This product was designed and manufactured to meet strict quality and safety standards. There are, however, some installation and operation precautions which you should be particularly aware of.

- Read Instructions All the safety and operating instructions should be read before the appliance is operated.
- Retain Instructions The safety and operating instructions should be retained for future reference.
- Heed Warnings All warnings on the appliance and in the operating instructions should be adhered to.
- Follow Instructions All operating and use instructions should be followed.
- 5. Water and Moisture The appliance should not be used near water for example, near a bathtub, washbowl, kitchen sink, laundry tub, in a wet basement or near a swimming pool, etc.

Section 810 of the National Electric Code, ANSI/NFPA No. 70-1984, provides information with respect to proper grounding of the mats and supporting structure grounding of the lead-in wire to an antenna discharge unit, size of grounding connectors, location of antenna-discharge unit, connection to grounding electrodes and requirements for the grounding electrode. See Fig. below.

- 15. Non-use Periods The power cord of the appliance should be unplugged from the outlet when left unused for a long period of time
- Object and Liquid Entry Care should be taken so that objects do not fall and liquids are not spilled into the enclosure through openings.
- 17. Damage Requiring Service The appliance should be serviced by qualified service personnel when:
 - A. The power supply cord or the plug has been damaged; or
 - Objects have fallen, or liquid has been spilled into the appliance; or
 - C. The appliance has been exposed to rain; or
 - The appliance does not appear to operate normally or exhibits a marked change in performance; or
 - E. The appliance has been dropped, or the enclosure damaged.
- **18. Servicing** The user should not attempt to service the appliance beyond that described in the operating instructions. All other servicing should be referred to qualified service personnel.

Note to the CATV system installer: This reminder is provided to call the CATV system installer's attention to Article 820-40 of the NEC that provides guidelines for proper grounding and, in particular, specifies that the cable ground shall be connected to the grounding system of the building, as close to the point of cable entry as practical.



FEATURES



First Time Set Up - automatically sets the TV for local channels and the correct picture signal (antenna or cable). See your Set-up and Quick Use Guide for details.

Infrared Remote Control - operates your TV set and all on screen feature controls.

Standard TV broadcast (VHF/UHF) or Cable TV (CATV) channel capability.

Closed Captioning - allows the viewer to read TV program dialogue or voice conversations as on-screen text.

Automatic Programming of channels - for quick and easy selection of favorite stations available in your area.

Stereo TV - with a built-in audio amplifier and a twin speaker system, reception of TV programs in both broadcast stereo sound or (SAP) bilingual broadcast are available.

On-Screen Features - display helpful information for the setting of TV controls (such as help messages, operating tips and glossary).

Parental Controls - for "censoring" or blocking out channels to keep children from watching undesirable programming.

Audio/Video Jacks - for direct connections with VCRs (and other accessories) for quality TV picture and sound playback. Component video Input connectors are also available for high fidelity color and picture resolution when using digital video source material, such as DVD.

Surround Sound -this TV set contains external audio speaker connections for a more dynamic sound effect.

Sleep-Timer - automatically turns the TV OFF at preset time intervals.

Digital Ready - Projection Television capable of connecting to both the current analog television signals of today as well as interfacing with new upcoming digital source playback products and devices. This TV includes multiple signal connectors (Component Video, S-Video, Composite Video) which give you a variety of equipment playback options for digital set top boxes, satellite receivers, cable boxes, and other digital devices.

While there may exist some digital devices with connections not available on this television, you should be adequately prepared for the vast majority of products coming onto the digital consumer electronics' market. Note: You should always use the connection output on digital devices that gives the highest level of picture quality possible. As listed above the Component Video (or Y PB PR) input delivers the best color and picture reproduction; followed by S-Video; and then Composite Video. In addition to the above listed inputs, your television also includes the standard 750hm cable signal connector for use with antennas or analog cable boxes.

As you unpack your TV please note that the following items have been included with your set:

- · Batteries for Remote Control Use

Please take a few minutes to complete your registration card. The serial number for the TV is on the back of the set.

