

### **CAUTION**

### **Precautions**

### **Installing your TV**

- Place the TV on the floor or on a sturdy platform. The
  mounting surface should be flat and steady. If you install the
  TV on a soft floor, make sure that the floor is not damaged
  by the weight of the TV.
- Place the TV far enough away from the walls to allow proper ventilation. This will prevent the TV from overheating and avoid possible damage to the TV. Avoid dusty areas too.
- Damage may occur if you leave the TV in direct sunlight or near a heater. Avoid areas subject to extremely high temperatures or humidity, and temperatures of 41°F(5°C) or lower.

### **Using your TV**

- Do not stand or climb on the TV.
- Do not put any heavy object on top of the TV.
- Do not place containers with liquids such as drinks or cosmetics on the TV. If any foreign material or water leaks into the TV, unplug the AC cord and contact your dealer.
- If the room temperature suddenly rises, condensation may occur on the lenses resulting in picture distortion or color fading. In such a case, simply wait a while (with the power on) and the condensation will evaporate.
- Avoid displaying stationary images on your TV screen for extended periods of time. Stationary patterns generated by a picture-in-picture (PIP) display, Multi-Window display, computer displays, video games, stock market reports, etc., can become permanently engrained on the picture tube. This damage is not protected by your warranty because it is the result of misuse. If you wish to use your TV to display still images, reduce brightness and contrast settings. Never leave a PIP, Multi-Window, computer, or video game display unattended.
- Sit approximately 10–25 feet away from the TV. Sitting too far to the left or right of the screen will cause the picture to appear dull as will direct sunlight and room lights. Turn the TV off to check for reflections on the screen. Then remove the source of any reflections while viewing.

### Cleaning your TV

 Clean the TV with a soft dry, cloth. Never use strong solvents, such as thinner or benzine, which might damage the finish of the cabinet. If the cabinet is very dirty, use a damp cloth to wipe the cabinet clean and then finish with a dry cloth.

### NOTICE OF POSSIBLE ADVERSE EFFECTS ON TV PICTURE TUBE

Extensive viewing of fixed (non-moving) images or patterns can cause uneven aging of the picture tube, and leave a subtle but permanent ghost image in the picture. This type of damage is **NOT COVERED BY YOUR WARRANTY**. Never leave the TV on and unattended for long periods of time while the following formats or images are displayed:

- Fixed images, such as PIP/POP windows, stock tickers, video game patterns, TV station logos, and websites.
- Special formats that do not use the entire screen. For example, viewing letterbox style (16:9) media on a normal (4:3) display (bars at top and bottom of screen), or viewing normal (4:3) media on a widescreen (16:9) display (bars on left and right sides of screen).

### **Welcome to Toshiba**

Congratulations! You have purchased one of the finest projection TVs on the market. The goal of this manual is to guide you through setting up and operating your Toshiba TV as quickly as possible.


This manual applies to model 53AX61.


Instructions in this manual are based on using the remote control. You can also use the buttons on the TV front panel if they have the same name as those on the remote control.


Please read all the safety and operating instructions carefully, and keep the manual for future reference.

### **Exploring your new TV**

You can operate the TV using the buttons on the front panel or remote control. The back panel and front panel (behind the door) provide all the terminal connections you will need to connect other equipment to the TV (see "Connecting your TV" on page 5).







### **Connecting your TV**

If you have not connected electronic equipment before, or you have been frustrated in the past, you may wish to read this section. (Cables are not supplied.)


- A coaxial cable is the standard cable that comes in from an antenna or cable converter box. Coaxial cables use "F" connectors.
- Audio and video cables are usually color-coded according to use: yellow for video, and red and white for audio. The red audio cable is for the stereo right channel, and the white audio cable is for the stereo (or mono) left channel. On the rear panel of the TV, the terminals are color-coded in the same manner as the cables.
- S-video cables provide better picture performance than regular video cables. S-video cables can only be used with S-video compatible components.
- ColorStream® (component video) cables come in sets of three, and can only be used with component video—compatible components. A component video connection provides the best picture performance.


### **Connecting a VCR**

This connection allows you to watch local channels and video programs, play or record on the VCR while watching TV, and record from one channel while watching another channel.

You will need:

- one coaxial cable
- one pair of audio cables (one single audio cable for a mono VCR)
- one video cable





### Caution:

Do not plug in the TV until you have finished connecting all equipment.

### Caution:


If you have a mono VCR, connect L/Mono to VCR Audio OUT using only one audio cable. If you have an S-VHS VCR, use the S-video connections and remove the video cable.

Do not connect a regular video cable and an S-video cable to Video-1 (or Video-2) at the same time, or the picture will be distorted.

### Connecting a cable converter box

This connection allows you to watch cable and premium channels. To use the TV's features, select ANT-1. To view premium channels, select ANT-2 and tune the TV to channel 3 or 4 (whichever is vacant in your area), and then use the converter box to change channels. You will need:

· one coaxial cable




### Note:

When you use a converter box with your TV, there may be features that you cannot program using the remote control, such as programming your favorite channels, labeling channels, and locking channels.

