Important Warranty Information Regarding Television Format Viewing

Standard screen format televisions (4:3, the aspect ratio of the screen width to height) are primarily designed to view standard format full-motion video. The images displayed on them should primarily be in the standard 4:3 ratio format and constantly moving. Displaying stationary graphics and images on screen, such as the dark top and bottom letterbox bars (wide screen pictures), should be limited to no more than 15% of the total television viewing per week.

Wide screen format televisions (16:9, the aspect ratio of the screen width to height) are primarily designed to view wide screen format full-motion video. The images displayed on them should primarily be in the wide screen 16:9 ratio format, or expanded to fill the screen if your model offers this feature, and constantly moving. Displaying stationary graphics and images on screen, such as the dark side-bars on non-expanded standard format television video and programming, should be limited to no more than 15% of the total television viewing per week.

Additionally, viewing other stationary images and text such as stock market reports, video game displays, station logos, web sites or computer graphics and patterns, should be limited as described above for all televisions. Displaying any stationary images that exceed the above guidelines can cause uneven aging of picture tubes (CRTs) that leave subtle, but permanent burned-in ghost images in the television picture. To avoid this, vary the programming and images, and primarily display full screen moving images, not stationary patterns or dark bars. On television models that offer picture sizing features, use these controls to view the different formats as a full screen picture.

Be careful in the selection and duration of television formats used for viewing. Uneven CRT aging as a result of format selection and use, as well as other burned-in images, is not covered by your Samsung limited warranty.

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











You can display a VCR or DVD Player, etc. by using the display deck.

Inserting the Batteries into the Remote Control








You must insert or replace the batteries in the remote control when you:


- Purchase the television
- Find that the remote control is no longer operating correctly
- Remove the cover on the rear of the remote control by pressing the symbol (\$\opi\$) downwards and then pulling firmly to remove it.
- Insert two R03, UM4, "AAA" 1.5V or equivalent batteries taking care to respect the polarities:
 - on the battery against on the remote control
 - + on the battery against + on the remote control
- 3 Replace the cover by aligning it with the base of the remote control and pressing it back into place.
 - Do not mix battery types, i.e. alkaline and manganese.

Infrared Remote Control



The performance of the remote control may be affected by bright light.

Connecting to an Aerial or Cable Television Network



To view television channels correctly, a signal must be received by the set from one of the following sources:

- ♦ An outdoor aerial
- ♦ A cable television network
- ♦ A satellite network
- In the first three cases, connect the aerial or network input cable to the ANT IN jack on the rear of the television.
- 2 If you are using an indoor aerial, you may need to adjust it when tuning your television until you obtain a picture that is both sharp and clear.

Connecting a Satellite Receiver or Decoder

In order to watch television programmes broadcast via a satellite network, you must connect a satellite receiver to the rear of TV. Also, in order to descramble a coded transmission signal, you must connect a decoder to the rear of TV.

Using a SCART cable

Connect the receiver (or decoder) SCART cable to one of the SCART connectors on the rear of the television.

♦ Using a coaxial cable


Connect a coaxial cable to the:

- Receiver (or Decoder) output socket.
- Television aerial input socket.
- If you wish to connect both a satellite receiver (or decoder) and a VCR, you should connect the:
 - ◆ Receiver (or Decoder) to the VCR
 - ◆ VCR to the television

Otherwise, connect the receiver (or decoder) directly to the television.

Switching Your Television On and Off



The mains lead is attached to the rear of your television.

- 1 Plug the mains lead into an appropriate socket.
 - The main voltage is indicated on the rear of the television and the frequency is 50 or 60Hz.
- Press the power switch on the side of the television to "ON" (I).

 Result: The Standby indicator on the front of the television lights up.
- 3 Press the POWER ((()) button on the remote control to switch the television on.

Result: The programme that you were watching last is reselected automatically.

