





You need to have music files on your computer before transferring them to the player and playing back. There are various ways to obtain music files, such as importing from CDs, purchasing at online music stores, downloading from the Internet, and so on.

Be careful that the player can play back music files in supported formats only. Also, copyright protected music files may not be playable depending on their copyright protection. For details about supported file formats, see [Details].

Once you have music files on your computer, you are ready to transfer them to the player. You can transfer music to the player in the following three ways.



- The player does not use SonicStage software (SonicStage software, developed by Sony, manages music on a computer or transfers music to other types of players). For this player, you can transfer music in the above three ways, not using SonicStage.
 ATRAC files managed by SonicStage can be transferred to the player after conversion to MP3 file format.
- The maximum number of files per folder in the [MUSIC] folder is 4,000.

Note

- During data transfer between the player and a computer, [Do not disconnect.] appears on the player's screen. While [Do not disconnect.] is displayed, do not disconnect the USB cable. Otherwise, the data being transferred or the data stored in the player may be damaged.
- Do not leave the player connected for extended periods to a laptop computer that is not connected to AC power, since the player may discharge the computer's battery.
- If you turn on or restart the computer while the player is connected to the computer, the
 player may malfunction. In this case, press the RESET button of the player to reset it
 [Details]. Disconnect the player from the computer before turning on or restarting the
 computer.





Turning the player on and off

- To turn on the player
- To turn off the player



- 1 OPTION/PWR OFF button
- 2 HOLD switch

If [On hold... Cancel HOLD function to activate controls.] appears on the screen, slide the HOLD switch in the opposite direction of the arrow on the right side of the player to cancel the HOLD function.

To turn on the player

Press any button to turn the player on.

To turn off the player

Press and hold the OPTION/PWR OFF button [Details]. [POWER OFF] appears, the player enters standby mode, and the screen turns off.

Hint

- Set the date and time on the player before using it [Details].
- During pause, if there is no operation for about 3 minutes, the player automatically enters standby mode, and the screen turns off. In standby mode, press any button to turn on the screen again.
- While the player is in standby mode, if there is no operation for about 4 hours, the player completely turns off automatically.

Note

- You cannot operate the player when it is connected to a computer. Disconnect the USB cable before operating the player.
- After connecting to a computer with the USB cable, the resume information of the last played song, video, photo, etc., is cleared. Reselect the desired content from the list screen.
- The player consumes battery power very slightly even when it is in standby mode.
 Therefore, the player might unexpectedly turn off completely, depending on the power remaining in the battery.



Charging the battery

About the battery indicator

The player's battery is recharged while the player is connected to a running computer. When you connect the player to your computer, use the USB cable (supplied).



1 Display

When charging the battery, you can check the battery charging status.

Battery charging status on the display

Status	Description
	Charging (*1)
Full	Charging is completed (*1).
Blank screen	The battery is not being charged (*2).

- (*1) Charging time is approx. 2 hours. When charging is completed, disconnect the player from the USB connector of your computer.
- (*2) If the computer enters a power saving mode, such as the Sleep or Hibernation mode, the player's screen may turn off. In this case, the player consumes battery power.

Hint

- Depending on the computer, changing the settings of the Sleep or Hibernation mode varies. Refer to the manufacturer.
- When you use the player for the first time, or if you have not used the player for a long time, recharge it fully (until the battery charge indicator displays Full).

About the battery indicator

The battery indicator in the information area shows the remaining battery charge.



As the battery power gets lower, the bars of the icon disappear. If [LOW BATTERY. Please Charge.] appears, you cannot use the player. In this case, charge the battery by connecting to

your computer. See [Details] on battery duration.