### Connecting a cable converter box and a VCR

This connection allows you to watch and record basic and premium cable channels, as well as watch videotapes. To use the TV's features, select ANT-1. To view premium channels or record with the VCR, select ANT-2 and tune the TV to channel 3 or 4 (whichever is vacant in your area), and then use the converter box to change channels. You will need:

- one cable splitter
- · two coaxial cables
- one pair of audio cables (one single audio cable for a mono VCR)
- one video cable



### Note:

If you have a mono VCR, connect L/Mono to VCR Audio OUT using only one audio cable.

If you have an S-VHS VCR, use an S-video cable instead of a regular video cable. Do not connect a regular video cable and an S-video cable to Video-1 (or Video-2) at the same time or the picture will be distorted.


When you use a converter box with your TV, you may not be able to program some features using the remote control, such as programming your favorite channels, labeling channels, and locking channels.

## Connecting a DVD player/satellite receiver and a VCR

This connection allows you to watch DVD/satellite, VCR, and TV programs. You can record one TV channel while watching another channel.

You will need:

- one coaxial cable
- two pairs of audio cables (one single and one pair of audio cables for a mono VCR)
- one video cable
- one S-video cable

### Note:

You can use a regular video cable instead of an S-video cable, but the picture quality will decrease. If you use an S-video cable between the TV and DVD player/satellite receiver, make the audio connections only and remove the regular video cable.

Do not connect a regular video cable and an S-video cable to Video-1 (or Video-2) at the same time or the picture will be distorted.

### Connecting a DVD player with ColorStream® (component video) and a VCR

This connection allows you to watch DVD, VCR, or TV programs, and record DVD or TV programs. You can record from one source while watching a program from another source.

Your TV has ColorStream® (component video) connections. Connecting your TV to a DVD player with component video (such as a Toshiba DVD player with ColorStream®) can greatly enhance picture quality and performance.



### You will need:

- one coaxial cable
- three pairs of audio cables (one single and two pairs of audio cables for a mono VCR)
- two video cables
- one set of ColorStream (component video) cables

To play a DVD, the DVD player and TV must use ColorStream (component video) connections, and the TV must be set to ColorStream mode (see page 40). To record from the DVD player, the VCR must select Line IN.

### Connecting two VCRs

This connection allows you to record (dub/edit) from one VCR to another VCR while watching a video program. You will also be able to record from one TV channel while watching another channel.

### You will need:


- · one coaxial cable
- two pairs of audio cables (two single audio cables for mono VCRs)
- two video cables

Do not connect the same VCR to the output and input jacks on the TV at the same time.

If you are using an S-VHS VCR, use an S-video cable instead of a regular video cable for better picture performance. Do not connect a regular video cable and an S-video cable to Video-1 (or Video-2) at the same time or the picture will be distorted.

To dub or edit, VCR 2 must select Line IN, and the TV must select Video-1.

The unauthorized recording of television programs, video tapes, DVDs, and other materials may infringe upon the provisions of copyright laws.




- The Audio OUT jacks can output the sound of either the main or PIP picture (see "Selecting the Audio OUT sound" on page 47).
- \*\* The Video OUT jack will not output a PIP picture.

### **Connecting a camcorder**

This connection allows you to watch video materials recorded on a camcorder.

You will need:

- one pair of audio cables
- one video cable

### Note:

If you have an S-VHS camcorder, use an S-video cable instead of a regular video cable.

Do not connect a regular video cable and an S-video cable to Video-3 at the same time or the picture will be distorted.


### Connecting an audio system

This connection allows you to use an audio amplifier to adjust the audio level. This also allows you to use external speakers.

To control the audio, turn on the TV and the stereo amplifier, and then turn off the built-in speakers (see" Turning off the built-in speakers" on page 46).

You will need:

• one pair of audio cables



### Note:

To hear sound, the volume of both the TV and the external audio amplifier must be set above 0 (zero).


### Connecting an A/V receiver

If you use a system that delivers Dolby Pro Logic\* surround sound, you will probably want to use the TV speakers as center channel speakers.

A center channel speaker adds to the realism of a surround sound system such as Dolby Pro Logic.

You will need:

- one pair of audio cables
- one video cable
- one audio cable for audio center channel

### Caution:

To avoid damaging the TV speakers, turn off the TV before connecting or disconnecting the Audio Center Channel cable.

### Note:

For surround sound system setup details, refer to the instructions furnished with your A/V receiver.

When the Audio Center Channel ON/OFF switch is in the ON position, the TV speakers will function only as center channel speakers.

To adjust the center channel speaker volume, use the center level control on your A/V receiver.

To use the TV speakers as normal speakers, set the Audio Center Channel ON/OFF switch to the OFF position.

