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INTRODUCTION

About This Manual

To get the most out of your new nüvi 310/360, take time to read this manual and learn the operating procedures for your nüvi in detail. This manual is organized into the following sections:

Index—provides a keyword reference for quickly locating information.

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

When installing the unit in a vehicle, place the unit securely so that it does not interfere with vehicle operating controls or obstruct the driver's view of the road (see diagram).

Do not mount in front of an airbag field of deployment.

Looking at Your nüvi



Mounting the nüvi on the Windshield

For a tight grip, clean and dry your windshield and the suction cup with a lint-free cloth before mounting the suction cup.

To mount the suction cup mount:

- 1. Place the suction cup on the windshield.
- 2. Flip the lever back, toward the windshield.
- 3. Open the antenna. Fit the bottom of your nüvi into the cradle.
- 4. Tilt your nüvi back until it snaps into place. If necessary, rotate the cradle.
- 5. Plug the small end of the cable into the back of the mount (not the side of the nüvi); plug the other end into a 12/24-Volt receptacle in your vehicle.



If you are using the external microphone (optional) for the phone functions, plug the microphone into the right side of the nüvi cradle.

To remove your nüvi from the cradle, press the small tab on the bottom of the cradle up, and tilt the nüvi forward.

BASIC OPERATION

Turning Your nüvi On or Off

To turn your nüvi on or off, press and hold the **OPower** button on the top of the nüvi. The first time you turn on your nüvi, follow the on-screen, set-up instructions.

Charging Your nüvi

To charge the nüvi:

Connect the nüvi to the suction mount and plug in the 12/24-Volt car adapter. **OR**

Connect the USB cable to the nüvi and plug it into a computer USB port.

OR

Connect the AC adapter to the nüvi and plug it into a wall outlet (nüvi 360).

Changing the Volume, Brightness, and Screen Lock

1. Press and quickly release the **OPower** button.

OR

 Move the sliders to adjust the volume and brightness. To turn the volume off, touch Mute. To prevent accidental screen taps, touch Lock. To unlock the screen, press the Power button.

Using the GPS

To use your nüvi indoors, close the GPS antenna. Use this setting when you are practicing using the nüvi or using the Travel Kit, such as using the MP3 player.

Resetting Your nüvi

If your nüvi locks up (freezes up), turn off the nüvi, and then turn it back on. If this does not help, reset your nüvi.

To reset the nüvi:

- Raise the antenna.
- 2. Press the **Reset** button.

Clearing User Information



CAUTION: If you use this function, you are deleting all user-entered information.

- 1. Hold your finger on the upper-right corner of the nüvi's screen while you turn on the nüvi. Keep your finger pressed until the pop-up window appears.
- Touch Yes. All factory settings are restored. Your Recent Selections and audible bookmarks are also deleted.

Using the Anti-Theft Feature

The Garmin LockTM is an anti-theft feature. You can set a 4-digit PIN (personal identification number) that must be entered every time the nüvi is powered on; and you can set a security location. Write down your PIN, and keep it in a safe place. If you forget your PIN, you can go to your Security Location to unlock the nüvi.

- 1. Open the GPS antenna.
- 2. On the Menu page, touch \(\frac{1}{3} \) Settings > Garmin Lock.

- 3. Touch **OK**, and enter a four-digit PIN.
- 4. Set a Security Location.



NOTE: If you forget your PIN and your Security Location, Garmin cannot unlock your GPS over the phone; you must send your GPS to Garmin to get it unlocked.

Changing the Vehicle on the Screen

You can change the vehicle icon that appears on the screen. Visit www.garmin.com/vehicles to download additional vehicles.


- 1. On the Menu page, touch $\sqrt[3]{}$ Settings > Map.
- 2. Touch Vehicle Change.
- 3. Touch the vehicle that you want to use.

nüvi Tips and Shortcuts

- To quickly return to the Menu page, press and hold **Back**.
- Press **Back** to return to the previous page you were viewing.
- To jump from any page back to the player page when you are listening to music or an audible book, quickly press the Power button twice.
- To extend the battery life, close the antenna when you do not need to receive GPS signals. If the antenna is closed, the GPS receiver is turned off.
- To access the Quick Settings, quickly press and release the **OPower** button.

MAIN PAGES

Understanding the Menu Page



- **GPS satellite signals**—represents the satellite signals being received by your nüvi. When you see green bars, you have a strong signal.
- Bluetooth technology status—appears when Bluetooth technology is enabled.
- **Battery status**—represents the status of the battery charge. The lightening bolt symbol indicates that the nüvi is currently charging.
- **Settings**—accesses the nüvi settings.
- Quick settings—accesses the settings for volume, brightness, and screen lock.
- **Phone**—appears when the nüvi and phone are paired; accesses phone features.
- Traffic—appears when you install an FM TMC Traffic Receiver; accesses the traffic functions

Understanding the Map Page

From the Menu page, touch **We View Map** to open the Map page. The **e** vehicle icon shows your current location.



Understanding the Trip Information Page

The Trip Information page displays your current speed and provides helpful statistics about your trip. To view the Trip Information page, select **Speed** or **Arrival** on the Map page.




Resetting Trip Information

To get accurate trip information, reset the trip information before beginning a trip. If you make frequent stops, leave the nüvi turned on so it can accurately measure elapsed time during the trip.

Select **Reset Trip** to reset the information on the Trip Information page. Select **Reset Max** to reset the Maximum Speed.

