

Attaching/Detaching the Stand




Detaching the stand neck for wall mounting

- 3 ① Place the hinge plate in the TV set as illustration shown.
 - ② Place the stand cover in the TV set and tighten the 4 screws into the 4 holes.





Using the Remote Control Unit

Use the remote control unit by pointing it towards the remote control sensor on the TV. Objects between the remote control unit and the remote control sensor may prevent proper operation.



■ Cautions regarding the remote control unit

- Do not expose the remote control unit to shock. In addition, do not expose the remote control unit to liquids, and do not place in an area with high humidity.
- Do not install or place the remote control unit under direct sunlight. The heat may cause deformation of the remote control unit.
- The remote control unit may not work properly if the remote control sensor on the TV is under direct sunlight or strong lighting. In such cases, change the angle of the lighting or the TV, or operate the remote control unit closer to the remote control sensor.



IMPORTANT:

The POWER indicator on the television should light GREEN indicating you have power to the television. If the POWER indicator on the television still does not light up, press POWER on the remote control to turn the power on.


Preparation

Antennas

To enjoy a clearer picture, use an outdoor antenna. The following is a brief explanation of the types of connections that are used for a coaxial cable. If your outdoor antenna uses a 75-ohm coaxial cable with an F-type connector, plug it into the antenna terminal at the rear of the TV set.

1.A 75-ohm system is generally a round cable with F-type connector that can easily be attached to a terminal without tools (Commercially available).

 A 300-ohm system is a flat "twin-lead" cable that can be attached to a 75-ohm terminal through a 300/75-ohm adapter (Commercially available).



75-ohm coaxial cable

NOTE F-type connector should be finger-tightened only.

When connecting the RF cable to the TV set, do not tighten F-type connector with tools.


If tools are used, it may cause damage to your TV set. (The breaking of internal circuit, etc.)



Connecting Antenna Cable

• Connect the antenna cable to the TV using one of the methods in the illustration as shown (1, 2, 3 or 4).

- 1 Cable without a CATV converter
- ② VHF/UHF antenna
- ③ Combination VHF/ UHF antenna
- 4 Separate VHF/UHF



Installing Batteries in the Remote Control Unit

If the remote control fails to operate TV functions, replace the batteries in the remote control unit.


1 Open the battery cover.



2 Insert two "AA" size batteries (supplied with the product).



 Place the batteries with their terminals corresponding to the (+) and (-) indications in the battery compartment.







CAUTION








TV (Side/Rear)

Remote Control Unit



NOTE

• When using the remote control unit, point it at the TV.

- 1 POWER: Switch the power on or enters standby mode. (See page 13.)
- 2 0-9: Set the channel.
- **3 (DOT):** (See page 14.)
- **4 SURROUND:** Display the surround setting menu. (See page 14.)
- 5 FREEZE: Set the still image. Press again to return to normal screen.
- 6 SLEEP: Allows you to set a time when the TV automatically switches to standby. Each time you press this button, the remaining time setting switches by 5 minutes up to 3 hours. This display will disappear after a few seconds, and the sleep timer automatically starts counting down.
 - If you want to adjust the sleep timer again, you can press this button repeatedly then change the time setting.
 - The TV will enter the standby mode when the remaining time reaches zero.
- **7 EXIT:** Turn off the menu screen.
- 8 CC: Display captions during closed-caption source. (See page 15.)
- **9 AUDIO:** Display the MTS setting menu. (See page 15.)
- 10 FAVORITE CH
 - **A**, **B**, **C**, **D**: Select 4 preset favorite channels in 4 different categories. (See page 23 for details.) While watching, you can toggle the selected channels by pressing **A**, **B**, **C** and **D**.
- **11 DISPLAY:** Display the current channel (or input source) information on the screen.
- **12 INPUT:** Select a TV input source. (See page 14.)
- 13 MUTE: Mute the sound. "MUTE" will be displayed on the screen, and the sound is silenced. The muting feature can be released by pressing this button again or one of the VOL +/- buttons.
- **14 VOL +/-:** Set the volume. (See page 14.)
- 15 CHV/A: Select the channel. (See page 14.)
- 16 ENT: Jumps to a channel after selecting with the 0-9 buttons.
- 17 FLASHBACK: Press to switch to the previously tuned channel. Press again to switch back to the currently tuned channel.
 - This function will not work if no channel has been changed after the TV is turned on.
- 18 MENU: Display the menu screen.
- 19 ▲/▼/◄/▶ENTER: Select a desired item on the screen.
- 20 RETURN: Return to the previous menu screen.

