# Types of "Memory Stick" you can use with your camcorder

- For recording movies, it is recommended that you use a "Memory Stick PRO Duo" of 1 GB or larger marked with:
  - MEMORY STICK PRO DUD ("Memory Stick PRO Duo")\*
  - MEMORY STICK PRO-HG DUD ("Memory Stick PRO-HG Duo")
  - \* Marked with Mark2 or not, either can be used.
- A "Memory Stick PRO Duo" of up to 16 GB has been confirmed to operate correctly with this camcorder.
- See page 14 for the recordable time of a "Memory Stick PRO Duo."
- "Memory Stick PRO Duo" and "Memory Stick PRO-HG Duo" are both called as "Memory Stick PRO Duo" in this manual.

#### Using the camcorder

- The camcorder is not dustproofed, dripproofed or waterproofed. See "Precautions" (p. 32).
- Do not do any of the following when the
   (Movie)/(1) (Still) mode lamps (p. 10), the access lamp (p. 12) or the QUICK ON lamp (p. 7) is lit or flashing.

Otherwise, the "Memory Stick PRO Duo" may be damaged, recorded images may be lost or other malfunctions could occur.

- Eject the "Memory Stick PRO Duo"
- Remove the battery pack or AC Adaptor from the camcorder.
- Apply mechanical shock or vibration to the camcorder.
- If you close the LCD panel when your camcorder is connected to other devices with the USB cable, the recorded images may be lost.
- When inserting or ejecting the "Memory Stick PRO Duo," be careful so that the "Memory Stick PRO Duo" does not pop out and drop (p. 12).
- When connecting your camcorder to another device with a cable, be sure to insert the connector plug in the correct way. Pushing the plug forcibly into the terminal will damage the terminal and may result in a malfunction of your camcorder.

- To prevent your image data from being lost, save all your recorded images on other media. It is recommended that you save the image data on a disc such as DVD-R using your computer, etc. Also, you can save your image data using a VCR, or a DVD/HDD recorder (p. 23).
- It is recommended that you save your image data periodically, after recording.

# Getting Started Step 1: Charging the battery pack



# You can charge the "InfoLITHIUM" battery pack NP-FH50 after attaching it to your camcorder.

#### Ø Notes

• You cannot attach any "InfoLITHIUM" battery pack other than NP-FH50 to your camcorder.

#### 1 Connect the AC Adaptor to the DC IN jack on the Handycam Station.

Be sure that the  $\blacktriangle$  mark on the DC plug is facing up.

# 2 Connect the power cord (mains lead) to the AC Adaptor and the wall outlet (wall socket).

# **3** Make sure that the LCD panel is closed.

# **4** Insert the battery.

- Open the battery/Memory Stick Duo cover.
- 2 Insert the battery pack all the way in until it clicks.
- 3 Close the battery/Memory Stick Duo cover.

#### 5 Place the camcorder on the Handycam Station as shown above, and insert it into the Handycam Station securely, all the way to the bottom.

The **4**/CHG (charge) lamp lights up and charging starts. The **4**/CHG (charge) lamp turns off when the battery pack is fully charged. Remove the camcorder from the Handycam Station.

#### Ø Notes

 You cannot charge the battery pack while the QUICK ON lamp is flashing. When the QUICK ON lamp is flashing, press POWER to turn off your camcorder. Make sure the QUICK ON lamp is not flashing before charging the battery pack.

#### To remove the battery pack

Turn off your camcorder and open the battery/Memory Stick Duo cover. Slide the battery eject lever. Be sure not to drop the battery pack.



#### Ø Notes

• When you remove the battery pack or disconnect the AC Adaptor, make sure that the (Movie) lamp/ (Still) lamp (p. 10)/ access lamp (p. 12)/QUICK ON lamp are turned off.

# To charge the battery pack using only the AC Adaptor

Close the LCD panel with your camcorder turns off, then connect the AC Adaptor to the DC IN jack on your camcorder.

#### On the battery pack

- When you remove the battery pack, turn off your camcorder, and turn off the H (Movie) lamp/ (Still) lamp (p. 10)/access lamp (p. 12)/QUICK ON lamp.
- The power will not be supplied from the battery as long as the AC Adaptor is connected to the DC IN jack of your camcorder or the Handycam Station, even when the power cord (mains lead) is disconnected from the wall outlet (wall socket).

