

Control panel overview



1 Fax and telephone keys:

■ Duplex Copy

Press this key to copy on both sides of the paper.

■ Hook

Press before dialing if you want to make sure a fax machine will answer, and then press **Mono Start** or **Colour Start**.

Also, press this key after picking up the handset of an external telephone during the F/T pseudo/double-ring.

■ Redial/Pause

Redials one of the last 30 numbers called. It also inserts a pause when dialling.

2 Dial Pad

Use these keys to dial telephone and fax numbers and as a keyboard for entering information into the machine.

This function transfers to the touchscreen during some operations.

The # key lets you temporarily switch the dialling mode during a telephone call from Pulse to Tone. (Not Available in New Zealand)

3 Mode keys:

- Fax
 Lets you access Fax mode.
- Scan

 Lets you access Scan mode.
- Copy


 Lets you access Copy mode.
- Photo Capture Lets you access PhotoCapture Center™ mode.

4 Start keys:

■ **Colour Start**

Lets you start sending faxes or making copies in full colour. Also lets you start a scanning operation (in colour or mono, depending on the scanning setting in the ControlCenter software).

Lets you start sending faxes or making copies in monochrome. Also lets you start a scanning operation (in colour or mono depending on the scanning setting in the ControlCenter software).



5 Power Save

Lets you put the machine into Power Save mode.

6 Stop/Exit

Stops an operation or exits from a menu.

7 LCD (liquid crystal display)

This is a Touchscreen LCD. You can access the menus and options by pressing buttons displayed on the screen.

Also, you can adjust the angle of the display by lifting it.

8 One Touch keys


These 3 keys give you instant access to 6 previously stored numbers.

Shift

To access One Touch numbers 4 to 6, hold down **Shift** as you press the One Touch key. Also, if no number is assigned to the key, you can directly store a number by pressing the empty key.

LCD screen indications

The LCD shows the current machine status when the machine is idle.



1 Wireless Status

A four level indicator shows the current wireless signal strength if you are using a wireless connection.



2 Memory Status

Lets you see the available memory in the machine.

3 Current Receive Mode

Lets you see the current receive mode.

- Fax (Fax only)
- F/T (Fax/Tel)
- TAD (External TAD)
- Mnl (Manual)

4 Ink indicator

Lets you see the available ink volume. Also, lets you access the Ink menu.

5 Phone Book

Lets you set up your phone book of One Touch Dial, Speed Dial and Group numbers.

Also, you can search the phone book for the number you want to dial.

6 MENU

Lets you access the main menu.

7 Faxes in memory

Shows how many received faxes are in the memory.

8 Fax Preview

Lets you preview received fax.

9 New Fax(es)

When Fax Preview is set to On, you can see how many new faxes you have received.

10 History

Lets you view a list of outgoing calls and the caller ID history.

Also, lets you fax or call the number you have chosen from the lists.

11 Warning icon

Appears when there is an error or maintenance message; press the Warning icon to view it, and then press to return to the Ready screen.




If you receive a fax containing multiple paper sizes (for example, a page of A4 data and a page of A3 data), the machine may create and store a file for each paper size. The LCD may show that more than one fax job has been received.

Basic Operations


To operate the Touchscreen use your finger to press the MENU or option button directly on the LCD screen. To access more menus or options in a setting, press ◀▶ or ▲ ▼ to scroll through them.

The following steps show how to change a setting in the machine. In this example the Sleep mode setting is changed from 10 Mins to 5 Mins.


- 1 Press MENU.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to display General Setup.



- 3 Press General Setup.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to display Sleep Mode.



- 5 Press Sleep Mode.
- 6 Press 5 Mins.



7 Press Stop/Exit.



- For Tray #2, see Loading paper in paper tray #2 on page 13.
- If the tray used for Fax mode is set to Auto Select you should open and close the scanner cover to reset the machine after refilling paper tray #1.
- When you load a different size of paper in Tray #1 or Tray #2, you will need to change the paper size setting in the machine at the same time. (See Paper Size and Type on page 29.)


Loading paper in paper tray #1

1 If the paper support flap is open, close it, and then close the paper support. Pull the paper tray completely out of the machine.






 When you are using A3, Legal or Ledger size paper, press and hold the universal guide release button (1) as you slide out the front of the paper tray.



 If you are using A5 or smaller size paper, make sure that the paper tray is not extended.




Open the paper tray cover (1).




With both hands, gently press and slide the paper side guides (1) and then the paper length guide (2) to fit the paper size.

Make sure that the triangular marks (3) on the paper side guides (1) and paper length guide (2) line up with the mark for the paper size you are using.




4 Fan the stack of paper well to avoid paper jams and misfeeds.



! IMPORTANT

Always make sure that the paper is not curled.

Gently put the paper into the paper tray print side down and top edge in first.
Check that the paper is flat in the tray.





6 Gently adjust the paper side guides to the paper with both hands.


Make sure the paper side guides touch the sides of the paper.



Close the paper tray cover. Check that the paper is flat in the tray and below the maximum paper mark (1).




Slowly push the paper tray completely into the machine.



A CAUTION


DO NOT push Tray #1 into the machine too quickly. Doing this may cause injury to your hand by trapping it between Tray #1 and Tray #2. Please push Tray #1 slowly.

While holding the paper tray in place, pull out the paper support (1) until it clicks, and then unfold the paper support flap (2).





If you are finished using A3, Ledger or Legal size paper and want to use a smaller paper size, take the paper out of the tray. Then shorten the tray by pressing the universal guide release button (1). Adjust the paper length guide (2) to fit the paper size you are going to use. Then put the paper into the tray.




Loading paper in paper tray #2


Note

You can only use plain paper sizes A3, A4, Ledger, Letter, Legal or Executive in Tray #2.

1 Pull the paper tray completely out of the machine.




2 Take off the paper tray cover (1).




With both hands, gently press and slide the paper side guides (1) and then the paper length guide (2) to fit the paper size.

Make sure that the triangular marks (3) on the paper side guides (1) and paper length guide (2) line up with the mark for the paper size you are using.





If you are using A3, Ledger or Legal size paper, press and hold the universal guide release button (1) as you slide out the front of the paper tray.




Fan the stack of paper well to avoid paper jams and misfeeds.


! IMPORTANT




Gently adjust the paper side guides with both hands to fit the paper stack. Make sure the paper side guides touch the sides of the paper.




- 9 Do one of the following:

Press and hold the universal guide release button (1) as you slide out the front of the paper tray.






Open the paper tray cover and adjust the paper length guide (1) for the paper.




Close the paper tray cover and slowly push the paper tray into the machine. Pull out the paper support (1) until it clicks and unfold the paper support flap (2).





If you are finished using A3, Ledger or Legal size paper and want to use a smaller paper size, take the paper out of the tray. Then shorten the tray by pressing the universal guide release button (1). Adjust the paper length guide (2) to fit the paper size you are going to use. Then put the smaller paper into the tray.



Loading envelopes and postcards

About envelopes

- Use envelopes that weigh between 80 to 95 gsm.
- Some envelopes need margin settings to be set in the application. Make sure you do a test print first before printing many envelopes.

IMPORTANT

DO NOT use any of the following types of envelopes, as they will cause paper feed problems:

- That are of a baggy construction.
- That are embossed (have raised writing on them).
- That have clasps or staples.
- That are pre-printed on the inside.


Occasionally you may experience paper feed problems caused by the thickness, size and flap shape of the envelopes you are using.

Loading envelopes and postcards in tray #1


1 Before loading, press the corners and sides of envelopes or postcards to make them as flat as possible.

! IMPORTANT

If envelopes or postcards are 'double-feeding', put one envelope or postcard in the paper tray at a time.




Put envelopes or postcards in the paper tray with the address side down and the leading edge (top of the envelopes) in first. We recommend you load one extra envelope or postcard. With both hands, gently press and slide the paper side guides (1) and paper length guide (2) to fit the size of the envelopes or postcards.



If you have problems printing on envelopes with the flap on the short edge, try the following:


- Open the envelope flap.
- 2 Make sure the flap is to the back edge of the envelope when printing.

Removing small printouts from the machine


When the machine ejects small paper onto the output paper tray you may not be able to reach it. Make sure printing has finished, and then pull the tray completely out of the machine.




Printable area

The printable area depends on the settings in the application you are using. The figures below show the unprintable areas on cut sheet paper and envelopes. The machine can print in the shaded areas of cut sheet paper when the Borderless print feature is available and turned on. Acceptable paper and other print media

The print quality can be affected by the type of paper you use in the machine.

To get the best print quality for the settings you have chosen, always set the Paper Type to match the type of paper you load.

You can use plain paper, inkjet paper (coated paper), glossy paper, transparencies and envelopes.

We recommend testing various paper types before buying large quantities.

For best results, use Brother paper.

- When you print on inkjet paper (coated paper), transparencies and photo paper, be sure to choose the correct print media in the 'Basic' tab of the printer driver or in the Paper Type setting of the menu. (See Paper Size and Type on page 29.)
- When you print on Brother Photo paper, load one extra sheet of the same photo paper in the paper tray. An extra sheet has been included in the paper package for this purpose.
- When you use transparencies or photo paper, remove each sheet at once to prevent smudging or paper jams.
- Avoid touching the printed surface of the paper immediately after printing; the surface may not be completely dry and may stain your fingers.

Recommended print media

To get the best print quality, we suggest using Brother paper. (See table below.)

If Brother paper is not available in your country, we recommend testing various papers before purchasing large quantities.

We recommend using '3M Transparency Film' when you print on transparencies.


Handling and using print media

- Store paper in its original packaging, and keep it sealed. Keep the paper flat and away from moisture, direct sunlight and heat.
- Avoid touching the shiny (coated) side of photo paper. Load photo paper with the shiny side facing down.
- Avoid touching either side of transparencies because they absorb water and perspiration easily, and this may cause decreased output quality. Transparencies designed for laser printers/copiers may stain your next document. Use only transparencies recommended for inkjet printing.
- You can only print on both sides of the paper with PC printing. (See *Printing* for Windows[®] in the Software User's Guide on the CD-ROM.)

IMPORTANT

DO NOT use the following kinds of paper:

 Damaged, curled, wrinkled, or irregularly shaped paper

- Extremely shiny or highly textured paper
- Paper that cannot be arranged uniformly when stacked

General setup

Power Save mode

To maintain print quality, prolong print head life, and provide the best ink cartridge economy, you should keep your machine connected to the power at all times.

You can put the machine into Power Save mode by pressing the Power Save key. You can still receive telephone calls in Power Save mode. For further information on receiving faxes in the Power Save condition, please see the table on page 28. The delayed faxes that have been set up will be sent. You can even retrieve faxes using Remote Retrieval if you are away from your machine. If you want to do other operations, you must take the machine out of Power Save mode.



If you have connected an external telephone or TAD, it is always available.

Putting your machine in Power Save mode

Press and hold down the Power Save key until the LCD shows

Shutting Down.

The LCD will stay on for a few seconds before going off.

