

Follow these safety precautions when using your cordless phone to reduce the risk of fire, electric shock and injury to persons or property.

Reduce risk of fire and shock by:

- 1. Keep all slits and openings of the phone unblocked. Do not set the phone on a heating register or over a radiator. Ensure that proper ventilation is provided at the installation site.
- 2. Do not use while wet or while standing in water.
- 3. Do not use this product near water (for example, near a bath tub, kitchen sink, or swimming pool).
- 4. Do not allow anything to rest on the power cord. Place the power cord so that it will not be walked on.

- Never insert objects of any kind into the product slits as that may result in fire or shock.

- 4. Operate this phone using only the power source that is indicated on the marking label. If you are unsure of the power supply to your home, consult with your dealer or local power company.
- 5. Do not place this product on an unstable cart, stand or table. This product may fall, causing serious damage to the product.
- 6. Adjust only those controls that are covered by the operating instructions. Improper adjustment of other controls may result in damage and will often require extensive work to restore the product to normal operation.
- 7. Clean this product with a soft, damp cloth. Do not use chemicals or cleaning agents to clean this phone.

Please check the contents of the package carefully. If something is missing or has become damaged in transit, you should NOT use the telephone. In such a case you should return to the dealer with your sales receipt or contact the Motorola's distributor directly. (For details, please refer to the Warranty section.)

Note: Retain the packaging of your appliance to prevent it from being damaged should you ever need to return it.

Setting up the Base Station and Charger Unit

Place the base station and charger unit in an easily accessible location. Make sure that the location is stable and flat and that the surface is non-slip. When choosing the location, also make sure that all cables can be routed so as to prevent people tripping over them. Furthermore, avoid placing the base station and charger unit in the immediate vicinity of other electronic appliances such as microwaves, PCs or Hi-Fi's, for example.



Do not expose the base station and charger unit to direct sunlight. Do not allow the base station and charger unit to become wet. They should not be set up in rooms which are subject to condensation or corrosive steam or a high concentration of dust (e.g. cellars, garages or conservatories). The room temperature must be between 0°C and 35°C.

Connecting the Base Station and Mains Adaptor


- 1. Plug the telephone line cord into the base station socket.
- 2. Route the cord underneath the base station towards the back.
- 3. Plug the other end into the telephone wall socket.
- 4. Connect the mains power supply.



The base station does not have a power switch. Only use the mains adaptor supplied with your phone.

Connecting the Charger Unit

Insert the plug of the mains adaptor in the socket on the underneath of the charger unit. Plug the mains adaptor into the mains socket. The charger unit is now ready to use.



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Inserting the Batteries

Open the battery compartment by pushing downwards on the battery compartment cover. Insert the 2 x AAA batteries supplied, observing the correct polarity.



The mobile handset will not operate if the batteries are inserted incorrectly. There is also a possibility that the handset may be damaged.

CAUTION : Risk of explosion if battery is replaced by an incorrect type. Dispose of used batteries according to the instructions.

Replace the cover on the battery compartment and push it upwards until it clicks into place. Place the handset on the base station. You will hear a beep and the charging light comes on.


Note: When used for the first time, allow the batteries to charge for at least 14 hours without interruption. If possible, only take the handset out of the base station when the charging process has ended. This will help to guarantee optimum operation.

Note: To ensure the battery charges properly, clean the charging contacts on the handset and charger with a soft, dry cloth once a month. Clean more often if the unit is subject to grease, dust or high humidity.

Attaching the Belt Clip

Push the belt clip into the opening on the back of the handset. The clip will bend slightly until it clicks into place.

Attaching the Headset



You can connect a headset to the mobile handset. The 2.5mm jack plug must be inserted fully into the jack socket on the right-hand side of the handset.

The microphone and receiver loudspeaker of the handset are automatically switched off.







Navigating the Menu

In standby mode:

- 1. Press the rightharpoonup key to open the main menu and display the first menu option.
- Press or key to scroll through and display all the available options in the main menu.
- 3. Press *INT* **OK** to select the menu option you want. You can now scroll through the sub-menu options and press *INT* **OK** to select.
- 4. To return to the previous menu level, press $\mathcal{L}/ \mathfrak{A}$.

Alternatively, after pressing menu, select the function you want using the digit keys. select the required menu item directly using the digit keys.

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For example: Enter 44 to access Menu 4-BASE > 4-DIAL MODE.

Note : For the answering machine operation, please refer to pg.37.

Switching the Handset On/Off / Display Illumination

When the handset is place on the base station or charging unit, it switches on automatically and starts to charge up. Allow the batteries to be charged for 14 hours without interruption when the first time they are charged. The telephone does not have an On/Off switch.

