

- 1. Read these instructions---All operating instructions must be read and understood before the product is operated.
- 2. Keep these instructions---These safety and operating instructions must be kept in a safe place for future reference.
- 3. Heed all warnings---All warnings on the product and in the instructions must be observed closely.
- **4. Follow all instructions**—All operating instructions must be followed.
- **5. Do not use this apparatus near water**---for example, near a bathtub, washbowl, kitchen sink, or laundry tub, in a wet basement, or near a swimming pool, and the like. Do not use immediately after moving from a low temperature to high temperature environment, as this causes condensation, which may result in fire, electric shock, or other hazards.


**13. Move carefully---**When a cart is used, use caution when moving the cart/apparatus combination to avoid injury from tip-over. Sudden stops, excessive force and uneven floor surfaces can cause the product to fall from the trolley.

Never attempt to move the TV unless the AC power cord has been disconnected.



**14. Lightning---**Unplug this apparatus during lightning storms or when unused for long periods of time.

For added protection for this television equipment during a lightning storm, or when it is left unattended and unused for long periods of time, unplug it from the wall outlet and disconnect the antenna. This will prevent damage to the equipment due to lightning and power-line surges.


#### **Using the Remote Control**

■ Use the remote control by pointing it towards the remote sensor window of the set. Objects between the remote control and sensor window may prevent proper operation.

**Note**: This illustration is for reference only. The remote sensor may be in different locations on different models.

#### Cautions regarding use of remote control


- Do not expose the remote control to shock. In addition, do not expose the remote control to liquids, and do not place in an area with high humidity.
- Do not install or place the remote control under direct sunlight. The heat may cause deformation of the unit.
- The remote control may not work properly if the remote sensor window of the main unit is under direct sunlight or strong lighting. In such a case, change the angle of the lighting or LCD TV set, or operate the remote control closer to the remote sensor window.



#### **Batteries for the Remote Control**


If the remote control fails to operate the LCD TV functions, replace the batteries in the remote control.

1 Open the battery cover.




2 Insert two size-AAA batteries.

■ (Place the batteries with their terminals corresponding to the (+) and (–) indications in the battery compartment.)



3 Replace the cover.



#### Precaution on battery use

Improper use of batteries can result in a leakage of chemicals and/or explosion. Be sure to follow the instructions below.

- Place batteries with their terminals corresponding to the (+) and (–) indications.
- Different types of batteries have different characteristics. Do not mix batteries of different types.
- Do not mix old and new batteries. Mixing old and new batteries can shorten the life of new batteries and/or cause old batteries to leak chemicals.
- Remove batteries as soon as they are non-operable. Chemicals that leak from batteries can cause a rash. If chemical leakage is found, wipe with a cloth.
- If the remote control is not used for an extended period of time, remove the batteries from the remote control.
- The batteries (battery pack of batteries installed) shall not be exposed to excessive heat such as sunshine, fire or the like.


#### **Antenna Connection**

#### **CABLE TV (CATV) CONNECTION**

A 75-ohm coaxial cable connector is built into the set for easy hookup. When connecting the 75-ohm coaxial cable to the set, screw the 75ohm cable to the ANT. Terminal.

Some cable TV companies offer "premium pay channels". Since the signals of these premium pay channels are scrambled, a cable TV converter/descrambler is generally provided to the subscriber by the cable TV company.

This converter/descrambler is necessary for normal viewing of the scrambled channels. For more specific instructions on installing cable TV, consult your cable TV company. One possible method of utilizing the converter/descrambler provided by your cable TV company is explained below. Please note: An RF switch provided with two inputs (A and B) is required (not supplied).



"A" position on the RF switch (not supplied): You can view all unscrambled channels by using the TV's channel keys.

"B" position on the RF switch (not supplied): You can view the scrambled channels via the converter/descrambler by using the converter's channel kevs.


Consult your Dealer or Service Center for the type of splitter, RF switch or combiner that might be required.

#### **ANTENNAS**

The antenna requirements for good color television reception are more important than those for black & white television reception. For this reason, a good quality outdoor antenna is strongly recommended.

The following is a brief explanation of the type of connections that are provided with the various antenna systems.

