


Thank you for purchasing a HUMAX TV. Please read this user manual carefully in order to safely install, use and maintain the TV at maximum performance. Keep this user manual next to your TV to ensure the best performance possible.

General Safety Precautions

Power

- Plug the power cord into the correct power outlet. An unstable connection may cause fire.
- Do not use damaged power cords or plugs, or use a loose wall outlet. This may cause electrical shock or fire.
- Do never touch the power cord with wet hands. This may cause electrical shock.
- Do not use multiple devices with one outlet. Overheating the outlet may cause fire.
- Do not bend or pull out the power cord using force, nor place heavy objects over it. This may cause electrical shock or fire.
- Make sure you pull out the power cord holding the plug itself. An internal disconnection may cause fire.
- When removing the product, turn off the power and pull out the plug from the power outlet. Also make sure other devices including the antenna or the connectors are removed from the outlets before relocating the product. Otherwise you may suffer electrical shock or fire due to a damaged power cord.
- This TV shall be connected to mains socket outlet with a protective earthing connection.
- The mains plug shall remain readily operable.

Installation

- Keep the product away from any heating devices. Placing it close to a heating device may cause fire.
- Keep the power cord away from any heating devices. A melted coating may cause fire or electrical shock.
- Place the antenna as far away as possible from any high-voltage cables. Touching the high voltage wiring may cause fire or electrical shock.

Usage


- Unplug the product from the wall outlet and do not touch the antenna during a thunderstorm. This will prevent damage to the unit due to lightning and power-surges.




Power cord

Front & Side Panel

LED touch buttons are displayed on the front panel.

You can simply touch LED buttons to control some main functions such as selecting a main input, using the OK command, displaying menus, adjusting volume, and switching channels.



1 **POWER** switch

Turns the power on/off.

2 Remote control sensor

Receives commands directly from your remote control and passes them on.

3 TV/AV button

Displays input source.

4 OK button

Confirms the selection.

5 MENU button

Displays the on-screen menu.

6 < VOL / VOL > buttons

Adjusts the volume.

7 VP/P∧ buttons


Selects channels.

8 Standby button

Sets your TV in standby mode and turns on blue during the standby mode.

Rear & Side Panel

Side Panel



1 AV3 (CVBS) INPUT

Connects to the audio and video output jacks of a camcorder, videogame and similar devices.

2 S-VIDEO INPUT

Connects to the S-Video jack of a camcorder, video game console, and similar devices.

3 H/P (Headphones)

Connects to headphones.


4 CI (Common Interface) SLOT

A slot for a CI Module.

5 SMARTCARD SLOT

A slot for a Smartcard. (Ready for future use)

Rear Panel



1 AC INPUT

Connects the power cord.

2 HDMI INPUT

Receives uncompressed digital audio and video signals from the device that supports High Definition Multi-media Interface (HDMI).

3 SERVICE ONLY (RS232C)

Connects to the PC to update the software of the TV.

4 PC INPUT/PC AUDIO INPUT

Connects to the video and audio output jacks on your PC.

5 S/PDIF OUTPUT

Connects to a digital audio component. (digital audio output only)

6 COMPONENT INPUT

Connects to Video (Y/PB/PR) and audio (L/R) components.

7 AV1/AV2 (SCART1/SCART2)

Inputs or outputs for external devices, such as VCR, DVD, video game console or video disc players. AV1 jack outputs only Analog TV signal and AV2 jack outputs Digital TV, Analog TV, AV1, AV2, AV3 or S-Video input signal.

8 RF INPUT

Connects to an antenna or a cable system.

Remote Control Buttons

Number (0~9) buttons

Enters the channel number for direct display. Used to enter digit numbers.

Fav

Switches to a favourite channel. Circulates through favourite channels in sequent order while watching TV.

LIST

Displays channel lists. Press the ▲/▼ button to select a channel.

Coloured buttons

Used for interactive applications in the EPG, Edit Programmes, Schedule, Playlist and Teletext mode.

EPG

Displays the Electronic Programme Guide (EPG) in DTV mode.

BACK

Returns to the previous display.

MENU

Displays the On Screen Display (OSD) menu.