Note: The display illumination switches on automatically when the handset is removed from the charging station or by pressing any key. It also lights up when calls are received. The display switches off after 10 seconds if no key is pressed.

Selecting the Language

Ten different languages are available for selection for each handset. Proceed as follows to select a language:

- Press the \$\vee\$ key repeatedly until menu item LANGUAGE appears.
 Press the *INT* OK key to confirm the item.
 Press a of \$\vee\$ as often as necessary to select the required language.
 Press the *INT* OK key to confirm the selection.

Note: The following languages are available: English, German, Italian, France, Spainish, Huangarian, Dutch, Polish, Swedish, Turkish.

Making Internal Calls

With more than one handset registered to the same base as you, you can make internal calls between handsets.

- 1. Press the INT OK key.
- 2. Press the number of the required handset (1..4). The other handset will ring.
- 3. Press the *r* key to end the call.

Note: If an external call is received during an internal call, you will hear short beeps to indicate you have a call waiting. (call waiting).

Making External Calls

There are two ways to dial a number, namely direct dialing and on-hook dialing.

Direct dialing

- 1. Press the *r* key and wait for the dialing tone.
- 2. Dial the telephone number and complete the call.
- 3. Press the *r* key to end the call.

On-hook dialing

- 1. Dial the telephone number.
- 2. Delete any incorrect entries by pressing the CISI key.
- 3. Press the *r* key. The number entered is dialed and a connection established.
- 4. Press the
 key to end the call.

Out of Range Warning

If the handset moves out of communication range with the base station, Ψ will flash.

Using Handsfree

In handsfree mode, all communication is via the handset speakerphone and microphone, leaving your 'hands free'. You can make a call handsfree or switch to handsfree during a call.



Using the Telephone

Make a handsfree call

In standby mode

- Press the key and wait until the handset speaker comes on then dial the telephone number as required.
- 3. Press the *r* key to end the call.

Switching during a Call

- 1. Press the d key to switch hand-free mode on or off.

Prefix Dialling

When prefix dialling number has been entered, (see Handset Settings page 29) the prefix number that you set will be dialled out first whenever you make an external call. The prefix can be a number up to 5 digits. You can use the prefix memory to store an area code that you frequently use, for example 0207 or 08457, to save you dialling it each time you make a call.

- 1. Press the **0** key for two seconds.
- 2. Supplement the call number and press the
 key to establish a connection.

Dialing from the Phone Book

Note. To store a number in the Phonebook, see 'Store entries' page 25.

- 1. Press the **III** key; the first entry in the phone book appears.
- 2. Press the \bigcirc or \diamondsuit key to select the required subscriber from the phone book. Alternatively, enter the first letter of the name required.
- 3. Press the *r* key. The number is dialed. Carry out the conversation.

Call Log Operations

You can view, call back, delete or save numbers shown in the Calls Log. If you have unanswered calls/calls that have been received in your absence, they are stored in the Calls Log. When using the calls log the **1**? will be displayed.

Viewing the call log

Note: The **1**? only disappears after all the entries have been viewed.

From standby mode:

- 1. Press 2. The display shows CALL LOG. Press INT OK to see the first entry in the call log. 2. Press \bigcirc or $\stackrel{\circ}{\Rightarrow}$ to scroll through the list.

Alternatively, press and hold the \star key to open the call log then scroll $\overline{\mathbf{a}}$ or $\overrightarrow{\star}$

Call a number in the Calls log

- 1. Press 🕏 . The display shows CALL LOG. Press INT OK to see the first entry in the call log.
 Press or to scroll through the list to the number you want.
 Press route to dial the number displayed.



Delete a call log entry

- 1. Press 🕏 . The display shows CALL LOG. Press INT OK to see the first entry in the call log. 2. Press \bigcirc or \Rightarrow to scroll through the list to the number you want.
- 3. Press and hold the CISI key for two seconds. The display shows ERASE? Press INT OK to confirm.

- **Delete all call log entries** 1. Press ♀ . The display shows CALL LOG. Press *INT OK* to see the first entry in the call log.
- 2. Press and hold the **C**/**S** key for two seconds. The display shows ERASE? Press ♠ or ♀ to display ERASE ALL? then press *INT OK* to confirm.

Save a call log number to the phone book.

Note: You can only save numbers that are not already stored in the phone book.

- 1. Press 🕏 . The display shows CALL LOG. Press INT OK to see the first entry in the call log.
- 2. Press of or V to scroll through the list to the number you want.
- 3. Press III . then press INT OK .
- 4. Enter a name to go with the number.
- 5. Press INT OK . The ring tone is played for that number. Press 🍙 or ᅷ to select the ring tone you want and press INT OK.

