IMPORTANT SAFEGUARDS

- **1.Read instructions**-All the safety and operating instructions should be read before the appliance is operated.
- **2.Retain Instructions-**The safety and operating instructions should be retained for future reference.
- **3.Heed Warnings**-All warnings on the appliance and in the operating instructions should be adhered to.

- **10.Power Sources-**This TV/VCR/DVD should be operated only from the type of power source indicated on the marking label. If you are not sure of the type of power supply to your home, consult your appliance dealer or local power company. For TV/VCR/DVDs intended to operate from battery power, or other sources, refer to the operating instructions.
- **11.Grounding or Polarization-**This TV/VCR/DVD is equipped with a polarized alternating-current line plug(a plug having one blade wider than the other). This plug will fit into the power outlet only one way. This is a safety feature. If you are unable to insert the plug fully into the outlet, try reversing the plug. If the plug should still fail to fit, contact your electrician to replace your obsolete outlet. Do not defeat the safety purpose of the polarized plug.
- **12.Power-Cord Protection**-Power-supply cords should be routed so that they are not likely to be walked on or pinched by items placed upon or against them, paying particular attention to cords at plugs, convenience receptacles, and the point where they exit from the appliance.



- **13.Outdoor Antenna grounding-**If an outside antenna or cable system is connected to the TV/VCR/DVD, be sure the antenna or cable system is grounded so as to provide some protection against voltage surges and built-up static charges. Article 810 of the National Electrical Code, ANSI/NFPA No. 70, provides information with respect to proper grounding of the mast and supporting structure, grounding of the lead-in wire to an antenna discharge unit, size of grounding conductors, location of antenna-discharge unit, connection to grounding electrodes, and requirements for the grounding electrode. (Fig. A)
- **14.Lightning-**For added protection for this TV/VCR/DVD receiver during a lightning storm, or when it is left unattended and unused for long periods of time, unplug it from the wall outlet and disconnect the antenna or cable system. This will prevent damage to the TV/VCR/DVD due to lightning and power-line surges.
- **15.Power Lines-**An outside antenna system should not be located in the vicinity of overhead power lines or other electric light or power circuits, or where it can fall into such power lines or circuits. When installing an outside antenna system, extreme care should be taken to keep from touching such power lines or circuits as contact with them might be fatal.
- **16.Overloading-**Do not overload wall outlets and extension cords as this can result in a risk of fire or electric shock.
- **17.Object and Liquid Entry**-Never push objects of any kind into this TV/VCR/DVD through openings as they may touch dangerous voltage points or short out parts that could result in a fire or electric shock. Never spill liquid of any kind on the TV/VCR/DVD.

LOCATION

For safe operation and satisfactory performance of your TV/VCR/DVD, keep the following in mind when selecting a place for its installation:

- Shield it from direct sunlight and keep it away from sources of intense heat.
- Avoid dusty or humid places.
- Avoid places with insufficient ventilation for proper heat dissipation. Do not block the ventilation holes at the top or bottom of the unit. Do not place the unit on a carpet because this will block the ventilation holes.
- Install unit in a horizontal position.
- Avoid locations subject to strong vibration.
- Do not place the TV/VCR/DVD near strong magnetic fields.
- Avoid moving TV/VCR/DVD to locations where temperature differences are extreme.