Bringing your machine out of **Power Save mode**

Secure Function Lock

Changing user name, password or settings for restricted users

 General Setup.
- 3 Press General Setup.
- 4 Press ▲ or ▼ to display
 Function Lock.
- 5 Press Function Lock.
- 6 Press Setup User.
- 7 Enter the administrator password using the buttons on the LCD. Press OK.
- 8 Press ▲ or ▼ to display the existing restricted user you want to change.
- 9 Press the user name.
- 10 Press Change.
- 11 Do one of the following:
 - If you want to change the name press , and then enter the new name using the buttons on the LCD. (See *Entering Text* on page 205.) Press OK.
 - To leave the name unchanged Press OK.





When you want to send a fax, or change fax send or receive settings, press the

Press ◀ or ▶ to scroll through the Fax key options. Some functions are only available when sending monochrome faxes.

Press the option you want.

Faxing from the ADF

- Press 🗀 🖼) (Fax).
- Place the document face up in the ADF. (See *Using the ADF* on page 24.)
- Enter the fax number using the dial pad. You can also enter the fax number on the LCD by pressing Phone Book and Send a fax, or you can press a One Touch key on the machine's control panel. (For details, see How to Dial on page 75.)



- You can preview a fax message before sending it by setting Preview to On. (See How to preview an outgoing fax on page 42.)
- If your network supports the LDAP protocol you can search for fax numbers and E-mail addresses on your server. (See LDAP operation in the Network User's Guide on the CD-ROM.)
- Press Mono Start or Colour Start.



- To cancel, press Stop/Exit.
- If you send a mono fax when the memory is full it will be sent in real time.
- You can send a colour fax that is A4 size or a mono fax that is A3 size.

Faxing from the scanner glass

You can use the scanner glass to fax pages of a book one at a time. The documents can be up to A3 size.

You cannot send colour faxes with multiple pages.



- Since you can only scan one page at a time, it is easier to use the ADF if you are sending a multiple page document.
- You can send colour faxes up to A4 in size.
- 1 Press (Fax).
- 2 Load your document face down on the scanner glass. (See *Using the scanner glass* on page 25.)
- 3 Enter the fax number using the dial pad. You can also enter the fax number on the LCD by pressing Phone Book and Send a fax, or you can press a One Touch key on the machine's control panel.



You can preview a fax message before sending it by setting Preview. (See *How to preview an outgoing fax* on page 42.)

- Press Mono Start or Colour Start.
 - If you press **Mono Start**, the machine starts scanning the first page. Go to step **⑤**.
 - If you press Colour Start, the machine starts sending the document.

- When the LCD asks you Next Page?, do one of the following:
 - To send a single page, press No (or press Mono Start again).
 - The machine starts sending the document.
 - To send more than one page, press Yes and go to step **6**.
- 6 Place the next page on the scanner glass.

Press Mono Start or Colour Start.
The machine starts scanning the page.
(Repeat steps 6 and 6 for each additional page.)

Setting the scanner glass size for faxing

To fax a A3, Letter, Legal or Ledger size document from the scanner glass, you need to change the glass scan size setting.

- Press ◀ or ▶ to display
 Glass ScanSize.
- 3 Press Glass ScanSize.
- 4 Press A4, A3, Letter, Legal or Ledger.



You can save the setting you use most often by setting it as default. (See Setting your changes as a new default on page 47.)

Colour fax transmission

Your machine can send a colour fax to machines that support this feature.

Colour faxes cannot be stored in the memory. When you send a colour fax, the machine will send it in real time (even if Real Time TX is set to Off).

How to preview an outgoing fax

You can preview a fax message before you send it. You must set the Real Time Transmission and Polling RX to off before you use this feature.

- Press (Fax).
- Press ◀ or ▶ to display Preview.
- Press Preview.
- Press on.
- 5 Load the document.
- 6 Enter the fax number using the dial pad. You can also enter the fax number on the LCD by pressing Phone Book and Send a fax, or you can press a One Touch key on the machine's control panel. (For details, see How to Dial on page 75.)



Press Mono Start.

The machine starts scanning the document and the outgoing fax appears on the LCD.

When the fax is displayed, press MENU. The buttons will appear on the LCD and perform the operations shown below.

The fax message in the memory will be sent and then erased when you press Mono Start.

Cancelling a fax in progress

If you want to cancel a fax while the machine is scanning, dialling or sending, press Stop/Exit.

Broadcasting (Monochrome only)

Broadcasting is when the same fax message is automatically sent to more than one fax number. You can include Groups, One Touch, Speed Dial numbers and up to 50 manually dialled numbers in the same broadcast.

After the broadcast is finished, a Broadcast Report will be printed.

- 1 Press (Fax).
- 2 Load your document.
- 3 Press ◀ or ▶ to display Broadcasting.
- 4 Press Broadcasting.
- 5 You can add numbers to the broadcast in the following ways:
 - Press Add Number and enter a number using the buttons on the LCD.

■ Press Phone Book.

Press MA to search by

Alphabetical Order or

Numerical Order. Press the entries that you want to add to the broadcast.

Press OK.



One Touch Dial locations begin with *. Speed Dial locations begin with #.

6 After you have entered all the fax numbers by repeating step 6, press OK.



Press Mono Start.



- If you did not use up any of the numbers for Groups, you can 'broadcast' faxes to as many as 256 different numbers.
- The available memory will vary depending on the types of jobs in the memory and the number of locations used for broadcasting. If you broadcast to the maximum numbers available, you will not be able to use dual access and delayed fax.
- If the memory is full, press Stop/Exit to stop the job. If more than one page has been scanned, press Mono Start to send the portion that is in the memory.

Cancelling a Broadcast in progress

- 1 Press Stop/Exit.
- 2 Do one of the following:
 - To cancel the entire broadcast, press Entire Broadcast. Go to step ③.
 - To cancel the current job, press the button that displays the number being dialled. Go to step 4.
 - To exit without cancelling, press Stop/Exit.
- When the LCD asks if you want to cancel the entire broadcast, do one of the following:
 - Press Yes to confirm.
 - To exit without cancelling, press No or **Stop/Exit**.
- 4 Do one of the following:
 - To cancel the current job, press Yes.
 - To exit without cancelling, press No or Stop/Exit.

Additional sending operations

Sending faxes using multiple settings

When you send a fax you can choose any combination of these settings: resolution, contrast, glass scan size, overseas mode, delayed fax timer, polling transmission and real time transmission.

1 Press (Fax).
The LCD shows:



- Press ◀ or ▶ to display a setting you want to change and press the setting, then press the option you want.
- 3 Go back to 2 to change more settings.



- Most settings are temporary and the machine returns to its default settings after you send a fax.
- You can save some of the settings you use most often by setting them as default. These settings will stay until you change them again. (See Setting your changes as a new default on page 47.)

Contrast

If your document is very light or very dark, you may want to change the contrast. For most documents the factory setting Auto can be used. It automatically chooses the suitable contrast for your document.

Use Light when sending a light document. Use Dark when sending a dark document.

- 1 Press (Fax).
- Press ◀ or ▶ to display Contrast.
- 3 Press Contrast.
- 4 Press Auto, Light or Dark.



Even if you choose Light or Dark, the machine will send the fax using the Auto setting in any of the following conditions:

- · When you send a colour fax.
- When you choose Photo as the Fax Resolution.

Changing fax resolution

The quality of a fax can be improved by changing the fax resolution.

- 1 Press (Fax).
- Press ◀ or ▶ to display
 Fax Resolution.
- 3 Press Fax Resolution.
- 4 Press the resolution you want.



You can choose four different resolution settings for monochrome faxes and two for colour.

Monochrome	
Standard	Suitable for most typed documents.
Fine	Good for small print and transmits a little slower than Standard resolution.
S.Fine	Good for small print or artwork and transmits slower than Fine resolution.
Photo	Use when the document has varying shades of grey or is a photograph. This has the slowest transmission.

Colour	
Standard	Suitable for most typed documents.
Fine	Use when the document is a photograph. The transmission time is slower than Standard resolution.

If you choose S. Fine or Photo and then use the Colour Start key to send a fax, the machine will send the fax using the Fine setting.

Dual access (Monochrome only)

You can dial a number and start scanning the fax into memory—even when the machine is sending from memory, receiving faxes or printing PC data. The LCD shows the new job number and available memory.

The number of pages you can scan into the memory will vary depending on the data that is printed on them.



If the Out of Memory message appears while scanning documents, press **Stop/Exit** to cancel or **Mono Start** to send the scanned pages.

Real time transmission

When you are sending a fax, the machine will scan the documents into the memory before sending. Then, as soon as the telephone line is free, the machine will start dialling and sending.

If the memory is full and you are sending a black & white fax from the ADF, the machine will send the document in real time (even if Real Time TX is set to Off).

Sometimes, you may want to send an important document immediately, without waiting for memory transmission. You can turn on Real Time TX.

- 1 Press (Fax).
- 2 Load your document.
- 3 Press ◀ or ▶ to display Real Time TX.
- 4 Press Real Time TX.
- 5 Press On.



In real time transmission, the automatic redial feature does not work when using the scanner glass.

Overseas Mode

If you are having difficulty sending a fax overseas due to possible interference on the telephone line, we recommend that you turn on the Overseas mode. After you send a fax using this feature, the feature will turn itself off.

- 1 Press (Fax).
- 2 Load your document.
- 3 Press ◀ or ▶ to display
 Overseas Mode.
- 4 Press Overseas Mode.
- 5 Press on (or off).

Delayed Faxing (Monochrome only)

During the day you can store up to 50 faxes in the memory to be sent within 24-hours. These faxes will be sent at the time of day you enter in step **6**.

- 1 Press (Fax).
- 2 Load your document.
- 3 Press ◀ or ▶ to display Delayed Fax.
- 4 Press Delayed Fax.
- 5 Press on.
- 6 Enter the time you want the fax to be sent (in 24-hour format) using the buttons on the LCD.

 (For example, enter 19:45 for 7:45 PM.)

 Press OK.



The number of pages you can scan into the memory depends on the amount of data that is printed on each page.

Delayed Batch Transmission (Monochrome only)

Before sending the delayed faxes, your machine will help you economize by sorting all the faxes in the memory by destination and scheduled time. All delayed faxes that are scheduled to be sent at the same time to the same fax number will be sent as one fax to save transmission time.

- 1 Press 📠 (Fax).
- 3 Press Batch TX.
- 4 Press on.

Checking and cancelling waiting jobs

You can check which jobs are still waiting in the memory to be sent and cancel a job. (If there are no jobs, the LCD shows

No Jobs Waiting.)

- 1 Press MENU.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to display Fax.
- 3 Press Fax.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to display Remaining Jobs.
- 5 Press Remaining Jobs.
 Any waiting jobs appear on the LCD.
- 6 Press ▲ or ▼ to scroll through the jobs and press the job you want to cancel. Press OK.

- 7 Do one of the following:
 - To cancel, press Yes.
 If you want to cancel another job go to step 6.
 - To exit without cancelling, press No.
- 8 When you have finished, press Stop/Exit.

Setting your changes as a new default

You can save the fax settings for

Fax Resolution, Contrast, Preview, Glass ScanSize and Real Time TX you use most often by setting them as default. These settings will stay until you change them again.

