
Always follow these basic safety precautions when using your player. This will reduce the risk of product damáge and personal injury.

#### Precautions in using the headphones



- Replace the battery cover.




## Connecting to a computer

Connect the player to a computer to transfer your music files.

- 1. Connect the player to the computer's USB port.
- 2. The computer system detects "New hardware" and starts to install the driver automatically. Wait for the system to finish the installation.



When it has finished, "Slick MP3" will appear in " My Computer".



## **Troubleshooting**

If you have problems while operating your player, please check the points below before sending it to the service center.

#### Cannot power on

The battery may be exhausted, please change the battery.

Files can not be transferred to the player

- Check if the driver is installed correctly in the computer by disconnecring and then reconnecting the player to the computer
- Check the connection between the player and PC, and confirm that it is properly connected to the computer's USB port

#### No sound from the headphones

- Please ensure the volume is turned up, and the headphones are properly connected
- Check if the format of music file is supported by the player

#### Can not record

Check if there is enough memory and battery capacity

#### Display is in the wrong language

Please ensure you selected the correct language from the "Settings" menu

#### The buttons do not work

- The player may be locked. Press and HOLD the [► II] button to deactivate the lock function
- To adjust this feature select: **Settings** > **Lock**

## Folder navigation

In the File View mode, you can browse all files stored on the player.

- 1. Select "Folder" from the main menu, and press the [► II ] button.
- 2. Use the [◀] or [▶] button to select a folder or file, and press the [▶ II] button.

- 3. Use the [ $\blacktriangleleft$ ] or [ $\blacktriangleright$ ] button to select a value, and press the [ $\blacktriangleright$ II] button to confirm, or press the [ $\blacktriangleright$ ] button to exit and not confirm.
- 4. Press and HOLD the [► II] button to return to the main menu.

## Transferring media files to the player

To copy and transfer your music to the player follow the steps below:

- 1) Connect the MP3 Player to the USB port of your computer.
- 2) Open the "Windows Explorer" or click on "My Computer", and locate "Slick MP3".
- 3) Select the files on your computer and simply move it into "Slick MP3" in the usual way (drag and drop, or copy and paste). After copying is completed, the data will be available on the player.

Connect the MP3 player to your computer, and locate "Slick MP3". Drag the files into the area shown below.



**Note:** Please do not disconnect the player during loading as it may cause a malfunction of the player and the files.

## Disconnecting the player

After completing the file transfer, disconnect the player the following way:

- 1. Double click the green arrow "Safely Remove Hardware" in the task bar on the bottom right of the window.
- 2. Select "USB Device" and click "Stop".
- When the "Stop a Hardware device" appears, click "OK" to disconnect the USB mass storage device, and unplug the player safely.



## **Basic operation**

Make sure the battery and headphones are installed properly before using the player.

#### Turning on/off

- To turn on the player, press and HOLD the [4] button until the display turns on.
- $\bullet$  To turn off the player, press and HOLD the  $[\red{\red{O}}]$  button until the display turns off.

#### Unlock buttons

The buttons of the player are locked when not used for a certain period of time. This feature prevents you from accidentally pressing the buttons while using the player on the move.

- To unlock the buttons, press and HOLD the [► II] button.
- To adjust select: Settings > Lock.

## Playing back voice recordings


- 1. Select "Voice" from the main menu, and press the [► II] button.
- 2. Use the [◀] or [▶] button to select a recorded file.
- 3. Press the [► II] button to start playing.

While playing back voice recordings you can:

- Pause/Resume Playing: Press the [► II ] button to pause or resume playback.
- Skipping Tracks: Use the [◀] or [►] button to skip to the previous or next track.
- Searching: Press and HOLD the [◄] button to fast rewind within a track; Press and HOLD the [►] button to fast forward within a track.
- Adjust Volume: Press the [▲] or [▼] button to increase or decrease the volume.
- Main Menu: Press and HOLD the [► II] button to return to the main menu.

- Tempo rate: Set the music playing rate. Use the [◀] or [▶] button to select: -8, -7, -6, -5, -4, -3, -2, -1, 0, 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8.
- Favorite: Add or view songs to the "Favorite" playlist. Select "Add" to add the current song to the "Favorite" playlist, or "View" to select songs that you have previously strored to your "Favorite" playlist.
- Exit: Exit and return to the music playing mode.

#### Managing/deleting audio files

Manage or delete files and folders containing your music and voice recordings.

- 1. Press the [ **(b)**] button while a song or voice recording is in the "Stop" mode.
- Use the [◀] or [▶] button to select: Local folder, Delete file, Delete all, or Exit.
- 3. Press the [► II ] button to enter and confirm your selections.
- Local folder: View all audio files from the local folder. Use the [◀] or [▶] button to select an audio file or folder, and press the [▶ II] button to select the file and enter the music playing mode.
- Delete file: Delete the current file. Use the [◄] or [▶] button to select "YES" or "NO", and press the [▶ II] button to confirm.
- Delete all: Delete all files stored in the local folder. Use the [◄] or [►] button to select "YES" or "NO", and press the [► II] button to confirm.
- Exit: Exit and return to music mode.

# Voice Recording and Playback Recording

- 1. Select "Record" from the main menu, and press the [► II] button.
- 2. Press the [► II ] button again to start recording.




Main Menu Screen Select "Record"

## Getting music on your computer using Windows Media Player 11

1. Open Windows Media Player.



- 3. Insert a music CD into the CD-ROM drive of your computer.
- 4. Click the check boxes to select which tracks to rip. If you would like to rip the entire album, click the check box next to "Album".
- 5. Cllick "Start Rip".

Windows Media Player will display the music that you have on your computer (you will need to search for your music files if they are not located in the default folder).


- 3. Connect your MP3 Player to the USB port of the computer.

- 5. To easily identify your player within Windows Media Player, name it in the "Device Setup" screen.

- 7. The selected songs will sync to your MP3 Player.



#### Music

   Natural, Rock, Pop, Classic, Soft, Jazz, DBB, or SRS WOW, and press the
   [▶ II] button.
