


HANDSET AND CHARGE CRADLE LAYOUT



BEFORE YOU BEGIN

Parts Checklist

Make sure your package includes the items shown here.



INSTALLING THE PHONE



IMPORTANT: Make sure the extra handset is registered to GE Models 25831, 25833, or 25835 before use. Refer to the GE 25831, 25833, or 25835 instruction book for detailed installation and operation information.

- Never install telephone wiring during a lightning storm.
- Never install telephone jacks in wet locations unless the jack is specifically designed for wet locations.
- Never touch non-insulated telephone wires or terminals, unless the telephone line has been disconnected at the network interface.
- Use caution when installing or modifying telephone lines.
- Temporarily disconnect any equipment connected to the phone such as faxes, other phones, or modems.

IMPORTANT INSTALLATION GUIDELINES

- Install telephone near an electrical power outlet.
- Avoid sources of noise, such as a window by a busy street, and electrical noise, such as motors, microwave ovens, and fluorescent lighting.
- Avoid heat sources, such as heating air ducts, heating appliances, radiators, and direct sunlight.
- Avoid areas of excessive moisture or extremely low temperature.
- Avoid dusty locations.
- Avoid other cordless telephones or personal computers.
- 1. Plug the charge cradle power adaptor into an electrical outlet.
- 2. Install the handset battery.

INSTALLING THE HANDSET BATTERY

(**NOTE:** You must connect the handset battery before use.


- 1. Locate battery and battery door which are packaged together inside a plastic bag and are separate from the handset.
- 2. Locate the battery compartment on the back of the handset.
- 3. Plug the battery pack cord into the jack inside the compartment. **NOTE:** It is important to maintain the polarity (black and red wires)

to the jack inside the compartment. To ensure proper battery installation, the connector is keyed and can be inserted only one way.

4. Insert the battery pack.

5. Close the battery compartment by pushing the door up until it

- 6. Place the handset in the charging cradle. The charge indicator turns on to indicate the battery is charging.
- 7. Allow the handset to charge for 16 hours prior to registration to GE Models 25831, 25833, or 25835. If you don't properly charge the phone, battery performance is compromised.



NOTE: If the battery is not properly installed in the handset, or if the battery pack is not properly connected to the jack inside the battery compartment. "NO BATTERY" shows in the display when the handset is placed in the charging cradle.

IMPORTANT: After you place the handset in the cradle the display shows "CHARGING...", then, "SEARCHING...", then "HANDSET NEEDS REGISTRATION" alternately. Wait until the handset charges properly, then register the handset to the base as described below.

Programming the Telephone

NOTE: The 25832 accessory handset is equipped with only basic features and does not have any answering features even when registered to Model 25833.

HANDSET REGISTRATION

Registration links the base to a cordless handset. Once a handset is registered it can use the base's phone connection. A cordless handset will not operate until it is registered to the base. During the registration process, keep the handset near the base.

NOTE: This extra handset is only compatible with the GE Models 25831, 25833, or 25835 series.

When your handset displays:



1. Press the MUTE/PROG button and HOLD BASE PAGE WAIT FOR BEEP shows in the display.



2. Press and hold the PAGE button on the base of Models 25831. 25833, or 25835 until you hear a long beep. The handset displays HANDSET # REGISTERED followed by HANDSET NAME.

3. The handset number (1 to 4) is assigned. You may also give the handset a specific identifying name.

1. Use the touch-tone keypad to enter the name (up to 15 characters).

HANDSET NAME

More than one letter is stored in each of the number keys. For example, to enter the name Bill Smith, press the 2 key twice for the letter B. Briefly pause and the cursor moves to the next field. Press the 4 key 3 times for the letter I. Briefly pause and the cursor moves to the next field. Press the 5 key 3 times for the second letter L. Briefly pause and the cursor moves to the next field. Press the 5 key 3 times for the second letter L, press 1 key to add a space between the first and last name. Press the 7 key 4 times for the letter S. Briefly pause and the cursor moves to the next field. Press the 6 key once for the letter M. Briefly pause and the cursor moves to the next field. Press the 4 key 3 times for the letter I. Briefly pause and the cursor moves to the next field. Press the 8 key for the letter T. Briefly pause and the cursor moves to the next field. Press the 4 key twice for the letter H.

NOTE: If you make a mistake press the DELETE button to backspace and erase the wrong character(s).

NOTE: Press MUTE/PROG button once to skip this step and exit to standby screen.

2. Press the MUTE/PROG button to save. You will hear a confirmation tone, and the display returns to the main menu.

HANDSET DE-REGISTRATION

Deregistration cancels a handset's registration. If you do not know a handset's name, you should deregister the handset according to the steps below. During the de-registration process, keep the handset near the base.

WARNING: It is not recommended that a handset be deregistered unless absolutely necessary because once a handset is de-registered, that handset's telephone features cannot be used until the handset is re-registered.

- 1. Make sure your handset is **OFF** (not in talk mode).
- 2. Press the MUTE/PROG button to display main menus: ROOM MONITOR and HANDSET SETUP.
- 3. Use CALLER ID/VOL button to locate to HANDSET SETUP and then press MUTE/PROG button to select.
- 4. Use CALLER ID/VOL / + button to locate the DEREGISTRATION and then press MUTE/PROG button to select.
- 5. Then, handset shows DEREGISTRATION 1YES 2NO in the display.

- 6. Use the touch-tone pad to enter 1YES, or use the CALLER ID/VOL (- or +) button to scroll to 1YES.
- 7. Press MUTE/PROG and MOVE NEAR TO BASE displays until you move the handset closer to the base.



Then the handset displays CONFIRM? 1YES 2NO.

