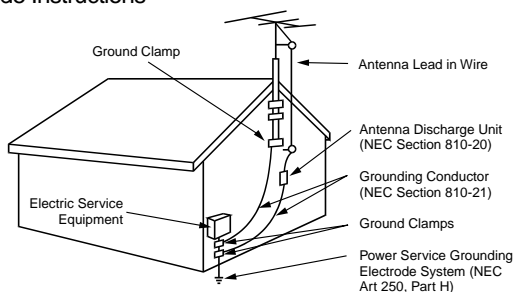

## 14. Outdoor Antenna Grounding

If an outside antenna or cable system is connected to the product, be sure the antenna or cable system is grounded so as to provide some protection against voltage surges and built-up static charges. Article 810 of the National Electrical Code (U.S.A.), ANSI/ NFPA 70 provides information with regard to proper grounding of the mast and supporting structure, grounding of the lead-in wire to an antenna discharge unit, size of grounding conductors, location of antenna-discharge unit, connection to grounding electrodes, and requirements for the grounding electrode.

## 15. Lightning

For added protection for this product (receiver) during a lightning storm, or when it is left unattended and unused for long periods of time, unplug it from the wall outlet and disconnect the antenna or cable system. This will prevent damage to the product due to lightning and power-line surges.

## 16. Power Lines

An outside antenna system should not be located in the vicinity of overhead power lines or other electric light or power circuits, or where it can fall into such power lines or circuits. ## 17. Overloading

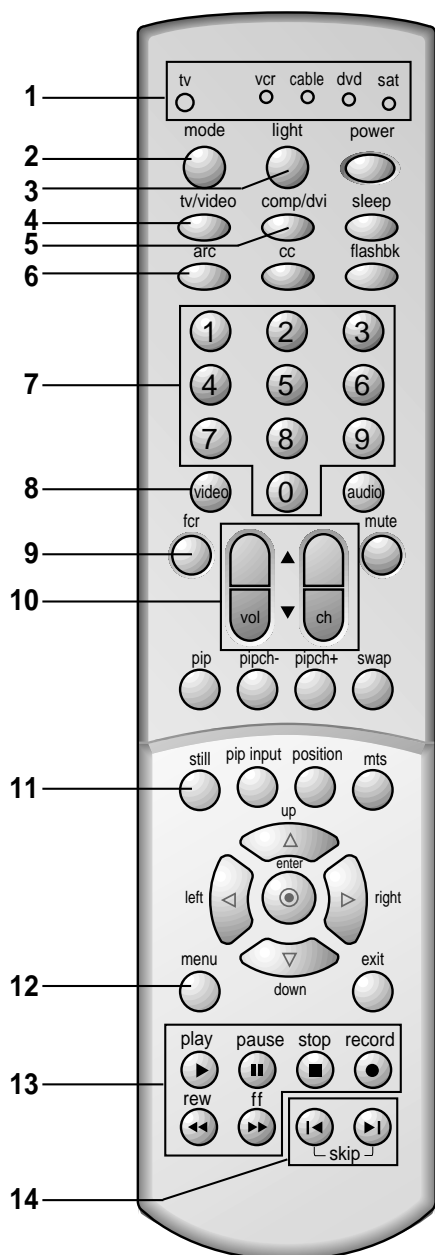

# Remote Control Key Functions



## 1. MODE INDICATOR LIGHTS

Show active remote mode every time any button is pressed.

## 2. MODE

Selects the remote operating mode: TV, VCR, Cable Box, DVD and Satellite. Select other remote modes, for the remote to operate external devices.

## 3. LIGHT

Illuminates the remote control keys.

## 4. TV/VIDEO

Selects TV, VIDEO, COMPONENT, or DVI mode.

## 5. COMP/DVI

Selects COMPONENT or DVI mode.

## 6. ARC

Selects 4:3, 16:9, Horizon, Zoom 1, or Zoom 2 picture formats.

## 7. NUMBER BUTTONS

Direct channel selection.

## 8. VIDEO

Selects factory preset picture settings: **Clear**, **Optimum**, **Soft**, or **User**.

## 9. FCR ( Favorite Channel Review )

Selects favorite channels. Refer to "**Favorite channel memory**".

## 10. CHANNEL UP/DOWN

- Selects the desired channel.
- Selects the desired menu option when menu is displayed on the screen.

## VOLUME UP/DOWN

- Increases or decreases sound level.
- Enters or adjusts the selected menu when menu is displayed on the screen.

## 11. STILL

Freezes the sub picture in PIP mode.  
Freezes the currently-viewed picture.

## 12. MENU

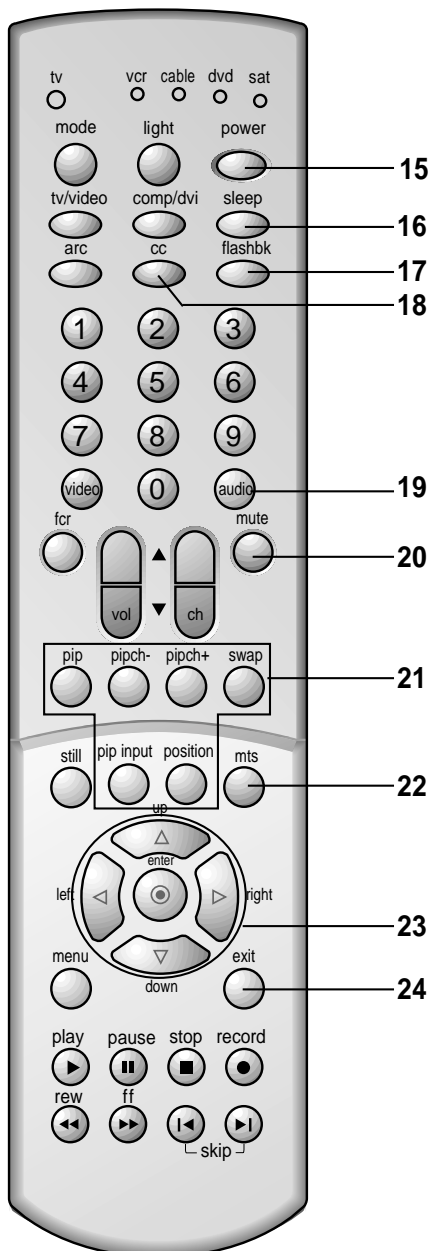
Displays on-screen menus.

## 13. VCR BUTTONS

Control some video cassette recorders.

## 14. SKIP Left/Right

Playing CDs: Selects previous/next song.  
Playing DVDs: Selects previous/next movie chapter.



15. **POWER (or ON/OFF)**  
Refer to "Turning the TV on/off".
16. **SLEEP (Sleep Timer)**  
Sets turn off time.
17. **FLASHBK**  
Returns to the previous channel.
18. **CC**  
Selects the CAPTIONS: **On**, **EZ Mute**, or **Off**.
19. **AUDIO**  
Selects the sound appropriate for the program's character; **Virtual**, **Flat**, **Music**, **Movie**, **Sports** or **User**.
20. **MUTE (Two Levels)**  
Reduce sound to half volume or mute the sound entirely.
21. **PIP (Picture-in-Picture)**  
**PIP**  
Selects the PIP mode, twin picture window, or POP mode.  
**PIPCH +/-**  
Selects the sub picture channel.  
**SWAP**  
Switches the main and sub pictures.  
**PIP INPUT**  
Selects the input signal for the sub picture.  
**POSITION**  
Moves the sub picture to another corner of the main picture.
22. **MTS BUTTON**  
Selects MTS sound: **Mono**, **Stereo**, or **SAP**.
23. **UP▲/ DOWN▼/ LEFT◀/ RIGHT▶/ ENTER⊙**
  - Navigates the on-screen menus to adjust the TV settings and preferences.
  - Displays current TV mode (Remote control only).
24. **EXIT**  
Clears all on-screen displays and returns to TV viewing from any menu.
25. **STAND BY INDICATOR (Ⓞ)**  
Illuminates brightly when the TV is in standby mode. Dims when the TV is switched on.