Connecting to External Equipment

You can connect many types of external equipment to your TV like a Blu-ray disc player, HD-DVD player, DVD player, VCR, Digital TV tuner, HDMI equipment, game console or camcorder. To view external source images, select the input source from **INPUT** on the remote control unit or on the TV. (See page 14.)

- To protect equipment, always turn off the TV before connecting any external equipment.
- Please read the relevant operation manual (Blu-ray disc player, etc.) carefully before making connections.



Watching TV

Turning On/Off the Power



Press **POWER** on the TV, or **POWER** on the remote control unit to turn the power on.

 POWER indicator (Green): The TV is on. (After a few seconds, a window appears with sound.)

Press **POWER** on the TV, or **POWER** on the remote control unit again to turn the power off.

- The TV enters standby and the image on the screen disappears.
- POWER indicator (Red): The TV is standby.



- · Weak electric power is still consumed even when the TV is turned off.
- If there is no signal input for 30 minutes, the power will turn to standby mode automatically.

Initial Setup

When you turn on the TV for the first time, it will automatically memorize the broadcasting channels available in the region where you live. Perform the following steps before you press **POWER** on the remote control unit.

- 1. Insert the batteries into the remote control unit. (See page 8.)
- 2. Connect the antenna cable to the TV. (See page 8.)
- 3. Plug in the AC cord to the AC outlet. (See page 7.)



Language (Language setting)

Select from among 3 languages: English, French and Spanish.

1 Press ▲/▼ to select the desired language listed on the screen, and then press the B button.



2 If you are connecting to a HD cable box, press the A button to exit. If you are connecting to Antenna or Cable from wall outlet, press the B button to next step.



Air/Cable (Antenna setting)

Make sure what kind of connection is made with your TV when selecting "Air" or "Cable".

3 Press **△**/▼ to select "Air" or "Cable". Press the **B** button to continue.





4 Press the A button to finish.

 Auto programming may take up to 20 minutes to complete. Digital channels will take longer than Analog to find and program. Please wait until you see the Auto programming complete message. The TV will then switch automatically to the first channel found.

Changing Channels

You can change channels by pressing **CH**∧√ or **0-9**, • (DOT).

Examples:

To select a 1 or 2-digit channel number (e. g., Channel 5):

Changing Volume



You can change the volume by pressing **VOL+**/- on the TV or on the remote control unit.

- •To increase the volume, press **VOL +**.

MUTE

Mutes the current sound output.

Press **MUTE**.

NOTE

- Mute can be canceled by using the method below.
 - Mute will be canceled if you press **VOL**+/- or **MUTE**.

Sleep Timer

Allows you to set a time when the TV automatically switches to standby.

Press SLEEP.

- The remaining time displays when the sleep timer has been set
- Each time you press SLEEP, the remaining time switches as shown below.

- When set, the time automatically starts counting down.
- If you want to adjust the sleep timer, you can press SLEEP twice then change the time setting.
- One minute before the time expires, the remaining time displays every second.

NOTE

- Select "0" by pressing **SLEEP** to cancel the sleep timer.
- The TV will enter standby mode (power indicator lights red) when the remaining time reaches zero.

FLASHBACK

Press **FLASHBACK** to switch to the previously tuned channel.

