## IMPORTANT SAFEGUARDS

When using your overhead projector, basic safety precautions should always be followed, including the following:

- 1. Read and understand all instructions.
- Close supervision is necessary when any equipment is used by or near children. Do not leave projector unattended while in use.
- 3. Care must be taken as burns can occur when changing lamp.
- Do not operate projector with a damaged cord or if projector has been dropped or damaged — until it has been examined by a qualified service technician.
- 5. Do not let the cord hang over edge of the table or counter or touch hot surfaces.
- If an extension cord is necessary, a cord with a suitable current rating should be used.
   Cords rated for less amperage than the projector may overheat. Care should be taken to arrange the cord so that it will not be tripped over or pulled.
- Always unplug projector from electrical outlet when not in use. Never yank cord to pull plug from outlet. Grasp plug and pull to disconnect.
- Let projector cool completely before putting away. Return cord to dust cover cord storage space provided when storing projector.
- To protect against electrical shock hazards, do not operate this projector in the rain or when wet.
- 10. To avoid electric shock hazard, do not disassemble this projector, but refer to a qualified service technician when service or repair work is required. Improper repairs or reassembly can cause electric shock hazard when the projector is used subsequently.
- 11. Do not remove lamp house cover when projector motor is running.
- 12. Observe the caution plate on the rear of top cover when replacing lamp or fuse.
- 13. Do not look directly at an operating lamp with unprotected eyes.
- 14. Disconnect this unit from its source of supply before replacing the projection lamp.
- 15. Connect this appliance to a grounded outlet.





# 3. SETTING UP




#### OPEN THE STAGE COVER

1 To open stage, release latch and lift.




#### RELEASE POST LOCK

Release the post lock, and raise the post and head assembly.



#### RAISE THE HEAD AND POST

Raise head and post assembly until it is vertical and locked into position.



#### SWING UP THE HEAD


4 Push the head arm away from the post while
 5 rotating the head arm counter clockwise until it

locks into position.




#### RAISE THE HEAD MIRROR

6 Lift the mirror to the desired position. Avoid touching the mirror surface.



#### CLOSE STAGE COVER


Position the projector to the screen.



#### ■ ELECTRICAL CONNECTION


Pull out the required cable length and connect to your standard outlet.

# 4. PROJECTING



#### SCREEN SIZE


Adjust the projection distance by moving the projector to correspond with available screen size. Position to the height of the screen by adjusting the mirror angle.



#### FOCUS

Adjust the focus by rotating the focus knob for the sharpest center image. Poor edge focus is usually caused by excessive keystoning.

# 5. FOLDING DOWN




#### LAMP COOLING

Switch lamp "OFF" and allow fan to cool the lamp before folding.


Disconnect power supply cord.

Retract cord into retractable cord strage, or return cord to dust cover cord strage space.



#### ■ FOLD DOWN THE MIRROR

It is important to fold the mirror completely before folding the head.




#### OPEN STAGE TOP




#### ■ FOLD DOWN THE HEAD

Push the head arm away from the post while rotating the head arm clockwise until it locks in a folded position.




#### FOLD DOWN THE HEAD ARM

- Push, release to fold down post.
- Fold down arm and the post until the post is firmly latched.



#### CLOSE STAGE COVER

Close and secure the latch. Projector can now be safety stored or transported.




#### CARRYING


Transport the projector with its convenient carrying handle.

# 6. LAMP REPLACEMENT

CAUTION: Disconnect power and allow lamp to cool before opening lamp house cover-




#### OPEN THE STAGE COVER




#### OPEN THE LAMP HOUSE COVER

Loosen a screw, and lift to remove completely to change lamp.



#### ■ REMOVING THE LAMP

Pull back a lamp holder lever and carefully remove the defective lamp. Replace with the same type lamp FXL 82V 410W. (Useable ENX 82V 360W or ENX-5 86V 360W.)




#### SPARE LAMP

Spare lamp is installed in the built-in lamp changer. To change lamp, switch the lever to the oposite position.

## 7. FUSE REPLACEMENT

CAUTION: Disconnect power before moving fuse.



#### CHANGING FUSE

- Locate the fuse holders under the stage near the post.
- Use a 

  Phillips screwdriver, unscrew the fuse holder cap.
- Remove and inspect the fuse. Replace only with fuses of the same current rating.

# 8. CARE AND CLEANING

This product has been designed to give years of trouble free service. A little care and cleaning by you will insure like-new performance in year to come.

- After each use lightly wipe off the stage fresnel with a soft silicone cloth.
   DO NOT USE ANY CLEANING SOLVENTS!
- · Clean projection lens with lens cleaning solution and lens tissues or soft cloth.
- · Clean front surface mirror with soft cloth and lens cleaning solution.

- · Clean outside case with a damp cloth and mild soap solution.
- Always store with dust cover in place.