Understanding the Current Route Page


The Current Route page displays turn-by-turn instructions for your route. Touch the green text bar on the top of the Map page to open the Current Route page. This page displays all turns in the route and the distance between turns. Select a turn on the list to view the Next Turn page for that turn. Touch **Map** to view the entire route on the map.



Understanding the Next Turn Page

The Next Turn page displays the upcoming turn on the map and the distance and time remaining before you reach the turn. To view an upcoming turn on the map, select **Turn In** on the Map page, or select any turn from the Current Route page.

Use and to view other turns in the route. When you are finished viewing the Next Turn page, select **Back**.





Finding Your Destination

Flip up the antenna on the nüvi to get satellite signals. Then, use the Garmin nüvi to find your destination and go to it.

- 1. On the Menu page, touch <a> Where to?
- 2. Select a category. (Touch the arrows to see more categories.)
- 3. Select a destination. (Touch the arrows to see more places.)
- 4. Touch .

Following Your Route

Follow the route to your destination using the Map page. As you travel, the nüvi guides you to your destination with voice prompts, arrows on the map, and directions at the top of the Map page. If you depart from the original route, the nüvi recalculates the route and provides new route instructions.



Your route is marked with a magenta line.



Follow the arrows as you take turns.



A checkered flag marks your destination.

Finding an Address

- 2. Select a state, and select a city, if necessary.
- 3. Type the address number, and touch **Done**.
- 4. Type the street name until a list of streets appears, or touch **Done**.
- 5. Select the street.
- Select a city, if necessary.
- 7. Select the address, if necessary. Touch ...



NOTE: Finding an intersection is very similar to finding an address. Touch **Intersection**, and enter the two street names.

Finding a Place by Spelling the Name

- 2. Using the on-screen keyboard, enter letters contained in the name. Touch to delete the last character entered; touch and hold to delete the entire entry.
- 3. Then touch Done.
- 4. Select the place you want to visit.
- 5. Touch Go!



TIP: In a search results list, if you do not see the place you want to visit, or you want to narrow your search results list, touch **Spell** and enter the name or part of the name.

Finding a Place Using the Map

Touch and drag anywhere on the Map page to browse the map and view different parts of the map. You can also touch \(\bigvee \) Where to? \(\bigvee \) Browse Map.

Tips for Browsing the Map

- Touch the map and drag to view different parts of the map.
- Use the \blacksquare and \blacksquare icons to zoom in and out.
- Touch any object on the map. An arrow appears pointing at the object you selected
- Touch **Go** to navigate to the selected location.
- Touch **Save** to save this location to your **Favorites**.
- If the GPS if turned off, touch Set Loc. to set your location to the selected location.
- Touch **Back** to return to the previous screen.

Viewing Places on the Map

You can view a place you have found on the Map page.

- 1. Touch Show Map.
- Drag the map, and zoom in or out as necessary. Touch Back when you are done.

Expanding Your Search

- 1. On the Menu page, touch **Where to? > Near**.
- 2. Select an option. Touch OK.

Where I Am Now—searches for places near your current location.

A Different City—searches for places near the city you enter.

My Current Route—searches for places along the route you are currently navigating.

My Destination—searches for places near your route destination.



NOTE: Your nüvi automatically searches for places near your current location.

Adding Stops to Your Route

You can add a stop (via point) to your route. The nüvi gives you directions to the via point and then to your final destination.

- 1. With a route active, go to the Menu page, and touch \quad \text{Where to?.}
- 2. Search for the extra stop.
- Touch .
- 4. Touch **Yes** to add this stop before your destination.



NOTE: You can add only one via point to your route.

Adding a Detour to a Route

If you need to take a detour from your current route, select **Detour** on the Menu page of the nüvi. The nüvi calculates a new route and provides you with new instructions. The nüvi attempts to get you back on your original route, as soon as possible.

- 1. On the Map page, select **Menu** to return to the Menu page.
- 2. Select **Detour**, and the nüvi creates a new route, if possible.

On some routes, the route you are currently taking might be the only reasonable option. In this case, you cannot take a detour.

Stopping Your Route

If you want to stop your current route, return to the Menu page and select **Stop**.



Understanding My Locations

You can save all of your favorite places in **My Locations**. You can also save your home location in **My Locations**.

Saving Places You Find

- 1. After you have found a place you want to save, touch Save.
- 2. Touch **OK**. The place is saved in **My Locations** > **Favorites**.

Finding Saved Places

- 1. On the Menu page, touch \(\bigvee \) Where to? > \(\bigvee \) My Locations > Favorites.
- 2. Select a place.
- 3. Touch Con.

Saving Your Current Location

Touch anywhere on the Map page. An arrow points to your current location. Touch **Set Loc.** Your current location is saved in **Favorites**.

Setting a Home Location

You can set a Home location for the place you return to most often. After you have set your Home, you can easily **Go Home**.

- 1. On the Menu page, touch \(\bigcirc \) Where to? > \(\bigcirc \) My Locations > Set Home.
- 2. Select an option.

Going Home

After you set your home location, you can route to it at any time.

Touch My Locations > Go Home.

Editing Saved Places

You can change the name of a saved place and its symbol on the map.

- 1. On the Menu page, touch \(\bigcirc \) Where to? > \(\bigcirc \) My Locations > Favorites.
- 2. Select the place you want to edit.
- 3. Touch the **Edit** button. The Edit window opens.
- 4. Touch a button to change the name or the map symbol, or to delete the item.

Deleting Saved Places

To delete a saved place, touch **Delete**. Then touch **Yes**.