Refer to the back of this manual for instructions on the cleaning and care of the TV.

End-of-Life disposal

PICTURE MENU CONTROL ADJUSTMENTS

COLOR, BRIGHTNESS, SHARPNESS, TINT, PICTURE

To adjust your TV color and picture controls, select a TV channel and follow the steps shown below:

BEGIN

TURE, COLOR, TINT, or SHARPNESS picture control.

With the PICTURE MENU on screen, move the RED highlight with the MENU (buttons. Then press the MENU button.

- Press the (+) or (-) buttons to adjust the selected control.
- Press the STATUS button to clear the screen.



SMART HELP

Remember. When the bar scale is centered, control settings are at normal mid-range levels.


BRIGHTNESS Press (-) **or** (+) until dark parts of the picture show good detail.

<u>PICTURE</u> Press (-) or (+) until whitest parts of the picture are as bright as you prefer.

<u>COLOR</u> Press (-) **or** (+) to add or eliminate color.

<u>TINT</u> Press (-) or (+) to obtain natural skin tones. (Also see Flesh Correction on page 7 for more information).

 $\underline{SHARPNESS}$ **Press** (-) or (+) to improve detail in the picture.



CLEARVIEW

Clearview is a sharpness feature which smoothes out background snow (or picture noise) without losing picture image detail or crispness.

(BEGIN)


Select CLEARVIEW control.

With the PICTURE MENU on screen, move the RED highlight with the MENU (buttons. Then press the MENU button.

2 Press the MENU ▲▼ buttons
to move the RED highlight. Press
the MENU button to select () the
ENHANCED mode.

Press the STATUS button to clear the screen.





FLESH CORRECTION

Use the Flesh Correction control to keep skin tone hues (or facial tint) from varying from TV channel to TV channel.

BEGIN


Select FLESH CORREC-TION control.

With PICTURE MENU (2 of 2) on screen, move the RED highlight with the MENU (buttons. Then press the MENU button.

to move the RED highlight. Press the MENU button to turn (✓) the FLESH CORRECTION control ON.

3 Press the STATUS button to clear the screen.





RED/BLUE CONVERGENCE

Convergence is the correct lining up of the red and blue light paths on the TV screen. NOTE: If no color fringing (see Smart Help) shows, then no Convergence adjustments are necessary for your TV.

BEGIN

Select CONVERGENCE control.

With PICTURE MENU (2 of 2) on screen, move the RED highlight with the MENU (a) buttons. Then press the MENU button.

- 2 If there is RED or BLUE color fringing on the White cross, press the MENU button to continue.
- TV screen.


The red or blue cross is properly adjusted when it is completely merged with the white cross. (No color appears around the edge of the white cross).

Press the STATUS button to clear the screen when convergence adjustments are complete.



SMART HELP

Remember. Convergence has been set at the factory for best viewing, but if one or more of the (red or blue) colors appear around the edges of objects (color fringing) follow the steps given in this section.



FEATURE MENU CONTROL ADJUSTMENTS

PICTURE SOURCE

The picture for the TV can come through either the ANTENNA plug or the AUDIO/VIDEO INput jacks (on the rear of the TV). The Picture Source control simply tells the TV which one of these picture sources it is to show on the TV screen.

BEGIN

Select PICTURE SOURCE | SELECT control.

With the FEATURES MENU on screen, move the RED highlight with the MENU (•) buttons. Then press the MENU button.

Press the MENU AV buttons
to move the RED highlight. Press
the MENU button to turn the desired
PICTURE SOURCE control ON
().

ANTENNA- for a picture signal coming from the ANTENNA plug on the TV.


AUX 1 VIDEO- for a picture signal coming from the AUX 1 Video Input jack on the rear of the TV.


AUX 1 Y PB PR- for picture signals coming from the component (Y PB PR) luminance and color input jacks on the rear of the TV.

AUX 2 VIDEO- for a picture signal coming from the AUX 2 Video Input jack on the rear of the TV.