### Using the remote control

### **Preparing the remote control for use**

Your Toshiba remote control has one dedicated TV mode and 5 universal modes: VCR, Cable/SAT, DVD, Audio1, and Audio2. The target devices and default devices being programmed for each mode are as follows:



Repeatedly press MODE to cycle among the modes. If you own different brands of audio/video devices and want to operate them using the TV remote control, you must first program the remote control (see "Programming the remote control for use with audio/video devices" on page 14).


### Installing the remote control batteries

To install the batteries:

1. Slide the battery cover off the back of the remote control.




2. Install two "AA" size alkaline batteries. Match the + and - signs on the batteries to the signs on the battery compartment.



3. Slide the battery cover back on to the remote control until the lock snaps.

### Note:

The remote control may not operate your audio/video devices. Refer to the owner's manuals provided with your other devices to see which features are available. In addition, the remote controls for your other devices may have features not available on the TV remote control. If you would like to continue to use these features, you may want to use the remote controls for your other devices.



### Caution:

- Dispose of batteries in a designated disposal area. Do not throw batteries into a fire.
- Do not mix battery types, or combine used batteries with new ones.
- Remove dead batteries immediately to prevent battery acid from leaking into the battery compartment.
- Battery life expectancy is about one year with normal use. If you do not intend to use the remote control for a long time, remove the batteries.

### Notes:

- "---" will send nothing.
- "← TV" will jump to TV.
- "VCR ——>" will jump to last active VCR or DVD. Active VCR/DVD is defined as the mode that remains for a minimum of 5 seconds, or if a key is pressed in that mode.
- \* The VOLUME and MUTE will jump to "TV" by default. When the volume is unlocked, all the devices will have their own volume. The AUDIO1/2 (Receiver, CD) modes will have their own volume even if Volume Lock is on TV, CABLE/SAT, VCR, or DVD. See "Using the Volume Lock feature" on page 15.

# Programming the remote control for use with your audio/video devices

### **Device code setup**

- 1. Refer to the Device code table on pages 16–19 to find the code for the brand of your device.
  - If more than one code is listed, try each one separately until you find the one that works.
- 2. Press MODE until the Mode indicator of the device (CABLE/SAT, VCR, DVD, AUDIO1, AUDIO2) lights up.
- 3. While holding down RECALL, press the Number buttons to enter the four-digit code for your device.

  If the correct code is entered, the mode indicator will blink twice. If an incorrect code is entered, there will be one long blink.
- 4. Point the remote control at the device and press POWER to test the code.
  - If the device responds to the remote control, you have entered the correct code.
  - If the device does not respond, you may have entered the wrong code. Repeat steps 3 and 4 using another code.
- 5. To control the TV, press MODE to select TV.



If you do not know the device code for a particular device, you can cycle the remote control through the available codes for that device mode, and sample various function buttons to find the code that enables the remote control to operate the target device. The keys available to be sampled, provided they are applicable to that mode, are 0, 1, 2, 3, POWER, VOL  $\blacktriangle$ , CH  $\blacktriangle$ , PLAY, and STOP. Invalid keys will be ignored while in program mode.


To cycle through each available device code and sample its functions:

- 1. Press MODE to select the mode you want to set up.
- 2. While holding down RECALL, press 9, 9, 1. The remote control will enter program mode.
- 3. Point the remote control at the target device, and then press POWER (or other function buttons that are available to be sampled).
- 4. If the device responds to the remote control:

  Press RECALL to store the device code. The mode indicator will blink twice, and the remote control will exit program
  - If the device does not respond to the remote control:

    Press MENU ▲, and then press POWER. Repeat this step
    until the device responds to the remote control, and then press
    RECALL.

**Note:** When the search cycle is done, the mode indicator will blink three times. The remote control will begin to cycle through the available codes again. If no key is pressed within 10 seconds while programming, the remote control will exit the program mode and return to the previous code.



#### Note:

- Each time you replace the batteries, you must reprogram the remote control.
- Some newer VCRs are capable of working on either of two remote codes. These VCRs have a switch labeled "VCR1/VCR2."

If your VCR has this kind of switch and does not respond to any of the codes for your VCR brand, set the switch to the other position (VCR1 or VCR2) and reprogram the remote control.

### Verifying the device code (990)

Use this feature to verify the device codes currently programmed in the remote control. The number of blinks after pressing the 1, 2, 3, and 4 buttons is the 4-digit code set up for that mode.

For example, to verify the device code for the VCR mode:

- 1. Repeatedly press MODE until the VCR mode is selected.
- 2. While holding down RECALL, press 9, 9, 0.
- 3. Press  $1 \rightarrow 0$  blinks.
- 4. Press  $2 \rightarrow 3$  blinks.
- 5. Press  $3 \rightarrow 8$  blinks.
- 6. Press  $4 \rightarrow 5$  blinks.

This verifies that the device code of the VCR mode is "0385."

### **Using the Volume Lock feature (993)**

For the TV, CABLE/SAT, VCR, and DVD modes, the volume controls (VOL ▲▼ and MUTE) can be programmed or locked to the selected device mode. This feature does not apply to the AUDIO1 and AUDIO2 modes.