The travel kit provides many features that are helpful when you are traveling across town or across the globe. Touch **Help** to learn more about the nüvi Travel Kit.

- 1. On the Menu page, touch Travel Kit.
- 2. Touch the item you want to open.

To purchase a Travel Kit accessory, go to the Garmin Web site at www.garmin.com/products/nuvi310/ or www.garmin.com/products/nuvi360/, and click the **Accessories** link. You can also contact your Garmin dealer to purchase nüvi accessories.

Using the Language Guide

The Garmin Language Guide is an optional accessory. The Language Guide puts data from Oxford's multilingual resources and five bilingual dictionaries in the palm of your hand. A sample version of the Garmin Language Guide is provided.



NOTE: Only the nüvi 360 can verbally translate words and phrases in the Language Guide. The nüvi 310 can display this information.

Loading the Language Guide

When you receive the Garmin Language Guide SD card, you must load the data on the nüvi. Follow the directions on the package or in the nüvi help file.

Translating Words and Phrases

- 1. On the Menu page, touch Travel Kit > Language Guide.
- 2. Touch Words and Phrases.
- Touch Language.
- 4. Select the From and To languages and touch Back.
- 5. Select a category.
- 6. Search for a phrase, and touch it.
- 7. Touch (1) to hear the translation.

Words and Phrases Tips

- Use **Keywords in Phrases** to find all phrases that contain a specific word.
- Touch Search to spell the word.
- Touch an underlined word to replace the word.
- Touch More Variations to change words in the phrase or to get a different translation.
- If you cannot find what you are looking for in Words and Phrases, look in the Bilingual Dictionaries.

Using the Bilingual Dictionaries

The Garmin Language Guide provides five bilingual dictionaries. You can easily translate words and hear their pronunciation using the Bilingual Dictionaries.

- 1. On the Menu page, touch Travel Kit > Language Guide.
- 2. Touch Bilingual Dictionaries.

- 3. Touch a translation option. If necessary, touch **To English**.
- 4. Search for the word and touch it.
- 5. Touch (1) to hear the word spoken.

Bilingual Tips

- Touch **Search** to spell the word or the beginning of the word.
- Touch Legend to view the legend for the selected language. The Legend contains information on abbreviations, labels, and pronunciation symbols used in each dictionary.

Using the Travel Guide

The Travel Guide is an optional accessory. Much like a paper travel guide, the Garmin Travel Guide provides detailed information about places, such as restaurants and hotels. Your nüvi comes with a few sample travel guide points.

- 1. On the Menu page, touch Travel Kit > Travel Guide.
- 2. Touch a location.
- 3. Touch a category. Touch a sub-category, if necessary.
- 4. Touch an entry.
- 5. Touch **Go** to go to the location. Touch **Map** to display this item on a map.

Using the SaversGuide

The SaversGuide® is an optional accessory that is available only in North America. With the SaversGuide preprogrammed SD data card and membership card, your nüvi

is a digital coupon book that notifies you of merchants near your current location where you are eligible for a discount, such as restaurants, hotels, dry cleaners, movie theaters, and auto repair shops.

Listening to MP3 Files

- 1. On the Menu page, touch Travel Kit > MP3 Player.
- 2. Touch Browse.
- 3. Select a category.
- 4. To play the entire category from the beginning of the list, touch **Play All**. To play starting with a specific song, touch the title.
- 5. Touch **Back** to exit the MP3 page to view other pages, such as the Map page.

Touch **(** to adjust the volume.

Tap • to go to the beginning of the song; touch and hold to skip back.

Tap be to skip to the end of the song; touch and hold to skip ahead.

Touch to pause the song.

Touch **□** to repeat. Touch **□** to shuffle.

When you are listening to music or an audible book, quickly press the **OPOWER** button twice to jump from any page back to the player page. Press **Back** to return to the previous page you were viewing (such as the map).



NOTE: The nüvi plays MP3 files only; it does not support iTunes M4A/M4P files.

Playing Audible Books

Your nüvi provides sample Audible books, which are only portions of the book. Purchase full books from Audible.com at www.garmin.audible.com.

- 1. On the Menu page, touch Travel Kit > Audible Book Player.
- 2. Touch Browse.
- 3. Touch a book title.

Touch **(4)** to adjust the volume.

Tap to jump back. Tap to skip ahead. Press and hold to move more quickly.

Touch to pause the book.

Touch the book cover art to view book information.

When you are listening to music or an Audible book, quickly press the **Power** button twice to jump from any page back to the player page. Press **Back** to return to the previous page you were viewing (such as the Map page).

Using Bookmarks

To create a bookmark, touch and **Bookmark**. To view your bookmarks, touch and then touch a bookmark. Touch **Play** to listen to the book from the bookmark.

Loading Audible Books to Your nüvi

To purchase a book, go to www.garmin.audible.com and create an Audible.com account. After you create an account, download AudibleManager to your personal computer. Then you can purchase a book and download it to your nüvi.

Before you can listen to an audible book, you must activate your nüvi. The first time you open AudibleManager, you are led through the activation process.

Step 1: Activate Your nüvi with AudibleManager

Before you can listen to a book you have downloaded from Audible.com, you must activate your nüvi. This is a one-time process.