During a call you can mute the microphone so your caller cannot hear you while you speak privately to someone else in the room. The 🖾 icon is displayed when the microphone is muted.

1. Press the **C**/**G** key to switch the microphone on or off during a call.

Teleconference and Call Transfer

If you are already on an external call, you can include another internal handset in the conversation and hold a three-way conference call. Or you can simply transfer the caller to the other handset.

- 1. Press the *INT OK* key and enter the number of the corresponding handset (e.g. 2) which should be included in the call.
- The external caller is kept on hold. As soon as handset 2 takes the call, press
 key to transfer the call to handset 2.
- Or3. The external caller is kept on hold. As soon as handset 2 takes the call, press and hold *#* key to begin the conference call.
- 4. By pressing the rekey, any of the handsets can be disconnected from the teleconference and the other handset continues with the external call.



If the telephone is connected to a switchboard network, it is possible to put calls on hold and call other extensions or to forward calls.

- 1. Press the \boldsymbol{R} key to put the call on hold.
- 2. Dial the number of the extension (e.g. 23).
- 3. Press the **R** key once more to take the call back again or the **c** key to forward the call.

Note: The above information can vary according to the PBX network used. Therefore, refer to the relevant information in the PBX/switchboard user guide.

Entering a Dialing Pause (P)

If your Motorola ME4067 is connected to a switchboard/PBX it may be necessary to enter a dialling pause in order to give the switchboard time to get an outside line before dialling the number. To do this, press the key after entering the relevant digit, e.g. 0, for an outside line (0P...). A 'P' appears in the display indicating a pause. The pause can also be entered when programming numbers in the phone book.

Phone Book

Your MOTOROLA phone can store up to 30 entries in the phone book with name and call number.

Store Entries

- 1. Press the 🕏 key until the PHONE BOOK menu appears.
- 2. Press the INT OK key. The display shows NEW ENTRY.
- 3. Press the INT OK key.
- 4. Enter the number (max. 25 digits).
- 5. Press the INT OK key.
- 6. Enter the name (max.10 characters).

Note: To enter the characters, press the relevant key the corresponding number of times, 1, 2, 3 or 4 times, according to the position on the key. For example, to enter an L, press the 5 key three times or to enter a B press the 2 key twice. Delete incorrect entries by pressing the *L*/*S* key.

- 7. Press the INT OK key.
- 8. Select the ringing tone with the $\stackrel{\bullet}{=}$ or $\stackrel{\bullet}{\Rightarrow}$ key.
- 9. Press the INT OK key.

Note: If certain phone book entries should appear at the start of a list, e.g. 'FIRE', enter a space before the name 'FIRE'. The space is entered by pressing the 1 key.



Phone Book

View Entries

- Press the *INT OK* key.
 Press a or the *Key* key to select LIST ENTRY.
 Press the *INT OK* key.
- 5. Press $\stackrel{\bullet}{\odot}$ or $\stackrel{\bullet}{\Rightarrow}$ key to select the required entry.

Note: if there is no entry in the phone book, "MEM EMPTY" will display.

- 6. Press INT OK key to view the number.
- Or 7. Press rekey to dial the number.

Search for a name in the phone book

You can search for a name alphabetically.

- 1. Press the **III** key then press the alphanumeric key with the first letter of the stored name. For example, to display names beginning with N press 6 twice. The first stored name beginning with N is displayed.
- 2. Press $\stackrel{\bullet}{\oplus}$ or $\stackrel{\bullet}{\Rightarrow}$ to scroll through all stored names beginning.

Phone Book

Edit Entries

- 1. Press the 💙 key repeatedly until PHONE BOOK appears.
- 2. Press the INT OK key.
- 3. Press [↑] or [→] key to select EDIT ENTRY.
 4. Press the *INT OK* key.
- 5. Press $\stackrel{\bullet}{\Rightarrow}$ or $\stackrel{\bullet}{\Rightarrow}$ key to select the required entry.

Note: if there is no entry in the phone book, "MEM EMPTY" will display.

- 6. Press the INT OK key.
- 7. Enter the number.
- 8. Press INT OK key.
- 9. Enter the name.
- 10.Press INT OK key.
- 11.Press a or $\overleftrightarrow{}$ key to select the normal ring or VIP ring.

12.Press INT OK key.

