




Taking the steps shown on this page will prepare your MONITOR-VCR, so you can watch TV and record a TV program. The following connections are one time system setup steps.

(A) BASIC ANTENNA CONNECTIONS



Indoor Antenna Connections


ANTENNA (SUPPLIED)



(B) CATV CONNECTIONS WITHOUT A CONVERTER/DESCRAMBLER BOX

Use this connection if your cable system connects directly to your MONITOR-VCR without a converter box.

Back of MONITOR-VCR



- With this connection you will have:
 - a) Remote Control of all receivable channels.
 - Full programmability of unscrambled channels for unattended recording.


- Use the CHANNEL UP/DOWN Keys to select the desired channel.
- You cannot record or view scrambled channels with this connection.

• How to Install Antenna

A rod antenna is packed with your set. Push the stem of the antenna into the antenna hole on the back of the set and connect its wires to the 300 ohm-75 ohm transformer then connect the transformer to the back of the MONITOR-VCR as shown above. Extend the antenna and adjust its length, direction and angle for the clearest picture.

WITH A CONVERTER/DESCRAMBLER BOX

If your cable service supplies you with a converter box, you can use the basic connection shown here.



With this connection, you can record and view any channel including scrambled channels.

However, channel selection must be made at the cable company converter box. Therefore, the MONITOR-VCR's remote channel control feature cannot be used, unattended recording is limited to one channel at a time, and you cannot view another channel other than the one you are recording.

TO RECORD AND VIEW A SCRAMBLED/ UNSCRAMBLED CHANNEL

- Set channel selector to the output channel of the Cable Converter Box (e.g. CH 3).
- Select your desired channel on cable converter channel selector.


WIRELESS REMOTE CONTROL

Various MONITOR-VCR function controls are conveniently available with your Wireless Remote Control.




The following on-screen graphics will appear automatically for a few seconds when one of the main function buttons is pressed on the remote control or at the MONITOR-VCR. The channel currently tuned-in will be displayed automatically for a few seconds when the power is first turned on, whenever the channel is changed, or when the CHANNEL CALL Button is pressed thereafter.

STOP, EJECT, PLAY, REC, FF, REW, PAUSE, TIME, DATE, CHANNEL INDICATION, TAPE COUNTER/COUNTER MEMORY, TAPE SPEED, STANDBY SET (indicates the Standby O.T.R. mode is set), OTR (whenever Standby OTR starts), DEW*




* When "DEW" appears on the TV screen, the unit will not operate due to excessive moisture within it. If this happens, let the MONITOR-VCR remain at room temperature, until this indicator disappears. If there is a cassette in the MONITOR-VCR, it will be ejected when "DEW" appears.

DATE INDICATOR



Press the TIME CALL Button to show or remove the date and time from the TV screen.

TAPE COUNTER/COUNTER MEMORY/ TAPE SPEED INDICATOR



Press the COUNTER CALL Button to show or remove the tape counter/counter memory/tape speed display.

BLANK TAPE INDICATION

If a blank (unrecorded) section of tape is encountered while in the play mode, the TV screen will change to a solid blue field. The screen will remain blue until a recorded signal is again detected.

Description of controls (continued)

FRONT

STOP/EJECT BUTTON

To stop the tape. To remove a cassette in the stop mode.

REWIND/SEARCH BUTTON

To rewind tapes. Also, during playback press this button to do rapid reverse visual search.

VOLUME UP/DOWN BUTTONS

Press either VOLUME UP or DOWN Button to change the sound level.

POWER BUTTON

To turn the MONITOR on and off.

VERTICAL HOLD CONTROL

See page 10 for details.

PLAY/STILL BUTTON

To play back a tape. In SLP playback, press this button once more to view a still picture.

FAST FORWARD/SEARCH BUTTON

To rapidly advance the tape. Also, during playback press this button to do rapid forward visual search.

REPEAT INDICATOR

See page 20 for details.

TIMER INDICATOR

Indicates the MONITOR-VCR is set for unattended recording. Flashes when clock is not set.

SLEEP TIMER INDICATOR

Indicates the MONITOR-VCR is set for SLEEP TIMER.

