



O Main body (front panel)





1 POWER (STANDBY/ON) button

Use to power the device on/off if AC power supply is connected.

- 2 Disc tray
- **③ OPEN/CLOSE Tray button**

) operation can be selected with this button.

6 JOG-Ring


Use to wind currently being played disc, or to playback rapidly in clockwise. And use to rewind currently being played disc, or to playback back rapidly in counter-clockwise.

In Pause mode, rotating this jog ring make screen advance frame by frame.

7 Operation Display Window

Display operation of device. For more information, see "Operation Display Window" in the next page.

1 Recognised DISC TYPE indicator

DVD, SVCD, VCD, CDDA, MP3

2 DISC LOAD/PLAY indicator

This indicator is lighted up after recognizing disc.

③ PLAY/PAUSE indicator

Use to copy contents of disc into videotape.

4 VOLUME button

Size of this button is changed with every press.

(5) VCD2.0/SVCD PBC indicator

This indicator is lighted up in selecting PBC ON while this indicator disappears in selecting PBC OFF.

6 DVD TITLE indicator

This indicator is lighted up if title number is displayed in playing DVD.

7 TRACK/CHAPTER indicator

This indicator is lighted up if Chapter(DVD) or track(VCD / SVCD / CDDA / MP3) number is displayed.

8 REPEAT MODE indicator

REPEAT 1: In case you want to repeat and play a chapter or track

REPEAT ALL: In case you want to repeat and play a title or disc

REPEAT A-: In case you want to set "A-Repeat" REPEAT A-B: In case you want to set "A-B Repeat"

9 PARENTAL LIMIT indicator

This indicator is lighted up if parental limit in "Select Function" menu is set items except "8 ADULT(RELEASE)". This indicator disappears in setting the parental limit to "8 ADULT(RELEASE)".

11 DVD AUDIO STREAM indicator

12 NUMBER/CHARACTER indicator


13 3D SOUND indicator

To enjoy sound quality of theatre level in home, connect this jack with amp or unit embedded with digital audio decoder.

② 5.1 CHANNEL ANALOG AUDIO OUT Jack

For Dolby digital and dts, total 6 channels are used; 3 channels for the front panel, 2 channels for surround, and 1 channel for subwoofer.

These channels are located in right, left, centre of front panel for 3 channels, right and left of rear panel for 2 channels, and centre of front panel for a channel. L and R means left side and right side respectively, CENTRE means central side, and SUB means subwoofer.





DVD Playback

Press [& STANDBY] button to power on.



Press [OPEN/CLOSE] button to open the disc tray.


Place a disc firmly on the disc tray, making its label look upward.

Insert the disc and press [OPEN/CLOSE] button to close the tray.

The disc tray is closed and after checking the disc's condition, Playback or Stop function starts to operate.



To playback it, press [►PLAY] button. • In the case of DVD, DVD menus and titles are displayed on TV screen.

- In the case of S-VCD and VCD2.0
 the menus are displayed on TV screen and it is converted into PBC(Playback Back Control) mode.
- In the case of CD, VCD1.1 and MP3, the disc plays in order of its track numbers.



To stop it, press [■] button.

For pause, press [PAUSE/STEP] button. If you press this button once more, it makes playback advance frame by frame.

Press [OPEN/CLOSE] button to remove the disc.

■ If you want still picture,

press [PAUSE/STEP] in Playback mode. You can watch the desired screen in stop status.

■ If you want slow-motion playback,

press [►►] or [◄◄] button in Pause mode.
You can watch the desired screen in the forward or backward direction.

■ If you want to watch a series of screens one by one (FRAME ADVANCE)

press [PAUSE/STEP] button or rotate Jog Ring in Pause mode. Each time you press this button, the picture advances one frame.





Select Dual Mono.

Dual Mono means 2 individual mono channels. Dual Mono is mainly used to apply 2 different languages to one program. This function is similar to multichannel sound function supported in TV or VCR. 2 mono channels can be combined into total 4 values; STEREO, LEFT MONO, RIGHT MONO and MIXED MONO.



- STEREO: outputs left channel and right channel to left speaker and right speaker respectively.
- LEFT MONO: outputs left channel to left speaker and right speaker.
- RIGHT MONO: outputs right channel to left speaker and right speaker.
- MIXED MONO: mixes 2 mono channels and outputs the mixed channel to left and right speaker at the same time.



Select a Dynamic Range.

Dynamic range can differ by users and their watching environment. High-density audio programs like movies have wide dynamic range. In the dynamic range, explosion sounds 20dB higher and rustle of leaves sounds 50dB less than conversation. Sometimes, depending on watching environment, loud sound should be heard louder while soft sound should be heard softer. Likewise, very soft sound is not audible and viewers should raise the sound level.

Set "OFF" to view a program in the dynamic range as recorded in disc. If you hear loud sound softer and soft sound louder, set a suitable value below "MAX".



SPEAKER Setup

A user may set each speakers sound.



Terms related with DVD

DVD A DVD (abbreviation of Digital Versatile Disc or Digital Video Disc) can include 135 minutes of video

information. And for audio, it can hold up to 8 kinds of languages and 32 kinds of subtitle languages. By using MPEG-2 video compression and digital 3D surround sound, DVD realizes high-defined screen and

quality sound like a movie theater.

CDDA A CDDA (abbreviation of Compact disc digital audio) is a music disc that is currently used.

MP3 (abbreviation of MPEG-1 Audio Layer 3) sizes up with a small file and supports CD quality sound.

PBC By creating menus in a simple video CD, it enables a user to communicate with a CD. Also PBC is

adopted in VCD2.0, SVCD and CVD.

CHAPTER It means the information recorded in a DVD. A title in a DVD is divided into many tracks, of which a

track is called as a chapter. A certain scene of a screen can be guickly searched with the chapter number.

TITLE It means the information recorded in a DVD. A DVD can be divided into may titles.

TRACK It means the information recorded in a video CD and audio CD. A disc consists of many a track, for

which a user can search a certain position.

dts (Digital Theatre System) is the standard of surround sound for 5.1 CH which are being widely adopted

in films.

Multi Angle A certain DVD has scenes recorded in various angles. Also the disc is called as Multi Angle Disc.

PCM PCM (Pulse Code Modulation) means digital sound.

Dolby digital Dolby digital is a system maximized surround sound from the reform of the existing 4 CHPROLOGIC.

Basically the system consists of 5 channels of a centre speaker, L & R speakers and L & R front main speakers. Dolby digital adds a sub-speaker to the above system in order to reinforce sub-woofer.

Dolby digital 5.1 channel

Dolby digital 5.1 CH is the system to output 5.1 CH analogue from decoding in DVD player itself and

can be used with the connection of amplifier holding a 5.1 CH analogue terminal.

Bitstream Bitstream is the Dolby digital; or audio data to be decoded by dts decoder. Dolby digital or dts decorder

embedded AMP is necessary for using Bitstream.

L/R/C/SW/LS/RS

6 channels are using in Dolby digital and dts. They are 3 channels for the front screen, 2 channels for surround and 1 subwoofer. The front left speaker is referred as L, right speaker as R, centre speaker as C, subwoofer as SW, left surround speaker as LS, right speaker as RS.

*L/R of 6CH output like upper case is displayed as Lo/Ro.

Downmix

Downmix is the technology for playing proper audio in case the recorded audio channel construction and that of output channel does not match each other. Downmix will provide 5.1 channel-audio by using 2 stereo speakers.

S-VIDEO

S-VIDEO offers clearer and sharper screen than COMPOSITE by separately-transmitting the signal of color(C) and brightness(Y).
