# Discs that can be played



### \*DVD-F61 is not compatible with WMA, JPEG, or HighMAT. References to them apply only to DVD-F65.

Use discs with the above logos and that conform to specifications. The unit cannot play other discs correctly. Do not use irregularly shaped discs (e.g. heart-shaped), as these can damage the unit.

It may not be possible to play CD-R, CD-RW, DVD-R and DVD-RAM in all cases due to the type of disc or condition of the recording.

# Discs that cannot be played

DVD-ROM, CD-ROM, CDV, CD-G, +RW, DVD-RW, CVD, SACD, Divx Video Discs, Photo CD, DVD-RAM that cannot be removed from their cartridge, 2.6-GB and 5.2-GB DVD-RAM, and "Chaoji VCD" available on the market including CVD, DVCD and SVCD that do not conform to IEC62107.

# Built-in decoders

DOLBY DIGITAL

This unit has Dolby Digital and DTS decoders so you can enjoy these systems in stereo without connecting a separate decoder.



#### Video systems Units for Asia, Australia and N.Z.:

- This unit can play PAL and NTSC, but your television must match the system used on the disc.
- PAL discs cannot be correctly viewed on an NTSC television.
- This unit can convert NTSC signals to PAL 60 for viewing on a PAL television (→ page 18, Video—NTSC Disc Output).
- •Output is interlace (576I) when playing PAL discs.

#### Units for the U.S.A. and Canada:

NTSC is used. This unit converts still pictures on PAL system DVD-Audio discs for play on NTSC video systems. The picture is compressed to show it in its entirety, but this may cause it to be stretched vertically.

# Playing DVDs and Video CDs

The producer of these discs can control how they are played so you may not always be able to control play as described in these operating instructions (for example if the play time is not displayed or if a Video CD has menus). Read the disc's instructions carefully.

# DVD-RAM discs

The DVD-RAM you can play on this unit are those recorded with DVD video recorders, DVD video cameras, personal computers, etc. using Version 1.1 of the Video Recording Format (a unified video recording standard).

- •Remove discs from their cartridges before use and return them when you are finished, making sure that the labels of the disc and cartridge face the same way.
- ·Some parts of the disc, for example where one program ends and another begins, may not play smoothly.

# DVD-R discs

Panasonic DVD-R recorded and finalized on a Panasonic DVD video recorder or DVD video camera are played as DVD-Video on this unit.

# CD-R and CD-RW discs

This unit can play CD-R/RW (audio recording disc) recorded with CD-DA, video CD, SVCD (conforming to IEC62107), WMA, MP3, or JPEG. Close the session or finalize after recording.

See page 11 for more information about WMA, MP3, and JPEG.

# HighMAT discs

This unit is compatible with HighMAT discs containing WMA, MP3, and/or JPEG files.

# Disc structure

Disc structure and the labels given to the items on discs depend on the disc type.

- Track: the smallest division on DVD-Audio, CDs, and Video CDs, or a single WMA/MP3 file.
- Chapter: the smallest division on DVD-Video.
- collections of tracks on DVD-Audio and equivalent to folders or Group: albums on data discs.
- Title: the largest division on DVD-Video, usually an entire movie.
- Program: the division on DVD-RAM equivalent to a single recording. Picture: a single JPEG file.
- Play list: the largest grouping on a HighMAT disc, or a group of scenes on DVD-RAM.
- DVD-RAM program sections specified and grouped into play Scene: lists on a DVD video recorder.

Content: covers tracks and pictures on HighMAT discs.

### To clean discs

DVD-Audio, DVD-Video, Video CD, CD Wipe with a damp cloth and then wipe drv.

### DVD-RAM, DVD-R

- •Clean only with an optional DVD-RAM/PD disc cleaner (LF-K200DCA1, where available).
- •Never use cloths or cleaners for CDs etc.

# Handling precautions

•Do not write on the label side with a ball-point pen or other writing instrument.

- Do not use record cleaning sprays, benzine, thinner, static electricity prevention liquids or any other solvent.

The QUICK SETUP screen appears when you press [SETUP] the firs time after purchase and assists you to make necessary settings. Preparation

Turn on the television and select the appropriate video input on the television to suit the connections for the player.

# TV Aspect

Select "4:3" (regular) or "16:9" (widescreen) to suit your television. If you have a regular 4:3 television, you can also select how video on some discs is shown (→ page 18, Video—TV Aspect).

•4:3 Pan&Scan (Factory preset)

Widescreen software is expanded to fill the screen of a 4:3 aspect television (unless prohibited by the producer of the disc).