EXIT


Exits from the currently displayed menu.

Arrow (▲/▼/◄/▶) buttons

Controls the selection in the On Screen Display (OSD) menu.

oĸ

Confirms (save or enter) your choice in the On Screen Display (OSD) menu. Displays the setting status of the current screen.



STANDBY

Puts your TV in standby mode.

MUTE

Mutes the sound. To cancel, press the MUTE, VOL+, or VOL- button.

TV/AV

Displays all available input sources. Press the ▲/▼ button to select a required input source.

SLEEP

Selects a preset time interval for switching the TV to standby mode automatically.

PIC MODE

Selects the picture mode (Standard, Dynamic, Movie, Mild, Game, or User).

SND EFFECT

Selects sound modes (Flat, Speech, Movie, Music, or User).

WIDE

Select the aspect ratio (Auto, 4:3, 14:9, 16:9, Zoom1, or Zoom2).

PLAYBACK Control Buttons

■ (STOP)

Stops recording or playback and go to the live programme.

►/II (PLAY/PAUSE)


Plays at normal speed or pauses the live programme.

▶▶ (FAST FORWARD)

Fast forward at high speed. Each time you press this button the fast forwarding speed increases.

◄ (FAST REWIND)

Rewinds at high speed. Each time you press this button the fast rewinding speed increases.



PLAYBACK Control Buttons

■ (STOP)

Stops recording or playback and go to the live programme.

• (RECORD)

Records programmes or sets time to end recording.

►/II (PLAY/PAUSE)

Plays at normal speed or pauses the live programme.

▶▶ (FAST FORWARD)

Fast forward at high speed. Each time you press this button the fast forwarding speed increases.

◀◀ (FAST REWIND)

Rewinds at high speed. Each time you press this button the fast rewinding speed increases.

Jumps back 15 seconds (default value) and starts playing again in trick play mode.

○ (Commercial Skip)

Skips watching the programme for 15 seconds forward.

A►B (A-B Repeat)

Repeats a specified repeat area(A-B). Not work in the time shifting playback.

I► (Slow Motion)

Plays the programme in slow motion mode. Each time you press this button, playback speed decreases.

知 (Add Bookmark)

Adds a bookmark. Not work in the time shifting playback.

11 (Bookmark Jump)

Jumps to the bookmarked point and plays from that point. Not work in the time shifting playback.

TELETEXT Function Buttons

(Teletext On/Off)

Activates or deactivates the teletext service.

(Mix)

Overlaps the teletext with the broadcasting screen.

Adjusts the opacity to the background in Teletext mode.

(Index)

Displays the teletext index page.

Displays the TV programme when searching for the new teletext page.

(Reveal)

Shows the hidden information.

Selects the teletext mode (LIST/FLOF)

(Size) (≡


Displays the double-size letters.

⊞ (Hold)

Holds the current teletext page not updating it.

(Time)

When viewing a TV programme, press this button to display the current time at the top right hand corner of the screen.



PIP/PBP Function buttons

PIP P+/PIP P-

Switches sub-picture channels.

PIP/PBP

Selects the PIP/PBP mode (Off, PIP Small, PIP Large, PBP1, PBP2, or POP).

PIP INPUT


Selects an input source for the sub picture.


PIP POSITION


Changes the position of the PIP screen.

SWAP

Swaps the main picture and the subpicture.







■ Inserting Batteries into the Remote Control

You must insert or replace the batteries in the remote control when:

- + You just purchased TV
- + Remote control does not work
- 1 Remove the cover on the rear of the remote control by pressing the symbol (▼) downwards and then pulling firmly to remove it.
- 2 Insert two AAA size 1.5V batteries ensuring that the plus(+) and minus(-) signs of the batteries are correctly aligned.
- 3 Close the cover.

Note: Do not mix different battery types such as alkaline with manganese.

Installing TV Wall Mount

Installation Method

- TV wall mount is sold separately.
- Install the TV on a vertical wall only.
- To avoid troubles during the installation, refer to the followings:
 - Do not install next to smoke and fire detectors.
 - Do not install in an area subjected to vibration or high voltage.
 - Do not install near or around any heating apparatus.
 - Only use recommended parts and components.