TV/VCR Mode

- **Hi-Fi system**—The Hi-Fi stereo recording system offers you excellent sound quality with a dynamic range of 80dB, frequency response from 20Hz to 20kHz and 0.005% wow and flutter.
- Rotary 4-head Record/Playback System–Four video heads ensure excellent picture quality and special effects playback.
- **Index Search**–Fast-forwards to start of next recording.
- **Slow Motion**–View recorded program at slower than normal speed.
- Infrared remote control
- Trilingual on screen TV/VCR setup display selectable in English, Spanish or French
- **Real time counter**-This shows the elapsed recording or playback time in hours, minutes and seconds. The "-" indication will appear when the tape is rewound further than the tape counter position "0:00:00".
- 181 channel capability PLL frequency synthesizer tuner with direct station call–(A converter may be necessary to view scrambled cable channels.)
- Auto Clock Setting-Allows you to set the clock function from a PBS broadcast station.
- **Closed caption system**–You may view specially labeled (cc) TV programs, movies, news, prerecorded tapes, etc. with either a dialogue caption or text display added to the program.
- Auto power on and off system-Automatically turns on the TV/VCR/DVD when you insert the cassette, turns off after auto-rewind and ejects when the beginning of the tape is reached.
- Auto rewind when the end of a tape is reached–This function doesn't occur when using timer recording.
- **Smooth mode change**-TV/VCR mode and DVD mode automatically changes without control.

- 2 Step picture search operation–You can view a video program at high speed or super high speed in either a forward or reverse direction in LP and SLP mode. For SP mode only high speed is available.
- Three different playback tape speeds : SP/LP/SLP
- Two different recording tape speeds : SP/SLP
- Auto Head Cleaner–Automatically cleans video heads as you insert or remove a cassette.
- **Zero Return**—The tape returns to counter of 0:00:00 by rewinding or fast forwarding.
- **Still**–"Freeze" the picture at any time, for close viewing of a particular scene.
- **Digital Auto Tracking (DTR)**–Automatically adjusts the tracking for each tape you play.
- Rental play mode–Improves playback picture quality from worn tapes, such as rental tapes.
- Auto repeat-Allows you to repeat the playing of a tape indefinitely without pressing the PLAY button.
- **Time search**–Lets you set the TV/VCR/DVD to advance the tape by entering the desired playback time you want to skip.
- **OTR (One Touch Recording)**–Instant timed recording from 30 to 480 minutes is possible at the push of the REC/OTR button.
- 1 Year, 8 events (including Daily and Weekly Timer Recording)—The built-in timer allows you to record up to 8 programs at different times on different channels up to 1 year in advance. The Daily timer allows recordings to be made of daily broadcasts and the Weekly timer allows recording to be made once a week up to the end of the tape.
- **Auto return**–After timer recording is finished, the TV/VCR/DVD can return to the beginning of the recording.
- **Sleep timer**–Allows you to have the TV/VCR/DVD automatically turn off at a desired time.
- **Timer Program Extension**–Allows you to shift the time schedule for automatic timer recording.
- **V-CHIP**–Enables parents to prevent their children from watching inappropriate material on TV.

DVD Mode

Dolby Digital sound

This TV/VCR/DVD can handle Dolby Digital surround sound having 5.1 channels when connected to a Dolby Digital decoder.

Still/fast/slow/step playback

Various playback modes are available including still pictures, fast forward/reverse, slow motion and step frames.

• Random playback for audio CD and MP3

This unit can shuffle the order of tracks to play them in random order.

• Program playback for audio CD and MP3

You can program the order of tracks to play them in any desired order.

• DVD menus in a desired language

You can display DVD menus in a desired language, if available on a DVD.

Screen saver/Auto power-off functions

The screen saver program starts when there is no input from the unit for 5 minutes in the stop mode. When the screen saver program is activated for 15 minutes, the power automatically turns off.

• Subtitles in a desired language

You can select a desired language for the display subtitles, if that language is available on a disc.

Selecting a camera angle

You can select the desired camera angle, if a disc contains sequences recorded from different angles.

Choices for audio language and sound mode

You can select the desired audio language and sound mode, if different languages and modes are available on a disc.

Parental lock

You can set the control level to limit playback of discs which may not be suitable for children.

• Automatic detection of discs

This unit automatically detects if the loaded disc is DVD, audio CD or MP3 on disc.

Playback MP3 disc

• On-screen display

Information about the current operation can be displayed on a TV screen, allowing you to confirm the currently active functions (such as program playback), on the TV screen using the remote control.

