



- 2. While holding down [TV POWER], enter the 2-digit code using the number buttons [0 - 9], then release [TV POWER].





Speaker Connections

To achieve proper stereo reproduction, connect the speaker wires without shorting to adjacent wires as shown below.

Black and Blue	Front left speaker
Black and Green	Center speaker
Black and Orange	Surround right speaker


The supplied speakers have built-in magnetic stray field compensation. They may be placed close to a TV without affecting the color purity.

The five speakers are all the same and can be used for Front left, Center, Front right, Surround left, and Surround right speakers.

The front, center, and surround speakers should be placed at approximately the same distance from the listening position. Place the front left and right speakers either side of the TV. Place the center speaker directly above the TV.


Place the surround speakers either sides of the listening position, or slightly to the rear, approximately 2 feet \sim 3 feet 3 inches (60 cm \sim 1 meter) higher than ear level.

The subwoofer can be placed near the front speaker and not too far from the TV.


TV Connections

Using MONITOR OUT VIDEO jack

Connect the Video cable with yellow connectors (supplied) between the MONITOR OUT VIDEO jack of the unit and the VIDEO INPUT jack on the TV.

Important Information:

To connect the unit to a TV, TV must have a Video input jack (RCA-type) at least. You cannot connect it to an antenna terminal of TV.



Notes:

- Please refer to the instruction manual of your TV.
- When you connect the unit to your TV, be sure to turn off the power and disconnect both units from the wall outlet until all the connections have been made.
- Do not connect the MONITOR OUT (S-VIDEO/VIDEO) and COMPONENT VIDEO OUT jacks of the unit to a VCR directly. The playback picture will be distorted because DVD video discs are copy protected.




- If your TV has the S-VIDEO INPUT jack, connect the *S-video cable (not supplied) between the MONITOR OUT S-VIDEO jack of the unit and the S-VIDEO INPUT jack of the TV. (The MONITOR OUT VIDEO jack connection is not necessary.)
 - You can enjoy clearer picture playback.
- 2. Set the VIDEO OUT SELECT switch to the **S-VIDEO** position.


- If your TV has the COMPONENT VIDEO INPUT jacks, connect the *Component Video cable (not supplied) between the COMPONENT VIDEO OUT jacks of the unit and the COMPONENT VIDEO INPUT jacks of the TV.
 - (The MONITOR OUT VIDEO or S-VIDEO OUT jack connection is not necessary.)
 - You can enjoy high quality picture playback.
- 2. Set the VIDEO OUT SELECT switch to the **COMPONENT** position.

Using RF Modulator

If your TV does not have a Video input jack and has an antenna terminal only, please purchase the *RF Modulator (not supplied). (*Please consult your audio/video dealer.)




TV's back panel

- Connect the antenna cable (not supplied) to the ANT. IN terminal of the RF Modulator.
- 2. Connect the 75-ohm coaxial cable (not supplied) between the TO TV terminal of the RF Modulator and the VHF/UHF ANTENNA IN terminal of the TV.
- 3. Connect the Video cable with yellow connectors (supplied) between the MONITOR OUT VIDEO jack of the unit and the VIDEO input jack of the RF Modulator.

For more details, please refer to the instruction manual of the RF Modulator. -



- 1. Connect the antenna cable (not supplied) to the VHF/UHF FROM ANT IN terminal of the VCR.
- 2. Connect the 75-ohm coaxial cable (not supplied) between the TO TV OUT terminal of the VCR and the ANT. IN terminal of the RF Modulator.
- 3. Connect the 75-ohm coaxial cable (not supplied) between the TO TV terminal of the RF Modulator and the VHF/UHF ANTENNA IN terminal of the TV.
- 4. Connect the audio cables (not supplied) between the VIDEO (AUDIO) IN 1 or 2 jacks of the unit and the AUDIO OUT jacks of the VCR. Use the red connectors for the right-R jacks and the white connectors for the left-L jacks.
- 5. Connect the Video cable with yellow connectors (supplied) between the MONITOR OUT VIDEO jack of the unit and the VIDEO input jack of the RF Modulator.

