

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
# Connecting an aerial and VCR to the TV




2. labelled  $\exists \Gamma$  on the rear of the TV. 3. Notes: ignoring the scart lead connection.

#### Connecting an aerial only

Inserting batteries into the remote control







Always remember to:

- · observe the correct polarity when inserting batteries,
- dispose of batteries in an environmentally friendly way.

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1. Connect your aerial lead to the IN\* socket on your VCR.


Connect an RF lead from the OUT\* socket on your VCR to the aerial socket

Connect a fully wired 21-pin scart lead from the scart socket marked  $\bigcirc$  3/ $\bigcirc$ 3 on the rear of the TV to a scart socket on your VCR\*\*

\*Socket names may vary depending on make and model of VCR. Refer to your VCR instruction manual for details.

\*\*If your VCR does not have a scart socket follow the connecting instructions above You will also need to manually tune the VCR to a spare TV channel (ideally channel 0, refer to the 'Manual Programme Preset menu' section of the main instruction manual).

**1**. Connect your aerial lead to the aerial socket labelled  $\exists \Gamma$  on the rear of the TV.



Connect the TV plug to your mains socket and switch on.

The TV is usually switched on. If not, push in the On/Off button ① on the front

If the red standby mode indicator on the front of the TV is lit, press the TV I/ $^{\circ}$  button on the remote control to switch on the TV set. Please be patient as the picture may take a few moments to appear on the TV screen.

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
### Automatically tuning the TV


- When you switch on the TV for the first time the Sony logo appears on the TV screen, 1. followed by the Language/Country menu with the word 'English' highlighted. Press the ♠ or ♥ buttons on the remote control to highlight your required language. Press the **OK** button to confirm your choice. From now on all menus appear in your chosen language.
- The word 'Country' is now highlighted. Press the ♠ or ♥ buttons on the remote control 2. to highlight the country in which you are using the TV. It is important to select the correct country to ensure correct Teletext displays. Press the OK button to confirm your choice.
- The picture rotation prompt appears. Sometimes the Earth's natural magnetism can 3. cause the screen to look tilted.
  - a) If no correction is required, press the + button on the remote control.
  - b) If some correction is required, press the **OK** button on the remote control. Press the  $\blacklozenge$  or  $\blacklozenge$  buttons to rotate the picture over a range of -5 to +5. Press the **OK** button to store.
- The autotune prompt screen appears. Press the OK button to select Yes. The 4. autotune procedure begins, tuning all the available channels.
  - A display appears on the TV screen to inform you of the tuning progress.

If no channels are found, a display appears on the TV screen asking you to confirm your aerial is connected. Check the aerial has been connected correctly then press the **OK** button to repeat the tuning process.

- Once all available channels have been tuned the 'Programme Sorting' menu 5. appears. This menu allows you to rearrange the order of the channels on the TV.
  - a) If you do not wish to rearrange the order, press the **MENU** button to remove the 'Programme Sorting' menu from the TV screen.
  - b) If you wish to rearrange the order, press the ♠ or ♥ buttons to select the channel you wish to move, then press the → button. Press the + or + buttons to select the new position for your selected channel. Press the **OK** button to confirm. The selected channel moves to its new position. Repeat this procedure if you wish to move other channels. Press the **MENU** button to remove the 'Programme Sorting' menu from the TV screen when you have finished rearranging the channel order.


#### The TV has now tuned in all the available channels and is ready for use





Watching a video tape

Providing that you have used a fully wired 21 pin scart lead to connect the VCR to the TV:



1. With a video tape inserted into the VCR, press the 'PLAY' button on the VCR. The TV automatically displays the video picture.

If the video picture does not appear, press the E/ Is button on the remote control repeatedly until the video picture is displayed on the TV screen.

Press the  $\Box$  (TV) button on the remote control to return to normal viewing. 2.

If you have not used a scart lead to connect your VCR you must select the channel you have manually tuned the VCR to in order to view pictures Note: from the VCR

You can now use your TV for everyday viewing.

#### Basic overview of the remote control

| • <b>Mute button</b><br>Press to mute the TV sound. Press again to<br>restore the sound.   |
|--|
| <b>TV Standby button</b><br>Press to switch off the TV temporarily. The red standby indicator on the front of the TV is lit when the TV is in standby mode. Press again to return to normal operation.   |
| • Numbered buttons<br>In TV Mode: Press to input the required channel<br>number. For two digit channel numbers, enter<br>the second digit within two seconds.<br>In Teletext Mode: Press to enter the three digits<br>of the page number you wish to view. |
| • Channel Return button<br>Press to return to the previous channel you were<br>watching (provided you watched it for at least 5<br>seconds).   |
| • <b>Teletext button</b><br>Press to switch Teletext on or off.  |
| <br>• <b>TV button</b><br>Press to return to normal TV operation from<br>Teletext or Video Input mode.   |
| Programme buttons<br>In TV Mode: Press to display the next (+) or<br>previous (-) channel.<br>In Teletext Mode: Press to select the next (+) or<br>previous (-) Teletext page.   |
| Volume buttons<br>Press to increase (+) or decrease (-) the volume.  |
