- Use Caller Display to see who is calling before you pick up the phone and keep track of incoming calls with the 30 number Calls list.*
- Use the phonebook to store and dial up to 30 of your most frequently used phone numbers.
- Handsfree operation for greater flexibility when on the phone.

* Feature requires subscription to a caller display service from your network provider. A quarterly fee may be payable.

This User Guide provides you with all the information you need to get the most from your phone.

Before you make your first call you will need to set up your phone. Follow the simple instructions in 'Getting Started', on the next few pages.

Location

You need to place your BT Freestyle 650 close enough to a mains power and telephone wall socket so that the cables will reach.

The strength of the handset signal depends on where you site the base. Make sure it is at least 1 metre away from other electrical appliances to avoid interference. Do not place your BT Freestyle 650 in the bathroom or other humid areas.

Setting up the base and handset

 Plug the power adaptor and telephone cable into the back of the base. Only use the cables provided with the product.



Handset range

The BT Freestyle 650 has a range of 300 metres outdoors when there is a clear line of sight between the base and handset. Any obstruction between the base and handset will reduce the range significantly. With the base indoors and handset either indoors or outdoors, the range will normally be up to 50 metres. Thick stone walls can severely affect the range.

IMPORTANT

The base station must be plugged into the mains power socket at all times.

Do not connect the telephone line to the telephone line wall socket until the handset is fully charged.

Signal strength

The () icon on your handset indicates when you are in range. When it flashes, you are out of range. Plug the power adaptor into the mains wall socket and switch the power on. When connected correctly, you will hear two beeps and the green Power light and the red Messages light on the base will come on.

Your BT Freestyle 650 answering machine will announce, "Answer On. Calls will be answered after 6 rings".

3. Place the battery ribbon in the base of the handset battery compartment. Insert the 2 x AAA rechargeable batteries supplied observing the polarity (+ and -) markings. Then slide the battery compartment cover into place.



With batteries installed the display will show:



The $\mathbf{1}$ icon will flash while the handset searches for the base.

4. Place the handset in the base to charge, the red charging light comes on, you hear a beep tone and the **rand** icon begins scrolling.

When the handset has linked with the base the idle display will be shown:



You should charge the handset for at least 24 hours on first charge.

5. Once fully charged, plug the telephone line cord into the telephone wall socket.

Set day and time

You will need to set the day and time so that you know when each answering machine message was received.

Once a message has been played back, the machine will announce, for example, "Tuesday, four fifty, pm."

1. Press and hold stop until you hear the current day setting.

Talk/Standby time

In ideal conditions, the handset batteries should give about 10 hours talk time or 100 hours standby on a single charge. The base must remain plugged in to the mains and switched on at all times

Note that new batteries do not reach full capacity until they have been in normal use for several days.

If the battery charge becomes low during a call you will hear a warning beep every minute (provided the battery warning beeps are set to on, see page 29). If the battery runs out you will be cut off. You will need to recharge the handset before using it again.

During charging, the **I** will scroll in the display.

Battery performance

To keep your batteries in the best condition, leave the handset off the base for a few hours at a time.

Running the batteries right down at least once a week will help them last as long as possible.

The charge capacity of rechargeable batteries will reduce with time as they wear out, giving the handset less talk/standby time.

Eventually they will need to be replaced. New batteries are available from the BT Freestyle 650 Helpline on 0870 605 8047.

After charging your handset for the first time, subsequent charging time is about 6–8 hours a day. Batteries and handset may become warm during charging. This is normal.

To scroll through days / hours / minutes rapidly, *press and hold* (1990) or (1990). After the desired setting is announced, *release* the confirm.

Default day and time

The default date and time is Saturday, 12.01pm. If the power to the base is lost, the date and time will revert to this default setting. Your messages will be unaffected.

To check current day and time setting

Press and release the stop button.