Delete Entries

- 1. Press the 🕏 key as often as necessary until the PHONE BOOK menu appears.
- 2. Press the \bigcirc or \clubsuit key to select the DELETE or DELETE ALL submenu. 3. Press the *INT OK* key. Press the \bigcirc or \clubsuit key to select the phone book entry. Alternatively, enter the first letter of the name required.
- 4. Press the INT OK key to confirm the setting.

Note: The delete process can be stopped at any time prior to confirmation of it by pressing the *L*/**I** key several times.

Changing the ringer volume

- 1. press 🗳 key repeqtedly until HANDSET appears.
- 2. press INT OK twice.
- 3. press 🚖 or 🕏 key to select VOLUME.
- 4. press INT OK key.
- 5. press \bigcirc or \checkmark key to select the ringer volume (0-5 level, level 0 means ringer off).
- 6. press INT OK key to confirm the setting.

Changing the Ringer Melody (external/internal)

- 1. Press the rightharpoonup key as often as necessary until the HANDSET menu appears.
- 2. Press the INT OK key twice.
- 3. Use the $\frac{1}{6}$ or $\frac{1}{2}$ key to select the required submenu (EXT RINGER or INT RINGER).
- 4. Press the INT OK key.
- 5. Use the $\stackrel{\bullet}{\oplus}$ or $\stackrel{\bullet}{\Rightarrow}$ key to select the required melody.
- 6. Press the INT OK key to confirm the setting.

Note: For polyphonic ringer melody, please select melody (11-25)

Handset Setting

Entering/Changing Handset Name

It is possible to assign a name to each handset. This name is then displayed when the phone is in Standby mode.

1. Press the rightharpoonup key as often as necessary until the HANDSET menu appears.

- 2. Press the INT OK key.
- 3. Press the \bigcirc or \Rightarrow key to select the HS NAME submenu.
- 4. Press the INT OK key.
- 5. Enter/Change the name of the handset (e.g. MOBIL 1).

Note: To enter the characters, press the relevant key the corresponding number of times, 1, 2, 3 or 4 times, according to the position on the key. Press the 5 key three times for an L, for example.

Handset Settings

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6. Press the INT I OK key to confirm the input.

Saving a Prefix

It is possible to save prefix numbers in the handset. This number is then recalled after pressing the 0 key for two seconds.

- 1. Press the \Rightarrow key as often as necessary until the HANDSET menu appears.
- 2. Press the INT OK key.
- 3. Press the \bigcirc or \Rightarrow key to select the PREFIX MEM submenu.
- 4. Press the INT OK key.
- 5. Enter the prefix number (e.g. access code of the subscriber you call most frequently).
- 6. Press the INT OK key to confirm the input.

Switching the Key Tone On/Off

- 1. Press the 🛫 key as often as necessary until the HANDSET menu appears.
- 2. Press the INT OK key.
- 3. Press the \bigcirc or \clubsuit key to select the KEY TONE submenu.

- 6. Press the INT OK key to confirm the setting.

Automatic Call Answering

The automatic call answering function (auto answer on) enables an incoming call to be taken immediately when the handset is lifted from the base station (or charger unit) without pressing the
or

button.

- 1. Press the 💱 key as often as necessary until the HANDSET menu appears.
- 2. Press the INT OK key.
- 3. Press the \bigoplus or \clubsuit key to select the AUTO ANS submenu.
- 4. Press the INT OK key.
- 5. Use the $\stackrel{\bullet}{=}$ or $\stackrel{\bullet}{\Rightarrow}$ key to switch automatic call answering on or off.
- 6. Press the INT OK key to confirm the setting.

Handset Settings

The duration of each call is displayed. You can switch this function on and off.

- Press the key as often as necessary until the HANDSET menu appears.
 Press the *INT OK* key .
- 3. Press the $\stackrel{\bullet}{=}$ or $\stackrel{\bullet}{\Rightarrow}$ key to select the CALL TIMER submenu.
- Press the INT OK key.
 Use the or vert key to switch the call timer on or off.
- 6. Press the INT OK key to confirm the setting.

Restore Default Settings

The handsets can be reset to the default settings. In doing so, all the settings which you have changed are returned to their DEFAULT values. The phone book entries will not be affected.

- 1. Press the $\stackrel{\bullet}{\rightarrow}$ key until the HANDSET menu appears.
- Press the *INT OK* key .
 Press the *OF* → key to select the DEFAULT submenu.
 Press the *INT OK* key .
 Press the *INT OK* key to confirm the setting.

Note: The handset is reset to its DEFAULT settings.

Registering Additional Handsets

Further handsets can be registered on the base station. They must support the GAP standard. Please note, it is possible that some of the handset functions will not be available.



- Periodic maintenance and repair or replacement of parts due to normal wear and tear.
