

**Telephone Mode** If you input the wrong password, ERROR! appears.

#### Alarm Mode

If you do not press a button within about five seconds, the default display appears.

#### Stop Watch Mode

- If you do not reset the counter, the stopwatch starts timing from the last reading.
- If you press ▲, ▼, ◄, or ▶ while SP flashes, the timer stops. Press ENTER and the total accumulated time appears.

#### Replacing the Batteries

When the display dims, replace the battery. For the best performance and longest life, we recommend RadioShack batteries.

#### Care

Keep the keychain dry; if it gets wet, wipe it dry immediately. Use and store the keychain only in normal temperature environments. Handle the keychain carefully; do not drop it. Keep the keychain away from dust and dirt, and wipe it with a damp cloth occasionally to keep it looking new.

#### Service and Repair

If your keychain is not performing as it should, take it to your local RadioShack store for assistance. Modifying or tampering with the keychain's internal components can cause a malfunction and might invalidate its warranty.

## FAST SEARCHING MODE

- 1. Repeatedly press ON/MENU until RECRLL? and **a** appear.
- 2. Press ENTER twice. **NRME?** appears, then flashes.
- 3. Use  $\blacktriangle$ ,  $\bigtriangledown$ ,  $\triangleleft$ , and  $\triangleright$  to enter the name or the first few letters of the name to find. Press ENTER twice. If the record does not exist, **no THIS!** appears.

### **DELETING RECORDS**

- 1. Press ON/MENU until DEL TEL? and a appear. Press ENTER.
- 2. Repeatedly press  $\blacktriangle$  or  $\checkmark$  until the desired record appears.
- 3. Press ENTER. DELETE? appears.
- 4. Press ENTER to confirm deletion, or press any other button to cancel the deletion. DELETED! appears after you press ENTER to confirm deletion.

## **SETTING A SIX-DIGIT** PASSWORD

- 1. Press ON/MENU until UNLOCK! appears.
- 2. Press ENTER. **NEW:** appears and flashes.
- 3. Repeatedly press  $\blacktriangle$  or  $\checkmark$  to select the first digit, then press ENTER to confirm and move the cursor to next space. After six digits are entered, the password is set and LOCKED! appears.
- 4. Once the password is set, you must input the correct password to enter telephone mode.

## **CLEARING OR CHANGING A** PASSWORD

- 1. Press ON/MENU until LOCKED! appears.
- 2. Press ENTER. OLD: appears and flashes.
- 3. Input your current password. **NEW:** appears.
- 4. Input a new password, or press ENTER to clear the current password. UNLOCK! appears.

## INPUT A POWER UP OR **DISPLAY MESSAGE**

- 1. Press ON/MENU until MSG IN? appears.
- 2. Press ENTER. flashes.
- 3 Input the characters by pressing A

5. Press ON/MENU until SCROLL? appears. Press ENTER. The message scrolls across the display.

## **ALARM MODE**

- 1. Repeatedly press ON/MENU until RLM ON or **OFF** and the set alarm time appear.  $\mathcal{V}$
- 2. Hold down ENTER until the hour digit flashes. Repeatedly press ▲ or ▼ to set the hour.
- 3. Press ▶. The minute digits flash. Repeatedly press  $\blacktriangle$  or  $\blacktriangledown$  to set the minutes.
- 4. Press ENTER to confirm the setting.
- 5. Repeatedly press  $\blacktriangle$  or  $\blacktriangledown$  to toggle the alarm time ON and OFF.
- 6. At the set alarm time, the alarm sounds for about one minute. Press any button to silence the alarm sooner.

# **STOP WATCH MODE**

- 1. Repeatedly press ON/MENU until STW and the last stopwatch reading appear.
- 2. Press ENTER to reset the counter to 00-00 00.
- 3. Press  $\blacktriangle$ ,  $\bigtriangledown$ ,  $\triangleright$  or  $\blacktriangleleft$  to start timing.
- 4. Press  $\blacktriangle$ ,  $\blacktriangledown$ ,  $\blacktriangleright$  or  $\blacktriangleleft$  to stop timing at any time. Press  $\blacktriangle$ ,  $\triangledown$ ,  $\blacktriangleright$  or  $\blacktriangleleft$  to resume.
- 5. While the stopwatch is running, press ENTER to split the time. SP flashes. The timer continues.
- 6. Press ENTER again to return to normal timing. SP disappears.

# LOTTERY GAME MODE

- 1. Press ON/MENU until LOTTERY appears.
- 2. Press ENTER to generate six random numbers between 1 and 49.
- 3. For additional random numbers, press ◀ or ▼ to draw single-digit numbers. Press or A to draw double-digit numbers.
