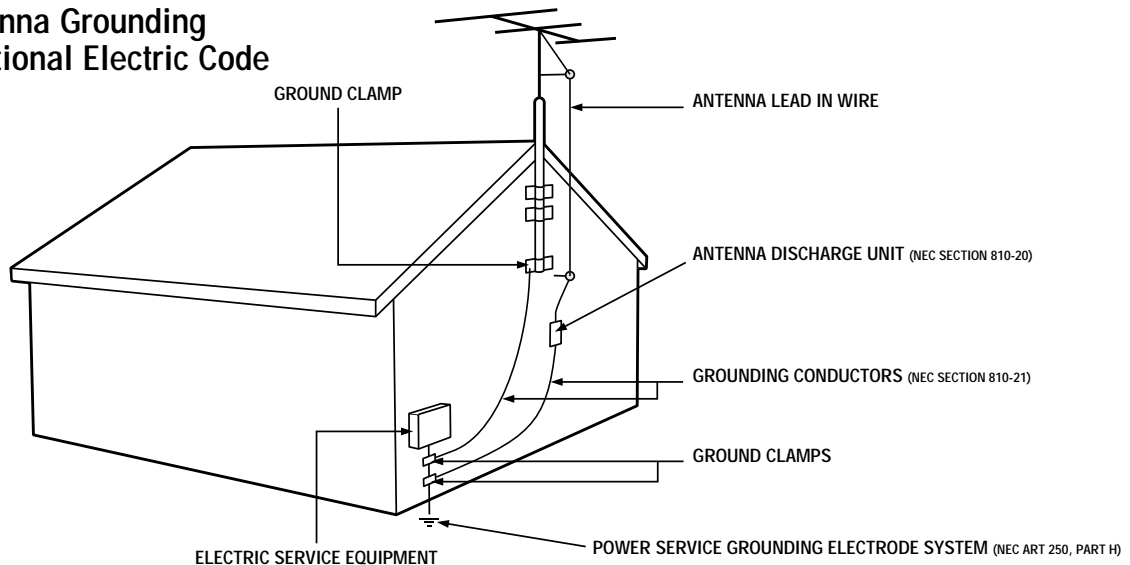

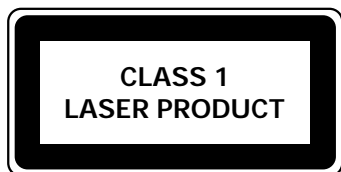

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# FEATURES

**Audio/Video Jack Panel** allows direct connections with accessory devices, providing quality TV picture and sound playback.

**Audio Volume Leveler (AVL) Control** keeps the TV sound at an even level. Peaks and valleys that occur during program changes or commercial breaks are reduced, making for a more consistent, comfortable sound.

**AutoLock™** allows you to block the viewing of certain channels or programs with certain ratings if you do not want your children to view inappropriate materials.

**Auto Programming** scans (when activated) for all available channels from regular antenna or cable signals and stores only active broadcast stations in the TV's memory.

**AutoPicture™** allows you to change the picture settings (color, tint, contrast, etc.) for various types of programming, such as sports, movies, multimedia (games), or weak signals with the push of one button.

**AutoSound™** allows you to select from three factory-set controls and a personal control that you set according to your own preferences through the on-screen Sound menu. The three factory-set controls (Voice, Music, and Theatre) enable you to tailor the TV sound so as to enhance the particular programming you are watching.

**Channel Edit** allows you to add or delete channels from the list stored in the TV's memory. Channel Edit makes it easy to limit or expand the number of channels that are available to you when you press the Channel (+) or (-) buttons on your remote control.

**Closed Captioning** allows the viewer to read TV program dialogue or voice conversations as on-screen text.

**Contrast +** helps you sharpen the picture quality by making dark portions of the picture darker and light portions brighter.

**Infrared Remote Control** controls your TV and the built in DVD player.

**On-screen Menu** shows helpful messages and instructions for setting TV feature controls (can be viewed in English, French, or Spanish).

**Sleep Timer** automatically turns the TV OFF after a set amount of time that you choose.

**Standard Broadcast (VHF/UHF) or Cable TV (CATV)** channel capability allows for viewing by antenna or cable.

**Stereo** capability, including a built-in audio amplifier and twin-speaker system, allows for the reception of TV programs broadcast in stereo sound.

**Surf Button** allows you to easily switch among only the channels that are of interest to you (the ones that you have programmed into the TV's Surf control through the on-screen menu).






**Timer** allows you to set your TV to turn itself ON and OFF once or daily like an alarm clock.

**DVD Player** plays DVD discs, Video CDs, Audio CDs, etc. Create Favorite Track Programs and store them in the TV/DVD Players memory.

# ADJUSTING THE PICTURE




To adjust your TV picture controls, select a channel and follow these steps.

## BEGIN

- 1 Press the **MENU** button on the remote control to show the on-screen menu. PICTURE will be highlighted.
- 2 Press the **CURSOR RIGHT** button and the menu will shift to the left. BRIGHTNESS will be highlighted and an adjustment bar will be shown to the right.
- 3 Use the **CURSOR LEFT** or **CURSOR RIGHT** button to adjust the BRIGHTNESS level of the picture.
- 4 After adjusting the BRIGHTNESS control, press the **CURSOR DOWN** button to select another picture adjustment: COLOR, PICTURE, SHARPNESS, TINT, OR COLOR TEMP. Press the **CURSOR LEFT** or **CURSOR RIGHT** button to adjust the selected control.
- 5 Press the **STATUS** button to remove the menu from the screen.



Remember, when the bar scale is centered , the control settings are at normal, mid-range levels. Picture adjustments are described here.

**BRIGHTNESS** – adds or subtracts light from the darkest part of the picture.

**COLOR** – adds or eliminates color.

**PICTURE** – improves the detail of the lightest parts of the picture.

**SHARPNESS** – improves the detail in the picture.

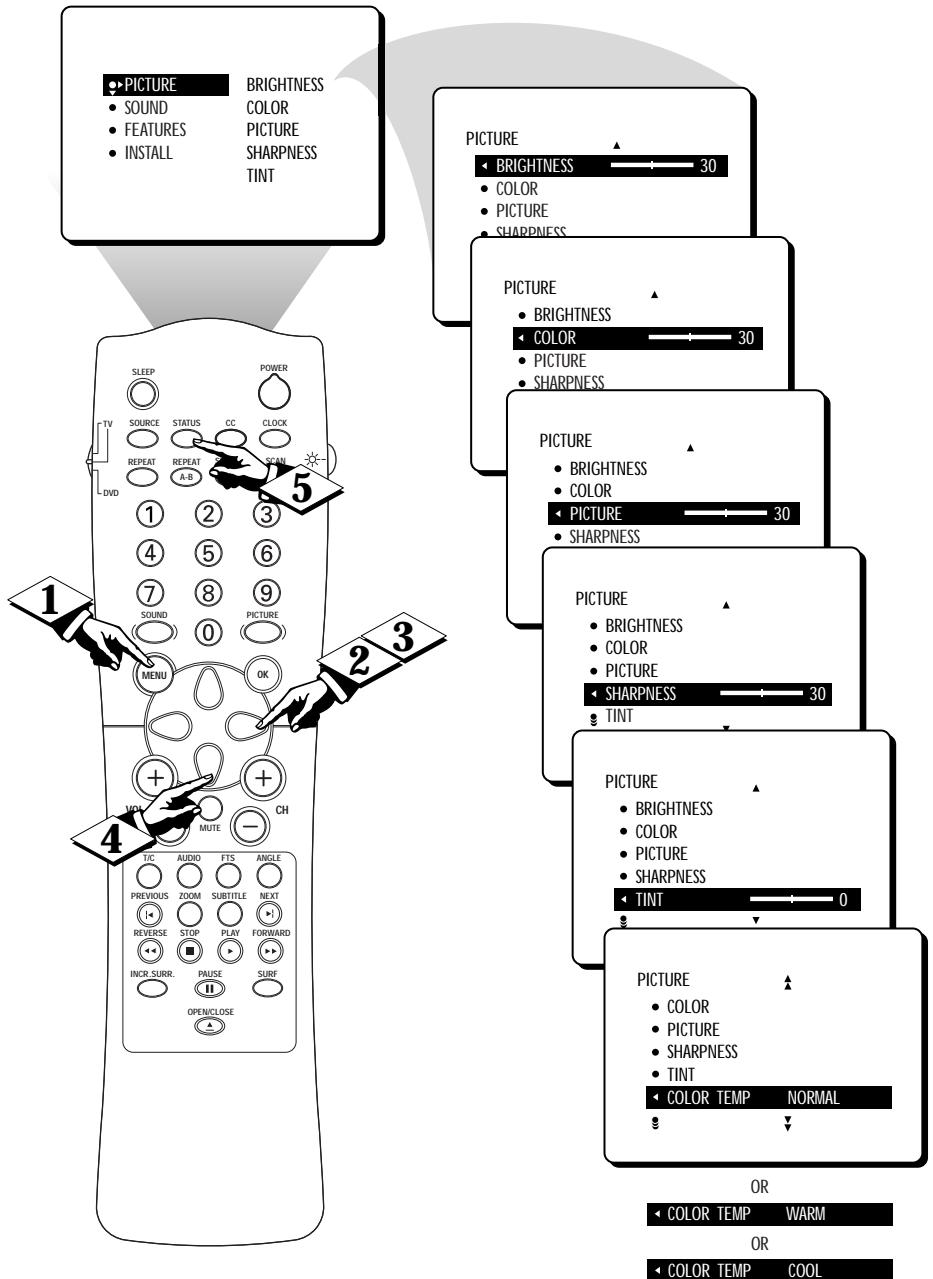
**TINT** – adjusts the picture to obtain natural skin tones.

COLOR TEMP offers NORMAL, COOL, or WARM picture preferences.

**NORMAL** – keeps whites, white.

**COOL** – makes whites, bluish.

**WARM** – makes whites, reddish.



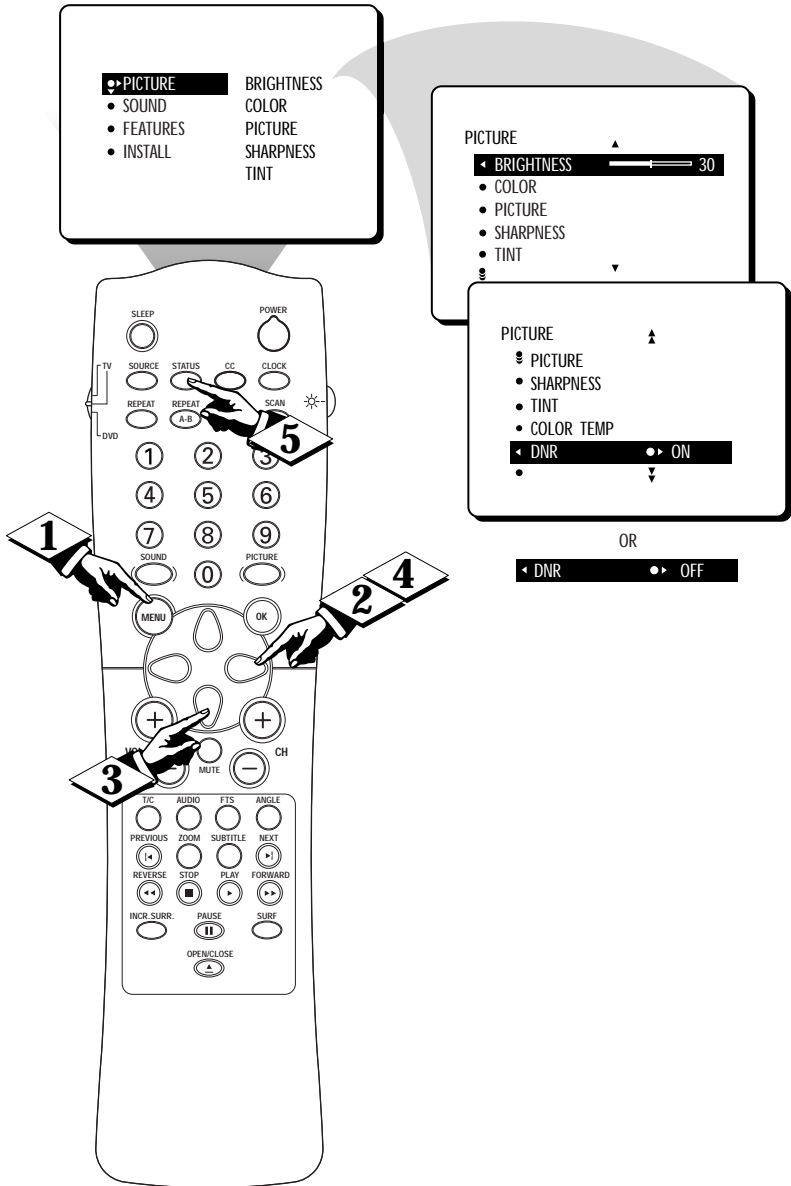


# TURNING ON THE DYNAMIC NOISE REDUCTION CONTROL

*Due to many reasons, such as poor cable reception, the picture can sometimes appear slightly "speckled" (an indication of signal noise in the picture). The DNR (Dynamic Noise Reduction) control can help eliminate this type of interference and improve the quality of the picture.*

## BEGIN

- 1 Press the **MENU** button on the remote to show the on-screen menu. PICTURE will be highlighted.
- 2 Press the **CURSOR RIGHT** button and the menu will shift to the left. BRIGHTNESS will be highlighted.
- 3 Press the **CURSOR DOWN** button repeatedly until the DNR control is highlighted.
- 4 Press the **CURSOR RIGHT** button to switch DNR ON or press the **CURSOR LEFT** button to switch DNR OFF.
- 5 Press the **STATUS** button to remove the menu from the screen.





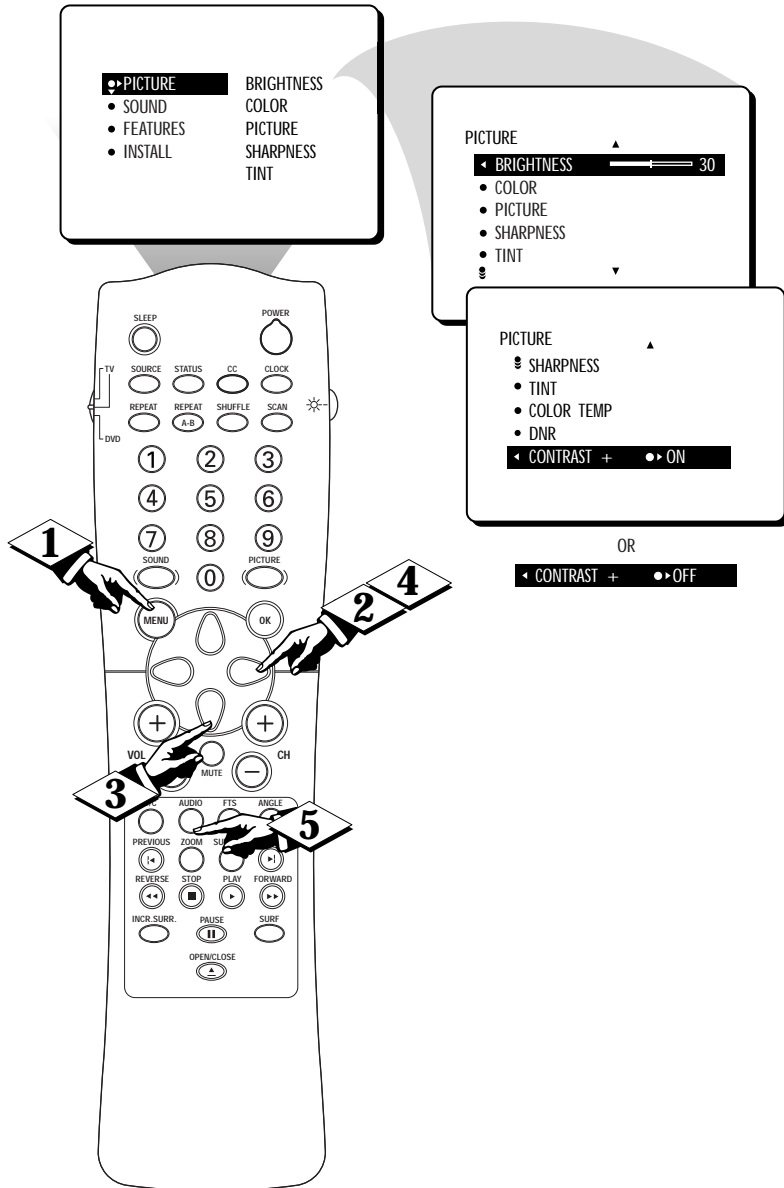
# TURNING ON THE CONTRAST + CONTROL

The Contrast + Control helps you sharpen the picture quality by making dark portions of the picture darker and light portions of the picture brighter.

## BEGIN

- 1 Press the **MENU** button on the remote control to show the on-screen menu. PICTURE will be highlighted.
- 2 Press the **CURSOR RIGHT** button and the menu will shift to the left. BRIGHTNESS will be highlighted.
- 3 Press the **CURSOR DOWN** button repeatedly until the Contrast + control is highlighted.
- 4 Press the **CURSOR RIGHT** button to switch between ON and OFF.
- 5 Press the **STATUS** button to remove the menu from the screen.

# THE TIMER – SETTING THE CLOCK

Your television comes with an on-screen clock. During normal operation, the clock appears on the screen when the STATUS button is pressed or if the TIMER DISPLAY control is turned ON.

## BEGIN

- 1 Press the **MENU** button on the remote control to show the on-screen menu.
- 2 Press the **CURSOR DOWN** button twice to highlight FEATURES.
- 3 Press the **CURSOR RIGHT** button and the menu will shift to the left. **TIMER** will be highlighted.
- 4 With **TIMER** selected, press the **CURSOR RIGHT** button again to shift the display left and highlight the **TIME** control.
- 5 Press the **CURSOR RIGHT** button again to highlight the time indicator area.
- 6 Press the **CURSOR LEFT** or **CURSOR RIGHT** button to select the position or digit you wish to enter.
- 7 Press the **CURSOR UP** or **CURSOR DOWN** button to select the digits for the time. Or press the **NUMBERED** buttons to enter the correct time.
- 8 Press the **CURSOR RIGHT** button to move to the AM or PM position.
- 9 Press the **CURSOR UP** or **CURSOR DOWN** button to set AM or PM.
- 10 Press the **STATUS** button to remove the menu from the screen.

# THE TIMER – SETTING THE START TIME

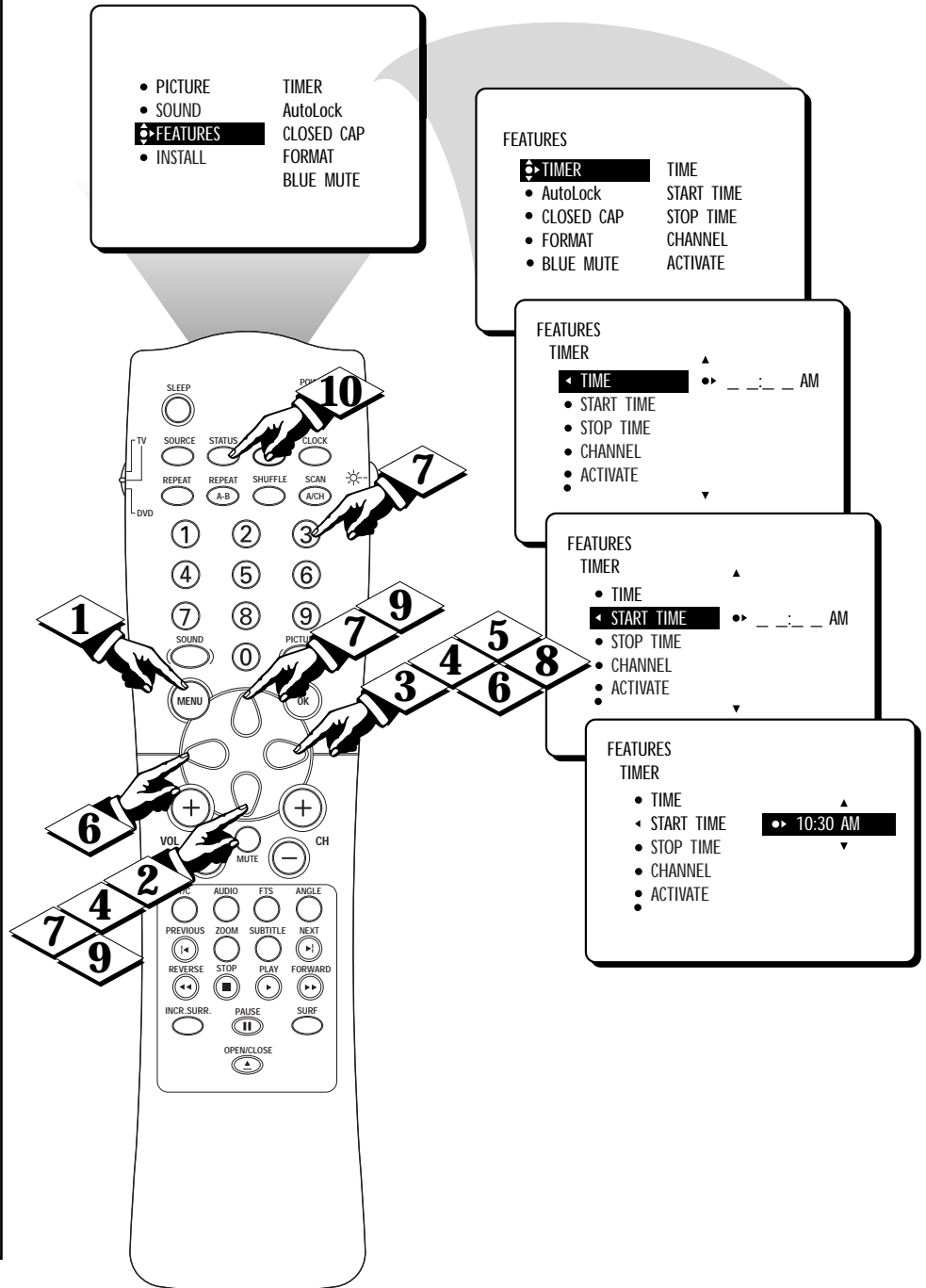


*Just as you would an alarm clock, you can set the TV to turn itself ON once or at the same time every day. Follow these steps to set the Start Time.*

## BEGIN

- 1 Press the **MENU** button on the remote control to show the on-screen menu.
- 2 Press the **CURSOR DOWN** button twice to highlight **FEATURES**.
- 3 Press the **CURSOR RIGHT** button and the menu will shift to the left. **TIMER** will be highlighted.
- 4 Press the **CURSOR RIGHT** button again to shift the display left. Then press the **CURSOR DOWN** button once to highlight the **START TIME** control.
- 5 Press the **CURSOR RIGHT** button again to highlight the time indicator area.
- 6 Press the **CURSOR RIGHT** or **CURSOR LEFT** button to move among the positions where the time is input.
- 7 Press the **CURSOR UP** or **CURSOR DOWN** button to select the digits for the time. Or press the **NUMBERED** buttons to enter the correct time.
- 8 Press the **CURSOR RIGHT** button to move to the **AM** or **PM** position.
- 9 Press the **CURSOR UP** or **CURSOR DOWN** button to set **AM** or **PM**.
- 10 Press the **STATUS** button to remove the menu from the screen.