How to Attach the TV to the Bracket (sold separately)

The exterior of the TV may be different than the picture. (Assembly and installation of the plastic hanger is the same.)







- Please be careful not to harm your fingers while installing and adjusting the angle.
- Please secure the wall mount bracket to the wall to avoid injury from a falling TV.
- 3 Tighten the screws of the plastic hanger to the rear of the TV.
- 4 Put the 6 pegs on TV in the grooves of the wall mount bracket and pull down on TV [1] to secure it to the wall mount bracket [2]. Tighten the screws as shown [3] so that the TV cannot be separated from the wall mount bracket.










Connecting to an Aerial or a Cable TV

To view the television channels correctly, a signal must be received by the broadcasting provider.




- 1 Connect the RF coaxial cable from an aerial or a cable TV to the RF-INPUT jack on the rear of the TV.
- Turn on the TV, and then press the TV/AV button to select Digital TV or Analog TV.

Notes:

- **1.** To receive an optimal signal, it is recommended that you use a 75 ohm F-type coaxial cable.
- **2.** For proper reception of signals, an external antenna is required. For best reception, an outdoor antenna is recommended.
- **3.** To improve the picture quality in a poor signal area, please purchase a signal amplifier and install properly.

Connecting to the VCR

Using the SCART Cable



- 1 Connect the SCART cable between the AV1 (or AV2) jack on TV and the SCART jack on your VCR.
- 2 Turn on the TV, and then press the TV/AV button to select AV1 (or AV2).
- 3 Turn on your VCR, then insert a video cassette into the VCR and press the PLAY button on your VCR. (Refer to the VCR owner's manual)


If you want to make a copy from a secondary VCR (or DVD player)

- 1 Connect your secondary VCR (or DVD player) to the AV1 jack and the target VCR (or DVD player) to the AV2 jack so that the signal transfers from AV1 to AV2.
- 2 To record a programme, connect the receiver to the AV1 jack and the VCR (or DVD player) to the AV2 jack so that the signal transfers from AV1 to AV2.

Note: For more details about how to record, refer to your required Equipment's instructions.


■ Using the Audio/Video (Composite) Cable



- 1 Connect the video cable between the VIDEO IN(AV3) input jack on TV and the video output jack on your VCR.
- 2 Connect the audio cable between the AUDIO-L/R (AV3) input jacks on TV and the audio output jacks on your VCR.
- 3 Turn on the TV, and then press the TV/AV button to select AV3(CVBS).
- **4** Turn on your VCR, then insert a video cassette into the VCR and press the **PLAY** button on the VCR. (Refer to the VCR owner's manual)

Using the Audio/S-Video Cable


S-Video carries the video data as two separate signals (brightness and colour), unlike composite video which carries the entire set of signals in one package. S-Video does not carry audio. Hence, a separate audio connection is required.



- 1 Connect the S-Video cable between the S-VIDEO input jack on TV and the S-Video output jack on your VCR.
- 2 Connect the audio cable between the AUDIO-L/R (AV3) input jacks on TV and the audio output jacks on your VCR.
- **3** Turn on the TV, and then press the **TV/AV** button to select **S-Video**.
- 4 Turn on your VCR, then insert a video cassette into the VCR and press the **PLAY** button on your VCR. (Refer to the VCR owner's manual)


Connecting to the DVD Player

Using the SCART Cable



- 1 Connect the SCART cable between the AV1 (or AV2) jack on TV and the SCART jack on your DVD player.
- 2 Turn on the TV, and then press the TV/AV button to select AV1 (or AV2).
- 3 Turn on your DVD player, and then insert a DVD into the DVD player and press the PLAY button on your DVD player. (Refer to the DVD player owner's manual)

Using the Audio/Component Video Cable




- Connect the component video cables between the COMPONENT VIDEO

 Y/Pb/Pr input jacks on TV and the component video output jacks on your DVD player.
- **2** Connect the audio cable between the **AUDIO-L/R** (for COMPONENT) input jacks on TV and the audio output jacks on your DVD player.
- **3** Turn on the TV, and then press the **TV/AV** button to select **Component**.
- 4 Turn on your DVD player, then insert a DVD into the DVD player and press the PLAY button on your DVD player. (Refer to the DVD player owner's manual)

Note: Depending on the manufacturer, the Y/Pb/Pr jacks may be identified as $Y/P_B/P_R$, Y/B-Y/R-Y or $Y/C_B/C_R$.



