

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LIMITED WARRANTY

For one year from the date of original retail purchase, MTD PRODUCTS INC will either repair or replace, at its option, free of charge, F.O.B. factory or authorized service firm, any part or parts found to be defective in material or workmanship. Transportation charges under this warranty must be paid by the purchaser unless return is requested by MTD PRODUCTS INC.

This warranty will not apply to any part which has become inoperative due to misuse, excessive use, accident, neglect, improper maintenance, alterations, or unless the unit has been operated and maintained in accordance with the instructions furnished. This warranty does not apply to the engine, motor, battery, battery charger or component parts thereof. Please refer to the applicable manufacturer's warranty on these items.

This warranty will not apply where the unit has been used commercially.

Warranty service is available through your local authorized service dealer or distributor. If you do not know the dealer or distributor in your area, please write to the Customer Service Department of MTD.

The return of a complete unit will not be accepted by the factory unless prior written permission has been extended by MTD.

This warranty gives you specific legal rights. You may also have other rights which vary from state to state.

WARNING TO PURCHASERS OF INTERNAL COMBUSTION ENGINE EQUIPPED MACHINE OR DEVICES IN THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA

The equipment which you have just purchased does not have a spark arrester. If this equipment is used on any forest covered land, brush covered land, or grass covered unimproved land in the State of California, before using on such land, the California law requires that a spark arrester be provided. In addition, spark arrester is required by law to be in effective working order. The spark arrester must be attached to the exhaust system and comply with Section 4442 of the California Public Resources Code.



It is suggested that this manual be read in its entirety before attempting to assemble or operate. Keep this manual in a safe place for future reference and for ordering replacement parts.

This unit is shipped WITHOUT GASOLINE or OIL. After assembly, see operating section of this manual for proper fuel and amount.

Your rotary mower is a precision piece of power equipment, not a plaything. Therefore exercise extreme caution at all times.

SAFE OPERATION PRACTICES FOR WALK-BEHIND MOWERS

TRAINING

- Read the Operating and Service Owner's Manual carefully. Be thoroughly familiar with the controls and the proper use of the equipment.
- Never allow children to operate a power mower. Only persons well acquainted with these rules of safe operation should be allowed to use your mower.
- 3. Keep the area of operation clear of all persons, particularly small children and pets. Stop engine when they are in the vicinity of your mower. Although the area of operation should be completely cleared of foreign objects, a small object may have been overlooked and could be accidently thrown by the mower in any direction.

PREPARATION

- Thoroughly inspect the area where the equipment is to be used. Remove all stones, sticks, wire, bones and other foreign objects which could be picked up and thrown by the mower in any direction.
- Do not operate equipment when barefoot or wearing open sandals. Always wear substantial footwear.
- 3. Do not wear loose fitting clothing that could get caught on the mower.
- 4. Check the fuel before starting the engine. Do not fill the gasoline tank indoors, when the engine is running, or while the engine is still hot. Wipe off any spilled gasoline before starting the engine.
- Disengage the self-propelled mechanism or drive clutch on units so equipped before starting the engine.
- Never attempt to make a wheel or cutting height adjustment while the engine is running.
- Mow only in daylight or in good artificial light.
- 8. Never operate the equipment in wet grass. Always be sure of your footing. Keep a firm hold on the handle and walk, never run.


OPERATION

- Do not change the engine governor settings or overspeed the engine. Excessive engine speeds are dangereous.
- Do not put hands or feet near or under rotating parts. Keep clear of the discharge opening at all times.
- Stop the blade(s) when crossing gravel drives, walks or roads.
- 4. After striking a foreign object, stop the engine, remove the wire from the spark plug.