- **1. POWER Button** [TV/VCR P.15 / DVD P.37] Press to turn the power on and off.
- **2. VOLUME (VOL.)** $\triangle I \bigtriangledown$ **Buttons** Press to control the volume level for the DVD and TV.

3. SKIP Buttons (for DVD)[P.38]

Press once to skip chapters or tracks to a desired point.

Press and hold to change forward or reverse playback speed.

4. PLAY Button [TV/VCR P.26 / DVD P.37] Starts playback of the disc or tape contents.

- **5. STOP Button** [TV/VCR P.26 / DVD P.37] Stops operation of the disc. (or front panel) Stops operation of the disc or tape contents. (remote control)
- 6.OPEN/CLOSE Button [DVD P.37] Press to insert discs into or remove them from the tr
 - Press to insert discs into or remove them from the tray.
- 7. Disc loading tray
- 8. DVD Indicator
 - Lights up during DVD mode.
- **9. SELECT Button** Press to change to TV/VCR mode, external input mode or DVD mode.
- **10.TV/VCR Indicator** Lights up during TV/VCR mode.
- **11. CHANNEL (CH.)** ▲/▼ Buttons Press to select memorized channel.
- **12. Recording Indicator** Flashes during recording. Light

Flashes during recording. Lights up in the Standby mode for Timer Recording.

13. REC/OTR Button (Front Panel) [TV/VCR P.30, 31] Press to start manual recording. Press repeatedly to start One Touch Recording.

RECORD Button (Remote Control) [TV/VCR P.30] Press to start manual recording.

- **14. REW Button (for TV/VCR)** [TV/VCR P.26] Press to rewind the tape, or to view the picture rapidly in reverse during playback mode. (Rewind Search)
- **15. F.FWD Button (for TV/VCR)** [TV/VCR P.26] Press to rapidly advance the tape, or to view the picture rapidly in forward during playback mode. (Forward Search)
- **16. STOP/EJECT Button** [TV/VCR P.28] Press to stop the tape motion. Press in the Stop mode to remove tape from the unit.

17. Remote sensor window

18. HEADPHONE Jack

To connect headphone (not supplied) for personal listening.

19. VIDEO input Jack

Connect to the video output jack of a video camera or VCR.

Connect to an antenna, cable system or satellite system.

47. Power cord

Connect to a standard AC outlet (120V/60Hz).

VHF/UHF SEPARATE ANTENNAS

In some areas it will be necessary to use an outdoor antenna.

CABLE WITHOUT CONVERTER/ DESCRAMBLER BOX

Use this connection if your cable system connects directly to your TV/VCR/DVD without a converter box.

By using this connection you can:

- 1) Use the remote control to select channels.
- 2) Program one or more unscrambled channels for Automatic Timer Recording.

NOTE: This unit will <u>ONLY</u> record and view the same channel.

CABLE WITH CONVERTER/ DESCRAMBLER BOX OR SATELLITE BOX

If your cable service supplies you with a converter box or if you use a satellite system, you can use the basic connection shown in the illustration.

By using this connection you can also record scrambled channels. However, channel selection must be made with the converter box or satellite box. This means that channels cannot be changed using the remote control. Unattended timer recording is limited to one channel at a time.

TO RECORD A SCRAMBLED/UNSCRAM-BLED CHANNEL

This reminder is provided to call the CATV system installer's attention to Article 820-40 of the NEC that provides guidelines for proper grounding and in particular, specifies that the cable ground shall be connected to the grounding system of the building as close to the point of cable entry as practical.

CONNECTING TO EXTERNAL INPUT JACKS

When using this unit to play a DVD disc in a 5.1 channel Dolby Digital surround format, the unit outputs a DOLBY DIGITAL Data stream from its COAXIAL digital audio out jack. By hooking the unit up to a Dolby Digital decoder, you can enjoy a more convincing, realistic ambience with powerful and high-quality surround sound as enjoyed in movie theaters.