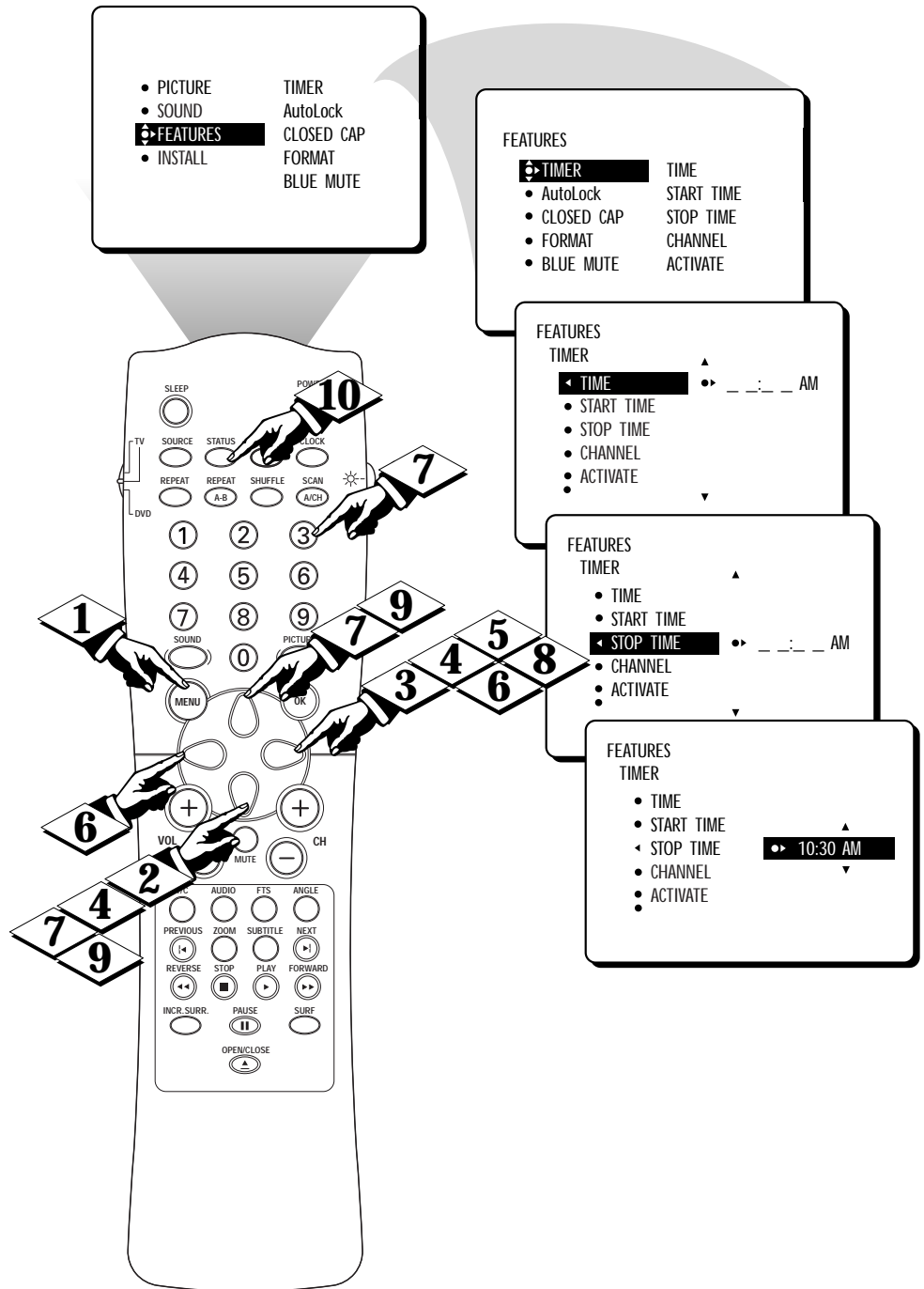
# THE TIMER – SETTING THE STOP TIME

Use the **START TIME** control to set the TV to turn itself **ON** once or at the same time every day (see page 13 for details). The following steps will guide you in setting the TV to turn itself **OFF** once or at the same time every day.

## BEGIN

- 1 Press the **MENU** button on the remote control to show the on-screen menu.
- 2 Press the **CURSOR DOWN** button twice to highlight **FEATURES**.
- 3 Press the **CURSOR RIGHT** button and the menu will shift to the left. **TIMER** will be highlighted.
- 4 Press the **CURSOR RIGHT** button again to shift the display left. Then press the **CURSOR DOWN** button once twice to highlight the **STOP TIME** control.
- 5 Press the **CURSOR RIGHT** button again to highlight the time indicator area.
- 6 Press the **CURSOR RIGHT** or **CURSOR LEFT** button to move among the positions where the time is input.
- 7 Press the **CURSOR UP** or **CURSOR DOWN** button to select the digits for the time. Or press the **NUMBERED** buttons to enter the correct time.
- 8 Press the **CURSOR RIGHT** button to move to the **AM** or **PM** position.
- 9 Press the **CURSOR UP** or **DOWN** button to set **AM** or **PM**.
- 10 Press the **STATUS** button to remove the menu from the screen.

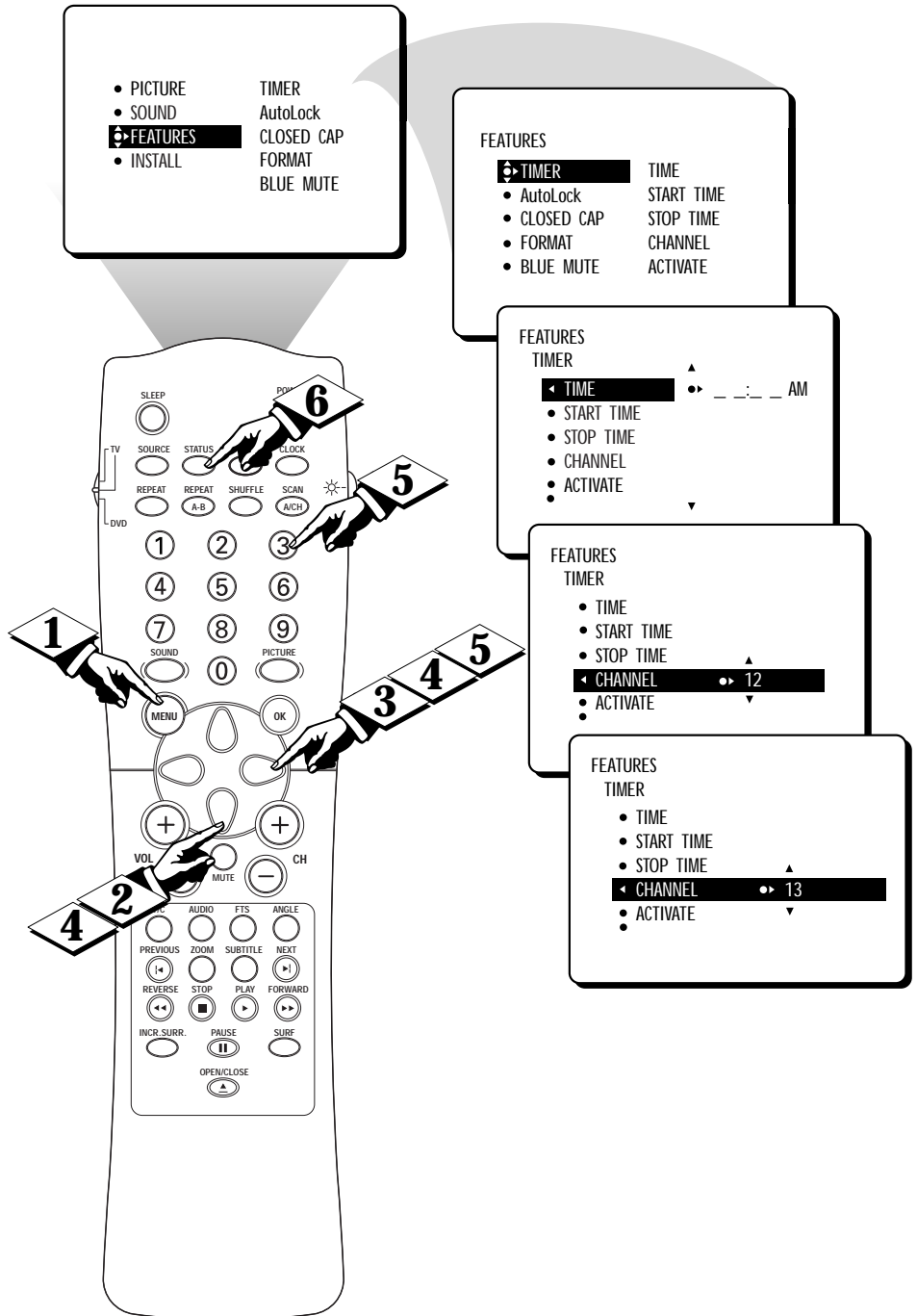


# THE TIMER – SELECTING THE START UP CHANNEL

You can select a specific channel that the television will tune to when the timer turns the set ON. Follow these steps to select the channel.

## BEGIN

- 1 Press the **MENU** button on the remote control to show the on-screen menu.
- 2 Press the **CURSOR DOWN** button twice to highlight FEATURES.
- 3 Press the **CURSOR RIGHT** button and the menu will shift to the left. **TIMER** will be highlighted.
- 4 Press the **CURSOR RIGHT** button again to shift the menu to the left. Then press the **CURSOR DOWN** button repeatedly until the **CHANNEL** control is highlighted.
- 5 Press the **NUMBERED** buttons to enter the desired start-up channel. Or, press the **CURSOR RIGHT** button repeatedly to enter the start-up channel you want.
- 6 Press the **STATUS** button to remove the menu from the screen.



# THE TIMER – SETTING ACTIVATE TO ON OR OFF

After you have set the Time, Start Time, Stop Time, and Start Channel, the timer must be set to come on ONCE or DAILY, or turned OFF through the ACTIVATE control.

## BEGIN

- 1 Press the **MENU** button on the remote control to show the on-screen menu.
- 2 Press the **CURSOR DOWN** button twice to highlight **FEATURES**.
- 3 Press the **CURSOR RIGHT** button and the menu will shift to the left. **TIMER** will be highlighted.
- 4 Press the **CURSOR RIGHT** button again to shift the display to the left. Then press the **CURSOR DOWN** button repeatedly until the **ACTIVATE** control is highlighted.
- 5 Press the **CURSOR RIGHT** button again to set **ACTIVATE** to ONCE; press the **CURSOR RIGHT** button again for DAILY; and press the **CURSOR RIGHT** button again to toggle **ACTIVATE** to OFF.
- 6 Press the **STATUS** button to remove the menu from the screen.

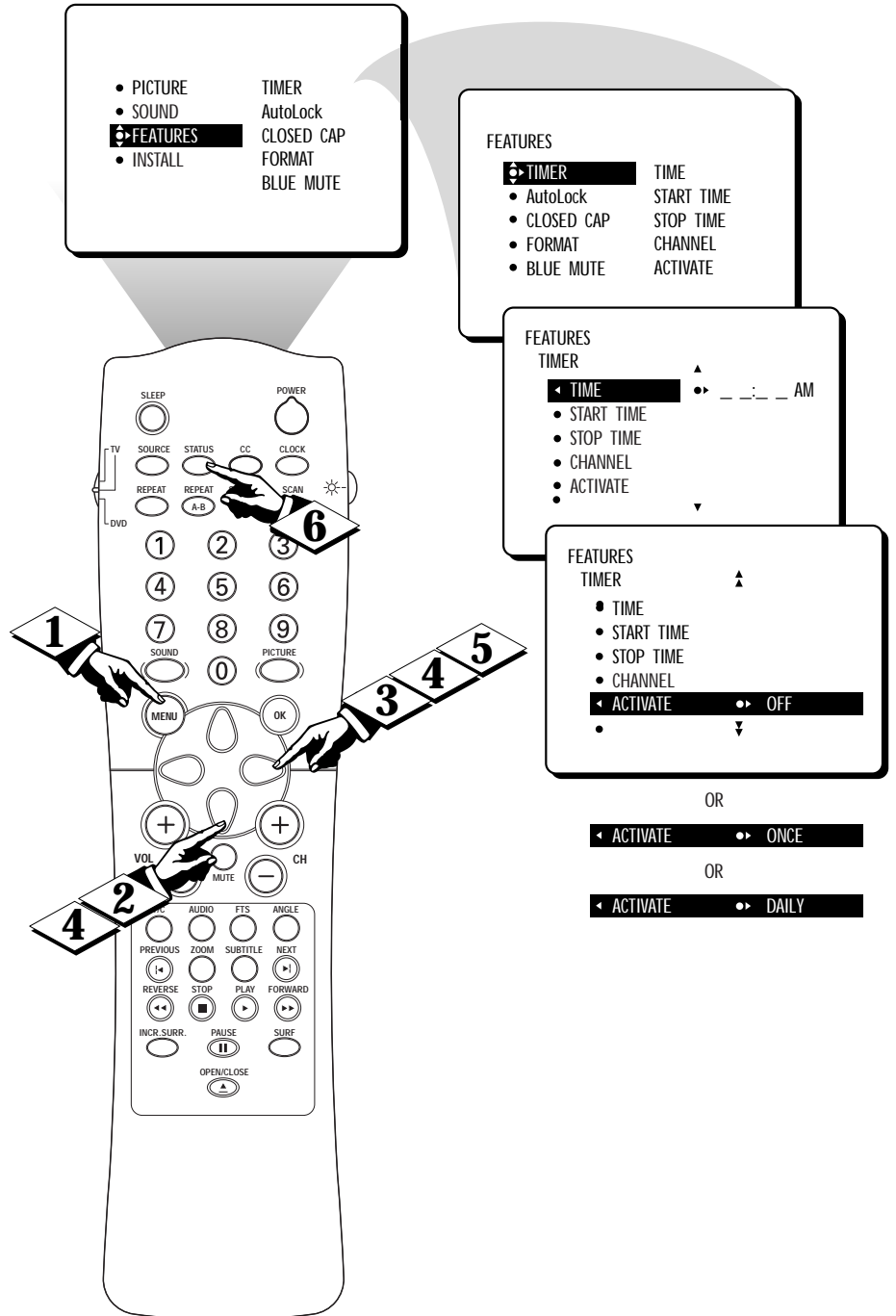


## SMART HELP



Remember, before setting the **TIMER** controls, the TV's clock must be set to the correct time (see page 10).

# THE TIMER – TURNING ON THE TIMER DISPLAY



After the TV's clock has been set, you can use your TV as a clock. The **TIMER DISPLAY** control allows you to permanently display the time in the upper right corner of the screen.

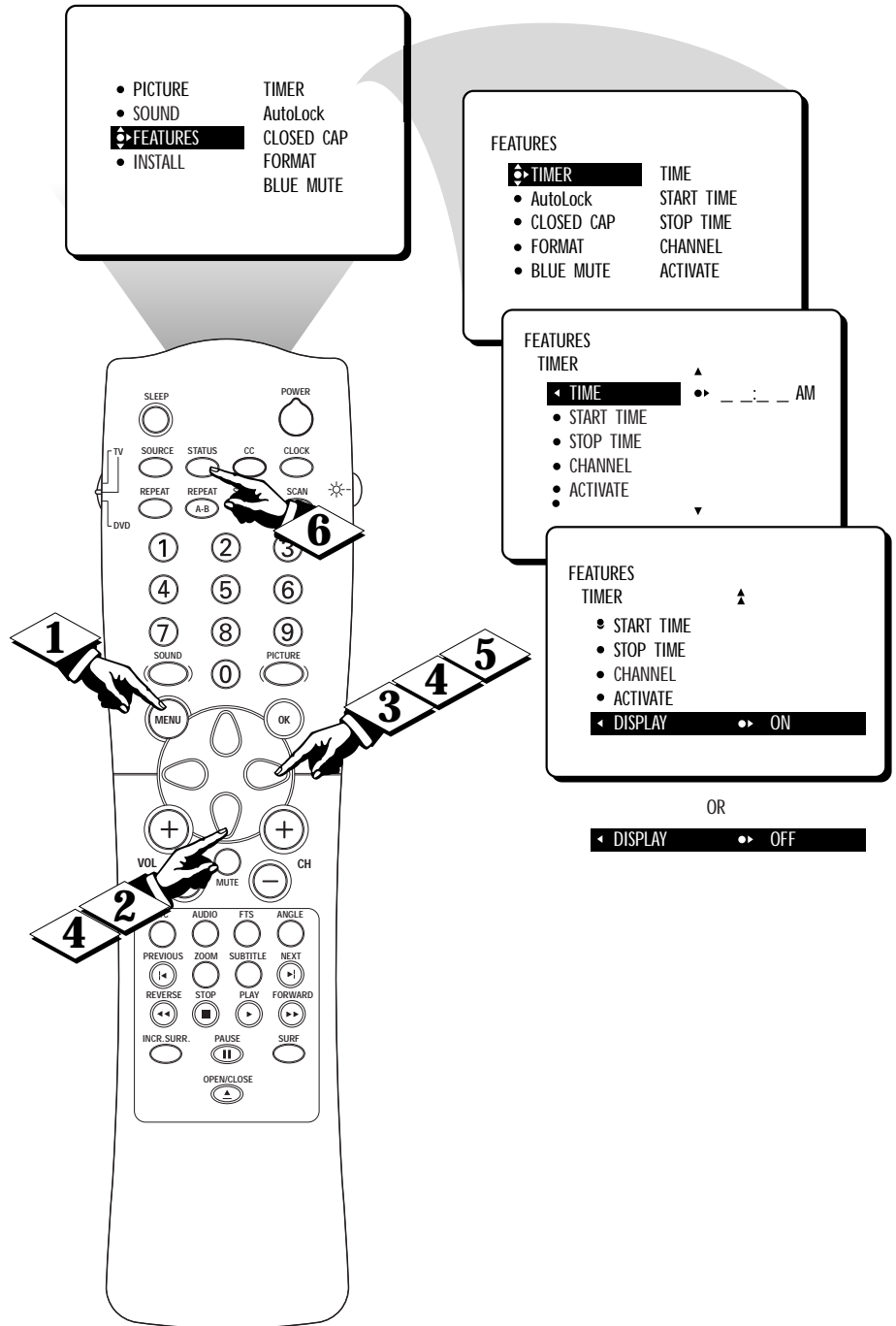
## BEGIN

- 1 Press the **MENU** button on the remote to show the on-screen menu.
- 2 Press the **CURSOR DOWN** button twice to highlight **FEATURES**.
- 3 Press the **CURSOR RIGHT** button and the menu will shift to the left. **TIMER** will be highlighted.
- 4 Press the **CURSOR RIGHT** button again to shift the menu left. Then press the **CURSOR DOWN** button repeatedly until the **DISPLAY** control is highlighted.
- 5 Press the **CURSOR RIGHT** or **CURSOR LEFT** button to turn the **TIMER DISPLAY** ON or OFF.
- 6 Press the **STATUS** button to remove the menu from the screen.

