## **Before Calling For Service**

Please make these simple checks before calling for service. These tips can save you time and money since charges for TV installation and adjustments of customer controls are not covered under your warranty.

Symptoms	Items to Check and Actions to follow
Colour patch (unevenness)	<ul> <li>Switch off the TV with the mains power button and wait for 20 minutes before switching on again.</li> </ul>
'Ghosts' or double images or Teletext garbled	<ul> <li>This may be caused by obstruction to the antenna due to high rise buildings or hills. Using a highly directional antenna may improve the picture.</li> </ul>
No Power	<ul> <li>Check that the TV set's AC power cord is plugged into mains socket.</li> <li>Unplug the TV, wait for 60 seconds. Then re-insert plug into the mains socket and switch on the TV again.</li> </ul>
No picture	<ul> <li>Check antenna connections at the rear of the TV to see if they are properly connected to the TV input terminal.</li> <li>Possible TV station trouble. Try another channel.</li> <li>Adjust the contrast and brightness settings</li> </ul>
Good picture but no sound	<ul> <li>Increase the VOLUME.</li> <li>To check that the TV is not muted, press the MUTE button on the remote control.</li> <li>When no TV signal is detected, the TV automatically mutes the sound. This is a proper set operation and does not indicate a malfunction.</li> </ul>
Good sound but poor or abnormal colour or no picture	<ul> <li>Adjust the contrast and brightness setting.</li> </ul>
Snowish picture and noise	Check the antenna connection.
Horizontal dotted lines	<ul> <li>This may be caused by electrical interference (e.g. hairdryer, nearby neon lights, etc.).</li> <li>Switch off the equipment.</li> </ul>
One white line across the screen	<ul> <li>Switch off the TV immediately and consult the service personnel.</li> </ul>
TV not responding to remote control	<ul> <li>Check batteries and replace them if necessary.</li> <li>Clean the remote control sensor lens on the TV.</li> <li>Operating range between TV and remote control should not be more than 6 metres.</li> </ul>

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## What you should know













- Place the television on a solid base
- Leave at least 5 cm around the side and 10 cm from the top for good ventilation of your television.
- Do not place the television near a radiator or other sources of heat.
- Choose a position where light does not fall directly onto the screen.
- Do not place anything on the top of the television.
- Do not expose the television to rain or excessive moisture.
- Never attempt to repair a defective television yourself. Always consult skilled television service personnel.
- Do not place speakers or any magnetic objects near the television because the magnetic field may cause 'colour patches' to appear on the screen.
- Before you start cleaning, switch off the television.
- Clean your television screen with a piece of SOFT, DRY cloth only when necessary.

Note : DO NOT use hard cloth or detergent cleaners as it will damage the screen's coating.

### **Connect your antenna**

We recommend that you use a good outdoor antenna for best reception of broadcast VHF/UHF channels. You may need to use one of the adaptors/mixers(not supplied). Consult your local dealer if you have any queries or need any assistance on connection.



### **Connect to power**

Refer to the Specification page for the correct operating voltage. Consult your local dealer if your mains supply is different.

• Connect your television to the mains supply socket and switch on.



(Diagram is only a representation of the actual plug and socket and may be different from the one used in your country)

### Preparing your remote control



Remove the battery cover at the back of your remote control.



Insert two batteries (Type AAA, 1.5 V) into the compartment.



Replace the cover.

Note :

- Remove the batteries from the remote control if you do not use it for an extended period. This is to prevent possible damage due to battery leakage.
- Make sure that there is no obstruction between the remote control and the television.

### Switch on your television

When the set is switched on, do not shift, turn (e.g. on a swivel base) or move it around because an unevenness in colour will develop in some parts of the screen. This can be eliminated by switching off the TV with the power knob and wait for about 20 minutes before switching on again. If symptom persists, call for Service.

Press the power knob ① on the front, bottom left of your television.
 A green or red light appears.

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If the light indicator is GREEN, it means:

The television is switched ON. Wait a few seconds for the screen to light up. If there is no signal input detected, you will see a scrolling word "PHILIPS".

If the light indicator is RED, it means:

The television is switched on but the screen stays dark. Your television is on 'standby'.

 Press any digit (0-9), PROGRAM + or -, A/CH and AV button on your remote control. The screen lights up. If there is no signal input detected, you will see the word "PHILIPS".

Note : If there is no signal detected after about 15 minutes, your television will switch over to standby.

## Search and store channels

You can use either the remote control or television top controls to select any one of the options in the INSTALLATION menu.

To search and store channels manually, perform the following steps in sequence.