- 1 Connect the HDMI cable between the HDMI input jack on TV and the HDMI output jack on your DVD player.
- **2** Turn on the TV, and then press the **TV/AV** button to select **HDMI**.
- 3 Turn on your DVD player, then insert a DVD into the DVD player and press the PLAY button on your DVD player. (Refer to the DVD player owner's manual)


■ Using the HDMI to DVI Adapter



- 1 Connect the HDMI cable between the HDMI input jack on the TV and HDMI jack on the HDMI to DVI adapter.
- 2 Connect the HDMI to DVI adapter to the DVI output jack on the DVD player.
- **3** Connect the audio cable between the **AUDIO-L/R**(for COMPONENT) input jacks on TV and the audio output jacks on your DVD player.
- 4 Turn on the TV, and then press the TV/AV button to select HDMI.
- Turn on your DVD player, then insert a DVD into the DVD player and press the PLAY button on the DVD player. (Refer to the DVD player owner's manual)



- **3** Connect the audio cable between the **AUDIO-L/R** (for COMPONENT) input jacks on TV and the audio output jacks on your STB.
- 4 Turn on the TV, and then press the TV/AV button to select HDMI.
- **5** Turn on your STB. (Refer to the STB owner's manual)


Connecting to the Digital Audio System



- 1 Connect the optical cable between the S/PDIF OUT jack on TV and the optical input jack on your digital audio system.
- **2** Turn on the TV and your Digital Audio System, and then adjust the volume. (Refer to the Digital Audio System owner's manual)

Note: In order to enjoy the sound from the Digital Audio System, press the **VOL+/-** button or **MUTE** button to minimise the volume or to cut off the sound from the TV.


Connecting to the PC



- 1 Connect the PC cable between the **PC INPUT** jack on TV and the PC output jack on your PC.
- **2** Connect the audio cable between the **PC AUDIO IN** jack on TV and the audio output jack on your PC.
- 3 Turn on the TV, and then press the TV/AV button to select PC.

Connecting Headphones

Connect a set of headphones to **H/P** jack on TV if you want to watch a television programme without disturbing other people close to you.



Note: Prolonged use of headphones at a high volume may cause health damage on your ears.


Conditional Access System

(for the digital channels only)

Conditional Access System (CAS) is a technology used to control access to digital television (DTV) services to authorised users by encrypting the transmitted programming.

Inserting a Smartcard (Ready for future use)


Insert the Smartcard into the slot at rear flap of your TV. A valid Smartcard enables you to access to all the channels you subscribe to.



- 1 Open the rear flap of your TV.
- 2 Hold the Smartcard with the electronic chip facing backwards to your TV.
- 3 Insert the Smartcard into the left slot until the card is completely in.

Inserting a CI Module (with Smartcard)


CI Module looks like a PC Card (called PCMCIA) for laptops. There are different kinds of CI Modules, suitable for different coding systems.




- 1 Open the rear flap of your TV.
- 2 Follow the instructions of the module and insert the Smartcard into the Common Interface (CI) module.
- 3 Keep the CI module(with the Smartcard) vertically.
- 4 Insert the CI module completely into the right slot.

Note: Ensure the Smartcard or CI module is inserted in the right direction. Inserting in the wrong direction may cause damage to the Smartcard or CI module.

Turning on Your TV







To turn on your TV, do as follows:

- 1 Connect the power cord on TV to the wall outlet.

- 7: Programmes is blocked for age groups under 7.
- 12: Programmes is blocked for age groups under 12.
- 15: Programmes is blocked for age groups under 15.
- 18: Programmes is blocked for age groups under 18.

Lock All: All Programmes are blocked without considering the age level.



