to your BT Synergy 3105 digital cordless telephone

- Digital call quality with a range of up to 300 metres outdoors and up to 50 metres indoors (in ideal conditions).
- 50 Name and number phonebook.
- Use Caller Display to see who is calling and keep track of unanswered calls*.
- Register up to 5 handsets to the base without the need for additional wiring, giving you a complete phone system on a single line.
- The BT Synergy 3105 is a Digitally Enhanced Cordless Telecommunications (DECT) product and is GAP compatible.

^{*} You must subscribe to your network provider's Caller Display service for this feature to work. A quarterly fee is payable.

This User Guide provides you with all the information you need to get the most from your phone.

You must first set up your phone before you can use it.

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Getting started

WARNING

Do not place your BT Synergy 3105 in the bathroom or other humid areas.

Handset range

The BT Synergy 3105 has a range of 300 metres outdoors when there is a clear line of sight between the base and handset. When there is no clear line of sight between the base and handset, e.g. base indoors and handset either indoors or outdoors, the range could be reduced to 50 metres. Thick stone walls can severely affect the range.

Signal strength

The symbol on your handset display indicates when you are in range. When you are out of range, it flashes and BASE 1 is displayed.

The base station must be plugged into the mains at all times.

IMPORTANT

Do not connect the telephone line until at least one of the handsets is fully charged.

The base station must be plugged into the mains power at all times.

You must charge your handset for 16 hours before you can use it.

Location


You need to place your BT Synergy 3105 within 2 metres of a mains power and telephone socket so that the cables will reach.

Make sure it is at least 1 metre away from other electrical appliances to avoid interference.


Your BT Synergy 3105 works by sending radio signals between the handset and base. The strength of the signal depends on where you site the base. Putting it as high as possible ensures the best signal.

Setting up


 Plug the mains power cable into the base. Use the power supply with the clear plastic end.



The green Power/In use light comes on.



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- 3. Insert the 2 x AAA NiMH batteries supplied. Then slide the battery compartment cover into place.
- 4. Place the handset on the base to charge for at least 16 hours. The red Charging light comes on (the red Charging light stays on even when the batteries are full charged). The handset is pre-registered to the base as SYNERGY HS 1. This is shown on the display. When the handset is fully charged the display shows a full battery symbol.
- After 16 hours, plug one end of the telephone line cord into your BT Synergy 3105 base and the other end into the telephone wall socket.

Talk/Standby time

Under ideal conditions, fully charged handset batteries should give about 14 hours talk time or 350 hours standby time on a single charge.

Your BT Synergy 3105 is now ready for use.

BATTERY LOW WARNING

If the handset battery symbol is empty and flashing, and you hear a warning beep every minute, you will need to recharge your handset before you can use it.

Battery performance

To keep your batteries in the best condition, leave the handset off the base for a few hours at a time (after the initial 16 hour charge).

New NiMH batteries do not reach full capacity until they have been in normal use for several days.

Running the batteries right down at least once a week will help them last as long as possible.

The charge capacity of rechargeable batteries will reduce with time as they wear out, so reducing the talk/ standby time of the handset. Eventually they will need to be replaced. New batteries can be obtained from the BT Synergy Helpline 0870 605 8047.

Under no circumstances should non-rechargeable batteries be used. Use only approved Nickel Metal Hydride batteries (NiMH) size AAA capacity 550mAL 1.2V. Using unapproved batteries will invalidate your guarantee and may damage the telephone

Getting started

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Range indicator

The symbol on your handset display indicates when you are in range of the base. If the symbol flashes and you hear a warning beep, you are out of range and will need to move closer to the base.


Keep the charger connected to the mains power at all times.

If you have purchased the BT Synergy 3105 with multiple handsets

 Connect the mains power adaptor to the charger(s) and switch on. Use the power supply with the red plastic end.




2. Insert the batteries and charge the handset(s) for at least 16 hours.

Your BT Synergy 3005 additional handsets come pre-registered to the base as SYNERGY HS2, SYNERGY HS3 and SYNERGY HS4. This is shown on the display.







Getting to know your phone

Navigating the menus

Your BT Synergy 3105 handset has a menu system which is easy to use. Each menu has a list of options, which you can see on the menu map on the following page.