- 1 Press (Fax).
- Press ◀ or ▶ to choose the setting you want to change, and then press the new option.
 Repeat this step for each setting you want to change.
- 4 Press Set New Default.
- 5 Press Yes.
- 6 Press Stop/Exit.

Restoring all fax settings to the factory settings

You can restore all the fax settings you have changed to the factory settings. These settings will stay until you change them again.

- 1 Press (Fax).
- Press ◀ or ▶ to display Factory Reset.
- 3 Press Factory Reset.
- 4 Press Yes.
- 5 Press Stop/Exit.

Sending a fax manually

Manual transmission lets you hear the dialling, ringing and fax-receiving tones while sending a fax.



To send a multiple page fax, use the ADF.

- 1 Press (Fax).
- 2 Load your document.
- 3 To listen for a dial tone pick up the handset of an external telephone.
- 4 Dial the fax number using the dial pad. You can also enter the fax number on the LCD by pressing Phone Book and Send a fax, or you can press a One Touch key on the machine's control panel.



If your network supports the LDAP protocol you can search for fax numbers and E-mail addresses on your server. (See *LDAP operation* in the Network User's Guide on the CD-ROM.)

- When you hear the fax tone, press Mono Start or Colour Start.
 Then press Send on the LCD.
- 6 Replace the handset.

Out of Memory message

If you get an Out of Memory message while scanning the first page of a fax, press **Stop/Exit** to cancel the fax.

If you get an Out of Memory message while scanning a subsequent page, you will have the option to press **Mono Start** or **Colour Start** to send the pages scanned so far, or to press **Stop/Exit** to cancel the operation.



To free up extra memory, turn off Memory Receive or print the faxes that are in the memory. (See *Memory Receive* (*Monochrome only*) on page 54 or *Printing a fax from the memory* on page 54.)

Receiving a Fax


Receive modes

You must choose a receive mode depending on the external devices and telephone services you have on your line.

Choose the Receive Mode

By default, your machine will automatically receive any faxes that are sent to it. The diagram below will help you choose the correct mode.

For more detailed information on the receive modes, see *Using receive modes* on page 50.



To set a receive mode follow the instructions below.

- 1 Press MENU.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to display Initial Setup.
- Openion of the second of th
- 4 Press ▲ or ▼ to display Receive Mode.
- 5 Press Receive Mode.
- 6 Press Fax Only, Fax/Tel, External TAD or Manual.
- 7 Press Stop/Exit.
 The LCD will display the current receive mode.

Using receive modes

Some receive modes answer automatically (Fax Only and Fax/Tel). You may want to change the ring delay before using these modes. (See *Ring Delay* on page 51.)

Fax only

Fax only mode will automatically answer every call as a fax call.

Fax/Tel

Fax/Tel mode helps you automatically manage incoming calls, by recognising whether they are fax or voice calls and dealing with them in one of the following ways:

- Faxes will be automatically received.
- Voice calls will start the F/T Ring to tell you to pick up the line. The F/T Ring is a fast double ring made by your machine.

(See F/T Ring Time (Fax/Tel mode only) on page 51 and Ring Delay on page 51.)

Manual

To receive a fax in manual mode lift the handset of an external telephone. When you hear fax tones (short repeating beeps), press **Mono Start** or **Colour Start** and choose Receive. You can also use the Fax Detect feature to receive faxes by lifting a handset on the same line as the machine.

(See Fax Detect on page 52.)

External TAD

External TAD mode lets an external answering device manage your incoming calls. Incoming calls will be dealt with in one of the following ways:

- Faxes will be automatically received.
- Voice callers can record a message on the external TAD.

(For more information see Connecting an external TAD (telephone answering device) on page 71.)



Note

Do not turn off Distinctive Ring if you are subscribed to FaxStream[®] Duet[®].

Receive mode settings

Ring Delay

The Ring Delay sets the number of times the machine rings before it answers in Fax Only or Fax/Tel mode. If you have external or extension telephones on the same line as the machine choose the maximum number of rings.

(See Operation from extension telephones on page 73 and Fax Detect on page 52.)

- 1 Press MENU.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to display Fax.
- 3 Press Fax.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to display Setup Receive.
- 5 Press Setup Receive.
- 6 Press ▲ or ▼ to display Ring Delay.
- 7 Press Ring Delay.
- 8 Press the number of times the machine will ring before it answers (2-10 for Australia, 1-10 for New Zealand, 0-10 for some countries).

 If you choose 0, the line will not ring at all.
- 9 Press Stop/Exit.

F/T Ring Time (Fax/Tel mode only)

When somebody calls your machine, you and your caller will hear the normal telephone ring sound. The number of rings is set by the ring delay setting.

If the call is a fax, then your machine will receive it; however, if it is a voice call the machine will sound the F/T Ring (a fast double-ring) for the time you have set in the F/T Ring time setting. If you hear the F/T Ring it means that you have a voice caller on the line.

Because the F/T Ring is made by the machine, extension and external telephones will *not* ring; however, you can still answer the call on any telephone. (For more information see *Using remote codes* on page 74.)

- 1 Press MENU.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to display Fax.
- 3 Press Fax.
- 4 Press ▲ or ▼ to display
 Setup Receive.
- 5 Press Setup Receive.
- 6 Press ▲ or ▼ to display F/T Ring Time.
- $\overline{7}$ **Press** F/T Ring Time.
- 8 Press how long the machine will ring to alert you that you have a voice call (20, 30, 40 or 70 seconds for Australia and some countries, 20, 30, 40 or 55 seconds for New Zealand).
- 9 Press Stop/Exit.



Even if the caller hangs up during the pseudo/double-ringing, the machine will continue to ring for the set time.

Fax Detect

If Fax Detect is On:

Fax Detect is turned on as default.

The machine receives a fax call automatically, even if you answer the call. When you see Receiving on the LCD or when you hear "chirps" through the handset you are using, just replace the handset. Your machine will do the rest.

If Fax Detect is Off:

If you are at the machine and answer a fax call by lifting the handset, press **Mono Start** or **Colour Start**, then press Receive to receive the fax.

If you answered at an extension telephone, press * **5 1** (* **9 1** for New Zealand). (See *Operation from extension telephones* on page 73.)



- If this feature is set to On, but your machine does not connect a fax call when you lift an extension or external telephone handset, press the remote activation code * 5 1 (* 9 1 for New Zealand).
- If you send faxes from a computer on the same telephone line and the machine intercepts them, set Fax Detect to Off.
- 1 Press MENU.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to display Fax.
- 3 Press Fax.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to display Setup Receive.
- 5 Press Setup Receive.
- 6 Press ▲ or ▼ to display Fax Detect.
- 7 Press Fax Detect.
- 8 Press On (or Off).
- 9 Press Stop/Exit.

Additional receiving operations

Printing a reduced incoming fax

If you choose On, the machine automatically reduces each page of an incoming fax to fit on one page of A4, Letter or Legal size paper. The machine calculates the reduction ratio by using the page size of the fax and your Paper Size setting. (See *Paper Size and Type* on page 29.)

- 1 Press MENU.
- 2 Press **\(\)** or **\(\)** to display Fax.
- 3 Press Fax.
- 4 Press ▲ or ▼ to display
 Setup Receive.
- 5 Press Setup Receive.
- 6 Press ▲ or ▼ to display
 Auto Reduction.
- 7 Press Auto Reduction.
- 8 Press on (or off).
- 9 Press Stop/Exit.

Setting Receiving Priority

If a A3 Colour fax is sent to your machine, your machine will receive either a A3 Mono fax or a A4 Colour fax depending on the Receiving Priority setting. If you choose Mono (Max.A3), you will receive a A3 Mono fax. If you choose Colour (Max.A4), you will receive a A4 Colour fax.



The default setting is Mono(Max.A3), so the machine cannot receive A4 colour faxes by default.

When you print a fax from the memory, the fax data will be erased.

Out of Paper Reception

As soon as the paper tray becomes empty during fax reception, the screen will display No Paper Fed, asking you to put paper in the paper tray. (See Loading paper and other print media on page 10.)

The machine will carry on receiving the fax, with the remaining pages being stored in memory, if enough memory is available.

Further incoming faxes will also be stored into memory until the memory is full. When the memory is full the machine will stop automatically answering calls. To print the faxes, put fresh paper in the tray.

Memory Receive (Monochrome only)

You can only use one Memory Receive operation at a time:

- Fax Forwarding
- Fax Storage
- PC Fax Receive
- Off

You can change your selection at any time. If received faxes are still in the machine's memory when you change the Memory Receive operations, a message will appear on the LCD. (See *Changing Memory Receive Operations* on page 58.)



When you receive a colour fax, the machine will treat the data as a colour or monochrome fax depending on the Receive Priority setting. (See Setting Receiving Priority on page 53.)

Fax Forwarding

When you choose Fax Forward, your machine stores the received fax in the memory. The machine will then dial the fax number you have programmed and forward the fax message.

- 1 Press MENU.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to display Fax.
- 3 Press Fax.
- 4 Press ▲ or ▼ to display Setup Receive.
- 5 Press Setup Receive.
- 6 Press ▲ or ▼ to display
 Memory Receive.
- 7 Press Memory Receive.
- 8 Press Fax Forward.
- Enter the forwarding number (up to 20 digits) by using the buttons on the LCD. Press OK.
- 10 Press Backup Print:On or Backup Print:Off.

IMPORTANT

- If you choose Backup Print:On, the machine will also print the fax at your machine so you will have a copy. This is a safety feature in case there is a power failure before the fax is forwarded or a problem at the receiving machine.

 Backup Print:On does not work when Fax Preview is set to On.
- The machine can store faxes approximately 24 hours if there is a power failure.
- Press Stop/Exit.

Fax Storage

If you choose Fax Storage, your machine stores the received fax in the memory. You will be able to retrieve fax messages from another location using the remote retrieval commands.

If you have set Fax Storage, a backup copy will automatically be printed at the machine.

- 3 Press Fax.
- 4 Press ▲ or ▼ to display Setup Receive.
- 5 Press Setup Receive.

- 9 Press Stop/Exit.

PC Fax Receive

If you turn on the PC-Fax Receive feature your machine will store received faxes in memory and send them to your PC automatically. You can then use your PC to view and store these faxes.

Even if you have turned off your PC (at night or on the weekend, for example), your machine will receive and store your faxes in its memory. The number of received faxes that are stored in the memory will appear on the LCD.

When you start your PC and the PC-FAX Receiving software runs, your machine transfers your faxes to your PC automatically.

To transfer the received faxes to your PC you must have the PC-FAX Receiving software running on your PC. (For details, see *PC-FAX receiving* in the Software User's Guide on the CD-ROM.)

If you choose Backup Print:On the machine will also print the fax.

- PC Fax Receive is not supported in the Mac OS[®].
- Before you can set up PC Fax Receive you must install the MFL-Pro Suite software on your PC. Make sure your PC is connected and turned on. (For details see PC-FAX receiving in the Software User's Guide on the CD-ROM.)
- If you get an error message and the machine cannot print the faxes in memory, you can use this setting to transfer your faxes to your PC. (For details, see *Error* and Maintenance messages on page 155.)

