FM:



How to receive an FM broadcast clearly Set (FM RECEPTION) to [NORMAL]. When the FM reception is impaired, or there is interference from a powerful station, set it to [CITY].

Preset tuning

Frequencies of up to 20 radio stations (10 each for AM and FM) can be stored in the memory.

How to adjust the allocation settings

- While playing the radio
- 1. Set [MAIN, SUB, HOLD] to [MAIN].
- 2. While pressing [BATT CHECK +5], press and hold [5, RADIO ON/BAND] for about 3 seconds.
- The changed allocation settings (FM and then AM) are displayed.

Note: Converting the allocation erases the stations previously stored in memory.