3 Press the STATUS button to clear the screen.







CLOSED CAPTION

Closed Captioning (CC) allows you to read the voice content of television programs on the TV screen. Designed to help the hearing impaired this feature uses on-screen "text boxes" to show dialogue and conversations while the TV program is in progress.

(BEGIN)

Select CLOSED CAPTIONING control.

With the FEATURES MENU on screen, move the RED highlight with the MENU (buttons. Then press the MENU button.

2 Press the MENU **△** buttons

to move the RED highlight. Press the MENU button to select () the desired Closed Caption mode - For Example: "ALWAYS ON" and "CAPTION 1".

CAPTION 1, 2, 3, 4:

dialogue (and descriptions) for the action on the captioned TV program shows on-screen. (See Important Note on this page.)

TEXT 1, 2, 3, 4:

often used for channel guide, schedules, or bulletin board information for CC programs.


3 After making your Caption mode selection, press the STATUS button to clear the TV screen. The selected Closed Caption mode will be active.

To cancel, set the Closed Captioned feature to OFF when finished viewing.

SMART HELP

Remember. Broadcast stations will often use spelling abbreviations, symbols, dropouts and other grammatical shortcuts in order to keep pace with the on-screen action. These type factors vary upon the source of the captioned text material and do not indicate a need for service on the part of the TV.

NOTE: Not all TV programs and product commercials are made for broadcast with Closed Caption (CC) information included. Neither are all Closed Caption modes (CAPTION 1-4; or TEXT 1-4) necessarily being used by a broadcast station during the transmission of a closed caption program. Usually "CAPTION 1" is the most used mode to view captioned material. Refer to your area's TV program listings for the stations and times of Closed Caption shows.



CABLE TUNING

NOTE: If you went through First Time Setup (in your Quick Use Guide), this task has already been completed for you.

You need to make sure the TV is set to pick up either Cable TV or Antenna signals. In other words, the TV needs to know if you connected a Cable TV signal or a normal antenna to its ANTENNA plug.

(BEGIN)

Select CABLE CHANNEL TUNING control.

With the FEATURES MENU on screen, move the RED highlight with the MENU buttons.

Then press the MENU button.

2 Press the MENU ▲▼ buttons
to move the RED highlight. Press
the MENU button to select () the
desired mode - For Example:
CABLE.

CABLE- If you DO have


Cable TV connected to the TV. Channels 1-125 are available.

NORMAL- If you have an

Antenna connected to the TV. Channels 2-69 are available.

3 Press the STATUS button to clear the screen.





CHANNEL MEMORY

AUTO-PROGRAMMING

NOTE: If you went through First Time Setup (in your Quick Use Guide), this task has already been completed for you.

Your TV can automatically set itself for local area (or Cable TV) channels. This makes it easy for you to select only the TV stations in your area when the CHANNEL ▲ ▼ buttons are pressed.

BEGIN

Select CHANNEL MEMORY (START AUTO-PROGRAM-MING) control.

With the FEATURES MENU on screen, move the RED highlight with the MENU (buttons. Then press the MENU button.

Press the MENU button to turn AUTO-PROGRAMMING ON .

The TV shows which channel numbers are "SAVED" () as they are added into memory.

"Auto-programming CHANNEL MEMORY is finished" shows when the TV is through adding channels.

Press the STATUS or Menu button to clear the screen.




SMART HELP

Try it out. **Press the CHANNEL** ▼ **buttons** and

see which channels you can select.

Remember. An Antenna or Cable TV signal must first be connected to your TV so that channels can be saved.

If you want to delete any unwanted channels from the TV's memory, see "ADD/DELETE CHANNELS" on the next page.



ADD/DELETE CHANNELS

Auto-Programming (see previous page) adds all the channels it can find (on your Antenna or Cable TV system) into the TV's memory. Add/Delete Channels makes it easy for you to add other channels, or drop unwanted channels, from the list of channels in the TV's memory.

(BEGIN)

Select CHANNEL MEMORY
(ADD/DELETE CHANNELS)
control.

With the FEATURES MENU on screen, move the RED highlight with the MENU (•) buttons. Then press the MENU button.

