## Adding Memory/Upgrading Your Notebook

The Compaq Presario 800 Series Mobile Internet PC features one memory expansion slot, located on the bottom of the unit and accessible through the memory expansion door.

#### *To install a memory expansion board:*

All memory expansion boards are asymmetrically keyed (notched) to ensure correct positioning and can be used in either memory expansion slot.

- With the computer turned off, locate and remove (unscrew) the memory expansion hatch on the bottom of your Notebook.
- Insert the memory expansion board into an empty memory expansion slot at a 45-degree angle.
- Push the memory expansion board down until the board is seated in the plastic retention clips. Close the memory expansion hatch.
- Run Computer Setup. The memory is checked and displayed on start-up.



If you encounter minor problems with your Notebook, display, or software, refer to the following list of general suggestions before taking further action.

- Ensure that your Notebook is plugged into the AC adapter and that the adapter is plugged into a working electrical outlet.
- Ensure that your Notebook is turned on and the Power light or icon
- Adjust the brightness and contrast controls of the display. • Remove any diskettes from the drive before turning on your Notebook.