Remember, be sure you have set the TV's clock with the correct current time. (Refer to page 10 to set the correct time.)





# USING THE CLOSED CAPTIONING CONTROL

**C**losed Captioning (CC) allows you to read the voice content of television programs on the TV screen. Designed to help the hearing impaired, this feature uses on-screen "text boxes" to show dialogue and conversations while the TV program is in progress.

## BEGIN

- 1 Press the **MENU** button on the remote control to show the on-screen menu.
- 2 Press the **CURSOR DOWN** button twice to highlight **FEA-TURES**.
- 3 Press the **CURSOR RIGHT** button and the menu will shift to the left.
- 4 Press the **CURSOR DOWN** button repeatedly until the **CLOSED CAP** control is highlighted.
- 5 Press the **CURSOR RIGHT** button again. The menu will shift to the left and **CAPTION MODE** will be highlighted. Then press the **CURSOR RIGHT** button to highlight **CAPTION MODES**.
- 6 Press the **CURSOR UP** or **CURSOR DOWN** button to select a **CAPTION MODE**: CC1, CC2, CC3, CC4, CC MUTE, TXT1, TXT2, TXT3, or TXT4. CC DISPLAY turns text OFF or ON if the TV station broadcasting on the channel is making **CLOSED CAPTIONING** available. With **CC DISPLAY** highlighted, press the **CURSOR RIGHT** button to toggle **Closed Captioning ON** or **OFF**.
- 7 Press the **STATUS** button to remove the menu from the screen.



**NOTE:** Not all TV programs and product commercials are broadcast with Closed Captioning (CC). Nor are all Closed Captioning MODEs (CAPTION 1-4 or TEXT 1-4) necessarily being used by broadcast stations during the transmission of a program offering Closed Captioning. Refer to your area's TV program listings for the stations and times of shows being broadcast with Closed Captioning.

# ACTIVATING THE BLUE MUTE CONTROL

The Blue Mute feature will eliminate annoying snow from the screen when no video signal is present by displaying a pleasant blue screen. This occurs in cases such as when a VCR tape is removed or an antenna signal is broken. To turn the Blue Mute feature ON or OFF, follow the steps below.

# USING THE SLEEP TIMER



*Have you ever fallen asleep in front of the TV, only to have it wake you up at two in the morning with a test pattern sound screeching in your ears? Well, your TV can enable you to avoid that discomfort by automatically turning itself off. With the Sleep Timer feature, you can set a timer to automatically switch the TV OFF after a period of time you choose (15-minute increments up to 60 minutes, then 30-minute increments up to 90 minutes, then 60-minute increments up to 240 minutes).*

## BEGIN

**1** Press the **SLEEP** button on the remote control. The **SLEEP** timer on-screen display will appear in the upper part of the screen.

**2** Within five seconds, press the **SLEEP** button repeatedly to pick the amount of time (15-minute increments up to 60 minutes, then 30-minute increments up to 90 minutes, then 60-minute increments up to 240 minutes) before the TV will turn itself off.

An on-screen countdown will appear during the last minute before the TV shuts itself off.

The AutoLock™ feature receives and processes data sent by broadcasters or other program providers that contain program content advisories. When programmed by the viewer, a TV with AutoLock™ can respond to the content advisories and block program content that may be found objectionable (such as offensive language, violence, sexual situations, etc.). This is a great feature to censor the type of programming children may watch.

In the AutoLock™ section, you'll learn how to block channels and programming that is not rated, is unrated, or has no rating. You will also find out how to turn these blocking features ON or OFF. Following are brief explanations of some terms and ratings related to the AutoLock™ feature.

**AutoLock™ offers various Blocking Options from which to choose:**

**BLOCKING:** The BLOCKING control is what can be thought of as the "master switch" for AutoLock™. This control affects the settings you have chosen for blocking programs according to movie ratings or TV ratings, or for blocking programs that have no rating or are unrated. When the BLOCKING control is OFF, the blocking or censoring of programs is disabled. When the BLOCKING control is ON, blocking will occur according to the settings you have chosen.

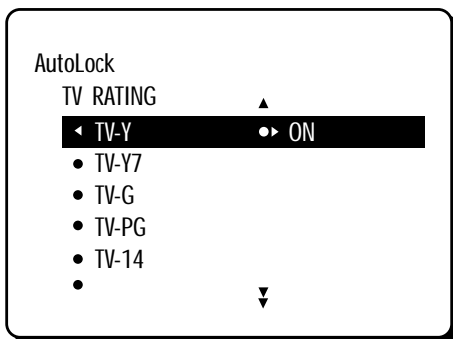
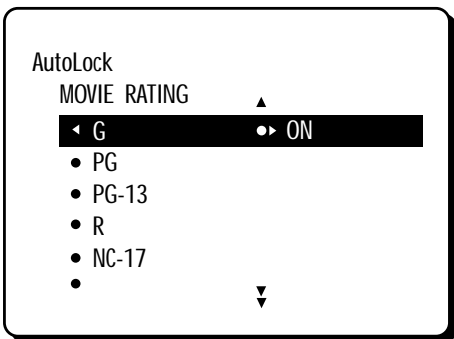
**BLOCK UNRATED:** ALL unrated programs will be blocked if this feature is set to ON.

**UNRATED programming is encoded with information from the MPAA (Motion Picture Association of America) or TV broadcasters, but it does not have a specific rating. In other words, the MPAA or the TV broadcasters have chosen not to assign a rating to the programming.**

**NO RATING:** ALL programming with no content advisory data can be blocked if NO RATING is set to ON.

*Programming that has No Rating is not encoded with any rating information from the MPAA or the Parental Guidelines. Any programming could fall into this category.*

**You also can block individual channels or block programming based on ratings of the MPAA and TV broadcasters. (See a description of the ratings on this page.)**



**MOVIE RATINGS**  
(MOTION PICTURE ASSOCIATION OF AMERICA)

**G: General Audience** - All ages admitted. Most parents would find this programming suitable for all ages. This type of programming contains little or no violence, no strong language, and little or no sexual dialogue or sexual situations.

**PG: Parental Guidance Suggested** - This programming contains material that parents may find unsuitable for younger children. It may contain one or more of the following: Moderate violence, some sexual situations, infrequent coarse language, or some suggestive dialogue.

**PG-13: Parents Strongly Cautioned** - This programming contains material that parents may find unsuitable for children under the age of 13. It contains one or more of the following: violence, sexual situations, coarse language, or suggestive dialogue.

**R: Restricted** - This programming is specifically designed for adults. Anyone under the age of 17 should view this programming only with an accompanying parent or adult guardian. It contains one or more of the following: intense violence; intense sexual situations; strong, coarse language; or intensely suggestive dialogue.

**NC-17: No one under the age of 17 will be admitted.** - This type of programming should be viewed by adults only. It contains graphic violence; explicit sex; or crude, indecent language.

**X: Adults Only** - This type of programming contains one or more of the following: very graphic violence, very graphic and explicit or indecent sexual acts, very coarse and intensely suggestive language.

**TV PARENTAL GUIDELINES**  
(TV BROADCASTERS)

**TV-Y: (All children** -- This program is designed to be appropriate for all children.) Designed for a very young audience, including children ages 2-6. This type of programming is not expected to frighten younger children.

**TV-Y7: (Directed to Older Children** -- This program is designed for children ages 7 and above.) It may be more appropriate for children who have acquired the development skills needed to distinguish between make-believe and reality. This programming may include mild fantasy and comic violence (FV).

**TV-G: (General Audience** -- Most parents would find this program suitable for all ages.) This type of programming contains little or no violence, no strong language, and little or no sexual dialogue or sexual situations.

**TV-PG: (Parental Guidance Suggested** -- This program contains material that parents may find unsuitable for younger children.) This type of programming contains one or more of the following: Moderate violence (V), some sexual situations (S), infrequent coarse language (L), or some suggestive dialogue (D).

**TV-14: (Parents Strongly Cautioned** -- This program contains some material that many parents would find unsuitable for children under 14 years of age.) This type of programming contains one or more of the following: intense violence (V); intense sexual situations (S); strong, coarse language (L); or intensely suggestive dialogue (D).

**TV-MA: (Mature Audience Only** -- This program is specifically designed to be viewed by adults and therefore may be unsuitable for children under 17.) This type of programming contains one or more of the following: graphic violence (V); explicit sexual situations (S); or crude, indecent language (L).



# AUTOLOCK™ – SETTING UP THE ACCESS CODE



**A**utoLock™ allows parents to block out or “censor” any channels they think children should not watch. A channel blocked by the AutoLock™ control cannot be viewed until a correct access code is used to unlock the channel for viewing. First, let’s set your AutoLock access code.

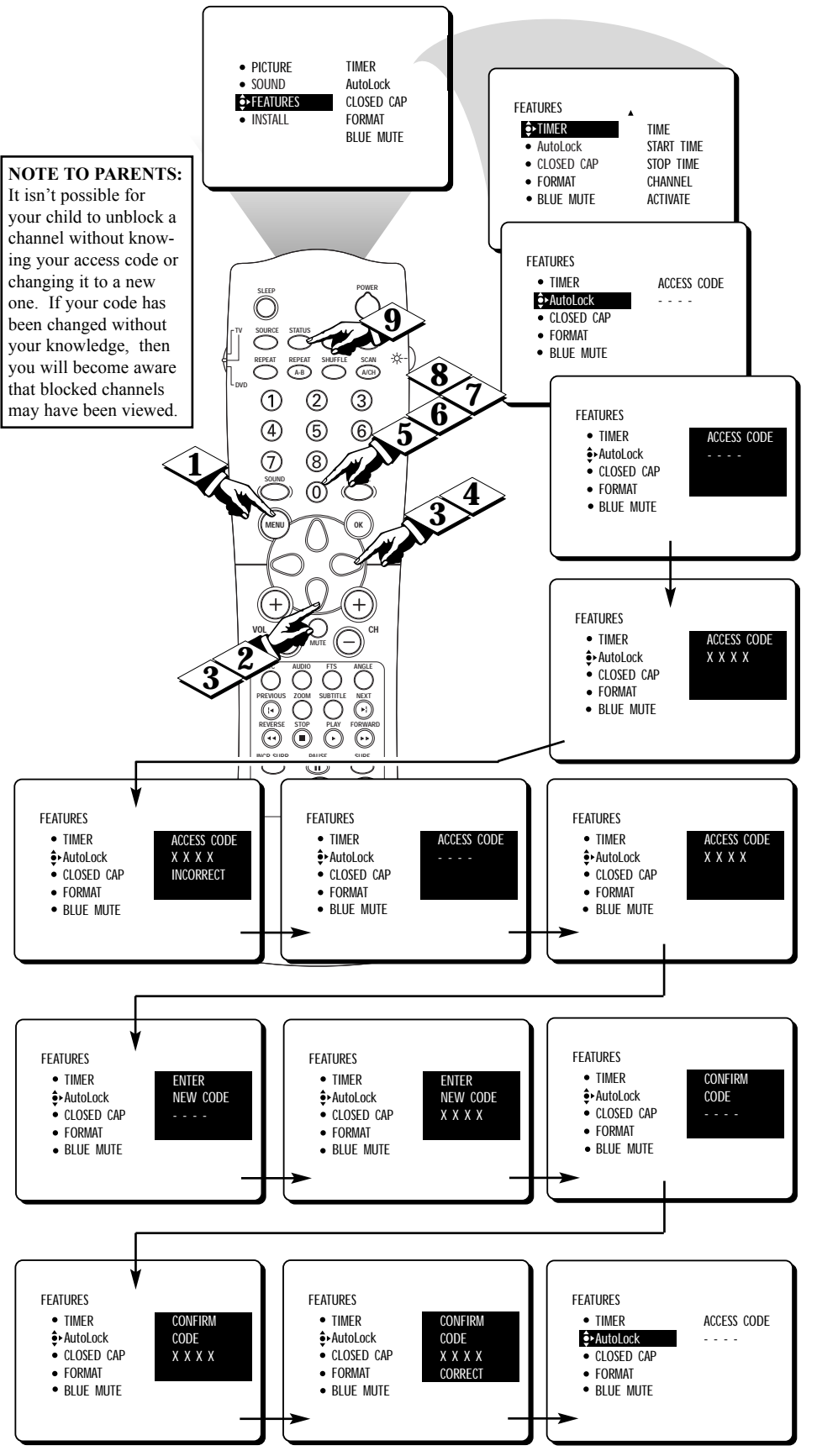

- 1 Press the **MENU** button on the remote control to show the on-screen menu.
- 2 Press the **CURSOR DOWN** button twice to highlight **FEA-TURES**.
- 3 Press the **CURSOR RIGHT** button and the menu will shift to the left. Then press the **CURSOR DOWN** button once to highlight the AutoLock control.
- 4 Press the **CURSOR RIGHT** button to highlight **ACCESS CODE**.
- 5 Press **0,7,1,1** on the remote control. **INCORRECT** will appear on the screen.
- 6 Press **0,7,1,1** on the remote control again. **ENTER NEW CODE** will appear on the screen.
- 7 Enter a new four-digit code using the number buttons. **CONFIRM CODE** will appear on the screen.
- 8 Enter your new four-digit code again. **CORRECT** will flash on the screen briefly and the high-light bar goes back to AutoLock.
- 9 Press the **STATUS** button to remove the menu from the screen.



**Remember that 0711 is the default AutoLock™ code. If your access code has been changed by someone other than you (a child, for example) or you have forgotten the code, you can always get in by inputting the default code.**

**NOTE TO PARENTS:**  
It isn't possible for your child to unblock a channel without knowing your access code or changing it to a new one. If your code has been changed without your knowledge, then you will become aware that blocked channels may have been viewed.

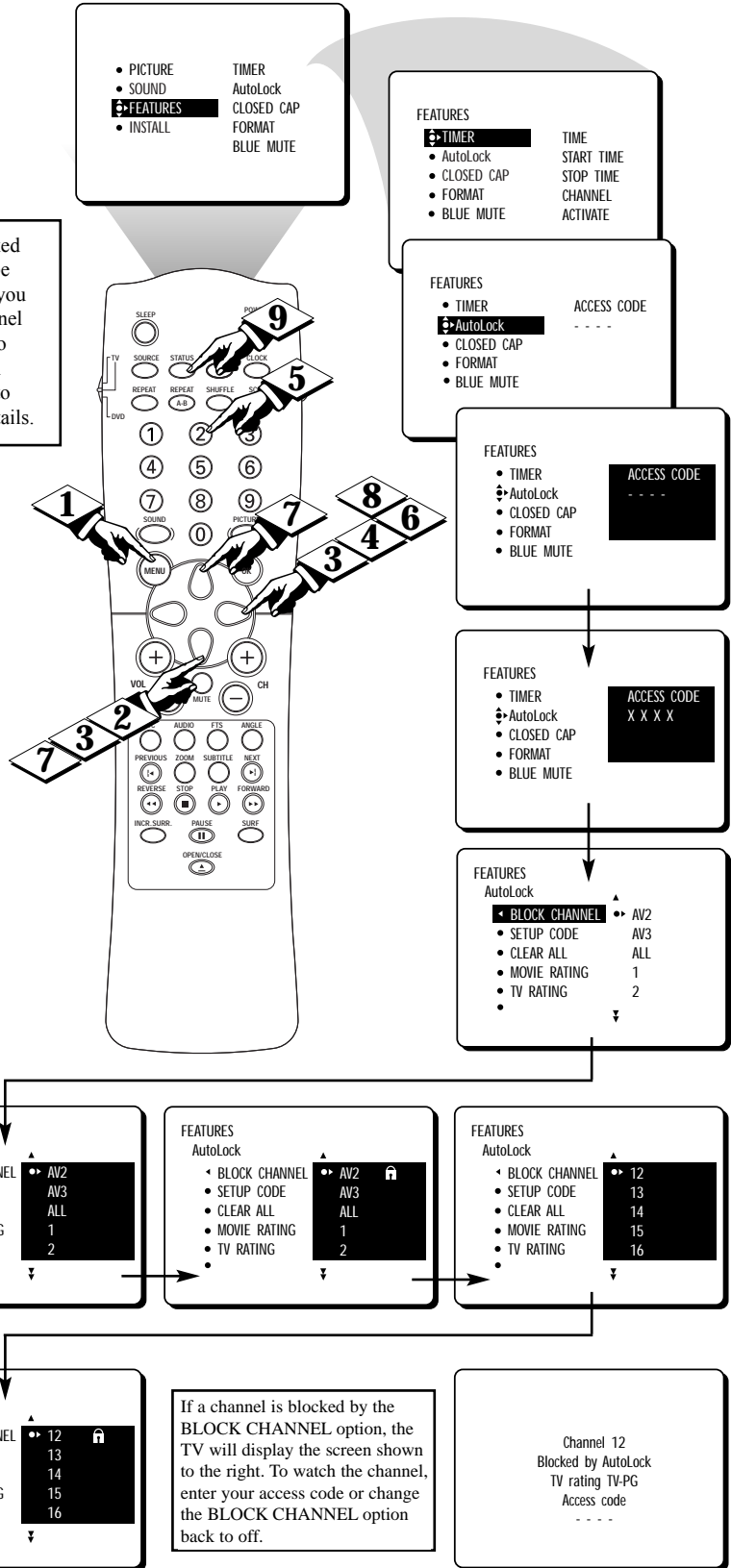
After your personal access code has been set (see the previous page), you are ready to select the channels or inputs you want to block out or censor.

## BEGIN

- 1 Press the **MENU** button on the remote control to show the on-screen menu.

- 3 Press the **CURSOR RIGHT** button and the menu will shift to the left. Then press the **CURSOR DOWN** button once to highlight the **AutoLock™** control.
- 4 Press the **CURSOR RIGHT** button again to highlight **ACCESS CODE**.
- 5 Enter your four-digit **ACCESS CODE**. *CORRECT* will flash very briefly and the menu will move to the left with **BLOCK CHANNEL** highlighted.
- 6 Press the **CURSOR RIGHT** button to highlight the TV's available channels.
- 7 Press the **CURSOR UP** or **CURSOR DOWN** button to highlight the channel you want to block.
- 8 Press the **CURSOR RIGHT** button to block the channel. A padlock image appears to the right of the channel number.  
Repeat steps 7 and 8 for any channels you want to block from viewing.
- 9 Press the **STATUS** button to remove the menu from the screen.



**NOTE:** Blocked channels will be skipped when you press the Channel +/- buttons. To view a blocked channel, refer to page 28 for details.



**NOTE:** You also can block out the use of the A/V external inputs on the rear of the TV. This stops the viewing of VCR, DVD, and other sources that can be shown through the A/V input jacks. Select AV1, AV2, or AV3 and then select **BLOCK**.



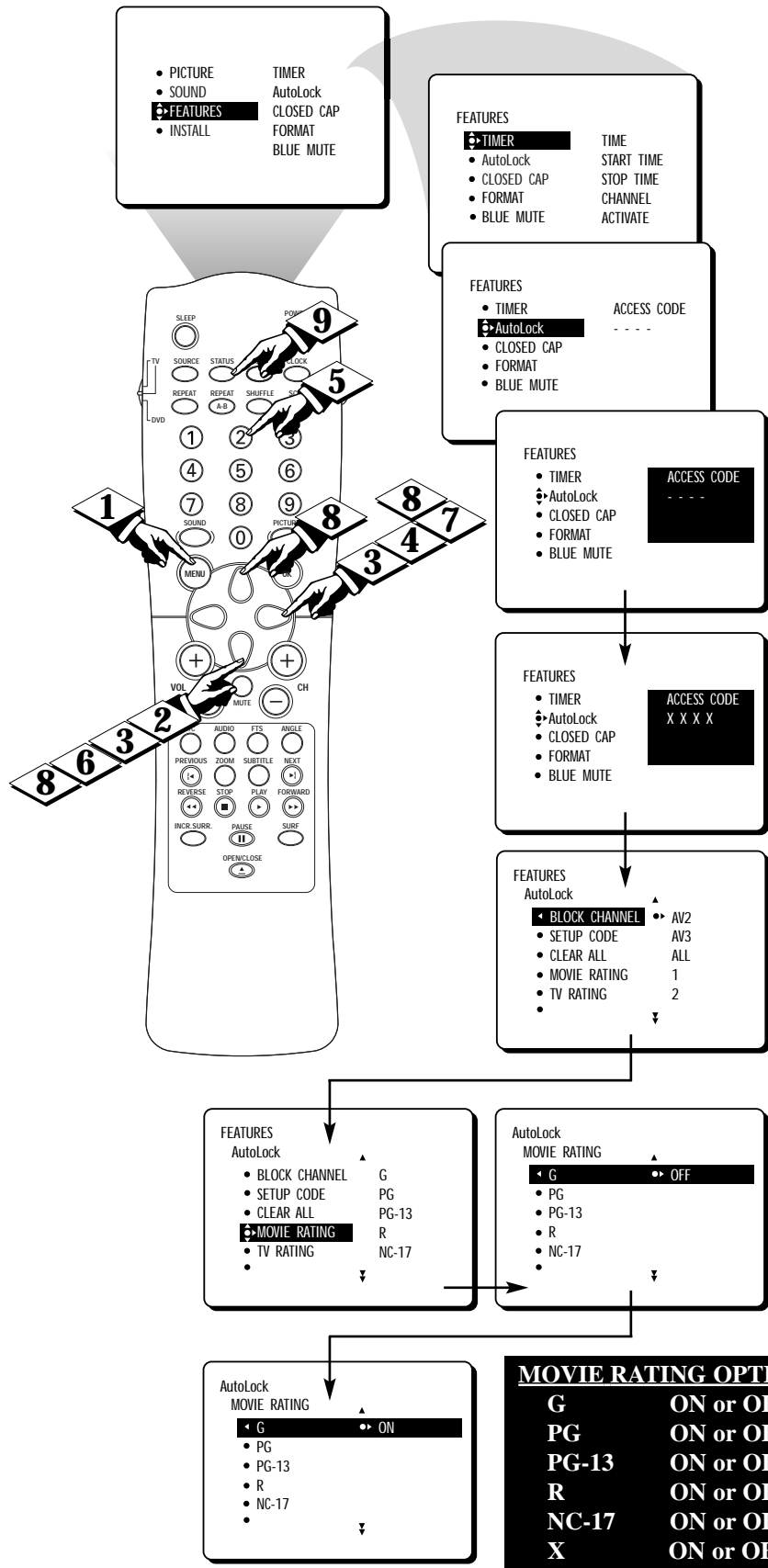


After your personal access code has been set (see page 19), you can select specific movie ratings that you want to censor.