- Press the CHANNEL Number buttons to select the channel you want to add or delete.
- 3 Press the MENU ▶ button to ADD the channel into the TV's memory.

Press the MENU ◀ button to DELETE the channel from memory.

Repeat steps 2 and 3 for each channel you wish to add or delete.

Press the STATUS or MENU button to clear the screen.




SMART HELP

Remember. You can also add the AUX 1 VIDEO,
AUX 2 VIDEO, or AUX 1 Y PB
PR, modes just like a channel.
Then by pressing the CHANNEL

Then by buttons the AUX(iliary)
mode can quickly be selected to use the desired set of Input jacks (see page 28).

Note: AUX(iliary) VIDEO modes are located between the lowest and highest channel numbers within the ADD/DELETE CHANNEL control screen.



SET CLOCK

NOTE: If you went through First Time Setup (in your Quick Use Guide), this task has already been completed for you.

Your TV comes with an on-screen clock. During normal operation the clock appears on the screen with every channel change (and when the STATUS button is pressed).

(BEGIN)

1 Select SET CLOCK control.


With FEATURES MENU (2 of 3) on screen, move the RED highlight with the MENU (buttons. Then press the MENU button.

Press the remote's number buttons to set the time clock.

The remote's MENU buttons can also be used to set the hours, minutes and AM/PM portions of the clock.

3 Press the STATUS button to set the clock in operation and clear the screen.

STOP



HALF HOUR REMINDER

With the Half Hour Reminder control the TV automatically shows you the current time and channel every thirty minutes.

BEGIN


Select HALF HOUR REMINDER control.

With FEATURES MENU (2 of 3) on screen, move the RED highlight with the MENU (buttons. Then press the MENU button.

Press the MENU ▲▼ and MENU buttons to highlight and select (✓) the EVERY HALF HOUR item.

Press the STATUS button to clear the screen.





SET ALARM TIMER


Just like an alarm clock you can set the TV to turn itself on at the same time everyday.

(BEGIN)

Select SET ALARM TIMER control.

With FEATURES MENU (2 of 3) on screen, move the RED highlight with the MENU (•) buttons. Then press the MENU button.

- Press the MENU ▲▼ and MENU buttons to highlight and select "ON" (▶).
- Press the MENU ▲▼ and then the MENU buttons to select "SET ALARM TIME".
- Press the remote's number buttons to set the "TURN ON" time for the TV. (Press MENU ▲ ▼ for AM or PM.)
- Fress the STATUS button to set the "ALARM TIME" and clear the screen.



SLEEP TIMER

Have you ever fallen asleep in front of the TV only to have it wake you up at two in the morning with a test pattern screeching in your ears? Well, your TV can save you all that trouble by automatically turning itself off.

BEGIN

Press the SLEEP button on the remote control.

Note: you can also select the SLEEP control with the TV's onscreen FEATURES MENU (2 of 3). Move the RED highlight with the MENU (a) buttons. Then press the MENU button.

Press the SLEEP button repeatedly to pick the amount of time (15 minutes to 2 hours ahead) before the TV will turn itself off.



SMART HELP



To stop a SLEEP TIMER setting, reset the timer back to OFF. (Turning the TV off and on, or pressing a button during the last minute of a timer setting, will also cancel a setting.)

A few seconds before the TV is to shut off a message will come on the screen telling you GOOD NIGHT.

PARENTAL CONTROL SETUP CODE NUMBER

Parental Control allows parents to block out, or "censor", any channels they think children should not watch. A channel placed under Parental Control cannot be viewed until a correct access code is used to unlock the channel for viewing.

First let's set your Parental Code:

BEGIN

Select the PARENTAL CON-

With FEATURES MENU (3 of 3) on screen, move the RED highlight with the MENU (buttons. Then press the MENU button.

- 2 Press the MENU ▲▼ and
 MENU buttons to highlight and select the SETUP CODE item.
- Press 0, 7, 1, 1 on the remote.

 "XXXX" shows on the ACCESS

 CODE SETUP screen as you press
 the number buttons.

"INCORRECT ACCESS CODE - TRY AGAIN" will also show on the screen.

