


## Inserting/removing the battery



- 1 Open the card/battery door and insert the battery in the direction shown in the figure.
  - Push the center of the battery in the direction of the △ until it "clicks" and locks
- 2 Close the card/battery door.
- Removing the battery

Move the battery release lever in the direction indicated by the arrow and remove the battery when unlocked.

 Turn off the unit and make sure the LCD monitor is turned off. Then remove the battery while supporting the unit to prevent it from dropping.



### **CAUTION**

Danger of explosion if battery is incorrectly replaced. Replace only with the same or equivalent type recommended by the manufacturer. Dispose of used batteries according to the manufacturer's instructions.

## Charging the battery

When this unit is purchased, the battery is not charged. Charge the battery fully before using this unit for the first time.

### Important:

- The battery will not be charged if the unit is turned on.
- 1 Slide the USB terminal slide lever while holding it down.




Slide the USB terminal slide lever until it "clicks" and locks

• This pushes the USB terminal cover open deploying the USB terminal.

## 2 Connect USB terminal of this unit to a PC with a USB extension cord.

 Connect the USB extension cord by inserting it securely all the way without forcing.



- A USB extension cord (supplied)
- Do not use any other USB extension cords except the supplied one.
   (Operation is not guaranteed with any other USB extension cords.)
- Insert the USB extension cord securely all the way.
   (The insertion of the plug to the USB terminal of this unit leaves a gap (a).) It will not operate properly if it is not inserted all the way.
- During charging, the status indicator flashes. When charging is finished, the status indicator turns off.



### ■ To return the USB terminal slide lever to its original position

While holding down the USB terminal slide lever, slide it to its original position and close the USB terminal cover.



- Please refer to page 60 if the status indicator flashes quickly.
- During the charging, the unit can not be turned on with the power button. In order to turn on the unit, disconnect it from the PC.
- We recommend using Panasonic batteries (→ 8, 71).



## Inserting/removing an SD card

When using an SD card not from Panasonic, or one previously used on other equipment, for the first time on this unit, format the SD card. (→ 35) When the SD card is formatted, all of the recorded data is deleted. Once the data is deleted, it cannot be restored.

#### Caution:

Check that the status indicator has gone off.



### Status indicator (A)

 When this unit is accessing the SD card, the status indicator lights up.

## 1 Open the card/battery door and insert (remove) the SD card into (from) the card slot **3**.

- Face the label side in the direction shown in the illustration and press it straight in as far as it will go.
- Press the center of the SD card and then pull it straight out.

## 2 Securely close the card/battery door.

- Do not touch the terminals on the back of the SD card.
- Do not apply strong shocks, bend, or drop the SD card.
- Electrical noise, static electricity or the failure of this unit or the SD card may damage or erase the data stored on the SD card.
- When the status indicator is lit, do not:
  - Remove the SD card
  - Turn the unit off
  - Insert and remove the USB terminal
  - Expose the unit to vibrations or shock

Performing the above while the lamp is on may result in damage to data/SD card or this unit.

## Turning the unit on/off

### Press the power button to turn on the unit.



• The LCD monitor lights on.

### To turn off the unit

Continue pressing the power button until the LCD monitor goes off.

### ■ About the screen display

### About the power save function

To prevent battery consumption, it will turn off the screen and go into idle mode after approx. 2 minutes of no operation. (The status indicator A

flashes.)

The unit will be turned off automatically if no operation is performed for a further 5 minutes (approx.) while in idle mode.



• Idle mode is canceled by pressing one of the buttons.

### ■ About the high temperature warning icon

When the high temperature warning icon  $\ensuremath{\mathbb{N}}$  is displayed, the temperature of the unit is high.

- It is possible to continue recording/playback when M is displayed. but it is recommended to stop operations and turn off the unit as soon as possible.
- If the temperature rises further, the unit will be turned off automatically after M flashes. You will not be able to turn on the unit again until the temperature lowers (M will flash.), so wait until the temperature lowers before using again.
- A countdown until the recording is stopped will start from approx. 15 seconds during motion picture recording, and the recording will stop when the display reaches 0 seconds.
- When you turn off the unit while the temperature is high (M is displayed.), you will not be able to turn on the unit again until the temperature lowers. ( $\mathbb{N}$  will flash.)

## Setting date and time

When the unit is turned on for the first time, a message asking you to set the date and time will appear.

Press the MENU/SET button and perform steps 2 to 3 below to set the date and time

### Select the menu. (→ 32)

(MEND): [CLOCK SET] → desired setting

**[DATE1:** Setting of the year/month/day

Setting of the hour/minute [TIME]:

## 2 Select the items to be set using ▶ and ◀ on the cursor button, and set the desired value using T and W.



- The year can be set between 2000 and 2039.
- The 12-hour system is used to display the time.