- 7 Press the **CURSOR RIGHT** button and the Rating menu shifts to the left with **G** highlighted.
- 8 Press the **CURSOR UP** or **CURSOR DOWN** button to highlight each rating you want. Then press the **CURSOR RIGHT** button to turn the rating ON or OFF. Turning the rating ON will block programs with that rating from being seen.
- 9 Press the **STATUS** button to remove the menu from the screen.

**NOTE:** When a rating is turned ON, all higher ratings also will be turned on automatically. For example, if the *R* rating is turned on, the *NC-17* and *X* ratings also will be turned on.



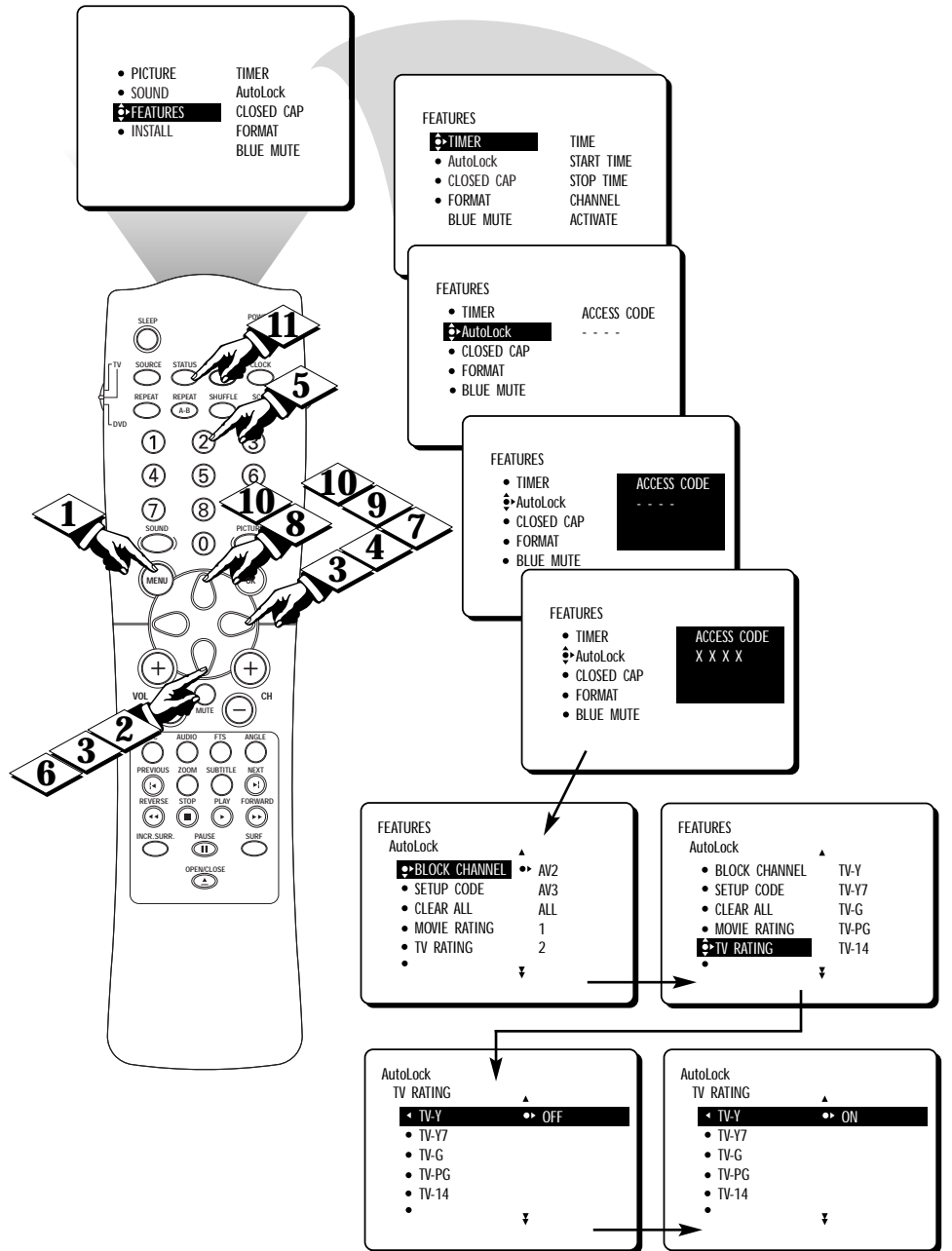

**TV-MA:** (Mature Audience Only -- This program is specifically designed to be viewed by adults and therefore may be unsuitable for children under 17.) This type of programming contains one or more of the following: crude, indecent language (L); explicit sexual situations (S); or graphic violence (V).

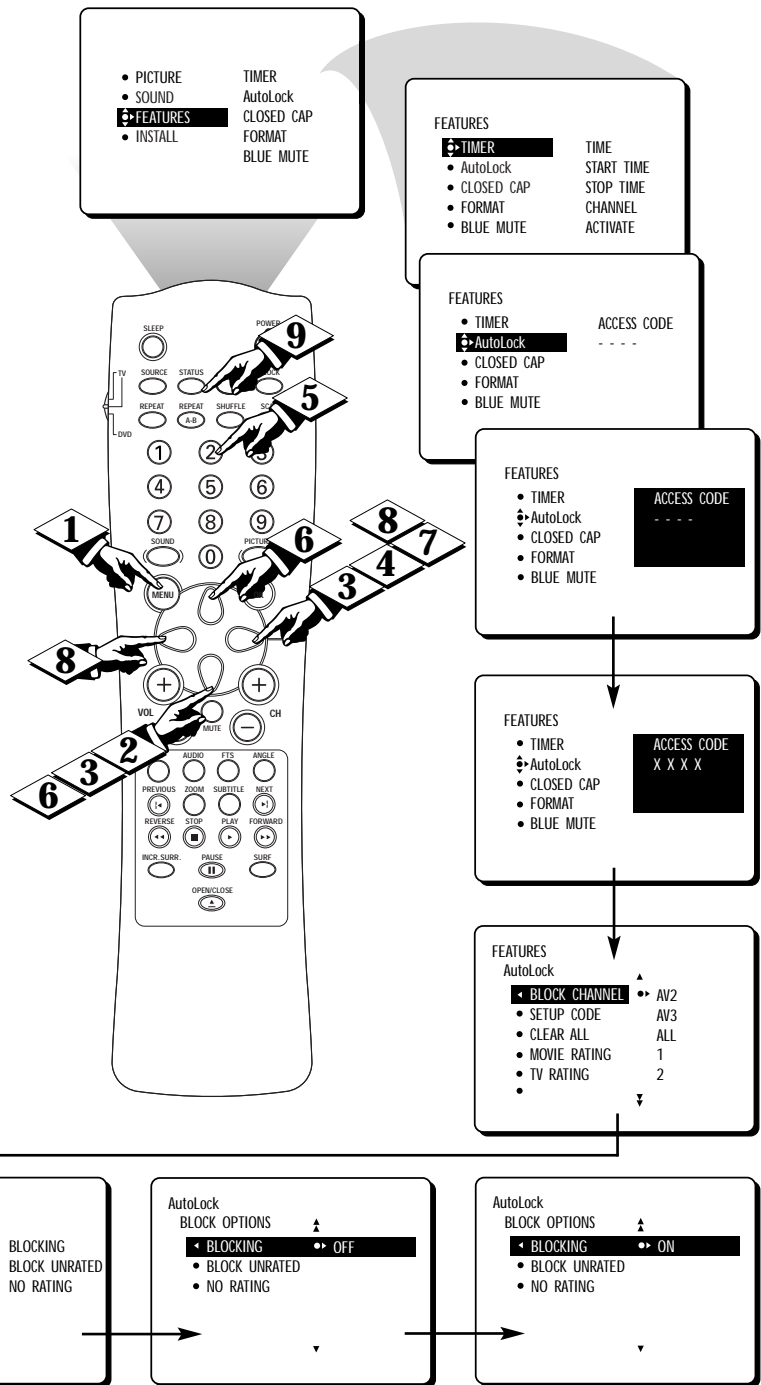

**NOTE:** If you have blocked specific subratings, such as V for Violence in the TV-PG category, these blocked subratings will not appear in the review. The subratings however, are still blocked according to your selections.

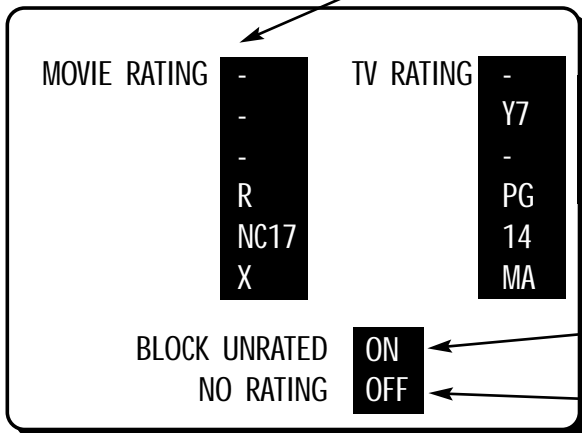
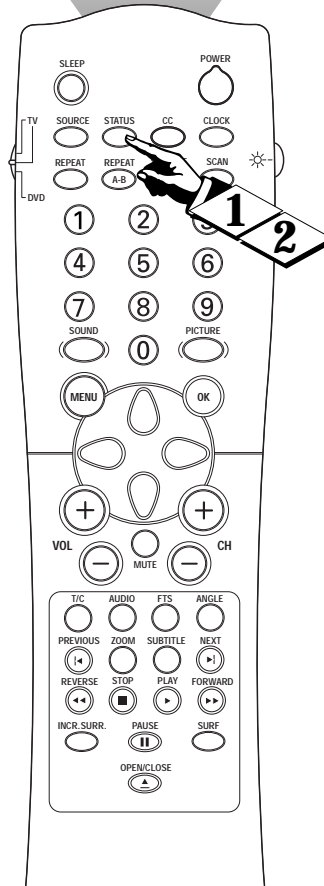
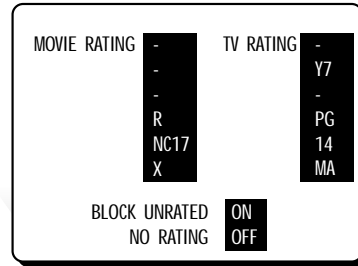
**2** After a few seconds, the settings will leave the screen automatically, or you can press the **STATUS** button a third time to remove them from the screen.



## SMART HELP



Remember, the review screen will appear only if **BLOCKING** is set to **ON**. For details, see page 25.



**MOVIE RATINGS** – Shows all blocked movie ratings that were set within the MOVIE RATING feature. Some or all may be blocked at one time. **NOTE:** If a lower rating is blocked, higher ratings also will be blocked automatically (for example, if R is set to be blocked, X also will automatically be blocked).

**TV RATINGS** – Shows all blocked TV ratings that were set within the feature. Some or all may be blocked at one time. **NOTE:** If a lower rating is blocked, higher ratings also will be blocked automatically (for example, if TV-14 is set to be blocked, TV-MA also will automatically be blocked). TV ratings also have subratings for Violence (V), Fantasy Violence (FV), Sexual Situations (S), Coarse Language (L), and Suggestive Language (D). If the main rating is turned OFF but the subrating is turned ON, the program will be blocked; however, the rating will not appear within the AutoLock review menu.

**BLOCK UNRATED** – Shows ON or OFF, depending on the status of the BLOCK UNRATED feature.

**BLOCK NO RATING** – Shows ON or OFF, depending on the status of the BLOCK NO RATING feature.



# AUTOLOCK™ – VIEWING BLOCKED PROGRAMMING

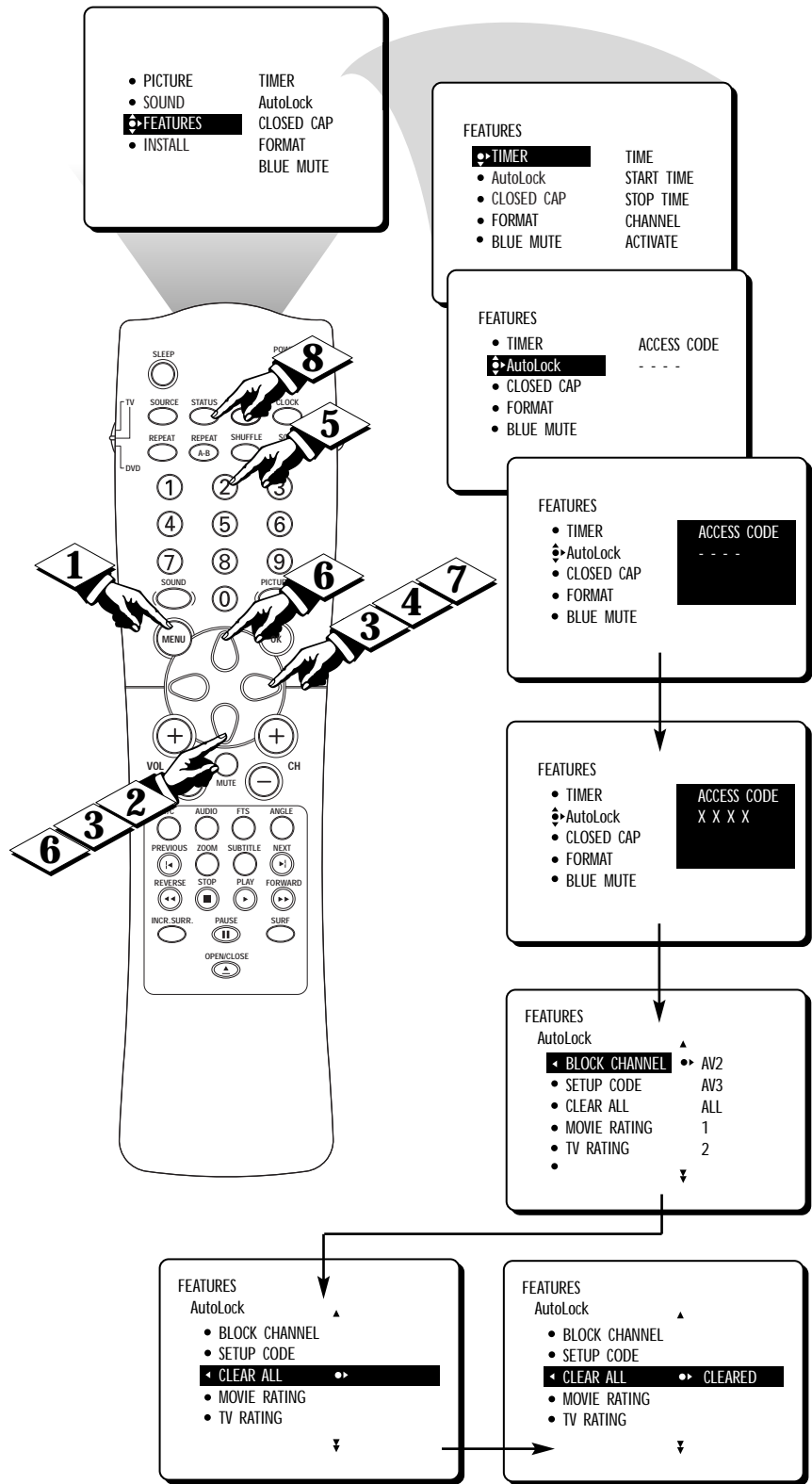


Various on-screen messages will appear when someone tries to view blocked programming. The message is determined by how the current programming is blocked. You may view the blocked programming and turn OFF the AutoLock™ feature by clearing all blocking options or by entering your access code.

## BEGIN

- 1 Press the **MENU** button on the remote to show the on-screen menu.
- 2 Press the **CURSOR DOWN** button twice to highlight **FEATURES**.
- 3 Press the **CURSOR RIGHT** button and the menu will shift to the left. Then press the **CURSOR DOWN** button once to highlight the AutoLock control.
- 4 Press the **CURSOR RIGHT** button again to highlight **ACCESS CODE**.
- 5 Enter your four-digit **ACCESS CODE** and the menu will move to the left with **BLOCK CHANNEL** highlighted.
- 6 Press the **CURSOR DOWN** button twice to highlight **CLEAR ALL**.
- 7 Press the **CURSOR RIGHT** button twice. The **CLEAR ALL** option will display the word **CLEARED**. All blocked channels and programming are now viewable.
- 8 Press the **STATUS** button to remove the menu.

If you tune to a specific channel that has been blocked by **BLOCK CHANNEL** or any of the AutoLock™ **RATING** options, simply enter your four-digit access code to view the channel. **NOTE:** this will unblock ALL channels until the TV is shut OFF. When powered back ON, all previously blocked channels will be blocked again.







# SOUND – ADJUSTING THE TREBLE, BASS, AND BALANCE

Besides the normal volume level control, your TV also has individual sound-adjustment controls. The **TREBLE** (high frequency), **BASS** (low frequency), and **Speaker BALANCE** may all be used to adjust the sound playback of TV programs.

## BEGIN

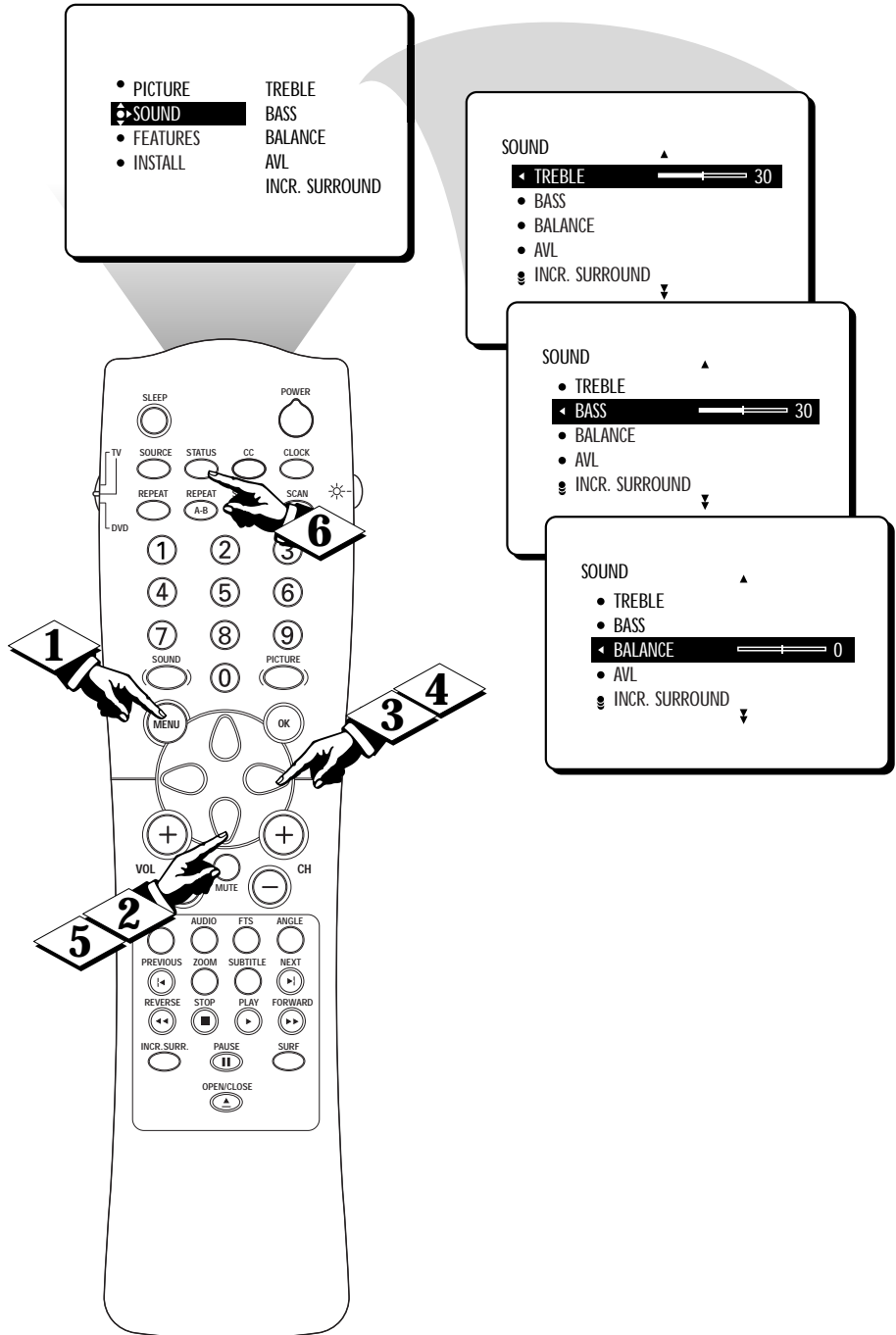
- 1 Press the **MENU** button on the remote control to show the on-screen menu.
- 2 Press the **CURSOR DOWN** button once to highlight **SOUND**.
- 3 Press the **CURSOR RIGHT** button and the menu will shift to the left. **TREBLE** will be highlighted and an adjustment bar will be shown to the right.
- 4 Use the **CURSOR RIGHT** or **CURSOR LEFT** button to adjust the **TREBLE** (high frequency) level of the television's sound.
- 5 After adjusting the **TREBLE** control, press the **CURSOR DOWN** button to select another sound adjustment: **BASS** or **BALANCE**. Press the **CURSOR RIGHT** or **CURSOR LEFT** button to adjust the selected control.
- 6 Press the **STATUS** button to remove the menu from the screen.