- If your television isn't turned on when the POWER ((()) button is pressed, press the SELECT button to check if "TV" mode has been chosen.
 - If you have not yet stored any channels, no clear picture appears. Refer to "Storing Channels Automatically" on page 20 or "Storing Channels Manually" on page 22.
- 4 To switch your television off, press the power switch to "**OFF**".

Placing Your Television in Standby Mode




Your television can be placed in Standby mode, in order to reduce the power consumption.

Standby mode can be useful when you wish to interrupt viewing temporarily (during a meal, for example).

1 Press the **POWER** ((()) button on the remote control.

Result: The screen is turned off and the Standby indicator on the front of the television lights up.

- 2 To switch the television back on, simply press the POWER (③) button again or a numeric button.
 - You can also switch the TV back on by pressing the TV (□), P ()(□) or numeric button.




Familiarizing Yourself with the Remote Control

The remote control is used mainly to:

- ♦ Change channels and adjust the volume
- ♦ Set up the television using the on-screen menu system

The following table presents the most frequently used buttons and their functions.

Used to display the next stored channel. Used to display the previous stored channel. □ to ③ Used to display the corresponding channels. For double digit channels, the second digit must be pushed immediately after the first. Failure to do this will result in a single digit channel being displayed. -// Used to select a channel numbered ten or over. Press this button, and the "" or "" symbol is displayed. Enter the two or three-digit channel number. PRE-CH Press the PRE-CH button. The TV will switch to the last channel viewed. To quickly switch between two channels that are far apart, select the frist channel, then use the numeric buttons to select the second channel. Then, use the PRE-CH button to quickly alternate between them. Used to increase the volume. Used to decrease the volume. MUTE Used to switch the sound off temporarily. (☆) ➤ To turn the sound back on, press this button again, or press the ④ or ⑥ button. MENU Used to display the on-screen menu system. Plug & Play Feature

When the television is initially powered on several basic customer settings proceed automatically and subsequently. The following settings are available.

1 If the television is in Standby mode, press the **POWER** (③) button on the remote control.

Result: The message Start Plug & Play is displayed.

2 To start Plug & Play, press the ENTER (→) button.

Result: The Language menu is displayed.

3 Select the appropriate language by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button. Press the ENTER (→) button to confirm the language.

Result: The message Check antenna input. is displayed.

Make sure that the antenna is connected to the TV, then press the ENTER () button.

Result: The Country menu is displayed.

5 Select your country by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button. Press the ENTER (→) button to confirm your choice.

Result: The **Search** menu is displayed.

6 To start channel store, press the **ENTER** (→) button.

Result: The search will end automatically. Channels are sorted and stored in the order which reflects their position in the frequency range (with lowest first and highest last). When it has finished, the Clock menu is displayed.

To stop the search before it has finished or return to normal viewing, press the **MENU** () button.

7 Press the ◀ or ▶ button to move to the **Hour** or **Minute**. Set these by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button.

You can also set the Hour and Minute by pressing the numeric buttons directly.

8 Press the **ENTER** () button.

When the settings are all finished, the message Enjoy your watching. is displayed, and then the channel which has been stored will be activated.

If you want to reset this feature...

1 Press the **MENU** () button.

> Result: The main menu is displayed.

2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button until the **Setup** is selected.

The options available in the **Setup** group are displayed.

3 Press the **ENTER** () button.

4 Press the ▲ or ▼ button until the Plug & Play is selected.

Press the **ENTER** () button.

Result: This feature starts with the message Start Plug &

Play displayed.

Displaying Information

You can view the channel information and setting status you selected by pressing the "INFO ()" button on the remote control.





Choosing Your Language





When you start using your television for the first time, you must select the language which will be used for displaying menus and indications.

1 Press the MENU () button.

Result: The main menu is displayed.

2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button until the **Setup** is selected.

Result: The options available in the **Setup** group are displayed.

- 3 Press the ENTER (→) button.
- 4 Press the ▲ or ▼ button until the Language is selected. Press the ENTER (→) button.

Result: The available languages are listed.