 Press FLASHBACK again to switch back to the currently tuned channel.

NOTE

FLASHBACK will not work if no channel has been changed after the TV is turned on.

SURROUND

The surround function produces Surround effect from the speakers. Each time you press **SURROUND**, the mode changes.

 Press SURROUND to toggle between Mono, Stereo, and Virtual surround modes.

NOTE

 You can have the same settings by choosing "Surround" on the menu items. (See page 19.)

FREEZE

Allows you to capture and freeze a moving image that you are watching.

Press FREEZE.

- A moving image is captured.
- Press FREEZE again to cancel the function.

NOTE

- When this function is not available, "O" will display.
- If you are using the freeze function and a broadcast activates the V-CHIP BLOCK, the freeze function will be canceled and a V-CHIP BLOCK message will appear.

INPU

To view external source images, select the input source using **INPUT** on the remote control unit or on the TV.

- 1 Press INPUT.
 - A list of selectable sources appears.
- 2 Press INPUT again or press ▲/▼ to select the input source.
 - An image from the selected source automatically displays.
 - Each time **INPUT** is pressed, the input source toggles.
 - If the corresponding input is not plugged in, you cannot change the input. Be sure to connect the equipment beforehand.

NOTE

See page 12 for external equipment connection.

AV MODE

AV MODE gives you 5 viewing options to choose from to best match the surrounding environment of the TV, which can vary due to factors like room brightness, type of program watched or the type of image input from external equipment.

Press AV MODE. Current AV MODE displays.

 Press AV MODE again before the mode displayed on the screen disappears. The mode changes as shown below:

USER: Allows the user to customized settings as desired. You can set the mode for each input source.

DYMAMIC: Changes the image and sound settings to the factory preset values.

STANDARD: For normal TV viewing.

MOVIE: Brilliant picture settings for a cinematic

GAME: Lowers image brightness for easier viewing.

AUDIO

■ MTS/SAP stereo mode

The TV has a feature that allows reception of sound other than the main audio for the program. This feature is called Multi-channel Television Sound (MTS). The TV with MTS can receive mono sound, stereo sound and Secondary Audio Programs (SAP). The SAP feature allows a TV station to broadcast other information, which could be audio in another language or something completely different like weather information.

You can enjoy Hi-Fi stereo sound or SAP broadcasts where available.

- Stereo broadcasts: View programs like live sporting events, shows and concerts in dynamic stereo sound.
- SAP broadcasts: Receive TV broadcasts in either MAIN or SAP sound.

MAIN sound: The normal program soundtrack (either in mono or stereo).

SAP sound: Listen to a second language, supplementary commentary or other information. (SAP is mono sound.)

If stereo sound is difficult to hear.

 Obtain a clearer sound by manually switching to fixed mono-sound mode.

You can change MTS as shown below to match the television broadcast signal.

Press AUDIO to toggle between audio modes.

Examples: when receiving MTS and SAP MAIN + SAP mode: MAIN - SAP

MONO mode: MONO

■ Digital broadcasting audio mode

The types of audio transmitted in a digital broadcast include SURROUND as well as MONO and STEREO. In addition, it is possible for multiple audio tracks to accompany a single video track.

Press AUDIO to toggle between audio modes.

Example: when receiving Digital broadcasting STEREO (Audio1) → STEREO (Audio2)

SURROUND (Audio3)

NOTE

MTS only operates while in TV mode.

Closed Captions and Digital Closed Captions

Your TV is equipped with an internal Closed Caption decoder. It allows you to view conversations, narration and sound effects as subtitles on your TV. Closed Captions are available on some TV programs and on some VHS home video tapes at the discretion of the program provider.

Digital Closed Caption service is a new caption service available only on digital TV programs (also at the discretion of the service provider). It is a more flexible system than the original Closed Caption system, because it allows for a variety of caption sizes and font styles. When the Digital Closed Caption service is in use, it will be indicated by the appearance of a 3-letter abbreviation that also indicates the language of the Digital Closed Captions: ENG (English), SPA (Spanish), FRA (French) or other language codes.