Use audio coaxial digital cables available at retail for the audio connections.



NOTES:

- Be sure to turn off the power to all components in the system before connecting another component.
- Refer to the Owner's Manuals for the components to be connected to the unit.
- If connected to a Dolby Digital decoder, set DOLBY DIGITAL to ON for audio output in the setup mode. (See page 45 to set DOLBY DIGITAL to ON.)

You can view specially labeled (cc) TV programs, movies, news and pre-recorded tapes with either a dialogue caption or text display.

CAPTION mode: By choosing the caption mode, you can watch dramas, movies and news while captioning the dialogues and the contents of news.

TEXT mode: By choosing the text mode, you can watch half screen text information if you want.

1-2: You may get these captions or text information by selecting either "1" or "2". Caption "2" is used, usually for a second language if available.

NOTE:

Not all programs are broadcast with closed captions. Your unit is designed to provide error free closed captions from high quality antenna, cable and VCR signals. Conversely, poor quality signals are likely to result in caption errors or no captions at all. Common signal conditions which may cause captions errors are listed below:

- Automobile ignition noise
- Electric motor brush noise
- Weak snowy reception on TV screen
- Multiplex signal reception displaying picture ghosts or airplane flutter.
- Playback of poorly recorded or worn VCR tapes. **NOTE:**

If the unit displays a black box on the TV screen, this means that the unit is set to the TEXT mode. To clear screen, select [CAPTION1], [CAPTION2] or [OFF].

PRECAUTIONS

- Avoid moisture. Moisture condensation may occur on the tape if it is moved from a cold place to a warm place or visa versa. Before using a tape with these conditions, to avoid damage of the tape and your unit, wait until the tape has warmed to room temperature and the moisture has evaporated.
- Avoid extreme heat, high humidity and magnetic fields.
- Do not tamper with the cassette mechanism.
- Do not touch the tape with your fingers.

TWO DIFFERENT TAPE SPEEDS

Before recording, select the tape speed from : **SP mode** (Standard Play) or **SLP mode** (Super Long Play).

REMOVING A CASSETTE

1)In the Stop mode, press the STOP/EJECT button on the unit. The cassette will eject.

2)Pull the cassette out of the cassette compartment.3)Store the cassette in its case as shown.



ERASE PREVENTION

You can prevent accidental erasing of recording by breaking off the tab on the back edge of the cassette.



If you decide to record on the tape again, cover the hole with plastic tape.



NOTE:

• In DVD mode, Whether the cassette is with tab or without tab you insert, it doesn't start playing until you press the PLAY button.

In TV/VCR mode, if the cassette without tab is inserted, playback will automatically start.

COPYING A VIDEO CASSETTE

TV/VCR

You can make copies of video tapes made by friends or relatives for your enjoyment.

You can not copy a DVD to a videotape.

WARNING: Unauthorized redordings of copyrighted video tapes may be an infringement of copyright laws.

Connect your TV/VCR/DVD and a Source (Playing) VCR using the following diagram.



- 1)Insert a pre-recorded video cassette into the Source (Playing) VCR or camcorder.
- 2)Insert a blank video cassette or one you want to record over, into the unit's cassette compartment.
- 3)Press the SPEED button on ferriore control for the TV/VCR/DVD to select the desired recolling speed (SP/SLP). (not supplied) speed (SP/SLP).
- 4)Press the CHANNEL button \blacktriangle or \blacktriangledown on the unit until "AUX" appears on the screen.
- 5)Press the RECORD button on the unit.
- 6)Begin playback of the tape in the source (Playing) VCR or camcorder.

Avoid over lap of programs ...

- The program with an earlier start has priority.

5)Press the ENTER or RETURN button to exit the setting menu. Then press the SETUP button on the remote control to return to original mode.

