- Battery life may be shortened depending on usage conditions, such as viewing the Caller ID Caller List or directory list, and ambient temperature.
- Clean the handset and the base unit charge contacts with a soft, dry cloth once a month. Clean more often if the unit is subject to grease, dust or high humidity. Otherwise the battery may not charge properly.
- off the battery is fully charged, you do not have to place the handset on the base unit until "Recharge" is displayed and/or "[1] flashes. This will maximize the battery life.
- •The battery cannot be overcharged.

Standby Mode (While the handset is off the base unit)

The handset goes into the standby mode after you finish using the handset (making/answering a call, viewing the Caller List or directory list etc.). The display is blank, but the handset can receive calls.

The battery life is conserved in this mode.

If you subscribe to a Caller ID service, the calling party information will be displayed after the first ring (p. 26). In order to view the Caller ID information, please wait until the second ring to answer a call.

Caller ID Service


This unit is compatible with a Caller ID service offered by your telephone company. If you subscribe to a Caller ID service, the calling party's information will be displayed on the handset after the first ring.

The unit can record information of up to 50 different callers, including the time and date received and the number of times called, in the Caller List. The Caller List information is sorted by the most recent to the oldest call. When the 51st call is received, the first call is deleted.

Using the list, you can automatically call back a caller. You can store the callers' numbers from the Caller List into the directory.

If you subscribe to a Call Waiting Caller ID Feature, when a second call is received while talking, the new caller's name and phone number will be displayed (p. 47).




Voice Mail Service

If this equipment does cause harmful interference to radio or television reception, which can be determined by turning the equipment off and on, the user is encouraged to try to correct the interference by one or more of the following measures.

- Routine care—wipe the unit with a soft cloth. Do not use benzine, thinner, or any abrasive powder. When you leave the unit unused for a long period of time, unplug the AC adaptor from the outlet.
- off there is any trouble—disconnect the unit from the telephone line and connect a known working phone. If the known working phone operates properly, have your unit repaired by one of the authorized Panasonic Factory Service Centers. If the known working phone does not operate properly, consult your telephone company.