#### •4:3 Letterbox

Widescreen software is shown in the letterbox style on a 4:3 aspect television.

Press [RETURN].

- Connect to the component video input terminals on a 480P compatible television. (Video will not be displayed correctly if connected to an incompatible television.)
- 2. In QUICK SETUP, set "Progressive Out" to "Enable".
- 3. Change Video output mode to "480P" ( $\rightarrow$  page 17).
- •All televisions manufactured by Panasonic and that have 480P input connectors are compatible. Consult the manufacturer if you have another brand of television.
- •If the unit is connected to the television through VIDEO OUT or S VIDEO OUT, output will be interlace, irrespective of the settings.

# **Basic play**



#### Preparation

Turn on the television and select the appropriate video input on the television to suit the connections for the player.

# **Press** $[\oplus]$ to turn on the unit.

# 2 Press [▲] to open the drawer and place the disc(s) label-up on the disc trav(s).

To load discs on the other trays, press [DISC SKIP] on the main unit.

# •If the disc contains both audio data

(WMA and MP3) and JPEG, check "Mixed Disc—Audio & Stills" setting in the SETUP menu (→ page 18). Select "Stills (JPEG)" or "Audio (MP3/WMA)".

 Load double-sided discs so the label for the side you want to play is facing up.

3 Press [▲] to close the drawer.

A disc indicator lights to show a disc is on the tray.

# Press [▶] (PLAY).

Play begins. It is normal for sound and pictures to take time to start.

Slow- motion	While paused, press [◀◀] (backward) or [▶▶] (forward). Press [▶] (PLAY) to restart.

### Notes

 On the main unit, press [I<</li>

- •The speed of search and slow-motion increases up to 5 steps.
- •Slow-motion and frame-by-frame only work on moving pictures.
- •You can turn off the sound during search (→ page 18, Audio— Audio during Search).

#### When playing Video CDs

- •You cannot move backwards during slow-motion and frame-byframe.
- Pressing buttons to perform skip, search or slow-motion may take you to a menu screen.

### $\bullet$ If " $\bigcirc$ " appears on the television

- The operation is prohibited by the unit or disc.
- ●Discs continue to rotate while menus are displayed even after playing an item. Press when you finish to preserve the unit's motor and your television screen.

#### To prevent damage

- Do not;
  - -load more than one disc per tray.
  - -touch the drawer or the carousel while they are in motion
  - -rotate the carousel by hand.

#### Playing bonus groups

Some discs contain bonus groups. If a password screen appears after selecting a group, enter the password with the numbered buttons. Refer also to the disc's jacket.

# Glossary

#### Bitstream

The digital form of multi-channel data (e.g. 5.1 channel) before decoding.

#### Decoder

A decoder restores coded audio signals on DVDs to normal

#### Dolby Digital

This is a method of coding digital signals developed by Dolby Laboratories. Apart from stereo (2-channel) audio, these signals can also be multi-channel audio. A large amount of audio information can be recorded on one disc using this method

#### **Dolby Pro Logic**

A surround system where a 4-channel audio track is recorded as 2 channels and then is restored to 4 channels for play. The surround channel is monaural and can reproduce up to 7 kHz

#### DTS (Digital Theater Systems)

This surround system is used in many movie theaters around the world. There is good separation between the channels, so realistic sound effects are possible.

### Dynamic range

Dynamic range is the difference between the lowest level of sound that can be heard above the noise of the equipment and the highest level of sound before distortion occurs.

### Film and video

DVD-Videos are recorded using either film or video. Usually, film is recorded at 24 frames per second, the rate movies are filmed at, while video is recorded at 30 frames per second.

## Frame still and field still

Frames are the still pictures that make moving pictures. About thirty are shown each second. A frame still may appear blurred but overall quality is high

Two fields appear alternately to make up one frame. A field still is not blurred but picture quality is lower.

### Interlace and progressive output

NTSC, the video signal standard, has 480 interlaced (I) scan lines, whereas progressive scanning uses twice the number of scan lines. This is called 480P.

## I/P/B

MPEG 2, the video compression standard adopted for use with DVD-Video, codes frames using these 3 picture types.

- I: Intra coded picture
  - This picture has the best quality and is the best to use when adjusting the picture.
- P: Predictive coded picture This picture is calculated based on past I or P-pictures.
- Bidirectionally-predictive coded picture B: This picture is calculated by comparing past and future I and P-pictures so it has the lowest volume of information.

#### Linear PCM (pulse code modulation)

These are uncompressed digital signals, similar to those found on CDs.