- and thoroughly inspect the mower for any damage. Repair the damage before restarting and operating the mower.
- If the equipment should start to vibrate abnormally, stop the engine and check immediately for the cause. Vibration is generally a warning of trouble.
- 6. Stop the engine whenever you leave the mower, before cleaning the mower housing, and when making any repairs or inspections.
- 7. When cleaning, repairing or inspecting, make certain the blade and all moving parts have stopped. Disconnect the spark plug wire, and keep the wire away from the plug to prevent accidental starting.
- Before attempting to unclog the mower or discharge chute, stop the engine and be sure the blade(s) have stopped completely. Disconnect the spark plug wire and keep the wire away from the plug to prevent accidental starting.
- 9. Do not run the engine indoors.
- 10. Shut the engine off and wait until the blade comes to a complete stop before removing the grass catcher or unclogging chute.
- Mow across the face of slopes, never up-anddown. Exercise extreme caution when changing direction on slopes. Do not mow excessively steep slopes.
- Always disconnect electric mowers (line operated) before cleaning, repairing or adjusting.
- Never operate mower without proper guards, plates or other safety protective devices in place.
- 14. Keep washout ports and other mower-housing service openings closed when mowing.

MAINTENANCE AND STORAGE


- 1. Check the blade and engine mounting bolts at frequent intervals for proper tightness.
- Keep all nuts, bolts, and screws tight to be sure the equipment is in safe working condition.
- Never store the equipment with gasoline in the tank inside of a building where fumes may reach an open flame or spark. Allow the engine to cool before storing in any enclosure.
- 4. To reduce fire hazard, keep the engine free of grass, leaves, or excessive grease.
- Check the grass catcher bag frequently for wear or deterioration. For safety protection replace only with new bag meeting original equipment specifications.

Tools Required for Assembly:

- (1) Adjustable Wrench
- (1) 7/16" Open End or Box Wrench
- (1) 3/4" Open End or Box Wrench

ASSEMBLY

Your new mower is shipped preassembled with the exception of the handle.

- Remove lawn mower and all parts from the carton. Make certain that all loose parts and literature have been removed before the carton is discarded.
- 2 . Extend throttle control assembly which is attached to engine at the rear of the mower and place on floor.



Do not bend or kink control wires.






It may be necessary to bend the ends of the lower handle inward slightly to assure a snug fit against the deck mounting area.




Figure 3 was photographed with the rear wheel removed for clarity. It is not necessary to remove wheel for handle assembly.

3. Place lower handle (H) in position over studs ——located in front of each rear wheel mounting position. Secure with hairpin cotter (E) provided in hardware pack. See figure 3.


4 . Assemble the upper handle halves (I) to lower
 handle using five hex bolts (A) and lock nuts
 (B). Only tighten finger tight. See figure 4.


- 5. Place the tab on throttle control between the upper handle halves at top hole. Secure with hex bolt (C) (Yellow) and hex lock nut (B) provided in hardware pack. See figure 5.
- 6. Tighten securely all six hex bolts and hex lock nuts with 7/16" wrench.

- 7. Secure throttle control wire to handle with two cable ties (D) provided in hardware pack.
 —See figure 6.
- 8. Check all nuts and bolts for correct tightness.

CAUTION

Please note that the chute deflector on your mower is in an upright position. It is held in that position by a shipping block. This block is used for shipping purposes only. It must be removed and discarded before your mower is put into operation. See figure 7.

OPERATION

Keep hands and feet away from the chute area on cutting deck. See figure 8.

For shipping puposes, the wheels on your mower are generally set in the upper mounting holes. Relocating the wheels to the second holes from the bottom will give better mowing results in most cases. When changing wheel positions, be sure belleville washers are assembled properly. (See cutting height instructions.)

1. FILL SUMP WITH OIL—Use a high quality detergent oil classified "For Service SC, SD, SE or MS". Nothing should be added to the recommended oil.

SUMMER (Above 40° F.) Use SAE 30 If not available, Use SAE 10W-30 WINTER
(Under 40° F.)
Use SAE 5W-20 or SAE 5W-30
If not available,
Use SAE 10W or SAE 10W-30

or SAE 10W-40

DIRECTIONS: Place the engine level. Remove oil filler plug. FILL THE OIL SUMP TO POINT OF OVERFLOWING. Pour slowly. Capacity 1-1/4 pints.

