Inside you will find many helpful hints on how to use and maintain your air conditioner properly. Just a little preventive care on your part can save you a great deal of time and money over the life of your air conditioner.

You'll find many answers to common problems in the *Before You Call For Service* section. If you review our chart of *Troubleshooting Tips* first, you may not need to call for service at all.

⚠ **WARNING!**

For your safety, the information in this manual must be followed to minimize the risk of fire, electric shock or personal injury.



SAFETY PRECAUTIONS

- This air conditioner must be properly installed in accordance with the Installation Instructions before it is used.
- Repair or replace immediately all electric service cords that have become frayed or otherwise damaged.
- Turn the mode control to **OFF** and unplug your air conditioner before making any repairs.

NOTE: We strongly recommend that any servicing be performed by a qualified individual.



USE OF EXTENSION CORDS

The use of an extension cord is not recommended. However, if an extension cord is required to reach the nearest wall receptacle, use only a UL-listed, 3-wire, grounded, 14 gauge, 15A, 125V appliance extension cord.



USE OF ADAPTER PLUGS

Because most 2-prong outlets are not grounded, we strongly advise against using an adapter plug. However, a temporary connection may be made where local codes permit and if the 2-prong wall outlet is properly grounded. UL-listed adapters are available at most hardware stores.

When you plug the adapter in, make sure the larger prong goes into the larger slot to provide the proper polarity for the power cord.

For Proper Grounding:

- Screw the adapter to the outlet, using the outlet cover screw.
- Ground the outlet through the house wiring.

When disconnecting the power cord from the adapter, hold the adapter close to the outlet while pulling the plug out. If this is not done, the grounding connector is likely to break with repeated use.

If the grounding connector breaks, **DO NOT USE** the air conditioner until a proper ground has again been made.

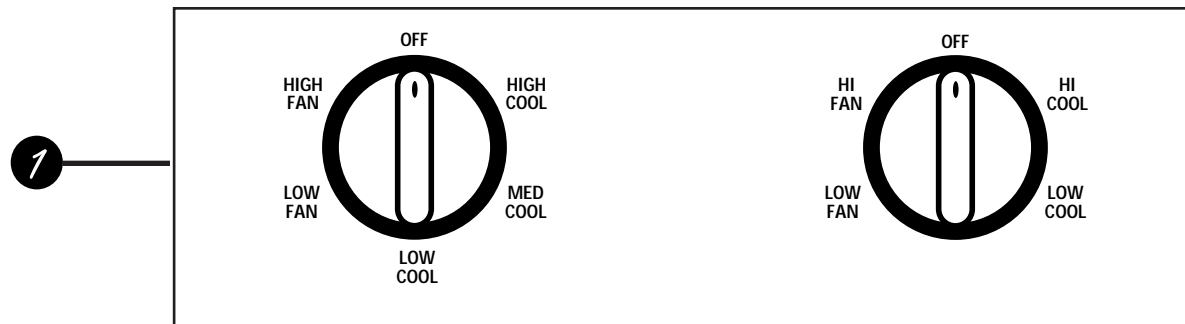

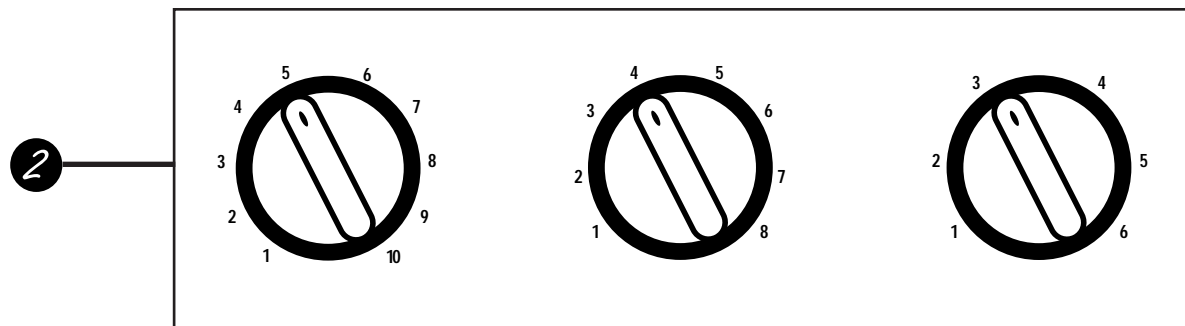
SAVE THESE INSTRUCTIONS

About the controls on the air conditioner.

The controls will look like one of the following.



MODE CONTROLS



TEMP CONTROLS



Controls

- 1 Mode Controls**
HIGH COOL, **MED COOL** and **LOW COOL** provide cooling with different fan speeds.
LOW FAN or **HIGH FAN** provides air circulation and filtering without cooling.

