- **3** After the computer shuts down, disconnect it from the electrical outlet.
- 4 Disconnect all cables – such as power and USB cables – from your computer.

- 2 Replace the screws that secure the base cover to the palm-rest assembly.
- **3** Turn the system badge over and snap it in place.
- 4 Turn the computer over, open the display, and turn on the computer.

1 Peel the Mylars that secure the system badge to the base-cover assembly.

### Replacing the Wireless Card

- 2 Align the screw hole on the wireless card to the screw hole on the palm-rest assembly.
- **3** Connect the antenna cables to the wireless card.
- 4 Align the screw hole on the wireless-card bracket with the screw hole on the wireless card.
- 5 Replace the screw that secures the wireless-card bracket and the wireless card to the palm-rest assembly.

**NOTE:** The color of the antenna cables is visible near the tip of the cables.