When the handset is switched on and in standby:

- Press to open the main menu then press and to scroll to the menu option you want.

For example to change the handset ringer volume:

- ✓ scroll ▼ to HANDSET ✓ scroll ▼ to RING VOL ✓.
- 2. Scroll \triangle and ∇ to select volume \checkmark to confirm.

Exit or go back one level in the menu

Press igotimes. Or press **and hold** igotimes to return to standby.

If no buttons are pressed for 15 seconds, the handset reverts to standby automatically.

Using the phone

When the handset is off and it is placed back on the base it will switch back on automatically.

If you make a mistake when preparatory dialling, press to delete.

Call timer

The display shows the duration of all external calls, both during the call and for a few seconds after you hang up.

Caller Display

If you have subscribed to your network's Caller Display service, the caller's number (and name if stored in the phone book) is displayed. See page 29 for more information.

Switch handset on/off

1. Press and hold to switch the handset off.

Or

Press any button to switch the handset on.

Make an external call

1. Press then dial the number you want.

Preparatory dialling

Preparatory dialling allows you to enter the number before pressing the button. You can correct any mistakes before you actually make the call.

- 1. Enter the number to be dialled.
- 2. Press to dial the number.

End a call

1. Press or place the handset back on the base.

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Receiving calls

When the phone rings, the display shows CALL and the EXT symbol flashes.

 Press or if the handset is on the base, simply lift it up and speak.

Earpiece volume

During a call:

1. Press \triangle or ∇ to select volume 1 to 5.

In standby:

- 3. Press \bigcirc then \triangle or \bigcirc to select volume 1 to 5.
- 4. Press oto confirm.
- 5. Press *and hold* to return to standby.

Handsfree

Handsfree lets you talk to your caller without holding the handset. It also enables other people in the room to listen to your conversation over the loudspeaker.

To switch back to the handset at any time, press again.

During a handsfree call, press △ or ▼ to change the volume.

Make a call in handsfree

- 1. Dial the number then press .
- 2. Press to end the call.

Answer a call in handsfree

When the phone rings:

1. Press and the call is transferred to the loudspeaker.

Switch to handsfree during a call

During a call:

- 1. Press . The call is transferred to the loudspeaker.
- 2. Press to end the call.

Redial

The last 5 numbers called are stored in the redial list for quick and easy redialling. The name will be displayed instead of the number, if a name/number match is found in the phonebook (see page 18). The most recent number will be shown first.

Any number entered during a call after a or will not be stored in the redial list.

- Press repeatedly to display and scroll through the redial list.
- 2. With the number you want displayed, press 🔊 to dial.

Secrecy

Use secrecy during a call to mute your voice so that you can talk to someone nearby without your caller hearing you.

- 1. Press , MUTE is displayed. Your caller cannot hear you now.
- 2. Press **again** to return to your caller.

Paging

You can alert handset users that they are wanted or locate a missing handset.

- 1. Press on the base. The handsets will ring and the displays will flash INT # # #.
- 2. Press Page to stop the paging ring

Or

Press any button on the handset.

Paging calls cannot be answered by a handset.

Entering names

Use the keypad letters to enter names, e.g. to store TOM:

Press **8** once to enter T.
Press **6** three times to enter O.
Press **6** once to enter M.

Writing tips

If you make a mistake, press \bigotimes to delete the last character or digit.

Press **1** once to insert a space, or *twice* to insert a hyphen (-). Press *three* times to enter 1.

Phonebook with Caller Display

If you subscribe to a Caller Display service, and want the names in your Phonebook displayed instead of the phone numbers, you must store the full telephone number including the full dialling code.

Insert a 'pause' in a stored number

You may need to enter a pause when storing international numbers, charge card numbers or if you connect your telephone to a switchboard. (For more information on use with a switchboard, see page 46)

When storing a number, at the point you want to insert a pause, press and hold \triangle until P is displayed.

You may enter as many pauses as required.

Phonebook

You can store up to 50 names and numbers in the Phonebook. Names can be up to 8 characters long and numbers up to 20 digits.