Press 0, 7, 1, 1 on the remote again.

"Next Enter Your New Access Code" shows on the screen.

Enter a new four digit number code using the remote.


"Access Code Changed" shows on the screen to let you know the new code has been set.

Continue to the next page to find out how to "BLOCK" channels from viewing.

SMART HELP

Note to Parents - it isn't possible to unlock or defeat your Censor Access Code without changing to a new code number. So if your Code number changes, and you didn't change it yourself, then you will know that someone has altered the code and the blanked out channel has been viewed.

NOTE:Your TV left the factory with the Parental Code set to "0000". If you are using your TV and the Parental Control for the first time, and don't want to SETUP a new Access code number, you can use the "0000" number to block channels - see next page. The "0711" Parental Code (shown on this page) is given as a default or way to reset the Code when the current Access number is not known.



- Press MENU to go on and start to "block" channels.
- Press MENU
 to go to "Content Advisory" (or TV and Movie Ratings system of channel blocking).
- Press MENU to return to the Parental Control Menu screen.
- Press STATUS to clear the screen.

PARENTAL CONTROL CHANNEL BLOCKING

fter you Setup your personal **1** Parental Access Code number (see previous page), you are now ready to select the channels you want to block out or censor from viewing.

BEGIN

1 Select the CHANNEL **BLOCKING** control.

> With FEATURES MENU (3 of 3) on screen, move the RED highlight with the MENU (buttons. Then press the MENU button.

- $\langle 2 \rangle$ Press the MENU $\blacktriangle \nabla$ and MENU buttons to highlight and select the CHANNEL BLOCKING Menu item.
- 3 Enter the correct Parental **Code** number (see previous page).
- **4** Press Channel Number buttons to select the channel you want to block.
- **(5) Press the MENU ▶** button to "BLOCK VIEWING" on the selected channel.

Press the MENU **◄** button to "ALLOW VIEWING" on a blocked channel.


Repeat steps 4 and 5 for any other channels you wish to block out.



SMART HELP

Remember, to make TV viewing easier all channels (and Audio/Video Input jacks) will be unblocked, once the correct Parental Code number has been entered.

When the TV is turned OFF and then back ON again, Parental Control is back in place for all channels.



(Appears when an attempt to select a blocked channel is made and Parental Control is ON.)

PARENTAL CONTROL CONTENT ADVISORY

nother new area available to **1** parents for the censoring of program material is through the TV Guidelines and Movie Ratings system. Program Content Advisory data will soon be contained within the broadcast signals of received TV programs. When setup by the parent or viewer, the TV can respond to transmitted advisory data by blocking out or denying access to TV shows (based on whether the program meets or exceeds the limitations you select as viewable). The TV program can then only be viewed by entering the correct and current Parental Code Access number.

The Content Advisory system uses both "Movie Ratings" and a "Parental Guidelines" form of censoring. Refer to the following page sections for explanations on the different Rating system levels and their uses.



NOTE: In normal Content Advisory system operation the TV screen will display a message when programming is blocked by a Movie Rating, Parental Guideline, or Blocking Option control feature. Entering the correct ACCESS CODE number will unblock all the blocked Content Advisory Rated channels until the TV is turned Off. CONTENT ADVISORY MOVIE RATINGS

Movie Ratings set viewing access levels for TV programming according to current Motion Picture Association of America (MPAA) ratings. These ratings are similar to the categories used with the rated movies appearing in cinema theaters and with video rental material.







Note: When a Movie Rating is selected () all higher level ratings are automatically blocked (although each individual Movie Rating can be manually selected and turned On or Off as desired). Programs with lower than the selected rating level are allowed for viewing or unblocked.







