This manual will provide you with full understanding of the necessary instructions for assembly, operation and maintenance of the equipment.

Please read it carefully before starting operation. For continued safe and rellable operation, use ONLY original RedMax parts and accessories, Adhere to all notes and warnings.

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## FOR SAFE OPERATION

#### KNOW YOUR UNIT

- 1. Read this Owner's Manual carefully until you completely understand and can follow all safety rules, precautions, and operating instructions before operating the unit.
- 2. Restrict your unit to users who understand and follow all safety rules, precautions, and operating instructions found in this manual. Children should not be allowed to operate this unit.

#### PLAN AHEAD

- 1. Dress in a long-sleeved shirt and long pants. Wear protective gloves and shoes. Eye and ear protection should be worn at all times. Do not wear loose clothing, jewelry, short pants or sandals. Do not go barefoot.
- Guard against hazardous situations at all times. Warn adults to keep pets and children away from the work area. Establish a safe method for gaining your attention during operation. Be careful if you are approached.
- 3. Do not operate the unit when you are tired, ill or upset; or if you are under the influence of alcohol, drugs, or medication.
- 4. Inspect the work site before each use. Remove all debris and objects that could be thrown, become entangled in the cutting head, or cause damage during operation.

#### HANDLE FUEL WITH CAUTION

- 1. Eliminate all sources of sparks or flame (including smoking, open flames, or work that could cause sparks) in the area where fuel is mixed, poured, or stored.
- 2. Mix, pour, and store fuel in an approved, marked container and in a well ventilated area.
- 3. Be sure to stop the engine before refueling the unit.
- 4. Do not smoke while handling fuel or while operating the unit.
- 5. Wipe up all spills before starting the engine. Move at least 10 feet (3 meters) away from fuel and refueling site before starting the engine.

#### OPERATE YOUR UNIT SAFELY

- 1. Inspect the entire unit before each use for worn, loose, or damaged parts. Do not use until the unit is in proper working order.
- 2. Keep the handles free of oil and fuel.
- 3. Never start or run the engine inside a closed room or building. Exhaust fumes contain dangerous carbon monoxide.
- 4. Keep the engine idle speed adjusted properly so that the cutting head comes to a complete stop when trigger is released.
- 5. Be sure to stop the engine before refueling, inspecting or leaving the unit unattended.
- 6. Always use both hands to hold the unit.
- 7. Do not use any accessory or attachment other than those bearing the RedMax mark and recommended for the unit.

#### MAINTAIN YOUR UNIT PROPERLY

- 1. Disconnect the spark plug before performing all maintenance except for carburetor adjustment.
- 2. Use only recommended, genuine replacement parts to avoid creating hazard and/or voiding your warranty.
- 3. Wear protective gloves when handling or performing maintenance on metal blades.
- 4. When transporting or storing the unit, drain fuel from the fuel tank.
- 5. Do not store the unit or fuel in a closed area where fuel vapors can reach an open flame from hot water heaters, furnaces, and so on.
- 6. Store the unit in a dry area out of the reach of children.
- 7. All engine service, other than those explained in this manual, should be performed by competent service personnel. Improper service to the muffler and flywheel could cause serious accidents.

## PARTS LOCATION & SPECIFICATION

## A. Engine

- 1. Install the engine to the driveshaft so that the cylinder head and the stop switch may come on the same side.
- 2. Using attached four bolts, secure the connection firmly with equal force (Torque: 25 in-lbs)



Never use any screws other than those specified by the manufacturer, or the engine can get loose, resulting in a hazardous event.

## **B. Throttle Control**

1. Loosen two screws and remove the control bracket from the shaft casing.



2. Pass the throttle cable through the holes on the bottom of the rear grip.



3. Hook the cable end into the hole of the throttle lever.



- 4. Install the control bracket to the shaft casing.
- 5. Connect the switch wires (Black  $\rightarrow$  Black/Red  $\rightarrow$  Red).



## C. Blade Cuttercase



- 1. Remove the fastening screw (long) and the lock screw (short) from the cuttercase.
- 2. While aligning the locking holes (cuttercase hole, spacer hole, and shaft casing hole) install the cuttercase assembly to the shaft casing. If it will not bottom, twist the case slightly back and forth.
- 3. Align the locking holes and make sure that the locking screw (short) is fastened to the bottom by hand, then secure it with wrench.



#### Note:

If the locking screw is tightened up with the holes out of alignment, the cuttercase may be damaged.

4. Fasten the cuttercase fastening screw (long).

## D. Front Handle

Extend the handle gap and fit it over the shaft casing.

Adjust the position and fasten with three screws and nuts provided with the products.