5 Select the appropriate language by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button. Press the ENTER (→) button to confirm your choice.

Adjusting the Screen Automatically (Self Focus)

The "Self Focus" feature automatically finds the optimum picture quality when blurring, overlapping colours or incorrect focus occurs. These conditions may be caused by moving your TV.

1 Press the **MENU** () button.

> Result: The main menu is displayed.

2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button until the **Setup** is selected.

The options available in the **Setup** group are displayed.

- 3 Press the **ENTER** () button.
- 4 Press the ▲ or ▼ button until the **Self Focus** is selected. Press the **ENTER** () button.

Result: The **Self Focus** is selected.

5 Press the **ENTER** () button again


Result: The self focus process begins with the message Self


Focus and a horizontal bar is displayed. During the process, minor distortions of the picture may occur. At this time, the colours may diffuse and a searching action will appear on the edges of the screen. This is a normal part of the adjustment. When it is finished, this will disappear and optimum picture quality can be enjoyed.

- It can be displayed simply by pressing the SELF FOCUS button.
- Changing channels and any other signal changes will pause self focus until a stable signal has returned. It resumes after the signal has been stabilised. This feature will not work without a signal.
 - Ambient light that is too bright may affect the self focus. If this occurs, darken the environment and try again.









Deactivating the Automatic Execution of Self Focus







The "Self Focus" feature starts by default. It will automatically begin 10 minutes after switching on the power and the appearance of the screen image. To set the optimum picture quality, "Self Focus" will automatically begin again after another 30 minutes, as the screen image is then fully stabilised.

1 Press the **MENU** () button.

Result: The main menu is displayed.

2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button until the **Setup** is selected.

Result: The options available in the **Setup** group are displayed.

- 3 Press the ENTER () button.
- 4 Press the ▲ or ▼ button until the **Self Focus** is selected. Press the **ENTER** (→) button.

Result: The options available in the **Self Focus** group are displayed.

- 5 Press the ▲ or ▼ button until the Auto is selected. Press the ENTER (→) button.
- To turn off the automatic execution of the self focus feature, select **off** by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button. Press the **ENTER** (→) button to confirm.

Removing "Self Focus" from the Display

1 Press the MENU () button.

Result: The main menu is displayed.

2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button until the **Setup** is selected.

Result: The options available in the **Setup** group are displayed.

- 3 Press the ENTER () button.
- Press the ▲ or ▼ button until the Self Focus is selected. Press the ENTER () button.

Result: The options available in the **Self Focus** group are displayed.

- Fress the ▲ or ▼ button until the Message Display is selected. Press the ENTER (→) button.
- To remove the message **self Focus** and the horizontal bar on the screen during the self focus process, select **off** by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button. Press the **ENTER** (→) button to confirm.







Storing Channels Automatically

You can scan for the frequency ranges available to you, (availability depends on your country). Automatically allocated programme numbers may not correspond to actual or desired programme numbers. However you can sort numbers manually and clear any channels you do not wish to watch.

1 Press the **MENU** () button.

Result: The main menu is displayed.

- Press the ▲ or ▼ button until the Channe1 is selected.
 Result: The options available in the Channe1 group are displayed.
- 3 Press the ENTER (←) button. Result: The Auto Store is selected.
- 4 Press the ENTER () button again.

 Result: The Auto Store menu is displayed with the Country selected.
- Fress the ENTER (→) button once again. Select your country by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button.

The countries are displayed in the following order:

Belgium - Germany - Spain - France - Italy - Netherlands - Switzerland - Sweden - United Kingdom - Eastern Europe - Others.