- Disconnect your n\u00fcvi from your computer: double-click the Unplug or Eject icon in your system tray. Select "USB Mass Storage Device" and click Stop. Select the n\u00fcvi drives, and click OK. Unplug the USB cable from your n\u00fcvi.
- From your computer's desktop, double-click the **AudibleManager** icon to open AudibleManager.
- 3. In the "Choose your device" window, click the box next to "Garmin nüvi" to place a check mark in the box. Click **Next**.
- 4. Enter your Audible user name and password. Click **Next**.
- 5. Connect your nüvi to your computer using the USB cable. Wait a few moments for AudibleManager to detect your nüvi.
- 6. Select Activate my player(s), and click Next.

 Please wait while AudibleManager attempts to activate your n\u00fcvi. Upon completion, you will receive a message saying the process has been successful. Click Finish.



NOTE: If you are unable to connect to the Internet or have any other problems activating your nüvi, refer to the AudibleManager Help File. Select **Help** from the menu, and then click **Help**.

Step 2: Connect your nüvi to the computer

- 1. Connect the mini-USB connector to the side of the nüvi.
- 2. Connect the larger end of the cable to an available USB port on your computer.
- If you want to load the book on your SD card, insert the SD card in the slot in your n\u00fcvi.

Step 3: Download the book to your computer

Refer to AudibleManager's Help file for detailed instructions about downloading books to your computer and loading them on your nüvi.

- From your computer's desktop, double-click the AudibleManager icon to open AudibleManager.
- 2. Click the **Go to My Library Online** button on the top center of the window. Your Audible.com library opens, displaying the books you have purchased.
- 3. Click **Get it Now** to download the book to your computer.
- 4. Select a format, and click **Download**.

Step 4: Transfer the book to your nüvi

Refer to AudibleManager's Help file for detailed instructions about downloading books to your computer and loading them on your nüvi. You must first activate your nüvi before transferring books.

- 1. Open AudibleManager.
- Select the Internal Drive or External Drive (SD card) in the lower portion of the window.
- 3. Select the book title. Click the **Add to Garmin nüvi** button in the top left corner.
- Select how much of the book you want to load. You can load small sections at a time to save memory. Click OK. AudibleManager transfers the book to your nüvi.
- 5. When you are finished, double-click the **Unplug or Eject Hardware** icon **Stop**, and then click **OK**.



Viewing Pictures

You can view pictures that you have stored in your nüvi using the Picture Viewer.

- 1. On the Menu page, touch Travel Kit > Picture Viewer.
- 2. Touch a picture to view a larger image of it.

Viewing a Slide Show

Touch **Slide Show** to start a slide show, which displays each image for a few moments and then displays the next image. Touch anywhere on the screen to stop the slide show



TIP: Touch **Rotate** to rotate the image 90°.

Using the World Clock

- On the Menu page, touch Travel Kit > World Clock.
- 2. To change a city listed, touch the city.
- 3. Select a new time zone (or city). Touch **OK** when done.
- 4. Touch **World Map** to view a map.
- Nighttime hours are shown in the shaded area. Touch World Clock to view the clocks again, or Back to exit.

Converting Currency

- 1. On the Menu page, touch Fravel Kit > Currency Converter.
- 2. Touch a currency button to change the currency.
- 3. Select a currency, and touch **OK**.
- 4. Touch the blank rectangle under the currency rate you want to convert.
- 5. Enter the number. Touch **Done**.
- 6. Touch Clear to convert a different value.

Updating Conversion Rates

The nüvi allows you to update the currency conversion rates manually so that you are always using the most current rates.

- 1. On the Menu page, touch Travel Kit > Currency Converter.
- 2. Touch Update.
- 3. Touch the rate you want to update.
- Touch to erase the current rate. Enter a new rate, and touch Done.
- 5. Touch Save to finish.



TIP: Touch **Restore** to use the original conversion rate.

TIP: Touch and hold to erase the entire entry.

Converting Measurements

- 1. On the Menu page, touch **Travel Kit** > **Measurement Converter**.
- 2. Select a type of measurement, and touch **OK**.
- 3. Touch a unit of measure that you want to change.
- 4. Select a unit of measure, and touch **OK**. Repeat, if necessary.
- 5. Touch the blank rectangle to enter a value.
- 6 Enter a value, and touch **Done**.
- 7. Touch Clear to enter another measurement.

Using the Calculator

- 1. On the Menu page, touch Travel Kit > Calculator.
- 2. Enter the first number of your calculation.
- 3. Touch an operator (÷, **x**, -, or +).
- 4. Enter the second number of your calculation.
- 5. Touch =.
- 6. Touch c to make a new calculation.

Touch . to add a decimal.

Touch \pm to make the number negative or positive.

Touch % to make the number a percent (0.01).

Touch **C** to clear the entry.

Using Bluetooth® Technology

If you have a phone with Bluetooth wireless technology, and your phone is supported by the nüvi (see www.garmin.com/bluetooth/), you can use your nüvi as a hands-free device. You can speak into the front of the nüvi, and listen to the conversation over the nüvi speaker. To use this hands-free feature, you must pair (connect) your phone with the nüvi. You can initiate this pairing from the phone settings or from the nüvi settings. Refer to your phone's documentation for more information.

To pair using the phone settings:

- 1. Access the phone's Settings menu.
- 2. Access the phone's Bluetooth technology settings. Sometimes these are in a Bluetooth, Connections, or Hands-free menu.
- 3. Search for devices. The nüvi must be 10 meters or closer and turned on.
- 4. Select the nüvi from the list of devices.
- 5. Enter the nüvi PIN (personal identification number), **1234**, into your phone.

