

6 Introduction

Welcome!

This Digital Video Disc Player will allow you to enjoy better picture quality, clearer sound, and endless playback features on Digital Video Discs (DVDs). Expanding technology allows you to add options to your viewing - watch a director's cut of a movie, listen to the producer's comments, or play your favorite scene repeatedly. Hear a movie in different languages, or listen only to the soundtrack. The possibilities are limited only by your choices and the materials available on the DVD.

We hope you enjoy this DVD Player and learn to use its features. To get the most from the DVD Player, read this manual carefully. It will describe how you can access these features.

Environmental Information


Your system has materials that can be recycled and reused if disassembled by a specialized company. Please observe the local regulations regarding the disposal of packaging materials, exhausted batteries, and old equipment.

Safety Information

- Do not expose the system to excessive moisture, rain, sand, heat, or humidity.
- Place the DVD Player on a firm, flat surface.
- Keep the DVD Player away from domestic heating equipment and direct sunlight.
- When placing the DVD Player in a cabinet, allow about one inch of space all around the DVD Player for ventilation. Leave enough room in front of the DVD Player for the disc tray to open completely.
- If the DVD Player is brought directly from a cold to a warm location, or is placed in a very damp room, moisture may condense on the lens inside the DVD Player. If this occurs, the DVD Player will not operate normally. Leave the power on for about one hour with no disc in the DVD Player until normal playback is possible.
- The mechanical parts of the Player contain self-lubricating bearings and must not be oiled or lubricated.
- When the DVD Player is turned off, it is still consuming some power. To disconnect the system from the power supply completely, remove the AC power plug from the power outlet.
- Always keep the disc tray closed to avoid dust on the lens.

Cleaning Discs

- When a Disc becomes dirty, clean it with a cleaning cloth. Wipe the Disc from the center to the edge in a straight line. Do not wipe the Disc in a circular pattern.



- Do not use solvents such as benzene, thinner, commercially available cleaners, or anti-static spray intended for analog discs.

Playable Discs

This DVD Player will play various types of Discs. Look for these logos on your Discs to determine whether the Disc will play on this Player.



DVD (Digital Video Disc)



Audio CD (Compact Disc Digital Audio)



Video CD and Super Video CD



CD-R (CD-Recordable) and CD-RW (CD-Rewritable)
Finalize CD-Rs when you record them. Otherwise, you cannot play them on this Player.



DVD+R (DVD + Recordable) and DVD+RW (DVD + Rewritable)
Finalize these Discs when you record them. Otherwise, you cannot play them on this DVD Player.

Region Codes and Color Systems

DVDs must meet the requirements for Region Codes and Color Systems before you can use them with the DVD Player. DVDs must be labeled for **ALL regions or for Region 1** in order to play on this DVD Player. You cannot play Discs that are labeled for other regions. These symbols must appear on your DVDs, or you cannot play the DVD in this Player.



The number inside the globe refers to a region of the world. Region 1 represents the United States, Canada, upper regions of North America, Bermuda, the U.S. Virgin Islands, and small regions near Australia.

Furthermore, recordings are made according to different color systems throughout the world. The most common color systems are NTSC (which is used primarily in the United States and North America), PAL, and SECAM.

This DVD Player is compatible with **NTSC and PAL**. Make sure the Discs you play were recorded in NTSC or PAL and your TV is NTSC or PAL compatible. You must set the DVD Player's TV TYPE to match your TV and your DVDs. *Details are on page 38.* The color system of the DVD may appear on the DVD or on the Disc case.


DVD Player Upgrades

If a DVD does not play properly, please contact Philips at 1-800-531-0039 for assistance. Due to the inconsistency of Disc formats provided by various Disc manufacturers, your DVD Player may require a playability enhancement. As DVD technology has advanced, these enhancements have become both common and easy to complete.

8 General Information

Battery Installation

- 1 Remove the battery compartment lid** on the rear of the remote control by pressing in the tab, then lifting off the lid.
- 2 Place two AA batteries inside the battery compartment with their + and – ends aligned as indicated.** Do not mix old and new batteries or different types of batteries (standard, alkaline, etc.).
- 3 Replace the battery compartment lid.**



Using the Remote Control

When using the remote control to operate the DVD Player, aim the remote toward the front of the Player (not toward the TV). This remote may operate some features of your television. When using the remote to work the TV, aim the remote at the TV. *Details about TV operations are on pages 17 and 44-45.*

DVD Disc Menus...

