

## 1. Unpack the player and accessories


When you unpack your new player, be sure you have removed all the accessories and information papers. The items shown below are packed with your player.

## 2. What's so special about this MP3 player?

This player is meant to play MP3 and Windows Media™ audio files encoded on a memory card or recorded in the built-in flash memory.

To do so, you need the use of a Windows computer with USB port, connection cable (included) and a music management software (MusicMatch Jukebox).



# 3. Insert batteries into the player

A. To insert batteries, lift open the battery compartment door.



B. Insert 2 "AAA" (LR03) batteries with polarities corresponding to indications on the compartment. (Refer to "More information" for battery precautions.)

C. Close the door to the battery compartment

**Note:** Refer to the power level indicator on display for battery level.
Replace with new batteries when the indicator is empty.

# 4. Inserting a SD card / MultiMediaCard (Optional)

The player has built-in flash memory. To extend the playtime, you can use the optional Memory Card slot.

A. Insert a Memory Card into the card slot when the player is off as the diagram shows:

B. To remove card, push the Memory Card to eject.



**Caution:** Do not remove Memory Card during playback or when power is on. It may stop unit from playing immediately.

## 5. Using Headphones


Insert phone jack into **PHONES** on the side of player for listening.



Note: Have a Blast- Just Not in Your Eardrums. Make sure you turn down the volume on the unit before you put on headphones. Increase the volume to the desired level only after headphones are in place.


# 6. Connecting the Lyra Player to your Computer

- 1. Lift the rubber cover on the player.
- 2. Insert the smaller end of the connection cable into the socket tightly.
- 3. Insert the opposite end of the connecting cable to the USB socket on the back of the computer.



**Note:** Refer to the Software Instruction manual for procedures in setting up USB drivers and transferring files to the player.

# **General Controls**



- 1. DISPLAY
- 2. **STOP** Stops playback and turn unit off.
- 3. LAST Skips back to last track. Press and hold to search backward through the track
- 4. **NEXT** Skips to next track. Press and hold to search forward through the tracks.
- 5. **PLAY** Turns unit on, start playback and pause, mute operation in Radio mode.
- 6. **DSP** Selects among DSP modes. (Flat, Bass, Pop, Rock, Jazz,Tone)

- 7. **MODE** Selects between repeat one, repeat all, random playback, random shuffle, program and program repeat all modes.
- 8. **RADIO** Selects radio mode.
- MUSIC Selects Digital music playback mode.
- 10. **ENTER** Presses to confirm selection.
- 11. USB Connects USB cable.
- 12. **MEMORY CARD** Slot for inserting Memory Card.
- 13. **PHONES** Inserts headphones
- 14. **VOLUME** Adjusts sound volume.

# **Radio Controls**

## Listening to the radio(FM only)

#### Manual search

- 1. Press PLAY to turn on the unit.
- Push the ENTER knob upward to enter radio mode.
- 3. You may tune up or tune down the frequency by pushing the **ENTER** knob to the left/right.

# Auto search / Preset a station

- In radio mode, keep pushing the ENTER knob to the left/right for 2 seconds, the unit will start searching for a station.
- 2. The unit will stop searching when a station is found.
- 3. You may save the station by pressing **ENTER**, then push the **ENTER** knob to the left/right to select the location you want to store the station in (0-9).
- 4. Press **ENTER** to confirm. A preset station is stored.

## Select a preset station

- 1. In radio mode, press **MODE** button.
- 2. You may recall your previously saved preset station (0-9)
- 3. Push the **ENTER** knob to the left/right to select your desired preset station.
- 4. Press ENTER to confirm selection.

## Mono / Stereo selection

1. In radio mode, press DSP button to toggle between ST / Mono.

## **Adjust Volume Level**

Press + or - to adjust sound volume. Refer to the volume level on display for sound level.

## **Digital music Operation**

## Playback

- 1. In OFF mode, press **PLAY** to turn the unit on.
- 2. Select music by pushing the **ENTER** key downward, then the total number of tracks will show on display. Playback then starts automatically from the first track.
- 3. You can press **PLAY** button during playback to pause and press again to resume playback.
- 4. During playback , you can press **ENTER** to display complete song title and artist information.