- 1. A 75-ohm system is generally a round cable with F-type connector that can easily be attached to a terminal without tools (not supplied).
- 2. A 300-ohm system is a flat "twin-lead" cable that can be attached to a 75-ohm terminal through a 300-75-ohm adapter (not supplied).






Connect the outdoor antenna cable lead-in to the ANT. terminal on the rear of the TV set.

#### POWER ()

Press this button to turn the unit ON from STANDBY mode. Press it again to turn the set back to STANDBY.

#### SOURCE

To access signal source select menu

#### MENU

Press this button to access the Menu main page.

#### ▶ VOL+/ ∢ VOL-

Press the ▶ VOL+ or ◀ VOL- button to directly increase or decrease the sound volume level; In OSD Menu, press these buttons to adjust the value or setting of each item.

#### ▲ CH+/ ▼ CH-

Press these two buttons to directly change the TV channel; In OSD Menu, press these buttons to choose the OSD items.

#### Note:

Functions of ▶ VOL+/◀ VOL-, ▲ CH+/▼ CH-, MENU, SOURCE and POWER are also provided to the remote control. This operation manual provides a description based on operating functions with the remote control.







#### Connect a DVD player or Set-Top Box




#### How to connect a DVD Player using Component Video Connections:

Connect the Video cable between the Y, Cb/Pb, Cr/Pr input jacks on the unit and Y, Pb, Pr output jacks on the DVD player. Connect the Audio cable between the AUDIO input jack on the unit and AUDIO output jacks on the DVD player.

#### To play DVD

- 1. Turn on your TV , press **SOURCE** button on the remote control.
- 2. Press ▲ or ▼ repeatedly to select **YPBPR1** or **YPBPR2**, and press ◀ or ▶ to confirm.
- 3. Turn on your DVD player, insert a DVD disc and press the Play button.



- 2. Press ▲ or ▼ repeatedly to select **PC** and press ◆ or ▶ to confirm.
- 3. Turn on your PC and check for PC system requirements.
- 4. Adjust the PC screen.





#### How to connect:

Connect the Audio/Video cables between the Audio (L/R)/Video jacks on the unit and VCR.

#### To record program

- 1. Turn on your TV, select a program you wish to record.
- 2. Turn on your VCR, insert a videotape for recording.
- 3. Press the Record button to begin recording.

#### To enjoy high-quality sound through an external amplifier

#### Note:

The operations of the amplifier may be different depending on model. Please read the user manual of your amplifier to confirm proper operation.

Only analog TV programs, AV1, AV2 and SVIDEO input sources can be output through the AV output jacks.

# **Basic Operations**

#### Turning the Unit On and Off

#### **Turning On**

Insert the power cord into the wall outlet.

Press the **Power**  $\circlearrowleft$  button on the remote control, the unit will be turned on and you will be ready to use its features.

#### **Turning Off**

With the power on, press the **Power** button on the remote control to turn off the unit.

#### Note:

You can also use the **Power**  $\odot$  button on the Control panel on the main unit. After you turn off the television, you should wait for some seconds to turn the television on again.

#### Viewing the Menus and Displays

This unit has a simple, easy-to-use menu system that appears on the screen. This system makes it convenient and fast to use features on the unit. The unit also lets you display the status of many of your TV features.

#### Viewing the Menus

- 1 With the power on, press the **MENU** button on the remote control. The main menu appears on the screen.
- 2 Press ◀ or ▶ to select menu page, and press ▼ to access.
- 3 Use the ▲ or ▼ to select menu item and ◀ or ▶ to adjust value or setting of the item.
- 4 Press MENU button repeatedly to exit.

To clearly introduce the menu operations, this operation manual provides a description based on operation with the remote control.

#### **Displaying Status Information**

Press the **DISPLAY** button on the remote control, the unit will display current status information such as channel number, audio mode or signal source, etc.

# **Basic Operations** (continued)

#### **Changing Channels**

#### Using the Channel Buttons (CH+ or CH-)

Press the CH+ or CH- to change channels.

When you press the **CH+** or **CH-**, the unit changes channels in sequence. You will see all the channels that the unit has memorized. You will not see channels that were skipped.

#### **Direct Accessing Channels**

Press the **number buttons** to go directly to a channel.