Some explanations in this manual describe the DVD Disc Menus, which vary among DVDs. Movie producers set these menus, and not all DVDs have menus. If the DVD has a menu, access the Disc Menu by pressing the DISC MENU button on the remote control. *Details are on page 20.*

DVD Player Menus...

Some instructions explain how to use the DVD Player's Setup menu to set features of the Player or the Disc. You get to the Setup Menu by pressing SYSTEM MENU on the remote control. Even if a feature is set in the Player's menu, it will not be available if the current Disc does not include that feature.

Available Disc Features...

Features in this manual may not be available on every Disc. If the feature is not available, you cannot use the DVD Player to make the feature available. The \emptyset will appear in the top left corner of the TV screen if you try to access a feature that is not available. For example, the feature may not be available at the present time. Some features are only available during playback, while other items can be accessed only when play is stopped. Try stopping or starting playback, then try the feature again.

Determining the best possible connection...

The capabilities of your existing equipment, especially your TV, will determine your connection possibilities. However, the following guidelines describe which options provide the best picture and sound quality.

- ★★★★ Component Video provides the best picture quality. *Details are on page 13.*
If your TV accepts Progressive Scan through the Component Video connection, set PROGRESSIVE to ON at the Player. *Details are on page 38.*
- ★★★ S-Video provides excellent picture quality. *Details are on page 12.*
- ★★ Composite Video (a yellow Video jack) provides good picture quality. *Details are on page 11.*
- ★★ **Your TV may have only an RF-style jack, usually labeled Antenna In or 75 ohm or RF In. You will need an RF modulator in order to view the DVD Player at your TV.**
Details are on page 10.

- ★★★★ Digital audio connections provide the clearest sound, but you must have a digital stereo receiver. Connect the DVD Player's COAXIAL or OPTICAL digital audio out jack to your Stereo for the best sound quality. *Details are on page 15.*
- ★★★ If digital connections are not possible, connect the DVD Player's red and white AUDIO OUT jacks to the Audio In jacks of your Stereo, TV, or RF modulator. *Details are on pages 10-14.*

Before you begin...

- Refer to the manuals of your TV, Stereo, or other equipment as necessary. Note the style of jacks and connectors on the other equipment. Determine how to choose different Audio and Video In channels/sources on your other equipment so you can see and hear the DVD Player on the TV, Stereo, etc.
- Disconnect all equipment from the power outlets. Connect the equipment to the power outlets only after you have finished hooking up everything. Never make or change connections with equipment connected to the power outlet.


Remember...

- Connect the DVD Player directly to the TV. For example, do not connect the DVD Player to a VCR, then connect the VCR to a TV. This type of connection may distort the picture and sound. Also, your VCR might have the copy protection system, which could distort the DVD image or prevent playback of some Discs.
- Set the TV to the correct Video In channel. Such channels may be called AUX or AUXILIARY IN, AUDIO/VIDEO or A/V IN, EXT1 or EXT2 or External In, etc. These channels are often near channel 00. See your TV manual for details. Go to your lowest TV channel (01 or 02) and change TV channels downward until you see the DVD screen saver on the TV. Or, your TV's remote may have a button or switch that selects Video In channels. Check your TV manual for details.
If you are using an RF modulator, set the TV to channel 3 or 4.
- Set the Stereo to the correct channel or "source" mode.
- Do not connect the DVD Player's AUDIO OUT jacks to the PHONO IN jack of your Stereo.
- You only need one audio connection and one video connection between the DVD Player and your TV and/or Stereo. So, you will not use all the jacks on the DVD Player.



10 Hookups (cont'd)


Connecting to a TV Only TV has only a single Antenna In or RF In jack




Before you begin, make sure you have an RF modulator and extra RF coaxial cables. These are not supplied with the Player, but are available from Philips or most consumer electronics retailers.