- **G General Audience:** Most parents would find this program suitable for all ages. This type of programming contains little or no violence, no strong language, and little or no sexual dialogue or situations.
- PG Parental Guidance: This programming contains material that parents may find unsuitable for younger children. It may contain one or more of the following: Moderate violence, some sexual situations, infrequent coarse language, or some suggestive dialogue.
- PG-13: This programming contains material that parents may find unsuitable for children under the age of 13. It contains one or more of the following: violence, sexual situations, coarse language, or suggestive dialogue.
- R Restricted: This programming is specifically designed for adults. Anyone under the age of 17 should only view this programming with an accompanying parent or adult guardian. It contains one or more of the following: intense violence, intense sexual situations, strong coarse language, or intensely suggestive dialogue.
- NC-17 No one under 17 admitted: This type of programming should be viewed by adults only. It contains graphic violence, explicit sex, or crude indecent language.
- X Mature audience only: This type of programming contains one or more of the following: very graphic violence, very graphic and explicit or indecent sexual acts, very coarse and intensely suggestive language.

CONTENT ADVISORY PARENTAL GUIDELINES

Parental Guidelines can be even more defined and specific in the degree and extent of material parents may allow for TV program viewing. Sub-settings for Language, Violence, and other blocking factors can be manually switched On or Off for use within the major Parental Guideline categories (TV-Y7, TV-PG, etc.).







The TV-Y7; TV-PG;
TV-14; and TV-MA guidelines also include customized settings for various additional items such as V (violence), S (sexual situations), L (coarse language), D (suggestive dialogue), and FV (fantasy violence). These additional settings are category specific and can be individually selected for use as desired.







- TV-Y Appropriate for all children: Designed for a very young audience, including children ages 2-6. This type of programming is not expected to frighten younger children.
- TV-Y7 -Appropriate for children seven and older: It may be more appropriate for children who have acquired the development skills needed to distinguish between make-believe and reality. This programming may include mild fantasy and comic violence (FV).
- TV-G General Audience: This type of programming contains little or no violence, no strong language, and little or no sexual dialogue or situations.
- TV-PG Parental Guidance suggested: This type of programming contains one or more of the following: Moderate violence (V), some sexual situations (S), infrequent coarse language (L), or some suggestive dialogue (D).
- TV-14 Unsuitable for children under 14: This type of programming contains one or more of the following: intense violence (V), intense sexual situations (S), strong coarse language (L), or intensely suggestive dialogue (D).
- TV-MA Mature audience only: This type of programming contains one or more of the following: graphic violence (V), explicit sexual situations (S), or crude indecent language (L).
- (V) Violence
- (S) Sexual situations
- (L) Language
- (D) Inappropriate dialogue
- **(FV) Fantasy Violence** may frighten children under seven. Some cartoons may have this rating. Available in the TV-Y7 category only.





Note: Remember that Content Advisory data or encoded information is not available with all received TV programming (this also includes commercials, and other program spot announcements). Broadcaster's can decide **not to encode** any kind of content advisory ratings with their programming, or they can actually choose to **encode programs to be "unrated**."

The TV Blocking Options allow the viewer to block any program without content advisory data with the use of its "NO RATING INFORMATION" control. And to block programs that are encoded as "unrated" with its "UNRATED PROGRAMMING" control option.

Since the reception of Content Advisory data can take a few seconds, you may want to use the "CHANNEL CHANGE" option to be sure no viewing is allowed during blocked program channel changes. This can eliminate the display of a few seconds of undesirable video on the TV, or receiving scenes from a Ratings blocked channel source.




SECOND AUDIO PROGRAM

Second Audio Program (SAP) is part of the stereo broadcast system. Sent as a third audio channel SAP can be heard apart from the current TV program sound. TV stations are free to use SAP for any number of purposes, but many experts believe it will be used for foreign language translations of TV shows (or for weather and news bulletins.)

NOTE: If a SAP signal is not present with a selected program, the SAP option can not be selected. "This program does not contain SAP information" will show on the TV screen.





SECOND PROGRAM SOUND CAN ONLY BE SELECTED () WHEN SAP INFORMATION IS PRESENT ON CURRENT CHANNEL.

NOTE: The TV's FIXED AUDIO OUTPUT jacks can also be used for the playback of TV program sound with an external audio amplifier, or home theater hi-fi system. Connection of the FIXED AUDIO OUT(puts) is similar to the Variable Audio Outputs (as shown above). However, specific sound level adjustments will be made with the controls at the external amplifier or home sound system (instead of through the TV's audio level controls.)