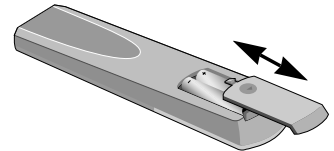

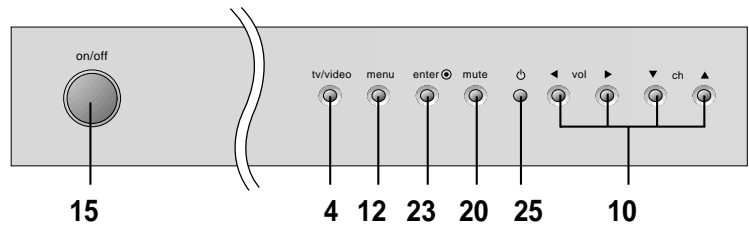
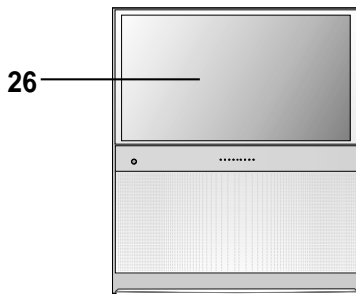
- Remove the battery compartment cover on the back side and insert the batteries with correct polarity.
- Install two 1.5V, AA type batteries. Don't mix used and new batteries.



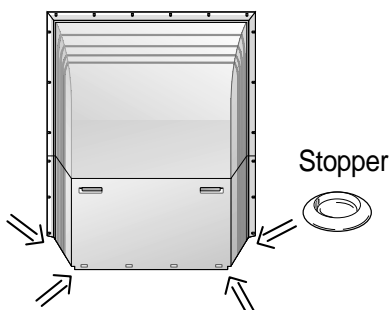
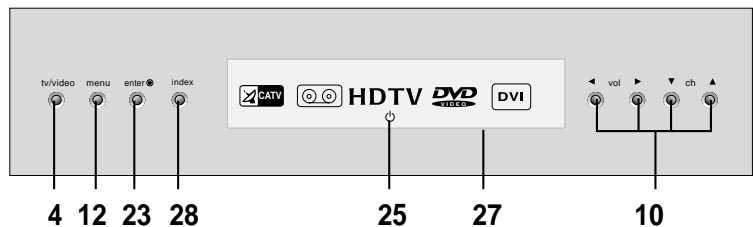
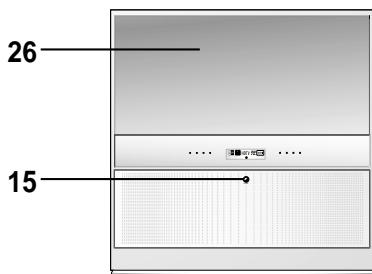

## Securing TV Position

- Position the TV and prevent it from being moved, by placing the 4 stoppers under the roller casters on the bottom of the TV.
- Casters (on TV bottom)  
Use to turn and move the TV easily.



# Basic TV Setup and Operation

Before operating your TV, make sure the TV has been connected to an antenna or cable system and the TV is plugged into a power outlet.

## Turning the TV On/Off

The set switches to standby mode and the standby indicator lights red. To switch the TV on from standby mode, press the on/off, tv/video, ch▲/▼ button on the set or tv/video, ch▲/▼, comp/dvi, power or number button on the remote control.

A channel number will be displayed on the screen. The on-screen display will disappear after a few seconds.

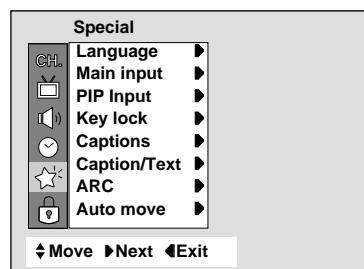
Press the **power** button on the remote control or the set. The TV reverts to standby mode.

## Selecting a Language for the Onscreen Menus

1. Press the **menu** button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select the Special menu.
2. Press the ► and then use ▲/▼ button to select **Language**.
3. Press the ► and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select the desired language.

From this point on, the menus will appear in the language you selected.

4. Press the **exit** button to return to TV viewing.

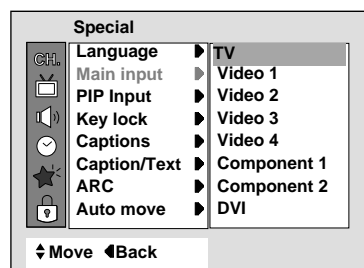


## Selecting a Source for the Main Screen Picture

Changes the picture source for the main screen so you can watch your off-air TV, cable TV, VCR, DVD, or any other devices that are connected to your TV.

1. Press the **menu** button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select the Special menu.
2. Press the ► and then use ▲/▼ button to select **Main input**.
3. Press the ► and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select **TV, Video 1, Video 2, Video 3, Video 4, Component 1, Component 2** or **DVI**.

4. Press the **exit** button to return to TV viewing.



## Channel Search

Channel Search memorizes all the active channels in your area. You must do a channel search before you can use the TV.

There two ways of memorizing channels. You can use either, **EZ Scan** or **Manual Program..**

In **EZ Scan**, the TV memorizes the channels in ascending numerical order.

You can also add or delete channels manually.

## Finding Channels with EZ Scan

**EZ Scan** searches and memorizes all the active channels in your area. Select the desired channel with the ▲/▼ buttons.

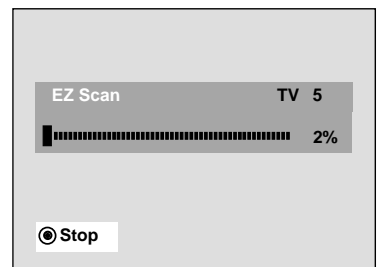
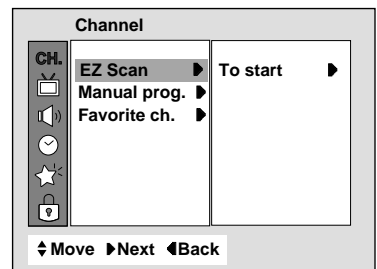
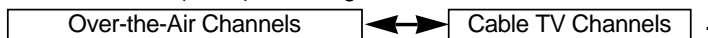
1. Press the **menu** button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select the Channel menu.
2. Press the ► and then use ▲/▼ button to select **EZ Scan**.
3. Press the ► button. The EZ Scan function starts.

If you want to stop EZ Scan, press the **enter** (⊙) button.

Only the channels searched up to that time are memorized.

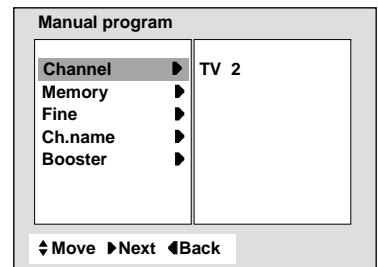
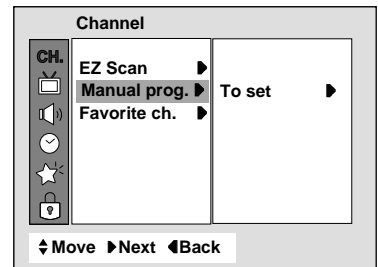
### Notes

- EZ Scan stores all available channels regardless of signal (RF, Cable).
- If over-the-air and Cable TV channels are duplicated, use the number buttons (0 ~ 9) to change channels for:



## Adding/Deleting Channels with Manual Program

1. Press the **menu** button and then use **▲ / ▼** button to select the Channel menu.
2. Press the **▶** and then use **▲/▼** button to select **Manual prog.**.
3. Press the **▶** and then use **▲/▼** button to select **Channel**.
4. Press the **▶** and then use **▲/▼** button to select the channel number you want to memorize or erase.
5. Press the **◀** button and then use **▲/▼** button to select **Memory**.
6. Press the **▶** and then use **▲/▼** button to select **On** or **Off**.
7. Press the **◀** button and then use **▲/▼** button to select **Ch.name**. You can make a channel name.
8. Press the **▶** and then use **◀/▶** button to select a word position and then **▲/▼** button to enter alphabet **A** to **Z**, **α** to **z**, number **0** to **9** and blank.
9. Repeat process 3 to 8 to memorize or erase another channels.
10. Press the **exit** button to return to TV viewing.



## Tuning Channels

Use the **ch ▲ / ▼** button to easily select the next higher or lower channel. Or, use the **NUMBER** buttons to directly select the desired channel.

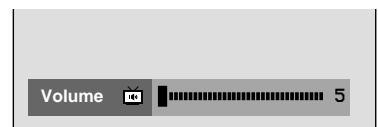
## Adjusting the Sound Level

Use the **vol ▲** button to increase the volume level or **vol ▼** button to decrease the volume level.

If you press the **mute** button on the remote control once, the sound is reduced to the half level of original volume level. When pressing the **mute** button on the remote control again, the sound is muted. At this time, the word **Mute** is displayed.

Using Mute is convenient if you need to answer a telephone call.