## **Stop Playback**

1.During playback, press **STOP** to stop playback (Stop mode) with total number of tracks will show on display.
2.Press **STOP** again to exit to the WEL-COME screen. (The unit will turn itself off automatically after idle for about 1 minute.)

## Skip / Search (Scan)

1.In stop mode, push ⋈ or ⋈ to select desired tracks.

2.Push (2) once to skip to next track. Push and hold for quick forward scan of playing track.

3.Push © once to return to previous track. Push and hold for quick backward scan of playing track.

# **Advanced Operation**

## **DSP**

• In Music mode, press **DSP** button repeatedly to select among the DSP modes:

FLAT > BASS > POP

^ v

TONE > JAZZ > ROCK

• In TONE mode, you may further adjust BASS and TREBLE level.

## **Play modes**

• In music mode, press **MODE** button repeatedly during playback for the following playback modes:

Off (Normal playback) > Repeat One > Repeat All > Shuffle > Repeat Shuffle > All Program > Repeat program > Normal.

**Note:** Plprogram and Repeat program only appears if there are programmed tracks.

## **Programming Tracks**

- 1. Press **ENTER** in stop mode to enter program mode. You will see 'P' icon flashes on display, flashing '--' for track selection and 'P01' for program list position.
- 2. Press ⋈ or ⋈ to select a track. Selected track number will flash.
- 3. Press **ENTER** key upward/downward to skip to the previous / next programming position.
- 4. Press **ENTER** to confirm selection.
- 5. Repeat steps 2-4 for further selections. *Maximum 20 selections can be made.*
- 6. Press **STOP** to exit programming mode or unit returns to stop mode automatically after 30 seconds if no keys are activated.

**Note:** The player will enter Intro Play mode and play the beginning of each track as you scroll through tracks for programming.

## **Editing program**

#### **Overwriting Programmed Tracks**

- 1. In stop mode, press **ENTER** to enter programming mode.
- 2. Push △ or ▽ to select the programmed track you want to overwrite.

  3. Push ⋈ or ⋈ to select the new
- 3. Push ⋈ or ⋈ to select the new track you want to store.
- 4. Press **ENTER** to confirm selection.
- 5. Repeat steps 2 to 4 to overwrite additional programmed tracks.

# **Advanced Operation**

### **Key Lock**

To avoid accidental key activation, press and hold the **MODE** button to lock keys. "Locked" can be seen on display. press and hold the **MODE** button again to unlock keys.

### **File Download**

This unit can be connected to the computer. Please see Software Instruction Manual for instructions to install USB driver, music management software and to transfer tracks to player and/or memory card.

## **Adjust Volume Level**

Press + or - to adjust sound volume. Refer to the volume level on display for sound level. E۱

## **Troubleshooting Tips**

### The player does not turn on when PLAY button pressed.

- Batteries may be inserted incorrectly.
- Batteries may be empty.

### Skipping tracks or bad sound quality?

- Repeat, random or program function may be activated.
- There may be strong magnetic fields (e.g. too close to TV) near the unit.
- Low Battery level. Replace with new ones.

### Cannot perform playback?

- LOCK function may be activated.
- There may be no MP3 tracks in the card or internal memory.
- Memory Card may be damaged.

### Cannot play tracks on the player?

• Track encoded bit rate may not be between 32 to 320kbps for MP3 or between 48kbps to 128kbps for Windows Media Audio.

**Note**: For better result, we recommend a constant encoded bit rate from 32 to 320kbps for MP3 and 48kbps to 128kbps for Windows Media audio.

Nevertheless, your unit may play tracks encoded in variable bit rate (VBR).

### USB display does not appear when connected to computer.

- Check connection between your unit and the computer. (Refer to Software Instruction Manual)
- Check if USB drivers are properly installed (Refer to Software Instruction Manual)

#### The player does not respond to key operations?

• Turn the player off by removing the batteries. Reinsert the batteries properly and turn the player on again to resume normal operations.

# **US Limited Warranty**