## SMART HELP



Remember, when the bar scale is centered, speaker **BALANCE** is centered between the TV's left and right side speakers.





Use the Volume Bar control to see the TV's volume level settings on the TV screen. The Volume Bar will be seen each time the VOLUME buttons (on the TV or remote control) are pressed.

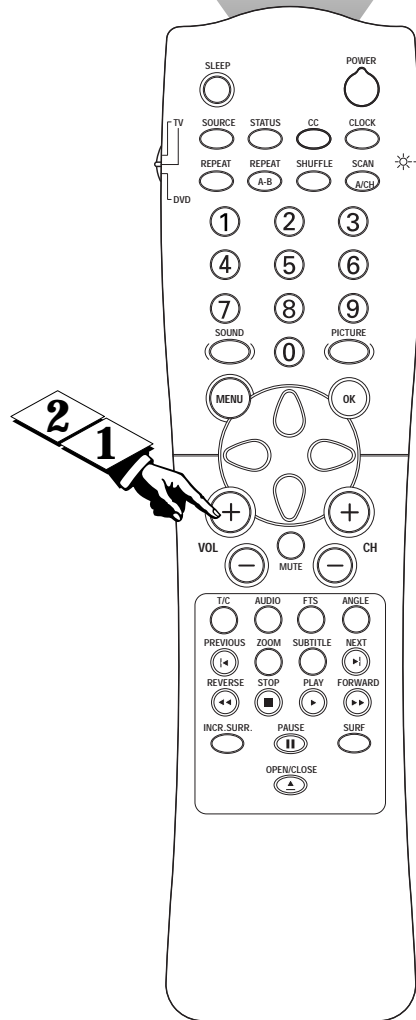
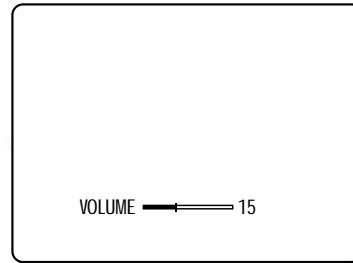
- 1 Press the VOLUME (+) or (-) button on the remote control to show the VOLUME bar display on the screen.
- 2 Press the VOLUME (+) or (-) button to adjust the television's sound level.



## SMART HELP



Try it out. Press the VOL (+) and (-) buttons. The VOLUME bar will appear near the bottom center of the screen.



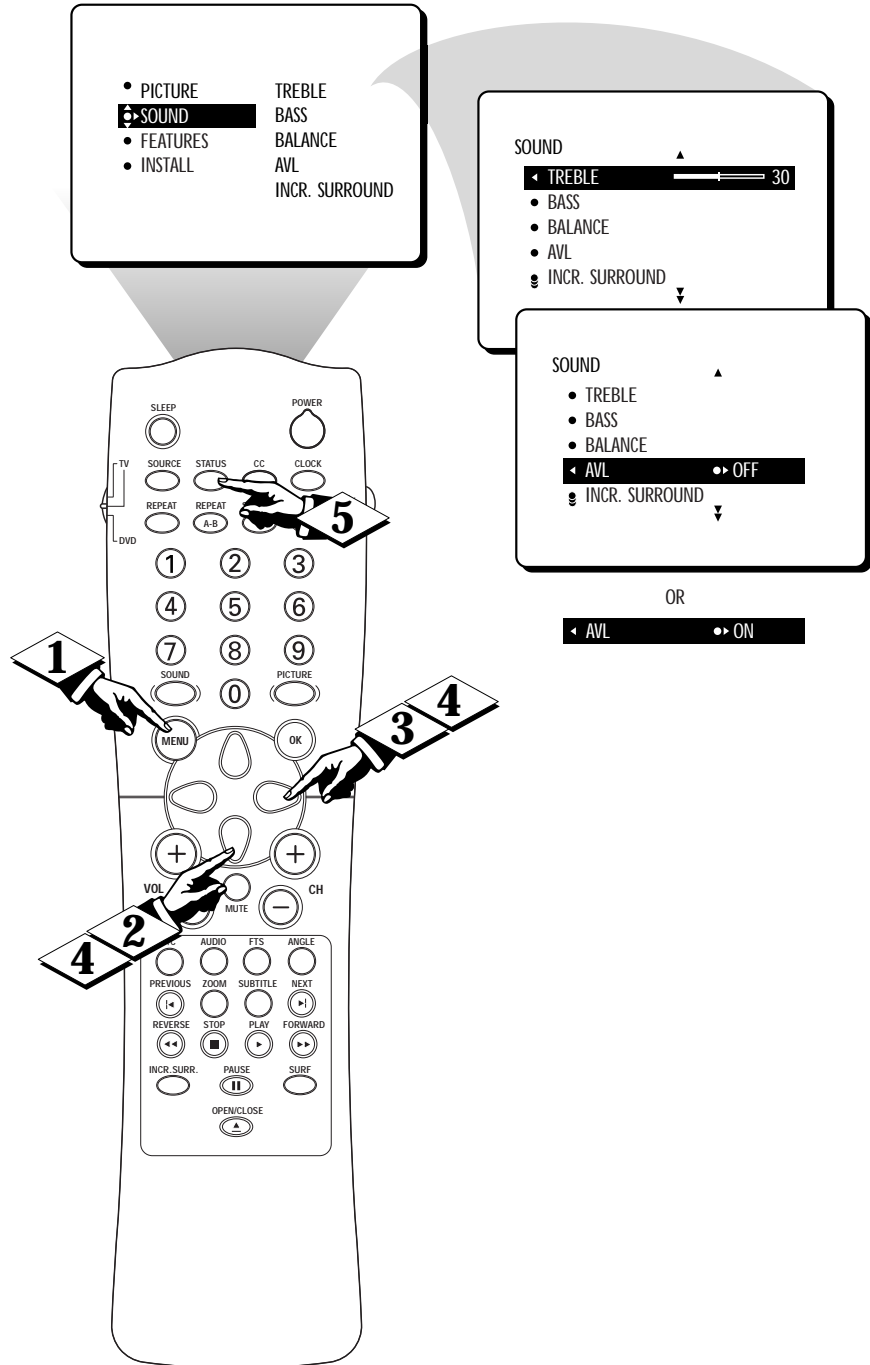


# SOUND – USING THE AVL (AUDIO VOLUME LEVELER)

In most cases, the volume levels coming from broadcast programming or commercials are never the same. With the AVL (Audio Volume Leveler) control turned ON, you can have the TV level out sound that is being heard. This makes for a more consistent sound by reducing the peaks and valleys that occur during program changes or commercial breaks. To turn the AVL ON, follow these steps.

## BEGIN

- 1 Press the **MENU** button on the remote control to show the on-screen menu.
- 2 Press the **CURSOR DOWN** button once to highlight **SOUND**.
- 3 Press the **CURSOR RIGHT** button and the menu will shift to the left. **TREBLE** will be highlighted and an adjustment bar will be shown to the right.
- 4 Press the **CURSOR DOWN** button repeatedly until **AVL** is highlighted. Then press the **CURSOR RIGHT** or **CURSOR LEFT** button to toggle AVL ON or OFF.
- 5 Press the **STATUS** button to remove the menu from the screen.





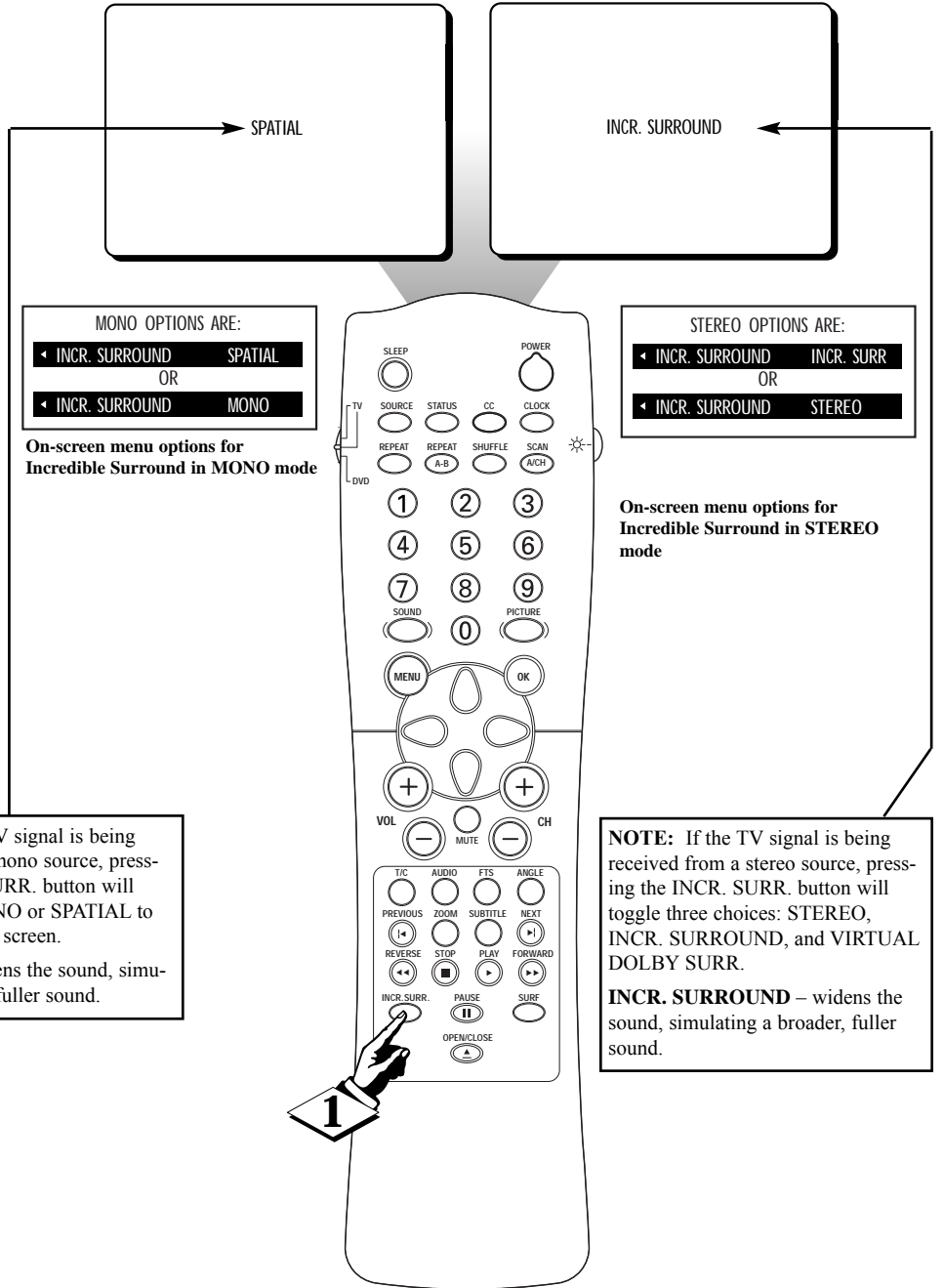
*The Incredible Surround feature adds greater depth and dimension to both monaural (MONO) and stereo TV sound. With the control set to INCR. SURROUND (Incredible Surround), the TV's speakers can add even wider sound separation to normal broadcasts.*

**BEGIN**

**1** Press the **INCR. SURR.** button on the remote control to turn the Incredible Surround feature ON.

When the TV signal is being received in Stereo, pressing this button will give you these options: STEREO, or INCR. SURROUND.

When the TV signal is in MONO, the choices displayed will read SPATIAL or MONO.



**NOTE:** If the TV signal is being received from a mono source, pressing the INCR. SURR. button will cause either MONO or SPATIAL to appear on the the screen.  
**SPATIAL** – widens the sound, simulating a broader, fuller sound.

**NOTE:** If the TV signal is being received from a stereo source, pressing the INCR. SURR. button will toggle three choices: STEREO, INCR. SURROUND, and VIRTUAL DOLBY SURR.  
**INCR. SURROUND** – widens the sound, simulating a broader, fuller sound.



# SOUND – SETTING THE TV FOR STEREO AND SAP

You can receive broadcast stereo TV programs. The TV has both an amplifier and twin speakers through which the stereo sound can be heard.

## BEGIN

- 1 Press the **MENU** button on the remote control to show the on-screen menu.
- 2 Press the **CURSOR DOWN** button once to highlight the **SOUND** menu.
- 3 Press the **CURSOR RIGHT** button and the menu will shift to the left.
- 4 Press the **CURSOR DOWN** button repeatedly until the **STEREO** control is highlighted.
- 5 Press the **CURSOR LEFT** or **CURSOR RIGHT** button to select **STEREO** or **MONO**. When **STEREO** has been selected, the television will reproduce any stereo broadcast signal it receives.
- 6 Press the **STATUS** button to remove the menu from the screen.



## SECOND AUDIO PROGRAM (SAP)

An SAP is an additional part of the stereo broadcast system. Sent as a third audio channel, an SAP can be heard apart from the current TV program sound. TV stations are free to use SAP for any number of purposes.

If an SAP signal is not present with a selected program, the SAP option cannot be selected. Also, if SAP is selected on a channel (with SAP) and you select another channel, when you return to the original channel, SAP will be OFF. You will have to reselect the SAP feature.

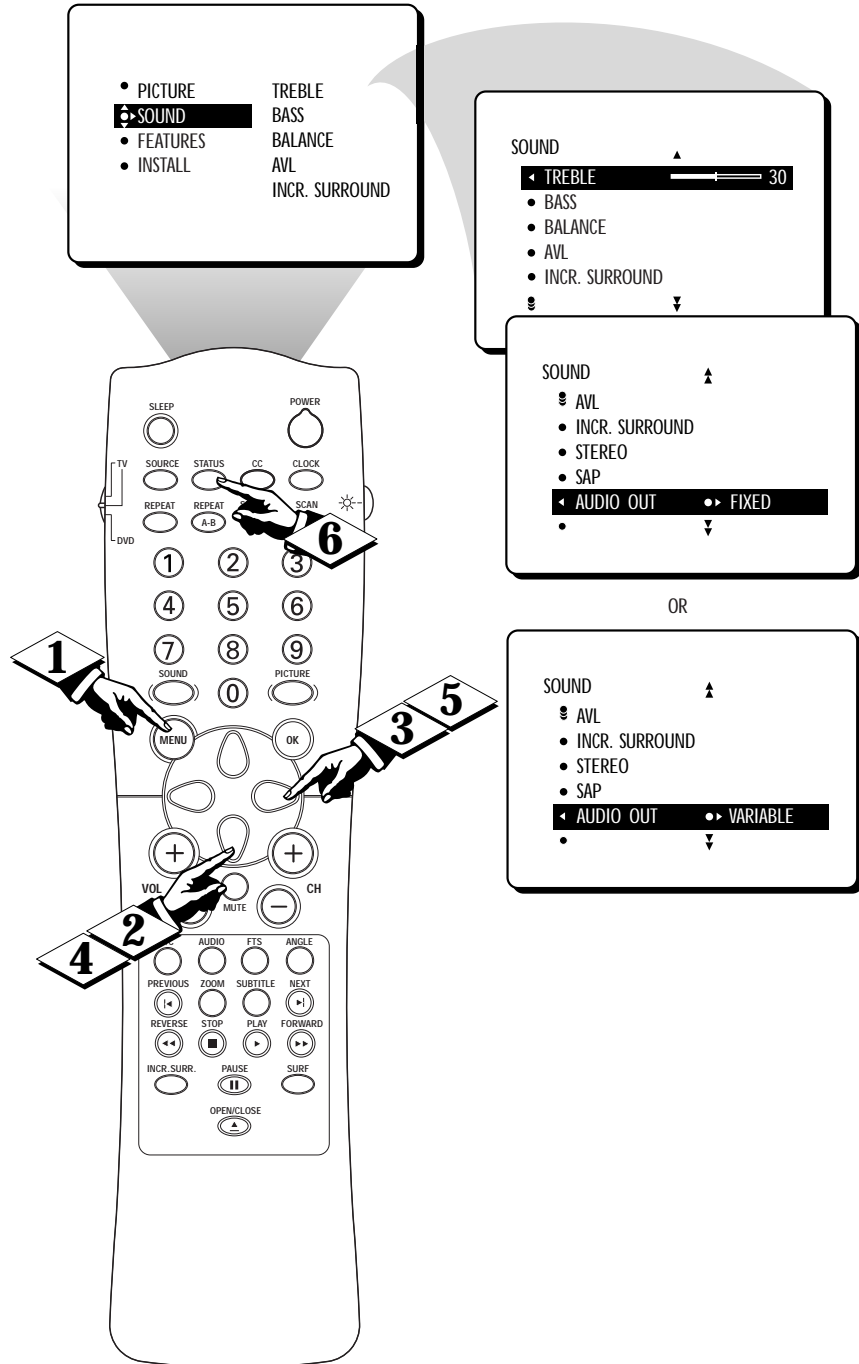
# SOUND – SETTING THE AUDIO OUT CONTROL



If you have connected the TV's **AUDIO OUTPUT** jacks to the **AUDIO INPUT** jacks on a stereo receiver, set **AUDIO OUT** to either **VARIABLE** or **FIXED** to determine whether you adjust the volume at the stereo or at the TV. If you select **VARIABLE**, change the volume at the TV using the TV's remote control. If you select **FIXED**, adjust the volume at the stereo using the stereo's controls. To select **FIXED** or **VARIABLE**, follow these steps.

## BEGIN

- 1 Press the **MENU** button on the remote control to show the on-screen menu.
- 2 Press the **CURSOR DOWN** button once to highlight **SOUND**.
- 3 Press the **CURSOR RIGHT** button and the menu will shift to the left.
- 4 Press the **CURSOR DOWN** button repeatedly until **AUDIO OUT** is highlighted.
- 5 Press the **CURSOR LEFT** or **CURSOR RIGHT** button to set the **AUDIO OUT** to **VARIABLE** or **FIXED**.
- 6 Press the **STATUS** button to remove the menu from the screen.





# SOUND – USING THE TV SPEAKER CONTROL AND AUDIO OUTPUT JACKS

Would you like to hear TV programs through your audio hi-fi system? The TV's Audio Output jacks and TV Speaker ON/OFF control work together to offer you this TV sound option.

## BEGIN

**1** Connect the **R(ight)** and **L(eft)** **AUDIO OUT** jacks on the TV to the R and L audio input jacks on your amplifier or sound system. Set the audio system's volume to a normal listening level.

**2** Turn the TV and audio system **ON**. You can now adjust the sound level coming from the audio system with the **VOLUME (+)** or **(-)** buttons on the TV or remote control.