To restore the muted sound, press the **mute** button on the remote control again or **vol ▲/▼** button again.



## Clock Setup: Auto/Manual

Before using the on/off timer features, set the current time on the clock.

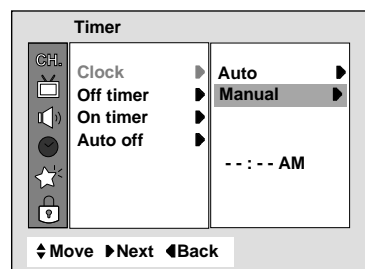
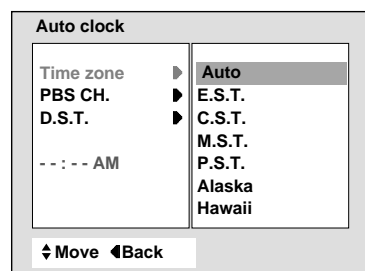
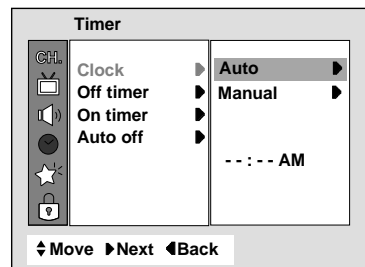
### Auto Clock Setup

The time is set automatically from a PBS broadcast signal. The PBS channel signal includes information for the correct time and daylight saving time.

1. Press the **menu** button and then use **▲ / ▼** button to select the Timer menu.
2. Press the **▶** and then use **▲ / ▼** button to select **Clock**.
3. Press the **▶** and then use **▲ / ▼** button to select **Auto**.
4. Press the **▶** button and then use the **▲ / ▼** button to select the **Time zone**.
5. Press the **▶** button and then use the **▲ / ▼** button to select **E.S.T.** (Eastern Standard Time), **C.S.T.** (Central Standard Time), **M.S.T.** (Mountain Standard Time), **P.S.T.** (Pacific Standard Time), **Alaska**, or **Hawaii**.
6. Press the **◀** button and then use the **▲ / ▼** button to select **PBS CH.**
7. Press the **▶** button and then use the **▲ / ▼** button to set PBS channel.
8. Press the **◀** button and then use the **▲ / ▼** button to select **D.S.T.** (Daylight Savings Time).
9. Press the **▶** button and then use the **▲ / ▼** button to set **D.S.T.** (Daylight Savings Time) **Auto**, **On**, or **Off** depending on whether or not your viewing area observes Daylight Savings Time.
10. Press the **exit** button to return to TV viewing.

### Manual Clock Setup

1. Press the **menu** button and then use **▲ / ▼** button to select the Timer menu.
2. Press the **▶** and then use **▲ / ▼** button to select **Clock**.
3. Press the **▶** button and then use the **▲ / ▼** button to select **Manual**.
4. Press the **▶** button and then use the **▲ / ▼** button to set the hours.
5. Press the **▶** button and then use the **▲ / ▼** button to set the minutes.
6. Press the **exit** button to return to TV viewing.



## Off Timer/On Timer Setup

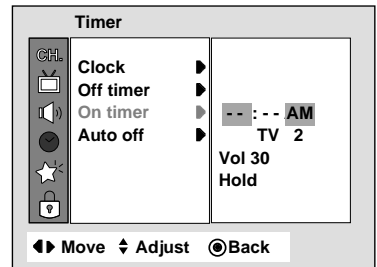
Off Timer automatically switches the TV to standby mode at the preset time.

On Timer automatically turns the TV on at the preset time and tunes to the specified channel.

1. Press the **menu** button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select the Timer menu.
2. Press the ► and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select **Off timer** or **On timer**.
3. Press the ► and then use ▲ / ▼ button to set the hour.
4. Press the ► and then use ▲ / ▼ button to set the minute.
5. **For only On timer function:** Press the ► and then use ▲ / ▼ button to set the desired channel.  
Press the ► and then use ▲ / ▼ button to set the volume level at turn on.
6. **Run/Hold** is used to activate or deactivate preset on/off timers.  
Press the ► and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select **Hold** or **Run**.
7. Press the **exit** button to return to TV viewing.

### Notes

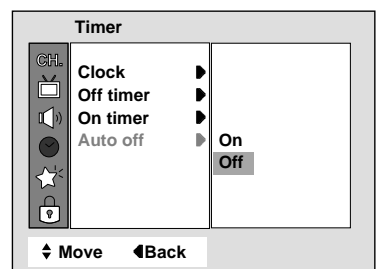
- Two hours after the set is turned on by the on timer function, it will automatically revert back to standby mode unless a button has been pressed.
- This function works only in standby mode.
- If the same time is set for the on time and off time, only the off time operates.



## Auto Off Setup

If an input signal is not present, the TV is automatically switched to standby mode after 10 minutes.

1. Press the **menu** button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select the Timer menu.
2. Press the ► and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select **Auto off**.
3. Press the ► and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select **On** or **Off**.
4. Press the **exit** button to return to TV viewing.



## Sleep Timer Setup

You don't have to remember to switch the TV to standby mode before you go to sleep. The Sleep Timer automatically turns the TV off after the preset sleep time expires.

Use the **sleep** button to select the desired sleep time.

Each time you press this button, preset sleep time settings are displayed one by one as shown below. The Sleep Timer begins to count down from the number of minutes selected.

▶ --- ▶ 10 ▶ 20 ▶ 30 ▶ 60 ▶ 90 ▶ 120 ▶ 180 ▶ 240



### Notes

- After a few seconds, the desired sleep time setting will disappear and the TV turn-off function will operate automatically.
- To view the remaining sleep time, press the **sleep** button once and the remaining sleep time will be displayed.
- To cancel the Sleep Timer, select the --- setting with **sleep** button.

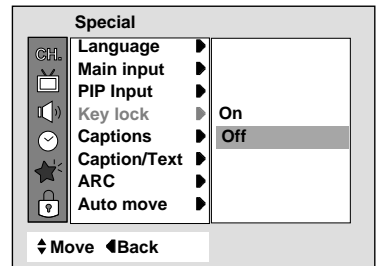
## Key Lock Setup

The TV can be set up so that it can only be operated by the remote control. This feature can be used to prevent unauthorized viewing.

1. Press the **menu** button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select the special menu.
2. Press the ▶ and then use ▲/▼ button to select **Key lock**.
3. Press the ▶ and then ▲/▼ button to select **On** or **Off**.
4. Press the **exit** button to return to TV viewing.

### Notes

- With key lock set to on, the display **Key lock** appears on the screen if any button on the front panel is pressed while viewing the TV.
- This TV is programmed to remember which option it was last set to when you switch the TV on from standby mode.



## Fine Tuning Adjustment

Use Fine Tuning is to stabilize the picture's condition if it is poor, for example, a horizontal stripe, twisted picture or no color in broadcast.

1. Press the **menu** button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select the Channel menu.
2. Press the ► and then use ▲/▼ button to select **Manual prog.**
3. Press the ► and then use ▲/▼ button to select **Fine**.
4. Press the ► and then use ◀ / ▶ button to adjust the picture appearance to your preference.
5. Press the **exit** button to return to TV viewing.

**Notes :**

- To release the memorized fine tuning, reprogram the fine-tuned channel with EZ Scan or Manual Program.
- If a finely-tuned channel is memorized, the color of the channel number changes to yellow.

## Signal Reception Booster

If TV signal reception is poor because you are in a fringe area, set **Booster** to **On**. If the picture condition is good, do not set **Booster** to **On**.

1. Press the **menu** button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select the Channel menu.
2. Press the ► and then use ▲/▼ button to select **Manual prog.**
3. Press the ► and then use ▲/▼ button to select **Booster**.
4. Press the ► and then use ▲/▼ button to select **On** or **Off**.
5. Press the ◀ button to exit.