### 1. Start INSTALLATION menu



2. Select CHANNEL SET option from menu



### 3. Searching for a channel

#### Use first method

(Press for more than 1 second)



Note : If you need to interrupt, press ◀ or ▶ again.

Once a channel is located, your television will stop searching. If you are satisfied with the reception, go to step 5.

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#### Or second method

Key in directly if you know the frequency for the channel . Refer to 'Frequency Tables' if necessary.



4. Sound system has been set to that used in your country and you cannot do any adjustment.

Press once to view the sound system (if required) or proceed to the next step.



- 5. Assign a number to the channel just tuned in
- a) Select the channel option from the menu



### 6. Give a name to the channel just tuned in (optional)

a) Select the TITLE option from the menu

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c) Key in the first letter or number
 Press ▲ or ▼ until desired letter or number is reached.

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Repeat step c) and d). Maximum 5 characters allowed.

### e) End the 'TITLE' naming



### 7. To store your channel settings

Note : If you do not store, the settings will be lost after you exit from this menu.



8. To set the other channels, repeat steps 3 to 7. If not go to step 9.

### 9. To exit from CHANNEL SET menu

a) Select EXIT option from the menu



## **Favourite Channel**

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Use this feature to skip those channels which have weak or no signal.

### 1. Start INSTALLATION menu



### 2. Select Favourite Channel option from the menu



### 4. To add or delete channels from 'Favourite Channel' list



Repeat step 3 to 4 for other channel numbers. If not, go to step 5.

### 5. To exit from menu

Press twice to exit.



Note : When you call up a channel which has been deleted from the 'Favourite Channel' list, **NOT PROGRAMMED** appears on your screen.

## Store channels automatically

To store your channels automatically, follow the steps below in sequence.

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### 5. To exit from menu

Press twice to exit.



All the channels located will be stored and given numbers automatically. You may like to sort them again in order of your preference. If you wish to do that, go to the section 'Rearrange your channel numbers'.

## **Fine Tuning**

In case the picture and sound of channel is weak, a slight adjustment of the frequency may help.

### 1. Start INSTALLATION menu



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### 2. Select FINE TUNE option

### 3. Select the channel with weak signal



### 4. To fine tune frequency of the channel

Press repeatedly until picture and sound improve.



Note :

Every press of the button will increase or decrease the frequency by 0.06 MHz.

# 5. Press OK button and repeat steps 3 to 4 for other channels, otherwise proceed to step 6.

### 6. To exit from menu

Press twice to exit.



## **Rearrangement of channel numbers sequence**

You can use this feature to rearrange the stored channels according to your preference.

The adjustment will be stored automatically and you can call it up in the PERSONAL mode of 'SMART CONTROLS sound'.

### 1. Select a channel to adjust the sound

### **CTI (Colour Transient Improvement)**

Switch this feature on to enhance colour definition. Switch it off if colour edge is wavy. When switching CTI on or off, the menu on your screen may shift slightly.

With this feature switched on, the screen will appear blue whenever no signal is detected.

#### Select BLUE MUTE





### Lock Mode

This is a useful feature when you want to prevent someone from watching your television. When this feature is switched 'ON', the buttons on the television's top control are not functional anymore and whenever you try to press any one of them, the word **LOCKED** appears on the screen. **Do not forget where you keep your remote control!** 

The next time you switch on the television, it will be on 'standby'.

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To switch on, press any one of these buttons on your remote control :

- 1) PROGRAM + or -
- 2) 0 to 9
- 3) A/CH
- 4) AV

### **Picture selection**

There are 4 picture settings to choose from :

RICH	:	Emphasizes very vibrant colours (suitable for AV mode in brightly lit room conditions).
NATURAL	:	Emphasizes original colours.
SOFT	:	Emphasizes warm colours (white tones are reddish). Gives a cinema like effect when light is switched off.
PERSONAL	:	The settings of brightness, contrast, colour, sharpness, NTSC-TINT, CTI, NR and Incredible Picture that you have adjusted on the channel will be automatically memorised with this mode.

• Press **SMART PICTURE** button to cycle through the 4 settings and select the one that you prefer.





### Sound selection

The SMART sound control pre-programmes the frequency response to accomodate all types of programmes.

VOICE	:	Emphasizes speech frequency so that voice is clearer.
MUSIC	:	Emphasizes bass frequency so that music is more dynamic.
THEATRE	:	Emphasizes low and high frequencies to give more sensation to the actions.
PERSONAL	:	The treble, bass and balance settings that you have adjusted during the channel adjustment will be memorised automatically.

• Press **SMART SOUND** button to cycle through the 4 settings and select the one that you prefer.