SURROUND SOUND

By adding optional external speakers to the TV's sound system, you can create the feeling of reflected sound that surrounds you at a movie theater or concert hall.







The S(uper)-Video connection on the rear of the TV can give you better picture detail and clarity, for the playback of S-VHS VCR tapes or Video Discs, than the normal antenna picture connections.

Note: The VCR (or Video Disc Player) must have a S-VIDEO OUT(put) jack in order for you to complete the connections shown on this page.

Connect the S-VIDEO (S-VHS) OUT jack from the VCR to the S-VIDEO AUX 1 IN(put) jack on the TV.

The S-VIDEO connecting cable will be supplied with the S-VHS VCR (or Video Disc Player).

Z Connect the AUDIO OUT jacks R(ight) and L(eft) from the VCR to the AUDIO AUX 1 IN(put) jacks on the TV.

Select the "AUX 1 S-VIDEO"
PICTURE SOURCE control.

With the FEATURES MENU on screen, move the RED highlight with the MENU (buttons. Then press the MENU button.


The "AUX 1 S VIDEO" picture source option appears only when a S-VIDEO cable has been connected to the TV's AUX 1 IN(puts).

COMPONENT VIDEO INPUTS

Component Video Inputs provide for the highest possible color and picture resolution in the playback of digital signal source material such as with DVD players. The color difference signals (PB, PR) and the luminance (Y) signal are connected and received separately which permits for improved color bandwidth information (not possible when using composite video or S-Video connections).



Refer to your DVD or digital accessory Owner's Manual for definitions and connection details.



USING THE AUDIO/VIDEO OUTPUT JACKS

AUDIO/VIDEO OUTPUTS

The Audio/Video Output jacks on the TV can be used to record TV programs on VCRs which have Audio/Video Input jacks.

To record TV programs by using the Audio/Video jacks on the TV:

- Connect the VIDEO OUT jack from the TV to the VIDEO IN jack on the VCR.



Remember, if the VCR has an INPUT SELECTOR switch, place it in the LINE or CAMERA position.

Unattended Timer Recordings with a VCR are possible, but not recommended with this connection since the TV must be left ON for the VCR to record.







TIPS IF SOMETHING ISN'T WORKING



Please make these simple checks before calling for service. These tips can save you time and money since charges for TV installation and adjustment of customer controls are not covered under your warranty.

CAUTION: A video source (such as a video game, Compact Disc Interactive - CDI, or TV information channel) which shows a constant non-moving pattern on the TV screen, can cause picture tube damage. When your TV is continuously used with such a source the pattern of the non-moving portion of the game (CDI, etc.) could leave an image permanently on the picture tube. When not in use, turn the video source OFF. Regularly alternate the use of such video sources with normal TV viewing.

No Power

- Check the TV power cord. Unplug the TV, wait 1 minute, then reinsert plug into outlet and push POWER button again.
- Check to be sure outlet is not on a wall switch.

- Check antenna connections on the rear of the TV. Are they properly secured to the antenna plug on the TV?
- Check the CABLE TUNING control for correct position.
- Check PICTURE SOURCE control for correct position ANTENNA; AUX 1/AUX2 VIDEO; or AUX Y PB PR position without a signal source connection will result in a blank screen.
- Check the CLOSED CAPTIONS control. Some TEXT modes could block the screen.

No Sound

No Picture

- Check the VOLUME buttons.
- Check the MUTE button on the remote control.
- Check the TV SPEAKER ON/OFF control for the correct position.
- If attempting auxiliary equipment hook-ups, check audio jack connections and that the auxiliary equipment is on and in the proper operating modes.

Remote Does Not Work

- Check batteries. Replace with AAA Heavy Duty (Zinc Chloride) or Alkaline batteries if necessary.
- Clean the remote and the remote sensor window on the TV.

TV Displays Wrong Channel or No Channels Above 13

- Repeat channel selection.
- Add desired channel numbers (ADD/DELETE CHANNELS control) into TV memory.
- Check CABLE TUNING control for correct position.