! IMPORTANT

In the event of a power failure, the machine will store your faxes in the memory for approximately 24 hours. However, if you choose

Backup Print: On the machine will print the fax, so you will have a copy if there is a power failure before it is sent to the PC.

The LCD will give you more options if there are received faxes still in your machine's memory. (See *Changing Memory Receive Operations* on page 58.)

Changing Memory Receive Operations

If received faxes remain in your machine's memory when you change the Memory Receive Operations, the LCD will ask you one of the following questions:

- Erase All Doc?
- Print All Fax?
 - If you press Yes, faxes in the memory will be erased or printed before the setting changes. If a backup copy has already been printed it will not be printed again.
 - If you press No, faxes in the memory will not be erased or printed and the setting will be unchanged.

If received faxes are left in the machine's memory when you change to PC Fax Receive from another option [Fax Forward or Fax Storage], press A or V to choose the PC.

The LCD will ask you the following question:

- Send Fax to PC?
 - If you press Yes, faxes in the memory will be sent to your PC before the setting changes. You will be asked if you want to turn on Backup Print. (For detail, see PC Fax Receive on page 56.)
 - If you press No, faxes in the memory will not be erased or transferred to your PC and the setting will be unchanged.

Fax Preview (Monochrome only)

How to preview a received fax

You can view received faxes on the LCD by pressing the Fax Preview button on the LCD. When the machine is in Ready mode, a popup message will appear on the LCD to alert you of new faxes.

Using Fax Preview

When you receive a fax, you will see the popup message on the LCD. (For example:

New Fax: 02)

The LCD will display the new fax list.



- If you receive a fax containing multiple paper sizes (for example, a page of A4 data and a page of A3 data), the machine may create and store a file for each paper size. The LCD may show that more than one fax job has been received.
- You can also see your old fax list by pressing the Old Fax tab on the LCD.
 Press the New Fax tab to go back to your new fax list.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to display the fax number of the fax you want to see.
- Oress the fax you want to see.



- If your fax is large there may be a delay before it is displayed on the LCD.
- The LCD will show the current page number and total pages of the fax message. When your fax message is over 99 pages the total number of pages will be shown as "xx".

When the fax is displayed, press More. The buttons will appear on the LCD and perform the operations shown below.

Remote Retrieval

You can call your machine from any touch tone telephone or fax machine, then use the remote access code and remote commands to retrieve fax messages.

Setting a Remote Access Code

The remote access code lets you access the remote retrieval features when you are away from your machine. Before you can use the remote access and retrieval features, you have to set up your own code. The factory default code is the inactive code (---*).

- 1 Press MENU.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to display Fax.
- 3 Press Fax.
- 4 Press ▲ or ▼ to display
 Remote Access.
- 5 Press Remote Access.
- 6 Enter a three-digit code using numbers 0-9, *, or # by pressing the buttons on the LCD.

Press OK.

(The preset '*' cannot be changed.)



Do not use the same code as your Remote Activation Code (* 5 1 (* 9 1 for New Zealand)) or Remote Deactivation Code (# 5 1 (# 9 1 for New Zealand)). (See Operation from extension telephones on page 73.)

7 Press Stop/Exit.



You can change your code at any time by entering a new one. If you want to make your code inactive, press Clear in step 6 to restore the inactive setting (---*) and press OK.

Using your Remote Access Code

- 1 Dial your fax number from a touch tone telephone or another fax machine.
- When your machine answers, enter your remote access code (3 digits followed by *) at once.
- The machine signals if it has received messages:
 - 1 long beep Fax messages
 - No beeps No messages
- When the machine gives two short beeps, enter a command.

 The machine will beep three times if you enter an invalid command.
- 5 Press **9 0** to stop Remote Access when you have finished.

If your machine is set to Manual mode and you want to use the remote retrieval features, wait for about 100 seconds after it starts ringing, and then enter the remote access code within 30 seconds. This function may not be available in some countries e.g. Australia.

Retrieving fax messages

You can call your machine from any touch tone telephone and have your fax messages sent to a machine. Before you use this feature, you have to turn on Fax Storage.

- 1 Dial your fax number.
- When your machine answers, enter your remote access code (3 digits followed by *) at once. If you hear one long beep, you have messages.
- When you hear two short beeps, press **9 6 2**.
- Wait for a long beep, and then use the dial pad to enter the number of the remote fax machine where you want your fax messages sent, followed by ## (up to 20 digits).



You cannot use * and # as dial numbers. However, press # if you want to create a pause.

Hang up after you hear your machine beep. Your machine will call the other fax machine, which will then print your fax messages.

Changing your Fax Forwarding number

You can change the default setting of your fax forwarding number from another touch tone telephone or fax machine.

- When your machine answers, enter your remote access code (3 digits followed by *) at once. If you hear one long beep, you have messages.
- When you hear two short beeps, press **9 5 4**.
- Wait for the long beep, enter the new number (up to 20 digits) of the remote fax machine you want your fax messages forwarded to using the dial pad, then enter ##.



You cannot use * and # as dial numbers. However, press # if you want to create a pause.

Telephone and External devices

Voice operations

Voice calls can be made either with an extension or external telephone, by dialling manually, or by using Quick Dial numbers.

Tone or Pulse (Not Available for New Zealand)

If you have a Pulse dialling service, but need to send Tone signals (for example, for telephone banking), follow the instructions below:

- 1 Pick up the handset of the external telephone.
- 2 Press # on the machine's control panel. Any digits dialled after this will send tone signals.

When you hang up, the machine will return to the Pulse dialling service.

Fax/Tel mode

When the machine is in Fax/Tel mode, it will use the F/T Ring Time (pseudo/double-ringing) to alert you to pick up a voice call.

If you are at an external telephone, lift the handset of the external telephone, and then press **Hook** to answer.

If you are at an extension telephone, you'll need to lift the handset during the F/T Ring Time and then press # 5 1 (# 9 1 for New Zealand) between the pseudo/double rings. If no one is on the line, or if someone wants to send you a fax, send the call back to the machine by pressing * 5 1 (* 9 1 for New Zealand).

Fax/Tel mode in Power Save condition

When the machine is in Power Save mode you can receive faxes if the Power Save setting is Fax Receive: On. (See Power Save setting on page 27.)

Fax/Tel mode does not work in the Power Save condition. The machine will not answer telephone or fax calls and will keep ringing. If you are at an external or extension telephone, lift the handset and talk. If you hear fax tones, hold the handset until Fax Detect activates your machine. If the other party says they want to send you a fax, activate the machine by pressing * 5 1 (* 9 1 for New Zealand).

Telephone Service for Australia

Telstra[®] FaxStream[®] Duet[®] (Distinctive Ring)

Telstra[®] FaxStream[®] Duet[®] is an enhanced Public Switched Telephone Service (PSTS) offered by Telstra[®] that allows you to have an additional number on one phone line, with its own distinctive ring pattern. Telstra[®] FaxStream[®] Duet[®] is a call handling feature that helps users distinguish voice and facsimile calls. With FaxStream[®] Duet[®], incoming calls to a fax number are announced by a different, distinctive ring signal. Only one call can be answered (or made) at any one time and while this call is in progress, incoming calls to either number will be presented with a busy tone.

Your machine has a Distinctive Ring function, allowing you to dedicate one phone number just for receiving faxes.



After you have set the Distinctive Ring feature to On, the receive mode is set to Manual automatically. Your Distinctive Ring Number does not allow Voice calls - only Faxes. You can not change the receive mode from Manual mode while the Distinctive Ring is set to on.

What is the Advantage of using Telstra[®] FaxStream[®] Duet[®] Function?

Using Telstra® FaxStream® Duet® is the most efficient way to receive both fax and telephone calls on the same line. When the voice call comes in, all phones (extension and external) and the fax machine will ring to alert you to pick it up. If a fax call comes in, the fax machine will answer automatically without ringing, whereas the extension and external phones will ring twice with a distinctive ring pattern. It is also a more efficient way of operating a Fax machine with an extension phone as you do not have to use the remote activation codes. It gives you two independent numbers without the higher cost of a second line.


How does Telstra[®] FaxStream[®] Duet[®] Work?

Incoming calls to the voice number, will have the standard ring pattern of long, long tone, followed by a pause, repeated, while the new fax number will have a different ring pattern of three short bursts of ring, repeated at regular intervals.

When FaxStream[®] Duet[®] is On and you receive a voice call all extension and external phones will ring with a standard ring pattern. The fax machine will ring on the third ring with a standard ring pattern. All external and the extension phones will continue to ring, until you or a telephone answering device can answer the voice number.

When FaxStream[®] Duet[®] is On and you receive a fax call on the Duet[®] number the Fax machine will answer and automatically receive the fax message without ringing. On the other hand, all extension and external phones will ring twice with a distinctive ring pattern. Do not answer the phone as you are receiving a fax message.

If you turn off Distinctive Ring, the machine will stay in Manual receive mode. You will need to set the Receive Mode again. (See *Choose the Receive Mode* on page 49.)

Caller ID

Caller ID is a telephone service that allows the subscriber to see a display of the caller's phone number or name as the telephone rings. It is a fast way to screen your calls. You can respond quickly to calls you missed, because Caller IDs are received and stored in your machine memory.



To get the Caller ID Service: apply for the Caller ID service at your local telephone company, if available.

How Does the Caller ID Work?

The Caller ID Appears on the Display When Your Telephone Rings

As your telephone rings, the display shows you the caller's phone number or name if the name has stored in the One Touch and Speed Dial. Once you answer the call, the caller's ID disappears. You will see up to the first 20 characters of the number on the display.



- If ID Unknown appears on the display, it means that the call came from outside your caller ID service area or a public phone. ¹
- If ID Withheld appears on the display, it means the caller intentionally blocked the transmission of his/her ID.
- Depends on network function.

The Caller ID is Stored in Your Machine Memory

The machine can store a maximum of the last 30 incoming caller IDs in the memory, along with the time and date of reception. The 31st call will cause the oldest ID to be erased.

The Caller ID information stored in the memory can be used for the following.

■ Printing the Caller ID List.

You can review calls you received by checking the Caller IDs in memory. This report will list the Date, Time, Phone Number (Caller ID) name, and type of Call (Comment) if available. (See *How to print a report* on page 86.)

Telephone Service for New Zealand

FaxAbility

FaxAbility is a service offered by Telecom that allows you to have an additional number on one phone line, with its own distinctive ring pattern. This way, when you get an incoming call, you can identify the number being called by its ring.

How Will the Fax Machine Treat All Other Numbers?

FaxAbility mode ensures that the machine will answer calls to the FaxAbility (secondary) number. When a call comes in to your main number, all the phones will ring. You can set an external answering device (TAD) to answer calls on the other number(s). (See the chart in the following page.)


What is the Advantage of Using the FaxAbility Function?

Using FaxAbility is the most efficient way to receive both fax and telephone calls on the same line. It is much easier for your callers who dial manually. The fax machine will answer with receiving tones so they will not have to press an activation code. And the people who call to talk on your main number will not have to talk to your fax machine. Basically, it gives you two independent numbers without the higher cost of a second line.

How Does FaxAbility Work?

