3.3 Install

Important Make sure to install the software provided in the supplied CD for music and video transfer.

System requirements:

- Windows Vista, XP, ME or 2000
- Pentium III 800MHz processor or higher
- 128MB RAM
- 500MB hard disk space
- Internet connection (preferable)
- Microsoft Internet Explorer 6.0 or later
- CD-ROM
- USB port
- 1 Insert the CD supplied with your product into the CD ROM drive of your PC.
- 2 Follow the on-screen instructions to complete the installation of **Philips Device** Manager and **Philips Media Converter**.
- 3 If the installation program does not start automatically, browse the CD contents with **Windows Explorer** and run the program by double clicking on the file ending with .exe.

3.4 Connect and charge

Your player will be charged when connected to the PC.

3.4.1 Use the supplied USB cable



Connect the supplied USB cable to PC for charging and data transfer. However, your PC must have hi-power capability in order to perform charging.

Note Charge your player for at least 5 hours before using it for the first time. The battery* will be fully charged (100%) in 4 hours.

The player is fully charged when the charging animation stops and 🛐 is displayed.

Your fully charged player will allow up to 15 hours* of music playback or 4 hours* of video playback.

3.4.2 Battery level indication

The approximate power levels of your battery are indicated as follows:



Note When the batteries are almost empty, the low battery screen blinks. Your player will power down in less than 60 seconds. Your player will save all settings and unfinished recordings before it powers down.

* Rechargeable batteries have a limited number of charge cycles and may eventually need to be replaced. Battery life and number of charge cycles vary by use and settings.

3.5 Transfer music, pictures and texts

Your player appears as a USB mass storage device in **Windows Explorer**. You can organize files, transfer music, pictures and texts to your player during USB connection.

- 1 Click and highlight one or more files to transfer between your player and your computer.
- 2 Use drag and drop actions to complete your transfer.

Tip To transfer music CDs to your player use software such as Musicmatch Jukebox or Windows Media Player, rip (convert) the songs on your music CD into MP3/WMA files. Copy the files into your digital audio player via Windows Explorer. Free versions of these programs can be downloaded from the internet.

3.6 Transfer videos

Important If you have DRM protected videos on your PC, make sure that you play these at least once in Windows Media Player before transferring them to your player using MediaConverter for Philips.

Use **MediaConverter for Philips** to convert the video files to the correct screen size and transfer videos from your PC to your player. This application will convert your video files to the right format and resolution before transferring them to your player so that they are guaranteed to playback on your player without any problems.

- 1 Connect your player to the PC via the supplied USB cable.
- 2 Start MediaConverter for Philips by clicking this icon on your desktop.

Note Video conversion and transfer is usually a long process and dependent on your PC configuration. Please be patient while this happens.



- 3 In the **Convert to:** option at the bottom of the screen, select **Current Device**, the contents will be stored directly on the connected player.
- 4 Press the Add Media button to select your video files.
- 5 Press OPEN when you have found the video files on your PC that you want to transfer to the player. You may also add additional video files. OR

Select the files in **Windows explorer** and then drag and drop them into the **MediaConverter for Philips** screen.

6 Press Convert.

Note If needed, the files will first be converted to a format that can be played on the player.

3.7 Disconnect your player safely

Exit any active application working with your player. Remove your player safely by clicking sin the task tray shown in your PC.

3.8 Enjoy

3.8.1 Power on and off

To power on, press **II** until the Philips welcome screen appears.

To power off, press and hold **I** until there is no display on the screen.

Tip Your player automatically powers down if there is no operation and no music or video is played for 10 minutes.

3.8.2 Navigate the menu

Your player has an intuitive menu navigation system to guide you through various settings and operations.

3.8.3 Lock slider

The player has a lock switch to prevent any accidental operation. When you slide the lock slider to the \bigcirc position while the power is on, \bigcirc appears on the screen and all function keys are disabled except for - VOL + to adjust the volume. Slide the lock switch to unlock position and the buttons function as normal.

4 Detail operation

4.1 Music mode (also applicable to playback of recordings)

Your player supports MP3 and WMA formats.