#### On the charging/recording/playback time

- Times measured when using the camcorder at 25°C (77°F) (10°C to 30°C (50°F to 86°F) is recommended).
- The available recording and playback time will be shorter when you use your camcorder in low temperatures.
- The available recording and playback time will be shorter depending on the conditions under which you use your camcorder.

#### On the AC Adaptor

- Use the nearby wall outlet (wall socket) when using the AC Adaptor. Disconnect the AC Adaptor from the wall outlet (wall socket) immediately if any malfunction occurs while using your camcorder.
- Do not use the AC Adaptor placed in a narrow space, such as between a wall and furniture.
- Do not short-circuit the DC plug of the AC Adaptor or battery terminal with any metallic objects. This may cause a malfunction.
- Even if your camcorder is turned off, AC power source (mains) is still supplied to it while connected to the wall outlet (wall socket) via the AC Adaptor.

#### On using abroad

 You can use your camcorder in any countries/ regions using the AC Adaptor supplied with your camcorder. Also, you can charge the battery pack.

Touch the button on the LCD screen.

# select switch 2270 degrees (max.) 00

### **1** Open the LCD panel.

Your camcorder turns on.

To turn on your camcorder when the LCD panel is opened, close it and open it again, or press POWER with the LCD panel opened.

To adjust the LCD panel, open the LCD panel 90 degrees to the camcorder (1), then rotate it to the best angle to record or play (2). You can rotate the LCD panel 270 degrees to the lens side (2)to record in mirror mode.



2 Slide the 🖽 (Movie)/📩 (Still) select switch repeatedly in the direction of the arrow until the respective lamp lights up.

**(Movie):** To record movies

**(Still):** To record still images

Go to step 4 when you turn on your camcorder for the first time.

• When you turn on 👩 (Still) lamp, the screen aspect ratio is changed to 4:3 automatically (the default setting).

- **3** Touch  $\Uparrow$  (HOME)  $\rightarrow \textcircled{a}$ (SETTINGS)  $\rightarrow$  [CLOCK/ [] LANG]  $\rightarrow$  [CLOCK SET].
- 4 Select the desired geographical area with △/☑, then touch [NEXT].
- 5 Set [SUMMERTIME], [Y] (year), [M] (month), [D] (day), hour and minute, then touch OK.



The clock starts.

#### To turn off the power

When recording standby/recording mode, close the LCD panel, then press POWER. Otherwise, close the LCD panel or press POWER.

#### ີ່ 🏹 Tips

- The date and time do not appear during recording, but they are automatically recorded on the "Memory Stick PRO Duo," and can be displayed during playback.
- You can turn off the operation beeps by touching ↑ (HOME) → ♣ (SETTINGS)
   → [SOUND/DISP SET] → [BEEP] → [OFF].
- When you close the LCD panel during standby/ recording, the QUICK ON lamp starts flashing and your camcorder goes to sleep mode. If [QUICK ON STBY] is set to [OFF] on the HOME MENU (p. 22), closing the LCD panel makes your camcorder turn off.

#### Changing the language setting

You can change the on-screen displays to show messages in a specified language. Touch  $\uparrow$  (HOME)  $\rightarrow \stackrel{\frown}{\Longrightarrow}$  (SETTINGS)  $\rightarrow$  [CLOCK/ $[\Delta]$  LANG]  $\rightarrow$ [ $[\Delta]$  LANGUAGE SET], then select the desired language.

# Step 3: Inserting a "Memory Stick PRO Duo"



If you insert a new "Memory Stick PRO Duo," the [Create a new Image Database File.] screen appears.

- Insert the "Memory Stick PRO Duo" all the way in until it clicks.

# 2 Open the LCD panel and turn on the ⊞ (Movie) lamp.

**3** On the [Create a new Image Database File.] screen, touch [YES].

#### To eject a "Memory Stick PRO Duo"

Open the battery/Memory Stick Duo cover, lightly push the "Memory Stick PRO Duo" in once.

#### Ø Notes

Otherwise, the media may be damaged, recorded images may be lost or other malfunctions could occur.