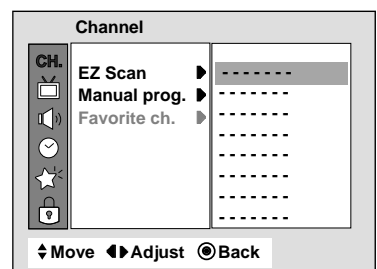
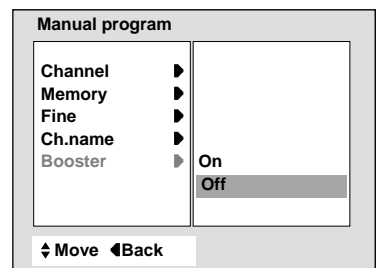
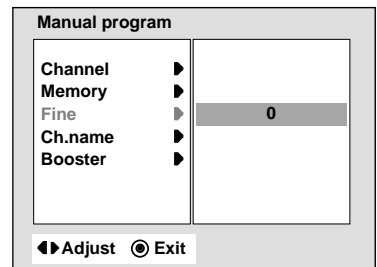
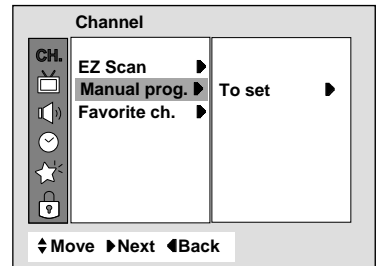
Note : Adjustment for one channel don't affect the adjustment of other channels. Set booster to on or off for each channel separately.

## Favorite Channel Memory

Favorite channel memory is a convenient feature that lets you quickly view up to eight channels of your choice without having to wait for the TV to tune in all of the in-between channels.

1. Press the **menu** button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select the Channel menu.
2. Press the ► and then use ▲/▼ button to select **Favorite ch.**
3. Press the ► and then use ▲/▼ button to select a favorite channel position.
4. Use the ◀/▶ button to select the desired channel number.
5. Repeat steps 3 to 4.
6. Press the **exit** button to return to TV viewing.

To select a favorite channel, press the **fcr** (Favorite Channel Review) button repeatedly. The eight favorite channels appear on the screen one by one.



## Picture Format Selection

You can select 5 picture formats are available.

Press the **ARC** button repeatedly to select your desired picture format. Each time you press the button, the picture format is changed in the order of **4:3**, **16:9**, **Horizon**, **Zoom 1**, and **Zoom 2**.

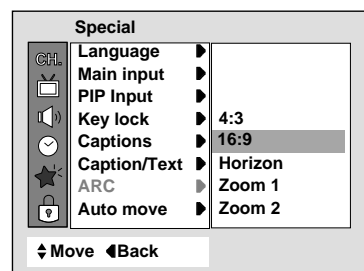
### Using the arc Button

1. Repeatedly press the **arc** button to select **4:3**, **16:9**, **Horizon**, **Zoom 1** or **Zoom 2**.
2. Press the **enter** (Ⓞ) button to exit.

### Using the Menu

1. Press the **menu** button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select the Special menu.
2. Press the ► and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select **ARC**.
3. Press the ► and then ▲ / ▼ button to select **4:3**, **16:9**, **Horizon**, **Zoom 1** or **Zoom 2**.
4. Press the **exit** button to return to TV viewing.

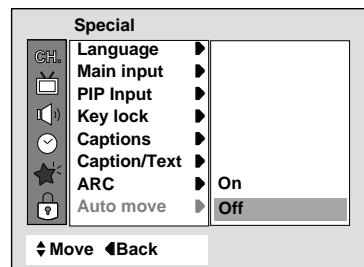
Note : This function is not available in Twin picture or Component 1080i mode.



## Auto Move

Auto move may help prevent a ghost image from appearing on the screen. In 4:3 aspect ratio, the picture will move right/left about 5mm every 2 hours. In twin picture mode, the picture will move up/down about 5mm every 2 hours.

1. Press the **menu** button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select the Special menu.
2. Press the ► and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select **Auto move**.
3. Press the ► and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select **On** or **Off**.
4. Press the **exit** button to return to TV viewing.

## EZ Video Setup

For optimum picture quality, use the factory preset picture modes.

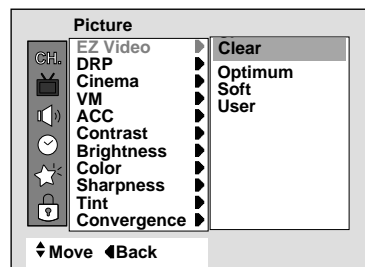

If the picture settings you adjust are not satisfactory, you can also select a factory preset picture setup. In the broadcasting system PAL-M/N, the picture option **Tint** is not adjustable.

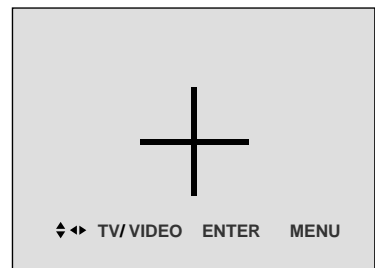
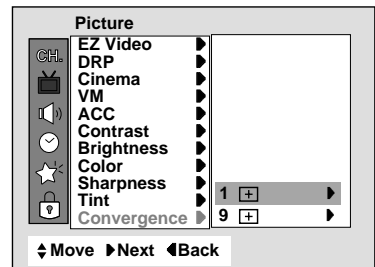

2. Press the **▶** and then use **▲/▼** button to select the desired picture option (**Contrast**, **Brightness**, **Color**, **Sharpness**, and **Tint**).

4. Press the **exit** button to return to TV viewing.



## Color Convergence Adjustment (R40W46, R40W46F, R45W46, R45W46F only)

Use this function to adjust the R-G-B color convergence while a stable signal is being received. When the TV is first installed or if it is relocated, the picture may be unstable with three color ghosts (red, green, blue). This problem can be solved by adjusting the color convergence.

1. Press the **menu** button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select the Picture menu.
2. Press the ► and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select **Convergence**.
3. Press the ► and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select 1 [+] (all point convergence) or 9 [+] (9 point convergence).  
If the + display is not white and shows three color ghosts, the color convergence needs to be adjusted. If the + display is white, color convergence does not need to be adjusted.
4. Press the ► and then press the **tv/video** button.  
The display ◀▶ button is selected in red or blue.
5. **Only selecting 9 [+] :** Use the number (0-9) button to select the position you want to adjust the convergence.
6. Use the ▲ / ▼ / ◀ / ▶ button to superimpose the + display (red or blue) over the green +. It will be changed to yellow or cyan.
7. When both red and blue + display is superimposed over green, the + display changes to white.
8. Press the **exit** button to return to TV viewing.



Note: If the picture needs to be adjusted more 1 [+] (all point convergence) adjustment, you can adjust the 9 [+] (9 point convergence) for the position you want to adjust.

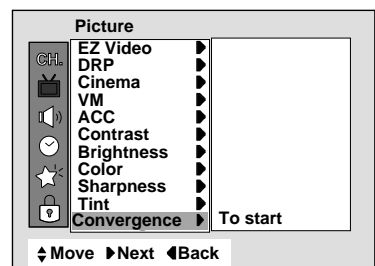
## Auto Convergence Adjustment (R50W46 and R57W46 only)

When the TV is first installed or relocated, the picture may be unstable and have three color ghosts (red, green, blue). This problem can be solved with Auto Convergence. This function can adjust the picture color convergence automatically if the TV is receiving a stable signal.

1. Press the **menu** button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select the Picture menu.
2. Press the ► and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select **Convergence**.
3. Press the ► button to start auto convergence.  
The color convergence order will be: blue, green, then red.  
The auto convergence function takes about 60 seconds.

- Wait 20 minutes after turning on the TV before using Auto Convergence.
- Darken the room before adjusting color convergence.



## Stereo/SAP Broadcasts Setup

This TV can receive MTS stereo programs and any SAP (Second Audio Program) accompanying the stereo program. The broadcaster may transmit one additional sound signal as well as the original one. The MTS function doesn't operate in the video mode.

1. Use the **mts** button to select your desired MTS mode.  
Each time you press this button, the **Mono**, **Stereo**, or **SAP** mode appear in turn.
2. Press the **enter** (⊙) button to return to TV viewing.

### Notes

- Stereo or SAP can only be received if the TV station transmits those signals, even though you have selected **Stereo** or **SAP**.
- Mono sound is automatically received if the broadcast is only in Mono; even though **Stereo** or **SAP** has been selected.
- Select **Mono** if you want to listen to mono sound in remote fringe areas during a stereo/SAP broadcast.

## EZ Audio Options

You can enjoy the best sound without any special adjustment because the TV automatically adjusts the sound appropriate for the program character.

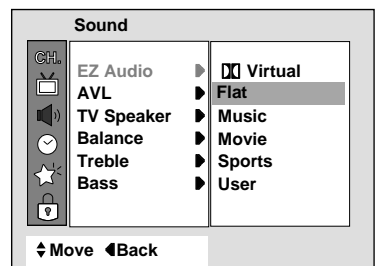

## Watching PIP (Picture-in-Picture)

PIP is a smaller inset picture placed on the larger main picture screen. Using the PIP feature enables you to view two different programs on the TV screen at the same time.