- If you have selected the **Others** but do not wish to scan the PAL frequency range, store the channels manually (see page 22).
- 6 Press the ENTER () button to confirm your choice
- 7 Press the ▲ or ▼ button until the **Search** is selected. Press the **ENTER** (→) button.
- 8 Press the ENTER () button to start the search.
 Result: The search will end automatically. Channels are sorted and stored in the order which reflects their position in the frequency range (with lowest first and highest last).
 The programme originally selected is then displayed.
 - To stop the search before it has finished or return to normal viewing, press the **MENU** (III) button.
- When searching and storing are complete, the **Sort** menu is displayed.
 - To sort the stored channels into the desired numerical order, go to step 5 of the "Sorting the Stored Channels" procedure on page 21.
 - To exit from the channel store function without sorting the channels, press the MENU () button repeatedly until the menus disappear.
- 10 When the channels have been stored, you can:
 - Sort them in the order required (see page21)
 - ◆ Assign names to the stored channels (refer to page 25)
 - Clear a channel (see page 24)
 - ◆ Fine-tune channel reception if necessary (see page 27)
 - Activate/deactivate the LNA (Low Noise Amplifier) feature (see page 28)
 - Activate/deactivate the Digital NR (Digital Noise Reduction) feature (see page 35)

Sorting the Stored Channels

This operation allows you to change the programme numbers of stored channels. This operation may be necessary after using the auto store. You can delete those channels you do not want to keep.

1 Press the MENU () button.

Result: The main menu is displayed.

2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button until the Channel is selected.

Result: The options available in the Channel group are

displayed.

3 Press the ENTER (→) button.

4 Press the ▲ or ▼ button until the **Sort** is selected. Press the **ENTER** (→) button.

Result: The **Sort** menu is displayed.

5 Select the channel that you wish to move by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button. Press the ENTER (→) button.

6 Select the number of the programme to which the channel is to be moved by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button. Press the ENTER (←) button.

Result: The channel is moved to its new position and all other channels are shifted accordingly.

7 Repeat steps 5 to 6 until you have moved all the channels to the required programme numbers.








Storing Channels Manually











You can store the television channels, including those received via cable networks.

When storing channels manually, you can choose:

- ♦ Whether or not to store each of the channels found
- ◆ The programme number of each stored channel which you wish to identify
- 1 Press the MENU () button.

Result: The main menu is displayed.

2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button until the Channel is selected.

Result: The options available in the **Channel** group are displayed.

- 3 Press the ENTER () button.
- 4 Press the ▲ or ▼ button until the Manual Store is selected. Press the ENTER (() button.

Result: The current channels are displayed.

5 Select the channel that you wish to move by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button. Press the ENTER (→) button.

Result: The **Prog.** is selected.

- 6 To assign a programme number to a channel, find the correct number by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button.

8 Press the ◀ or ▶ button until the Sound System is selected and press the ▲ or ▼ button. The sound standards are displayed in the following order.

BG - DK - I - L

Storing Channels Manually (continued)

- 9 If you know the number of the channel to be stored, see the following steps.
 - ◆ Press the ◀ or ▶ button until the **Channel** is selected.
 - ◆ Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select c (Air channel) or s (Cable channel).
 - ◆ Press the ▶ button.
 - ◆ Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select the required number.
 - If no sound or abnormal sound can be heard, re-select the sound standard required.
- 10 If you do not know the channel numbers, select the Search by pressing the

 or

 button. Press the
 or

 button to start the search.

Result:

The tuner scans the frequency range until the first channel or the channel that you selected is received on your screen.

- To store the channel and associated programme number, select **store** by pressing the ◀ or ▶ button. Set to **oK** by pressing the **ENTER** (→) button.
- 12 Repeat steps 9 to 11 for each channel to be stored.

Channel mode

- P (Programme mode): When completing tuning, the broadcasting stations in your area have been assigned to position numbers from P00 to P99. You can select a channel by entering the position number in this mode.
- C (Real channel mode): You can select a channel by entering the assigned number for each air broadcasting station in this mode.
- \$ (Cable channel mode): You can select a channel by entering the assigned number for each cable channel in this mode.









Skipping Unwanted Channels







You can exclude channels of your choice from the channel scan operation. When you scan through the stored channels, those that you have chosen to skip are not displayed. All channels that you do not specifically choose to skip are displayed during scanning.

