
Choose Your Connection


How to connect

- 1. Connect the DVD video outputs (Y, Pb/Cb, Pr/Cr) to the YUVIN jacks on the TV and connect the DVD audio outputs to the AUDIO IN jacks on the TV, as shown in the figure.
- 2. If your DVD only has an SCART output jack, connect this to the SCART input on the TV. as shown in the figure.


NOTE: If your DVD player does not have component video output, use S-Video.

How to use

- 1. Turn on the DVD player, insert a DVD.
- 2. Use the TV/AV and VOL+/- button on the remote control to select SCART mode.
- 3. Press Play button on external equipment for program play.
- 4. Refer to the DVD player's manual for operating instructions.

Digital Set-top Box

DTV connection

-To watch digitally broadcast programs, purchase and connecta digital set-topbox.

How toconnect

Use the TV's YPbPrIN and AUDIO IN jacks, VGA or HDMI/DVI VIDEO port for video connections, depending on your set-top box connections available. Then, make the corresponding audio connections.

How touse

- $\boldsymbol{1}$. Turn on the digital set-top box. (Refer to the owner's manual for the digital set-top box.)
- 2. Use TV/AV on the remote control to select DVI mode.
- 3. Press Play buttonon external equipment for program play.

PC connection

How toconnect

- 1. To get the best picture quality, adjust the PC graphics card to (>1024x768),60Hz.
- 2. Use the TV's VGA IN port for video connections, depending onyour PC connector.
- If the graphic card on the PC does not output analog and digital RGB simultaneously, connect only one of either VGA INto display the PC on the TV.
- If the graphic card on the PC does output analog and digital RGB simultaneously, set the TV to either VGA; (the other mode is set to Plug and Play automatically by the TV.)
- 3. Then, make the corresponding audio connection. If using a sound card, adjust the PC sound as required.

How to use


- 1. Turnon the PC and the TV.
- 2. Turn on the display by pressing the POWER button on the TV's remote control.
- 3. UseTV/AV on the remotecontrol to select PC.

4. Check theimage on yourTV. There may be noise associated with the resolution, vertical pattern, contrast or brightness in PC mode. If noise is present, change the PC mode to another resolution, change the refresh rate to another rate or adjust the brightness and contrast on the menu until the picture is clear. If the refresh rate of the PC graphic card cannot be changed, change the PC graphic card or consult the manufacturer of the PC graphic card.

NOTES:

- 1 Use a VGAcable.
- 2 Avoid keeping afixed image onthe TV's screen for along period of time. The fixed image may become permanently imprinted on the screen.
- 3 The synchronization input form for Horizontal and Vertical frequencies is separate.





Connecting Headphones

You can connect a set of headphones to your set if you wish to watch a TV programme without disturbing the other people in the room.




Plug a set of headphones into the 3.5mm mini-jack socket on the rear panel of the set.

Note:

- Prolonged use of headphones at a high volume may damage your hearing.
- You will not receive sound from the speakers when you connect headphones to the system.

Power source



TO USE AC POWER SOURCE

Use the AC polarized line cord provided for operation on AC. Insert the AC cord plug into a standard polarized AC outlet.

NOTES:

- Never connect the AC line cord plug to other than the specified voltage. Use the attached power cordonly.
- If the polarized AC cord does not fit into a nonpolarized AC outlet, do not attempt to file or cut the blade. It is the user`s responsibility to have an electrician replace the obsolete outlet.
- If you cause a static discharge when touching the unit and the unit fails to function, simply unplug the unitfrom the AC outlet and plug it back in. The unit should return to normal operation.

Set up your TV

- -There are several options you mightneed to set up in orderfor your TV to work properly. Read the instructions that follow.
- -In the manual, the OSD(on screen display) may be different from your TV's, because it is just an example to help you with the TV operation.




Switching ON/OFF the TV set


- 1 Please press downthe power switch to switch on AC power supply and the power indicator will light.
- 2 If the indicator is lighting in red, press \circlearrowleft button on the remote controller again.
- 3 If you want to exchange to standing by status, please press down button \circlearrowleft on the remote controller.
- 4 Disconnect the power supply or unplug the television if it is intended to completely cease the television performance.

Choose the Menu Language

When you start using your set for the first time, you must select the language which will be used for displaying menus and indications.

