Doing more with your camera

Storing pictures on an SD card

Your camera has internal memory. You can purchase an SD card to store more pictures and videos (www.kodak.com/go/c913accessories, www.kodak.com/go/cd93accessories). We recommend Kodak SD cards.



- Turn off the camera.
- Insert or remove the optional card.
 - Turn on the camera.





A card can only be inserted one way; forcing it may cause damage. If you insert or remove a card while the camera is accessing it, the card, pictures, or camera may be damaged.

Using the zoom button

Use optical zoom to get up to 3X closer to your subject.





- 1 Use the LCD to frame your subject.
- 2 Press Telephoto (T) to zoom in. Press Wide Angle (W) to zoom out.

The zoom indicator shows zoom status.

3 Take the picture or video.

NOTE: To get a focused picture every time, remember:

- Always use the auto focus framing marks.
- If you are using no zoom (1X, wide angle), you can be as close as 24 in. (60 cm) to your subject.
- As you zoom, you need to move further from your subject.

To use digital zoom in any Still mode:

Press Telephoto (T) to the maximum optical zoom limit. Release the button, then press it again.

NOTE: You may notice decreased image quality when using digital zoom. The slider on the zoom indicator turns red when the picture quality reaches the limit for an acceptable 4 x 6-in. (10 x 15 cm) print.



Using the flash button

Use the flash when you take pictures at night, indoors, or outdoors in heavy shadows.



Press the 🗲 button repeatedly to scroll through flash modes (see Flash modes below).

The current flash mode appears in the LCD screen.

Viewing thumbnails (multi-up)



- **1** Press the Review button.
- **2** Press the Zoom Wide Angle (W) button to change from single-picture view to multi-up thumbnails.
- **3** Press Telephoto (T) to return to single-picture view.

NOTE: To select multiple pictures/videos, see page 15.

Selecting multiple pictures/videos

Use the multi-select feature when you have two or more pictures/videos to print, transfer, delete, etc. Multi-select is used most effectively in Multi-Up mode, page 15.



- 1 Press the Review button, then **√** to find a picture/video.
- 2 Press the OK button to select pictures/videos.

A check mark appears on the picture. You can now print, transfer, delete, etc. the selected pictures. You can press OK a second time to remove a check mark.



Deleting pictures/videos

- 1 Press the Review button.
- 2 Press **4**/**b** for previous/next picture/video.
- **3** Press the Delete button
- **4** Follow the screen prompts.

Protecting pictures/videos from deletion

- **1** Press the Review button.
- 2 Press **/** for previous/next picture/video.
- **3** Press the Menu button
- 4 Press \checkmark to highlight Protect, then press OK.

The picture/video is protected and cannot be deleted. The Protect icon 🔒 appears with the protected picture/video.

Press the Menu button to exit the menu.

CAUTION:

Formatting internal memory or an SD or SDHC card deletes all (including protected) pictures/videos. (Formatting internal memory also deletes email addresses, tag names, and favorites.)

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Using the menu button in review

Using Kodak Perfect Touch technology

Kodak Perfect Touch technology helps ensure better, brighter pictures.

- 1 Press the Review button, then **4/** for previous/next picture.
- 2 Press the Menu button. Press $/ \sim$ to highlight Edit Picture, then press OK.
- 3 Press ▲/▼ to highlight Perfect Touch tech., then press OK. The enhancement is previewed in a split screen. Press ◀/▶ to view other parts of the picture.
- **4** Press OK. Follow the screen prompts to replace the original picture or to save the enhanced picture as a new one.
 - Press the Menu button to exit the menu.

Cropping pictures

You can crop a picture so that only the desired portion of the picture remains.



- **1** Press the Review button, then **∢/** to find a picture.
- 2 Press the Menu button. Press ▲/▼ to highlight Edit Picture, then press OK.
- **3** Press \checkmark to highlight Crop, then press OK.
- 4 Press Telephoto (T) to zoom in, or ◀/▶ ▲/▼ to move the crop box. Press OK.
- **5** Follow the screen prompts.

The picture is cropped and saved. The original is saved.

Press the Menu button to exit the menu.

Rotating pictures

You can change a picture to display in portrait 🔲 or landscape 📩 orientation.

- 1 Press the Review button, then \checkmark for previous/next picture.
- 2 Press the Menu button. Press Area to highlight Edit Picture, then press OK.
- **3** Press **1** to highlight Rotate Picture, then press OK.
- **4** Press **A**/**•** to highlight an option:

Rotate Right—rotates the picture 90 degrees clockwise 🔄.

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Rotate Left—rotates the picture 90 degrees counterclockwise 🖾.

- **5** Press OK. Follow the screen prompts to replace the original picture or to save the rotated picture as a new one.
 - Press the Menu button to exit the menu.

Making a picture from a video

You can choose a single frame from a video, then make a picture suitable for printing.



- 1 Press the Review button, then **4**/**>** to find a video.
- **2** Press the Menu button. Press **A**/**•** to highlight Edit Video, then press OK.
- **3** Press **A v** to highlight Make Picture, then press OK.
- **4** Press OK to select a video frame.
- **5** Follow the screen prompts to save the picture. *A picture is created. (The original video is saved.)*
 - Press the Menu button to exit the menu.



Searching pictures by date, Favorites, or other tag

If you have many pictures on your camera or card, you can sort them so that only some are visible at a time. You can sort by the date a picture was taken or—if you've tagged pictures with a Favorites tag or a tag that you created—you can sort by tag.

- **1** Press the Review button, then the Menu button.
- 2 Press A To highlight Search, then press the OK button.
- **3** Press **4**/**b** to highlight Date, Favorite, or Tag, then **w** to select a folder.
- 4 Press **4**/**b** to select a folder.
- **5** To see the results of your search, highlight Exit then press the OK button. Press Save, then press the OK button.

Pictures are displayed in multi-up view. Press **I** to view them. Press the Telephoto (T) button to view the picture full-screen. Press the Wide Angle (W) button to return to multi-up view.