1. Use the **pip** button to select either the PIP mode, twin picture mode or POP (Picture-Out-Picture) mode. Press the **pip** button repeatedly to select the desired sub picture size. The sub picture appears as indicated below.



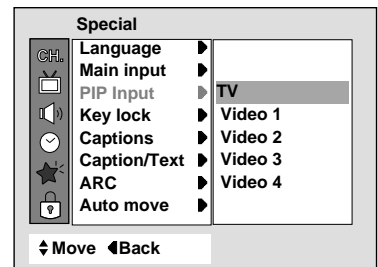
2. Use the **pipch+** or **pipch-** button to select the desired channel for the sub picture.

### Note

- Use the **ch ▲/ch ▼** button to select the next higher/lower channel for the main picture and use the **pipch+/pipch-** button to select the next higher/lower channel for the sub picture.

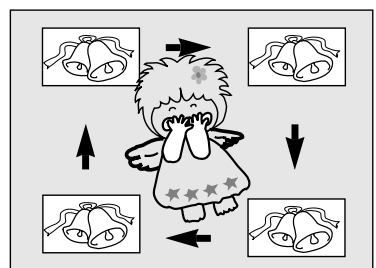

## POP (Picture-Out-Picture: Channel Search and Display)

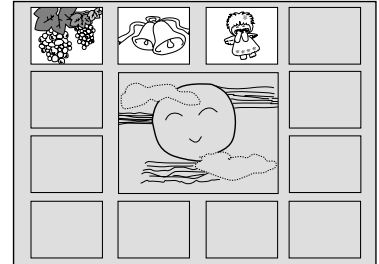
Use this Channel Search to view the current programs on all the memorized channels one-by-one on the 12 POP screen display, while the main screen displays the current channel.

Press the **pip** button in twin picture mode. The pictures of all the memorized channels are shown on the 12 PIP screen, as shown to the right.

To exit channel search, press the **pip** button.

### Notes

- By pressing the **swap** button, you can view the channel being scanned on the PIP screen enlarged on the main screen.
- Run Auto program before using POP mode.



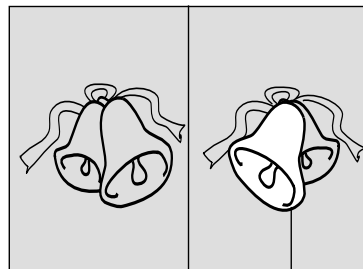

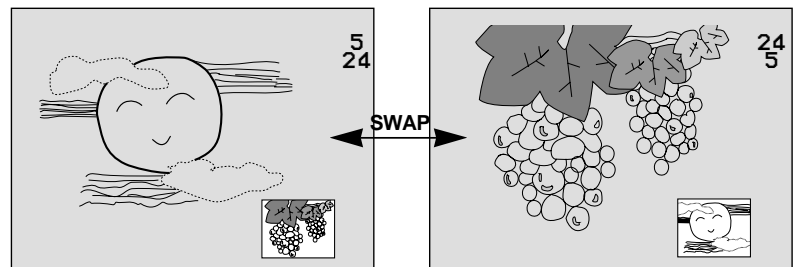

# Closed Captions

Closed captioning is a process which converts the audio portion of a television program into written words, which then appear on the television screen in a form similar to subtitles. Closed captions allow viewers to read the dialogue and narration of television programs.

## Using Closed Captions



Captions are the subtitles for the dialogue and narration of television programs. For prerecorded programs, program dialogue can be arranged into captions in advance. It is possible to caption a live program by using a process called “real-time captioning”, which creates captions instantly. Real-time captioning is normally done by professional reporters using a machine shorthand system with computer for translation into English.

Captioning is an effective system for the hearing-impaired, and it can also be used as an aid in teaching language skills.

- The picture at left shows a typical caption.

## Caption Tips

- Not all TV broadcasts include closed caption signals.
- Sometimes TV stations broadcast two different caption signals on the same channel. By selecting CC 1 or CC2, you can choose which signal you view. CC 1 is usually the signal with the captions, while CC 2 might show demonstration or programming information.
- Your TV might not display caption signals correctly under the following circumstances.

1. Poor reception conditions are encountered:



- **IGNITION:**

Picture may flutter, drift, display black spots or horizontal streaking, which are usually caused by interference from automobile ignition systems, neon lamps, electrical drills or other electrical appliances.



- **GHOSTS:**

Ghosts are caused when the TV signal splits and follows two paths. One is the direct path and the other is reflected off tall buildings, hills or other objects. Changing the direction or position of the antenna may improve reception.



- **SNOW:**

If your TV is located at the weak, fringe area of a TV signal, your picture may be marred by small dots. It may be necessary to install a special antenna to improve the picture.

2. An old, bad or illegally recorded being played.
3. Strong, random signals from a car or airplane interfere with the TV signal.
4. The signal from the antenna is weak.
5. The program wasn't captioned when it was produced, transmitted or taped.



## Displaying Text

Text services offer a wide variety of information on all kinds of subjects (ex. captioned program lists, weather forecasts, stock exchange topics, news for hearing-impaired---) filling the TV screen.

However, even though the program does offer captioning, text services may not be available.

### Note

- In the event you are receiving a poor signal, an empty black box may appear and disappear, when text mode is turned on. This commonly happens under poor signal conditions.

## Captions On, Off, EZ mute Setup

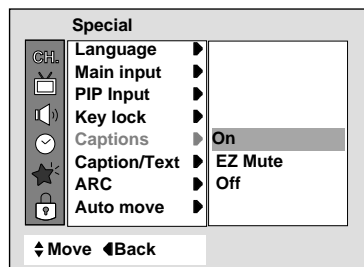
### Captions set up using the cc button

1. Use the **cc** button to select **On**, **EZ Mute** or **Off**.
2. Press the **enter** (Ⓞ) button to remove menu.



### Captions set up using the Captions Menu

1. Press the **menu** button and then use **▲ / ▼** button to select the Special menu.
2. Press the **▶** and then use **▲ / ▼** button to select **Captions**.
3. Press the **▶** and then use **▲ / ▼** button to select **On**, **EZ Mute** or **Off**.
4. Press the **exit** button to return to TV viewing.

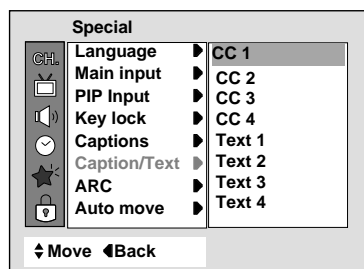


### Note

- EZ mute shows the selected captions option (if available on program) when the TV sound is muted.

## Selecting Caption/Text Mode

1. Press the **menu** button and then use **▲ / ▼** button to select the Special menu.
2. Press the **▶** and then use **▲ / ▼** button to select **Caption/Text**.
3. Press the **▶** and then use **▲ / ▼** button to select **CC1**, **CC2**, **CC3**, **CC4**, **Text 1**, **Text 2**, **Text 3**, or **Text 4**.
4. Press the **exit** button to return to TV viewing.



### Note

- This TV is programmed to retain the caption mode setting, when you turn the TV off.

# Parental Control Overview

Parental Control (V-Chip) can be set up to block program viewing based on the restriction settings. The default setting is to allow all programs to be viewed. Viewing can be blocked by the type of program and by the categories chosen to be blocked. It is also possible to block all program viewing for a time period. To use Parental Control, Function, the following must be set.

1. Ratings and categories to be blocked.
2. A password.
3. Enabling the lock.

## V-Chip Rating and Categories

Rating guidelines are provided by broadcast stations. Most television programs and television movies can be blocked by TV Rating and/or Individual Categories. Movies that have been shown at the theaters or direct-to-video movies use the Movie Rating System (MPAA) only.

### For Movies Previously Shown in Theaters

#### Movie Ratings:

- Unblocked
- G and Above (general audience)
- PG and Above (parental guidance suggested)
- PG-13 and Above (13 years and up)
- R and Above (restricted)
- NC-17 and Above (18 years and up)
- X (adult)

If you set PG-13 and Above, G and PG movies will be available; PG-13, R, NC-17, and X will be blocked.