## E. Stand

Install the stand onto the shaft casing approx. 1.2 inches away from the cuttercase. Fasten the clamp uniformly.





## FUEL

The RedMax engines are lubricated by oil specially formulated for air-cooled 2-cycle gasoline engine use. When RedMax oil is not available, use an anti-oxidant added quality oil expressly labeled for air-cooled 2-cycle engine use.

#### RECOMMENDED MIXING RATIO GASOLINE 32 : OIL 1

Exhaust emission are controlled by the fundamental engine parameters and conponents (eq., carburation, ignition timing and port timing) without addition of any major hardware or the introduction of an inert material during combustion.

These engines are certified to operate on unleaded gasoline.

#### WARNING!!!

The fuel is highly flammable. Do not smoke or bring any flame or sparks near fuel.

#### HOW TO MIX FUEL

- 1. Measure out the quantities of gasoline and oil to be mixed.
- 2. Put some of the gasoline into a clean, approved fuel container.
- 3. Pour in all of the oil and agitate well.
- 4. Pour in the rest of gasoline and agitate again for at least one minute.
- 5. Put a clear indication on the outside of the container to avoid mixing up with gasoline or other containers.

#### FUELING UNIT

- 1. Untwist and remove the fuel cap. Rest the cap on a dustless place.
- 2. Put fuel into the fuel tank to 80% of the full capacity.
- 3. Fasten the fuel cap securely and wipe up any fuel spillage around the unit.

#### CAUTION;

- 1. Select bare ground for fueling.
- 2. Move at least 10 feet (3 meters) away from the fueling point before starting the engine.
- 3. Stop the engine before refueling the unit.

#### FOR YOUR ENGINE LIFE, AVOID;

- 1. FUEL WITH NO OIL(RAW GASOLINE) It will cause severe damage to the engine inner parts very quickly.
- 2. GASOHOL It can cause deterioration of rubber and/or plastic parts and disruption of engine lubrication.
- 3. OIL FOR 4-CYCLE ENGINE USE or WA-TER COOLED 2-CYCLE ENGINE USE - It can cause spark plug fouling, exhaust port blocking, or piston ring sticking.



## A. Starting Engine

1. Place the machine on a flat, firm surface. Keep the cutting head clear of everything around it.



2. Push primer pump several times until overflow fuel flows out in the clear tube.



- 3. Move choke lever to the closed position.
- 4. Shift the stop switch backward (to the engine side).



5. While holding the throttle lever at the half open position, pull starter knob.



#### Note:

Avoid pulling rope to its full length or returning rope by releasing the knob quickly.

- 6. When engine has started, move choke lever gradually to the open position.
- 7. Allow your engine to warm up for a couple of minutes before starting operation.

#### Note:

- When re-starting engine immediately after stopping it, keep choke lever at the open position.
- If engine fails to start even after several attempts, the engine may have been flooded with fuel. Open choke and pull rope several times.

## **B. Stopping engine**

- 1. Release throttle lever and allow the engine to idle a couple of minutes.
- 2. Slide the stop switch forward (to the cutter side).



Note:

Except in an emergency, do not stop engine running at high speed. This can shorten the engine life.

## C. Adjustment

#### 1. Adjusting Throttle Cable Play

Check the cable play and, if necessary, adjust between .04" and .08" by bending throttle wire receiver of the bracket with a nipper.

#### 2. Adjusting Idling Speed

The idling speed is adjusted by turning idle adjusting screw on carburetor. When idling speed is so low as engine stops occasionally, turn the screw clockwise. When idling speed is so high as cutting blades keep moving, turn the screw counterclockwise.



#### Note:

When adjusting idling speed, be sure the engine has warmed up.





This machine does cutting not by a rotary cutter like conventional trimmers but by a pair of special blades, each upper blade and lower blade oscillate opposite direction alternately within a limited angle at a speed of approximately 1/30 of conventional trimmers.

This unique mechanism brings you many benefits like the following:

- 1. Since the blade does not cause grass chips and pebbles to the thrown around, you may use less care about your clothing or surroundings.
- 2. Should the blade hit a rigid object like stones, trees or steel poles during operation, it does not produce a bounce motion that can cause loss of machine control.
- 3. Since the blade does not cause cut grass to wrap around the neck, you need not to stop operation to remove such wrappers.

What's more, since the whole circle of the blade is available for cutting, you can move the cutting head in all directions and cut grass growing on such place difficult-to-get with conventional trimmer.

You can even trim the waterside without splashing water.