To hear the TV sound from only the audio system speakers:

**3** Press the **MENU** button on the remote control to show the on-screen menu.

**4** Press the **CURSOR DOWN** button once to highlight **SOUND**.

**5** Press the **CURSOR RIGHT** button and the menu will shift to the left.

**6** Press the **CURSOR DOWN** button repeatedly until the **SPEAKERS** control is highlighted.

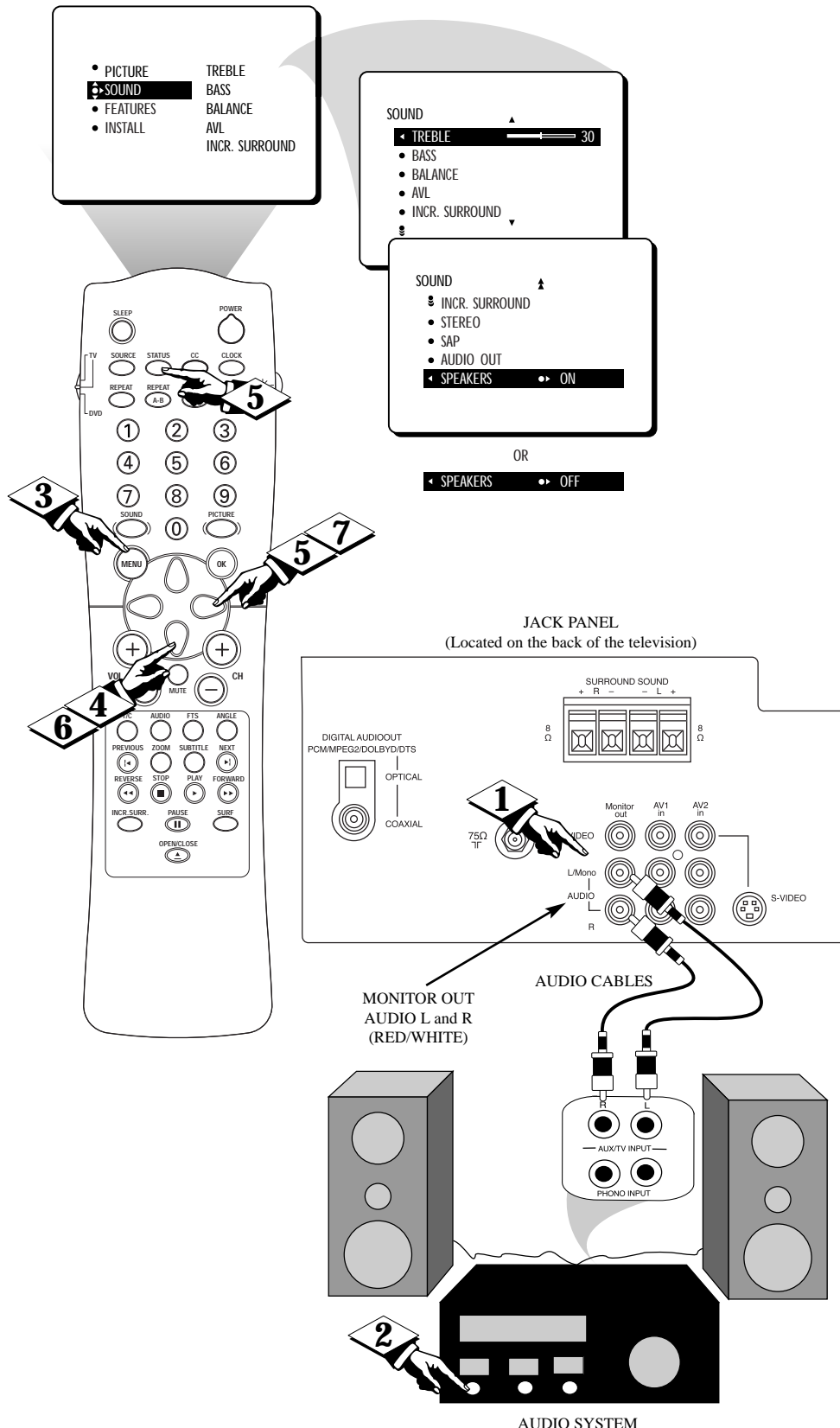
**7** Press the **CURSOR RIGHT** or **CURSOR LEFT** button to turn the television's speakers **ON** or **OFF**. With the **SPEAKERS** control set to **OFF**, you should hear the TV sound coming only from the audio system speakers.

Remember, the audio system may have to be in **AUX(iliary)** mode to play sound from the TV.







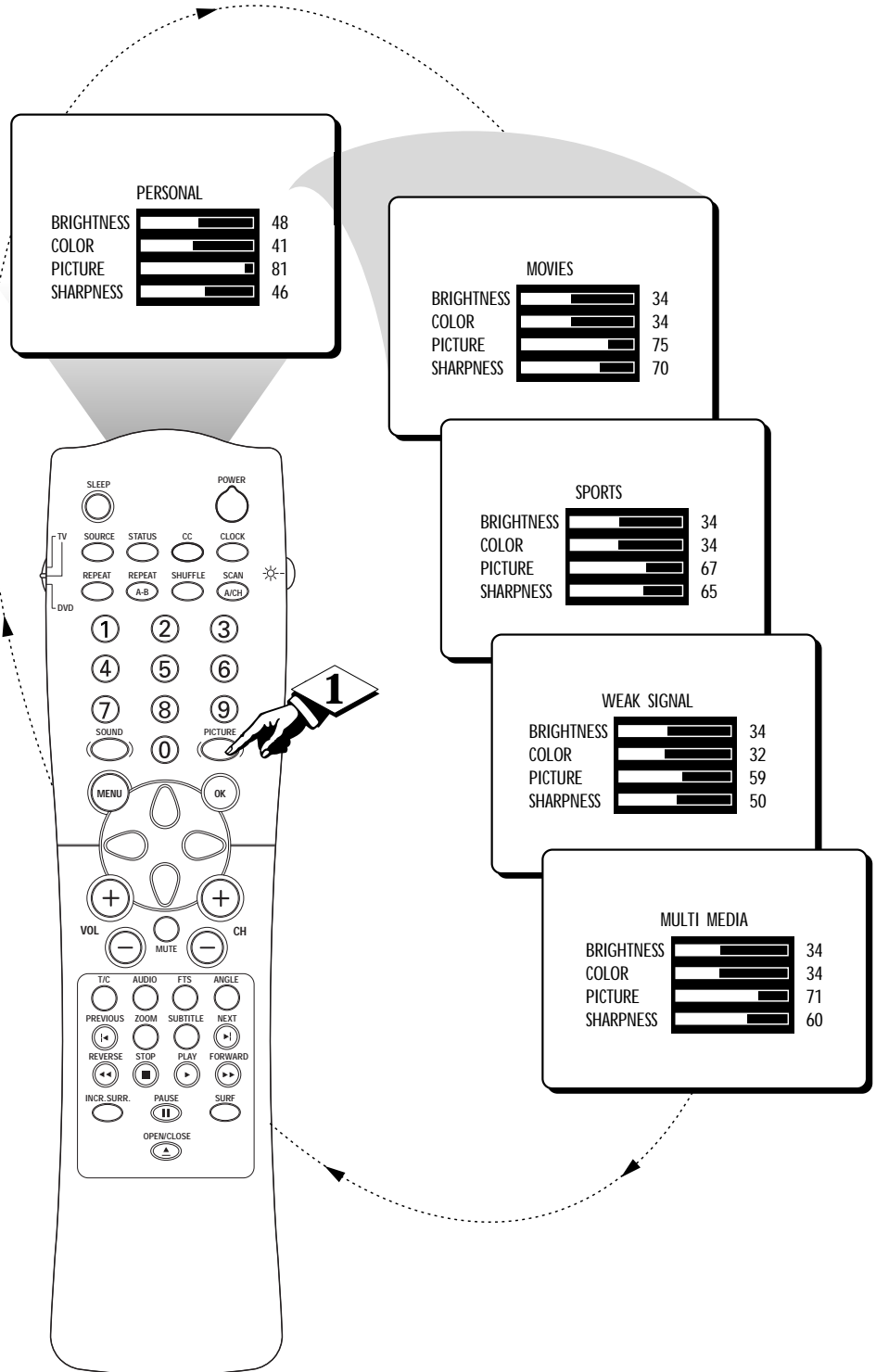
Whether you're watching a movie or a video game, your TV has automatic video control settings that will match with your current program source or content. AutoPicture™ quickly resets your TV's video controls for a number of different types of programs and viewing conditions that you may have in your home. The Movies, Sports, Weak Signal, and Multimedia AutoPicture™ controls have been preset at the factory to automatically adjust the TV's brightness, color, picture, sharpness, tint, and color temperature levels. The Personal AutoPicture™ settings are the ones that you made through the PICTURE options within the on-screen menu.

**BEGIN**

**1** Press the **PICTURE** button on the remote control. The current AutoPicture™ setting will appear in the middle of the screen.

**2** Press the **PICTURE** button repeatedly to select either PERSONAL, MOVIES, SPORTS, WEAK SIGNAL, or MULTI MEDIA picture settings.

**NOTE:** The PERSONAL setting and the PICTURE options within the on-screen menu are the same. This is the only option in AutoPicture™ that can be changed. To adjust these settings, use the PICTURE options within the on-screen menu. All other settings are set up at the factory during production and cannot be adjusted.





# REMOTE CONTROL – USING AUTO SOUND™

**A**utoSound™ allows you to select from three factory-set controls and a personal control that you set according to your own preferences through the on-screen Sound menu. The three factory-set controls (Voice, Music, and Theatre) enable you to tailor the TV sound so as to enhance the particular program you are watching. Follow these steps to select any of the options.

**BEGIN**

**1**

Press the **SOUND** button on the remote control. The current AutoSound™ setting will appear in the middle of the screen.

**2**

Press the **SOUND** button repeatedly to toggle among the four settings: PERSONAL, VOICE, MUSIC, or THEATRE.

Remember, only the PERSONAL control can be changed by the viewer. This changes the settings in the main on-screen menu's SOUND controls.

## SMART HELP



Remember, AutoSound™ works only with the programs coming through the ANTENNA/CABLE (ANT) input on the rear of the TV (RF audio). It will not control the sound levels for the external connections.

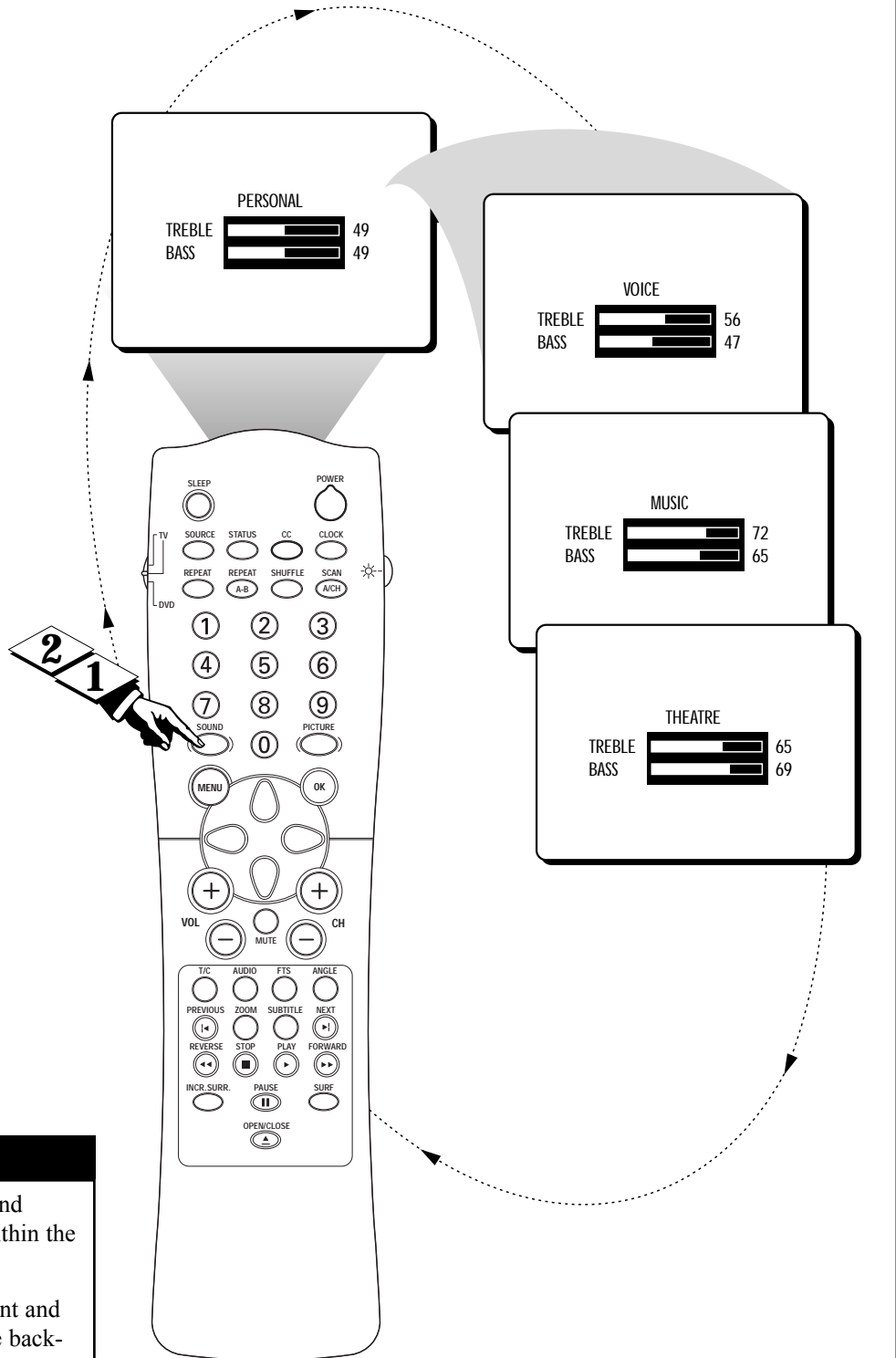
## AutoSound™ Options

**PERSONAL** – presents the TV's sound according to the settings you make within the sound menu.

**VOICE** – brings voices to the forefront and emphasizes them. Moves music to the background.

**MUSIC** – emphasizes music over voices.

**THEATRE** – provides a balance between voices and music.





A list or series of previously viewed channels can be selected with the SURF button on your remote control. With this feature, you can easily switch between different TV channels that currently interest you. The SURF control allows you to set up to ten channels in its quick viewing list.

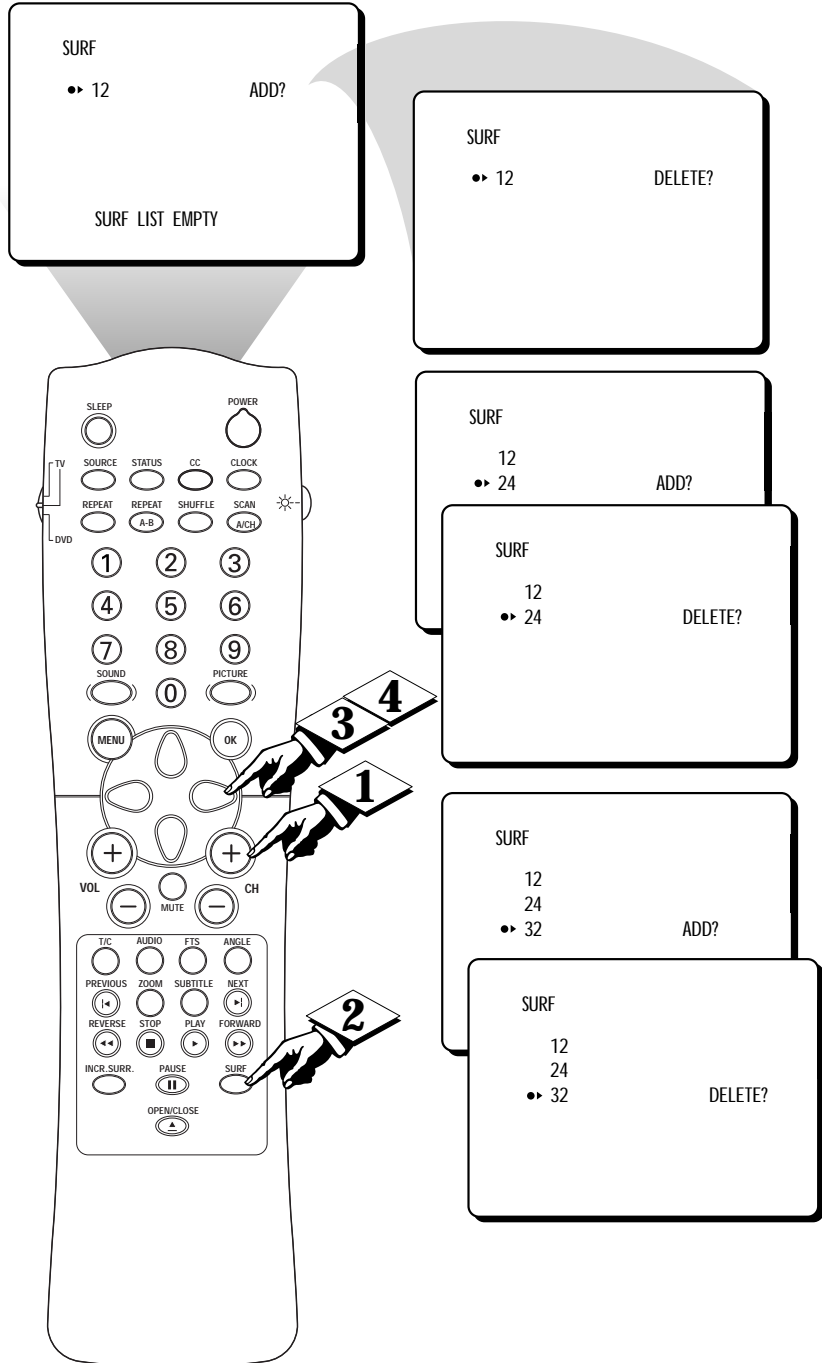
**BEGIN**

- 1 Press the CHANNEL(+) or (-) button (or the numbered buttons) to select a channel to add to the SURF list.
- 2 Press the SURF button on the remote control. The on-screen display may read, "SURF LIST EMPTY." The number of the current channel will be shown with "ADD?" to the right.
- 3 While the SURF list message or the SURF channel list appears on the screen, press the CURSOR RIGHT button to add the present channel to the SURF list.
- 4 If you want to delete the present channel from the SURF list, press the CURSOR RIGHT button again.

Repeat steps 1 through 3 to add more channels (up to 10) to the SURF list.



**NOTE:** Along with regularly programmed channels, the external video source connections can be added to the SURF list. This means that the AV1, AV2, and AV3 channels can be added to your SURF list. Just tune to their channel and use the same procedure described on this page.





# OPERATING THE DVD PLAYER

This section of the *Directions for Use* manual begins to explain the operating procedures of the DVD Player portion of this television. Be sure the remote control's TV/DVD Mode Switch is placed in the DVD position before attempting to operate the DVD Player.

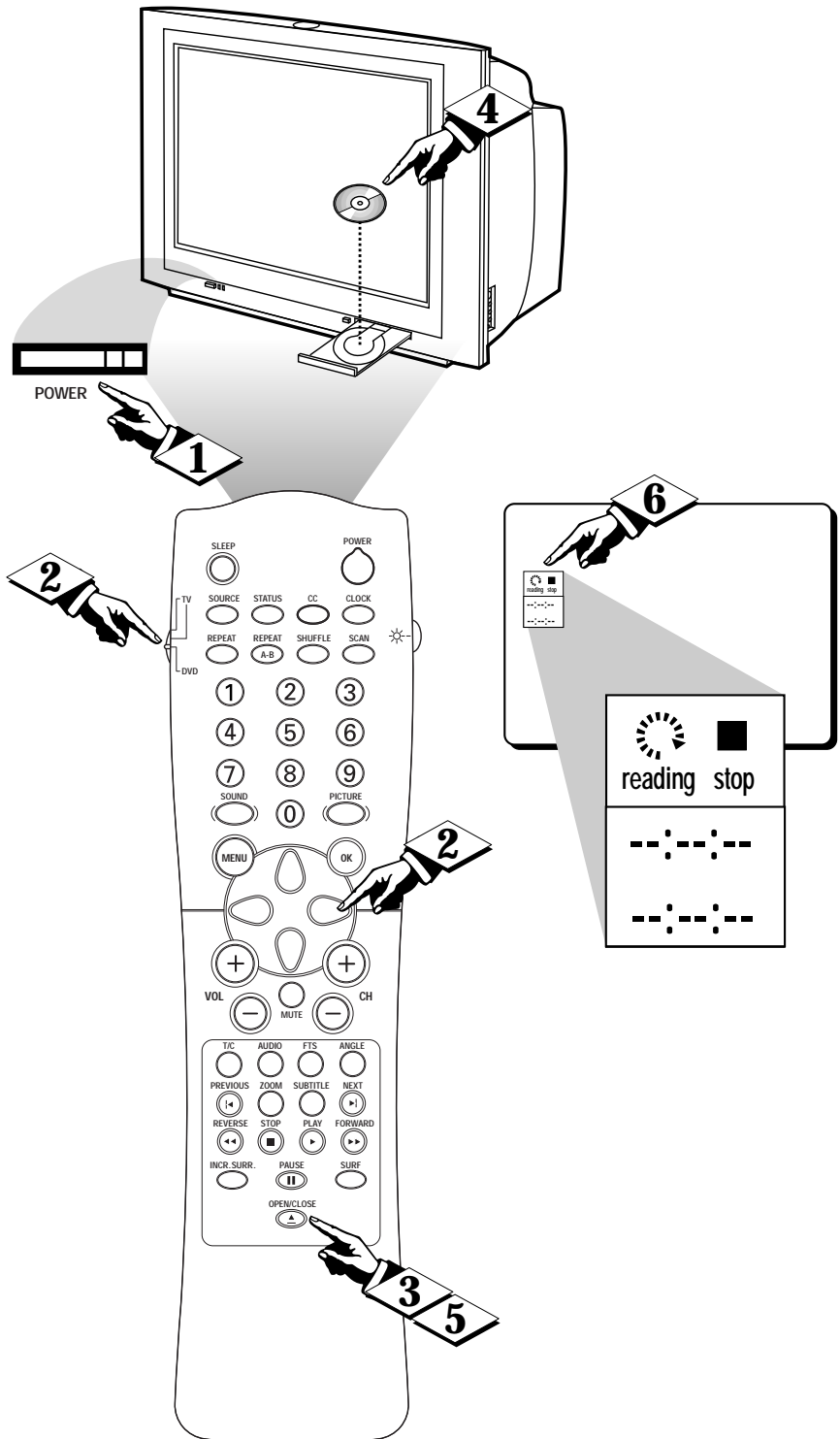
*Let's learn the simple operation of the TV's built-in DVD Player. Unless otherwise stated, all operations can be performed by using the remote control.*

### BEGIN

- 1 Press the **POWER** button on the remote control (or the TV) to turn the television ON.
- 2 Slide the **TV/DVD Mode Switch** on the remote control to the DVD position.
- 3 Press the **OPEN/CLOSE** button on the remote control to place the TV/DVD in the DVD mode. Press the **OPEN/CLOSE** button again to open the disc tray.
- 4 Place your chosen disc in the tray. Be sure that the disc label is facing up and the disc is centered in the tray.
- 5 Press the **OPEN/CLOSE** button on the remote control (or the **EJECT** button on the TV) to close the disc tray.
- 6 The on-screen display will indicate that the DVD Player is reading the disc. Then playback of the disc will begin automatically.


