- 2. Remove the Screws (5) and set aside.
- Slide the Adjustment Knobs (4) onto the bolts on the Stand Arms (2) and loosen the Stand Arms slightly by turning the Adjustment Knobs counter clockwise.

- 4. Insert the ends of the Stand Base (3) into the Stand Arms.
- 5. Align the holes in the sides of the Stand pieces and thread the Screws in place.
- 6. Adjust the body of the fan to the desired angle, then Tighten the Adjustment Knobs.

- 1. Turn the knob on the back of the Fan Body (1) to Off.
- 2. Set the Fan on a dry, stable surface.
- Plug the power cord into a standard 120V AC outlet.
- 4. Turn the Knob on the back of the fan to the desired setting: Low, Medium or High.
- Adjust the tilt of the Fan Body by loosening the Adjustment Knobs (4), changing the tilt of the body, then tightening the Adjustment Knobs.
- When done, turn the Knob on the back of the Fan Body to Off and unplug.
- **Note:** It is normal for the motor of the Fan to feel warm to the touch during operation. The motor is thermally protected and will automatically shut off when it overheats for any reason. If this happens, immediately disconnect the Fan from the power outlet.

Allow to completely cool down before turning on again.

The motor bearings are permanently lubricated at the factory and do not require any additional lubrication.