### For Television programs including made-for-TV movies:

#### General TV Ratings:

- Unblocked
- TV-G and Above (general audience) (individual categories do not apply)
- TV-PG and Above (parental guidance suggested)
- TV-14 and Above (14 years and up)
- TV-MA (mature audience)

#### Children TV Ratings:

- Unblocked
- TV-Y and Above (youth) (individual content categories do not apply)
- TV-Y7 (youth, 7 years and up)

#### Content Categories:

- Dialogue - sexual dialogue (applies to TV-PG and Above, TV-14)
- Language - adult language (applies to TV-PG and Above, TV-14 and Above, TV-MA)
- Sex - sexual situations (applies to TV-PG and Above, TV-14 and Above, TV-MA)
- Violence (applies to TV-PG and Above, TV-14 and Above, TV-MA)
- F Violence - fantasy violence (applies only to TV-Y7)

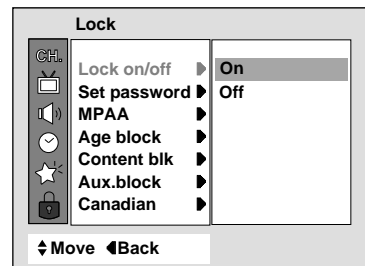

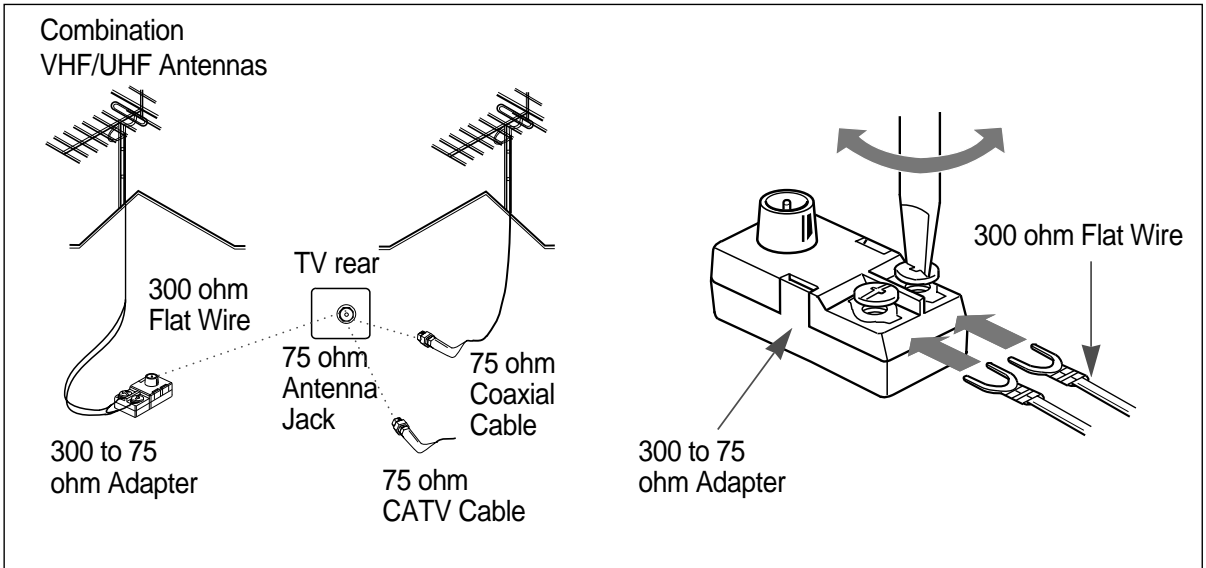

## Blocking Scheme Setup

1. Press the **menu** button and then use ▲ / ▼ button to select the Lock menu.
2. Press the ► and then set the initial 4-digit password “0-0-0-0” with the number keypad. If Parental is already set, enter the password when requested.
3. Press the ▲/▼ button to select the **Lock on/off** option.
4. Press the ► and then use the ▲/▼ button to select the **on** or **off**.
5. Press the ◀ and then use the ▲ / ▼ button to select the **Set password**.
6. Press the ► button. Enter a four number password. Enter it again when requested.
7. Use the ▲/▼ button to select the types of blocking to be set.
8. Press the ► and then use the ▲ / ▼ button to select the types of ratings to block.  
Age block, Content block, and Canadian options, also have sub menus; repeat steps 7 to 8 in sub menu, to set type of blocking and rating.
9. Press the **exit** button to return to TV viewing.



# Antenna Connections



## Connecting an Outdoor Antenna

For the best signal reception, we recommend you use an outdoor antenna.

Severely weathered antennas and antenna cables can reduce the signal quality. Before connecting an outdoor antenna, inspect it yourself or have a TV technician inspect it. Any service center can explain the various outdoor antenna options available to you.

### 300 Ohm Flat Wire

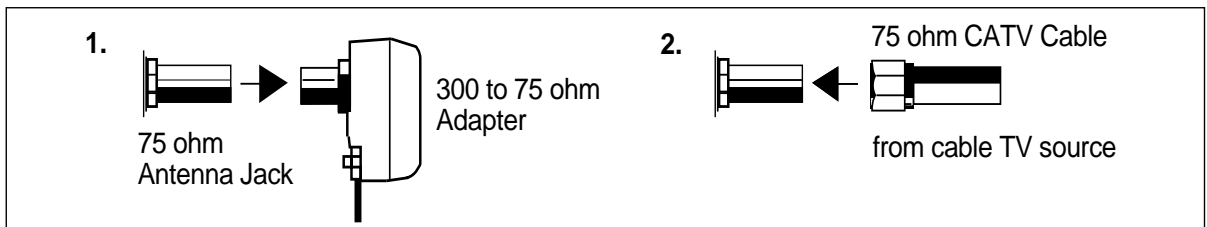
1. Connect the 300 ohm flat wire to screws on the 300 ohm to 75 ohm adapter.
2. Push the end of 300 ohm to 75 ohm adapter onto 75 ohm antenna jack.

### 75 Ohm Coaxial Cable

1. Connect the 75 ohm coaxial cable directly to the 75 ohm antenna jack.

## Connecting a CATV Cable

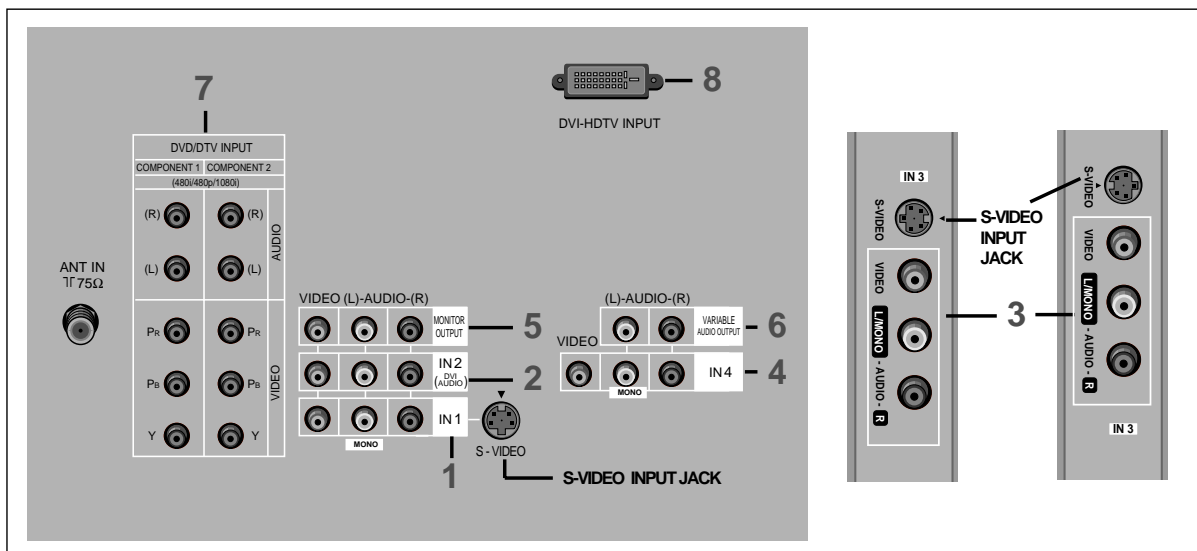
If you subscribe to a CATV system, use the antenna connection described below.



1. Remove the 300 to 75 ohm adapter or the cable from the set if attached.
2. Connect the CATV cable (75 ohm coaxial cable) to the 75 ohm antenna jack.

# External Equipment Connection and Viewing Setup

You can connect additional equipment, such as VCRs, camcorders etc. to your TV. Connection panels shown here may be somewhat different from your TV. Here is an example drawing of a typical jackpack layout.