- 1** Connect the supplied video cable (which has yellow markings) to the Player's yellow VIDEO (VIDEO OUT) jack. Connect the other end of the cable to the VIDEO IN jack on the RF modulator. The VIDEO IN jack on the RF modulator is usually yellow and might be labelled VIDEO, CVBS, COMPOSITE, or BASEBAND.
- 2** Connect the supplied audio cable (which has red and white markings) to the Player's AUDIO OUT (left and right) jacks. Connect the other ends of the audio cable to the AUDIO IN jacks on the RF modulator. Audio jacks on the RF modulator usually are red (right) and white (left). Match the cable colors to the jack colors.
- 3** You probably already have an Antenna or Cable TV signal connected to the ANTENNA IN jack on your TV. **Disconnect it now from the TV. Reconnect the Antenna or Cable TV signal to the ANTENNA IN jack on your RF modulator.**
- 4** Connect an RF coaxial cable (not supplied) to the RF OUT, ANTENNA OUT, or TO TV jack on the RF modulator. The RF OUT jack may be labelled differently among different brands. Refer to the instructions provided with your RF modulator. **Connect the other end of the same RF coaxial cable to the ANTENNA IN or RF IN jack on your Television.**
- 5** Your RF Modulator should have a Channel 3/4 switch. The setting of this switch determines the TV channel on which you will watch materials playing on the DVD Player. **Set the RF Modulator's Channel 3/4 switch to either 3 or 4, whichever TV channel is least used in your area.** If your RF modulator has a Modulator/Antenna switch, set it accordingly. Refer to the instructions that came with the RF Modulator.
- 6** Connect the power cords of all the equipment to a power outlet.
- 7** Turn on your TV and choose channel 3 or 4. Choose the same channel to which you set the RF Modulator's Channel 3/4 switch.
- 8** Turn on the DVD Player by pressing **STANDBY-ON** . You should see the Player's blue DVD screen on the TV.

Connecting to a TV Only TV has a yellow Video In jack




- 1** Connect the yellow **VIDEO (VIDEO OUT)** jack of the DVD Player to the corresponding **VIDEO IN** jack on your TV. Use the supplied video cable, which has yellow markings.
- 2** Connect the supplied audio cable to the red and white **AUDIO OUT** (left and right) jacks on the DVD Player and to the left/right **AUDIO IN** jacks on the TV. The supplied audio cables have red and white markings. Match the cable colors to the jack colors.
- 3** Plug the power cords of the DVD Player and the TV into an active power outlet. Press **STANDBY-ON**  on the front of the DVD Player to turn it on.
- 4** Turn on the TV. Set it to the correct Video In channel. See your TV owner's manual for details. Or, go to your lowest TV channel (01 or 02) and change channels downward until you see the DVD screen on the TV.


Helpful Hints

- On the TV, the Video In jack is usually yellow and might be labeled video, CVBS, composite, or baseband.
- If your TV has a single Audio In jack instead of separate left/right Audio In jacks, you will need a different audio cable. You need a "splitter" audio cable to go from the left/right AUDIO OUT jacks of the DVD Player to the single Audio In jack on your TV. See your electronics retailer for details.

12 Hookups (cont'd)

Connecting to a TV Only TV has an S-Video In Jack




- 1** Connect an S-Video cable (not supplied) to the S-VIDEO (VIDEO OUT) jack of the DVD Player and to the TV's S-VIDEO In jack.
- 2** Connect the supplied audio cable to the red and white AUDIO OUT (left and right) jacks on the DVD Player and to the left/right AUDIO IN jacks on the TV. The supplied audio cable has red and white markings. Match the cable colors to the jack colors.
- 3** Plug the power cords of the DVD Player and the TV into an active power outlet. Press **STANDBY-ON**  on the front of the DVD Player to turn it on.
- 4** Turn on the TV. Set it to the correct S-Video In channel. See your TV owner's manual for details. Or, go to your lowest TV channel (01 or 02) and change channels downward until you see the DVD screen on the TV.

Helpful Hints

- On the TV, the S-Video In jack may be labeled Y/C, S-Video, or S-VHS (super video).
- If your TV has a single Audio In jack instead of separate left/right Audio In jacks, you will need a different audio cable. You need a "splitter" audio cable to go from the left/right AUDIO OUT jacks of the DVD Player to the single Audio In jack on your TV. See your electronics retailer for details.