Store a name and number

- 1. Press ot display PHONEBK.
- 2. Press and LIST is displayed.
- 3. Scroll **T** to ADD, then press .
- NAME? Is displayed. Use the keypad to enter a name (8 characters max).
- 5. Press . NUMBER? is displayed, enter the telephone number and press .

Now either press to enter another entry or press and hold to return to standby.

Dial from the phonebook

- 1. Press ot display PHONEBK.
- Press and LIST is displayed. Press again.
- 3. Press \triangle or ∇ to scroll to the entry you want.

Or

Press lacktriangledown then use lacktriangledown or lacktriangledown to scroll to the entry you want.

Or

Press then enter the first letter of the name you want, e.g. for Tom, press to search for names beginning with T.

4. Press to dial.

Edit an entry

- 1. Press ot display PHONEBK.

- 4. Edit the name, using 💉 to delete characters and the keypad to enter new ones then press 🕜 .

The number is displayed.

- 5. Edit the number, using 💉 to delete digits and the keypad to enter new ones then press 🕜 .
- 6. Press *and hold* **(X)** to return to standby.

If you want phonebook entries to be recognised by Caller Display and to display the name of the person calling then you must enter the full telephone number including dialling code.

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Delete entries

- 1. Press oto display PHONEBK.

- 4. The number for the entry is displayed, press $\ensuremath{\checkmark}$ again.

The display shows CONFIRM?

- 5. Press **t**o confirm deletion.
- 6. Press *and hold* to return to standby.

Keypad beeps

When you press a button on your handset, you hear a beep. You can switch the beeps on and off.

- 2. Press ot display BEEP.
- 3. Press oto display KEYTONE then press .
- Press △ or ▼ to select ON or OFF then press ✓ to confirm.
- 5. Press *and hold* to return to standby.

Ringer volume

Select from volumes 1 to 5 or turn the ringer off completely if you do not want to be disturbed.

- 2. Press \bigcirc then \bigcirc to display RING VOL then press \bigcirc .

The current ring volume is displayed and played.

- 3. Press △ or ▼ to select VOLUME 1 to 5 or VOL OFF (you will hear a sample ring) and press ❖ to confirm.
- 4. Press *and hold* to return to standby.

External/Internal ringer melody

You can set different melodies for internal and external calls. There are 5 melodies to choose from.

The current ringer melody is displayed and played.

- 4. Press *and hold* to return to standby.

Keypad lock

Lock the keypad to prevent numbers from being accidentally dialled while carrying the handset around.

1. Press then . The keypad is now locked.

To unlock the keypad again:

1. Press 8 then 9 then .

Or

Press then .



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Auto talk

When the handset it on the base, you can answer a call just by picking it up. When auto talk is switched off, you will always have to press to answer a call. The default setting is On.

- Press or to select 0N or 0FF and press or confirm.
- 4. Press *and hold* to return to standby.

Name a handset

The handset name is pre-set to SYNERGY. You can personalise each handset to the name you want, using up to a maximum of 8 characters.

- 2. Press \bigcirc then \bigcirc to scroll to NAME and press \bigcirc .
- Press to delete the current name and then use the keypad to enter a new name and press to confirm.
- 4. Press *and hold* to return to standby.

Use the button to correct any mistakes.

Handset settings

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To return the handset to English:

- 1. Press \bigcirc then \bigcirc three times.
- 2. Press then seven times.
- Press then o until ENGLISH is displayed and press to confirm.

Language

You can change the language used on the handset display. Choose from English, Francais, Deutsch, Nederl, Italiano, Espanol, Portuges, Norsk, Dansk, Svenska and Suomi.

- 3. Press △ or ▼ to scroll and display the language you want and press ✓ to confirm.
- 4. Press *and hold* **x** to return to standby.

Ringer volume

Select from volumes 1 to 5 or turn the ringer off completely if you do not want to be disturbed.

- 2. Press the display shows BASE VOL, press .
- 3. Press △ or ▼ to select V0LUME 1 to 5 or V0L 0FF (you will hear a sample ring) and press ✔ to confirm.
- 4. Press *and hold* **x** to return to standby.

Ringer melody

Choose from 5 base ringer melodies.