- 2. Press and release size or step repeatedly to scroll through the days. After the correct setting is announced press step. The day is announced followed by the current hour setting.
- 3. Press and release (1980) or (1980) repeatedly to scroll through the hours. After the correct setting is announced press (1990) to select. The day and hour are announced followed by the current minute setting.
- 4. Press and release state or the press of t

BT Freestyle 650 multiple pack owners only

For each additional handset:

You need to place your BT Freestyle 650 charger close enough to a mains power socket so that the cable will reach.

Setting up the charger and additional handset

1. Plug the power adaptor cable into the underside of the charger.



- 2. Plug the power adaptor into the mains wall socket and switch the power on.
- 3. Place the battery ribbon in the base of the handset battery compartment. Insert the 2 x AAA rechargeable batteries supplied observing the polarity (+ and -) markings. Then slide the battery compartment cover into place.
- 4. Place the handset in the charger and charge the handset for at least 24 hours. The red Charging light on the charger comes on and the **rest** icon begins to scroll.

Your BT Freestyle 650 is ready for use.

BT Freestyle 650 Additional Handset

Your BT Freestyle 650 handsets are the same, so instructions throughout this guide apply to both.

Navigating the menus

Your BT Freestyle 650 handset has a menu system to guide you through the handset and base options. Refer to the menu map below for the available options.

When the handset is displaying the idle screen:

- 1. Press Menu to open the main menu.
- 2. Use \bigcirc and \bigtriangledown to scroll through the menu list.
- 3. When the menu item you want is displayed, press Menu to select and view the sub-menus available.

Press 💼 to exit a menu.

Keep pressing at to return to the idle screen at any time.

Using the phone

Switching the handset power on/off

Press and hold the R button.

Make an external call

1. Press (and listen for the dial tone, then dial the number.

The display shows the \int and then the \int icons.

Preparatory dialling

- 1. Enter the number first. If you make a mistake, press to delete the last digit.
- 2. Press 🔊 to dial.

End a call

1. Press 🔊 or place the handset back on the base.

Receiving calls

The base and handset will ring, the \mathcal{L}_{NT} icon flashes and CALL is displayed.

1. Press (a) to answer the call or, if the handset is on the base, simply lift it and speak.

When you make a call, the In Use light on the handset comes on and the In Use light on the base flashes.

Dialling numbers quickly

Numbers can also be dialled in Handsfree mode (page 17), using the phonebook (page 21), and from the calls list (page 24).

When you receive a call, the In Use lights on the handset and on the base flash.

Auto-answer

If you have switched auto-answer off (see page 42) then you will need to press after lifting the handset to take the call. If you have subscribed to your network's Caller Display service, the caller's number, or name (if an exact name/number match is found in the phonebook) will also be displayed, *See page 21* for more information.

Call timer

Your handset automatically times the duration of all calls, showing the time on the display during your call and for a few seconds after it has finished.

Handsfree calling

Handsfree lets you talk to your caller without holding the handset. It also enables other people in the room to listen to both sides of your conversation.

1. Press 🛛 listen for the dial tone then dial the number.

The display shows the \mathbf{I} and then the \mathbf{I} icons.

At any time during the call, to toggle between handsfree mode and normal mode (using the handset), press \mathbf{q} .

The d button is located on the left side of the handset rather than on the actual keypad.

To end a handsfree call, press d.

18 Using the phone

The earpiece volume will remain at the level set for all calls until changed.

The default setting is 3.

Earpiece volume

There are 5 volume levels to select from. The default is 3. You can only adjust the earpiece volume *during a call*.

Press to increase or to decrease the earpiece volume. The display shows the set volume, e.g. EAR VOLUME 2.

Handset ringer volume

There are 3 volume levels to select from, or you can set the volume to off.

While the phone is ringing:

1. Press 🔝 to increase or 🔽 to decrease the ringer volume. The display shows the set volume.

Secrecy

During a call, you can talk to someone nearby without your caller hearing you.

- 1. During your call, press Solution. MUTE is displayed and your caller cannot hear you.
- 2. Press again to resume your call.

Redial

Your handset automatically saves the last 5 numbers you dialled into a redial list.

- 1. Press 🔝.
- 2. Press or to scroll and display the number you want.