Your telephone number will have the standard ring pattern of long, long tone, while the new number will have a ring pattern of long, silence, long, etc. When FaxAbility is On, you will not hear the first ring of all incoming calls on the fax machine. Extension phones will ring as usual. If the fax machine recognizes the ring pattern, all ringing will stop and the fax machine will answer and automatically receive the fax message. Otherwise, you will hear the extension phones and the fax machine continue to ring. The fax machine always listens to the ring pattern before it answers, so do not pick up the phone during that time. You will quickly learn to recognize the ring pattern for faxes, so you will not be tempted to answer that number. Either you or a telephone answering device can answer the main number(s).

Flowchart Sequence of Incoming call





After you have set the FaxAbility feature to On, the receive mode is set to Manual automatically. Unless you have a TAD or Voice Mail set up on the FaxAbility number, Manual mode means you must answer all the call yourself. You can not change the receive mode to the other mode while the FaxAbility is set to on.

How to Turn FaxAbility OFF or ON

The FaxAbility function is designed to accommodate the FaxAbility service provided by Telecom. To change the setting, repeat steps 1-11; Step 8 is where you can choose either on or off.

Call Waiting beeps caused by incoming calls on your main number can affect fax transmissions. If you have FaxAbility Service but don't have Call Waiting, you need do nothing at this stage. If you do have Call Waiting as well as FaxAbility, set the Call Waiting menu option to on. See below.

Telephone Service for Some Countries

Distinctive Ring (For Singapore and Hong Kong)

This machine feature lets you use the Distinctive Ring subscriber service offered by some telephone companies, which allows you to have several telephone numbers on one phone line. Each phone number has its own Distinctive Ring pattern, so you will know which phone number is ringing. This is one way you can have a separate phone number for your machine.

Your machine has a Distinctive Ring function, allowing you to dedicate one phone number just for receiving faxes. You will need to set Distinctive Ring to On.



You can switch it off temporarily, then turn it back on. When you get a new fax number, make sure you reset this function.

 The machine will answer only calls to the Distinctive Ring number.

Registering the Distinctive Ring pattern

Very Important!

After you have set the Distinctive Ring feature to on, the receive mode is set to Manual automatically. Unless you have a TAD or Voice Mail set up on the Distinctive Ring number, Manual mode means you must answer all the calls yourself. You cannot change the receive mode to another mode while the Distinctive Ring is set to on.

- 1 Press MENU.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to display Fax.
- 3 Press Fax.

- 4 Press ▲ or ▼ to display
 Miscellaneous.
- 5 Press Miscellaneous.
- 6 Press Distinctive.
- 7 Press on.
- 8 Press Stop/Exit.
 Distinctive Ring is now set to on.

Turning off Distinctive Ring

- 1 Press MENU.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to display Fax.
- 3 Press Fax.
- 4 Press ▲ or ▼ to display
 Miscellaneous.
- 5 Press Miscellaneous.
- 6 Press Distinctive.
- 7 Press off.
- 8 Press Stop/Exit.



If you turn off Distinctive Ring, the machine will stay in Manual receive mode. You will need to set the Receive Mode again. (See *Choose the Receive Mode* on page 49.)

Caller ID (For Singapore and Hong Kong)

The Caller ID feature of this machine lets you use the Caller ID subscriber service offered by many local phone companies. Call your telephone company for details. This service provides you, by means of the screen display, the telephone number (or name) of your caller as the line rings.

After a few rings, the screen displays the telephone number of your caller (or name, if available). Once you answer the call, the Caller ID information disappears from the screen, but the call information remains stored in the Caller ID memory.

- You will see the first 16 characters of the number or name.
- ID Unknown display means call originates outside your Caller ID service area.
- ID Withheld display means the caller has intentionally blocked transmission of information.

Note

You can print a list of Caller ID information received by your machine. (See *How to print a report* on page 86.)

Caller ID service varies with different carriers. Call your local phone company to determine the kind of service available in your area.


Connecting an external TAD (telephone answering device)

You may choose to connect an external answering device. However, when you have an **external** TAD on the same telephone line as the machine, the TAD answers all calls and the machine 'listens' for fax calling (CNG) tones. If it hears them, the machine takes over the call and receives the fax. If it does not hear CNG tones, the machine lets the TAD continue playing your outgoing message so your caller can leave you a voice message.

The TAD must answer within two rings (the recommended setting is two rings). The machine cannot hear CNG tones until the TAD has answered the call, and with four rings there are only 8 to 10 seconds of CNG tones left for the fax 'handshake'. Make sure you carefully follow the instructions in this guide for recording your outgoing message. We do not recommend using the toll saver feature on your external answering machine if it exceeds five rings.



If you do not receive all your faxes, shorten the Ring Delay setting on your external TAD.



1 TAD

When the TAD answers a call, the LCD shows Telephone.

! IMPORTANT

DO NOT connect a TAD elsewhere on the same telephone line.

Connections

The external TAD must be connected as shown in the previous illustration.

- Set your external TAD to one or two rings. (The machine's Ring Delay setting does not apply.)
- Record the outgoing message on your external TAD.
- Set the TAD to answer calls.
- 4 Set the Receive Mode to
 External TAD. (See Choose the Receive Mode on page 49.)

Recording outgoing message (OGM) on an external TAD

Timing is important in recording this message. The message sets up the ways to handle both manual and automatic fax reception.

- 1 Record 5 seconds of silence at the beginning of your message. (This allows your machine time to listen for the fax CNG tones of automatic transmissions before they stop.)
- 2 Limit your speaking to 20 seconds.



We recommend beginning your OGM with an initial 5-second silence because the machine cannot hear fax tones over a resonant or loud voice. You may try omitting this pause, but if your machine has trouble receiving, then you must re-record the OGM to include it.

Multi-line connections (PABX)

Most offices use a central telephone system.

Brother recommends that all our machines be connected to a discreet (dedicated) line. Although a particular PABX may appear to work with a particular model of fax machine, we cannot guarantee that the unit will operate correctly.


While it is often relatively simple to connect a fax machine to a PABX, (Private Automatic Branch Exchange), we suggest that you contact the company that installed your telephone system and ask them to connect the fax machine for you.

Brother does not recommend the use of a PABX line. PABX limitations in general can cause some functions of the fax machine not to work correctly.

External and extension telephones

Connecting an external or extension telephone

You can connect a separate telephone to your machine as shown in the diagram below.



- 1 Extension telephone
- 2 External telephone

When you are using an external or extension telephone, the LCD shows Telephone.

Operation from extension telephones

If you answer a fax call on an extension or an external telephone, you can make your machine take the call by using the Remote Activation Code. When you press the Remote Activation Code * 5 1 (* 9 1 for New Zealand), the machine starts to receive the fax.

If the machine answers a voice call and pseudo/double-rings for you to take over, use the Remote Deactivation Code # 5 1 (#91 for New Zealand) to take the call at an extension telephone. (See F/T Ring Time (Fax/Tel mode only) on page 51.)

If you answer a call and no one is on the line:

You should assume that you're receiving a manual fax.

If you answered at an extension telephone, press * 5 1 (* 9 1 for New Zealand) and wait for the chirp or until the LCD shows

Receiving, and then hang up.



You can also use the Fax Detect feature to make your machine automatically take the call. (See *Fax Detect* on page 52.)

Using a cordless external telephone

If your cordless telephone is connected to the telephone line cord (See *External and extension telephones* on page 73) and you typically carry the cordless handset elsewhere, it is easier to answer calls during the Ring Delay.

If you let the machine answer first, you will have to go to the machine so you can press **Hook** to send the call to the cordless handset.

Using remote codes

Remote Activation code

If you answer a fax call on an extension telephone, you can tell your machine to receive it by dialling the Remote Activation Code * 5 1 (* 9 1 for New Zealand). Wait for the chirping sounds then replace the handset. (See *Fax Detect* on page 52.) Your caller will have to press **Start** to send the fax.

If you answer a fax call at the external telephone, you can make the machine receive the fax by pressing **Mono Start** and **choose** Receive.

Remote Deactivation code

If you receive a voice call and the machine is in F/T mode, it will start to sound the F/T (double) ring after the initial ring delay. If you pick up the call on an extension telephone you can turn the F/T Ring off by pressing # 5 1 (# 9 1 for New Zealand) (make sure you press this *between* the rings).

If the machine answers a voice call and pseudo/double-rings for you to take over, you can take the call at the external telephone by pressing **Hook**.

Changing the remote codes

If you want to use Remote Activation, you have to turn on the remote codes. The preset Remote Activation Code is * 5 1 (* 9 1 for New Zealand). The preset Remote Deactivation Code is # 5 1 (# 9 1 for New Zealand). If you want to, you can replace them with your own codes.

- 1 Press MENU.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to display Fax.
- 3 Press Fax.

- 4 Press ▲ or ▼ to display
 Setup Receive.
- 5 Press Setup Receive.
- 6 Press ▲ or ▼ to display Remote Codes.
- 7 Press Remote Codes.
- 8 Press on (or off).
- 9 Do one of the following.
 - If you want to change the Remote Activation Code, enter the new code.
 - Press OK, go to step 10.
 - If you do not want to change the Remote Activation Code, press OK, go to step ...
- 10 Do one of the following.
 - If you want to change the Remote Deactivation Code, enter the new code.

Press OK, go to step 1.

- If you do not want to change the Remote Deactivation Code, press OK, go to step ①.
- 11 Press Stop/Exit.



- If you are always disconnected when accessing your external TAD remotely, try changing the Remote Activation Code and Remote Deactivation Code to another three-digit code using the numbers 0-9, *, #.
- Remote Codes might not work with some telephone systems.

Dialling and storing numbers

How to Dial

Manual dialling

Press all of the digits of the fax or telephone number using the dial pad.



One Touch Dialling

Your machine has 3 One Touch keys where you can store 6 fax or telephone numbers for automatic dialling.



Speed Dialling

- 1 Press Phone Book.
- 2 Press the two-digit number you want to call. You can also display the numbers in alphabetical order by pressing
 on LCD.



If the LCD shows Not Registered when you enter a One Touch or Speed Dial number, a number has not been stored at this location.

Fax Redial

If you are sending a fax manually and the line is busy, press **Redial/Pause**, and then press **Mono Start** or **Colour Start** to try again. If you want to make a second call to a number you recently dialled, you can press **Redial/Pause** and choose one of the last 30 numbers from the Outgoing Call List.

Redial/Pause only works if you dialled from the control panel. *If you are sending a fax automatically* and the line is busy, the machine will automatically redial up to three times at five minute intervals.

- 1 Press Redial/Pause.
- 2 Press the number you want to redial.
- 3 Press Send a fax.
- 4 Press Mono Start or Colour Start.



In Real Time Transmission the automatic redial feature does not work when using the scanner glass.

Outgoing Call history

The last 30 numbers you sent a fax to will be stored in the outgoing call history. You can choose one of these numbers to fax to, add to One Touch or Speed Dial, or delete from the history.

Caller ID history

This feature requires the Caller ID subscriber service offered by many local telephone companies. (See *Caller ID* on page 67.) (See *Caller ID* on page 69.) (See *Caller ID* (For Singapore and Hong Kong) on page 71.)