**Note:** If the "Child Lock" option is set to ON within the Personal Preference section, the 4-digit access code must be entered or the disc must be authorized. (See the "Access Control" section within this manual.)

A Default Screen is displayed when the DVD Player is in the STOP mode. It may contain a "Status Window" and a "Temporary Feedback Field." this screen gives information concerning prohibited actions, playback, modes, available angles, etc.





- 1 Press the **STATUS** button to display the DVD Player's on-screen menu.

- 3 Some of these options, along with a few others, can also be selected directly from the remote control through dedicated function buttons.

## PICTURE

Many of the DVD Player's features can be set to suit your "Personal Preference." Let's start by looking at the PICTURE features.

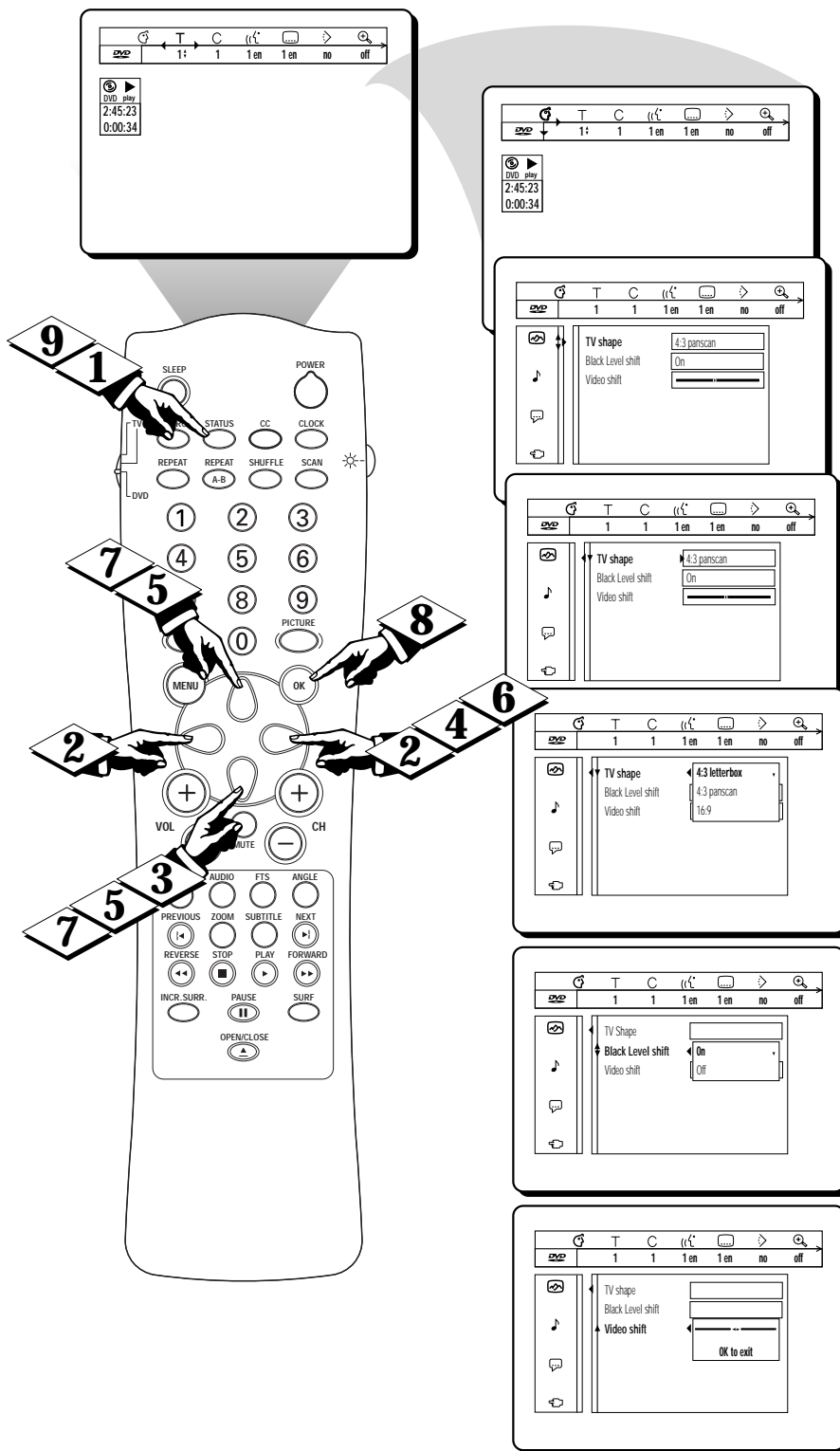
### BEGIN

- 1 Press the **STATUS** button on the remote control to display the on-screen menu.
- 2 Press the **CURSOR LEFT** or **RIGHT** until the **Personal Preference Icon**  is highlighted.
- 3 Press the **CURSOR DOWN** button to highlight the **Picture Icon** .
- 4 Press the **CURSOR RIGHT** button to highlight the first **Picture feature option "TV Shape"**.
- 5 Press the **CURSOR UP** or **DOWN** button to select and highlight the feature you wish to change. Choose **Picture Shape**, **Black Level Shift**, or **Video Shift**.
- 6 Press the **CURSOR RIGHT** button to display the options for the selected **Picture feature**.
 

**Picture Shape:** Select 4:3 panscan, 4:3 letterbox, or 16:9.

**Black Level Shift:** Select ON or OFF. When ON, richer color contrasts are obtained.

**Video Shift:** The factory centers the video picture on the TV's screen. Video Shift will let you position the picture by pressing the **Cursor Right** or **Left**.
- 7 Press the **CURSOR UP** or **DOWN** buttons to scroll and highlight the options of the selected feature.
- 8 Press the **OK** button to select or activate the chosen option.
- 9 Press the **STATUS** button to clear the on-screen menu from the TV screen.







## SOUND

The Personal Preference area of the menu has various **SOUND** features to customize and compliment your viewing and listening pleasure.

### BEGIN

- 1 Press the **STATUS** button on the remote control to display the on-screen menu.
- 2 Press the **CURSOR LEFT** or **RIGHT** button until the Personal Preference Icon is highlighted.
- 3 Press the **CURSOR DOWN** button to highlight the Sound Icon .
- 4 Press the **CURSOR RIGHT** button to highlight the first Sound feature option "**Digital output**".
- 5 Press the **CURSOR UP** or **DOWN** button to select and highlight the feature you wish to change. Choose **Digital output**, **Analog output**, **Night mode**, or **Karaoke vocal**.
- 6 Press the **CURSOR RIGHT** button to display the options for the selected Picture feature.
 

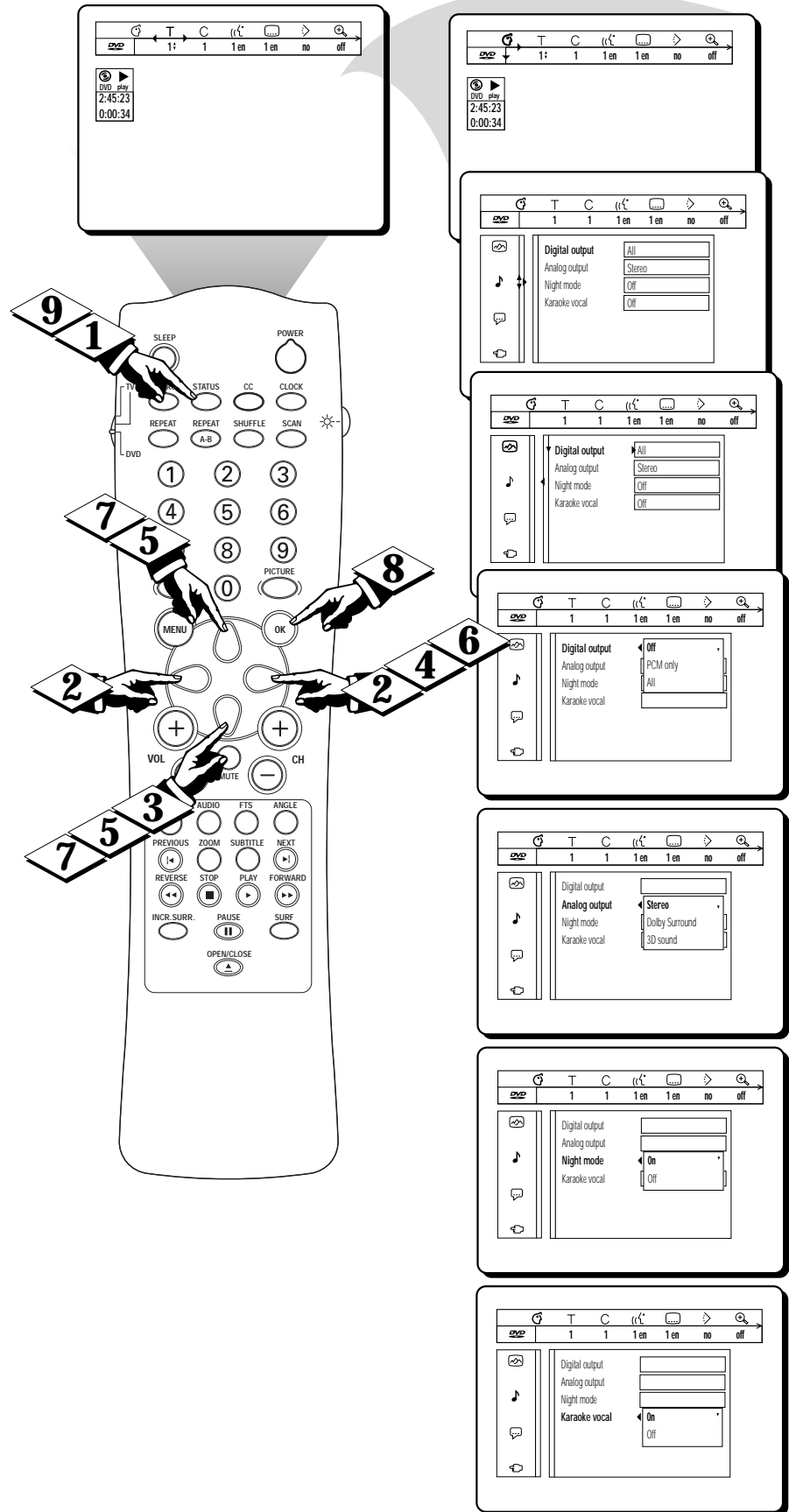
**Digital output:** Select **Off** (If using none of the digital outputs), **PCM only** (If your external equipment does not include a digital multi-channel decoder), or **All** (If using a digital multi-channel decoder, both coaxial and optical outputs are switched on.).

**Analog output:** Select **Stereo**, **Dolby surround**, or **3D sound**.

**Night mode:** Select **On** (Optimizes the dynamics of the sound with low volume playback), or **Off**.

**Karaoke vocal:** Select **On** (Set to on only when using a multi-channel karaoke DVD), or **Off**.
- 7 Press the **CURSOR UP** or **DOWN** buttons to scroll and highlight the options of the selected feature.
- 8 Press the **OK** button to select or activate the chosen option.
- 9 Press the **STATUS** button to clear the on-screen menu from the TV screen.

## LANGUAGE

Many DVDs are capable of multi-lingual settings. The Language feature within the Personal Preference area of the DVD on-screen menu will let the user set the Audio, Subtitle, and Menu language.

### BEGIN

- 1 Press the **STATUS** button on the remote control to display the on-screen menu.
  - 2 Press the **CURSOR LEFT** or **RIGHT** until the **Personal Preference Icon**  is highlighted.
  - 3 Press the **CURSOR DOWN** button to highlight the **Language** Icon .
  - 4 Press the **CURSOR RIGHT** button to highlight the first Language feature option "Audio Language."
  - 5 Press the **CURSOR UP** or **DOWN** button to select and highlight the feature you wish to change. Choose **Audio Language**, **Subtitle**, or **Menu**.
  - 6 Press the **CURSOR RIGHT** button to display the options for the selected Picture feature.
- Audio Language:** Choose from a list including; English, Español, Français, Português, Italiano, Russian, Deutsch, Greek, Japanese, Korean, Chinese, Quechua, Guarani, Aymará, or Inupiaq.
- Subtitle:** Select from the same list of languages listed under Audio Language. Will change the subtitle text only.
- Menu:** Select from the same list of languages listed under Audio Language. Will change the DVD on-screen menu only.
- NOTE:** Audio Language and Subtitle options are available only if the DVD being used has these capabilities.
- 7 Press the **CURSOR UP** or **DOWN** buttons to scroll and highlight the options of the selected feature.
  - 8 Press the **OK** button to select or activate the chosen option.
  - 9 Press the **STATUS** button to clear the on-screen menu from the TV screen.





## FEATURES

The Features section of the Personal Preference options contains an area where an Access Code and Parental censoring can be set. There also are features that can be turned On or Off (Status Window, Low Power Standby, and PBC - Playback Control).

### BEGIN

- 1 Press the **STATUS** button on the remote control to display the on-screen menu.
- 2 Press the **CURSOR LEFT** or **RIGHT** button until the Personal Preference Icon is highlighted.
- 3 Press the **CURSOR DOWN** button to highlight the Features option .
- 4 Press the **CURSOR RIGHT** button to highlight the first Features option "Access code."
- 5 Press the **CURSOR UP** or **DOWN** button to select and highlight the feature you wish to change. Choose **Access control**, **Status window** or **Low power standby**.
- 6 Press the **CURSOR RIGHT** button to display the options for the selected Picture feature.
 

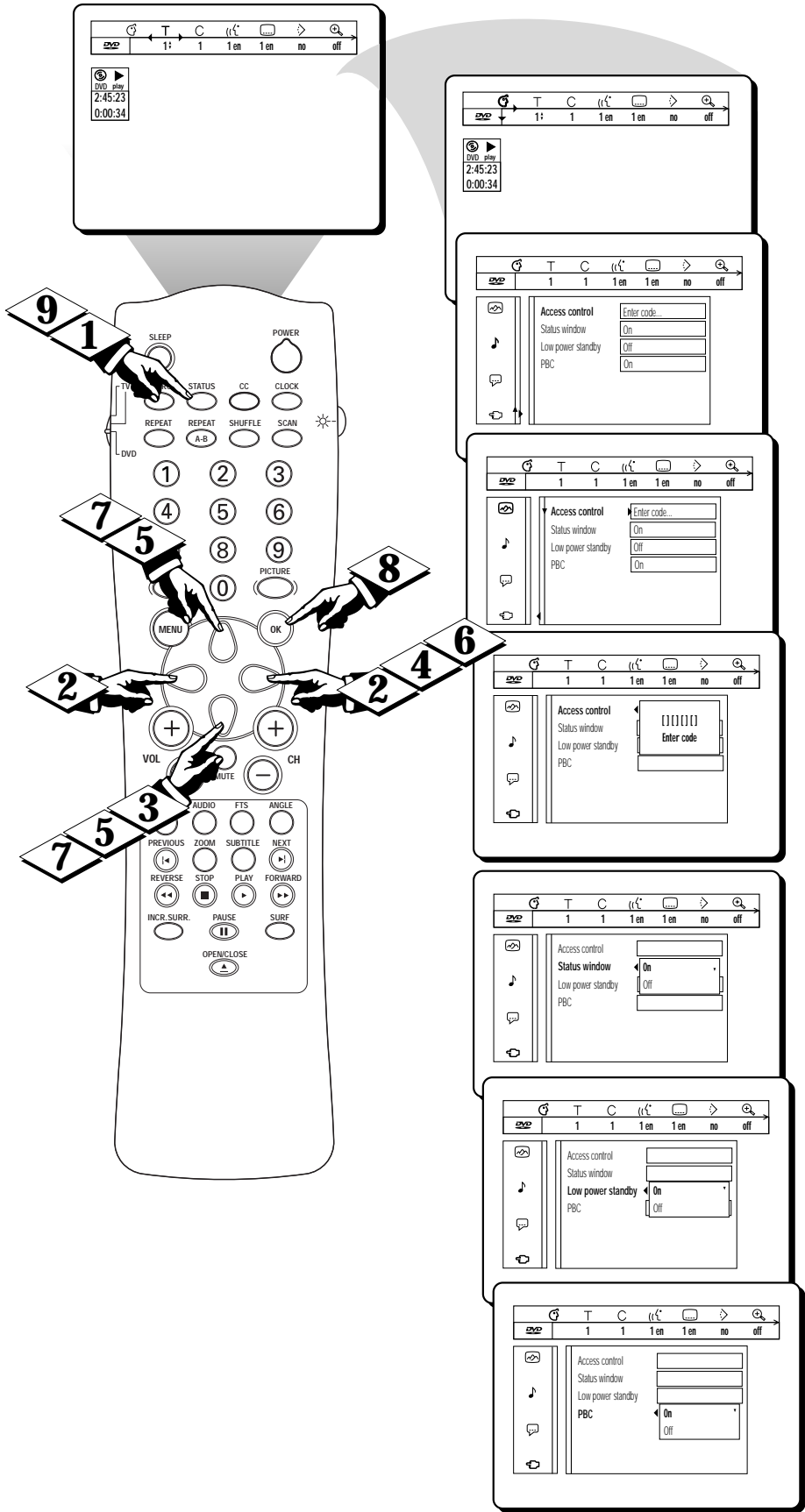
**Access Control:** Will require a four digit code to be entered (refer to next page for more details). Select **Child Lock** (locked or unlocked), **Parental level** (Rating 1 to 8 for scenes not suitable for children), **Change Country**, or **Change Code**.

**Status Window:** Select **On** or **Off**.

**Low Power Standby:** Select **On** (will put the set into the lower power standby mode), or **Off**.

**PBC (Playback Control):** Select **On** to allow viewing of main screen when playing a PBC featured Video CD, or **Off** for playback without use of the main screen.
- 7 Press the **CURSOR UP** or **DOWN** buttons to scroll and highlight the options of the selected feature.
- 8 Press the **OK** button to select or activate the chosen option.
- 9 Press the **STATUS** button to clear the on-screen menu from the TV screen.

## ACCESS CODE

When using and making changes within the Access Control option of the Features sub-menu, an ACCESS CODE will have to be entered before any new settings can be made. This page discusses how to set the Access Code to allow changes to this section of the on-screen menu.

### BEGIN

- 1 Press the **STATUS** button on the remote control to display the on-screen menu.
- 2 Press the **CURSOR LEFT** or **RIGHT** button until the Personal Preference Icon is highlighted.
- 3 Press the **CURSOR DOWN** button to highlight the Features Icon .
- 4 Press the **CURSOR RIGHT** button to highlight the first Features option "Access code."
- 5 Press the **CURSOR RIGHT** button, the screen will read, "[ ] [ ] [ ] [ ] Enter code."
- 6 Choose a four digit code and enter it by **pressing the NUMBERED buttons** on the remote control. The on-screen menu will ask to "Confirm code." Re-enter your chosen four digit access code. The on-screen menu will display the **Child lock, Parental level, change country, and Change code** options.
- 7 Press the **CURSOR UP** or **DOWN** button to select and highlight the option you wish to change.
- 8 Press the **CURSOR RIGHT** button to enter the highlighted option choices.
- 9 Press the **CURSOR UP** or **DOWN** button to choose one of the choices.
- 10 Press the **OK** button to select or activate the chosen option.
- 11 Press the **STATUS** button to clear the on-screen menu from the TV screen.