4.1.1 Control

You can do the following action during music playback:

The **Superplay**[™] feature of the player enables you to play all the tracks of currently displayed Artist, Album, Genre, or Playlist without having to select each track individually.

4.1.2 Find your music



1 From the main menu, select **1** to enter music mode. You can search from the following music options:

- 2 Press \blacktriangle or \checkmark to scroll through the list.
- **3** Press ► to select or press < to return to previous level.
- 4 Press ►II to play your selection.

4.1.3 Play mode

You can set your player to play songs randomly (Shuffle All 🙁) or repeatedly (Repeat One 🗠 or Repeat All 🖘).

- 1 From the main menu, select 🗱 > Play mode.
- 2 Press \blacktriangle or \checkmark to scroll up or down the options.
- **3** Press ► to select an option.

While you are playing music, you can see the above active play mode screen.

4.2 Sound settings

Set your player to play songs with different EQ (equalizers) settings.



- 1 From the main menu, select 🗱 > Sound settings.
- 2 Press ▲ or ▼ to scroll through the list of options: Rock, Funk, Jazz, Classical, HipHop, Techno, Spoken word, Custom or Off. You can select one of them.

Note Custom settings allow you to specify your desired equalizer settings by adjusting the individual settings for bass (B), low (L), mid (M), high (H) and treble (T).

3 Press ► to select.

4.3 Playlist on the go

Playlist on the go is a playlist that can be created on the player while on the move.

All songs will be displayed and listed in play order in the playlist. New songs are automatically added to the end of the playlist.

4.3.1 Add songs to playlist on the go

Press PLAYLIST to select the song to be added to the playlist on the go. If you have created more than one playlist on the go, the playlists on the go will be displayed in numerical order. Use the \blacktriangle / \checkmark keys to select the playlist on the go to which you wish to add the song and press \triangleright to confirm.

4.3.2 Play back playlist on the go

- Select **1** > **Playlists** > **Playlist on the go 1** (or Playlist on the go 2 / Playlist on the go 3, if available).
- 2 Select your playlist and press >11.

4.3.3 Add playlist on the go

You can create up to 3 playlists on the go.

1 Select **7** > **Playlists** > **Create playlist on the go**.

4.3.4 Clear playlist on the go

You can clear the playlist completely.

- 1 Press PLAYLIST and select Clear 'Playlist on the go 1'? (or 'Playlist on the go 2' / 'Playlist on the go 3').
- 2 Select Clear 'Playlist on the go'.
- 3 Select Clear to confirm clearing all the songs in the selected playlist on the go, or select **Cancel** to return to the previous menu.
- > A message Cleared! will be displayed.

* Tip This will empty playlist on the go but will not delete those songs from your player.

4.4 Picture library

4.4.1 Transfer pictures from your computer to your player

- Connect the player to your computer. 1
- 2 Drag and drop your pictures to the **PICTURES** folder of your player.

4.4.2 Find your pictures

The player supports JPEG files and provides a slideshow function.





1 From the main menu, select \bigcirc using \land or \checkmark . You can search from the following options:



- 2 Select the picture album folder you wish to view.
- You will see a thumbnail view (Fig1) of all pictures in that album folder. >
- 3 To start a slide show, select [], press >11. If you wish to see a particular picture in its full view, select the thumbnail, press $\ge 11 / \ge$, to start slide show, press ≥ 11 again.
- 4 When you are viewing the picture in full view, press $\triangleleft / \triangleright$ to go to previous / next picture. To return to previous menu, press MENU.

4.5 Videos

You can play the videos that are loaded from the PC using the MediaConverter software.

4.5.1 Find your videos

In the root menu of your player, select [™] by pressing ▲ or ▼.
 You can search from the following video options:



2 Press ► to enter the video library on your player.



3 Press ▲ or ▼ to select the video you want to watch, then press ▶II or ▶ to play your selection.



Note The video will playback in landscape mode to give you a full screen viewing experience,

Tip To better organize your videos, you can create folders for your player via **Windows Explorer**.