TO CORRECT A PROGRAM

- While setting a program; press the Arrow button to go back one step and enter the correct numbers using the Arrow button \blacktriangle or \blacktriangledown .
- After setting a program; 1)Press the POWER button.

2)Repeat steps [1] to [2] on page 32.

- 3)Press the Arrow button \blacktriangleright (or press the Arrow button \blacktriangleleft to go back one step) until the part you want to correct begins flashing, then make the changes pressing the Arrow button \blacktriangle or \blacktriangledown .
- 4)Press the POWER button to set automatic timer recording.

TO CANCEL AN AUTOMATIC TIMER RECORDING

- While recording is in progress;

TO CHECK THE BEGIN/END TIME

1)Press the POWER button so that the Recording indicator goes off.

- 2)Press the SETUP button on the remote control.
- 3)Confirm "TIMER PROGRAMMING" is pointed.
- 4)Press the ENTER button. The details of programs appear on the TV screen.
- 5)Press the SETUP button on the remote control to return to TV mode.

HINTS FOR AUTOMATIC TIMER RECORDING

TV/VCR

- Make sure the channel you want to record is properly set in advance.
- It is not necessary to press the RECORD button for timer recording.
- Recording begins automatically at the Start time.
- The display will not be turned on when the programmed recording begins. To watch the currently recorded TV program or to play a DVD disc, press the POWER button to turn on the display and use the SELECT button to choose the TV/VCR mode or the DVD mode.
- The erase-prevention tab on the cassette must be in place (or you must put tape over the hole).
- If the erase-prevention tab is removed, the cassette will be ejected when the POWER button is pressed to off.
- If the tape runs out before the end time, the unit will switch to the Stop mode immediately and the tape will be ejected.

AUTO RETURN

TV/VCR

With this feature, after timer recording is finished, the beginning of the recorded program(s) can be searched for automatically.

1 Select "USER'S SET UP"

Press the SETUP button on the remote control.

• If you press the POWER button while tape is rewinding, the Auto Return will stop.

TO CANCEL THE AUTO RETURN MODE

SLEEP TIMER

To check the Counter, Clock and Channel number on the TV screen, press the DISPLAY button on the remote control. Each time you press the DISPLAY button on the remote control, the TV screen will change as follows:

When the Closed Caption mode is OFF:

- Counter mode: After 5 seconds, only the counter remains. To clear it, press the DISPLAY button.
- Clock mode: After 5 seconds, only the clock and the channel number remain. To clear them, press the DISPLAY button.



When the Closed Caption mode is ON:

- The On Screen Display disappear after 5 seconds.
- This is true even if the MUTE button is pressed or the PAUSE button is pressed while recording.

DISC TYPES

[DVD]

Data on a DVD is divided into sections called "titles" and then into subsections called "chapters", each of which is given a title or chapter number. Playback conditions are preset on some DVD video discs and these playback conditions take priority over user operations on this TV/VCR/DVD. If a function you selected does not run as desired, refer to the manual accompanying the disc.



[AUDIO CD]

Data on an audio CD is divided into sections called "tracks", each of which is given a track number.



[MP3]

Data on an MP3 is divided into sections called "groups", and then into subsections called "tracks", each of which is given a group or track number.


PLAYING A DISC

BASIC PLAYBACK

DVD-V CD MP3

Getting started

- Turn on the power of amplifier and any other components, if necessary.
 - **1** Press the POWER button.
- The power will turn on.
 - 2 Press the OPEN/CLOSE button to open disc loading tray.
 - *3* Place the chosen disc in the tray, with the label facing up.

- A "prohibited icon" may appear at the top-right on the TV screen during operation, warning that a prohibited operation has been encountered by the DVD or the disc.

- With DVDs that use titles for playback program signals, playback may start from the second title or it may skip these titles.
- During the playback of a two layered disc, pictures may stop for a moment. This happens when the 1st layer switches to the 2nd layer. This is not a malfunction.