Connecting to a TV Only TV has Component Video In Jacks (red, green, and blue)




- 1** Connect the DVD Player's Y Pb Pr (VIDEO OUT) jacks to the corresponding **COMPONENT VIDEO IN** jacks on the TV. Use component video cables (not supplied). The Component Video jacks are red, green, and blue.
On your TV, you may have additional Component Video In jacks that are specifically labelled Progressive Scan. If you use these instead, set PROGRESSIVE to ON at the Player. (See step 5.)
- 2** Connect the DVD Player's red and white **AUDIO OUT** (left and right) jacks to the left/right **AUDIO IN** jacks on the TV. Use the supplied audio cables, which have red and white markings. Match the cable colors to the jack colors.
- 3** Plug the power cords of the DVD Player and the TV into an active power outlet. Press **STANDBY-ON** on the front of the DVD Player to turn it on.


- If you are playing a DVD, a Disc menu may appear. If the Title or Chapter selections are numbered, press a Number button to select an item. Or, press     to select an item, then press OK. Playback will begin. Or, follow the on-screen instructions as detailed in the DVD Disc menu.
- If you are playing an Audio CD, press PLAY  to start play.
- If a Video CD has Playback Control, press DISC MENU to access its menu while play is stopped. Or, press TITLE to see the menu during playback. 


If you press STOP  only once, play will resume at the same point if you press PLAY  later to restart play. This is known as the Resume feature.

Resume applies to the last five Discs. Press PLAY  immediately after inserting the Disc in the Player (while LOADING shows on the TV screen). RESUME PLAY will appear on the TV screen briefly. If you press STOP  more than once to stop playback, play will start at the beginning of the Disc again if you press PLAY  later to restart playback.



Remote sensor

This sensor receives the commands from the DVD Player's remote control. When using the Player's remote to operate the Player, point the remote here (not toward your TV).

Some DVDs are recorded in multiple languages; some may have extra audio options such as a director's commentary or a music soundtrack. You can choose the language or the soundtrack that you want to hear by adjusting AUDIO in PREFERENCE SETUP. To do so, follow the steps below. 
Not all DVDs are rated or coded by the Disc maker. You can specifically lock or unlock a DVD, regardless of its rating. If you lock a specific DVD, you must enter your password before you can watch the DVD. *Password details are on page 28.*

- Two-sided DVDs may have a different ID for each side. To unlock the entire Disc, unlock each side.
- Multi-volume Video CDs or DVD sets may have a different ID for each volume or Disc. To unlock the set, unlock each volume or Disc.
- Once you enter your password to play a Locked Disc, you can stop and resume playback without reentering the password every time you resume play. However, if you open the disc tray or turn off the DVD Player, you will have to enter the password to play the Disc again.

30 Parental Levels

You can set the Player to block or allow playback according to the DVD movie rating. Some DVDs may give you the option of entering your password to allow playback. If not, change the PARENTAL setting so you can watch the Disc.

Not all DVDs conform to the levels you select, as not all DVDs are coded or protected by the DVD manufacturer. Therefore, make sure the DVD plays according to your PARENTAL setting before you allow children unlimited access to the Player or DVDs.


This DVD Player can play some Compact Disc-Recordable (CD-R) discs that you record on your computer. These CD-Rs may contain pictures in a JPEG format or audio files/tracks in an MP3 format. For example, you may have photographic film developed by a retailer that places the pictures on a CD-R for you. These pictures may be in JPEG format. Or, you may copy or download MP3 music files from certain legal Internet sites, then copy those files onto a CD-R. (You cannot make or record such CD-Rs using this DVD Player. See your computer manual for details on making CD-R recordings.)

If you are playing a CD-R on this Player and the CD-R contains JPEG or MP3 files, you may want to access the CD-R menu using Navigator.

- 1** Press **STOP** ■ twice to stop Disc playback completely.
- 2** Press **SYSTEM MENU**.
- 3** Press **▼** to select **PREFERENCE SETUP**, then press **OK**.
- 4** Press **▼** to select **MP3/JPEG NAV (Navigator)**, then press **►**.