This TV is equipped with protective circuitry that shuts the TV off in case of moderate power surges. Should this occur turn the TV back on by pressing the POWER button once or twice, or unplug and then replug the power cord at the AC outlet. This feature is NOT designed to prevent damage due to high power surges such as those caused by lightning, which is not covered by your warranty.

Cleaning and Care

- To avoid possible shock hazard be sure the TV is unplugged from the electrical outlet before cleaning.
- When cleaning the TV screen take care not to scratch or damage the screen surface (avoid wearing jewelry or using anything abrasive- do not use household cleaners). Wipe the front screen with a clean cloth dampened with water. Use even, easy, vertical strokes when cleaning.
- Specially designed screen cleaning kits are also available which contain anti-static cleaners and cloths designed to get into the ridges of the TV screen. If interested, ask your dealer about an optional Projection TV Screen Cleaning Kit or call our toll-free Accessory Parts ordering number 1-800-851-8885.
- Gently wipe the cabinet surfaces with a clean cloth or sponge dampened in a solution of cool clear water and a mild soap or detergent. Use a clean dry cloth to dry the wiped surfaces.
- Occasionally vacuum the ventilation holes or slots in the cabinet back.
- Never use thinners, insecticide sprays, or other chemicals on or near the cabinet, as they might cause permanent marring of the cabinet finish.



GLOSSARY TO TELEVISION TERMS

Audio/Video Inputs * Located on the rear of the TV these connectors (RCA phono type plug) are used for the input of audio and video signals. Designed for use with VCRs (or other accessories) in order to receive higher picture resolution and offer sound connection options.

Coaxial Cable * A single solid antenna wire normally matched with a metal plug (F-type) end connector that screws (or pushes) directly onto a 75 Ohm input found on the Television or VCR.

Display * An on screen message or graphics that help the user operate and adjust TV feature controls. See On Screen Displays (OSD).

Identify* Method by which a remote control searches and finds an operating code for another product (such as a VCR or Cable Converter). Once the code has been "identified" then the TV remote can operate and send commands to the other product.

LED * Light Emitting Diode or indicator.

Menu * An on-screen listing of feature controls shown on the TV screen that are made available for user adjustments.

Multichannel Television Sound (MTS) * The broadcast standard that allows for stereo sound to be transmitted with the TV picture.

On Screen Displays (OSD) * Refers to the wording or messages generated by the TV to help the user with specific feature controls (color adjustment, programming, etc.).

Pre-Amplifier * The control center of a hi-fi system. Not only amplifies source inputs, but also allows for source selection, volume, tone, balance and all other controls that affect the sound.

Programming * The procedure of adding or deleting channel numbers into the TV's memory circuits. In this way the TV "remembers" only the locally available or desired channel numbers and skips over any unwanted channel numbers.

PTV * Projection Television (Rear and/or Front projection design systems are available.)

Remote Sensor Window * A window or opening found on the TV control panel through which infrared remote control command signals are received.

RF * Radio Frequency or modulated signal design used as the carrier for television broadcasts.

Second Audio Program (SAP) * Another or additional audio channel provided for in the Multichannel Television Sound (MTS) broadcast standard. A monaural soundtrack included within the recorded or video signal (usually containing a second language translation for the displayed programming.)

Status * Allows the user to quickly confirm what channel number is currently being viewed. Status can also be used to clear the TV of on-screen displays or information (rather than waiting for the displays to "time out" or automatically disappear from the screen).

S-Video Input * Allows direct connection of high-resolution video sources, such as a Super VHS videocassette recorder, Laser Disc player, etc. Provides improved picture resolution, sharpness, and clarity.

Twin Lead Wire * The more commonly used name for the two strand 300 Ohm antenna wire used with many indoor and outdoor antenna systems. In many cases this type of antenna wire requires an additional adapter (or balun) in order to connect to the 75 Ohm Input terminals designed into the more recent Televisions and VCRs.

Variable Audio Output * An adjustable audio output which allows for volume variations at the source.