For example, to lock the volume controls to the CABLE/SAT mode:

- 1. Repeatedly press MODE until the CABLE/SAT mode is selected.
- 2. While holding down RECALL, press 9, 9, 3.
- 3. Press VOL ▲. When locked, the mode indicator will blink two times.

The following table describes in more detail the Volume Lock implementation.

To reset the volume controls to the original device code:

- 1. While holding down RECALL, press 9, 9, 3.
- 2. Press VOL ▼. When unlocked, the mode indicator will blink four times.


### Operational feature reset (980)

This feature clears all setup features not related to "Device code set up," and resets the Volume Lock to "TV."

To reset the features:

While holding down RECALL, press 9, 8, 0.

When reset, the mode indicator will blink two times, and then pause and blink two more times.

### Learning about the remote control

Only the buttons used to operate the TV are described here.

**POWER** turns the TV on and off

**SLEEP** programs the TV to turn off at a specific time (page 42)

**LIGHT** Pressing the LIGHT button toggles the illumination mode on and off. With the illumination mode on, the keypad will light up for 5 seconds when any key is pressed. (If in programming mode, the keypad will remain lit for 10 seconds).

**Channel Numbers (0–9, 100)** allow direct access to channels, even those not programmed into the TV's memory (page 24)

**MODE** cycles through the six device modes (TV, CABLE/SAT, VCR, DVD, AUDIO1, and AUDIO2). The mode indicator light will remain lit for 10 seconds.

**FAVORITE** accesses the multi-window favorite channel scan function (page 31)

**INFO** accesses the multi-window channel preview function (page 31)

**MENU/ENTER** accesses the on-screen menu system and sets menu information (page 21)

**▲▼ ◀ ▶ Buttons** select or adjust menu items when a menu is on-screen (page 21)

**♦► Buttons** cycle through only the channels you program as favorite channels. These buttons function as favorite channel buttons (FAV **♦►**) only when no menu is on-screen. (page 26)

**VOL ▲▼** adjusts the volume level

**EXIT** closes any open on-screen menu (page 21)

**CH** ▲▼ cycles through only the channels you program into the TV's memory) (page 24)

**CH RTN** returns to the last viewed channel (page 26)

**RECALL** displays TV status information on-screen (page 48)





### Learning about the menu system


After you have installed the batteries and programmed the remote control, you will need to set some preferences on the TV using the menu system. You can access the menus using the buttons on the TV or remote control.


- 1. Press MENU to display the menu system.
- 2. Press ◀ or ▶ to select a menu.
- 3. Press  $\triangle$  or  $\nabla$  to select an item.
- 4. Press ◀ or ▶ to select or adjust a setting.



- Press ENTER to activate the function settings in the SET UP menu.
- Main menus close automatically if no selection is made within 15 seconds; sub-menus close automatically within 6 seconds (except the Convergence menu, which remains open until a button is pressed).
- Press EXIT to close an on-screen menu instantly.



### Changing the on-screen display language


You can choose from three different languages (English, French and Spanish) for the on-screen displays. Adjustment menus and messages will appear in the language of your choice.

To select an on-screen display language:

- 1. Press MENU, and then press ◀ or ▶ until the SET UP menu appears.
- 2. Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight LANGUAGE.



3. Press ◀ or ▶ to highlight your desired language.



### Selecting the antenna input


You can monitor or change the signal source that is connected to the TV (ANT 1, VIDEO 1, VIDEO 2, VIDEO 3, ColorStream, or ANT 2). The current signal source will display in purple.

To select the antenna input:

1. Press the INPUT button on the remote control (see below left) or the TV/VIDEO button on the TV front panel (see below right) to select either ANT 1 or ANT 2.




Pressing INPUT on the remote control displays this screen. To select, press 0-5.




Pressing TV/VIDEO on the TV displays this screen. To select, press TV/VIDEO.

To use the menu system to select the antenna input:

- 1. Press MENU, and then press ◀ or ▶ to highlight the SET UP menu.
- 2. Press  $\triangle$  or  $\nabla$  to highlight ANT 1/2.



3. Press ◀ or ▶ to highlight either ANT 1 or ANT 2.



### Adding channels to the TV's memory


When you press Channel  $\blacktriangle \nabla$ , the TV will cycle through only the channels stored in the TV's channel memory. Use the steps below and on the next page to program channels into the TV's memory.

### **Programming channels automatically**


The TV can automatically detect all active channels in your area and store them in its memory. After the TV has automatically stored all active channels, you can manually add or erase individual channels. If you use both ANT-1 and ANT-2 terminals, you must program channels for each input source.

To automatically program channels into the TV's memory:


- 1. Press MENU, and then press ◀ or ▶ until the SET UP menu appears.
- 2. Press ▲ or ▼ until TV/CABLE is highlighted.
- 3. Press ◀ or ▶ to highlight TV (if you use an antenna) or CABLE (if you use cable).



