No power

- Plug another electrical device (like a radio) to the power outlet to verify that the outlet is supplying the proper voltage.

Poor or no picture

- The TV station may be experiencing problems. Try another channel.
- The Cable TV signal may be scrambled or encoded. Please contact your local cable operator.
- Make sure that connection to other components are correct. (see also pages 12)
- Make sure that setup has been done correctly after connections. (see also pages 14-19)
- Make sure the correct input is selected and the input signal is compatible.

Strange color, light color, or color misalignment

- Ensure that the video cable is securely connected.
- The picture may appear dim in a brightly lit room.

No sound

Exclusion of damages:

- 1. Damage to other property caused by any defects in the product, damages based upon inconvenience, loss of use of the product, loss of time, loss of profits, loss of business opportunity, loss of goodwill, interference with business relationships, or other commercial loss, even if advised of the possibility of such damages.
- 2. Any other damages, whether incidental, consequential or otherwise.
- 3. Any claim against the customer by any other party.

Effect of state law:

This warranty gives you specific legal rights, and you may also have other rights which vary from state to state.