If a name/number match is found in the phonebook the name will be displayed instead of the number. Press to toggle between the name and number.

3. Press 💫 to dial the number.

Last number redial

- 1. Lift the handset and press 🔊.
- 2. Press (A). The last number called is redialled.

Delete a redial number

With the name or number you want to delete displayed:

- 1. Press . DELETE? is displayed.
- 2. Press Menu to confirm.

Each redial number can be up to a maximum of 32 digits long.

Only the last 12 digits of the number will be displayed. The ► icon will be displayed if there are more digits to view.

If there are no numbers saved in the redial list EMPTY will be displayed.

Press to exit a menu. Keep pressing to return to the idle display at any time.

Delete the redial list

With any number from the redial list displayed.

- 1. Press and hold Solution. DELETE ALL? is displayed.
- 2. Press Menu to confirm.

Phonebook

Store a phonebook entry

You can use the phonebook to store up to 30 names and numbers for easy dialling. Each number can be up to 20 digits and each name up to 12 characters long.

- 1. Press Menu to display PHONE BOOK.
- 2. Press Menu to confirm.
- 3. Display shows ADD ENTRY. Press Men to display NAME?.
- 4. Enter a name using the keypad *(see character map, page)* 22), then press Menu.
- 5. Enter the telephone number, then press Menu.
- 6. Select a ringer melody (1 to 3) using \bigcirc or \bigtriangledown , then press Menu. You hear a confirmation beep.
- 7. Repeat steps 3 to 6 to add more entries, or keep pressing
 to return to the idle display.

Dial a phonebook entry

- 1. Press m
- 2. Enter the first letter of the name you want using the keypad, then scroll to the exact entry using \bigcirc or ∇ .
- 3. Press 💫 to dial the number.

The III icon is displayed while you view the phonebook.

If you have Caller Display enabled on your line and your caller's details are matched to an entry in the phonebook then your handset will ring with the melody selected for that caller.

Using the phonebook with additional handsets

If you are using more than one handset, each handset has a separate phonebook, so you can store 30 entries per handset.

Deleting characters/digits If you make a mistake, press

Cancel storing Press once to return to ADD ENTRY.



Entering names: For example, to enter the name Tom:

Press 8 for T.

Press 6 three times for O.

Press 6 for M.

The maximum length for names is 12 characters.

You cannot store a name without a number.

Inserting a Pause

You can insert a Pause in the dialling sequence. This can be useful if your phone is connected to an internal switchboard, see page 43.

If the number has more than 12 digits, press very again to display the remaining digits.

Delete a phonebook entry

Press Men Display shows PHONE BOOK.
 Press Men to confirm.
 Press A or ♥ to select DELETE ENTRY.
 Press A or ♥ to select entry.
 Press A or ♥ to confirm. CONFIRM? is displayed.
 Press Men to confirm.



Edit a phonebook entry

- 1. Press Menu. Display shows PHONE BOOK.
- 2. Press Menu.
- 3. Press \Lambda or 🔽 to select MODIFY ENTRY. Press Menu to confirm.
- 4. Scroll to the entry you want using \bigcirc or \bigtriangledown .
- 5. Press Menu.
- 6. Use for to move through the name, and edit using to delete and enter new characters using the keypad, then press Meru.
- 7. Use to delete digits and enter the new number using the keypad, then press Merv.
- Select a ringer melody (1 to 3), then press Menu. You hear a confirmation beep.

To change individual characters Use an or to move the cursor underneath the letter you want to change, then overtype the correct letter. 24

Caller Display and the calls list

IMPORTANT

To use Caller Display you must first subscribe to the service from your network provider. A quarterly fee may be payable.

Caller information not available

Occasionally the telephone number of the caller is not available and cannot therefore be displayed.

In this case, your BT Freestyle 650 will show one of the following explanatory messages:

WITHHELD

UNAVAILABLE

INTERNATIONA(L)

OPERATOR

PAYPHONE

RINGBACK

If the telephone number is longer than 12 digits, then only the last 12 digits will be displayed. The < icon will be displayed to the left of the number if there are more digits to view.