- 1 Press the MENU and CH+/-button to select the Function menu.
- 2 Press VOL+ to enter.
- 3/Press CH+/-button to select Language.
- 4 Select a particular language by pressing VOL+/- button repeatedly.
- You can choose one of 13 languages.
- 5 When you are satisfied with your choice, press **MENU** button to return to previous or press **EXIT** button to return to TV viewing.





- This TV set has three methods to set channels, which are respectively full automatic, manual search, fine tune.
- In this section, how to use the remote control to set channel is explained. You can also use buttons on the TV set to set channel.

Full automatic search mode



If you have set Tuner Lock in Lock Set menu. Password must be entered when operating menu tuning. Otherwise there will be Tuner Lock display on screen.


Automatic search

- 1 Press MENU button and then CH+/- button, the icon to TUNING menu.
- 2 Press the VOL+/- buttons to enter submenu, and press CH+/- button to select "country" first according to yourself that means you have selected the sound system, this is useful especially for France), and then press CH+/-button to select "Auto Search" item.



Note : the TUNING menu will be only operated $\,$ in normal TV and SCART mode.

3 Press the VOL+/-button to ensure automatic search with higher level.



After the search has finished, all channels now playing program will be automatically preset in order.

How to select the desired program

1 Using "Program number" buttons
Press digit button to select the program.
If 2-digit or 3-digit programs are selected, press digit buttons you needed continuously within 3 seconds.

If selected channel program is set at Lock on mode and no password has been entered after initiation of the television, the screen will indicate require password entry. If wrong password is entered, channel selection will fail and previous program will still stay on the screen. The program locking password can be modified in the preset menu and previous password will be required.

2 Using the CH+/- button.

- Press the CH+ button to select a channel number in number increasing direction.
- Press the CH-button to select a channel number in number decreasing direction.

(*Note*: If Skip is ON on one channel, press CH+/- button, the channel will not appear.)

How to select the desired sound

Press the VOL-/+ button on the remote controller or the front of the TV set to adjust the volume level. The range is $0\sim100$. When the volume buttons are pressed the volume level is displayed automatically on the TV screen.






If the colour of some channel is abnormal

Usually this shouldbe set in the auto position. However if the colour displayed on the screen are incorrect, you can manually select the correct colour system.

Press the MENU、CH+/-and VOL+/- button, till the Tuning Program menu shown on the right will display on the screen.



If picture color is abnormal

Press the CH+/-button to select "Color System", then press the VOL-/+ button to select the correct color system. In general, you can set it as "AUTO".

Press VOL+/- button to select AUTO, NTSC, PAL, SECAM, PAL60 and NTSC4.43 in turn.

If sound is abnormal

Press the CH+/-button to select "Sound System", then press the VOL-/+ button to select the correct sound system.

Press VOL+/- button to select D/K, I, B/G, M, L, L'in turn.


If current program is to be named, press VOL-/+ button to select position you want to change and press digits to change, press MENU button to ensure it.



Skip

After the programs are presetting, you can skip some programs so that to select your favorite channels only.

- 1. Press CH+/- button or Direct-digit Choosing button to selecta channel directly (take channel 18 forexample).
- **2.**Press MENU、CH+/and VOL+/- button, till the **Tuning Program** menu shown on the right will display on the screen.



3. press VOL-/+ button to set **Skip On**. And press menu exit.




- 1. Use Direct-digit Choosing button to select the number of the channel to be recovered.
- 2. Do the above steps again.
- 3. Press VOL+/- button to set Skip Off.

Program swap

Swap function enables quick swap to the last watched program.

- 1 Suppose the channel number you used just now is 8 and the channel number you are using is 18 (as shown in the figure).
- 2 If you want to return to the last watched program channel 8, you can simply press the swap button.
- 3 If you want to return to channel 18, press the button again. Through this function, you can easily change between the channel you are using and the channel you used last time.





How to select picture modes

You can quickly select the desired picture mode from three preset modes and one customized mode.

Press the P.STD button to call up Video mode menu, and press CH+/-button to select the desired picture quality. Four kinds of picture modes (i.e., "Normal", "Soft", "Personal", "Bright",) can be selected in turn.





Noise Reduction

Automatically filters out and reduces the image noise and improves picture quality when receiving weak video signals.