WIRELESS REMOTE CONTROL

VOLUME UP/DOWN BUTTONS

Same as the VOLUME UP/DOWN Buttons on the MONITOR-VCR.

TIMER BUTTON

To set the MONITOR-VCR for TIMER (unattended) recordings after timer settings have been completed.

SLEEP TIMER BUTTON

Each press of this button advances the automatic off timer by 30 minutes (maximum is 90 minutes).

CHANNEL MEMORY BUTTON

This button is normally OFF. For CHANNEL MEMORY programming, hold this button in and press the NUMERIC Key "1" to use the AUTO SET feature.

ADD/DELETE BUTTON

Used to add or delete a selected channel.

CHANNEL CALL BUTTON

When pressing this button, the number of the channel tuned will be displayed on the TV screen momentarily.

• TIME CALL BUTTON

Press the TIME CALL Button to display or clear the date and time from the TV screen.

COUNTER CALL BUTTON

Press this button to display or clear the tape counter/counter memory/tape speed display.

REWIND/SEARCH BUTTON

Same as the REWIND/SEARCH Button on the MONITOR-VCR.

SLOW MOTION BUTTONS

Press the SLOW Button while watching a tape to put action into slow motion for tapes recorded in SLP speed. UP and DOWN Buttons let you adjust slow motion speed from about 1/5 to about 1/30 of normal speed.

MUTE BUTTON

To turn sound off. Press again and sound will return

CLEAR BUTTON

Press this button to clear the settings for the displayed program contents. While setting the clock or a program, each press of this button moves the digit to the left flashing for correction.

PROG BUTTON

Press this button to display the MENU screen to select either clock adjustment or the timer programming mode.

• STANDBY BUTTON

Used along with the O.T.R. Button, to set a delayed (Standby) O.T.R..

• ONE TOUCH RECORD (O.T.R.) BUTTON

Select the channel and press the ONE TOUCH RECORD Button to start recording immediately for 30 minutes to 4 hours of recording, or until tape ends. In any case power shut off is automatic.

PAUSE/STILL BUTTON

To temporarily stop the tape during recording or to view a still picture during playback.

• FAST FORWARD/SEARCH BUTTON

Same as the FORWARD/SEARCH Button on the MONITOR-VCR.

• DOUBLE SPEED (X2) PLAY BUTTON

Press this button during playback of the tapes recorded in SLP mode for rapid tape search at twice the normal speed.

FRAME ADVANCE BUTTON

While viewing an SLP still picture, press this button to advance the picture one frame at a time, or hold it down for a slow motion picture.


• REPEAT BUTTON

Used to repeat playback of the whole tape continuously.

TAPE SPEED SELECTOR (SP/LP/SLP) BUTTON Broom to colore the desired recording appeal.

Press to select the desired recording speed.

REMOTE CONTROL



Accurate clock time is a must for all types of timer recording. Your MONITOR-VCR will accurately maintain its calendar up to "Dec. 31, 2007, 11:59 PM" once you have set the present day and time.

TO SET THE CLOCK

MONITOR-VCR must be ON. Press the "PROG" Button and the clock set guide will appear on the TV screen.

EXAMPLE: To set the clock for FEB 9, 1988, 10:30 AM, enter the following:



- Be sure to enter the first digit to set the month within 30 seconds.
- Be sure to enter "0" before single-digit numbers.

TO MAKE CORRECTIONS IN ON-SCREEN ENTRY

To make corrections after entering a number, press the CLEAR Button to move the flashing indication one space left. Enter the correct number. The flashing indicator will then move one space right.

TO RESET THE CLOCK




If you want to reset the clock at some later time, press the PROG Button while you are watching TV. The MENU screen shown at the left will appear; press key


- 1) and follow the clock set guide to re-enter the new date and time.
- · Irregular key entries will be ignored.

Use Channel Memory to limit the CHANNEL UP/DOWN Key channel selection to just those channels active in your area. By following the steps below, you can select "CATV" from the 155 channel memory to receive Cable channels, or select "TV" to receive Broadcast channels. "TV" band channel reception was selected at the factory. You start the AUTO SET cycle to assign just the channels in your area from the band displayed and the MONITOR-VCR returns to normal viewing mode when AUTO SET is complete. Any time a channel is selected for viewing you may drop or assign it for scanning with the ADD/DELETE Button.