**Parental Level: (Ratings 1 to 8)**

When the Child Lock or Parental Level controls are on and a disc containing material that will be blocked is inserted, the disc must first be authorized before playback can occur.

### BEGIN

- 1 With the TV/DVD Player turned on, **press the OPEN /CLOSE button** on the remote control.
- 2 Place the disc in the disc tray and **press the OPEN/CLOSE button** on the remote control.

- 4 **Press the NUMBERED buttons** on the remote to enter your four digit Access Code. The Disc will begin to play or bring you to a "disc menu" where you might have to select play.

### DEAUTHORIZING A DISC:

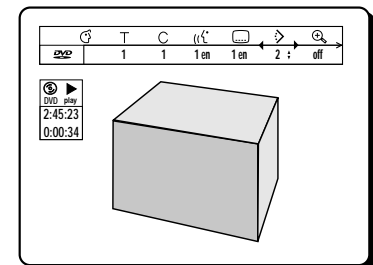
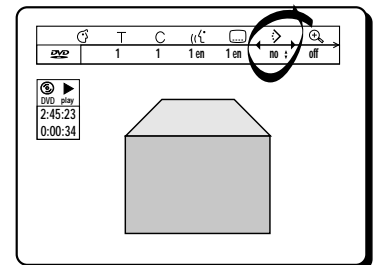
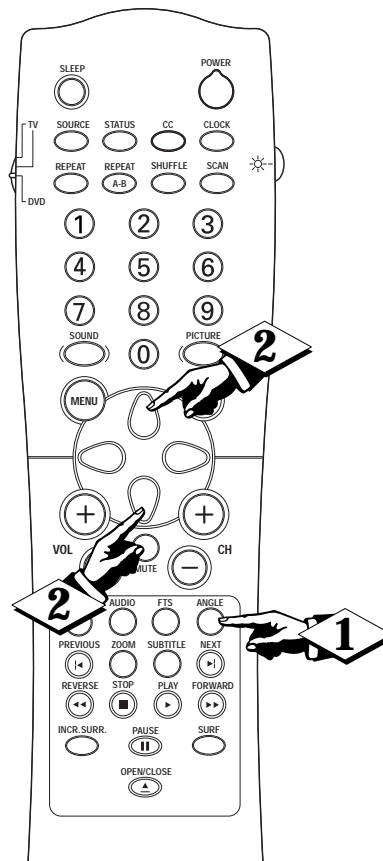
## CAMERA ANGLE

If the disc contains sequences recorded from different camera angles, the angle icon appears, showing the number of available angles and the angle being shown currently. You can then change the camera angle. (Not all disc contain this type of information, so this feature may not be available on the disc your using.)

- 1 Press the **ANGLE** button on the remote control to display the on-screen menu bar Angle Icon. If the X appears in the upper left corner of the screen, NO camera angles are available.

- 2 Press the **CURSOR UP** or **DOWN** button to select the desired camera angle. After a small delay the playback will switch to the new camera angle.

- 2 Go through the menu with the buttons indicated on the TV screen until your chosen passage starts to play. If a PBC menu consists of a list of title, you can select a title directly.

- 5 PBC can be set to OFF within the Personal Preference menu.

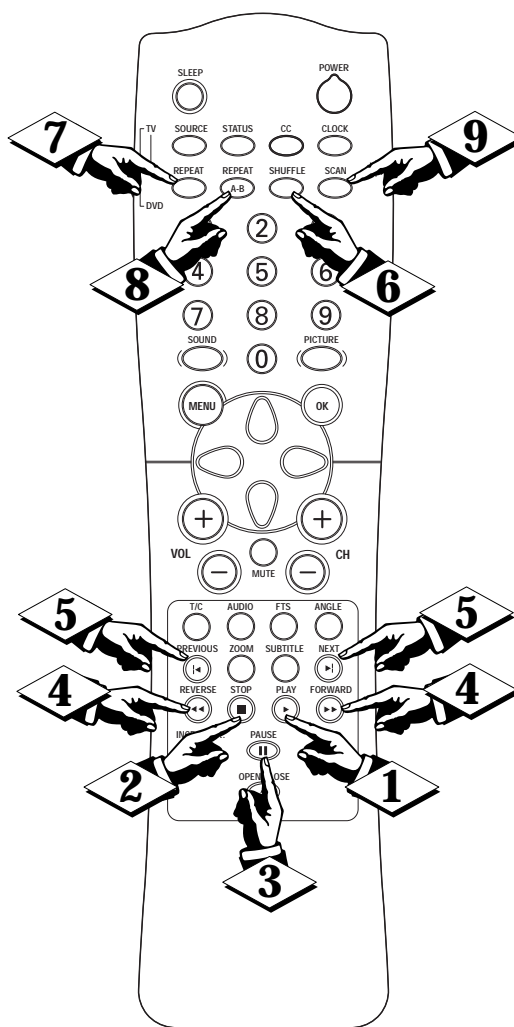

When an Audio CD is inserted into the DVD Player, playback will start automatically. The AUDIO CD dialogue box will appear on the screen giving information such as current track, time, total tracks, etc.

### BEGIN

- 1 Press the PLAY button to begin playback of an audio disc that has been paused or stopped.
- 2 Press the STOP button at any time to suspend playback.
- 3 Press the PAUSE button to temporarily suspend playback. Press again to resume playback.
- 4 Press the FORWARD or REVERSE buttons to search the disc content in either direction.
- 5 Press the NEXT or PREVIOUS buttons to go to the next track or the previous track.
- 6 Press the SHUFFLE button to randomly change the play order of the tracks.
- 7 Press the REPEAT button to repeat the playback of a track or the entire disk.
- 8 Press the REPEAT A-B button at any point on the disc. Press again at any ending point on the disc. The chosen sequence will be repeated. Press a third time to exit the repeating sequence.
- 9 Press the SCAN button to hear 10 seconds of playback for each track on the disc.

## FAVORITE TRACK SELECTION - AUDIO CD

**F**TS allows you to store your favorite tracks for a particular disc in the TV/DVD Player memory. Each FTS program can contain up to 20 tracks.

### **BEGIN**

#### Storing an FTS Program:

- 1 Load an audio CD and press the **STOP** button.
- 2 Press the **CURSOR DOWN** button to highlight the list of available tracks.
- 3 Press the **CURSOR RIGHT** or **LEFT** button to highlight a specific track.
- 4 Or, press the **NUMBERED** buttons (0-9) to go directly to any track.
- 5 With the track number highlighted, press the **OK** button to store the track. Repeat for other tracks.

#### Switching FTS ON or OFF:

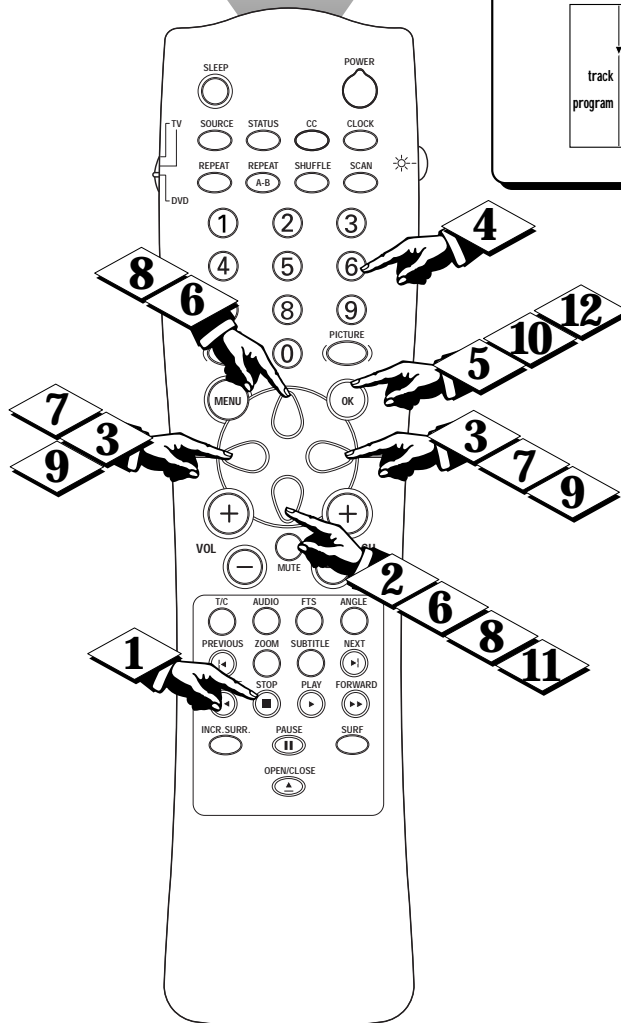
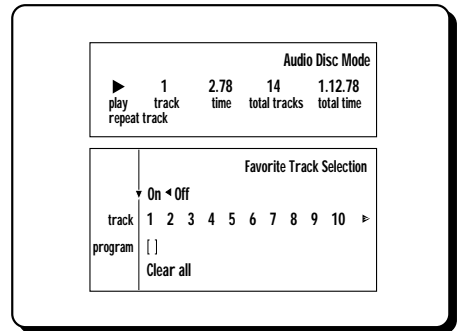
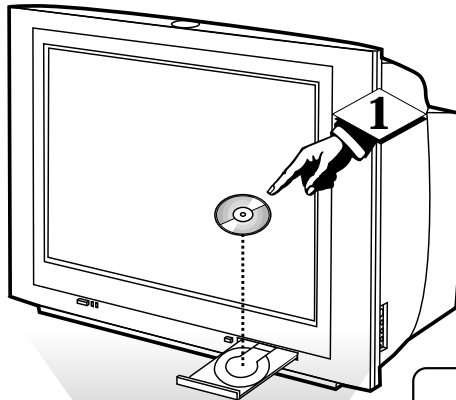
- 6 Within the Audio CD dialogue box, press the **CURSOR UP** or **DOWN** button to highlight the ON/OFF area.
- 7 Press the **CURSOR RIGHT** or **LEFT** button to select ON or OFF.

#### Erasing a Track from an FTS Program:

- 8 Within the Audio CD dialogue box, press the **CURSOR UP** or **DOWN** button to highlight "program."
- 9 Press the **CURSOR RIGHT** or **LEFT** button to select a specific track listed in the FTS Program.
- 10 Press the **OK** button to remove it.

#### Erasing a Complete FTS Program:

- 11 Within the Audio CD dialogue box, press the **CURSOR DOWN** button until "Clear All" is highlighted.
- 12 Press the **OK** button to erase the entire FTS Program.





*Please make these simple checks before calling for service. Because charges for TV installation and adjustment of customer controls are not covered under your warranty, these tips can save you time and money.*

**CAUTION:** A video source (such as a video game, compact disc interactive [CDI], or TV information channel) that shows a constant non-moving pattern on the TV screen can cause picture tube damage. When your TV is continuously used with such a source, the pattern of the nonmoving portion of the game (or other source) can leave a permanent image on the picture tube. When you're not using the video source, turn it OFF. Also, regularly alternate the use of such video sources with normal TV viewing.

## No Power

- Check the TV power cord. Unplug the TV, wait 10 seconds, then reinsert the plug into the outlet and push the POWER button again.
- Check that the outlet is not on a wall switch.
- Be sure the fuse is not blown on the AC power strip, if one is being used.

## No Picture

- Check antenna connections. Are they properly secured to the TV's ANT 75Ω plug?
- Check the TUNER MODE control for the correct tuner setting.
- Try running the Auto Program feature to find all available channels.
- Press the AV button on the remote to make sure the correct signal source is selected (AV 1, AV 2, AV 3, or S-VIDEO).

## No Sound

- Check the VOLUME buttons.
- Check the MUTE button on the remote control.
- Check the SPEAKER on-screen control. If it is in the OFF position, sound at the set will be eliminated.
- If you're attempting to hook up auxiliary equipment, check the audio jack connections.
- (If applicable) Check the audio receiver for the correct operating mode.

## Remote Does Not Work

- Check the batteries. If necessary, replace them with AA Heavy Duty (Zinc Chloride) or Alkaline batteries.
- Clean the remote control and the remote control sensor window on the TV.
- Check the TV power cord. Unplug the TV, wait 10 seconds, then reinsert the plug into the outlet and push the POWER button again.
- Be sure the fuse is not blown on the AC power strip, if one is being used.
- Check to be sure the TV outlet is not on a wall switch.

## TV Displays Wrong Channel or No Channels Above 13

- Repeat channel selection.
- Add the desired channel numbers (using the CHANNEL EDIT control) into the TV's memory.
- Check to be sure the TUNER MODES are set to the CABLE option and run the Auto Program feature to find all available channels.

## Cleaning and Care

- To avoid possible shock hazard, be sure the TV is unplugged from the electrical outlet before cleaning.
- When you are cleaning the TV, take care not to scratch or damage the screen surface (avoid wearing jewelry or using anything abrasive). Wipe the front screen with a clean cloth dampened with water. Use even, easy, vertical strokes when cleaning.
- Gently wipe the cabinet surfaces with a clean cloth or sponge dampened in a solution of cool, clear water. Use a clean, dry cloth to dry the wiped surfaces.
- Never use thinners, insecticide sprays, or other chemicals on or near the cabinet, as they might cause permanent marring of the cabinet finish.



## GLOSSARY OF TELEVISION TERMS

**Alternate Channel** • The feature that allows you to toggle between the last two channels viewed by pressing the A/CH button on the remote control.

**Auto Programming** • The feature that, when activated, scans for all available channels from regular antenna or cable signals and stores only active broadcast stations in the TV's memory.

**Channel Edit** • The feature that allows you to add or delete channels from the list of channels stored in the TV's memory. Channel Edit makes it easy to limit or expand the number of channels that are available to you when you press the Channel (+) or (-) buttons on your remote control.

**Closed Captioning** • The broadcast standard feature that allows you to read the voice content of television programs on the TV screen. Designed to help the hearing impaired, Closed Captioning uses on-screen "text boxes" to show dialogue and conversations while a TV program is in progress.

**Coaxial Cable** • A single, solid antenna wire normally matched with a metal plug (F type) end connector that screws (or pushes) directly onto a 75-ohm input found on the television or VCR.

**Direct Audio/Video Inputs** • Connectors, located on the rear of the TV, used for the input of audio and video signals. These inputs are designed for use with VCRs (or other accessories) in order to receive higher picture resolution and offer sound-connection options.

**Identify** • The method by which a TV remote control searches and finds an operating code for another product (such as a VCR or a cable converter). After the code has been "identified," the TV remote control can operate and send commands to the other product.

**Incredible Stereo (or Surround)** • False acoustic management of the audio signal that produces a dramatic expansion of the wall of sound that surrounds the listener and heightens overall viewing pleasure.

**Menu** • An on-screen listing of feature controls that are available for you to adjust.

**Multichannel Television Sound (MTS)** • The broadcast standard that allows for stereo sound to be transmitted with the TV picture.

**On-screen Displays (OSD)** • The wording or messages generated by the television (or VCR) to help you with specific feature controls (color adjustment or programming, for example).

**Programming** • The process of adding or deleting channel numbers into the television's memory circuits. Through programming, the TV "remembers" only the locally available or desired channel numbers and skips over any unwanted channel numbers.

**Remote Control Sensor Window** • The window or opening found on the television control panel and through which infrared remote control command signals are received.

**Second Audio Program (SAP)** • An additional audio channel provided for within the Multichannel Television Sound (MTS) broadcast standard. The most frequently proposed use for SAP is the simultaneous bilingual broadcast of TV material.

**STATUS Button** • The remote control function that allows you to quickly confirm what channel number is being viewed. **STATUS** also can be used to clear the television of on-screen displays or information (rather than waiting for the displays to "time out," or automatically disappear from the screen). In the **DVD mode**, pressing the STATUS button will display the DVD Player on-screen menu.

**Twin-Lead Wire** • The more commonly used name for the two-strand, 300-ohm antenna wire used with many indoor and outdoor antenna systems. In many cases, this type of antenna wire requires an additional adapter (or balun) in order to connect to the 75-ohm input terminals designed into the more recent TVs and VCRs.

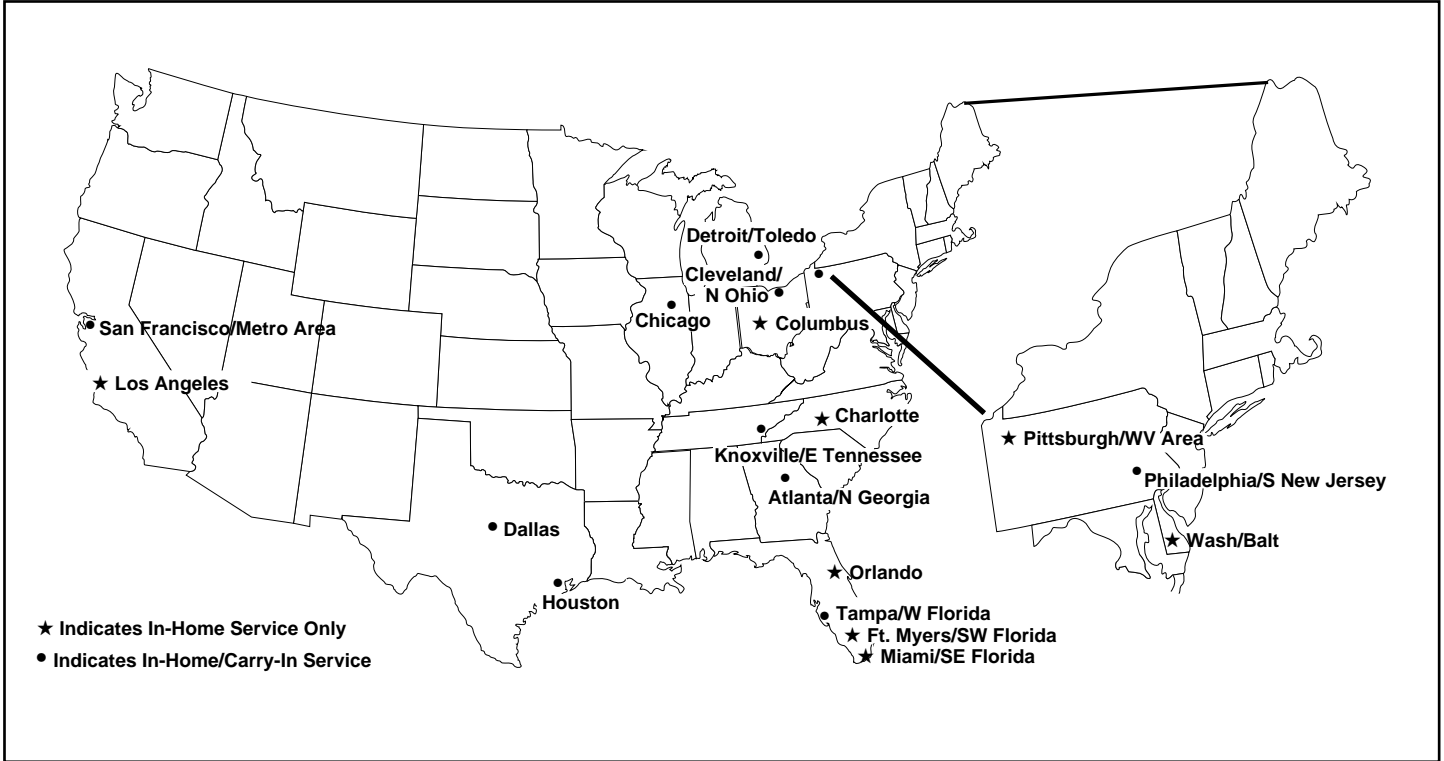

# LIMITED WARRANTY

90 Days Free Labor

One Year Free Replacement of Parts (Two Years Free Replacement on Color Picture Tube)

This product can be repaired in-home.

### WHO IS COVERED?

You must have proof of purchase to receive warranty service. A sales receipt or other document showing that you purchased the product is considered proof of purchase.

### WHAT IS COVERED?

Warranty coverage begins the day you buy your product. For 90 days thereafter, all parts will be repaired or replaced free, and labor is free. From 90 days to one year from the day of purchase, all parts will be repaired or replaced free, but you pay for all labor charges. From one to two years from the day of purchase, you pay for the replacement or repair of all parts except the picture tube, and for all labor charges. After two years from the day of purchase, you pay for the replacement or repair of all parts, and for all labor charges.

All parts, including repaired and replaced parts, are covered only for the original warranty period. When the warranty on the product expires, the warranty on all replaced and repaired parts also expires.

### WHAT IS EXCLUDED?

Your warranty does not cover:

- labor charges for installation or setup of the product, adjustment of customer controls on the product, and installation or repair of antenna systems outside of the product.