Antenna Connections

FM antenna


The FM indoor antenna lead wire is sufficient to receive most local FM broadcasts and should be connected to the rear FM 75 terminal. Extend the antenna lead wire as straight as possible and, while listening to the sound from the system, secure it in a position where the best FM reception is found.

In fringe areas, or where reception is distorted or noisy, an FM outdoor antenna (not supplied) should be connected instead of the FM indoor antenna lead wire. The terminals will accept 75-ohm coaxial cable.

AM antenna

The AM loop antenna is sufficient to receive most local AM broadcasts. Assemble the loop antenna.

Unwind the antenna wires, then connect them to the AM LOOP terminals. Place the loop antenna in a position which yields the best AM reception, or attach it to a wall or other surface as shown.



Screws (not supplied)

NOTE:

To minimize noise...

- Keep the speaker wires, power cord and all other system connection cables away from the loop antenna.
- Do not place the antenna close to a TV or speaker.


Note to CATV system installer:

This reminder is provided to call the CATV system installer's attention to Section 820-40 of the NEC which provides guidelines for proper grounding and, in particular, specifies that the cable ground shall be connected to the grounding system of the building, as close to the point of cable entry as practical.

Additional Connection Examples

1st video equipment input jack (VIDEO (AUDIO) IN 1)

Connect an audio cable (not supplied) from the audio output jacks of the TV to the VIDEO (AUDIO) IN 1 jacks.








When installing an outdoor antenna, follow the installation instructions in the attached "IMPORTANT SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS".







Headphones jack (PHONES)

Connect a pair of stereo headphones (8 ohms - 32 ohms, not available from Fisher) to the PHONES jack for monitoring or for private listening. The speakers are automatically disconnected when headphones are connected.



Power Supply (Main Unit and Active Subwoofer)

Connect the power cord to a 120VAC 60Hz outlet. This unit is equipped with a polarized plug. If you have difficulty inserting the plug, turn it over and reinsert it. If the unit will not be used for a long time, disconnect the AC plug from the AC outlet.

Press [POWER] of the active subwoofer to "ON". The LED indicator lights on the subwoofer.




Notes:

- Before plugging the power cord into an AC outlet, make sure that all the connections have been made.
- The main unit is not disconnected from the AC power unless the power cord is unplugged from the AC outlet.


ADJUSTING THE CLOCK

Example: To set "PM 6:30" (Using the remote control)


- 1. Press [J/ON] to turn the power on. The STANDBY indicator goes off.
- Press [CLOCK] while holding [SHIFT] down. "AM 12:00" blinks.
- 3. Press [ADJUST] while holding [SHIFT] down. The "hours" display blinks.




4. Press [I◀◀] or [▶▶f] to set the "hours".




Press [ADJUST] while holding [SHIFT] down. The "minutes" display blinks.



6. Press [I◀◀] or [▶▶I] to set the "minutes".



7. Press [ADJUST] while holding [SHIFT] down. The clock starts.



 The time can be set accurately by pressing [ADJUST] while holding [SHIFT] down when a time signal is heard.




Press [CLOCK] while holding [SHIFT] down to display the clock. (If leave it, the original display returns after approximately 10 seconds.)



Common Operation



Turning the power on and off

Press [아/ON] to turn the power on.

- "HELLO" briefly appears on the FL display.
- The STANDBY indicator goes out.

(After connecting the power cord, when you press [U/ON] for the first time, the volume-reset feature automatically sets the initial volume level.)

When the power cord is connected to the AC outlet, the unit will respond to commands from the remote control.

Note:

Make sure that the POWER button of the subwoofer is set to "ON".

To turn the power off, press [U/ON] again.

- "GOOD-BYE" briefly appears on the FL display.
- · The STANDBY indicator lights.

Smart start function

If the following buttons are pressed when the power is turned off, the unit turns on automatically and the selected source is activated.