To pair using the nüvi settings:

- 2. Verify that the Bluetooth field is set to **Enabled**.
- 3. Touch **Add** to search for available devices, or touch **Change** if you want to use a device that is already on the list.
- 4. Select your phone and touch **OK**, or touch **Add Device** and **OK**.

5. If adding, set your phone to **Find Me/Discoverable/Visible** mode, and touch **OK**. Enter passkey **1234** on your phone, when prompted. The **Phone** icon appears on the Menu page if the pairing is successful.

When you turn on the nüvi, it tries to pair with the last phone with which it paired. After the initial pairing, you can set some phones to automatically attempt pairing with a designated device when the phone is turned on.

To enable or disable the Bluetooth technology:

- 1. On the Menu page, touch Settings > Bluetooth.
- Set the Bluetooth field to Enabled to turn on the Bluetooth technology of your nüvi. Then you must pair the nüvi with your phone to use the technology. The Bluetooth icon appears on the Menu page if the nüvi is enabled.

To disconnect your nüvi from your phone, or to prevent a phone from automatically pairing, touch **Disabled**.

Placing and Answering Calls

Ensure that your phone is paired with your nüvi before you place or receive a call.

To place a direct call:

- 1. On the Menu page, touch 🥎 > **Dial**.
- 2. Enter the number, and touch Dial.
- 3. To end the call, touch (the In-Call button that pops up on the screen), and then touch regard. If you are calling a number that requires you to enter information using a keypad during the call (for example, entering a password for your voicemail), go to step 4.

- 4. Touch Cduring the call, and then touch
- 5. Enter the required information. Touch **Back** when you are finished.
- 6. To end the call, touch \(\biggreen \), and then touch \(\bigcirc \).

To call a POI (point of interest):

- 1. On the Menu page, touch 🥎 > POI Dial.
- 2. Search for the POI that you want to call.
- 3. Touch at the POI. To end the call, touch and then touch for and then touch for all the POI.

To answer a call:

- When you receive a call, an "Incoming Call" message appears on the nüvi. Touch Answer, or you can touch Ignore.
- 2. To end the call, touch (R), and then touch (R)

Handling Simultaneous Calls

If your phone supports simultaneous calls, and during your current call you receive a second call, the nüvi displays the "Incoming Call" message. If you answer the second call, the first call is placed on hold. Then you have the option of switching back and forth between the calls, or you can end a call.

Using the Phone Book

If your phone supports phone book transfer, when your phone pairs with the nüvi, the phone book automatically loads into the nüvi. After pairing, it might take a few minutes for the phone book to be available. You can also place a call using your phone book entries. On the Menu page, touch >> Phone Book.

Using Call History

Touch **Call History** to access information about the phone numbers that you last dialed, last received calls from, and those calls that you missed.

Using Call Home

- 1. Touch **Call Home** to set up or change your home information, so that you can quickly call home. The first time that you use this function, follow the prompts to enter your home information, and then touch **Save**.
- 2. If you want to set your phone number, follow the prompts, and then touch **Done**. The nüvi calls your home phone number.

Using Voice Dial

To use the Voice Dial function of the nüvi, your phone must support voice dial. On the Menu page, touch > Voice Dial.

Using Status

To access information about the phone signal, battery status, and carrier name of your phone, on the Menu page, touch % > **Status**.

Removing a Phone from the List

- 1. On the Menu page, touch Settings > Bluetooth.
- 2. Touch Change.
- 3. Touch the device name that you want to remove, and then touch **Remove**.
- 4. To confirm, touch Yes.

Dropping a Connection

You can drop the connection between your phone and the nüvi.

- 1. On the Menu page, touch Settings > Bluetooth.
- 2. Touch Change.
- 3. Touch the device name that you want to remove, and then touch **Drop**.
- 4. To confirm, touch Yes.

Changing the Friendly Name

The friendly name is the name that identifies your nüvi. The phone and the nüvi use this name when pairing.

To change the friendly name:

- 1. On the Menu page, touch Settings > Bluetooth.
- 2. Touch Edit.
- 3. Use the keyboard to enter the friendly name, and then touch **Done**.

USING AN FM TMC TRAFFIC RECEIVER


Using an optional Garmin FM TMC Traffic Receiver, your nüvi can receive and use traffic information broadcast over the FM Radio Data System (RDS). When a traffic message is received, your nüvi displays the event on the map and can change your route to avoid the traffic incident. For more information about FM TMC Traffic Receivers for the nüvi, visit the Garmin Web site (www.garmin.com). For participating subscription providers, refer to the Garmin Web site at www.garmin.com/fmtraffic.

Connecting the FM TMC Traffic Receiver to Your nüvi

Place your nüvi in the auto mount, and plug it into the 12/24-volt adapter. Plug the Traffic Receiver's mini-USB cable into the mini-USB connector located on the side of the nüvi.



NOTE: You can only access the traffic information and settings if the nüvi is connected to external power and an FM TMC Traffic Receiver, such as a GTM 10.



Connecting the FM TMC Traffic Receiver to the nüvi

Viewing Traffic Incidents

- 1. On the Menu page, touch 🔷 to display a list of traffic incidents.
- 2. Select an item to view details.
- 3. Select an option.

Avoiding Traffic

The Map page displays when there is a traffic incident on your current route or on the current road. When you are following a route, touch to avoid the traffic.

- 1. From the map page, touch
- 2. Select an item to view details.
- 3. Touch Avoid.



Managing Files on Your nüvi

You can store files (such as JPEG images and MP3 music files) in the nüvi's internal memory or on an optional SD card.