The number, or name if available, from the last 30 faxes and telephone calls you received will be stored in the Caller ID history. You can view the list or choose one of these numbers to fax to, add to One Touch or Speed Dial, or delete from the history. When the thirty-first call comes in to the machine, it replaces information about the first call.

- 1 Press History.
- Press Caller ID hist.
- 3 Press ▲ or ▼ to display the number or the name you want to call.
- 4 Press the number or the name you want to call.
- 5 Do one of the following:
 - To send a fax, press Send a fax.

 Press Mono Start or Colour Start.
 - If you want to store the number, press More and then press
 Add to Speed Dial or
 Add to One Touch Dial.

(See Storing One Touch numbers from the Caller ID history on page 78 and Storing Speed Dial numbers from the Caller ID history on page 80.)

■ If you want to delete the number from the Caller ID history list, press More and then press Delete.

Press Yes to confirm.

6 Press Stop/Exit.



You can print the Caller ID list. (See *How to print a report* on page 86.)

Storing numbers

You can set up your machine to do the following types of easy dialling: One Touch, Speed Dial and Groups for broadcasting faxes. When you dial a Quick Dial number, the LCD shows the name, if you stored it, or the number.



If you lose electrical power, the Quick Dial numbers that are in the memory will not be lost.

Storing a pause

When you are storing One Touch or Speed Dial numbers in the Phone Book, you can insert one or more 3.5-second pauses by pressing the Pause button on the LCD.

Storing One Touch Dial numbers

Your machine has 3 One Touch keys where you can store 6 fax or telephone numbers for automatic dialling. To access numbers 4 to 6 hold down **Shift** as you press the One Touch key.

Setting up groups for broadcasting

Groups, which can be stored in a One Touch key or a Speed Dial location, allow you to send the same fax message to many fax numbers by pressing only a One Touch key or Phone Book, the two-digit location, Send a fax and **Mono Start**. First, you'll need to store each fax number in a One Touch key or Speed-Dial location. Then you can include them as numbers in the Group. Each Group uses up a One Touch key or Speed Dial location. You can have up to six Groups, or you can assign up to 205 numbers in a large Group.

(See Storing Speed Dial numbers on page 79 and Broadcasting (Monochrome only) on page 43.)

- 1 Press Phone Book.
- 2 Press More.
- 3 Press Setup Groups.
- 4 Press Set Speed Dial or
 Set One Touch Dial.
 If you choose Set Speed Dial, go to step 6.
- 5 To accept the next available One Touch key number, press OK.
- 6 Enter the group name (up to 16 characters) using the buttons on the LCD.

 Press OK.
- When the LCD displays the next available Group number, press OK. This Group number and name will automatically be assigned to the next available Speed Dial location.

8 Add One Touch or Speed Dial numbers to the Group by pressing them to display a red checkmark. Press OK.
If you want to list the numbers by alphabetical order, press

- 8 Press the check box of the number you want to delete to uncheck it.
 Press OK to confirm.
- 9 Press OK.
- 10 Press Stop/Exit.

Combining Quick Dial numbers

Sometimes you may want to choose from several long distance carriers when you send a fax. Rates may vary depending on the time and destination. To take advantage of low rates, you can store the access codes of longdistance carriers and credit card numbers as One Touch and Speed Dial numbers. You can store these long dialling sequences by dividing them and setting them up as separate One Touch and Speed Dial numbers in any combination. You can even include manual dialling using the dial pad. (See Storing Speed Dial numbers on page 79.)

For example, you might have stored '555' on Speed Dial: 03 and '7000' on One Touch: 02. You can use them both to dial '555-7000' if you press the following keys:

- Press Phone Book.
- **Press** #03.



Speed Dial numbers start with #. One Touch numbers start with *.

- Press Send a fax.
- Press Phone Book.
- Press *02.
- 6 Press Send a fax.
- Press Mono Start or Colour Start. You will dial '555-7000'.

To temporarily change a number, you can substitute part of the number with manual dialling using the dial pad. For example, to change the number to 555-7001 you could press Phone Book, press #03, press Send a fax, and then press 7001 using the dial pad.



If you must wait for another dial tone or signal at any point in the dialling sequence, create a pause in the number by pressing Redial/Pause. Each key press adds a 3.5-second delay.

Printing Reports

Fax reports

You need to set up the Transmission Verification Report and Journal Period using the MENU keys.

Transmission Verification Report

There are several settings available for the Transmission Verification Report:

- on: Prints a report after every fax you send.
- On+Image: Prints a report after every fax you send. A portion of the fax's first page appears on the report.
- Off: Prints a report if your fax is unsuccessful due to a transmission error. The report will also print if the receiving machine modifies the size of the document you fax. Off is the default setting.
- Off+Image: Prints a report if your fax is unsuccessful due to a transmission error. The report will also print if your fax is successful, but the receiving machine modifies the size of the document you fax. A portion of the fax's first page appears on the report.
- Off2: Prints a report only if your fax is unsuccessful due to a transmission error.
- Off2+Image: Prints a report *only* if your fax is unsuccessful due to a transmission error. A portion of the fax's first page appears on the report.

The machine will print the Journal when the machine has stored 50 jobs.

10 Polling

Polling overview

Polling lets you set up your machine so other people can receive faxes from you, but they pay for the call. It also lets you call somebody else's fax machine and receive a fax from it, so you pay for the call. The polling feature needs to be set up on both machines for this to work. Not all fax machines support polling.

Polling receive

Polling receive lets you call another fax machine to receive a fax.

Setup to receive polling

- 3 Press Polling RX.
- 4 Press Standard.
- 5 Enter the fax number you are polling using One Touch, Phone Book or the dial pad on the control panel.

Setup to receive polling with secure code

Secure Polling lets you restrict who can get the documents you set up to be polled.

Secure Polling only works with Brother fax machines. If you want to get a fax from a secured Brother machine you have to enter the secure code.

- 3 Press Polling RX.
- 4 Press Secure.
- Enter a four-digit secure code using the buttons on the LCD. This is the same as the security code of the fax machine you are polling. Press OK.
- 6 Enter the fax number you are polling using One Touch, Phone Book or the dial pad on the control panel.
- 7 Press Mono Start or Colour Start.

Setup to receive delayed polling

Delayed polling lets you set the machine to begin polling receive at a later time. You can only set up *one* delayed polling operation.

- 3 Press Polling RX.
- 4 Press Timer.
- 5 Enter the time (in 24-hour format) you want to start polling.
 For example, enter 21:45 for 9:45 PM.

- 7 Press Mono Start or Colour Start. The machine makes the polling call at the time you entered.

Sequential polling (Monochrome only)

Sequential polling lets you request documents from several fax machines in one operation.

- 4 Press Standard, Secure or Timer.
- 5 Do one of the following:
 - If you chose Standard, go to step 6.

 - If you chose Timer, enter the time (24-hour format) you want to begin polling and press OK, go to step ⑥.
- 6 Press ◀ or ▶ to display Broadcasting.
- 7 Press Broadcasting.
- 8 Do one of the following:
 - Press Add Number and enter a number using the buttons on the LCD.

Press OK.

Press Phone Book. Press to choose Alphabetical Order or Numerical Order. Press ▲ or ▼ to select a number.

Press OK.



One Touch Dial locations begin with *. Speed Dial locations begin with #.

9 After you have entered all the fax numbers by repeating steps (3), press OK.

Press **Mono Start**.

The machine polls each number or group in turn for a document.

Press **Stop/Exit** while the machine is dialling to cancel the polling process.

Cancelling a Sequential Polling Job

 - Press No or Mono Start to send the document.



Making N in 1 copies or a poster (Page Layout)

The N in 1 copy feature can help you save paper by letting you copy two or four pages onto one printed page.

The 1 to 2 feature copies one A3 or Ledger size page onto two A4 or Letter size pages. If you use this setting, use the scanner glass.

You can also produce a poster. When you use the poster feature your machine divides your document into sections, then enlarges the sections so you can assemble them into a poster. If you want to print a poster, use the scanner glass.

When you are ready to use one of your favourite set of settings, you can recall it.

- 2 Press Favorite.
- 3 Press the favourite setting you want to retrieve.

Rename your favourite setting

After you stored your favourite setting, you can rename it.

'Out of Memory' message

If you get an Out of Memory message while scanning a multi-page document, you will have the option to press **Mono Start** or **Colour Start** to copy the pages scanned so far, or to press **Stop/Exit** to cancel the operation.

To free up extra memory, do the following:

- Turn off Memory Receive. (See *Memory Receive* (*Monochrome only*) on page 54.)
- Print the faxes that are in the memory. (See *Printing a fax from the memory* on page 54.)

When you get an Out of Memory message, you may be able to make copies if you first print incoming faxes in the memory to restore the memory to 100%.


Using PhotoCapture Center™ from your computer

You can access a memory card or USB Flash memory drive that is inserted in the front of the machine from your computer.

(See PhotoCapture Center™ for Windows® or Remote Setup & PhotoCapture Center™ for Macintosh® in the Software User's Guide on the CD-ROM.)

Using a memory card or USB Flash memory drive

Your Brother machine has media drives (slots) for use with the following popular digital camera media: CompactFlash[®], Memory Stick™, Memory Stick PRO™, SD, SDHC, xD-Picture Card™ and USB Flash memory drives.



- miniSD™ can be used with a miniSD™ adapter.
- microSD can be used with a microSD adapter.
- Memory Stick Duo[™] can be used with a Memory Stick Duo[™] adapter.
- Memory Stick PRO Duo[™] can be used with a Memory Stick PRO Duo[™] adapter.
- Memory Stick Micro[™] (M2[™]) can be used with a Memory Stick Micro[™] (M2[™]) adapter.
- Adapters are not included with the machine. Contact a third party supplier for adapters.

The PhotoCapture Center™ feature lets you print digital photos from your digital camera at high resolution to get photo quality printing.

Memory cards or USB Flash memory drive folder structure

Your machine is designed to be compatible with modern digital camera image files and memory cards or USB Flash memory drive; however, please read the points below to avoid errors:

- The image file extension must be .JPG (other image file extensions like .JPEG, .TIF, .GIF and so on will not be recognized).
- PhotoCapture Center[™] printing must be performed separately from PhotoCapture Center[™] operations using the PC. (Simultaneous operation is not available.)
- IBM Microdrive[™] is not compatible with the machine.
- The machine can read up to 999 files on a memory card or USB Flash memory drive.
- CompactFlash[®] Type II is not supported.
- This product supports xD-Picture Card[™] Type M / Type M⁺ / Type H (Large Capacity).
- The DPOF file on the memory cards must be in a valid DPOF format. (See *DPOF* printing on page 113.)

Please be aware of the following:

- When printing an index or image, PhotoCapture Center™ will print all valid images, even if one or more images have been corrupted. Corrupted images will not be printed.
- (memory card users)

Your machine is designed to read memory cards that have been formatted by a digital camera.


When a digital camera formats a memory card it creates a special folder into which it copies image data. If you need to modify the image data stored on a memory card with your PC, we recommend that you do not modify the folder structure created by the digital camera. When saving new or modified image files to the memory card we also recommend you use the same folder your digital camera uses. If the data is not saved to the same folder, the machine may not be able to read the file or print the image.