1 Press the MENU () button.

Result: The main menu is displayed.

2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button until the Channel is selected.

Result: The options available in the **Channel** group are displayed.

- 3 Press the ENTER () button.
- 4 Press the ▲ or ▼ button until the Add/Delete is selected. Press the ENTER (→) button.

Result: The Add/Delete menu is displayed with the current channel selected.

- Press the P ⊚ or ⊚ button to delete or add the required channel. Press the ENTER (→) button.
- 6 Repeat step 5 for each channel to be deleted or added.

Assigning Names to Channels

Channel names will be assigned automatically when channel information is broadcast. These names can be changed, allowing you to assign new names.

1 Press the MENU () button.

Result: The main menu is displayed.

2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button until the **Channel** is selected.

Result: The options available in the Channel group are

displayed.

3 Press the ENTER (→) button.

4 Press the ▲ or ▼ button until the Name is selected. Press the ENTER (→) button.

Result: The Name menu is displayed with the current channel

selected.


5 If necessary, select the channel to be assigned to a new name by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button. Press the ENTER (→) button.

Result: Arrow indications are displayed around the name box.

- 6 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select a letter (A~Z), a number (0~9) or a symbol (-, space). Move on to the previous or next letter by pressing the ◄ or ► button.
- 7 Repeat step 5 to 6 for each channel to be assigned to a new name
- When you have finished entering the name, press the **ENTER** () button to confirm the name.







Locking the Channel







This feature allows you to lock the television so that it cannot be switched on via the front panel. It can, however, still be switched on via the remote control. By keeping the remote control away from unauthorised users, such as children, you can prevent them from watching unsuitable programme.

1 Press the MENU () button.

Result: The main menu is displayed.

2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button until the **Channel** is selected.

Result: The options available in the **Channel** group are displayed.

3 Press the ENTER () button.

Press the ▲ or ▼ button until the Child Lock is selected. Press the ENTER (→) button.

Result: The **Child Lock** menu is displayed and the current channel is shown as selected.

5 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select the channel to be locked.

Press the ENTER (→) button. To lock the channel, select Locked by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button (to unlock the channel, select Unlocked). Press the ENTER (→) button to confirm.

Fine Tuning Channel Reception

If the reception is clear, you do not have to fine tune the channel, as this is done automatically during the search and store operation. If the signal is weak or distorted, you may have to fine tune the channel manually.

1 Press the MENU () button.

Result: The main menu is displayed.

2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button until the Channel is selected.

 $\underline{ \textbf{Result}} : \qquad \textbf{The options available in the \textbf{Channel} group are}$

displayed.

3 Press the ENTER () button.

Press the ▲ or ▼ button until the Fine Tune is selected. Press the ENTER (→) button.

Result: The horizontal bar is displayed.

5 To obtain a sharp and clear picture and good sound quality, press the ◀ or ▶ button until you reach the optimal setting.

Result: The programme number turns red.

- 6 To store the fine tuning setting in the TV's memory, press the ENTER (글) button.
- 7 To reset the fine tuning to 0, select **Reset** by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button, then press the **ENTER** (→) button.








Viewing the Channel Scan Picture





1 Press the **MENU** () button.

Result: The main menu is displayed.

2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button until the **Channel** is selected.

Result: The options available in the **Channe1** group are displayed.

3 Press the ENTER (→) button.

4 Press the ▲ or ▼ button until the **Scan** is selected. Press the **ENTER** (♣) button.

Result: You can view every memorized channel sequentially.

Using the LNA (Low Noise Amplifier) Feature





This feature is very useful in the situation that the TV is used in a weak signal, and amplifies the TV signal in the weak signal area, but not noise.

This feature is working only in a weak signal condition, and that is memorized on relevant channel's additional information automatically.

1 Press the MENU () button.

Result: The main menu is displayed.

2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button until the **Channel** is selected.

Result: The options available in the **Channel** group are displayed.