NOTE: The nüvi cannot communicate with Windows® 95, Windows 98, or Windows Me.

Supported File Types

- MP3 music files
- · JPG image files
- · AA audible book files
- GPI custom POI files from Garmin's POI Loader
- GPX waypoint files from MapSource
- Maps from MapSource




NOTE: The nüvi does not support iTunes M4A/M4P files.

Loading Items to Your nüvi

Step 1: Insert an SD Card (Optional)

The SD card slot is located on the side of the nüvi. To insert or remove the card, press it in until it clicks



Step 2: Connect the USB Cable

- 1. Plug the small end of the USB cable into the connector on the side of the nüvi.
- Connect the larger end of the USB cable to an available USB port on your computer.

After you connect your nüvi to your computer, one or two additional drives appear in your computer's list of drives: "Garmin nüvi" and possibly "nüvi sd." "Garmin nüvi" is the available storage in the nüvi's internal memory. "nüvi sd" is the SD card inserted into the nüvi. If you do not have an SD card inserted in your nüvi, the "nüvi sd" drive might not appear in the list.



NOTE: On some Windows Operating Systems, the nüvi drives may not be named automatically. See your Windows help file to learn how to rename the drives.

Step 3: Transfer Files to Your nüvi

- 1. Connect the nüvi to your computer.
- 2. Double-click the My Computer icon on your computer's desktop.
- 3. Browse your computer for the file you want to copy.
- 4. Highlight the file and select **Edit** > **Copy**.
- 5. Open the "nüvi" or "nüvi sd" drive.
- 6. Select **Edit** > **Paste**. The file then appears in the list of files on the nüvi memory or SD card.

Step 4: Eject and Unplug the USB Cable

When you are finished transferring files, double-click the **Unplug or Eject** sicon in your system tray. Select "USB Mass Storage Device," and click **Stop**. Select the nüvi drives, and click **OK**. You can disconnect your nüvi from your computer now.

Deleting Files from Your nüvi

You can delete files from your nüvi just as you would delete files from your computer.

With the nüvi connected to your computer, open My Computer. Open your "Garmin nüvi" or "nüvi sd" drive. Highlight the file that you want to delete from your nüvi, and press the **Delete** key on your computer's keyboard.



CAUTION: If you are not sure about a file's purpose, do **NOT** delete it. Your nüvi memory contains important map data files that should **NOT** be deleted. Be especially cautious of files located in folders entitled "Garmin."

Customizing the nüvi

To change nüvi settings, touch \Im **Settings** from the Menu page. See the following pages for more information.

- 1. On the Menu page, touch \Im **Settings**.
- 2. Touch the setting you want to change.

Restoring Settings

To restore all settings you have changed:

- 1. On the Menu page, touch \(\frac{1}{2} \) Settings.
- 2. Touch Restore.

To restore settings for an individual category, such as Map, touch **Restore** on that particular page.

Changing the Map Settings

To change the map settings, on the Menu page, touch \(\frac{1}{3} \) Settings > Map.

Map Detail—adjust the amount of detail shown on the map. Displaying more detail causes the map to redraw slowly.

Map View—change the perspective of the Map page.

- Track Up—display the map in _2 dimensions (2D) with your direction of travel at the top.
- North Up—display the map in 2D with North at the top.

• 3D View—display the map in 3 dimensions (3D), Track Up orientation. This is the default map view.

Vehicle—provides choices of vehicles for your map. The default is **a**.



Map outlines—turns on or off the supplemental map outlines.

Map Info—view the maps loaded on your nuvi and their version.

Changing the System Settings

To change the system settings, on the Menu page, touch \(\sqrt{\sqrt{Settings}} > \sqrt{System}.\)

GPS Mode—enable and disable GPS and WAAS/EGNOS. Select Normal for normal GPS (no WAAS or EGNOS). For information about WAAS and EGNOS, go to www.garmin.com/aboutGPS/waas.html.

Safe Mode—turn on or off the Safe Mode feature. When your vehicle is moving, Safe Mode disables all unit functions that require significant operator attention and could become a distraction while driving.

Garmin Lock—turn on Garmin LockTM to lock your nüvi. Enter a 4-digit PIN and set a security location. Each time you turn on the nüvi, enter the 4-digit PIN or drive to the security location.

Touch Tones—disable or enable the tone that sounds each time you touch the screen.

Proximity Alarms—turn on or off the alerts when you approach Custom POIs. This option is only visible if you have loaded Custom POIs.

About—display your nüvi's software version number, unit ID number, and audio version number. You need this information to update the system software or purchase additional map data.

Changing the Locale Settings

To change the locale settings, on the Menu page, touch \(\sqrt{Settings} > Locale. \)

View the location settings, such as language and time zone. Touch **Change** to adjust the settings. On each screen, touch the setting you want, and then touch **Next**.

Locale—select your location.

Text Language—change all on-screen text to the selected language. Changing the Text Language does not change the language of map data, such as street names and places or user-entered data.

Voice Language—change the language for all voice prompts and messages. Your nüvi contains two different types of voice languages: text-to-speech and pre-recorded.

Languages noted with a person's name are text-to-speech (TTS) voices: for example, American English-Jill is a text-to-speech voice. The text-to-speech voices "read" and "speak" the same words that are displayed on the nüvi. The voices have an extensive vocabulary, and they pronounce the street names as you approach turns.

The pre-recorded voices have a limited vocabulary and do not speak names of locations or streets.

Time Zone—select a time zone or nearby city from the list.