To select a one-digit channel: input the channel number by pressing the **0-9 number buttons** to display X--, and wait for some seconds the unit goes to the selected channel.

To select a two-digit channel: input the channel number by pressing the **0-9 number buttons** to display XX-, and wait for some seconds the unit goes to the selected channel.

To select a three-digit channel: input the channel number by pressing the **0-9 number buttons** to display XXX, and the unit goes to the selected channel at once.

#### Note:

"X" is 0-9 number.

When you use the number buttons, you can directly select channels that were skipped.

#### Using the RETURN ⇔ button

Press this button to switch between the current channel and the previous channel.

#### Selecting Input Source Signal

- 1 Press the **SOURCE** button to display the **SOURCE** menu.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to select a desired input source.
- 3 Press ◆ or ▶ to confirm.

PC -----Select signal from VGA jack.

**HDMI**-----Select signal from HDMI terminal.

**TV**-----Select TV signal.

AV1-----Select signal from AV IN 1 terminals.

**AV2----**Select signal from AV IN 2 terminals.

SVIDEO-----Select signal from S-Video terminal.

**YPBPR1**-----Select signal from COMPONENT IN 1 terminals.

YPBPR2-----Select signal from COMPONENT IN 2 terminals.






# **Memorizing the Channels**

Your TV can memorize and store all of the available channels. After the available channels are memorized, use CH+/- to scan through the channels.

#### Selecting the TV Source

Before you start **AUTO SCAN**, it is necessary to specify the type of signal source that is connect to the unit.(i.e., an antenna or cable system).

- 1 Press **MENU** to display the menu main page.
- Press ◆ or ▶ repeatedly to select **TV-CHANNEL** menu, and press ▼ to access. Then the [**SOURCE**] item will be highlighted automatically.
- 3 Press ◆ or ▶ to select AIR or CABLE item. In AIR mode, the set receives antenna signal. In CABLE mode, the set receives cable TV program.
- 4 Press **MENU** button repeatedly to exit.



#### Searching Channels Automatically

- 1 Navigate to the TV-CHANNEL menu, and highlight AUTO SCAN item.
- Press or to begin the auto channel search.
  The unit will begin memorizing all of the available channels.

**Note:** During the process of the Auto Scan, you can press **MENU** button to stop the search.



#### Skipping Channels


- 1 Navigate to the **TV-CHANNEL** menu, and highlight **CHANNEL** item.
- Press ◆ or ▶ to select a channel you want to skip.
- 4 Use ◀ or ▶ to select ADD or ERASE. When the item is set to ERASE, the selected channel will be skipped. When the item is set to ADD, the selected channel will not be skipped.
- 5 Press **MENU** button repeatedly to exit.

The skipped channels can not be selected by using CH+/- buttons unless you use number buttons to input channel number directly.



# Manual Fine Tuning

- 1 Select a channel you want to perform fine tuning.
- 2 Navigate to the **TV-CHANNEL** menu, and press ▲ or ▼ repeatedly to select **FINE TUNE** item.
- 3 Press ◀ or ▶ to start the fine tune till the best possible picture and sound are obtained.





#### Customizing the Picture

The scale item cannot be adjusted when there is no input signal or the picture is freezed.

#### Freezing picture

Press the **STILL** button to hold on the image on the screen (the video sources still run). Press it again to reactivate the image.

**Note:** For the sake of protecting the screen, please do not freeze a picture for a long time.




# **Setting Timer and System**

#### Setting Clock Time

Making use of this function can set the current time for the TV.

- 1 Press **MENU** to display the menu main page.
- Press ◆ or ▶ repeatedly to select **FUNCTION** menu, and Press ▼ to access. Then the [ **CLOCK** ] item will be highlighted automatically.
- 3 Use **0-9 number** buttons to input the current time.
- 4 Press MENU button repeatedly to exit.

**Note**: Before setting the **ON TIMER** and **OFF TIMER**, please set the **CLOCK** item first.




**Notes:** The above menu is shown as an example. The menu items may be different when the unit works in different mode.

#### Setting ON timer

With the ON timer, the TV will automatically turn on at a preset time.

- 1 Press **MENU** to display the menu main page.
- **?** Press ◆ or ▶ repeatedly to select **FUNCTION** menu, and press ▼ to access.