- FILL FUEL TANK—Use clean, fresh, lead-free or leaded "regular" grade automotive gasoline. Fill tank completely!
 - DO NOT MIX OIL WITH GASOLINE.
- 3. When ready to start engine, place throttle control lever on handle in "START" position and start engine in accordance with instructions in engine manual. After engine starts, move throttle control lever on handle to desired engine speed. The engine is stopped by placing control lever on handle in the "STOP" position.
- 4. Be sure that lawn is clear of stones, sticks, wire, or other objects which could damage lawn mower or engine. For best results and to insure more even grass distribution, do not mow when lawn is excessively wet.



After striking a foreign object, stop the engine. Remove wire from spark plug and thoroughly inspect the mower for any damage. Repair the damage before restarting and operating the mower.

ADJUSTMENTS



Do not at any time make any adjustment to lawn mower without first stopping engine and disconnecting spark plug wire.

CUTTING HEIGHT

Adjustment may be made by removing and moving wheel studs to desired position. Cutting heights will be raised as wheel studs are moved to a lower hole and lowered as wheel studs are moved to a higher hole in the deck. All wheel studs must be mounted in a relative position to the deck. See figure 3.

THROTTLE

If adjustment becomes necessary, the throttle control wire assembly can be reset as follows:

- Loosen, but do not remove, screw securing throttle control wire assembly at engine. See figure 9.
- 2. Move throttle control lever on handle to "FAST" position.
- Move lever, to which control wire is fastened at engine, to full open position and retighten screw to secure throttle control wire assembly.



If any adjustments are made to the engine while the engine is running (e.g. carburetor), disengage all clutches and blades. Keep clear of all moving parts. Be careful of heated surfaces and muffler.

CARBURETOR ADJUSTMENTS See Figure 10.

Minor carburetor adjustment may be required to compensate for differences in fuel, temperature, altitude and load.

All carburetor adjustments should be made with the air cleaner on engine. Air cleaner mounting screw must be in carburetor when engine is run. Best adjustment is made with a fuel tank half full of gasoline.

To Adjust Carburetor:

 Start engine and run long enough to warm it to operating temperature. If engine is out of adjustment so that it will not start, close the needle valve by turning it clockwise. Then open needle valve 1-1/2 turns counterclockwise.

- 2. Move engine control to run engine at normal operating speed.
 - a. Turn needle valve in clockwise until engine starts to lose speed (lean mixture).
 - b. Then slowly turn needle valve out counterclockwise past the point of smoothest operation until engine just begins to run unevenly (rich mixture).
 - c. Turn needle valve back in clockwise very slowly till engine runs evenly.
 - d. Final adjustment of the needle valve should be slightly to the rich side (turn counterclockwise) of the mid-point.
- Move engine control to SLOW. Turn idle adjusting screw until a fast idle is obtained—(1750 R.P.M.).
- 4. To check adjustment, move engine control from SLOW to FAST speed. Engine should accelerate smoothly. If engine tends to stall or die out increase idle speed or re-adjust carburetor, usually to a slightly richer mixture.



LUBRICATION



Always stop engine and disconnect spark plug wire before cleaning, lubricating or doing any kind of work on lawn mower.

Wheels—Wheel bearings are of self-lubricating Fortiflex. They require no lubrication. If your unit is provided with optional ball bearing wheels, lubricate at least once a season with light oil.

Protective Shield—The pivot points on the protective shield should be lubricated periodically with light oil to prevent any rust or binding.

Chute Deflector—The torsion spring and pivot point should be lubricated periodically with light oil to prevent any rust or binding. Deflector must work freely.

Engine—Follow engine manual for lubrication instructions.

Throttle—Periodically lubricate throttle control lever and throttle wire assembly with a few drops of light oil (SAE No. 10 or 20) for ease of operation.

MAINTENANCE

CUTTING BLADE

The blade may easily be removed for grinding or replacement as follows:

- 1. Remove bolt and lock washer holding blade blade adapter to engine crankshaft.
- 2. Remove blade and blade adapter from engine crankshaft.
- 3. Remove two bolts, lock washers and nuts holding blade to blade adapter (if necessary).