4. Press ▲ or ▼ to select CH PROGRAM.



- Press ◀ or ▶ to start automatic channel programming. The TV automatically cycles through all of the channels (either TV or cable, depending on which you selected), and stores all active channels in its memory.
  - While the TV is cycling through the channels, the message "Programming Now—Please Wait" appears.
- 6. When channel programming is complete, the message "Completed" appears.
- 7. Press Channel ▲▼ to view the programmed channels.




### Adding and erasing channels manually

After you have automatically programmed channels into the TV's memory (see page 23), you can manually add or erase individual channels.

To manually add or erase channels:

- 1. Select the channel you want to add or erase. If you are adding a channel, you must use the Channel Number buttons to select the channel.
- 2. Press MENU, and then press ◀ or ▶ until the SET UP menu appears.
- 3. Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight ADD/ERASE.



- 4. Press ◀ or ▶ to select ADD or ERASE, whichever function you want to perform.
- 5. Repeat steps 1–4 for other channels you want to add or erase.


### Changing channels

To change to the next programmed channel:

Press Channel ▲▼ on the TV or remote control.

To change to a specific programmed channel:

Press and hold Channel ▲▼ for about one second. The TV will enter the channel surf mode.




Repeatedly press or hold Channel ▲ or ▼ while the channel surf mode is on-screen to scroll the channel list. Release the button to display the highlighted channel.

To change to a specific channel (programmed or unprogrammed):

Press the Channel Number buttons (0–9 and 100).

For channels 100 and higher, press the 100 button, and then the next two numbers. For example, to select channel 125, press 100, 2, 5.



### Adjusting the color convergence


This projection TV uses three separate TV tubes: red, green, and blue. The red, green, and blue images are projected onto the screen where they converge to form a full-color picture. You can see a clear picture only when the three images converge correctly. Convergence may drift over time or if you move the TV. (If the image on your screen is clear, skip this procedure.)

To adjust the color convergence:


**Note:** The TV must be on for at least 30 minutes before adjusting the color convergence.


- 1. Press MENU, and then press ◀ or ▶ until the PICTURE menu appears.
- 2. Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight CONVERGENCE (below left).
- 3. Press ◀ or ▶ to display the center CONVERGENCE menu (below right). If you see separate red, blue, or green crossed lines, you should adjust the convergence.






- 4. Press ENTER to highlight RED or BLUE, depending on which color needs adjusting. If both red and blue need adjusting, you must perform steps 4 and 5 twice.
- 5. Press ▲ (up), ▼ (down), ◀ (left), or ▶ (right) on the remote control to converge the red or blue line into the green line. When correctly adjusted, you will see two single crossed white lines.
- 6. Press EXIT to display the circumference CONVERGENCE menu.
- 7. Press the corresponding Number button (1–4 and 6–9) to select the area you want to adjust (below left).
- 8. Press ENTER to highlight RED or BLUE, depending on which color needs adjusting (below right). If both red and blue need adjusting, you must perform steps 8 and 9 twice.





- 9. Press ▲▼◀▶ to converge the red or blue line into the green line, until you see two single crossed white lines.
- 10. To select another area to adjust, press EXIT once, and then repeat steps 7 through 9.
- 11. To close the CONVERGENCE menu, press EXIT twice.

### Adjusting the channel settings

### Switching between two channels

You can switch between two channels without entering an actual channel number each time.

To switch between two channels:

- 1. Select the first channel you want to view.
- 2. Select a second channel using the Channel Number buttons (0–9 and 100).
- 3. Press CH RTN. The previous channel will be displayed. Each time you press CH RTN, the TV will switch back and forth between the two channels.

### **Programming your favorite channels**


You can use the favorite channel programming feature to preset up to 18 of your favorite channels (nine in FAVORITE CH1 and nine in FAVORITE CH2). Because this feature scans through only your favorite channels, it allows you to skip other channels you do not normally watch.

To program your favorite channels:

- 1. Press MENU, and then press ◀ or ▶ until the CUSTOM menu appears.
- 2. Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight FAVORITE CH1 (or FAVORITE CH2).



3. Press ◀ or ▶ to display the FAVORITE CH1 (or FAVORITE CH2) menu. CH INPUT will be highlighted.



4. Press the Channel Number buttons to enter one of your favorite channels.

Note: For channels 100 and higher, you must use the 100 button.

- 5. Press ENTER.
- 6. Repeat steps 4 and 5 for other channels you want to program as favorite channels.

To select your favorite channels:


Press (FAV) ◀ or ▶.

**Note:** If you press (FAV)  $\triangleleft$  or  $\triangleright$  when no channels are programmed as favorite channels, the current channel will not change.

To scan your favorite channels in a 9-picture multi-window:

Press FAVORITE (see "Using the favorite function" on page 31).

**Note:** If you press FAVORITE when no channels are programmed as favorite channels, the message "Not Available" will display on-screen.








To clear a favorite channel:

- 1. Press MENU, and then press ◀ or ▶ until the CUSTOM menu appears.
- 2. Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight FAVORITE CH2, for example.
- 3. Press ◀ or ▶ to display the FAVORITE CH2 menu. CH INPUT will be highlighted.
- 4. Press ▲▼▶◀ to highlight the channel you want to clear, and then press ENTER.