## 3 Press the MENU/SET button.



- The clock function starts at [00] seconds.
- The clock is not set when the unit is shipped.
- The date and time function is driven by a built-in lithium battery.
- If the built-in lithium battery needs to be charged, the message "Set date and time" appears. To recharge the built-in lithium battery, connect USB terminal of this unit to a booted PC or attach the battery to this unit. Leave the unit as it is for approx. 24 hours and the battery will maintain the date and time for approx. 3 months. (The battery is still being recharged even if the unit is off.)
- The date and time will be set to January 1, 2010 00:00 when recording is performed without the date and time set.

## Recording

- This unit will perform automatic recording. Auto focusing, auto white balancing, and electronic stabilizer, will function during the recording.
  - \* The electronic stabilizer will not function when recording still pictures or using digital zoom.

## **Recording motion pictures**

- Press the Motion picture button to start recording.
  - When you begin recording, ■I changes to ●.



- 2 Press the Motion picture button again to pause recording.
- The images recorded between pressing the Motion picture button to start recording and pressing it again to pause recording become one scene.
- In the following cases, the countdown until the recording is stopped will start from approx. 30 seconds and the recording will stop when the display reaches 0 second.
  - When the total of the capacity of the SD card is about to be used during the recording.
  - When the recording time reaches near the maximum continuous recordable time for a single scene. (→ 65)
- Please refer to page 65 for details on continuous recordable time for a single scene.
- Maximum number of recordable scenes on a single SD card is 8999100.

 "h" is an abbreviation for hour, "m" for minute and "s" for second.



### About the compatibility of the recorded motion pictures

- They are not compatible with devices other than those that support MP4. Images cannot be played with equipment that does not support MP4. Confirm that your equipment supports MP4 by referring to the operating instructions.
- There are some cases where the recorded motion pictures cannot be played back, even if the device supports MP4. In such cases, play the recorded motion picture with this unit instead.

## **Recording still pictures**

### 1 Press the photoshot button halfway.

- (White) appears on the screen.
- Aspect ratio is switched in accordance with the setting in [PICTURE SIZE], and the focus is set.
- [] is displayed where the focus is set.

### 2 Press the photoshot button fully.

• (Red) appears on the screen.





- Still pictures cannot be recorded while recording the motion picture.
- The focus prioritizes closer subjects. If [] is not displayed at the desired position, reset the focus by getting closer to the subject or moving the unit, etc.
- Using a tripod is recommended when recording still pictures in dark places because the shutter speed becomes slow.
- The screen will turn black for an instant when pressing the photoshot button halfway/fully.

## Digital zoom in/out function

The maximum digital zoom ratio is  $4\times$ .



T: Close-up recording (zoom in)

W: Wide-angle recording (zoom out)

- Independent of zoom magnification, this unit can focus on a subject approx. 30 cm (11.8 ") away from the lens.
- The larger the zoom magnification, the more the image quality is degraded.

## Recording with the LED light

The LED light enables brightening of the images taken in a dimly-lit place.



### **Light button**

Each time the button is pressed, the LED light is turned on or off.


- The setting will be canceled when you turn off the unit or press the playback button.
- When the LED light is in use, the recordable time when using the battery is shortened.
- The subject should be within approx. 70 cm (2.3 feet) of the unit.
- Turn off the LED light at places where using a light is prohibited.
- Do not look directly at the LED light when it is on.
  - The bright light may hurt your eyes.
  - Keep a distance of at least 1 m (3.3 feet) when recording babies.
- Do not use pointing the LED light at drivers etc. as it may lead to accidents.

## Effect function (applying special effects)

You can record with effects such as changing the color tone or making the skin tone smooth

- 1 Press ▶ or ◀ on the cursor button while the recording is paused.
  - The effect icon appears.
- 2 Select the effect icon by pressing ▶ or ◄.





- Selected effect icon will be displayed in yellow, and the effect will be reflected on the screen.
- When the MENU/SET button is pressed or no operation is performed for approx. 2 seconds, the effect is set and the effect icon disappears.
- The setting will be normal when you turn off the unit or press the playback button.


## **Playback**

## Motion picture/Still picture playback

### 1 Press the playback button.



- The last recorded scene or still picture will be played back.
- When is pressed during playback of a scene, the unit goes to the next scene or still picture. When  $\triangleleft$  is pressed, the unit stops at the beginning of the scene that is currently being played back. When ◀ is pressed again, the unit goes to the previous scene or still picture.
- When ► (◄) is pressed during playback of a still picture, the unit goes to the next (previous) scene or still picture.



## 2 Select the playback operation using the operation icon A.





- Operation icon will disappear when there is no operation for a few seconds. It is displayed again when performing the playback operation again.
- Playback will end and it will go into pause mode for recording when the Motion picture button is pressed.



## 2 Select the scene or still picture to play back using the cursor button, and press the MENU/SET button or playback button.





- The selected scene or still picture is played back, and the operation icon is automatically displayed on the screen.
- The elapsed time for playback indication will be reset to "00m00s" for each scene.