■ (USB Flash memory drive users)

This machine supports USB Flash memory drives that have been formatted by Windows[®].





- 5 Repeat step 3 and 4 until you have chosen all the photos that you want to print.

Print Index (Thumbnails)



The Enhance Photos feature is supported by technology from Reallusion, Inc.

- Six thumbnails are displayed at a time with the current page number and total number of pages listed above the thumbnails.
- Press to start Slide Show.
- 3 Press a photo from the thumbnails.
- 4 Press Enhance or Trim. You can also choose both together. Press OK.
- 5 Do one of the following:
 - If you chose Enhance, go to step 6.
 - If you chose Trim, go to step ⑦.
- Press the effect you wish to add. Press OK.

You have 7 ways to add effects to your photo.



(Auto Correct)

The machine decides the suitable effect for your photo.



(Enhance Skin)

Best used for adjusting portrait photographs. It adjusts human skin colour. Press ◀ or ▶ to adjust the level of contrast.



(Enhance Scenery)

Best used for adjusting landscape photographs. It highlights green and blue areas in your photo. Press ◀ or ▶ to adjust the level of contrast.



(Remove Red-Eye)

The machine will attempt to remove red-eye from your photo. If red-eye detection fails, you can press the Try Again button to re-detect.



(Monochrome)

You can convert the colour of your photo to monochrome.



(Sepia)

Adds a sepia tone (shades of brown) effect to your photo.



(Auto Correct Remove Red-Eye)

The machine decides the suitable effects for your photo. Also, it will attempt to remove red-eye from your photo.

- There are some cases when red-eye may not be removed.
 - When the face is too small in the image.
 - When the face is turning too far up, down, left or right.

- While the image is enlarged, you can move around the image with up (▲), down (▼), left (◄)and right (►).
- Press Cancel to return to the list of effects.
- 7 Adjust the red frame around your photo. The part inside of the red frame will be printed.
 - Press + or to enlarge or reduce the frame size.
 - Press ▲, ▼, ◀ or ▶ to move the position of the frame.
 - Press 🕝 to rotate the frame.

Press OK when you have finished adjusting the frame setting. Press OK to confirm.



If your photo is very small or of irregular proportions you may not be able to trim the photo. The LCD will display

 Press OK.
- Do one of the following.
 - Press Print Setting and change the print settings. (See page 114.)
 - If you do not want to change any settings, press Colour Start to print.

DPOF printing

DPOF stands for Digital Print Order Format.

Major digital camera manufacturers (Canon Inc., Eastman Kodak Company, FUJIFILM Corporation, Panasonic Corporation and Sony Corporation) created this standard to make it easier to print images from a digital camera.

If your digital camera supports DPOF printing, you will be able to choose on the digital camera display the images and number of copies you want to print.

When the memory card (CompactFlash[®], Memory Stick ™, Memory Stick PRO™, SD, SDHC or xD-Picture Card™) with DPOF information is put into your machine, you can print the chosen image easily.

- 1 Make sure you have put a memory card in the correct slot.
 The machine will ask you if you want to use DPOF setting.
 The DPOF file on the memory card must be in a valid DPOF format.
- 2 Press Yes.
- 3 Do one of the following:
 - Press Print Setting to change the print settings. (See page 114.)
 - If you do not want to change any settings, press Colour Start to print.



An DPOF File error can occur if the print order that was created on the camera has been corrupted. Delete and recreate the print order using your camera to correct this problem. For instructions on how to delete or recreate the print order, refer to your camera manufacturer's support website or accompanying documentation.

PhotoCapture Center™ print settings

You can change the print settings temporarily for the next print.

The machine returns to its default settings after 3 minutes, or if the Mode Timer returns the machine to Fax mode. (See *Mode Timer* on page 28.)

White Balance

This setting adjusts the hue of the white areas of an image. Lighting, camera settings and other influences will affect the appearance of white. The white areas of a picture may be slightly pink, yellow or some other colour. By using this setting, you can correct that effect and bring the white areas back to pure white.

Sharpness

This setting enhances the detail of an image, similar to adjusting the fine focus on a camera. If the image is not in true focus and you cannot see the fine details of the picture, then adjust the sharpness.

Colour Density

This setting adjusts the total amount of colour in the image. You can increase or decrease the amount of colour in an image to improve a washed out or weak picture.

Cropping

If your photo is too long or wide to fit the available space on your chosen layout, part of the image will automatically be cropped.

The factory setting is On. If you want to print the whole image, turn this setting to Off.

If you are also using the Borderless setting, turn the Borderless to Off. (See *Borderless printing* on page 118.)

- 1 Press Print Setting.
- 2 Press ▲ or ▼ to display Cropping.
- 3 Press Cropping.
- 4 Press Off (or On).
- 5 If you do not want to change additional settings, press .

How to scan to a memory card or USB Flash memory drive

You can scan monochrome and colour documents onto a memory card or USB Flash memory drive. Monochrome documents will be stored in PDF (*.PDF) or TIFF (*.TIF) file formats. Colour documents may be stored in PDF (*.PDF) or JPEG (*.JPG) file formats. The factory setting is Color 150 dpi and the default file format is PDF. The machine automatically creates file names based on the current date. (For details, see the Quick Setup Guide.) For example, the fifth image scanned on July 1, 2009 would be named 01070905.PDF. You can change the colour and quality.

Understanding the Error Messages

Once you are familiar with the types of errors that can occur while you are using PhotoCapture Center™, you can easily identify and troubleshoot any problems.

■ Hub is Unusable.

This message will appear if a Hub or USB Flash memory drive with a Hub has been put into the USB direct interface.

■ Media Error

This message will appear if you put in a memory card that is either bad or not formatted, or when there is a problem with the media drive. To clear this error, take out the memory card.

■ No File

This message will appear if you try to access a memory card or USB Flash memory drive in the drive (slot) that does not contain a .JPG file.

■ Out of Memory

This message will appear if you are working with images that are too large for the machine's memory. This message will also appear when a memory card or USB Flash memory drive you are using does not have enough space available for the scanned document.

■ Media is Full.

This message will appear if you are trying to save more than 999 files in a memory card or USB Flash memory drive.

■ Unusable Device

This message will appear if a USB device or USB Flash memory drive that is not supported has been connected to the USB direct interface. For more information, visit us at http://solutions.brother.com. This message will also appear if you connect a broken device to the USB direct interface.

Printing photos from a camera

Printing photos directly from a PictBridge camera



Your Brother machine supports the PictBridge standard, allowing you to connect to and print photos directly from any PictBridge compatible digital camera.

If your camera is using the USB Mass Storage standard, you can also print photos from a digital camera without PictBridge. (See *Printing photos directly from a digital* camera (without PictBridge) on page 125.)

PictBridge requirements

To avoid errors, remember the following points:

- The machine and the digital camera must be connected using a suitable USB cable.
- The image file extension must be .JPG (other image file extensions like .JPEG, .TIF, .GIF and so on will not be recognized).
- PhotoCapture Center[™] operations are not available when using the PictBridge feature.

Setting your digital camera







Choosing a location

Put your machine on a flat, stable surface that is free of vibration and shocks, such as a desk. Put the machine near a telephone socket and a standard grounded electrical socket. Choose a location where the temperature remains between 10°C and 35°C.

No printout	Check the interface cable or wireless connection on both the machine and your computer. (See the <i>Quick Setup Guide</i> .)
	Make sure the machine is plugged in and not in Power Save mode.
	Check to see if the LCD is showing an error message. (See <i>Error and Maintenance messages</i> on page 155.)
	If the LCD says Cannot Print and Replace Ink, see Replacing the ink cartridges on page 165.
	Check that the correct printer driver has been installed and chosen.
	Make sure that the machine is online. Click Start and then Printers and Faxes . Choose Brother MFC-XXXX (where XXXX is your model name), and make sure that Use Printer Offline is unchecked.
	When you choose the Print Odd Pages and Print Even Pages settings, you may see a print error message on your computer, as the machine pauses during the printing process. The error message will disappear after the machine re-starts printing.

If you send a PC FAX message and get 'Result:ERROR' on the Transmission Verification Report, your machine may be out of memory. Handling Incoming Calls

The machine 'Hears' a voice as a CNG Tone.	If Fax Detect is set to on, your machine is more sensitive to sounds. It may mistakenly interpret certain voices or music on the line as a fax machine calling and respond with fax receiving tones. Deactivate the machine by pressing Stop/Exit . Try avoiding this problem by turning Fax Detect to off. (See <i>Fax Detect</i> on page 52.)
Sending a fax call to the machine.	If you answered on an external or extension telephone, press your Remote Activation Code (the factory setting is * 5 1 (* 9 1 for New Zealand)). When your machine answers, hang up.
Custom features on a single line.	If you have Call Waiting, Call Waiting/Caller ID, an alarm system or other custom feature on a single telephone line with your machine, it may create a problem sending or receiving faxes.
	For example: If you subscribe to Call Waiting or some other custom service and its signal comes through the line while your machine is sending or receiving a fax, the signal can temporarily interrupt or disrupt the faxes. Brother's ECM (Error Correction Mode) feature should help overcome this problem. This condition is related to the telephone system industry and is common to all devices that send and receive information on a single, shared line with custom features. If avoiding a slight interruption is crucial to your business, a separate telephone line with no custom features is recommended.

Dial Tone detection

When you send a fax automatically, by default your machine will wait for a fixed amount of time before it starts to dial the number. By changing the Dial Tone setting to Detection you can make your machine dial as soon as it detects a dial tone. This setting can save a small amount of time when sending a fax to many different numbers. If you change the setting and start having problems with dialling you should change back to the factory No Detection setting.

Routine maintenance

Replacing the ink cartridges

Your machine is equipped with an ink dot counter. The ink dot counter automatically monitors the level of ink in each of the 4 cartridges. When the machine detects an ink cartridge is running out of ink, the machine will tell you with a message on the LCD.



For example, when one of the ink cartridge is nearly empty, the LCD will display Ink low (name of colour).

You should purchase a replacement cartridge in preparation for when the machine indicates the colour is completely empty.

When one of the ink cartridge is empty, the LCD will display Cannot Print or B&W Print Only.

You should only replace the actual ink cartridge when this message Cannot Print or B&W Print Only appears on the LCD.

The LCD will tell you which ink cartridge is low or needs replacing. Be sure to follow the LCD prompts to replace the ink cartridges in the correct order.


Even though the machine tells you to replace ink cartridge, there will be a small amount of ink left in the ink cartridge. It is necessary to keep some ink in the ink cartridge to prevent air from drying out and damaging the print head assembly.


! IMPORTANT

Brother multifunction machines are designed to work with ink of a particular specification and will work to a level of optimum performance and reliability when used with genuine Brother Branded ink cartridges. Brother cannot guarantee this optimum performance and reliability if ink or ink cartridges of other specifications are used. Brother does not therefore recommend the use of cartridges other than genuine Brother Branded cartridges or the refilling of used cartridges with ink from other sources. If damage is caused to the print head or other parts of this machine as a result of using other brands of ink or ink cartridges, any repairs required as a result may not be covered by the warranty.