Note

- If you charge the player when it has not been used for a long period, your computer may not recognize the player, or nothing may appear on the display. Charge the player for about 5 minutes, after which it should start operating normally again.
- Charge the battery in an ambient temperature of between 5 °C to 35 °C (41 °F to 95 °F). If you try to charge the battery in an ambient temperature outside this range, the icon may appear, and charging cannot be performed.
- The number of times the battery can be recharged before it is used up is approximately 500 times. This number may vary, depending on the conditions under which you use the player.
- The battery indicator on the display is only an estimate. For example, one section of black in the indicator will not always indicate exactly one-fourth of the battery's charge.
- [Do not disconnect.] appears in the display while the computer accesses the player. During this time, do not disconnect the USB cable (supplied); otherwise, data being transferred (or data already in the player) may be damaged.
- The control buttons on the player become inoperative while it is connected to a computer.
- To prevent battery deterioration, charge the battery at least once every half a year or every year.
- Some USB devices connected to the computer may interfere with proper operation of the player.
- We do not guarantee battery recharging using a personally assembled/modified computer.
- If the computer enters a power saving mode, such as the Sleep or Hibernation mode, while
 the player is connected via the USB cable, the player's battery will not be charged. Instead,
 the player continues to draw power from the battery, discharging it.
- Do not leave the player connected for extended periods to a laptop computer that is not connected to AC power, since the player may discharge the computer's battery.
- While the player is connected to a computer, do not turn on, restart, wake up from sleep mode, or shut down the computer. These operations may cause the player to malfunction.
 Disconnect the player from the computer before performing these operations.
- Heat may build up in the player while charging. This is not a malfunction.
- After connecting to a computer with the USB cable, the resume information of the last played song, video, photo, etc., is cleared. Reselect the desired content from the list screen.

- Turn off the player manually

By adjusting the settings or managing the power supply properly, it is possible to save battery power for longer usage time between charges.

The following hints will yield a longer battery life.

Turn off the player manually

If you press and hold the OPTION/PWR OFF button, the player enters standby mode and the screen turns off to save battery power. Furthermore, if standby mode continues for more than about 4 hours, the player turns completely off automatically.

Longer battery life settings

The following settings are effective for extending the battery life of the player.

- Reduce the [Brightness] setting value.
- · Set [Type] of [Screensaver] to [Blank].
- Set [Equalizer], [Clear Stereo] and [Dynamic Normalizer] to [None] or [Off].

 Windows Media Player begins to import the CD.
 The imported songs are indicated as [Ripped to library]. Wait until all songs have been imported.

- [All Songs], [Album], [Artist] and [Genre] lists are arranged in alphanumeric order. The [Release Year] list is arranged in reverse chronological order. In the [Folder] list, folders are displayed in name order first, then files are displayed in name order. In this case, upper or lower case letters are not distinguished.

Operation

There is no sound.

- The volume level is set to zero.
 - → Turn the volume up.
- The headphone plug is not connected properly.
 - → If the headphones are connected improperly, the sound from the headphones will be impaired. Insert the headphone plug until it clicks into place [Details].
- The headphone plug is dirty.
 - → Clean the headphone plug with a soft dry cloth.
- No songs or videos are stored on the player.
 - → Follow the instructions in the displayed message, and transfer songs or videos from the computer.
- After prescribing the remedies above, if the problem still persists, press the RESET button of the player [Details].

Data cannot be played.

- The battery is consumed.
 - → Charge the battery fully [Details].
 - → If the player does not react, even after charging the battery, press the RESET button to reset the player [Details].
- · No data is stored on the player.
 - → Follow the instructions in the message, and transfer data from the computer.
- After transferring by drag-and-drop in Windows Explorer, data hierarchy levels do not correspond to the player.
 - → Place the data in the correct place by drag-and-drop [Details].
- Transferred files are not in a playable format.
 - → For information on the playable formats, see [Details]. Some files may not be played back, depending on certain file specifications.

Connection to a computer

Cannot install the software.

- Your computer is installed with an operating system that is not supported by the player.
 - → Check the operating system of your computer [Details].
- Other software is running on Windows.
 - → If another software is running, it may interfere with installation. Particularly, be sure to stop security software as it can put a heavy load on the computer.
- There is not enough free space for the hard drive.
 - → Check the required hard drive space for installing the application, and delete unnecessary files.
- Your account has no administrator privileges, or you have not logged in as the computer's administrator.
 - → To install the software, log in with an account with administrator privileges or log in as the computer's administrator.
- A message dialog is covered from your site by the install screen.
 - → Press and hold the [Alt] key and press the [Tab] key several times until the message dialog appears. Then follow the message.