To clear all favorite channels at once:




### Labeling channels


Channel labels appear above the on-screen channel number display each time you turn on the TV, select a channel, or press RECALL. You can choose any four characters for a channel label.

To create a channel label:

- 1. Press MENU, and then press ◀ or ▶ until the CUSTOM menu appears.
- 2. Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight CH LABELING.
- 3. Press ◀ or ▶ to display the CH LABELING menu. CH INPUT will be highlighted.



### To clear a channel label:

- 3. Press ◀ or ▶ to display the CH LABELING menu.
- 4. Press the Channel Number buttons to input the channel number whose label you want to clear.
- 5. Press ▼ to highlight CLEAR.



- 6. Press ◀ or ▶ to clear the channel label.
- 7. To clear other channel labels, press ▲ to highlight CH INPUT, and then repeat steps 4 through 6.




### Watching picture-in-picture (PIP)

The picture-in-picture (PIP) feature allows you to watch two pictures at the same time. The smaller (PIP) picture can come from a TV broadcast or an external source, such as a VCR.

To display a TV broadcast in the PIP window:

- 1. Turn on the TV and select the program you want to watch.
- 2. Press PIP once to display a small picture. A window 1/9 the size of the screen will appear. Press PIP a second time to display a 1/16 size window.




3. Press PIP CH ▲ ▼ to choose the program you want to display in the PIP window.

If the V-CHIP feature is active and you try to watch a TV program that exceeds the rating limits you set, the TV will enter the program block mode. See "Using the V-CHIP menu" on page 33.




To display a picture from an external source in the PIP window:

- 1. Make sure you have connected the external source equipment properly. For more information, see the "Connecting your TV" on page 5.
- 2. Turn on the TV and select the program you want to watch.
- 3. Press PIP once to display a small picture. A window 1/9 the size of the screen will appear. Press PIP a second time to display a 1/16 size window.
- 4. Repeatedly press SOURCE to select the PIP input source (TV, VIDEO 1, VIDEO 2, or VIDEO 3). The selected source will be displayed in purple. ColorStream cannot be selected.



To turn PIP off:

Press PIP once or twice, depending on the PIP window size you selected.




### Note:

- PIP cannot be turned on when ColorStream input is being viewed.
- You cannot display ANT-2 signal sources in the PIP window.
- You can output the sound of either the main or PIP picture from the Audio OUT jacks (see "Selecting the audio OUT sound" on page 47).


### **Switching the main and PIP pictures**

Press SWAP while you are using the PIP feature to switch the main and PIP pictures. The main and PIP pictures will switch each time you press the SWAP button.







### Freezing the PIP picture

Press STILL while you are using the PIP feature to freeze the PIP picture. To return to the moving picture, press STILL again.





### Using the multi-window feature

The multi-window feature provides two channel search functions (INFO and FAVORITE) and one strobe function (MULTI).


### Using the multi-window channel preview function

The channel preview function scans the channels you programmed into the TV's memory (pages 23–24) in a

6-picture multi-window across the bottom of the screen.

To start the channel preview function: Press INFO.

To cancel the channel preview function: Press INFO again.




### Using the multi-window favorite channel scan function

The favorite channel scan function displays the channels you programmed as favorite channels (page 26) in a 9-picture multi-window.

**Note:** If you press FAVORITE when no channels are programmed as favorite channels, the message "Not Available" will display on-screen.

To start the favorite channel scan function:

- Press FAVORITE to display the channels you programmed into FAVORITE CH1. (Press FAVORITE a second time to display the channels you programmed into FAVORITE CH2.)
   The 9-picture scan starts, with the first window displaying a moving picture.
- 2. Press ▲▼ ◀► to highlight the window of the channel you want to watch.
- 3. Press ENTER to display the channel you selected in step 2 as the main picture.



Each time you press FAVORITE, the displays changes in the following order:

FAVORITE CH1 — FAVORITE CH2 — OFF

To cancel the favorite channel scan function:

Press FAVORITE one or two times, depending on whether you are scanning the FAVORITE CH1 or FAVORITE CH2 channels.

### Using the multi-window strobe function

The strobe function strobes the current picture in a 9-picture multiwindow. This function is convenient when watching a quickly moving picture. For example, you can strobe the action of the current TV


program or view a decisive moment of a previously recorded sports program.


To start the strobe function:

Press MULTI.

To cancel the strobe function:

Press MULTI again.


- When the main picture source is ColorStream, the INFO, FAVORITE, and MULTI functions are not available.
- The INFO button will not work when ANT 2 mode is selected.
- A program or channel you blocked in the LOCKS menu may not be blocked during INFO or FAVORITE multi-window scanning. When blocked properly, the program will appear as a black window with an "X" under the channel number.

### **Using the LOCKS menu**

The LOCKS menu includes the V-CHIP, CH Lock, Video Lock, and New PIN Code functions. You can use these functions after entering the correct PIN code.