1. **IN 1 JACKS** : Connect external equipment outputs (VCR, DVD, CAMCORDER) to these inputs. Press the **tv/video** button repeatedly to select **Video 1**.
2. **IN 2 JACKS** : Connect external equipment outputs (VCR, DVD, CAMCORDER) to these inputs. Press the **tv/video** button repeatedly to select **Video 2**.
3. **IN 3 JACKS** : Connect external equipment outputs (VCR, DVD, CAMCORDER) to these inputs. Press the **tv/video** button repeatedly to select **Video 3**.
4. **IN 4 JACKS** : Connect external equipment outputs (VCR, DVD, CAMCORDER) to these inputs. Press the **tv/video** button repeatedly to select **Video 4**.
5. **MONITOR OUTPUT JACKS** : Connect a second TV or a monitor to these outputs to observe the selected program.
6. **VARIABLE AUDIO OUT JACKS**: Connect external analog stereo amplifier and use external front speakers.
7. **DVD/DTV INPUT JACKS** : Connect component output jacks to these inputs. Use the **tv/video** or **comp/dvi** button to select **Component 1**, **Component 2** sources. Your set-top devices may be used if they have a DVI-HDTV output connector that supports the proper version of DVI and HDCP.
8. **DVI-HDTV INPUT JACK**: Connect a set-top box to this input. Use the **tv/video** or **comp/dvi** button to select **DVI**.

**Note** : Avoid having a stationary fixed image remain on the screen for a long period of time. Typically a frozen still picture from a VCR. If allowed to remain on the screen ; a fixed image may remain visible on the screen.

## EZ Notice: Make A/V Connection

You can only select connected input sources with the **tv/video** or **comp/dvi** button on the remote control. (It's not available in DVI input source.)

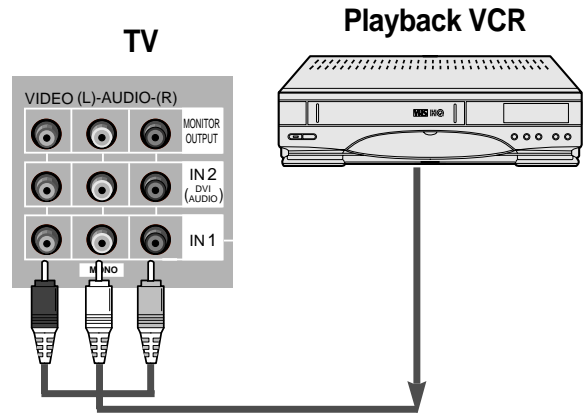
# External Equipment Connection and Viewing Setups

## VCR Connections

1. Connect the audio/video output jacks from the VCR to **IN 1 (A/V)** jacks on the TV.
2. Use the **tv/video** button to select **Video 1**.
  - If you connect the audio/video output jacks from the VCR to the **IN2, IN3** or **IN4** jacks on the TV, select **Video 2, Video3,** or **Video 4**.
3. Press the **PLAY** button on the VCR.  
The video playback appears on the TV screen.

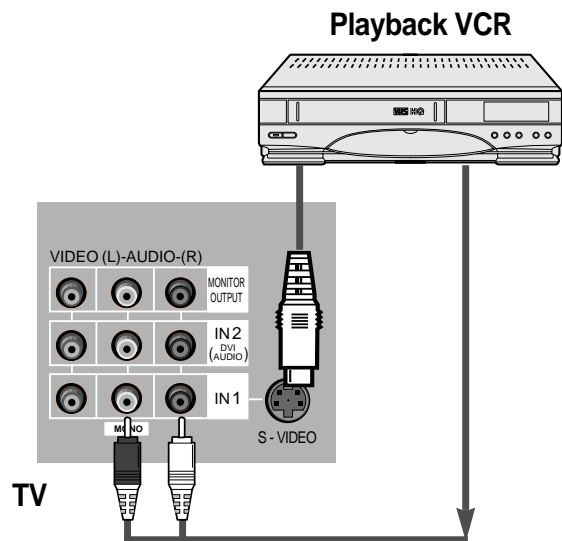
### Notes

- If using a monaural VCR, connect the output jack from VCR to the **AUDIO L/MONO IN** jack on TV so that the sound can be heard from both speakers. If you connect the output jack to the **AUDIO R IN** jack on the TV, the sound is only heard from right speaker.
- When the input jacks on the front panel and back panel are connected to external equipment at the same time, the input jacks on the front panel have priority over the input jacks on the back panel of the TV.



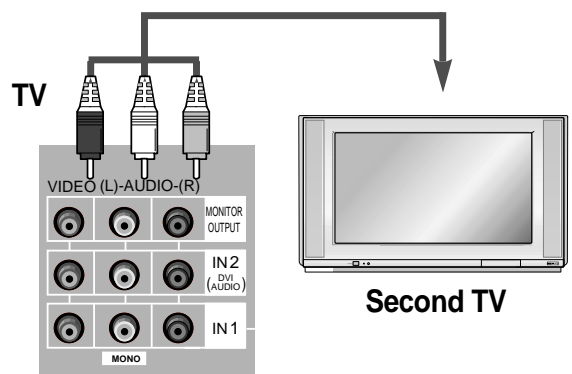
## S-VHS VCR Connections

1. Connect the S-VHS output jack from the VCR to one of the available **S-VIDEO** jacks on the TV.
2. Connect the audio/video output jacks from the VCR to the **IN 1** or **IN 3** jacks on the TV.
3. Use the **tv/video** button to select **Video 1** or **Video 3**.
4. Press the **PLAY** button on the VCR.  
The video playback is visible on the TV screen.



## Monitor Out Setup

1. Connect the audio/video input jacks from Second TV/Monitor to the **MONITOR OUTPUT (A/V)** jacks on the TV.
2. See the operating manual of the second TV or monitor for further details regarding that device's input source selection.

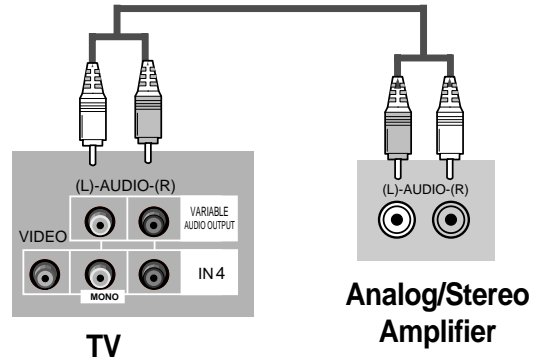


## External Stereo Amplifier/Speakers

1. Connect analog/stereo amplifier input jacks to variable audio out of the TV.
2. Set up your speakers through your analog/stereo amplifier, according to the instructions provided with the amplifier.

### Note

- If you want to hear the sound through your amplifier's speakers, set the **TV Speaker** option to **Off** (Refer to p.17).

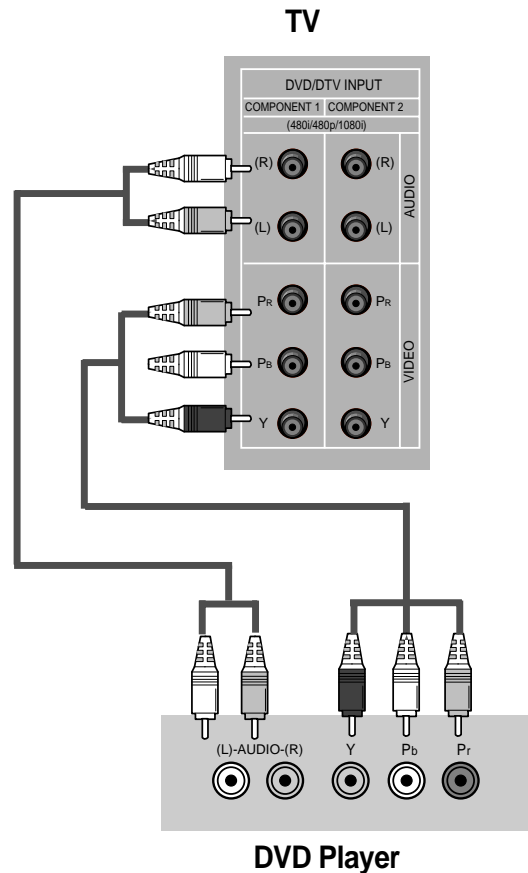
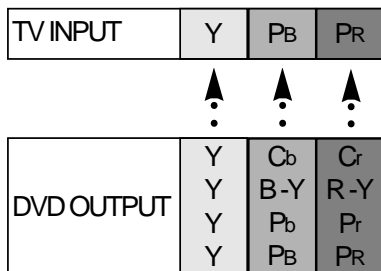


## DVD Player Connection

1. Connect the DVD component video outputs to Y, P<sub>B</sub>, P<sub>R</sub> (480i/480p/1080i) on the TV and DVD audio outputs to right and left audio jack (L/R) inputs on the TV.
2. Turn on the DVD player and insert a DVD.
3. Use the **tv/video** or **comp/dvi** button to select **Component 1** or **Component 2**.