- **1** Connect it to your computer.
- > Your player will be identified as Philips or Philips GoGear in Windows Explorer.
- 2 Go to Videos folder.
- 3 In Windows Explorer, right click to create and name a folder in your player.
- 4 Drag and drop converted video files (.wmv) to the newly created folder.
- 5 The video folders you have just created will be displayed under the Videos menu.

4.5.2 Controls

4.6 Delete media

You can delete videos, pictures, music and texts via Windows Explorer on your computer.

Note The delete option is also available in the menu to delete Artists, Albums, Genres etc. This will permanently remove the entry including all content from your library. In case this content is also contained in a playlist, the entry will continue to be contained in the playlist and on playing back this playlist, the missing content will be skipped.

4.7 Recordings

You can make voice recordings using your player. See sections **Overview of controls and connections** for the location of recording microphone.

- 1 From the main menu, select 👱.
- 2 Select **Start recording** to start recording a voice.
- > Your player will display the voice recording screen and voice recording starts automatically.
- 3 Press > 11 to pause.
- 4 Press < to stop and save the voice recording.
- Your voice recording will be saved on your player. (Filename format: VOICEXXX.WAV where XXX is the recording number which will be automatically generated.)
- 5 You can find this file under \mathbf{Q} > **Recordings library**.

4.7.1 Play back recordings



From the main menu, select **9** > **Recordings library**.

- **1** Select the recording you want to hear.
- 2 Press **I** to confirm.

4.7.2 Delete your recordings

The player provides the option to delete all the recordings files of your player.

- 1 From the main menu, select **D** > **Recordings library** > **Delete all recordings**.
- 2 Press II to confirm.

Your can also delete the recordings on the computer.

- 1 Connect your player to your computer.
- 2 Select your player in Windows Explorer.
- 3 Double click the VOICE folder
- 4 Select the files your want to delete and press **Delete** on your computer keyboard.

4.7.3 Upload your recordings to the computer

- **1** Connect your player to your computer.
- 2 Select your player in Windows Explorer.
- > You will find a Voice folder. This folder contains the recordings.
- 3 Copy and paste the recordings to any desired location on the computer.

4.8 Radio

From the main menu, select bo enter radio mode.

Connect the headphones

The supplied pair of headphones serves as a radio antenna. Make sure that it is properly connected to ensure optimal reception.

4.8.1 Select your FM region

From the main menu, select 🗱 > Radio settings.

4.8.2 Auto tune



- 1 Select Auto tune under Radio menu 📷.
- > The player will search for the stations with the strongest signals and automatically save up to 20 preset channels.

Tip Stop auto tune by pressing any key except volume key.

4.8.3 Play a preset radio station and tune the station

- 1 From the Radio menu **b**, select **Presets**.
- **2** Press \blacktriangle or \checkmark to browse and select the preset stations.



- 3 After you select a preset station, short press $\triangleleft / \triangleright$ can change to another preset stations.
- 4 You can also tune the frequency of selected preset station by long pressing \blacktriangle / \bigtriangledown .
- 5 Short press ▲ or ▼ to move one tuning step, long press ▲ or ▼ to search next nearest strongest signal.
- 6 The frequency bar indicates the change in frequency.
- 7 To confirm and save the signal, press **II**.

4.9 Lyrics

The player supports LRC format files and can simultaneously display lyrics while playing back songs. This special feature allows for lyric files to be saved and edited with a lyrics editor (the relevant lyric files as well as the software for a lyrics editor are available on the Internet).

Tip To create and/or edit lyrics you need to a Lyrics Editor. There are plenty of Lyrics Editors as well as "Lyric Files" that can be downloaded free of charge from the Internet.

Note Lyrics lines are linked to time stamps, so the display will only show the lyrics lines that are linked to the currently playing time stamp of the song.

Important To correctly display the lyrics during playback, you must

- Enable the lyrics display in the **Settings** options by selecting Lyrics **On**;
- Save the lyrics file (must have extension **.lrc**) under the same name and in the same location as the audio file to which the lyrics belong.