General Information on CD-R and CD-RWs

- When you make CDs to play on this DVD Player, the Disc should have at least 6-10 pictures or 2-3 MP3 music files. Make sure there is at least 3 MB (three megabytes) of information on the Disc. The maximum files per folder is 500.
- JPEG file names should end with the “.jpg” extension.
- To select a JPEG or MP3 file for playback, press the Number buttons to select an item, then press OK. Or, press ▲, ▼, ◀, or ▶ to select an item, then press OK.

JPEG features

- Press PREVIEW during Disc playback to access a Preview screen. This screen shows up to nine miniature pictures; each picture represents a JPEG image. Move to additional Preview screens by pressing Previous ◀◀ or Next ▶▶.
- While playback is stopped, you will see miniature images of the pictures. A maximum of 12 images will appear. Press Previous ◀◀ or Next ▶▶ to see the other pictures on the Disc.
- Press ZOOM to enlarge a JPEG image. Press ▲, ▼, ◀, or ▶ to move through the picture.
- Press ▲, ▼, ◀, or ▶ to select SLIDE SHOW, then press OK. This will play all the files, beginning with the first picture on the current page.
- During JPEG playback, press ▲, ▼, ◀, or ▶ to flip or rotate the image. Press ANGLE to choose different angles of the picture.

Repeat/Shuffle

- 1 While the menu is on the screen, press REPEAT to choose:
FOLDER - All files in the current folder will play once.
SINGLE - The selected file plays once, then play will stop.






This setting is possible only if the DVD was recorded in the letterbox or widescreen format. Check the Disc case for details.
 Select 16:9 (widescreen) if you connected the DVD Player to a widescreen TV.


Helpful Hints

- DVDs only play in the format in which they were recorded. For example, if the DVD case says the DVD is recorded in Letterbox or Widescreen format, you may play the DVD only with the black bars showing at the top and bottom of the widened picture. Even if you set TV DISPLAY to 4:3 PANSCAN, the picture will show in the widened format.
- Some widescreen TVs may show only part of the DVD Player's menu. Adjust the screen mode on your TV. See your TV owner's manual for details.

36 Smart Picture, Picture Setting






- For BRIGHTNESS, choosing a more positive value brightens the color on the screen and seems to add white to the picture. Choosing a more negative value darkens the colors in the picture. Choose zero (0) for the average setting.
- For CONTRAST, choosing a more positive value adds more noticeable difference between the black and white in your picture and sharpens the picture. Choose a more negative CONTRAST value to blur the distinction between black and white in the picture. The picture will not seem as sharp.
- For COLOR, choose a more positive value to increase the color in your picture. To decrease the color in the picture, choose a more negative value. As you decrease the COLOR, the picture becomes more black and white. Choose zero (0) to balance the color.
- For TINT, choose a more positive value to add red to the picture. Choose a negative value to add yellow to the picture. Choose zero (0) to balance the reds and yellows in the picture. You can adjust TINT when you need people's skin tones to look more natural.



TV Type

DVDs are recorded in a color system, usually NTSC or PAL. NTSC is the most common in the United States. Your TV also has a color system. This Player is compatible with NTSC and PAL. However, the color system of the DVD, the TV, and the Player should match. If all three are not the same, the DVD may play in only black and white, the picture may roll continuously, or the picture may appear distorted. TV TYPE lets you set the Player to match the color systems of your DVDs and your TV.

- 1 Press **SYSTEM MENU**.
- 2 Press **▼** to select **VIDEO SETUP**. Press **OK**.
- 3 TV TYPE will be selected. Press **►**.







If you connected the Player to a Stereo using the COAXIAL or OPTICAL jack as shown on page 15, adjust **LPCM OUTPUT**.

Discs are recorded in a certain sampling rate. The higher the sampling rate, the better the sound quality. Some Discs are recorded in a high sampling rate of 96 kHz. Set **LPCM OUTPUT** to 96K if you are playing Discs recorded at this high rate. Otherwise, set **LPCM OUTPUT** to 48K.




Closed Captions


Closed captions are hidden in the video signal of some Discs. Different than subtitles, closed captions are intended for the hearing impaired and also show sound effects. For example, closed captions may include information such as "phone ringing" or "footsteps approaching," while a subtitle would only show spoken text.