- Eject the "Memory Stick PRO Duo" from the camcorder
- Remove the battery pack or AC Adaptor
- Shake or knock your camcorder
- Do not open the battery/Memory Stick Duo cover during recording.
- If you force the "Memory Stick PRO Duo" into the slot in the wrong direction, the "Memory Stick PRO Duo," the Memory Stick Duo slot, or image data may be damaged.
- If [Failed to create a new Image Database File. It may be possible that there is not enough free space.] is displayed in step 3, format the "Memory Stick PRO Duo" (p. 24). Note that formating will delete all data recorded on the "Memory Stick PRO Duo."

Press PHOTO B lightly to adjust the focus (a beep sounds), then press it fully (a shutter click sounds).

#### Ø Notes

• If you close the LCD panel during recording, the recording will be stopped.

### ີ່ 🏹 Tips

- You can capture still images by pressing PHOTO **B** during movie recording.
- When a movie file exceeds 2 GB, the next movie file is created automatically.
- The maximum recordable time of Sony "Memory Stick PRO Duo" is as follows with recording mode [HD SP] (the default setting);
  - 1 GB: approx. 15 minutes
  - 2 GB: approx. 30 minutes
  - 4 GB: approx. 65 minutes
  - 8 GB: approx. 140 minutes
  - 16 GB: approx. 280 minutes
- When measuring "Memory Stick PRO Duo" capacity, 1 GB equals 1 billion bytes, a portion of which is used for data management.
- Check the number of recordable still images on the LCD screen of your camcorder (p. 19).
- You can capture still images from recorded movies (HDR-TG1E). See "Handycam Handbook" (PDF) for details.

### **1** Open the LCD panel to turn on your camcorder.

# **2** Touch $\mathbf{r}$ (VIEW IMAGES).

The VISUAL INDEX screen appears on the LCD screen (It may take some time to display the thumbnails).

### To adjust the sound volume of movies

When playing back a movie, touch  $\textcircled{OPTION} \rightarrow \textcircled{D}$  tab  $\rightarrow$  [VOLUME], then adjust the volume with  $\boxed{-/+}$ .

#### ີ່ 🏹 Tips

 On the VISUAL INDEX screen, I▶I appears with the image on the tab that was most recently played back/recorded (▶ for the still image).
 When you touch a movie marked with I▶I, you can play it back from the point it was previously stopped.

### Playing the image on a TV

Connection methods and quality of the image (HD (high definition)/SD (standard definition)) viewed on the TV screen differ depending on what type of TV is connected, and the connectors used.

Use the supplied AC Adaptor as the power source (p. 7).

Refer also to the instruction manuals supplied with the device to be connected.

#### Ø Notes

 When recording, set [X.V.COLOR] to [ON] to play back on an x.v.Color-compliant TV. Some settings may need to be adjusted on the TV when playing back. Refer to the instruction manual of your TV for details.

#### **Operation flow**

# Switch the input on the TV to the connected jack.

Refer to the instruction manuals of the TV.

Connect your camcorder and TV referring to [TV CONNECT Guide]. Touch ↑ (HOME) → (OTHERS) → [TV CONNECT Guide].

Make the required output settings on your camcorder.



Open the jack cover.



#### Ø Notes

- When the A/V connecting cable is used to output images, images are output with SD (standard definition) image quality.
- Your camcorder and the Handycam Station are equipped with A/V Remote Connector or A/V OUT jack. Connect the A/V connecting cable or component A/V cable either to the Handycam Station or to your camcorder. If you connect A/ V connecting cables or component A/V cable to both the Handycam Station and your camcorder at the same time, image disturbance may occur.

# **Recording/Playback**

### 1 Flash

The flash will flash automatically depending on recording conditions in the default setting.

Touch  $\Uparrow$  (HOME)  $\rightarrow \boxplus$  (SETTINGS)  $\rightarrow$  [PHOTO SETTINGS]  $\rightarrow$  [FLASH MODE] to change the setting.

2 Speaker

#### **3** QUICK ON lamp

Flashes during sleep mode. When you open the LCD panel while the QUICK ON lamp is flashing, you can start recording in about 1 second (QUICK ON).