REMOTE CONTROL



A AUTOMATIC SETTING



■ Hold the CHANNEL MEMORY Button in and press key ① for release of CHANNEL MEMORY mode while setting the CHANNEL MEMORY.

B USING THE ADD/DELETE BUTTON

CHANNEL UP/DOWN KEYS

Any time the CHANNEL MEMORY Button is OFF, you can select assigned channels sequentially using the CHANNEL UP/DOWN Keys. Unassigned channels will be skipped over in sequence.


Note to CATV system installer:

This reminder is provided to call the CATV system installer's attention to Article 820-22 of the NEC in USA (and to the Canadian Electrical code in Canada) that provides guidelines for proper grounding and, in particular, specifies that the cable ground shall be connected to the grounding system of the building, as close to the point of cable entry as practical.

This section describes the operations for watching TV. Use the controls described on the next page to adjust the picture as you desire while you are watching a scene.

AUDIO MUTE

To mute the sound temporarily, press the MUTE Button on the Remote Control. When you press it again, the volume will return to the previous level.

SLEEP TIMER


You can use the SLEEP TIMER feature to off automatically at the end of a preset period time (30, 60 or 90 minutes). This feature is useful for watching a late program when you might doze off before the MONITOR is turned off.

To set, press the SLEEP TIMER Button on the remote control ("30 MIN" will appear in the On Screen Display). Press the SLEEP TIMER Button repeatedly until the desired time (60 or 90 minutes) appears in the display.


While the SLEEP TIMER is set, the SLEEP TIMER Indicator appears on the MONITOR-VCR.

The MONITOR will turn off automatically after the selected period.

To cancel the SLEEP TIMER, press the SLEEP TIMER Button and select "SLEEP OFF".



PICTURE ADJUSTMENTS



AUTO COLOR CONTROL

When the AUTO COLOR Button is pressed to ON position, tint and color are automatically adjusted. In this position, you may still adjust PICTURE, BRIGHT, TINT and COLOR Controls to vary the levels within the optimum viewing range.

SHARPNESS CONTROL

This control lets you adjust the sharpness of the picture. The recommended setting is in the middle (or detent) position.

PICTURE CONTROL

This control lets you adjust the intensity of the picture. It does this by adjusting contrast and color level at the same time and in the proper balance.

BRIGHT CONTROL

This control lets you adjust the brightness of the picture. The recommended setting is in the middle (or detent) position.

TINT CONTROL

This control lets you adjust for most natural fleshtones.


COLOR CONTROL

This control lets you adjust the intensity of the colors.

VERTICAL HOLD CONTROL

If the picture begins to roll, adjust the Vertical Hold Control to stabilize the picture.





TRACKING CONTROL



A certain amount of "noise" may appear in the picture when a VHS video tape recorded on one MONITOR-VCR is played back on a different one. You may adjust the TRACKING CONTROL (UP/DOWN) on your Remote Control to minimize this noise in normal playback, double speed playback and slow motion playback. The normal position is automatically set when a cassette tape is inserted.

SPECIAL EFFECTS IN PLAYBACK MODE (BEST IN SLP SPEED: SOUND IS MUTED)

TO VIEW A STILL PICTURE

Press the PLAY/STILL Button (or the PAUSE/STILL Button on the Remote Control). A freeze frame picture of the playback image appears.



Press the button once more to release the still the playback continues.

TO ADVANCE A STILL PICTURE TO VIEW A SLOW PICTURE


 During still mode, press the FRAME ADVANCE Button on the Remote Control. Frame advance only operates while viewing a still picture.





A few presses of the OTR Button on the Wireless Remote Control lets you instantly start recording the channel you are watching, or extend a recording-in-progress. The first press of this button allows you to check the OTR status with the On-Screen Display. Quick succeeding presses start a recording and set the length of the OTR.

MAKE SURE THAT ...

- the clock is set to the correct time.
- the desired tape speed (SP, LP or SLP) is selected.
- the record tab is not missing on the cassette.
- the tape is long enough to record the programs.