[▲], [▶] (Front panel of the unit)

[OPEN/CLOSE], [▶], [TUNE/BAND] (Remote control)

Selecting the source

Press [FUNCTION] to select the desired source. Each time the button is pressed, the display changes as follows:

DVD/CD

VIDEO 1

VIDEO 2

FM TUNER

AM TUNER

 When the source selection is changed, disc playback automatically stops.


Adjusting the volume

Rotate [VOLUME] (or press [VOLUME] + or - on the remote control). The volume level appears on the display (VOL 0 ~ VOL MAX).

To reduce the volume temporarily (muting)

Press [MUTE] on the remote control. "MUTE" blinks on the FL display.

To restore the previous volume setting, press [MUTE] again.



Selecting the sound mode

- 1. Press [SOUND] repeatedly to select the desired sound mode ("BASS", "TREBLE" or "FLAT").
- 2. Press "▲" or "▼" to adjust the sound level ("+5" ~ "-5"). Note:

If "FLAT" is selected, press [ENTER]. "- - FLAT - -" briefly appears. In this case, "BASS" and "TREBLE" are set to "0".

- 3. Repeat steps 1 to 2 for another sound mode.
- 4. Press [SOUND] repeatedly to close the display.





Selecting Surround Mode

Press [SURROUND] to select the surround mode. Each time the button is preset, the surround mode changes as follows:





Function	FL display	Description
DVD/CD	AUTO	The unit selects the surround mode automatically depending on the disc.
		Dolby Digital (not encoded with Dolby Surround Sound) "DOLBY DIGITAL" appears on the FL display. Dolby Digital is a discrete 5.1 channel surround system, developed for cinema use. But, not all Dolby Digital sources are recorded with 6 channel.
		Some sources marked Dolby Digital may be recorded in Dolby Surround, a 2 channel system.
		Dolby Digital (encoded with Dolby Surround Sound) "DOLBY DIGITAL" and "DOLBY PL" appear on the FL display. The surround mode is set to Dolby Pro Logic mode.
		Dolby Pro Logic is a decoding system that was developed to enhance the soundtracks of theatrical motion pictures with Dolby Surround. All speakers sound, but the surround left and right speakers are monophonic sound.





Handling, Storing and Cleaning Discs

- If the CD has both audio tracks and MP3 files, only audio tracks are played.
- It would take 30 seconds or more for this player to read MP3 files depending on its structure.

Limitations on display

- The maximum number for directory name is approximately 8 letters
- The maximum number for file name is approximately 10 letters.

- Available letters for display are the following: capital or small alphabets of A through Z, and numbers of 0 through 9.
- Other letters than those above are replaced in "-" (hyphen).

Notes on MP3 files

- The recommend recording setting for a high-quality sound is 44.1 kHz of sampling frequency and 128kbps of fixing bit rate
- To play back MP3 CD in the recorded order,





A table of contents in the selected directory appears on the TV screen.

- To go back to the previous directory, press [RETURN].

Level 6: R (Restricted)

Level 4: PG13 (Parental guidance cautioned)

Level 3: PG (Parental guidance suggested)

Level 1: G (General audiences)

Some DVD discs contain a restriction level which enables parents to prevent playback of discs by children. This DVD video player is equipped with a password designed to prevent children changing the level.

You cannot play DVD video discs rated higher than the level you selected unless you cancel the parental lock function. For example, when you select level "5", the DVD video player will not play discs with ratings of "6", "7" or "8". The information will appear on the TV screen.

If you forget the password...

Enter "788444" even if 4 digits "----" appears, then press [ENTER] to clear the current password.

Enter a new password and set the parental lock level again.







To receive FM stereo broadcasts

Make sure that "MONO" is not displayed. If "MONO" appears, press [FM MODE] to turn the "MONO" indication off.

"ST" appears when an FM stereo broadcast is received.

 If the signal from an FM stereo station is weak and reception is poor, press [FM MODE] to change to monaural reception.
 The reception may be improved, but the sound will be monaural.



Manual presetting

- Tune in the station to be preset as described in "Automatic/ Manual Tuning".
- 2. Press [PROGRAM]. "PROG." blinks.