- If you select a blocked channel "This programme is blocked by age" message appears.
- 2. To watch the blocked programmes by the age restriction, you have to set the Age limit to View All in the Parental Controls menu.







Changing the Password

You can change the current password to a new one.



Common Interface

You can view the current status of the CI module. The ${\bf CI}$ sub menu displays when inserting the CI module or Smartcard to the TV.

- 2 Select System using the ▲/▼ button and press the **OK** or ▶ button.
- 3 Select CI(Common Interface) using the ▲/▼ button and press the OK or ▶ button.
- 4 If Common Interface is available, you can view information about each Slot.

Note: The displayed information about each Common Interface may differ depending on the type of Common Interface.

Default Settings

You can set your TV settings to the default setting values.

Warning: Please note that once you perform the Default Setting, all data such as aerial setting information, channel list, and user configured data are deleted.





To perform Default Setting, do as follows:

- 1 Press the **MENU** button.
- 2 Select **System** using the **△**/**▼** button and press the **OK** or **▶** button.
- 3 Select **Default Setting** using the **△**/**▼** button and press the **OK** or **▶** button. The **Please enter password** dialog box is displayed.
- 4 Enter your password using the **NUMBER (0~9)** buttons.
- 5 Select Yes using the ◀/▶ button and press the OK button to change all settings value to the factory default. Select No using the ◀/▶ button and press the OK button or press the BACK button to return to the previous menu.
- **6** Default setting is complete. Then, the TV is automatically turned off and on.

This chapter describes the PVR (Personal Video Recorder) function that allows you to record a programme in the installed hard disk drive.

Setting the Recording Quality

- 3 Select Recording Quality using the ▲/▼ button and press the ◄/▶ button to select one of three recording quality.

In general, the recording quality improves as the recording time decreases. Recording time may vary according to specific conditions.

Time-Shift Recording (TSR)


The TV automatically record the programme on air in the installed hard disk drive temporarily, so that users can pause, play, fast rewind, fast forward, instant replay, etc. even while watching the currently broadcasting TV programme.

Note: While instant recording or scheduled recording, you cannot perform the time shifted recording and playback.

TSR Time Bar


If you press playback control buttons while watching TV, the TSR Time bar appears on the bottom of the screen.


TSR Time bar displays the current operation status, the time of the watching point, and the amount of temporarily saved programme.



- 1 Operation status
- 2 Watching point
- 3 Broadcasting (Live) point
- 4 The amount of saved programme (max. 2 hours)
- 5 The time of watching point (hh:mm)
- 6 Current time (hh:mm)

Note: When the operation status is PLAYING (▶) or LIVE on the TSR Time bar, if you take no action for about 3 seconds, the TSR Time bar will be disappear.





Playback Control

Play/Pause

Press the **PLAY/PAUSE** (►/II) button to pause the playback. Press the button again to resume playback. TSR Time bar disappears after 10 seconds.

Note: Pause makes the time difference or delay between the broadcasting point and watching point. The time difference is equal to the paused time period. You can check the time difference in the TSR Time bar. Other operations such as slow motion and rewind also make the time difference. Press **STOP** (**■**) button to remove the time difference and watch the programme on air presently.

Stop

Press the **STOP** (■) button to stop TSR playback and watch the programme on air presently.

Fast Forward

Press the **FAST FORWARD** (▶) button to quickly advance a recorded file. Each time you press the **FAST FORWARD** (▶) button, the forward speed increases by 4 steps (x2, x4, x16, x64).

TSR Time bar is shown during the fast forwarding. If you press the **PLAY/PAUSE** (**>**/**II**) button during the fast forwarding, the programme is played at normal speed.

Note: You can use the fast forward operation only when there is a time difference between the current watching and the broadcasting point caused by some previous operations such as pause, slow motion, or rewind. You can fast forward up to the current broadcasting point. If the watching point reaches to the broadcasting point, the programme will play at normal speed.

Fast Rewind

Press the **FAST REWIND** (◀) button to rewinds the programme fast. Each time you press the **FAST REWIND** (◀) button, the rewind speed increases by 4 steps (x2, x4, x16, x64).