Daylight Saving—set to On, Off, or Auto if it is available.

Time Format—choose a 12-hour, 24-hour, or UTC time format.

Units—Change units of measure to kilometers (Metric) or miles (Statute).

Changing the Display Settings

To change the display settings, on the Menu page, touch \(\sqrt{Settings} > \text{Display}.\)

Color Mode—select Daytime for a light background, Nighttime for a black background, or Auto to automatically switch between the two.

Backlight Timeout—select the length of time the backlight stays on after external power is removed. Reducing the time the backlight stays on increases your battery life.

Touch Screen—recalibrates (or realigns) the touch screen to respond properly. Touch **Recalibrate** and then follow the directions.

PictureIt—enables you to take a screen shot when you quickly press and release the **Dower** button. The screen shots are saved in the "PictureIt" folder on your "nüvi" drive



NOTE: When PictureIt is **On**, the Quick Settings screen does not open when you press the **OPOWER** button.

Splash Screen—select an image to be shown when you turn on the nüvi. First, load JPEG images on your nüvi or SD card using USB Mass Storage Mode.

Changing the Navigation Settings

To change the navigation settings, on the Menu page, touch \(\sqrt{Settings} > \) **Navigation**.

Route Preference—select a preference for calculating your route. Select Faster Time to calculate routes that are faster to drive but can be longer in distance. Select Shorter Distance to calculate routes that are shorter in distance but can take more time to drive.

Vehicle—specify your vehicle type to optimize routes.

Avoidances—touch **Enabled** to access the road types. Select the road types you want to avoid on your routes. The nüvi uses these road types only if alternative routes take you too far out of your way or if no other roads are available. If you have an FM TMC Traffic Receiver, you can also avoid traffic incidents.

Attention Tone—turn on or off the attention tone.

Voice Prompts—select when you want the nüvi to announce route navigation and system status.

Changing the Bluetooth Settings

To change the Bluetooth settings, on the Menu page, touch $\$ **Settings** > **Bluetooth**.

Connections—select a device to connect to. Select Add Device to search the area for cellular phone with Bluetooth® wireless technology. Set your cell phone to Find Me, Discoverable, or Visible, and then touch OK. The nüvi searches for all Bluetooth wireless devices in the area and lists them. Select your phone, and then touch OK. Enter the nüvi's PIN in your phone.



NOTE: The nüvi's PIN code (or passkey) is 1234.

Drop—disconnect the nüvi from your phone.

Remove—remove a device from the device list. Touch the device, then touch **Remove**.

Bluetooth—enable and disable the Bluetooth component.

Friendly Name—select to enter a friendly name that identifies your nüvi on devices that are Bluetooth enabled. Touch **Done** after you have entered the name.

Restore—restore the original Bluetooth settings. Restoring the Bluetooth settings will not clear the pairing information.

Changing the Traffic Settings

To change the traffic settings, on the Menu page, touch \(\sqrt{Settings} > \textstyle \text{Traffic.} \)

Adding a Subscription

Your FM TMC Traffic Receiver might have a trial subscription, or you might be in an area with free service. You can also add subscriptions to expand your service area. You need your FM TMC Traffic Receiver's Unit ID. Go to www.garmin.com/fmtraffic to purchase a traffic subscription and obtain a 25-character traffic subscription code.

- 1. On the Menu page, touch Settings > Traffic. The subscriptions for the Garmin FM TMC Traffic Receiver are listed.
- 2. Touch Add, and follow the instructions.

APPENDIX

Mounting the nüvi on Your Dashboard

Use the enclosed mounting disk to mount your nüvi to the dashboard.

Important: The **permanent** mounting adhesive is extremely difficult to remove after it is installed

To install the mounting disk:

- 1. Clean and dry the dashboard where you will place the disk.
- Remove the backing from the permanent mounting adhesive on the bottom of the disk and place the disk on the dashboard.
- 3. Place the suction cup mount on top of the disk
- 4. Flip the suction lever down to secure the suction cup mount to the disk.



Removing the nüvi and the Mount

- 1. To remove the nüvi, press up on the tab on the bottom of the cradle.
- 2. Lift the nüvi off of the mount.
- 3. To remove the suction cup from the windshield, flip the lever toward you.
- 4. Pull the tab on the suction cup toward you.

Removing the Cradle from the Mount

To remove the cradle from the mount arm, turn the cradle to one side. The cradle will snap off the ball socket.

To replace the cradle, snap the cradle on the ball socket.

Custom POIs (Points of Interest)

Your nüvi accepts custom points of interest (POI) databases, available from various companies on the Internet. Some custom POI databases contain alert information for points such as safety cameras and school zones. Your nüvi can notify you with a proximity alarm when you approach one of these points.

After downloading your POI database, use the Garmin POI Loader to install the POIs into your nüvi. The POI Loader is available at www.garmin.com/products/nuvi310/ or www.garmin.com/products/nuvi360/. Select **Updates and Downloads**.

Using the POI Loader program, you can store the Custom POIs on your "nüvi" drive or your SD card. You can also customize the proximity alert settings for each POI using the POI Loader. Refer to the POI Loader Help file for more information; press F1 to open the Help file.

To view your Custom POIs, touch My Locations > Custom POIs.

To delete the Custom POIs and Favorites from your nüvi, touch **Where To?** from the Menu page. Touch **My Locations** > **Delete All**. Touch **Yes** to delete all of your Favorites and your Custom POIs.



CAUTION: Garmin is not responsible for the consequences of using a custom POI database or the accuracy of the safety camera or other custom POI database.