- Open the ink cartridge cover.


 If one or more ink cartridges have reached the end of their life, for example Black, the LCD shows Cannot Print.
- Press the lock release lever as shown to release the ink cartridge indicated on the LCD. Remove the cartridge from the machine.







5 Each colour has its own correct position. Insert the ink cartridge in the direction of the arrow on the label.



6 Gently push the ink cartridge until it clicks, and then close the ink cartridge cover.



7 The machine will automatically reset the ink dot counter.



- If you replaced an ink cartridge, for example Black, the LCD may ask you to verify that it was a brand new one (for example, Did You Change BK Black).
 For each new cartridge you installed, press Yes to automatically reset the ink dot counter for that colour. If the ink cartridge you installed is not a brand new one, be sure to press No.
- If the LCD shows No Cartridge or Cannot Detect after you install the ink cartridges, check that the ink cartridges are installed correctly.

A CAUTION

If ink gets in your eyes, wash them out with water at once and call a doctor if you are concerned.

! IMPORTANT

- DO NOT take out ink cartridges if you do not need to replace them. If you do so, it may reduce the ink quantity and the machine will not know the quantity of ink left in the cartridge.
- DO NOT touch the cartridge insertion slots. If you do so, the ink may stain your skin.
- If ink gets on your skin or clothing immediately wash it off with soap or detergent.
- If you mix the colours by installing an ink cartridge in the wrong position, clean the print head several times after correcting the cartridge installation.
- Once you open an ink cartridge, install it in the machine and use it up within six months of installation. Use unopened ink cartridges by the expiration date written on the cartridge package.
- DO NOT dismantle or tamper with the ink cartridge, this can cause the ink to leak out of the cartridge.

Cleaning the outside of the machine

Clean the Touchscreen as follows:

- To prevent activating the Touchscreen while cleaning, put the machine into Power Save mode first by pressing the Power Save key.
- DO NOT use any type of liquid cleaners (including ethanol).

2 In the ADF unit, clean the white bar (1) and the glass strip (2) with a lint-free cloth moistened with a non-flammable glass cleaner.






In addition to cleaning the glass strip with a non-flammable glass cleaner, run your finger tip over the glass strip to see if you can feel anything on it. If you feel dirt or debris, clean the glass strip again concentrating on that area. You may need to repeat the cleaning process three or four times. To test, make a copy after each cleaning attempt.

Cleaning the machine's printer platen

A CAUTION

Be sure to unplug the machine from the electrical socket before cleaning the printer platen.

- 1 Using both hands, use the finger holds on both sides of the machine to lift the scanner cover until it locks securely into the open position.
- Clean the machine's printer platen (1) and the area around it, wiping off any scattered ink with a soft, dry, lint-free cloth.




Cleaning the paper feed roller

If the paper feed rollers are stained with ink, it may cause paper feed or duplex copy problems.

Unplug the machine from the electrical socket and if the paper support flap is open, close it, and then close the paper support. Pull the paper trays completely out of the machine.




Do not use the machine again until the rollers are dry. Using the machine before the rollers are dry may cause paper feed or duplex copy problems.

Cleaning the paper pick-up roller

- Use a dry, soft, lint free cloth to dry the rollers, using a side-to-side motion. Slowly turn the rollers so that the whole surface is dried.
- 6 Close the Inner Rear Cover and the Outer Rear Cover. Make sure the cover is closed correctly.

- Put the paper trays firmly back in the machine.
- 8 Re-connect the power cord.
- Do not use the machine again until the rollers are dry.

Cleaning the print head

To maintain print quality, the machine will automatically clean the print head. You can start the cleaning process manually if there is a print quality problem.

Clean the print head and ink cartridges if you get a horizontal line or blank text in the text or graphics on your printed pages. You can clean Black only, three colours at a time (Cyan/Yellow/Magenta), or all four colours at once.

Cleaning the print head consumes ink. Cleaning too often uses ink unnecessarily.

! IMPORTANT

DO NOT touch the print head. Touching the print head may cause permanent damage and may void the print head's warranty.

- 1 Press
- Press Cleaning.
- 3 Press Black, Color or All.
 The machine cleans the print head.
 When cleaning is finished, the machine will go back to the Ready screen automatically.



If you clean the print head at least five times and the print has not improved, try installing a new genuine Brother Branded replacement cartridge for each problem colour. Try cleaning the print head again up to five more times. If the print has not improved call your Brother dealer.

Checking the print quality

If faded or streaked colours and text appear on your output, some of the nozzles may be clogged. You can check this by printing the Print Quality Check Sheet and looking at the nozzle check pattern.

- 1 Press III
- 2 Press Test Print.
- Open Print Quality.
- Press Colour Start.
 The machine begins printing the Print Quality Check Sheet.
- Check the quality of the four colour blocks on the sheet.
- 6 The LCD asks you if the print quality is OK.

- If all lines are clear and visible, press Yes to finish the Print Quality check and go to step .
- If you can see missing short lines as shown below, press No.

After replacing the ink cartridge, check the print quality. If the problem still exists, repeat the cleaning and test print procedures at least five times for the new ink cartridge. If ink is still missing, call your Brother dealer.

! IMPORTANT

DO NOT touch the print head. Touching the print head may cause permanent damage and may void the print head's warranty.




It is important to allow the machine to 'park' the print head after a print job. Listen carefully to the machine before unplugging it to make sure that all mechanical noise has stopped. Not allowing the machine to finish this parking process may lead to print problems and possible damage to the print head.





- If you are not able to find the green protective part, DO NOT remove the ink cartridges before shipping. Shipping without them will cause damage to your machine and may void your warranty. When travelling with the ink cartridges still in the machine please keep the machine upright as this will protect the machine from leakage.

Glossary

This is a comprehensive list of features and terms that appear in Brother manuals. Availability of these features depends on the model you purchased.

ADF (automatic document feeder)

The document can be placed in the ADF and scanned one page at a time automatically.

Auto Reduction

Reduces the size of incoming faxes.

Automatic fax transmission

Sending a fax without picking up the handset of an external telephone.

Automatic Redial

A feature that enables your machine to redial the last fax number after five minutes if the fax did not go through because the line was busy.

Backup Print

Your machine prints a copy of every fax that is received and stored in memory. This is a safety feature so you will not lose messages during a power failure.

Batch Transmission

(Black and white faxes only) As a cost saving feature, all delayed faxes to the same fax number can be sent as one transmission.

Beeper Volume

Volume setting for the beep when you press a key or make an error.

Brightness

Changing the Brightness makes the whole image lighter or darker.

Broadcasting

The ability to send the same fax message to more than one location.

Caller ID

A service purchased from the telephone company that lets you see the number (or name) of the party calling you.

CNG tones

The special tones (beeps) sent by fax machines during automatic transmission to tell the receiving machine that a fax machine is calling.

Coding method

Method of coding the information contained in the document. All fax machines must use a minimum standard of Modified Huffman (MH). Your machine is capable of greater compression methods, Modified Read (MR), Modified Modified Read (MMR) and JPEG, if the receiving machine has the same capability.

Colour Enhancement

Adjusts the colour in the image for better print quality by improving sharpness, white balance and colour density.

Communication error (Comm. Error)

An error during fax sending or receiving, usually caused by line noise or static.

Compatibility group

The ability of one fax unit to communicate with another. Compatibility is assured between ITU-T Groups.

Contrast

Setting to compensate for dark or light documents, by making faxes or copies of dark documents lighter and light documents darker.

Delayed Fax

Sends your fax at a specified time later.

Dual Access

Your machine can scan outgoing faxes or scheduled jobs into memory at the same time it is sending a fax from memory or receiving or printing an incoming fax.

ECM (Error Correction Mode)

Detects errors during fax transmission and resends the pages of the fax that had an error.

Extension telephone

A telephone using the same line as your fax but plugged into a separate wall socket.

External telephone

A TAD (telephone answering device) or telephone that is connected to your machine.

F/T Ring Time

The length of time that the Brother machine rings (when the Receive Mode setting is Fax/Tel) to notify you to pick up a voice call that it answered.

FaxAbility (New Zealand Only)

A subscriber service purchased from the telephone company that provides another phone number on an existing phone line. The Brother fax machine uses the new number to simulate a dedicated fax line.

Fax Detect

Enables your machine to respond to CNG tones if you interrupt a fax call by answering it.

Fax Forwarding

Sends a fax received into the memory to another pre-programmed fax number.

Fax Journal

Lists information about the last 200 incoming and outgoing faxes. TX means Transmit. RX means Receive.

Fax Preview

If you choose Fax Preview you will be able to view received faxes on the LCD by pressing the ${\tt Fax}$ ${\tt Preview}$ button on the LCD.

Fax Storage

You can store received faxes in memory.

Fax tones

The signals sent by sending and receiving fax machines while communicating information.

Fax/Tel

You can receive faxes and telephone calls. Do not use this mode if you are using a telephone answering device (TAD).

Fine resolution

Resolution is 203×196 dpi. It is used for small print and graphs.

Greyscale

The shades of grey available for copying, scanning and faxing photographs.

Group number

A combination of One Touch and Speed Dial numbers that are stored on a One Touch key or in a Speed Dial location for Broadcasting.

Help list

A printout of the complete Menu table that you can use to program your machine when you do not have the User's Guide with you.

Innobella™

Journal Period

The pre-programmed time period between automatically printed Fax Journal Reports. You can print the Fax Journal on demand without interrupting the cycle.

LCD (liquid crystal display)

The display screen on the machine that shows interactive messages during On-Screen Programming and shows the date and time when the machine is idle.

Manual fax

When you lift the handset of your external telephone you can hear the receiving fax machine answer before you press

Mono Start or Colour Start to begin sending the fax.

Menu mode

Programming mode for changing your machine's settings.

OCR (optical character recognition)

The bundled ScanSoft™ PaperPort™ 11SE with OCR or Presto! PageManager software application converts an image of text to text you can edit.

One Touch

Keys on the machine's control panel where you can store numbers for easy dialling. You can store a second number on each key if you hold down **Shift** as you press the One Touch key.

Out of Paper Reception

Receives faxes into the machine's memory when the machine is out of paper.

Overseas Mode

Makes temporary changes to the fax tones to accommodate noise and static on overseas telephone lines.

Pause

Allows you to place a 3.5 second delay in the dialling sequence while you are dialling using the dial pad or while you are storing One Touch and Speed Dial numbers. Press the **Redial/Pause** key on the control panel or the Pause button on the LCD as many times as needed for longer pauses.

When memory is full, you can send faxes in real time.

Remaining jobs

You can check which jobs are waiting in memory and cancel jobs individually.

Remote Access Code

Your own four-digit code (---*) that allows you to call and access your machine from a remote location.

Remote Activation Code

Press this code (* **5 1** (* **9 1** for New Zealand)) when you answer a fax call on an extension or external telephone.

Remote Deactivation Code (For Fax/Tel mode only)

When the machine answers a voice call, it pseudo/double-rings. You can pick up at an extension telephone by pressing this code (# 5 1 (# 9 1 for New Zealand)).

Remote Retrieval Access

The ability to access your machine remotely from a touch tone telephone.

Resolution