8. Use the touch-tone pad to enter 1YES or use CALLER ID/VOL (- or +) button to scroll to 1YES.

NOTE: Press the *EXIT button once to keep the previous setting and return to the main menu screen.

9. Press the MUTE/PROG button to confirm the deregistration. DE-REGISTER... displays for 30 seconds, then HANDSET # DE-REGISTERED displays for one second followed by HANDSET NEEDS REGISTRATION



GLOBAL DE-REGISTRATION

If one or more handsets becomes lost, you should de-register all handsets to ensure proper system operation. Follow the steps below to deregister both handsets at the same time.

- 1. Press and hold the PAGE button on the base of GE 25831, 25833. or 25835 until the CHARGE/IN USE indicator on the base flashes.
- 2. Press and hold the PAGE button on the base of GE 25831, 25833, or 25835 again until the CHARGE/IN USE indicator on the base flashes rapidly.
- 3. Press and release the PAGE button on the base of GE 25831, 25833, or 25835 once. All handsets are deregistered and HANDSET NEEDS REGISTRATION shows in the display.

IMPORTANT: It is strongly recommended that a handset not be de-registered unless absolutely necessary.

DEFAULT

As you become familiar with this system, you may prefer to use the system's original settings. Follow the steps below to return to the factory default settings.

- 1. Make sure your phone is **OFF** (not in talk mode).
- 2. Press the MUTE/PROG button to display main menus: ROOM MONITOR and HANDSET SETUP
- 3. Use CALLER ID/VOL button to locate to HANDSET SETUP and then press MUTE/PROG button to select.
- 4. Use CALLER ID/VOL / + button to locate the DEFAULT SETTING and then press MUTE/PROG button to select.
- 5. Then the handset shows DEFAULT SETTING 1YES 2NO in display.
- 6. Use the touch-tone pad on your handset to enter 1YES or 2NO, or use the CALLER ID/VOL - / + button on your handset to scroll to 1YES or 2NO. "2NO" is the default setting.



NOTE: If you choose "YES" all settings in the programmable menu return to the factory default settings.

NOTE: Press the *EXIT button once to keep the previous setting and return to the main menu.

7. Press the MUTE/PROG button to save your selection, and return to the main menu. The default setting you choose shows on the display for two seconds, and you will hear a confirmation tone.



PAGING ALL HANDSETS FROM A HANDSET

- 1. Make sure the originating phone is **OFF** (not in talk mode).
- 2. Press and release the INT button on a handset. PAGING EXTENSION? shows in the display.
- 3. Use the touch-tone pad to enter the handset number you want to page. (1=to page Handset 1, 2=to page handset 2, 3=to page handset 3, 4=to page handset 4, and 5=to page all handsets)
- 4. To cancel the page on the originating handset, press the *EXIT, INT, or TALK/CALLBACK button.

REPLACING THE BATTERY



CAUTION: to reduce the risk of fire or personal injury, use only the 5-2660 replacement battery listed on the accessory order form, which is compatible with this unit.

CAUTION: To ensure the phone/battery performance, use ONLY 25832 charging cradle, and 25831, 25833, or 25835 base for battery charging only.

- 1. Make sure the telephone is OFF before you replace battery.
- 2. Remove the battery compartment door.
- 3. Disconnect the cord attached to the battery pack from the jack inside the battery compartment and remove the battery pack from the handset.
- 4. Insert the new battery pack and reconnect the battery plug.
- 5. Put the battery compartment door back on.
- 6. Place handset in the base to charge. If you don't charge the handset battery properly (for 16 hours) when you first set up the phone and/or when you install a new battery pack, the battery's long-term performance will be compromised.

NOTE: If the battery is not properly installed in the handset, or if the battery pack is not properly connected to the jack inside the battery compartment. "NO BATTERY" shows in the display when the handset is placed in the charging cradle.

BATTERY SAFETY PRECAUTIONS

- Do not burn, disassemble, mutilate, or puncture. Like other batteries of this type, toxic materials could be released which can cause injury.
- Keep batteries out of the reach of children.
- Remove batteries if storing over 30 days.

CONNECTING AN OPTIONAL HEADSET TO THE HANDSET




- 1. Insert the headset plug into the headset jack.
- 2. Adjust the headset to rest comfortably on the ear.
- 3. Move the microphone to approximately 2 to 3 inches from your mouth.
- 4. Press the TALK/CALLBACK button to answer or place a call while using the headset.

CONNECTING THE BELT CLIP

There are two slots, one on each side of the handset.

Attach the belt clip by inserting the sides of the belt clip into the slots. Snap the ends of the belt clip into place.





GENERAL PRODUCT CARE

To keep your unit working and looking good, follow these guidelines:

- Avoid putting the phone near heating appliances and devices that generate electrical noise (for example, motors or fluorescent lamps).
- DO NOT expose to direct sunlight or moisture.
- Avoid dropping the handset, as well as other rough treatment to the phone.
- Clean the phone with a soft cloth.
- Never use a strong cleaning agent or abrasive powder because this will damage the finish.
- Retain the original packaging in case you need to ship the phone at a later date.
- Periodically clean the charge contacts on the handset and base with a clean pencil eraser.

Causes of Poor Reception

- Aluminum siding.
- Foil backing on insulation.
- Heating ducts and other metal construction that can shield radio signals.
- You're too close to appliances such as microwaves, stoves, computers, etc.
- Atmospheric conditions, such as strong storms.
- Base is installed in the basement or lower floor of the house.
- Base is plugged into AC outlet with other electronic devices.
- Baby monitor is using the same frequency.
- Handset battery is low.
- You're out of range of the base.