4.9.1 Scroll through lyric lines

Lyric text is split into lines and assigned to certain time stamps, which enables the device to display the matching lyric line for the particular section within the song.



4.10Folder view

The player also supports the database and folder browsing feature **Folder view**. The Folder view shows the device's contents and its structure resembles that of what you would see on your PC:



4.10.1 Access your files

Use the key or the key to directly access or play your files from the Folder view.

Use the \triangleright key to skip to the next level or the \triangleleft key to skip back to the previous level. The play modes (e.g. "Repeat All") work within folders, but have no function within nested folders.

➡ Note The ►II key has no function when pressed on folders. Nested folders will be skipped during playback.

Files that are not recognized by the player appear grayed out and with an icon indicating an "unknown" file type. These files cannot be executed and will be skipped during playback.

4.11 Settings

The settings menu allows you to make adjustments and personal preferences on your player.



- 1 From the main menu, select 🗱.
- **2** Use \blacktriangle or \checkmark to select an option.
- 3 Press \triangleright to go to the next level or \triangleleft to return to previous level.

You can use your player to store and carry data files by copying data files into your player with **Windows Explorer**.

5 Update your player

Your player is controlled by an internal program called the firmware. Newer versions of the firmware may have been released after you have purchased your player.

A software program called **Philips Device Manager** enables you to update the firmware on your device if a new firmware is available on your PC.

Install **Philips Device Manager** from the supplied CD or download the latest version from www.philips.com/support.

5.1 Manually verify whether your firmware is up to date

- 1 Connect your player to the computer.
- 2 Launch Philips Device Manager from Start > Programs > Philips Digital Audio Player > SA33XX > Philips SA33XX Device Manager.



- 3 Make sure you are connected to the internet.
- 4 Click Update.
- Philips SA33XX Device Manager will check whether a new firmware is available on the Internet and install it on your player.

My player cannot power on.

Your device battery may be out of power due to long period of non-usage. Please charge your player.

In case of device error, connect your player to the computer and use **Philips Device Manager** to restore your player.

Important All your contents will be erased from your player after completion of repair process. After repair, simply synchronize your player again to transfer music to your player.

There is no music on my player after transfer.

If you cannot find the songs that you have transferred to your player, check the following:

• Are your songs in MP3 or WMA format? Other formats will not play back on the player.

My player hangs.

1 In the unlikely event that your player hangs, do not panic. Insert a small pin or other sharp object into the reset hole located at the back of the player. Hold until the player shuts down. Power on again after the player has shut down.

Note The existing contents on your player will not be erased.

2 If nothing happens, recharge the battery for at least 4 hours and try to power on or reset again. If this does not work, you might have to repair your player with Philips Device Manager. (See **Updade your player** section in this user manual for details.)

My player is full and I have fewer songs on my player than I expected.

Your player has an internal memory to store songs. Check your model number to see the actual memory size. You will be able to store more songs on your player if you use WMA formatted songs in 64kbps+ with variable bitrate.

A

Album

A collection list of songs / pictures.

G

Genres

A particular style or type of music.

Μ

MP3

An audio compression format known as MPEG-1 Audio Layer 3.

Ρ

Picture Image and picture in JPEG file format.

Playlist A list of digital media contents.

Playlist on the go

A playlist that can be created on the player by adding favorite songs, albums, artists and genres during music playback.

R

Rip

To copy digital media content from an audio CD. Content may be converted to a different format during a ripping process.

Root menu

The main menu that sits on top of the user interface structure tree.

S

Songs

An individual track or a discrete piece of audio content.

Superscroll™

A Philips trademark user interface navigator feature to enhance the speed of browsing long lists of content.

Synchronization

The process of maintaining digital media files on a portable device based on the rules specified by the users. This may require copying digital media files from a computer to a device, updating information on the device or deleting files from the device.

т

Thumbnail

A small version of the main image, used for indexing and browsing.

Title

The largest unit of digital media content. For CD, it may be the name of the CD.

W

WAV

A digital media file format for storing sound.

Windows Media Audio (WMA)

An audio file in Windows Media Format. The audio content of the file is encoded with one of the Windows Media Audio codecs.