Though you can turn on Closed Captions in the DVD Player's menu, the captions must be available on the Disc. Also make sure you turn on Closed Captioning on your TV. Otherwise, the captions will not appear.

- 1 Press **SYSTEM MENU**.
- 2 Press **▼** to select **VIDEO SETUP**. Press **OK**.
- 3 Press **▼** to select **CLOSED CAPTIONS**. Press **►**.

If you are having problems with your product, check this list of problems and possible solutions before requesting service. You may be able to solve the problem yourself.

If you need to call a customer service representative, please know the model number and serial number of your product before you call. This information is on the rear of the product. Also, please take a moment to identify the problem you are having, and be prepared to explain this to the representative. If you believe the representative will need to help you with operations, please stay near the product. Our representatives will be happy to assist you.

No power

- Press the STANDBY-ON ⏻ button on the front of the DVD Player or POWER ⏻ on the remote. A red light appears on the front of the Player if the power is off.
- Make sure you connected the DVD Player's power cord to an AC power outlet.
- Make sure the AC outlet has power by trying another appliance in the same outlet.

No picture

- Make sure the TV power is on.
- Check the video cables. Make sure the cable(s) are fastened securely to the DVD Player and to the TV.
- Set your TV to the correct Video In channel. These channels are usually near channel 00. Or, you may have a button on the TV remote control that selects an Auxiliary, A/V IN, or Video channel. See your TV owner's manual for details. Or, go to your lowest TV channel (01 or 02), then change channels down until you see DVD playback or the blue DVD screen on the TV.
If you are using an RF modulator as described on page 10, set the TV to channel 3 or 4 instead.
- You only need one video connection between the DVD Player and the TV. *Details are on page 9.*

Distorted picture

- Check the Disc for fingerprints or scratches. Clean the Disc with a soft cloth, wiping from the center to the edge in a straight line. Do not wipe the Disc in a circular motion.
- Sometimes a small amount of picture distortion may appear. This is not a malfunction.

The picture is distorted, the picture rolls, or the picture is only black and white.

- TVs have a color system standard, usually NTSC in the United States. If the Disc's or DVD Player's color system is different than your TV's color system, the picture may be distorted or colorless. Set the Player's TV TYPE to match your TV and your DVDs. *Details are on page 38.*
- A DVD or Video CD picture may become distorted or black and white if you switch among PAL and NTSC (for TV TYPE). If so, set SMART PICTURE to STANDARD to correct the picture. *Details are on page 36.*

The sound is distorted or there is no sound during Disc playback.

- Make sure you did not connect any cables from the DVD Player to a Stereo's "PHONO IN" jack.
- Make sure you did not connect the Player's COAXIAL or OPTICAL digital audio out jack to an analog jack on the Stereo. (Analog audio jacks are usually labeled as such and are usually red and white. Coaxial Audio jacks are usually black. Optical Audio jacks are square.)

No sound

- Check the audio connections. *Details are on pages 10-15.* Remember, you only need one audio connection. See page nine to see what connection best suits your situation.
- Make sure cables are connected firmly to all equipment.
- Select another channel, sound source, or Auxiliary station at your Stereo or TV. See your Stereo or TV manual for details. Or, continue selecting the different sound sources or modes on the Stereo or TV until you hear sound from the Disc that is in the DVD Player. *Details are on pages 10-15.*
- Make sure your DOWNMIX, DIGITAL OUTPUT, and LPCM OUTPUT settings match the capabilities of your Stereo or TV. *Details are on pages 39-40.*
- Check the Audio setting of a DVD in the DVD Disc Menu, if available, and adjust as necessary.
- Deactivate mute at both the DVD Player and your TV.

Disc will not play.

- Make sure the Disc label is facing up. If you are playing a two-sided Disc, make sure the label of the side you want to play is facing up. *Details are on page 16.*
- Check the Parental controls. *Details are on pages 28-30.*
- Check the Region Code of the DVD. The DVD must be coded for All regions or Region 1 in order to play on this DVD Player. *Details are on page 7.*
- See if the Disc is defective by trying another Disc. Make sure the Disc is not scratched or warped. Carefully clean the Disc. *Details are on page 6.*
- You must finalize CD-R, DVD+R, and DVD+RW discs before playing them on this Player.
- If you are playing a CD-R or CD-RW you made, make sure it contains at least 3 MB of data. *Details are on page 34.*

An Audio CD will not play.