TSR Time bar is shown during the fast rewinding. If you press the **PLAY/PAUSE** (**>**/II) button during the fast rewinding, the programme is played at normal speed.

Note: You can rewind to the point when you have changed to the current channel. If the watching point reaches the start point during rewinding, the programme will begin to play at normal speed from the point.

Slow Motion

Press the **Slow Motion** ($_{I}\triangleright$) button to play the current programme in slow motion. Each time you press the **Slow Motion** ($_{I}\triangleright$) button, the slow speed decreases by 3 steps (x1/2, x1/4, x1/8).

TSR Time bar is shown during the slow motioning. If you press the **PLAY/PAUSE** (**>**/II) button during the slow motioning, the programme is played at normal speed.

Instant Replay

Press the **Instant Replay** (?) button to replay the current programme from the 15 seconds before. When the replay has been completed, the programme is normally played from the point.

Commercial Skip


Press the **Commercial Skip** () button to play the programme from the time point 15 seconds forward from the current watching point. You can use the skip operation only when there is a time difference between the current watching and the broadcasting point. If the time difference is less than 15 seconds, the programme is played from the current broadcasting point.

Note: A-B Repeat (A▶B), Add Bookmark (智) and Bookmark Jump (智) buttons do not work in the time shifted state.

Instant Recording







- 1 Press the **RECORD** (●) button on the remote control to record the current programme instantly.
- You can change the recording end time by pressing the RECORD (●) button again. Each time you press the ◀ or ▶ button, the end time decreases or increases by 10 minutes.
- **3** Press the **STOP** (■) button to stop recording.

- 11. Ensure that there is enough free space before recording, because if the free space on the hard disk drive is insufficient, recording will stop. Recording 1 hour of programme may require up to 2GB of free space of hard disk space. The space for recording 1 hour of programme may be different depending on the programme recorded.
- **12.** The default recording time of instant recording is 1 hour.
- **13.** During playback the recorded programmes, you can't record instantly.

You can schedule to record the programmes on EPG information or scheduled recording.

Displaying Teletext information



You can view teletext information at any time on your TV.

Most of TV broadcasting stations provide text information services via teletext. The index page of the teletext service gives you information on how to use the service. You can also select various options to fit your needs using the buttons on your remote control.

Note: To properly display teletext information, channel reception must be stable. Otherwise, information may be missing or some pages may not be displayed.

TELETEXT related buttons are as shown below:

(Teletext On/Off)

Activates or deactivates the teletext service.

(Mix)

Overlaps the teletext with the broadcasting screen. Adjusts the opacity to the background in Teletext mode.

(Index)

Displays the teletext index page.

■ (Cancel)

Displays TV programmes when searching for the new teletext page.

(Reveal)

Shows the hidden information. (answers to quiz games, for example) Press it again to return to normal display.

(Mode)

Selects the teletext mode (LIST/FLOF)

(Size

Displays the double-size letters for lower half of the screen, press it again to return to normal display.

(Hold)

Holds the display on a given page if the selected page is linked with several secondary pages that automatically follow. To resume, press it again.

(Time)

When watching TV programmes, press it to display the time at the top right hand corner of the screen.

Number (0~9)

Press to enter the three-digit page number given in the content.

Coloured buttons (Red/Green/Yellow/Blue)

If the FASTEXT system is used by a broadcasting company, the different topics covered on a teletext page are colour-coded and can be selected by pressing the coloured buttons. Press one of them according to your needs. The page is displayed with other coloured information that can be selected in the same way. To display the previous or next page, press the corresponding coloured button.







Sets the focus of screen.

- 5 Select **Phase** using the **△**/**▼** button and press the **OK** or **▶** button.
- 6 Adjust the optimal focus using the **◄/▶** button.

Note: If noise is present, change the PC mode to another resolution, change the refresh rate to another rate until the picture is clear. If the refresh rate of the PC graphic card can not be changed, change the PC graphic card or consult the manufacturer of the PC graphic card.

In order to maintain proper performance of the TV, it is essential to have the most up-to-date software. The latest news and release of software versions may be found at the **HUMAX website** – **http://www.humaxdigital.com**. It is recommended that you periodically check for the availability of software update.