### **Entering the PIN code**

1. Press MENU, and then press ◀ or ▶ until the LOCKS menu appears.



- 2. Press  $\triangle$  or  $\nabla$  to display the PIN code entering mode.
- Blocking reset status:

  Press the Number buttons
  (0–9) to enter a new 4-digit PIN code, and then press ENTER.
- When the PIN code is already stored:

Press the Number buttons (0–9) to enter your existing PIN code, and then press ENTER.






If the wrong PIN code is entered, the message "Incorrect" displays. Enter the code again, and then press ENTER.

If you cannot remember the PIN code you stored, while in the PIN code entering mode, press RECALL four times within 5 seconds. The PIN code you stored will be released (blocking reset status restored).

Continue to set each item following the steps on the next page.



### **Using the V-CHIP menu**

Some TV programs and movies include signals that classify the content of the program (violence, sex, dialog, language). The V-CHIP control feature in this TV detects the signals and blocks the programs according to your selections. To use this feature, perform the following setup.

### **ENABLE BLOCKING**

- 1. From the LOCKS menu, press **▼** or **△** to highlight ENABLE BLOCKING.
- 2. Press ◀ or ▶ to select ON (locking enabled) or OFF (locking disabled).

**Note:** The CH LOCK function is not affected by this selection.

### **TV RATING (Independent rating system for broadcasters)**

- 1. From the LOCKS menu, press ▼ or ▲ to highlight TV RATING (below left).
- 2. Press ◀ or ▶ to display the TV RATING menu (below right).





- 3. Press  $\nabla$  or  $\triangle$  to select an item.
- 4. Press ▶ to lock (displays "X"); press ◀ to unlock (displays "✓").
- 5. Repeat steps 3 and 4 to set the next item.

4. Press ▶ to lock ("X") or ◀ to unlock ("✓").

The movie ratings you can lock are described as follows:

X : X-rated (For adults only)

NC17: Not intended for anyone 17 and under

R : Restricted (Under 17 requires accompanying parent or adult guardian)



### **Unlocking programs temporarily**


### Locking the front panel buttons

The front panel buttons can be locked to prevent the TV settings from being changed accidentally (by children, for example). When the front panel lock is ON, all control buttons on the TV front panel (except POWER) do not operate.

To lock the front panel buttons:

- 1. From the LOCKS menu, select FRONT PANEL LOCK.
- 2. Press ◀ or ▶ to highlight ON.

To unlock the front panel buttons: Highlight OFF in step 2 above.

All buttons (except POWER) are locked when the FRONT PANEL LOCK is ON.

Sample video labels




## Using the closed caption feature

The closed caption feature has two options:

- Captions—A printed version of the dialogue, narration and/or sound effects of a program. Close captioned programs are usually designated as "CC" in program guides.
- Text—An on-screen display of information not related to the program, such as weather or stock data (when provided by individual stations).

To view captions or text:

- 1. Tune the TV to the desired program.
- 2. Press MENU, and then press ◀ or ▶ until the CUSTOM menu appears.
- 3. Press **▼** or **△** to highlight CC.



- 4. Press ◀ or ▶ to highlight the desired closed caption mode, as follows:
- To view captions, highlight C1, C2, C3, or C4 (C1 displays the primary language in your area).

**Note:** If the program or video you are viewing is not closed captioned, no captions will display on-screen.




• To view text, highlight T1, T2, T3, or T4.

**Note:** If text is not available, a black rectangle may appear on-screen. If this happens, set the closed caption feature to OFF.



• To turn off the closed caption feature, highlight OFF.



#### Note:

A closed caption signal may not display in the following situations:

- · When a video tape has been dubbed
- When the signal reception is weak
- When the signal reception is nonstandard

## Setting the sleep timer

You can use the sleep timer to turn the TV off automatically. To set the sleep timer:

1. Press SLEEP. Each time you press SLEEP, the time will increase in 10-minute increments, to a maximum of 180.



2. Press ENTER to start the timer.


To cancel the sleep timer:

Press SLEEP until the time is set to 0, or turn off the TV.

## **Setting the clock**

To set the clock:

- 1. Press MENU, and then press ◀ or ▶ until the SET UP menu appears.
- 2. Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight CLOCK SET.
- 3. After the number position starts to blink, press four Number buttons (0–9) to enter the correct time, and then press ENTER. The clock operates on a 12-hour cycle.




To display the time on-screen:

Press RECALL.

#### Note:

The timer can also be set using the MENU and  $\triangle \nabla \blacktriangleleft \triangleright$  buttons.

To display the amount of time until the TV turns off automatically, press SLEEP once. To close the display, press EXIT.



If the power source for the TV is interrupted (the power cord is unplugged or a power failure occurs), the clock must be reset.

