


Battery Installation 1. Open the battery cover by sliding it in the direction of the arrow. 2. Insert 3 alkaline "AAA" size batteries (not included) into the compartment 3. Replace the battery cover.



SD card Installation

This camera has no internal memory and requires an SD / SDHC card (not included) to record videos or take pictures. The camera can support **SD / SDHC** cards up to **4 GB**. To install the SD card into the camera, follow the steps below:

1. Turn off the camera. 2. Insert the SD card into the card slot (as shown below) until it clicks and locks into place.



• A card can only be inserted one way; do not use force when inserting the card. Inserting or removing a card while the camera is on may damage the card, files stored on the card, or the camera. • This camera supports SD or SDHC cards up to 4GB.

Using your camera

2. To turn on the camera, press and **HOLD** the [(I)] button until the display turns on. 3. To turn the camera off, press and **HOLD** the [(1)] button until the display turns off.