#### How to use

#### WARNING!!!

- 1. Always wear eye protection such as safety goggles. Never lean over the rotating cutting head. Rocks or other debris could be thrown into eyes and face and cause serious personal injury.
- 2. Keep the debris fuard attached in place at alltimes when the unit is operated.
- Adjust the front handle to the most comfortable position.
- · Start the engine and pull the throttle lever gradually. The blades will start moving as the engine speed goes up.
- To stop the blade motion, simply release the throttle lever. The clutch will disengage and the blades stop moving while the engine keeps idling.
- Move the cutting head as sliding its bottom on the ground. This will help you do the job with less effort.

#### Note:

- Avoid running the engine at full throttle with no load. Continuous no load full throttle operation can cause damage to the engine and driveshaft.
- Operation at too slow engine speed can cause abnormal vibration of the machine, resulting in short life of driveshaft and clutch parts. If you felt such vibration, use a higher speed range.
- Though the blades are made of harder steel compared to conventional metal blades, continuous cutting in soil will accelerate wear.

## MAINTENANCE



Before cleaning, inspecting or repairing your unit, make sure that engine has stopped and is cool.

#### A. After every use

- Remove all dust, dirt and grass from the entire unit.
- Check complete unit for loose or missing fasteners or parts. Correct if found.
- · Check engine for any fuel leaks.

#### **B. Blade Maintenance**



Use protective gloves whenever inspecting, removing, sharpening, and installing the blade.

- · Wipe off dust and dirt attached to the blade, and oil it after every use.
- As the extent of wear differs by each cutter depending on use conditions, rotate the blade position at intervals.

#### **To Remove Blades:**

- 1. Turn over the machine and remove the bottom cover by removing the four crossslotted screws.
- 2. Loosen the four socket screws and remove the lower blade.
- 3. Loosen the four socket screws and remove the upper blade.



#### **To Install Blades:**

The upper and lower blades are interchangeable. When fastening the blade mounting screws, torque them uniformly (Torque: 100 to 130 in-lbs)

#### To Sharpen Blade:

1. When the corners of cutter become rounded and the cutting edges become dull, resharpen using a small disk grinder, etc.



2. When sharpening, offset the top and bottom blade teeth by 1/8 inches, as shown in the illustration.



Apply the grinder lightly and quickly. Pressing too strongly or grinding for too long will generate heat which can soften the temper of the blade and accelerate wear.

3. The width of cutter decreases with repeated use and resharpening. Replace with a new blade when the width at the end becomes less than 5/16 in.



#### Note:

Using a worn blade can cause chipping of cutters, resulting in a loss of operation time and shorter service life of the machine.

#### To Rotate Blade By Hand:

When resharpening an old blade or replacing with a new blade, insert the accessory hex wrench into the hex hole in the top of the crankcase and turn strongly 2~3 times. This removes burrs and uneven painting from the blade and makes starting easier.



## C. Air Filter

A dirty air filter makes starting difficult and lowers the output. Inspect the filter periodically and, when dirty, clean the element by washing in gasoline.

Dry the filter element completely before installing it in place.



## **D. Spark Plug**

Inspect the spark plug frequently especially if difficult starting or miss-firing is experienced.

Pull the spark plug cap out and remove the plug using the socket wrench attached to the unit. Clean the electrodes and reset spark gap to .24 %. For replacement plug, use a Champion RCJ8 or NGK BMR6A.



## E. Spark Arrester

Lack of power and Starting failure can be caused by carbon deposits in the exhaust passage. Clean or replace the spark arrester as necessary.

- 1. Remove the two screws securing the cylinder/muffler shield (red).
- While spreading out the bottom end of the muffler shield, disassemble the heat insulation plate (black). Now the shield can be removed by hand.
- Loosen four screws with the socket screw wrench supplied with the machine, and separate the muffler halves. Use care not to make sealing gasket damaged. A damaged gasket must be replaced with new one.
- 4. When assembling the muffler halves, tighten the screws equally and securely.

## F. Fuel Filter

A clogged fuel filter can cause poor acceleration and RPM fluctuation. Inspect the fuel pick-up every 25 hours of use and clean or replace as necessary. Take the fuel pick-up out of the tank by using a small wire hook. Remove the filter from fuel hose and carefully disassemble it by removing the retainer. Wash the components in clean gasoline. Reassemble the components and connect fuel hose to the assembly.



## G. Gearcase and Cuttercase

- Periodically refill the case with grease (every 50 hours).
- Use only lithium based greases.



## H. Storage

- Oil the blades.
- Drain fuel tank and run engine out until all fuel in carburetor is used up.



- Remove spark plug and drop a spoonful of oil into the cylinder. Crank engine several times and replace spark plug. Pull starter until compression is felt.
- Store unit in a dry, dust-free place.

Do not use any accessory or attachment other than those specifically designed for use with this unit. Serious personal injury to the user or damage to the engine could result.