## **Adjusting the sound**

#### Muting the sound

Press MUTE to temporarily dim the sound (1/2 mute) or turn off the sound (mute). The screen will display "1/2 MUTE" or "MUTE" in the lower right corner. Each time MUTE is pressed, the mute mode changes in the following order:

When the TV is muted, the closed caption feature (page 41) is automatically activated (but only if the closed caption mode is set to OFF). To turn off captions, press MUTE again.

#### Selecting stereo/SAP broadcasts


The multi-channel TV sound (MTS) feature allows you to listen to high-fidelity stereo sound while watching your TV. MTS can also transmit a second audio program (SAP) containing a second language, music, or other audio information (if available in your area).

When the TV receives a stereo or SAP broadcast, the word STEREO or SAP appears on-screen every time the TV is turned on, the channel is changed, or RECALL is pressed.


**Note:** The MTS feature is not available when the TV is in VIDEO or ColorStream mode.

To listen to stereo sound:

1. Press MENU, and then press ◀ or ▶ until the AUDIO menu appears.



- 2. Press  $\triangle$  or  $\nabla$  to highlight MTS.
- 3. Press ◀ or ▶ to highlight STEREO.




If you leave the TV in STEREO mode, it will automatically output the type of sound being broadcast (stereo or monaural).

If the stereo sound is noisy, select MONO to reduce the noise. The word STEREO or SAP is displayed in yellow in the menu when the TV receives the signal.

To listen to SAP (if available):

- 1. Press MENU, and then press ◀ or ▶ until the AUDIO menu appears.
- 2. Press  $\triangle$  or  $\nabla$  to highlight MTS.
- 3. Press ◀ or ▶ to highlight SAP. You will hear the station's second audio program (if available) from the speakers, while viewing the program's normal picture (see note at right).



#### Note:

A second audio program (SAP) can be heard only on those TV stations that offer it. If you have SAP on, and the station the TV is currently tuned to is in SAP mode but is not currently playing a second audio program, you will see the picture but may not hear sound. If this happens, turn SAP off.

## Using the surround sound feature

The surround sound feature expands the audio listening field wider and deeper to create exceptional sound quality from the TV's speakers. The feature uses stereo signals from a TV broadcast or video input.


To turn on the surround sound feature:

- 1. Select the STEREO mode (see "Selecting stereo/SAP broadcasts" on page 43).
- 2. Press MENU, and then press ◀ or ▶ until the THEATER menu appears.
- 3. Press  $\triangle$  or  $\nabla$  to highlight SURROUND.
- 4. Press ◀ or ▶ to highlight MATRIX.



To turn off the surround sound feature: Highlight OFF in step 4 above.

If you leave the TV in MATRIX mode, it will automatically output the type of sound being broadcast (surround stereo or monaural).



#### Note:


When MATRIX surround is selected, the StableSound™ feature (page 47) is automatically turned off.

## Adjusting the sound quality

You can change the quality of the TV's sound by adjusting the bass, treble, and balance.

To adjust the sound quality:

- 1. Press MENU, and then press ◀ or ▶ until the AUDIO menu appears.
- 2. Press  $\triangle$  or  $\nabla$  to highlight the item you want to adjust.



- 3. Press ◀ or ▶ to adjust the level.
- $\blacktriangleleft$  makes the sound quality weaker or decreases the balance in the right channel, depending on the item selected.
- makes the sound quality stronger or decreases the balance in the left channel, depending on the item selected.



- 2. Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight SPEAKERS.
- 3. Press ◀ or ▶ to highlight OFF.



# Understanding the auto power off feature

The TV will automatically turn off after approximately 15 minutes if it is tuned to a vacant channel or a station that completes its broadcast for the day. This feature does not work in VIDEO mode.

# Understanding the last mode memory feature

If the power is cut off while you are viewing the TV, the Last Mode Memory feature turns the TV on automatically when the power is resupplied.

If the power is going to be off for a long time and you are going to be away from the TV, unplug the power cord to prevent the TV from turning on in your absence.

#### Limited One (1) Year Warranty

TACP and THI warrant this product and its parts against defects in materials or workmanship for a period of one (1) year after the date of original retail purchase. During this period, TACP and THI will repair or replace a defective part, at their option, with a new or refurbished part, without charge to you. TACP/THI Authorized Service Center personnel will come to your home when warranty service is required. Depending on the type of repair required, either the service will be performed in your home or the set will be taken to the TACP/THI authorized service center for repair and returned to your home at no cost to you.

#### Limited Two (2) Year Warranty of Picture Tube

TACP and THI further warrant the picture tube in this product against defects in materials or workmanship for a period of two (2) years after the date of original retail purchase. During this period, TACP and THI will repair or replace a defective picture tube at their option, with a new or refurbished picture tube, without charge to you, except that, if a defective picture tube is replaced after one (1) year from the date of the original retail purchase, you pay labor charges involved in the replacement.

#### **Rental Units**

The warranty for rental units begins with the first rental or thirty (30) days from the date of shipment to the rental firm, whichever comes first.

#### **Commercial Units**

Products sold and used for commercial use have a limited ninety (90) day warranty for all parts, labor and picture tube.
