

TO USE:

Different Moods



TO REPLACE BATTERIES

Use a Phillips/cross head screwdriver to loosen screw in battery compartment door (screw remains attached to door). Insert 3 x 1.5V "A76"/LR44 alkaline batteries. Replace door and tighten screw.