### Note

- This TV is programmed to remember which mode it was last set to, even if you turn the TV off.



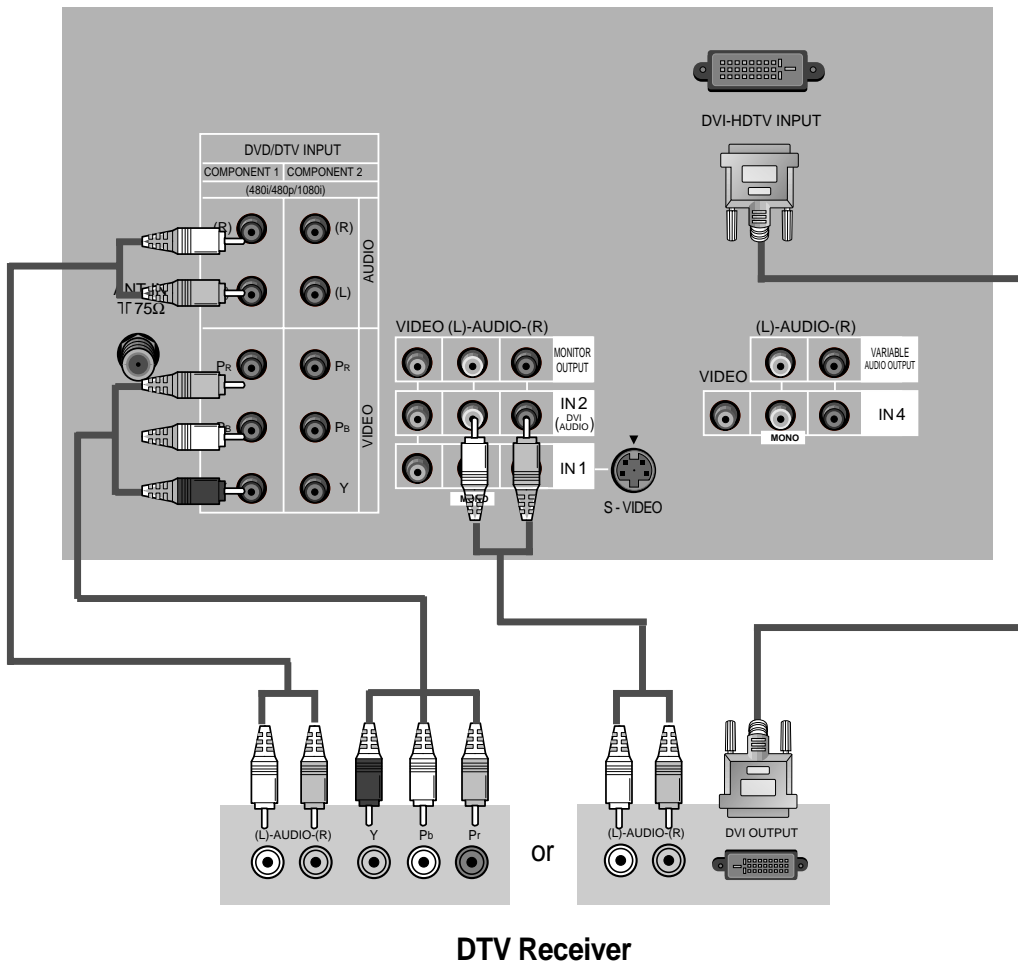
# External Equipment Connection and Viewing Setup

## DTV (Set-top Box) Connection

1. Connect DTV component video outputs to Y, P<sub>B</sub>, P<sub>R</sub> on the TV and audio outputs to audio (L/R) left/right input jacks.
2. Turn on the digital set-top box.  
Use the **tv/video** or **comp/dvi** button to select **Component 1** or **Component 2**.
  - If you connected the DVI output jack from the DTV to the DVI input jack on the TV, select **DVI**.

### Note

- For the best access to high-definition programming at the highest available resolution broadcast, connect the DVI-HDTV output to the corresponding DVI-HDTV input that supports High-band-width Digital Content Protection (HDCP) technology on your High-Definition monitor. Please check your HDTV set-top box or HDTV receiver user's manual or contact the manufacturer to find out if your HDTV receiver provides HDCP output.





# Programming the Remote to operate other devices

The remote control for your projection TV is a multi-brand or universal remote control. It can be programmed to operate most remote-controllable devices of other manufacturers.

Note that the remote control may not control all models of other brands.

## 1. Test your remote control.

To find out whether your remote control can operate the IR device without programming, turn on the IR device such as a VCR and press the corresponding mode button (VCR) on the remote control, while pointing at the IR device. Test the POWER and CH +/- buttons to see if IR device responds properly. If not, the remote requires programming to operate the device.

## 2. Turn on the IR device to be programmed, then press the corresponding mode button on the remote control.

## 3. Press the POWER and MUTE buttons simultaneously, the remote control is ready to be programmed for the code.

## 4. There are two ways to find the right code for the IR device.

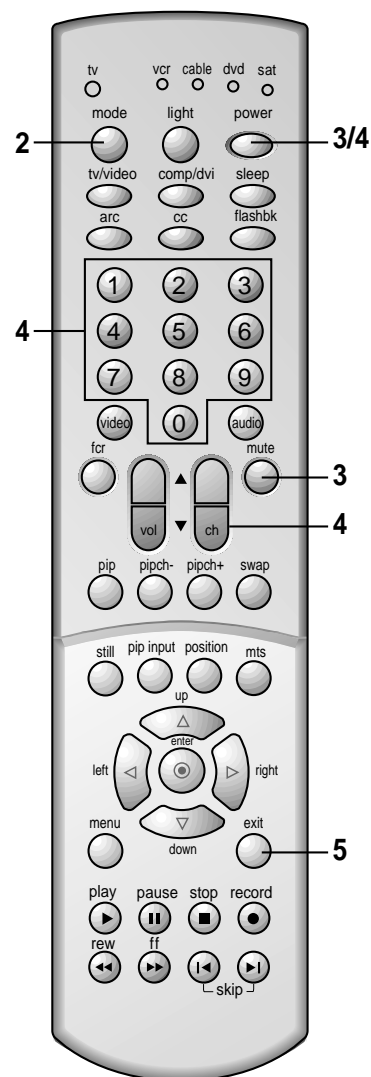
A. If you press the CH +/- buttons repeatedly, the codes will change one at-a-time. Press the POWER button after each code change. If the right code is found, the device will turn off.

## B. Enter a code number using the number buttons on the remote.

Programming code numbers for the corresponding component can be found on the following pages. Again, if the code is correct, the device will turn off.

## 5. Press the EXIT button to store the code.

## 6. Test the remote control functions to see if the IR device responds properly. If not, repeat from step 2.

Early malfunctions can be prevented. Careful and regular cleaning can help extend the amount of time you will have your new projection TV. Be sure to turn the power off and pull out the power plug from the wall power outlet before you begin any cleaning.

## Screen Cleaning

1. Here's a great way to keep the dust off your screen for a while. Wet a soft cloth in a mixture of lukewarm water and a little fabric softener or dish washing detergent. Wring the cloth until it's almost dry, and then use it to wipe the screen.
2. Make sure the excess water is off the screen, and then let it air-dry before you turn on your TV.

## Cabinet Cleaning

1. Use a soft cloth with a mild soap solution to wipe the cabinet.
2. Rinse the cloth and wipe the cabinet again.
3. Let the cabinet air-dry before turning the TV on.

## Extended Absence



If you expect to leave your TV dormant for a long time (such as a vacation), unplug the power cord to protect against possible damage from lightning or power surges. If you use an off-air antenna, you may also want to disconnect it from the back of your TV before leaving.

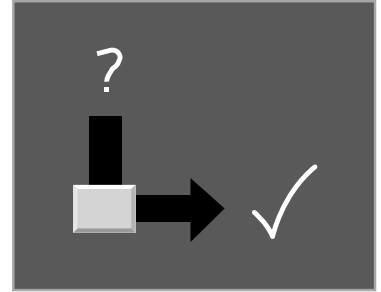