If you subscribe to a Caller Display service you can see your caller's number on your handset's display (unless it has been withheld) before you answer the call. If you have stored the caller's name and number in the phonebook then they will be shown alternately in the display.

Whether you answer a call or not, the caller's phone number is stored in the calls list.

When you have new entries in the calls list the \bigcirc icon will flash in the display.

When all the entries have been viewed, the \bigcirc icon will disappear.

Up to 30 phone numbers can be stored in the calls list. When the calls list is full, a new call replaces the oldest.

Each stored number can be up to 20 digits and each name up to 12 characters long.

View and dial a calls list entry

- 1. Press **v** to open the Calls list.
- 2. Press or **v** *repeatedly* to scroll through the entries. For each entry, the caller's number is displayed, or their name if a name/number match is found in the phonebook.

Caller Display and the calls list

- 3. When viewing an entry press *menu repeatedly* to view the details for the entry: the caller's number, and the date and time the call was received.
- 4. Press 💫 to dial the displayed number.

Or

Press at the calls list and return to the idle screen.

Delete a calls list entry

- 1. Press **v** to open the Calls list.
- 2. Press or repeatedly to scroll to the entry you want.
- 2. Press . DELETE? is displayed.
- 3. Press Menu to confirm. The display will return to the idle screen.

Delete all calls list entries

- 1. Press **v** to open the Calls list.
- 2. Press and hold with until DELETE ALL? is displayed.
- 3. Press Menu to confirm (or cancel).

What type of call?

The micro indicates a new call waiting to be viewed.

The **C** icon will be displayed for calls that you answered.

The **a** icon will be displayed for unanswered calls.

If there are no numbers saved in the Calls list EMPTY will be displayed.

When you reach the start or the end of the Calls list and there are no more calls to view, you will hear a long beep tone.

Using the calls list with additional handsets

If you are using more than one handset, each handset has a separate calls list. A call answered on one handset will show as unanswered on another.

Copy a calls list entry to the phonebook

- 1. Press **v** to open the Calls list.
- 2. Press or **v** *repeatedly* to scroll to the entry you want to copy.
- 3. Press Menu twice. ADD? is displayed, press Menu.
- 4. NAME? is displayed. Enter the name, then press Menu.
- 5. The Calls list number is displayed, press Menu.
- 6. Press 🔬 or 🔽 to select a ringer melody (1 to 3), then press Merry. You will hear a confirmation beep.

Call Waiting

Providing you have subscribed to your network provider's Call Waiting service, you will hear a soft beep every 5 seconds if an incoming call arrives while you are already on the phone. This beep is not audible to the person you are speaking to. The second caller's number (and name if stored in the phonebook) will appear on the handset display.

Instead of the engaged tone, the second caller will hear an announcement asking them to hold the line.

Caller Display and the calls list 27

Speak to a second caller

1. Press **R** to answer the second call and put your current caller on hold. Press **R** again to return to your first caller and to switch between both callers.

Or

2. If you want to end the current call and pick up the waiting call, press (2). The handset will ring. Press (2) again to connect to the waiting caller.

The second caller is only charged from the second you answer, not while they are waiting to be connected.

Ready to record

28

The answering machine is pre-set to ON, so it's ready to record messages as soon as the base is plugged in.

(Remember to charge the handset for at least 24 hours first).

Your BT Freestyle 650 answering machine uses voice prompts to guide you simply through its operation.

You can operate your answering machine from:

- the base
- remotely, from any other Touchtone[®] telephone, see page 36.

Before first using your answering machine you should set the correct day and time. If you have not done this already when you set up your product, please *see page 9*.

Switching the answering machine on/off

1. Press ***** The machine announces, ***** *Answer on******, followed by the current outgoing message, or ***** *Answer off******.

The Messages light comes on when the answering machine is switched on.

Listening to your messages

When you have messages recorded on your answering machine, the Messages light will flash.

Play all messages

1. Press Play. The total number of messages is announced. All messages are then played back, with the oldest message played back first. After each message the day and time of recording are announced.