The flashing stops and the power turns off automatically if you do not operate your camcorder for a certain period during sleep mode ([QUICK ON STBY], p. 22).

#### 4 Power zoom lever

Move the power zoom lever slightly for a slower zoom. Move it further for a faster zoom.

You can magnify still images from about 1.1 to 5 times the original size (Playback zoom).

• When you touch the screen during playback zoom, the point you touched will be displayed in the center of the LCD screen.

#### 5 RESET button

Press RESET to initialize all the settings including the clock setting.

#### 6 EASY button

Press EASY to display **EASY** and most of the settings are set automatically for easy recording/playback. To cancel, press EASY again.

#### 7 DISP/BATT INFO button

You can switch the screen display when you press DISP/BATT INFO while the power is on.

You can check the remaining battery when you press it after you open the LCD panel and press POWER to turn off your camcorder.

#### 8 Built-in microphone

Sound picked up by the internal microphone is converted to 5.1ch surround sound and recorded.

#### 9 Access lamp

When the access lamp is lit or flashing, your camcorder is writing/reading data on the "Memory Stick PRO Duo."

#### **10 POWER button**

Press POWER to turn on your camcorder. When you press it while the power is on, your camcorder turns off.

 When you press POWER to turn on your camcorder while the LCD panel is closed, your camcorder goes to sleep mode. When you press POWER while sleep mode, your camcorder turns off.

#### **13** Tripod receptacle (Bottom surface)

Attach a tripod (optional) to the tripod receptacle using a tripod screw (optional: the length of the screw must be less than 5.5 mm (7/32 in.)).

#### **15** Hook for wrist strap (Bottom surface)

Attach the strap and place your hand through the loop to prevent the camcorder from damage by being dropped.



### **Connecting to other devices**

# Troubleshooting **Troubleshooting**

If you run into any problems using your camcorder, use the following table to troubleshoot the problem. If the problem persists, disconnect the power source and contact your Sony dealer.

 For the symptoms of your camcorder, see "Handycam Handbook" (PDF) and for connecting to the computer, see "PMB Guide."

#### The power does not turn on.

- Insert a charged battery pack into the camcorder (p. 7).
- Connect the plug of the AC Adaptor to the wall outlet (wall socket) (p. 7).

# The camcorder does not operate even when the power is set to on.

- It takes a few seconds for your camcorder to be ready to shoot after the power is turned on. This is not a malfunction.
- Disconnect the AC Adaptor from the wall outlet (wall socket) or remove the battery pack, then reconnect it after about 1 minute. If the functions still do not work, press the RESET button (p. 17) using a pointed object. (If you press the RESET button, all settings, including the clock setting, are reset.)

#### Your camcorder gets warm.

• This is because the power has been turned on for a long time. This is not a malfunction.

#### The power abruptly turns off.

- Turn on the power again.
- Use the AC Adaptor.
- Charge the battery pack (p. 7).

# Pressing START/STOP or PHOTO does not record images.

- Slide the # (Movie) (Still) select switch to turn on the # (Movie) lamp or (Still) lamp (p. 13).
- You cannot record images in sleep mode. Open the LCD panel.
- Your camcorder is recording the image you have just shot on the "Memory Stick PRO Duo." You cannot make new recording during this period.
- The "Memory Stick PRO Duo" is full. Use a new "Memory Stick PRO Duo" or format the "Memory Stick PRO Duo." Or delete the unnecessary images (p. 24).
- Total number of movie scenes or still images exceeds the recordable capacity of your camcorder. Delete the unnecessary images (p. 24).

# You cannot install "Picture Motion Browser."

- Check the computer environment required to install "Picture Motion Browser."
- Install "Picture Motion Browser" in an orderly manner (p. 26).

# "Picture Motion Browser" does not work correctly.

• Finish "Picture Motion Browser" and restart your computer.

# Your camcorder is not recognized by the computer.

- Disconnect devices from the USB jack of the computer other than the keyboard, mouse, and your camcorder.
- Disconnect the USB cable from the computer and the Handycam Station or the Dedicated USB Terminal Adaptor, and restart the computer, then connect the computer and your camcorder again in an orderly manner.