When sharpening blade, follow the original angle of grind as a guide. It is extremely important that each cutting edge receives an equal amount of grinding to prevent an unbalanced blade. An unbalanced blade will cause excessive vibration when rotating at high speeds and may cause damage to the mower.

To insure safe operation of your unit, ALL nuts and bolts must be checked periodically for correct tightness.

DECK

The underside of mower deck should be cleaned after each period of use as grass clippings, leaves, dirt and other matter will accumulate. This accumulation of grass clippings, etc., is undesirable as it will invite rust and corrosion and may cause an uneven discharge of grass clippings at the next cutting.

The deck may be cleaned by tilting the mower forward or on its side and scraping clean with a suitable tool or by washing with a stream of water from a garden hose.



Do not direct the stream of water at a hot engine as damage to the engine may result.

CHECK OIL LEVEL before starting engine and after every 5 hours of operation.

ADD oil as necessary to keep level FULL TO POINT OF OVERFLOWING.

Before removing oil fill plug, clean area around plug to prevent dirt from entering oil fill hole.

Engine should be in a level position when checking oil.

CHANGE OIL after first 5 hours of operation. Thereafter change every 25 hours. Change oil while engine is warm. Oil may be drained thru drain on bottom of engine. To drain completely, always place engine level when draining thru the bottom. Oil capacity 1-1/4 pints. See figure 11.

CLEAN AIR CLEANER and re-oil element every 25 hours under normal conditions. Clean every few hours under extremely dusty conditions. Poor engine performance and flooding usually indicates that the air cleaner should be serviced. See figure 12.



- 1. Remove screw.
- Remove air cleaner carefully to prevent dirt from entering carburetor.
- 3. Take air cleaner apart and clean.
 - a. WASH foam element in kerosene or a liquid detergent and water to remove dirt
 - b. DRY foam completely by wrapping and squeezing in a cloth.
 - c. SOAK foam with engine oil. Squeeze to distribute and remove excess oil.

4. Reassemble parts and fasten to carburetor.

SPARK PLUG

The spark plug gap should be cleaned (see figure 13) and reset to a 0.030-inch clearance once a season (see figure 14). Spark plug replacement is recommended at the start of each mowing season; check engine parts list for correct plug type.





Whenever the spark plug is removed for cleaning, it is advisable to replace the spark plug gasket with a new gasket.

USING YOUR ROTARY MOWER

For the best results do not cut wet grass because it tends to stick to the underside of the mower, thus preventing proper discharge of grass clippings. If wet grass must be cut, reduce walking speed to help distribute the clippings more effectively.

New grass should be treated as wet grass, otherwise a normal walking speed is about the right pace for efficient mowing.

The best mowing pattern is one that allows the clippings to discharge towards the uncut part of the lawn. This permits recutting of the clippings to further pulverize them. When cutting high weeds, discharge towards cut portion then recut at right angles to first direction.

Lawn should be cut in the fall as long as there is growth.

OFF-SEASON STORAGE

The following steps should be taken to prepare lawn mower for storage.

- 1. Clean and lubricate mower thoroughly as described in the preceding instructions.
- 2. Refer to Engine Manual for correct engine storage instructions.
- 3. Coat mower's cutting blade with chassis grease to prevent rusting.
- 4. Place blocks under deck to raise tires clear of floor.
- 5. Store mower in a dry, clean area.



The manufacturer DOES NOT recommend the use of any accessory on this Rotary Mower other than those manufactured by the mower manufacturer.

GRASS CATCHER Model No. 190-003A is available as optional equipment for the mowers shown in this manual.




- 1. The mower should not be operated without the entire grass catcher or chute deflector in place.
- 2. The mower should not be operated without the protective shield on the rear of the deck in place.



Under normal usage bag material is subject to wear and should be checked periodically. Be sure any replacement bag complies with the mower manufacturer's recommendations.

For replacement bags, use only factory authorized replacement bag No. 764-0176.
