

Troubleshooting

There is no Power

- Make sure the radio is plugged in correctly. 1
- 2 Check to see that the power button is pushed in.

There is no Sound

1 Check the volume level by turning the volume knob.

Turntable will not work

- Make sure the function switch is set to phono.
- 2 Make sure the needle cover is flipped up.

CD does not play

- 1 Check to make sure CD is inserted correctly (label side facing up).
- 2 Check that the surface of the CD is clean
- 3 Make sure function switch is set to CD.

Turntable is dragging

Make sure the Turntable Suspension Screws are turned clockwise all the way in to allow the turntable to sit on the suspension.

CD Operation

Repeat Playback

- 1 To repeat a single track, choose the track that you want to repeat, then press the PLAY/PAUSE BUTTON (22) to start the track. Press the REPEAT BUTTON (19) once to repeat this track. The REPEAT INDICATOR (20) will flash.
- 2 To repeat all tracks, press the PLAY/PAUSE BUTTON (22) to start the CD. Press the REPEAT BUTTON (19) twice to repeat all tracks. Once the CD ends, it will start over again from the beginning of the CD. The REPEAT INDICATOR (20) will remain on.
- 3 To erase the repeat function, press the REPEAT BUTTON (19) again until the REPEAT INDICATOR (20) is off.

Cassette Operation

Cassette Operation

- 1 Slide the FUNCTION SWITCH (8) to the TAPE position.
- 2 Insert a prerecorded tape through the CASSETTE DOOR (25). Tape will slide into the cassette mechanism and start playing.
- 3 Adjust the volume level by turning the VOLUME KNOB (9).
- 4 For fast forwarding, press the CASSETTE EJECT/F.F (24) half way in. Pressing again, will stop the fast forwarding and return the cassette to the playing mode.
- 5 To stop and eject the cassette, press the CASSETTE EJECT/F.F (24) in completely.
- 6 When one side of the tape finishes playing, the cassette will automatically stop.

Note:Remove the tape from the unit when it is not in use or stopped.



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

Accessory: Adapter for 45 rpm

To play the 45 rpm record, place the adapter in the center of record. This unit includes six adapters found in the polybag of the instruction manual.



Radio Operation

- 1 Slide the FUNCTION SWITCH (8) to the Radio position.
- 2 Slide the AM/FM SWITCH (17) to the desired tuning band.
- 3 Select the desired radio station by rotating TUNING KNOB (16).
- 4 Adjust the VOLUME KNOB (9) to the desired sound level.


Antenna


Antenna: for FM reception, the unit is provided with a FM WIRE ANTENNA (35) , move the wire until the reception is clear and with no interferences. For AM reception, the unit is provided with a directional build-in ferrite antenna. Rotate the set to find the position in which the best reception is obtained. Do not connect the FM WIRE ANTENNA (35) to any outside antenna.

Getting Started

Turntable Operation

Unpacking


1 Remove packing materials from unit.

Note: Save all packing materials.

- 2 Remove plastic bag covering unit.
- $\begin{array}{c} 3 \\ \text{Remove plastic safety cover form A/C PLUG} \\ (32) \end{array}$
- 4 Remove tie from A/C Cord and untie ANTENNA WIRE (31) on the back of Radio.
- 5 Open lid and remove styrofoam shipping material from turntable.
- $6 \ \ \, {\rm Remove \ black \ tie-wrap \ from \ under \ the \ tone \ \ \, arm.}$
- 7 Using your Fingers, Turn the Turntable Suspension Screw (22) clockwise until it is all the way down. Do not force it. This allows turntable to float on its shock absorbers.



8 Remove the protecting Rubbers form the turntable.






- 1 Unwind the AC POWER CORD (36) at the back of the unit and connect it to a power outlet.
- 2 Plug A/C cord into appropriate outlet.



3 This product is equipped with a polarized alternating current line plug (a plug having one blade wider than the other). This plug will fit into the power outlet only one way. This is a safety feature, If you are unable to insert the plug fully into the outlet, try reversing the plug. If the plug should still fail to fit, contact you electrician to replace your obsolete outlet. Do not defeat the purpose of the polarized plug.



The sound from all speakers is cut off.

Assembly

- 1 To assemble legs, carefully place unit on its TOP.
- 2 Place the legs into position in all 4 corners.
- 3 Insert 2 screws, located inside the styrafoam packaging, into each leg.
- 4 Hand tighten with #2 Phillips head screwdriver.
- 5 Carefully turn unit upright onto legs.

Turntable Features

- 1 Selectable 33/45/78 rpm speeds.
- 2 Load up to 6 records at a time.
- 3 Plays 7", 10", and 12" records.
- 4 Record changer is fully automatic or can be operated manually.

Turntable Instructions


- 1 Turn power on by pressing POWER BUTTON(9).
- 2 Rotate the FUNCTION SWITCH (8) to PHONO mode.
- 3 Lift TENSION ARM (28) and rotate counterclockwise over the TONE ARM (29).
- 4 Load desired records on the CENTER SPINDLE (27). Records should be loaded one at a time.
- 5 Lift TENSION ARM (28) and rotate it clockwise over the records and release. TENSION ARM (28) will automatically pull down onto the records.
- 6 Set the SIZE SELECT SWITCH (30) to the correct size of your records.
- 7 Set the SPEED SELECT SWITCH (33) to the correct speed of your records.
- 8 Move the TURNTABLE SWITCH (32) to the "ON" position. Turntable will begin to turn.
- 9 Flip the needle cover up.



- 10 Move the TURNTABLE SWITCH (28) to "AUTO". The switch will automatically return back to the "ON" position and the first record will drop. The TONE ARM (25) will automatically lift and move to the beginning of the record. Once the first record is finished, the TONE ARM (25) will move back to the TONE ARM REST (27) and the next record will drop. The TONE ARM (25) will move back to the beginning of the record. This will repeat until the last record is finished. When the last record is finished, the TONE ARM (25) will return to its rest and the turntable will shut off.
- 11 To manually switch to the next record during playback, move the TURNTABLE SWITCH (8) to the "AUTO" position. The next record will drop and begin to play.

- 12 To stop playback manually, move the TURNTABLE SWITCH (32) to the "OFF" position. Gently lift the TONE ARM (29) from the record and return it to the TONE ARM REST (31).
- 13 To remove the records from the turntable, lift the TENSION ARM (28) up and rotate it counterclockwise over the TONE ARM (29). Grab the edges of the bottom record and lift straight up.

Tone Arm Adjustment



- Adjust this screw if the TONE ARM(29) is not raising high enough to clear to the TONE ARM REST(31). Turn the screw counter-clockwise to raise the height. Turn the screw clockwise to lower the height.
- 2 Adjust this screw if the TONE ARM(29) drops on the record too early or too late. Turn the screw counter-clockwise to start at a later point. Turn the screw clockwise to start at an earlier point.
- 3 Adjust the screw if you feel there is not enough tone arm pressure on the record. Turn the screw counter-clockwise to increase pressure. Turn the screw clockwise to descrease the pressure.
- Note : Adjust the screws one turn at a time and check the adjustment after each turn.