- 3. Press △ or ▼ to select MELODY 1 to 5 (you will hear a sample ring) and press ✓ to confirm.
- 4. Press *and hold* **S** to return to standby.

Select a base

If a handset it registered to more than one base, you can select which one it will use. (For more information on registering your handset to another base, see page 33.)

- Press ☐ or ▼ to select BASE 1 to 4 or AUTO and press to confirm.
- 4. Press *and hold* to return to standby.

Change base PIN

- Press then to display PIN COIE and press .
 Display shows PIN?
- 3. Enter your 4-digit PIN then press . Display shows NEW PIN.
- 4. Enter a new PIN and press . Display shows RETYPE.
- 6. Press *and hold* to return to standby.

IMPORTANT

If you change the base PIN, keep a record of new number by writing in the space provided on page 48.

You need your base PIN for registering handsets and for some other optional settings.

The original PIN setting is 0000.

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Default settings

You can reset your BT Synergy 3105 to its original/default settings.

- 1. Press \bigcirc then \bigcirc to display SETUP.
- 2. Press then to display DEFAULT and press . Display shows PIN?
- 3. Enter the 4-digit base PIN and press .

The display flashes BASE 1 and then SYNERGY HS 1.

Your BT Synergy 3105 is now reset to its default settings.

If you reset your phone you will delete any Phonebook, Redial and Calls list entries.

Caller Display

If you subscribe to a Caller Display service you can see the caller's number on the handset display (unless it has been withheld) before you answer the call. If your BT Synergy 3105 finds a name/number match in your handset phonebook, the name will be displayed instead.

Calls list

Whether you answer a call or not, the caller's details are stored in the calls list.

When you have new entries in the calls list the icon will flash in the handset display.

Up to 20 names/numbers can be stored in the calls list. When the calls list is full, a new call replaces the oldest call.

View the calls list

Press ▼ to open the calls list then scroll △ or ▼ through the list.

If a name/number match is found in the phonebook, the caller's name will be displayed.

IMPORTANT

To use Caller Display and Call Waiting you must first subscribe to the service from your network provider. A quarterly fee is payable.

Caller information not available

Occasionally the telephone number of the caller is not available and cannot therefore be displayed.

In this case, your display will show one of the following explanatory messages:

WITHHELD – caller has withheld their number

UNAVAILA – the network is unable to send the number

RINGBACK – following a ringback request

OPERATOR – call is via the operator

PAYPHONE – call is from a payphone

INTERNAT – call is from an international number

Ensure that you store the full telephone number, including the area code, otherwise the name will not match the number stored in the phonebook.

Caller Display and Call Waiting

- Press to display the caller's number, press again to see the time and date of the call.
- Press to return to the calls list or press and hold to return to standby.

Dial a calls list number

- Press
 ▼ to open the calls list then scroll or to the entry you want.
- 2. Press to dial the number.

Copy a number to the phonebook

- Press ▼ to open the calls list then scroll △ or ▼ to the entry you want and press ▼.
- 2. Press until the display shows ADD then press again to display NAME?
- 3. Enter the name (of up to 8 characters) and press to confirm.

See page 18 for details on how to enter a name.

Once stored in the phonebook, the entry will be deleted from the calls list.

Delete an entry

- Press ▼ to open the calls list then scroll △ or ▼ to the entry you want and press ▼.
- 3. Press and the entry is deleted.

Delete the entire list

- Press T to open the Calls list then press . DEL ALL is displayed.
- Press to confirm and the display shows EMPTY for 2 seconds.

Call Waiting

If an incoming call arrives while you are already on the phone, you will hear a soft beep every 5 seconds. This beep is not audible to the person you are speaking to. The second caller's number (and name if stored in the phonebook) will appear on the handset display.

Instead of the engaged tone, the second caller will hear an announcement to hold on as you know they are waiting.

IMPORTANT

To use Call Waiting you must first subscribe to the service from your network provider. A quarterly fee is payable.

You can use on to switch back and forth between the two calls without disconnecting either.

The second caller is only charged for their call from the moment you answer, not while they are waiting for your initial contact.