The progress bar on the install screen does not proceed. Or, the access lamp of the hard drive does not light for several minutes.

 Wait until the installation is completed, because it is progressing properly. The installation may take 30 minutes or more depending on the computer.

[Connected USB. The Timer and Alarm will become invalid.] or [Connected USB (MTP) The Timer and Alarm will become invalid.] does not appear when connected to the computer with the USB cable (supplied) (The computer does not recognize the player).

- The remaining battery power is insufficient.
 - → Charge the battery by connecting the player to a running computer for at least 5 minutes.
- The USB cable is not connected to a USB connector on your computer properly.
 - → Disconnect the USB cable, and then reconnect it.
 - → Use the supplied USB cable.
- A USB hub is being used.
 - → Connecting the player via a USB hub may not work. Connect the player directly to your computer using the USB cable (supplied).
- The USB connector on your computer may have a problem.
 - → Connect the player to another USB connector on your computer.
- When you use the player for the first time, or when the battery is low, it may take the player about 30 seconds to display the message after connected to a computer. This is not a malfunction.

- The software authentication may be performed and it may take rather a long time. Wait for a while.
- The software installation has been failed.
 - → Reinstall the software by using the installer. The imported data will remain untouched.
- The computer is running another software other than the one used for transferring.
 - → Disconnect the USB cable, wait a few minutes, and reconnect it. If the problem persists, disconnect the USB cable, restart the computer, and then reconnect the USB cable.

 - → Activate Windows Media Player, or Windows Explorer.
- After prescribing the remedies above, if the problem still persists, press the RESET button of the player and reconnect it to the computer by using the USB cable (supplied).

Data cannot be transferred to the player from your computer.

- Transferring may be stopped due to noise, such as static electricity, etc. This happens to protect data information.

FM broadcasts are unclear.

What is audio format?

Audio format refers to the method used to import audio data from the Internet or audio CDs to a computer, to save as an audio file.

Common formats include MP3 and WMA, etc.

MP3: MP3 (MPEG-1 Audio Layer3) is a common audio compression technology developed by the MPEG working group of the ISO (International Organization for Standardization). MP3 can compress audio files to about 1/10 the size of standard CD audio files.

WMA: WMA (Windows Media Audio) is a common audio compression technology developed by Microsoft Corporation. The WMA format produces the same sound quality as that of the MP3 format with a smaller file size.

AAC: AAC (Advanced Audio Coding) is a common audio compression technology developed by the MPEG working group of the ISO (International Organization for Standardization). The AAC format produces the same sound quality as that of the MP3 format, with a smaller file size.

Linear PCM: Linear PCM is an audio recording format without digital compression. You can achieve CD sound quality by recording with this format.

What is copyright protection?

Certain music files or video files, etc., that you purchase from a music download service site, etc., may have access control technologies applied, such as encryption, to limit usage and duplication of the material, in accordance with copyright laws.

The player cannot play the audio files that use the digital rights management technology for Windows Media ("WM-DRM").

What is bit rate?

Bit rate refers to the amount of data used to store each second of audio, expressed in kbps (kilo bits per second), such as 64 kbps. Generally, higher bit rates provide better sound quality, but require more storage space for the same length of audio.

What is the relationship between bit rate, sound quality, and storage size?

Generally, higher bit rates provide better sound quality, but require more storage space for the same length of audio, so you can store fewer songs on the player.

Lower bit rates enable you to store more songs, but at a lower sound quality.

Note

• If you import a song from a CD to your computer at a low bit rate, you cannot improve the song's sound quality by selecting a high bit rate when further transferring the song from the computer to the player.

Video format refers to the method used when importing video and audio data to a computer and saving it as a video file.

WMV: WMV (Windows Media Video) is a video compression format developed by Microsoft Corporation. It was built upon MPEG-4, achieves a high compression rate, and supports copy control by DRM.

Photo format refers to the method used to import images to a computer to save as image files. JPEG is one example of a commonly used format.

JPEG: JPEG (Joint Photographic Experts Group) is a common image compression format developed by the JPEG. JPEG can compress an image file to between 1/10 and 1/100 the size of original image files.
