## Using the rechargeable batteries (not included)

Use either "AA" batteries or, by inserting the supplied adaptor, "AAA" batteries. This unit cannot recharge batteries other than those especially designed for it. Obtain the optional rechargeable batteries:

## Charging procedure

Recharging starts and the "•• "C" charging indicator flashes on the unit's display. The indicator goes out when charging is complete.

When charging is complete, unplug the AC adaptor from the household AC outlet and DC IN jack.

Never mix dry cell and rechargeable batteries.
Turn the unit off before replacing the rechargeable batteries.

- Rechargeable batteries have a service life of approximately 300 charge-discharge cycles. The batteries have reached the end of their operational life if they last for a noticeably shorter time after recharging, or if they cannot be recharged at all. Replace the batteries.
- Recharging may only be performed when the unit is
- •The AC adaptor and rechargeable batteries may become warm while recharging is in progress. This is not a malfunction.

### When the battery indicator flashes



This indicator flashes when the batteries are almost out of power. Power is cut off completely a short while later. **Rechargeable batteries:** Recharge batteries.

Dry-cell batteries: Replace batteries with new ones.



# **HOLD function**



This function causes the unit to ignore accidental button presses. (The disc lid can still be opened and closed.)

# The HOLD function prevents the following:

- The unit is powered on accidentally when not in use, causing the batteries to run down.
- A button is accidentally pressed during play, interrupting the operation.

# To use the HOLD function