Accept a Call Waiting call

If, during a call, you hear the call waiting beep:

- 1. Press on to put you current call on hold and speak to the second caller.
- 2. Press again to return to your first caller.

To end the first call and take the second call:

- 1. When speaking to the first caller, press to end that call.
- 2. Your handset will ring, press **again** to connect to the waiting caller.

Additional handsets & bases

Up to 5 handsets can be registered and operated from any one BT Synergy 3105 base.

With additional handsets, you can make internal calls between two handsets while a third is making an external call.



Each handset can be registered on up to 4 bases.

Register handset to base

Make sure the handset is close to the base.

At the base:

1. Press and hold Page until you hear two beeps (after about 10 seconds) then release.

At the handset:



IMPORTANT

Each additional handset you buy must be registered with the base.

Remember to charge the batteries of new handsets for at least 16 hours before use. If the display shows NOT REG, and n is flashing, your handset is not yet registered with the base.

Your handset is supplied pre-registered as Handset 1 to its base (Base 1).

If you have purchased a Multiple pack, the additional handsets supplied will be pre-registered as Handset 2, Handset 3, Handset 4. All handsets will be pre-registered to Base 1.

If the handset does not find the base, it will return to the previous menu. If this happens, try registering again using a different base number. Make sure you are close to the base.

You cannot deregister the handset you are using.

The display shows $BS\ 1\ 2\ 3\ 4$. The numbers that are flashing indicate other bases that the handset is already registered to.

3. Enter 1 - 4 for the base you want to register to, followed by your base PIN (original setting 0000) then press .

The display shows SEARCH 1, 2, 3, 4. and 2^{n} flashes until the handset locates the base.

When the base is located, the handset will be automatically selected and shown on the display.

De-register handsets

- 1. Press \bigcirc then scroll \bigcirc to SETUP and press \bigcirc .
- Scroll ▼ to DEL HS and press ▼.
 The display shows PIN?
- 3. Enter your PIN (original setting 0000) and press .
- 4. Scroll or to select the handset (1-5) you want to de-register then press . Display shows CONFIRM?
- 5. Press **t**o confirm.

Once deregistered, the handset display shows NOT REG.

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Internal calls

If you have more than one handset registered to the base, you can make internal calls between handsets.

1. Press and enter the handset number you want to call, (1-5).

The receiving handset rings and the display shows INT and the number of the handset calling.

2. Press to end the call.

Transferring calls

You can transfer an external call to another handset registered to the base.

During an external call:

1. Press then the number of the handset you want (1-5).

The caller is put on hold.

2. When the other handset answers you can talk to them and press to transfer the call.

Or

If the other handset does not answer, press to speak to your caller again.

36 Additional handsets & bases

If the handset does not answer, press to speak to your caller again.

On a 3-way call, the call can only be ended by the handset that set it up.

Press to exit the call.

3-way conversation

You can talk to an external caller and an internal caller at the same time on your handset.

During an external call:

- Press to put your caller on hold. Enter the number of the internal handset (1-5) you wish to transfer the call to.
- 2. When the handset answers, press *and hold* for about 3 seconds.

You can now start your 3-way conversation.

3. Press to end the call.

Handset priority

If you have more than one handset registered to the base, you can select one handset (or the base) to ring first. You can also set the number of rings before the other handsets start ringing.

- 2. Scroll **▼** to PRIORITY and press **◆**.
- 3. Scroll **▼** to SELECT and press **◆**.

4. Scroll igvee to select the option you want, either BASE or HS 1-5 and press igvee.

Display shows RINGS 1-9.

5. Scroll **▼** to the number of rings you want and press to confirm.

PRIORITY is displayed.

6. Press to confirm. OFF is displayed. Press to switch OFF or scroll to ON and press to switch ON.


Help

Replacing the handset batteries

After a time, you may find that the handset batteries are running out of charge more quickly. This is a standard sign of wear and the batteries will need replacing.

For spare AAA rechargeable batteries, please contact the BT Synergy Helpline 0870 605 8047.

Remove the battery compartment cover and remove the existing batteries. Insert new batteries and replace the compartment cover.