Timer setting

The clock will only work if the TV set is turned on or in standby. When the set is disconnect from the power supply or is turned off by the main power on the rear panel, the clock loses power and will need to be reset when the power

1 Press the MENU button and CH+/-button, till the TIMER menu display on the screen.



2 Press CH+/- button select "Timer", press VOL -/+ buttons to select hour or minute position; then press digits buttons to set the value of hour or minute;

3 Press MENU button to return the previous menu.

NOTE:

1.If Timer option is setting, the time you set for Time Off/Time On will be a point of time. Otherwise, if Timer is not set, the time you set for Time Off/Time On will be a period of time.

2.Sleep Off/Time Off can not be set at simultaneously. If both of the two are set, the later setup will be operation. Indication will appear on the screen 1 minute prior to expiry of settime.

How to use the password function

Press H.LOCK button, Password will appear on the screen.

After entering the Lock set menu, password, Press vol+/-, the screen will display the roll.

Press digital button to set the new desired password, and the screen will display the follow.

Repeat ----

If the desired password is entered correctly twice, the old password will be changed. If the desired password is not correctly entered twice, the screen will display New ----, then you have to reenter the password.



Tuner Lock

Press CH+/- to select Tuner Lock and VOL+/- to set On/Off. (To set On, some operation such as search will be not available. Whenenter the TUNING menu, Tuner Lock will be on the screen, and the timewill be the same with the main menu if no operation. If you want to operate TUNING menu, you need to enter the Lockmenu to set Tuner Lock Off or operate Clear Lock.

Prog Set

Prog Set is opted for setting up start channel. Press CH+/- button to select Prog Set. Press VOL+/- button, sources can be swapped in TV/SCART1/SCART2/AV/HDTV/VGA/HDMI mode. After setup, the set mode will be entered if the television is switched off and on again. To set Off, the television will memory the off-channel.

Prog Num

Prog Num is opted for setting up preset channel. Press **CH+/**button to select Prog Num. Press **VOL**+ **/-** button, to select channel number. (The item is not available except TV signal.)

Source Lock

Source Lock is opted to hinderexternal input modes, such as AV, Scart and VGA. Press CH+/- button to select the option, and press VOL+/- button to display Source Lock menuas follows:



Press CH+/- button to select desired option. Press VOL+/-button to set up the mode of Source Lock. If some Source Lock is set ON, the mode will be entered and the screen will display blue background with the mute mode activated and Lock. In lock on mode, when screen is blank, icon Lock will be always displayed on the screen. If lock mode is to be verified, enter Source Lock submenu and set relative mode off, or select Clear Lock in the Lock Set Menu.



Child Lock

Press CH+/- button to select Child Lock.


Press VOL+/- button to set On or Off mode. If lock on mode is set, Child Lock is in activated automatically. In such case, if Child Lock button (button on the television) is pressed, the screen will display Child Lock, which can be erased by press of EXIT button. 5 seconds later after the latest press, the screen display will disappear automatically. The Child Lock mode can be resumed by entering Lock Set menu, set Child Lock On or Off.

Max Volume

Press CH+/- button to select Max Volume. Press VOL+/- button for adjustment between $0\sim$ 100. If a certain value is set, when volume is being adjusted, the sound value can not exceed maximum volume value. If current volume is over Max Volume, when Lock Set menu is set, current volume will become set maximum volume. If current volume is below maximum volume, customer set volume will stay unchanged.

Clear Lock

Press CH+/- button to select Unlock mode. Press VOL+/- button to unlock all set modes, setting all lock options to off, and the maximum volume returns to 100.



Others functions

Note:

The Time On setup and the SLEEP setup is absolute one another.



Sleep

The TV set will switch automatically to standby at the preset time with the SLEEP time on. You may set the sleep time, Operate as follows:

1. Press SLEEP button repeatedly to select the number of preset minutes, the timer will be set in sequence:

0Min→5Min→15Min→30Min→60Min→90Min→120Min→0Min

2. After the sleep time is set, the Indication will appear on the screen 1 minute prior to expiry of set time.

Time off

3 If remaining time of set timer is to be displayed, press **SLEEP** button again.

The TV set will switch off automatically at the preset time, press CH+/- button to turn on again.

4 If to cancel sleep time, press **SLEEP** button repeatedly to set as 0.

Picture Still

Press **Still** button, the picture will be still; if to cancel, press **Still** button again, the picture will resume.


