
Side panel



- 1. SOURCE: Display the input source menu.
- 2. MENU: Display main MENU.
- 3. CH+/CH-: In TV mode, press "CH+" or "CH-" to change the channel up and down. In MENU mode, press "CH+" or "CH-" to select items in standby mode, press "CH+" or "CH-" to turn on the TV.
- **4.** VOL+/VOL-: Adjust sound level. In MENU mode, press "VOL+" or "VOL-" to adjust the item that you selected.
- **5. STANDBY:** Press this button to turn the unit ON from STANDBY mode. Press it again to turn the set back to STANDBY.
- 6. USB INPUT

Note: This stand is not a swivel stand. Do not attempt to rotate the TV.


2. When HDMI has an input signal coming from a DVI source then the audio input signal must be connected to the PC audio input.

Be sure both the TV and computer are powered off.


- 1. Connect a VGA and audio cable.



AV EQUIPMENT


There are two HDMI ports located on the back of your TV. You can connect a Blu-ray player, DVD player, or other video equipment through these ports.

There is one component (Y, Pb, Pr) and two composite (AV) video input located on the back of your TV. You can connect a VCR, cable box, or other video equipment to these jacks.


Please see the diagram below. You may also need to refer to the owner's manual of the device that you are trying to connect.



The television's inputs can be connected to the following types of equipment: VCR, multi disc player, DVD, camcorder, video game or stereo system, etc.....



Insert Batteries Into the Remote Control



- Remove the battery cover.
 Insert the 2 AAA 1.5V batteries making sure the polarity (+ or -) of the batteries matches the polarity marks inside the unit.
- 3. Close the battery cover.

Replace with new batteries when the TV set begins to show the following symptoms:

Operation is unsteady or erratic. Sometimes the TV set does not function with the Remote Control.

- 1) Alkaline Batteries Recommended.
- 2) Remove batteries when they are exhausted or if the remote control is not to be used for a long time.

1: POWER

Press to power ON/OFF (standby) the TV.

NUMBÉR KEY

Press to enter the TV channel number and select a channel (Press "." to choose the sub-channel).

3: MENU

Press to open the on screen display (OSD) menu or return to the previous menu.

4: CURSOR

When the OSD menu is displayed on-screen, use these buttons as the up, down, left, right and ENTER buttons to adjust the various options in the OSD menu.

5: EXIT Press to exit the OSD menu.

6: VOL+/-

Press VOL+ or VOL- to adjust the volume.

7: P.M

Press repeatedly to select a picture mode: Vivid, Standard, Sports, Movie, or Custom.

8: PAGE DOWN/PAGE UP

In EPG mode, use this key to page up/down the EPG information.

9: SLEEP

Press repeatedly to set the sleep timer (off / 5 / 10 / 15 / 30 / 45 / 60 / 90 / 120 / 180 /240 minutes). The TV will automatically turn off after the selected amount of time passes.

10: **P.G** Press to go the Parental Control settings menu.

11: MUTE

Press to switch the sound ON/OFF.

12: RECALL

Press to switch between the current and previously viewed

13: SOURCE

Press to display or exit the TV input source menu.

14: ENTER

Press to confirm a selection.

15: TV DISPLAY

Press to show the information about the current input source.

16: S.M

Press repeatedly to switch audio modes: Standard, News, Music, Theater, Sports or Custom.

17: CH+/CH-

Press CH+ or CH- to browse through the TV channels.

18: ASPECT

Press to change the picture aspect ratio.

19: CH LIST

Press to display the channel list.

20: EPG

Press to display the DTV Electronic Program Guide. 21: FAV

Press to display the favorite channels list.

22: HDMI Press to directly switch to HDMI input mode.

Press to directly switch to AV (composite) input mode.

24: DTV STRENGTH

Press to display the DTV signal strength.

25: TV

Press to directly switch to TV mode.

26: YPbPr

Press to directly switch to component input mode.

27: CC

Press to turn on or off the closed captions.

Press to directly switch to VGA (PC input) mode

29: MTS/SAP

Press to activate the NTSC TV sounds, such as Stereo, SAP or Mono tone, and audio languages of DTV.


30: COLOR KEYS

Reserved keys

1. PICTURE MENU

In this menu, you can adjust the picture options here, such as contrast, brightness, etc.

Press ▼▲ to select, press ENTER to adjust.



Note:

- 1) If you want to adjust contrast, brightness, color, and
- sharpness, the picture mode must be set to personal.

 2) This will increase or decrease Warm (red) and Cool (blue)
- 2) This will increase or decrease Warm (red) and Cool (blue) colors to suit your personal preference.

 Select Cool to give the white colors a blue tint, Normal to give

Select Cool to give the white colors a blue tint, Normal to give the white colors a neutral tint, Warm to give the white colors a red tint.

Standard mode is the default setting, if you select some other options, the power consumption may change.

1.1 VGA Setting

When a PC is connected, you can adjust the VGA settings.

- 1) H-Pos: Adjust the horizontal position of the screen.
- 2) V-Pos: Adjust the vertical position of the screen.
- 3) Clock: Fine tune the screen width.
- 4) Phase: Fine tune the phase of the screen. Usually you don't adjust this item.
- 5) Auto: Auto adjust to fit the screen.



2.AUDIO menu

In this menu, you can ajust the sound options here. Press $\nabla \triangle$ to select, press ENTER to adjust.



Note:

- 1) Audio language is available in ATSC/TV mode only.
- 2) Auto volume is available only when the input signal volume is too large or there is distortion.

3. TIMER MENU

In this menu, you can adjust the sleep timer, time zone, etc. Press ▼▲ to select,press ENTER to adjust.




Note

1) Time zone, DST (Daylight Saving Time) and the clock are available in ATSC mode only, and the Clock can't be adjusted.

4.OPTION menu

In this menu, you can adjust the Menu language, Closed Caption, Restore Default etc.

Press ▼▲ to select, press ENTER to adjust.



4.1 Closed Caption



- 1). CC Mode: Switch the closed caption mode.
- 2). Advanced selection: only available in ATSC.
- 3). Option: Used to edit the CC font.

Note:

1). Restore Default: Restore Default will clear all the programs and reset all the settings to default value.

5.LOCK MENU

In this menu, you can change the password and adjust the vchip settings.

Enter the password, to enter the lock menu. The factory default password is 0000.

- 1). Old password: Input the old password.
- 2). New password: Input the new password.
- 3). Confirm password: Input the new password again.