Problems	Possible cause
No display	The batteries may be flat or dead. Recharge or replace the batteries.
	Is the handset switched off? To switch on, see page 14.
No dial tone	Check that the telephone line cord is plugged into the phone socket.
	Check that the base is connected to the mains power and switched on.

Help

Problems	Possible cause
You cannot link up with the base station	Is $\hat{\mathbf{r}}^{\mathbb{N}}$ flashing in the display? You may be out of range, move closer to the base.
	Check that the base is connected to the mains power and switched on.
	Are the batteries low or flat? If so, charge the batteries or replace them if necessary.
	If using more than one base, check that you are connected to the correct base. See page 26.
No ring on the handset	Check that the ringer volume is switched on, see page 21.
	Check that the base is plugged into the phone socket and that it is also connected to the mains power and switched on.
Buzzing noise on my radio, TV, computer or hearing aid	Sometimes, your BT Synergy 3105 and other DECT GAI compatible handsets can interfere with other electrical equipment if placed too close. Try moving at least one metre away from such appliances.
The handset is not charging properly	Check that the base is plugged into the mains socket and switched on.

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Problems	Possible cause
	Check that you are using the correct power adaptor plug. BT Synergy 3105 base – Item Code 872260. BT Synergy 3005 charger – Item Code 003313.
	Check that the handset is sitting correctly in the base.
	Check that the handset batteries have been correctly fitted.
Cannot adjust an option in the base station	Someone else might be making changes using another handset. Try again when the other handset user has finished.
	Have you pressed t o confirm your selection?

The item number for the power supply used with the charger is 003313 (only applicable when you have purchased the BT Synergy 3105 Multiple pack).
- Use only the approved rechargeable batteries supplied. Spare rechargeable batteries are available from the BT Synergy Helpline 0870 605 8047.
- Do not open the handset (except to replace the handset batteries) or the base.
 This could expose you to high voltages or other risks. Contact the Helpline for all repairs.
- Radio signal transmitted between the handset and base may cause interference to hearing aids.
- It is recommended that advice from a qualified expert be sought before using this product in the vicinity of emergency/intensive care medical equipment.

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- It is recommended that if you have a pacemaker fitted you check with a medical expert before using this product.

How many telephones can you have?

All items of telephone equipment have a Ringer Equivalence Number (REN), which is used to calculate the number of items which may be connected to any other telephone line. Your BT Synergy 3105 has a REN of 1. A total REN of 4 is allowed. If the total REN of 4 is exceeded, the telephone may not ring.

With different telephone types there is not guarantee of ringing, even when the REN is less than 4.

- Only use approved AAA NiMH rechargeable batteries.

Connecting to a switchboard

This product is intended for use within the UK for connection to public telephone network and compatible switchboards, which support tone dialling and timed break recall. If in doubt please consult your service provider.

Switchboard external line access code

You may need to enter an access code (e.g. 9) in order to get an outside line. So that the switchboard has time to pick up an outside line, you may also need to add a Pause after the access code.

Recall

Recall **R** is used when connected to certain switchboards (PBXs) and some BT Calling Features, or those services available via your network provider.

Dialling mode

- Scroll ▼ to DIAL MODE and press ▼.
- 3. Press △ or ▼ to select either TONE or PULSE and press ✔ to confirm.

Automatically insert a pause after access code

With some switchboards, you may be required to dial a pause after entering the switchboard access code (e.g. 9) to enable you to get an outside line.

This feature automatically inserts a pause between the access code and the telephone number you have entered in the phonebook. However, for this feature to work, you must still enter the access code before the telephone number when storing the number in the Phonebook.


- 2. Scroll **▼** to display PABX and press **◆**.
- 3. Scroll **▼** to PBX 1 and press **◆** to display PIN?
- 4. Enter the PIN (original code 0000) and press .
- 5. Enter the switchboard access code (e.g. 9) and press .

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Length of pause

You can also adjust the length of the pause to 3 or 5 seconds, according to the switchboard.

- 2. Scroll **▼** to display PABX and press **◆**.
- 3. Scroll **▼** to PAUSE.
- The display shows 3 SEC.
 If you want a 5 second pause, press ▼ to display 5 SEC.
- 5. Press **t**o confirm your choice.