If each succeeding press of the OTR Button does not follow within 5 seconds, the current TV broadcast channel will return to the screen.



B STANDBY O.T.R. — To delay the start time.

It's often convenient to delay a recording. By pressing the STANDBY Button you can quickly set the MONITOR-VCR to start recording on the hour or half-hour up to 11:30 PM of the following day. Then the length of the recording can be set with the OTR Button. Once you do this, the MONITOR-VCR is on standby, until the recording starts.

About 5 seconds later the program will be erased.

Your MONITOR-VCR will begin 4 separate unattended recordings any time within one month of the time you set them. Whenever a program number is vacant you can schedule a recording for some day ahead or even a full series of recordings, with the time and channel you desire. A series recording starts everyday or on the same day of each week, automatically adding recording after recording up to the end of a tape.



- 3. Enter key (5) to select the Weekly Recording mode. The screen shown at far left will appear.
- 4. Select the rec-on day for each week by number.
- Continue with the program guide shown on pages 17 and 18 to complete programming.

TO CHECK PROGRAMS

- a) When a Timer Recording has been set but is not yet in-progress. (TIMER Indicator is lit.)
 - 1. Press the TIMER Button to release the Timer Set mode.
 - 2. Follow steps 1 and 2 on page 17 to check or re-enter the program contents.
 - After checking, press the PROG Button twice to return to viewing channels.
- b) When a Timer Recording has been set and is now in progress.



F NOTES ON OPERATIONS

BASIC CONNECTIONS

 With cable connections, numbers selected to receive specific channels may differ from those for antenna connections. Refer to your cable service information.

CLOCK ADJUSTMENT

- Enter the first digit to set the month within 30 seconds of the appearance of the clock set guide.
 Otherwise, the program you were watching will return to the screen. If this happens, press the PROG Button and start again.
- The letters for day of the week will automatically appear when you have entered both digits for the year.
- If the day digit entered does not match the calendar, it will advance to the first day of the next month (for example, "FEB 29 89" will advance to "MAR 01 89").
- If you press the PROG Button while the clock set guide "-- -- --:-" appears, the TV screen will return to the program you were watching.

TO PLAYBACK

- During search playback, horizontal noise bars will appear on the TV screen.
- After the MONITOR-VCR has been in pause, or still for 5 minutes it will stop automatically for tape and video head protection.
- In search or still playback, some amount of noise may appear for tapes recorded in SLP mode. The picture may be completely snowy in search or still mode for tapes recorded in SP or LP speed.

TO RECORD

- It is possible to change the Tape Speed Selection while you are actually recording but there will be a momentary distortion when the tape is played back over the points where the tape speed change occurred.
- After the MONITOR-VCR has been in pause for 5 minutes it will stop automatically for tape and video head protection.

ONE TOUCH RECORDING

- During a One Touch Recording, press the OTR Button once to see the remaining recording time overlay.
- If the record tab is missing on the cassette, it will be ejected when you press the OTR Button or STANDBY Button.
- If the preset time for a Timer Recording comes up during a One Touch Recording, the One Touch Recording will take priority.

TIMER RECORDING

- Timer recording may not be performed or continued if a power interruption of more than about 60 minutes occurs before or during Timer Recording, even if power resumes thereafter.
- If the start times of 2 preset programs overlap, the preset time of the lower numbered program will have priority.

RE-RECORDING

• For technical reasons, the quality of the dubbed tape will not be as good as the original.

G CLEANING CARE FOR VIDEO HEADS ...



- Clogged Video Head
- (a) Video Head Cleaning: Your MONITOR-VCR will not normally require head cleaning: however, it is possible that the heads may become clogged when playing an old or damaged tape. If the image on your screen resembles the photograph on the left, while playing back a tape, the heads may require cleaning.
- (b) Cleaning the Heads: It is recommended that head cleaning be performed by a qualified service technician. Please contact your nearest Quasar Servicing Dealer or Matsushita Service Company. An alternate solution is to obtain a head cleaning cassette. There

are many types of cleaning cassettes, so be sure to follow the cleaning instructions carefully. Excessive use of the cleaning cassette could shorten head life. Use this cassette only when a head clogging symptom occurs.