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## **Incredible Picture**

Use this feature if you wish to view a realistic picture with plenty of depth. When this feature is switched 'ON', the picture will appear with better gradation and contrast.

• Press INCREDIBLE PICTURE button to switch on or off the feature.







This feature is specially built into your television to enhance the stereo effect when you are watching **stereo broadcasted programmes** or **playing back stereo programmes**. For **mono** programmes you will hear a 'Spatial' effect. Therefore when switching from stereo to mono programmes, you may experience a small decrease in volume.

### Select incredible sound

• Press INCREDIBLE SOUND button to switch on or off this effect.





When the programme you are watching is in mono mode, you will experience 'Spatial' sound.

• Press INCREDIBLE SOUND button to switch on or off this effect.



## **2CS Stereo**

When 2CS (2 Carrier System) Stereo is available, a green indicator light will appear above the word 'stereo'. Some programmes may be transmitted in two languages. When this happens, a green indicator light will appear above the word 'bilingual'.



• Press I-II button to switch to FM SOUND and back again when you are in this mode.



When there are two languages in transmission, you are able to switch and select **DUAL 1** (first language) or **DUAL 2** (second language).

• Press III button to toggle and make your selection.



## **Personal Preference**



**Personal Preference** is specially designed for your viewing pleasure. With this feature, you are able to store your picture and sound settings as well as selection for CTI, NR and Incredible Picture for certain channels and the external connections' channels : VIDEO 1, VIDEO 2 and CAMCORDER.

## To store settings for 'Personal Preference' in a channel

- · Select a channel.
- Adjust your settings.
   Your television will store them automatically as your 'Personal Preference'.

## To call up 'Personal Preference' in a channel

- Select a channel.
- Press **PP** button on your remote control. The television will recall the last personal settings of this channel.

Note:

For channel 0 to 11 and the external connections' channels, you can set different 'Personal Preference' for every channel.

For channel 12 to 99, the 'Personal Preference' set in any one channel will also be automatically memorised for other channels.
#### Open the lower half of your remote control to access to your PIP buttons.

With Picture In Picture (PIP), you can call up a subscreen within your main screen. Therefore, you can watch two channels at the same time.

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# **Video Cassette Recorder Functions**

Your remote control has been designed specially to be used with selected PHILIPS brand video cassette recorders. Please refer to the individual equipment's instruction manual when using this remote control to ensure compatibility.

# Open the lower half of your remote control to access to your video cassette recorder functions buttons



No	Function
1	To stop movement of video tape.
2	To rewind, or playback video tape in reverse at fast speed.
3	To playback video tape.
4	To advance, or playback video tape at fast speed.

#### **Playing back programmes**

Connect your peripheral equipment e.g video cassette recorder (VCR), laser disc player etc. to the sockets at **VIDEO 1** or/and **VIDEO 2**. For mono equipment, connect only the **AUDIO L** (left) socket.

#### Play back from VCR or Laser disc player on television



#### Play back from S-VHS VCR on television

If you have a S-VHS VCR, connect up the **S-VIDEO** socket from the television to the S-VHS socket of the VCR to enhance th epicture quality.

Note : You need not connect the VIDEO socket from the television.



For camcorder or computer game connect the equipment to the sockets shown below. For mono equipment, connect only the **AUDIO L** (left) socket.



CAMCORDER

If you have a S-VHS Camcorder, connect up the **S-VIDEO** socket from the television when you are using a S-VHS equipment to enhance the picture quality. Note : You need not connect the **VIDEO** socket from the television.



#### Record programmes onto a video cassette recorder (VCR)

Connect your equipment to the sockets at **MONITOR out**. To enhance the sound of your television, connect the **AUDIO L** and **R** sockets to an external amplifier instead of to the video cassette recorder. For mono equipment, connect only the **AUDIO L** (left) socket.



#### Record from television to a video cassette recorder

#### **Record from a S-VHS VCR to another S-VHS VCR**

Connect up the **S-VIDEO** sockets from the television to both the Input and Output in order to enhance the picture quality.

Note : You need not connect the VIDEO socket from the television.





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### View the external connections on screen

Press either AV button on the remote control or G button on the television top controls repeatedly and select the screen you want.



Television	:	Off air television programme.
Video 1	:	Playback programmes from the equipment you have connected to the sockets at VIDEO 1.
Video 2	:	Playback programmes from the equipment you have connected to the sockets at VIDEO 2.
Camcorder	:	Playback from the camcorder or computer game equipment you have connected to the sockets at back of your television.
Sound only	:	No picture. Only sound from your VIDEO 2 audio connections