- Some Audio CDs available on the market are copy protected. These discs will not play on this DVD Player. See your retailer for options regarding non-protected Audio CDs.

The DVD logo does not appear on the TV screen after you remove a Disc.

- Reset the DVD Player by switching it off, then on again.

The DVD Player does not respond to the remote control.

- Aim the remote at the remote sensor on the front of the Player.
- Remove any obstacles between the DVD Player and the remote control. Move closer to the Player and try the remote again.
- Inspect or replace the batteries in the remote control. *Details are on page 8.*
- Press the DVD/TV button on the remote once, then try the remote again. If the remote is in TV mode, it cannot control the Player. Pressing DVD/TV switches the remote between TV and DVD Player modes.

The DVD Player will not select some features, such as Angles, Subtitles, or multi-language Audio.

- The feature may not be available on the Disc. If it is not, the Ø will appear on the TV screen. Check the Disc case to see if the Disc has the feature. If the Disc does not have the feature, the DVD Player cannot create the feature. This is not a malfunction of the Player.
Or, the feature may not be available at the present time. Some features are only available during playback, while other items can be accessed only when play is stopped. Try stopping or starting playback, then try the feature again.

The DVD Player does not work.

- Disconnect the power cord from the power outlet for a few minutes. Reconnect the power cord and try to operate the Player again as usual.

The DVD Player turns itself off.

- If there is no activity at the DVD Player or with its remote control for 15 minutes and playback is stopped, the Player will turn itself off. This is an energy-saving feature that cannot be altered. Press STANDBY-ON ⏻ on the Player or POWER ⏻ or PLAY ▶ on the remote to turn on the Player.

Disc play is irregular or DVD Disc menu operation is faulty.

- Due to the inconsistency of Disc formats provided by various Disc manufacturers, your DVD Player may require a playability enhancement or upgrade. As DVD technology has advanced, these enhancements have become both common and easy to complete.

48 Glossary

Analog: Sound that has not been turned into numbers. Analog sound varies, while digital sound has specific numerical values. Analog sound is available when you use the red and white audio jacks on your equipment. These jacks send audio through two channels, the left and right.

AUDIO OUT Jacks: Jacks on the rear of the DVD Player that send audio to another system (TV, Stereo, etc.). The jacks are red and white.

CD: Compact Disc.

Chapter: A part of a Title.

COAXIAL jack: Sends digital audio to a Stereo, allowing you to adjust the volume at the Stereo. The Stereo must have a Coaxial In jack. This connection provides the 5.1 channel surround sound as heard in movie theaters. The COAXIAL jack on the DVD Player is black.

Color system: There are various systems for transmitting television signals, for example PAL, SECAM, and NTSC. NTSC is the most common color system in the United States of America.

Component Video Y Pb Pr Jacks: The Video Out jacks on the rear of the DVD Player that send high-quality video to a TV that has Component Video In jacks. The jacks on the DVD Player are red, blue, and green.

Digital: Sound that has been converted into numerical values. Digital sound is available when you use the Player's COAXIAL or OPTICAL jack, which sends audio through multiple channels instead of two channels as analog does.

Dolby Digital: A surround sound system that provides 5.1 channel sound as used in movie theaters.

DVD: Digital Video Disc.

Letter Box: Widescreen format; a TV aspect ratio setting (4:3). Displays the video in full-width, with black bars at the top and bottom of the TV screen. This format is similar to seeing a movie in a theater. If the Disc does not include a letter box format, selecting letter box may have no effect. Some DVDs are two-sided, with one side playing in widescreen format and the other side playing in a normal (pan & scan) format.

Optical Jack: Converts electrical signals into optical signals before sending the audio to the Stereo. Optical audio is not prone to external electrical influences and has less noise. Keep the protective cap on the jack when it is not in use; this keeps dust out of the jack.

Pan & Scan: A TV aspect ratio setting (4:3). Displays the video with full-height picture with one or both sides of the picture trimmed to fit on your TV screen. Some movie companies refer to this as "reformatting the picture to fit your TV screen."