OTA (Over the Air)

OTA, an abbreviation of **Over–the-Air**, means that the software can be downloaded through your aerial. The manufacturer reserves the right to decide when and where to release software by this process. The software update via your aerial will only occur under the following circumstances.

- 1 The equipment should have appropriate loader software.
 - **Caution**: Please note that if you don't have normal loader software, the equipment may not be updated or work after software update.
- 2 The manufacturer decides to release software downloading via a designated aerial system.
- 3 The equipment must be tuned properly according to the guidelines within this manual.
- 4 Update software when the quality of receiving signal strength is high. If the weather is not so good that the quality of receiving signal strength is not recommendable, perform the software update later.


Caution:

- Please be careful to keep the power on and the power cord plugged in during software update. If the power is disconnected during software update, it may cause fatal damage to the TV.
- Please be careful not to pull out the signal line (co-axial Cable) during software update. Update may be interrupted and the TV may not work.

Notes:


- 1. The other functions of TV cannot work at all during software update.
- 2. It may take 5 ~10 minutes to update software.
- 3. Scheduling operation cannot work during software update.



- 7 When completing the software update, the TV is automatically powered off and on again.

S/W Update from PC

You can connect your TV to the PC directly and update your software by transferring the new software from the PC. Follow these steps to download new software from PC to this TV.

- 1 Download new software file (HDF files) equivalent for this TV model from our website into your computer (http://www.humaxdigital.com).
- **2** Download and install download tool file from our website into your computer.
- 3 Connect your PC to this TV with RS-232C serial cable(not supplied).
- **4** Execute installed download tool, and then follow the instructions contained the download tool.
- **5** Reconnect the power cable of the TV and press the **STANDBY** button to make this TV operating.

Troubleshooting

Before contacting your local service dealer, please make sure you refer to the following guide. If the TV does not work normally after completing the following trouble shooting, please contact your local TV distributor or service centre.

- (1) No message is displayed on the front panel or the TV has no power.
 - Check the main power cable and make sure it is plugged into a suitable power outlet.
 - Check that the mains supply is switched on.
 - Check that the power switch is on at the side of the TV (where applicable)

(2) No picture

- Make sure that the TV is power on and in operation mode (press STANDBY button).
- Make sure that the AV cable is firmly connected to the TV. You may need to remove the cable from both ends and reconnect.
- Make sure that the antenna line is properly connected to the TV.
- Make sure that the Antenna Setting in the menu is correct.
- Check the brightness level of the TV.
- Check if the channel is currently on air. Contact the broadcaster to ensure that the channel is running.

(3) Poor picture & sound quality

- Install the antenna in an obstacle-free place.
- Make sure there is no mobile phone or microwave oven near the TV.
- Use 75 coaxial cable when connecting TV and antenna.
- In PIP/PBP/POP mode, if the 1080i video input signal is displayed on the sub screen through the Component or HDMI jack, the screen flicker may occur.

(4) No or poor sound

- Check that your AV cable is connected correctly.
- Check the volume levels of your TV.
- Check if the TV is on mute.
- Check audio type or soundtrack option in the AV menu.

(5) Remote Control does not operate.

- To control the TV, the top end of the remote control should point directly towards the receiving part of the TV.
- Remove and reinsert the batteries in the remote control.
- Replace the batteries in the remote control for a new set.

(6) Cannot make reservations.

- Check that no previous reservations are conflicting with the new reservation.
- Check that the TV is in operation mode or in standby mode at the time of the reservation. If the power switch or power outlet is off, the TV will not be able to switch on at the time of the reservation.

(7) Cannot watch scrambled channel.

- Check that you have the appropriate Smartcard or CAM. Reinsert the Smartcard or CAM and make sure it initializes correctly.
- Check in the menu that the TV is detecting the Smartcard or CAM.
- Check in the menu that you have a valid and working subscription to the channels you wish to view.
- Ensure that the Smartcard or CAM is not damaged.

Error Message

Error message	Possible causes	What to do
No or bad signal	 The aerial is not pointing properly. The AV device is not connected properly. 	 Adjust aerial. Check the cable from the aerial.
