
Batteries

Whenever convenient, use AC mains supply if you want to conserve battery life.

· Open the battery compartment.



 Insert as indicated six (preferably Alkaline) batteries, type R20, UM1 or D-cells.



CONTROLS/INSTALLATION

- The battery supply is switched off when the set is connected to the mains. When changing over to battery supply, remove the plug from the MAINS socket.
- Remove the batteries if exhausted or if they will not be used again for a long period.

AC mains supply

 Check if the mains voltage as shown on the type plate (on the base of the set) corresponds to your local mains supply. If it does not, consult your dealer or service organisation.



- For AM, the set is provided with a built-in aerial, so the telescopic aerial is not needed. Direct the aerial by turning the whole set.

Remarks

- If the battery voltage is not sufficient any more for playing a CD, the CD-player will not start.

- you inserted the CD the wrong way: the label should be facing up or there is no disc;
- the CD is badly scratched or dirty, see 'Maintenance';
- the lens (x) is steamed up because of a sudden transition from a cold into a warm environment. Do not clean the lens, but let the set acclimatize for a while.



Copyright: Recording is permissible insofar as copyright or other rights of third parties are not infringed.

 The tape in the cassette is secured at both ends with leader tape. At the beginning and end of the cassette, nothing will be recorded for six to seven seconds.


Erasure prevention tabs



 For recording, use only ferro, IEC I/Type I Normal Position Cassette on which the tabs have not been broken.




- The recording level is set automatically, regardless of the position of VOLUME [®]
- Accidental erasure can be prevented by breaking the small tab in the top left-hand comer of the back of the cassette. This protection can be reversed with a piece of adhesive tape placed over the same comer.



 Store the cassettes at room temperature and do not put them too close to magnets and transformers, for example, TVs and loudspeaker boxes. Preparation

MAINTENANCE

CD-player and CDs



- The lens may steam up when the set is taken from a cold into a warm environment. Playing a CD is not possible then. Do not clean the lens, but let the set acclimatize for a while.
- Always pick up the CD by the edge and put it back in its box immediately after use.




 To clean, breathe on the CD and wipe it off in a straight line from centre to edge using a soft, lint-free cloth.
 Cleaning agents may harm the CD.



Cassette deck

To ensure good recording and playback quality, clean the parts (a) (a) indicated after every 50 hours of operation or, on average, once a month.



- Open the CD/cassette door by pressing OPEN•CLOSE
 ②
- Use a cotton bud slightly moistened with alcohol or a special head cleaning fluid.

Press PAUSE II and clean the magnetic heads (A) (B) and the capstan (C).

DIRECTION RECORD PLAY REVVIND EFWD STOP PAUSE

After cleaning, press STOP

Cleaning of the magnetic heads

® can also be done by playing a cleaning cassette through once as an ordinary cassette.

Remarks

- The CD-player and the cassette decks are fitted with self-lubricating bearings which must not be oiled or greased.
- Fingerprints, dust and dirt on the apparatus can be removed using a soft, clean and slightly damp leather cloth. Do not use any cleaning agents, since they may damage the cabinet.



 Keep the set, batteries, CDs and cassettes away from rain, moisture, sand and excessive heat, e.g. near heating equipment or in cars parked in the sun.



Caution: Invisible laser radiation when open and interlocks defeated. Avoid exposure to beam.

TROUBLESHOOTING GUIDE

The following checks will assist in the correction of most problems which you may encounter with your portable set. Before going through the check list below, first check the following points.

The power cord must be connected firmly.

Should any problem persist after you have made these checks, consult your nearest friendly dealer.

Symptom	Possible Causes (and Remedies)
Interference noise during FM stereo reception	Adjust the antenna. The signal strength is too weak.
Cassette Deck Operation	
Recording is not possible	No cassette in the cassette holder. The small tab has been broken (This can be reversed with a piece of adhesive tape) The tape is completely wound.
Not possible to remove the cassette from the deck/ Not possible to insert a cassette.	Check that all the cassette deck buttons are released. If not, press STOP ■.
Recording or playback cannot be made or there is a decrease in sound level	Dirty tape head Magnetic build-up in the record/ playback head - See section on Maintenance on cleaning of tape heads.
Excessive wow or flutter, or sound drop-out.	Contamination of the capstans or pinch rollers.
CD Player Operation	
The PLAY ► does not function when pressed	The disc is not inserted correctly. The player is in PAUSE mode. Moisture condensation on the lens.
Track in the CD skips " E" is displayed	Dirty disc or scratched disc The disc is inserted upside down. The CD is dirty, badly scratched or warped. Try another disc Press PLAY-PAUSE again.
General	
Set not working	Hang up problem due to ESD and/or software Switch POWER ON/OFF or in the worst case, pull the mains plug out of the wall socket
Unit not working	Check that the power cord is connected firmly. Batteries not inserted correctly. Batteries exhausted, change the batteries. Remove the mains cord from the socket of the set if using batteries.
No sound output	Turn VOLUME clockwise. The headphones are connected, disconnect them. Change the batteries.
Lack of treble sound or apparently imprecise physical location of musical instruments	Check the TONE button.
Severe hum or noise	The TV or VTR is too close to the stereo system. Separate the portable set from the TV or VTR.

Who is Protected? ... Where?

This warranty is extended to the original retail purchaser for products purchased and used in the U.S.A., Puerto Rico, the Virgin Islands and Canada.

What the Purchaser Must Do

Before you call for service, check your operating instruction booklet. A slight adjustment of the customer controls discussed in your instruction booklet may save you a service call

This warranty does not cover commercial use, rental agreements, shipping damage, misuse or failure due to lack of normal care