Caring for Your nüvi

Your nüvi contains sensitive electronic components that can be permanently damaged if exposed to excessive shock or vibration. To minimize the risk of damage to your nüvi, avoid dropping your nüvi and operating it in high shock/vibration environments.

Cleaning the nüvi

The nüvi is constructed of high quality materials and does not require user maintenance other than cleaning. Clean the nüvi's outer casing (not the touch screen) using a cloth dampened with a mild detergent solution and then wipe dry. Avoid chemical cleaners and solvents that can damage plastic components.

Cleaning the Touch Screen

Clean the touch screen with a soft, clean, lint-free cloth. Use water, isopropyl alcohol, or eyeglass cleaner, if needed. Apply the liquid to the cloth and then gently wipe the touch screen.

Protecting Your nüvi

Follow the cautions below to protect your nüvi from damage:

- Do not store the nüvi where prolonged exposure to extreme temperatures can occur (such as in the trunk of a car), as permanent damage may result.
- Do not expose the nüvi to water. Contact with water can cause this nüvi to malfunction.
- Do not leave your nüvi in plain sight when you leave your vehicle. Take your nüvi with you or remove it from view to avoid theft.
- Though a PDA stylus can also be used to operate the touch screen, never attempt this while operating a vehicle. Never use a hard or sharp object to operate the touch screen, because it can damage the screen.
- To help prevent theft, use the Garmin Lock feature.

Changing the Fuse

An AGC/3AG 2 Amp, high-breaking capacity, 1500 A-rated fuse is located at the tip of the vehicle adapter. Periodically, you may need to change the fuse. Unscrew the black, round end piece and replace the fuse.

Updating the nüvi Software

Garmin periodically updates its software and map data. If you register your nüvi, you will receive notification of updates. To check for system software updates, go to www.garmin.com/products/nuvi310/ or www.garmin.com/products/nuvi360/, and select **Software Updates**. To check for map software updates, go to www.garmin.com/unlock/update.jsp.

Purchasing MapSource Maps

You can purchase additional MapSource map data from Garmin and load the maps on your nüvi's internal memory or on an optional SD card. Follow the instructions that come with the new map data to properly install the maps to your computer and nüvi. To enable additional maps, you need your unit ID and serial number. To load maps to your nüvi memory or SD card, select the name for your "Garmin nüvi" drive or SD card drive. Refer to the MapSource help file for more information about using MapSource and loading maps on your Garmin GPS.

Loading MapSource Waypoints

Using MapSource, you can save locations (also called waypoints) and transfer them to your nüvi. (For more information, see the help file; press F1 to open the help file.)

After you create the waypoints, select **File** > **Save**. Select **GPS eXchange Format** (*.gpx) for the **Save as Type**. Click the **Save** button.

With the nüvi connected to your computer, copy the *.gpx file into in the **Garmin\Waypoints** folder in the "Garmin nüvi" drive. The waypoints you created in MapSource are now in **My Locations** > **Favorites**.

Viewing Your Saved Locations in MapSource

You can view the locations you saved in your nüvi using the MapSource program.

In MapSource, select **File** > **Open**. Select **GPS eXchange Format** (*.gpx) for **Files of Type**. Browse to find the **Garmin\Waypoints** folder on your "nüvi" drive. Select **Waypoints.gpx**, and click **Open**.

Battery Information


Your nüvi contains an internal (non-removable) lithium-ion battery. Contact your local waste disposal department for information on properly disposing of the nüvi.

Battery Tips

- Your nüvi's battery should last 4 to 8 hours, depending on usage.
- To extend the battery life, reduce the time the backlight stays on. On the Menu page, select **Settings** > **Display** > **Backlight Timeout** to change the setting.
- Close the antenna when you do not need to receive GPS signals.
- To increase the accuracy of the battery gauge, fully discharge the battery and then fully charge it. You should not need to do this very often.
- Do not leave your n\u00fcvi in direct sunlight, and avoid prolonged exposure to
 excessive heat

Battery Gauge

The battery icon in the upper-right corner of the Menu page indicates the status of the internal battery. Periodically, you might notice that the battery gauge is not completely accurate. To increase the accuracy of the battery gauge, fully discharge the battery and then fully charge it without interrupting the charging. For best results, do not unplug the nüvi until it is totally charged.



About GPS Satellite Signals

Your nüvi must acquire GPS (Global Positioning System) satellite signals to operate. If you are indoors, near tall buildings or trees, or in a parking garage, the nüvi might not acquire satellites. Go outside to an area free from tall obstructions to use your nüvi, or close the antenna to turn off the GPS and use it indoors.

When the nüvi acquires satellite signals, the signal strength bars on the Menu page are green When it loses satellite signals, the bars turn red or disappear GPS. Touch the signals strength bars in the upper-left corner of the Menu page to view GPS information. Touch any where on the screen to return to the Menu page.



The sky view shows the satellites from which you are receiving. The satellite signal strength bars indicate the strength of each satellite you are receiving.

For more information about GPS, visit the Garmin Web site at www.garmin.com/about GPS.

Using a Remote Antenna

You can use an optional external remote antenna. This is very helpful when operating the nüvi in a vehicle with a coated windshield or an in-screen (in the window) heating system, which can block GPS signals. Connect the antenna to the connector located on the back of the nüvi. To purchase, go to the Garmin Web site at www.garmin.com/products/nuvi310/ or www.garmin.com/products/nuvi360/, and select the **Accessories** link.