# Additional Information Precautions

#### On use and care

- Do not use or store the camcorder and accessories in the following locations:
  - Anywhere extremely hot, cold or humid. Never leave them exposed to temperatures above 60°C (140°F), such as under direct sunlight, near heaters or in a car parked in the sun. They may malfunction or become deformed.
  - Near strong magnetic fields or mechanical vibration. The camcorder may malfunction.
  - Near strong radio waves or radiation. The camcorder may not be able to record properly.
  - Near AM receivers and video equipment. Noise may occur.
  - On a sandy beach or anywhere dusty. If sand or dust gets in your camcorder, it may malfunction. Sometimes this malfunction cannot be repaired.
  - Near windows or outdoors, where the LCD screen, or the lens may be exposed to direct sunlight. This damages the LCD screen.
- Operate your camcorder on DC 6.8 V/7.2 V (battery pack) or DC 8.4 V (AC Adaptor).
- For DC or AC operation, use the accessories recommended in these operating instructions.
- Do not let your camcorder get wet, for example, from rain or sea water. If your camcorder gets wet, it may malfunction. Sometimes this malfunction cannot be repaired.
- If any solid object or liquid gets inside the casing, unplug your camcorder and have it checked by a Sony dealer before operating it any further.
- Avoid rough handling, disassembling, modifying, physical shock, or impact such as hammering, dropping or stepping on the product. Be particularly careful of the lens.
- Keep your camcorder turned off when you are not using your camcorder.
- Do not wrap your camcorder with a towel, for example, and operate it. Doing so might cause heat to build up inside.
- When disconnecting the power cord (mains lead), pull it by the plug and not the cord (lead).
- Do not damage the power cord (mains lead) such as by placing anything heavy on it.
- · Keep metal contacts clean.

- If the battery electrolytic liquid has leaked:
  - consult your local authorized Sony service facility.
  - wash off any liquid that may have contacted your skin.
  - if any liquid gets in your eyes, wash with plenty of water and consult a doctor.
- When not using your camcorder for a long time
- Periodically turn on your camcorder and let it run such as by playing back or recording images for about 3 minutes.
- Use up the battery pack completely before storing it.

### LCD screen

- Do not exert excessive pressure on the LCD screen, as it may cause damage.
- If your camcorder is used in a cold place, a residual image may appear on the LCD screen. This is not a malfunction.
- While using your camcorder, the back of the LCD screen may heat up. This is not a malfunction.

#### To clean the LCD screen

If fingerprints or dust make the LCD screen dirty, it is recommended you use a soft cloth to clean it. When you use the LCD Cleaning Kit (optional), do not apply the cleaning liquid directly to the LCD screen. Use cleaning paper moistened with the liquid.

### On handling the casing

- If the casing is soiled, clean the camcorder body with a soft cloth lightly moistened with water, and then wipe the casing with a dry soft cloth.
- Avoid the following to avoid damage to the finish:
  - Using chemicals such as thinner, benzine, alcohol, chemical cloths, repellent, insecticide and sunscreen.
  - Handling the camcorder with above substances on your hands.
  - Leaving the casing in contact with rubber or vinyl objects for a long period of time.

### About care and storage of the lens

- Wipe the surface of the lens clean with a soft cloth in the following instances:
  - When there are fingerprints on the lens surface.
  - In hot or humid locations
  - When the lens is exposed to salty air such as at the seaside.
- Store in a well-ventilated location subject to little dirt or dust.
- To prevent mold, periodically clean the lens as described above. It is recommended that you operate your camcorder about once a month to keep it in optimum state for a long time.

# On charging the pre-installed rechargeable battery

Your camcorder has a pre-installed rechargeable battery to retain the date, time, and other settings even when your camcorder turned off. The preinstalled rechargeable battery is always charged while your camcorder is connected to the wall outlet (wall socket) via the AC Adaptor or while the battery pack is attached. The rechargeable battery will be fully discharged in **about 3 months** if you do not use your camcorder at all. Use your camcorder after charging the preinstalled rechargeable battery.

However, even if the pre-installed rechargeable battery is not charged, the camcorder operation will not be affected as long as you are not recording the date.

#### Procedures

Connect your camcorder to a wall outlet (wall socket) using the supplied AC Adaptor, and leave it with the power turned off for more than 24 hours.