3 Press the ENTER () button.

4 Press the ▲ or ▼ button until the LNA is selected. Press the ENTER (→) button.

5 Select off or on by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button. Press the ENTER (→) button to confirm.

Changing the Picture Standard

You can select the picture mode which best corresponds to your viewing requirements.

1 Press the MENU () button.

Result: The main menu is displayed.

2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button until the **Picture** is selected.

displayed.

3 Press the ENTER () button.

Result: The Mode is selected.

4 Press the ENTER () button again.

Result: The available options are listed.

Result: The following modes are available:

Dynamic - Standard - Movie - Custom

6 Press the **ENTER** (→) button to confirm.

You can select these options by simply pressing the **P.MODE** (Picture Mode) button on the remote control. (Not available in DVD mode)









Customizing the Picture Settings











Your television has several setting options that allow you to control the picture quality.

1 Press the MENU () button.

Result: The main menu is displayed.

2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button until the **Picture** is selected.

Result: The options available in the **Picture** group are displayed.

3 Press the ENTER () button.

Press the ▲ or ▼ button until the Custom is selected. Press the ENTER (→) button.

Result: The Custom menu is displayed.

5 Select the option (Contrast, Brightness, Sharpness, Colour, or Tint-NTSC only) to be adjusted by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button.

Press the ENTER (→) button.

Result: The horizontal bar is displayed. Press the ◀ or ▶ button until you reach the optimal setting.

- If you make any changes to the custom settings, the picture standard is automatically switched to **Custom**.
- 6 Press the MENU (III) button to return to the Picture menu.

 Press the ▲ or ▼ button until the Colour Tone is selected. Press the ENTER (I) button.
- 7 Select the required colour tone (Warm 1 ~ Warm 10, Normal, Cool 1 ~ Cool 10) by pressing the ◀ or ▶ button.

Selecting the Picture Size (4:3 Models)

You can select the picture size which best corresponds to your viewing requirements.

1 Press the MENU () button.

Result: The main menu is displayed.

2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button until the **Picture** is selected.

Result: The options available in the Picture group are

displayed.

3 Press the ENTER () button.

4 Press the ▲ or ▼ button until the Size is selected. Press the

ENTER () button.

Result: The Size menu is displayed.

5 Select the required mode by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button. Press

the **ENTER** () button.

Result: The following modes are available:

Normal Adjusts the picture to fit a 4:3 normal aspect ratio. (Prolonged use in 4:3 mode may cause the

lifespan of the CRT to be reduced.)

Zoom1 Vertically enlarges the picture by approximately 130%.

Zoom2 Vertically enlarges the picture about by approximately

150%.

 General name format of: Title.mp3. When composing your title, make sure that you use 8 characters or less, that there are no spaces in the name, and avoid the use of special characters including: (.,/,\=,+).
- ◆ Use a decompression transfer rate of at least 128 Kbps when recording MP3 files.

 The sound quality with MP3 files basically depends on the rate of compression/decompression you choose.

 Getting audio CD quality sound requires an analog/digital sampling rate (conversion to MP3 format) of at least 128 Kbps and up to 160 Kbps. However, choosing higher rates, like 192 Kbps or more, only rarely give better sound quality. Conversely, files with sampling rates below 128 Kbps will not be played properly.
- ◆ Do not try recording copyright protected MP3 files.



Your TV comes equipped with a universal remote control. In addition to controlling the TV, the universal remote control can also operate a VCR, Cable box, DVD, and Set-Top Box made by Samsung (even if your VCR, Cable box and DVD are made by manufacturers other than Samsung).

- The remote control might not be compatible with all VCRs, DVD players and Cable boxes.
- 1 Turn off your VCR (Cable box or DVD).

No sound or picture	 Check that the mains lead has been connected to a wall socket. Check that you have pressed the power switch to "OFF" and the POWER ((()) button. Check the picture contrast and brightness settings. Check the volume.

No picture or black and white picture	 Adjust the colour settings. Check that the broadcast system selected is correct.