Play new messages only

1. Press and hold Play until you hear "You have 'n' new messages." Your new messages will be played.

During playback:



Play Pause/resume playback.

Once repeats the current message, *twice* plays the previous message.

VISKIP Once plays the next message, *twice* plays the message after that.

Del Deletes the current message and you hear "Messaae deleted".

Stops playback, machine goes back to Answer On.

At the end of playback:

The machine announces, "End of messages. To delete all messages, press delete". The machine gives you 8 seconds during which you can press:

If no messages are stored on the answering machine, you will hear, "You have no messages".



Message indicator Flashes when there are answering machine messages.

Cancel operation

Press to end any operation at any time.

Loudspeaker volume

You can adjust the base loudspeaker volume at any time. In standby, you hear a beep which gets louder or softer. A double beep signifies the highest or lowest setting. Use the log and to buttons.

Personalise your OGM

To record your own outgoing message, see 'Record your own outgoing message', *see page 31*.

The answering machine is pre-set to Answer and Record mode.



Del to delete all messages; or

to *cancel* message deletion. This will also restore any messages you have selected individually for deleting. Any messages not deleted are saved.

You will hear a beep to signal when 8 seconds have elapsed.

Outgoing messages

The outgoing message (OGM) is the greeting a caller hears when the answering machine picks up their call. Your BT Freestyle 650 gives you a choice of two prerecorded outgoing messages, one for **Answer and Record** and one for **Answer Only**.

Answer and Record

Callers hear the announcement and are able to leave a message for you. The pre-recorded message is, *"Hello, your call cannot be taken at the moment, so please leave your message after the tone."*

Answer only

Callers hear an announcement but *cannot* leave a message. The pre-recorded message is, *"Hello, your call cannot be taken at the moment, and you cannot leave a message, so please call later."*

Select and play outgoing message 1. Press and hold Solution until you hear, "Please select outgoing messaae." 2. For Answer and Record, press or for Answer Only press **N**skip . The selected message is played. Record your own outgoing message(s) 1. Press and hold Solution until you hear, "Please select outgoing If you only want to hear the current message just press the Q messaae." button. 2. Press and keep holding to select Answer and **Record** or press and keep holding **Visip** for **Answer Only**, until you hear, "Please speak after the tone. To end recording release the button." You can only delete your own outgoing message, not the pre-recorded message.

What is Time Saver?

Time Saver can save you the cost of call when you want to ring in to find out if you have new messages (see 'Remote access', page 36).

If you have new messages, your answering machine answers after 2 rings. If you do not have new messages, it answers after 6 rings. This gives you a chance to hang up before the line is connected. 3. *During playback*, press **De**. The machine will stop playing your outgoing message and will revert to and play the pre-recorded outgoing message.

Answer delay

Answer delay is the number of times your BT Freestyle 650 rings before the answering machine picks up calls and starts playing the outgoing message to callers. You can choose between 2–9 rings, or Time Saver. The default setting is 6 rings.

Adjust answer delay

- 1. Press **1**. The machine announces, "Calls will be answered after X rings."
- 2. Press *and hold* **Liste**. The machine announces the settings in turn. *Release* the button when you hear the answer delay you want. The new setting is announced.

Security PIN

Your 3-digit PIN lets you access your answering machine remotely from another phone. For security reasons, it is recommended that you change the PIN from the original setting of 000.

Change the security PIN

- 1. Press *and hold* Del. The machine announces, "Security *code setting*", and then, "*First digit*", followed by the current first digit setting.
- 2. Press for to change the first digit and press Del to confirm.
- 3. You then hear, "Second digit". Press or to change the second digit and press Del to confirm.

Memory full during a call

If the memory runs out or the maximum message length of 3 minutes is reached while a caller is leaving a message, they will hear, *"Thank you for calling"* before the call is ended.

Call screening

When the answering machine is switched on, you can use the loudspeaker to listen to callers leaving their messages.



Remote access

You can operate your answering machine from any modern Touchtone[®] phone by calling your BT Freestyle 650 and entering a 3-digit security PIN.