Not all programs and VHS videotapes offer closed captions. Please press **DISPLAY** and look for CC presence information.

In the Closed Caption system, there can be more than one caption service provided. Each is identified by its own number. The "CC1" and "CC2" services display subtitles of TV programs superimposed over the program's picture.

In the Closed Caption system, the "Text1" or "Text2" services display text that is unrelated to the program being viewed (e.g., weather or news). These services are also superimposed over the program currently being viewed.

- 1 Press **DISPLAY**.
 - This will present the Closed Caption information display.
- 2 Press CC while the Closed Caption setting is on the screen.
 - Press repeatedly until you select the desired closed caption service.

Off \rightarrow On \rightarrow On during mute

VIEW MODE

You can select the screen size.

1 Press VIEW MODE.

- The View Mode menu displays.
- The menu lists the View Mode options selectable for the type of video signal currently being received.

Closed Captions Setting

This displays the transmitted CC- or CS-text on the screen according to your chosen CC or CS service. This text can either be permanently displayed (assuming that the service is available in the broadcast) or only when mute is active.

Use \triangle/∇ to toggle between "On", "Off", and "On during mute" and press d to confirm the change. (see page 15.)

Caption Services Setting

This allows you to select the Closed captions service levels of analog broadcasting to be displayed. Closed captioning allows you to read the voice content of television programs on the TV screen. Designed to help the hearing impaired, this feature uses on-screen "text boxes" to show dialogue and conversations while the TV program is in progress. Captions will appear on the screen during captioned broadcasts.

- CC1,2,3 or 4
 Dialogue (and descriptions) for the action on the captioned TV program shows on screen. Usually CC1 is the most used. CC2 can be used for alternate languages if they are being transmitted.
- T1,2,3 or 4
 Often used for channel guide, schedules, bulletin board information for Closed captions programs, news, weather informations or stock market reports. Not all Caption services are necessarily being used by a TV channel during the transmission of a Closed caption program.

Digital Caption Service Setting

This allows you to configure the way you choose to view digital captioning. Select one of the digital service channels made available by the caption provider. There are six standard services. Service 1 is designated as the Primary Caption Service. This service contains the verbatim, or near-verbatim captions for the primary language being spoken in the accompanying program audio. Service 2 is designated as the Secondary Language Service. This service contains captions in a secondary language, which is a translation of the captions in the primary Caption Service. The other service sub channels are not preassigned. It is up to the discretion of the individual caption provider to utilize the remaining service channels.

Digital Caption Options Setting

This allows you to modify how digital captions are displayed on you TV. Select from the following options to change the visual characteristics of the TV's digital captioning

- **Reset to default:** Selects this option to reset the digital caption options to the captions provider default settings.
- Size: Selects this option to choose a caption display size according to your own preference. Select "Default", "Small", "Standard", or "Large".
- **Text:** Selects this option to choose caption display text box, text color and/or the opacity according to your own preference. Select a "Color" and an "Opacity" option.
- **Background:** Selects this option to choose caption display character back ground color or one of the background opacity options according to your own preference. Select a "Color" and one of the "Opacity" options.
- **Edge:** Selects this option to choose caption display edge color or one of the type options according to your own preference.

 Only digital caption options can be selected in "Caption service" of "Features" menu.





Canada English Ratings Lock Setting

Canadian Rating Systems (Canadian English ratings and Canadian French ratings).

- The TV rating systems in Canada are based on the Canadian Radio-Television and Telecommunications Commission (CRTC) policy on violence in television programming.
- While violence is the most important content element to be rated, the structure developed takes into consideration other program content like language, nudity, sexuality and mature themes.
- When setting the V-CHIP on the Canadian system you can choose either the Canadian English ratings or the Canadian French ratings.



Auto CH Search Setting