Auto switch-off function

If an empty channel isselected or the TV programs are ended for the day, the power will be switched off 5 minutes later automatically. If the "Time Off" is setting, it will be switched off according to the presetting time. The auto power off function does not work undervide o input.

Under PC state, if no signals input, the television will enter standby status 1 minutes later automatically.

Teletext functions

Teletext is an information system, broadcast by certain channels, which can be read like a newspaper . It also provides subtitles for people with hearing difficulties or those who are unfamiliar with the language in which a particular programme is being broadcast (cable networks, satellite channels, etc.).



Teletext function operation

You can press button into TEXT mode, press again to leave TEXT mode. All menu related functions are not available in TEXT mode. Only a few direct button control functions are available in TEXT mode, they are:

- 1 Page up/down
 Result: Use the CH+/- buttons to browse next
 or previous page.
- 2 Page number entering
 Result: To select a teletext page either directly
 enter the page number using the
 numeric button pad on the remote
 control or use CH+/- buttons, or the
 colored Fast Text buttons.

Teletext functions

(MIX) While in Teletext mode press the button will show the teletext data superimposed on top of the TV picture. Press the button again to revert back to Full text. (HOLD) Pressing the button will stop the teletext page automatically updating. This feature is very useful where there are several teletext pages or data on the same page number.

Pressing the 🖶 button to change from different screen display size. This feature is very useful as it magnifies the image making the characters easier to read.

? (REVEAL)

(SIZE)

Pressing the ① button will reveal hidden text. This feature is used to reveal information such as answers to Teletext on-line interactive puzzles.

TIMER

While in normal TV mode only, pressing the button **TIMER** will display the teletext time in the top right corner for a few seconds.

(TEXT)

Press the button on the remote control to turn teletext On/Off.

(SUBTITLE)

Pressing the button will get the teletext decoder to automatically search for the subtitle page. In NZ the subtitle is usually page 801.

① (INDEX)

Press the ① button to show the list of teletext contents

① ⊕ ⊕ ⊕ (Fast text colored buttons)

Fast text automatically displays the four most commonly used pages that the broadcaster thinks that you may want to choose next. Press the same coloured button on the remote control as the coloured link at the bottom of the teletext page to go directly to that page.

Maintenance

- Early malfunctions can be prevented. Careful and regular cleaning can extend the amount of time you will have your new TV. Be sure to turn the power off and unplug the power cord before you begin any cleaning.

Cleaning the Screen

- 1. Here's a great way tokeep the dust off your screen for a while. Weta soft clothin a mixture of lukewarm water and a little fabric softener or dish washing detergent. Wring the cloth untilit's almost dry, and then use it to wipe the screen.
- 2. Make sure the excess water is off the screen, and then let it air-dry before you turn on your TV.

Cleaning the Cabinet

To remove dirt or dust, wipe the cabinet with a soft, dry, lint-free cloth. Please be sure not to use a wet cloth.

Extended Absence

If you expect to leave your TV dormant for a long time (such as a vacation), it`sa good idea to unplug the power cord to protect against possible damage from lightning or power surges.

Troubleshooting

For the sake of time and cost, it is strongly recommended that you check out the problem by yourself according to the instructions listed hereunder before contacting the after-sales service for technical assistance.

No picture, no sound	Verify if the television is properly plugged. Verify if the television is properly supplied power. Verify if electricity is available.
Blank screen	Verify if correct signals are input. Press TV/AV button to change signal input to TV input. Restart the television of power supply is interrupted.
No sound	Press Mute button and verify if Mute mode is set. Switch to other channel and verify if the same problem happens. Press VOL+ button to see if the problem can be solved.
Poor sound	Verify if sound system is correct. Refer to some chapter for adjust.
No picture in some channel	Verify if correct channel is selected. Adjust the antenna. Make adjustments by Fine Tune and Manual Search.
No color for some channel program (black and white)	Verify if the same problem exists in other channels. Check out of picture and sound systems. Refer to relative instructions in the Manual for color adjust.
Spots with some or all pictures	Verify if the antenna is correctly connected. Verify if the antenna is in good condition. Make fine adjustment of channel.
Horizontal/vertical bars or picture shaking	Check for local interference such as an electrical appliance or power tool.
Television out of control	Disconnect the television from power supply and, 10 seconds later, connect the television to the power supply. If the problem still exists, contact authorized after-sales service for technical assistance.

Note: Do not leave the television with static picture in an extended period as it may result in residual image on your television screen.
