# (For United Kingdom)

("EB" area code model only)

For your safety, please read the following text carefully. This appliance is supplied with a moulded three pin mains plug for your safety and convenience. A 5-ampere fuse is fitted in this plug.

Should the fuse need to be replaced please ensure that the replacement fuse has a rating of 5-ampere and that it is approved by ASTA or BSI to BS1362.

Check for the ASTA mark ♠ or the BSI mark ♥ on the body of the fuse.

If the plug contains a removable fuse cover you must ensure that it is refitted when the fuse is replaced. If you lose the fuse cover the plug must not be used until a replacement cover is obtained. A replacement fuse cover can be purchased from your local dealer.

#### CAUTION!

IF THE FITTED MOULDED PLUG IS UNSUITABLE FOR THE SOCKET OUTLET IN YOUR HOME THEN THE FUSE SHOULD BE REMOVED AND THE PLUG CUT OFF AND DISPOSED OF SAFELY. THERE IS A DANGER OF SEVERE ELECTRICAL SHOCK IF THE CUT OFF PLUG IS INSERTED INTO ANY 13-AMPERE SOCKET.

If a new plug is to be fitted please observe the wiring code as stated below. If in any doubt please consult a qualified electrician.

As these colours may not correspond with the coloured markings identifying the terminals in your plug, proceed as follows:

The wire which is coloured Blue must be connected to the terminal which is marked with the letter N or coloured Black or Blue.

The wire which is coloured Brown must be connected to the terminal which is marked with the letter L or coloured Brown or Red.

WARNING: DO NOT CONNECT EITHER WIRE TO THE EARTH TERMINAL WHICH IS MARKED WITH THE LETTER E. BY THE EARTH SYMBOL \(\precedut\) OR COLOURED GREEN OR GREEN/ YELLOW.



#### How to replace the fuse


The location of the fuse differ according to the type of AC mains plug (figures A and B). Confirm the AC mains plug fitted and follow the instructions below.

Illustrations may differ from actual AC mains plug.

1. Open the fuse cover with a screwdriver.



2. Replace the fuse and close or attach the fuse



- This unit is compatible with multi-session but if there are a lot of sessions it takes more time for play
  to start. Keep the number of sessions to a minimum to avoid this.





#### To clean discs

Wipe with a damp cloth and then wipe dry.

#### Disc handling precautions

- Do not attach labels or stickers to discs (This may cause disc warping, rendering it unusable).
- Do not write on the label side with a ball-point pen or other writing instrument.
- Do not use record cleaning sprays, benzine, thinner, static electricity prevention liquids or any other solvent.
- Do not use scratch-proof protectors or covers.
- Do not drop stack, or impact discs. Do not place objects on them.
- To protect discs from scratches and dirt, return them to their cases or cartridges when you are not using them.
- Do not use the following discs:
  - Discs with exposed adhesive from removed stickers or labels (rented discs etc).
  - Discs that are badly warped or cracked.
  - Irregularly shaped discs, such as heart shapes.



# Troubleshooting guide

Before requesting service, make the following checks. If you are in doubt about some of the check points, or if the solutions indicated in the chart do not solve the problem, consult your dealer for instructions. (Reference pages are shown in parentheses.)

#### The following do not indicate malfunction.

- Sound from the AC adaptor during recharging.
- The battery pack warming up when recharging or during use.
- The surface and area around the unit becoming warm when used for long periods.

#### Power

#### No power

- Check connections to the AC adaptor or battery pack. (8)
- The unit has protection circuitry that is activated if it becomes too hot or too cold. The unit will not work if this occurs. Use the unit between 5 °C and 35 °C.

#### Unit turns off automatically.

 The unit turns off after it has been stopped for about 15 minutes (5 minutes when the unit is powered by the battery pack) to conserve power. Turn the unit on again.

Cannot charge or the [CHG] indicator fails to light.

- The battery pack can only be recharged when the unit is off.
- The charging time increases when the temperature is too hot or too cold, and charging may not be possible under some circumstances.
- Check connections to the AC adaptor or battery pack. (8)
- Play time dramatically reduced after recharging.
- Difficulty inserting the plug or the plug is loose when connecting Car DC Adaptor.
- The battery pack has reached the end of its service life (It can be recharged about 300 times).

## No operation