NOTE: If you move the switch from a cool setting to **OFF** or to a fan setting, wait at least 3 minutes before switching back to a cool setting.

Cooling Descriptions

For Normal Cooling—Select **HIGH COOL** or **MED COOL** with the temp control at midpoint.

For Maximum Cooling—Select **HIGH COOL** with the temp control at the highest number available on your knob.

For Quieter & Nighttime Cooling—Select **LOW COOL** with the temp control at midpoint.

- 2 Temp Controls**
 The temp control is used to maintain the room temperature. The compressor will cycle on and off to keep the room at the same level of comfort. When you turn the knob to a higher number the indoor air will become cooler. Turn the knob to a lower number and the indoor air will become warmer.

Additional controls and important information.

Energy Saver (on some models)

The energy saver switch controls the fan.

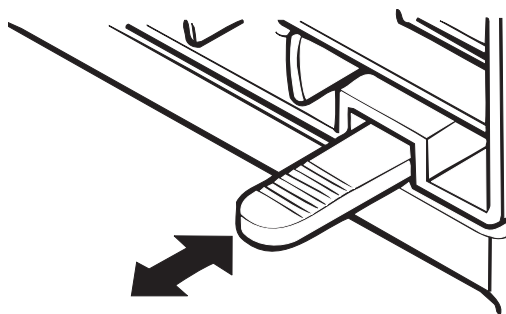
ENERGY SAVER ON—The fan and compressor cycle on and off together. This results in wider variations of room temperature and humidity.

ENERGY SAVER OFF—The fan runs all the time, while the compressor cycles on and off.

Vent Control

The vent control is located above the control knobs.

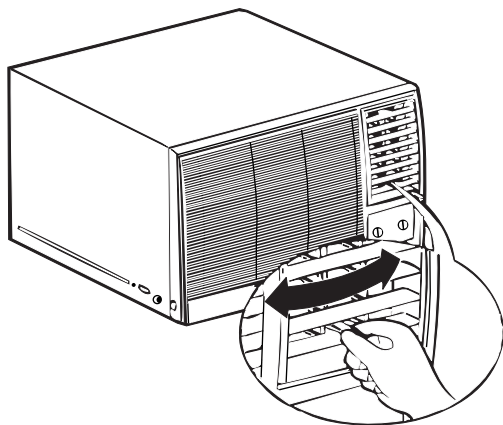
When set at **CLOSE**, only the air inside the room will be circulated and conditioned. When set at **OPEN**, some inside air is exhausted outside.



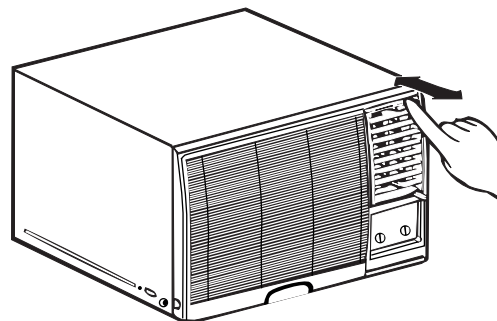
To open the vent, pull the lever toward you.
To close it, push it in.

Air Direction

The horizontal air direction is adjusted by moving the lever to the left or right.



Fingertip pressure on the horizontal louvers adjusts the air direction up or down.



Care and cleaning of the air conditioner.

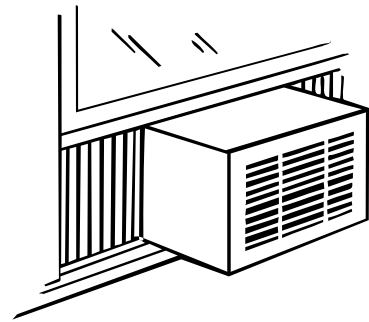
Grille and Case

Turn the air conditioner off and remove the plug from the wall outlet before cleaning.

To clean, use water and a mild detergent. Do not use bleach or abrasives.

Outdoor Coils

The coils on the outdoor side of the air conditioner should be checked regularly. If they are clogged with dirt or soot they may be professionally steam cleaned, a service available through your GE service outlet.

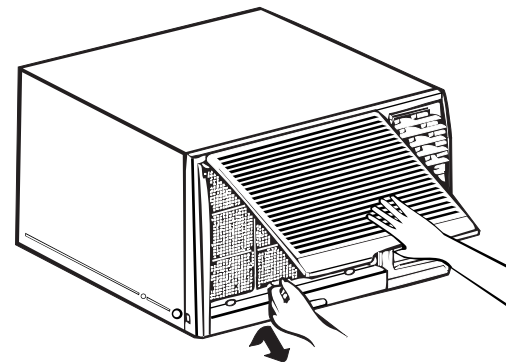


Air Filter

The air filter behind the front grille should be checked and cleaned at least every 30 days or more often if necessary.

To remove:

- ☐ Open the inlet grille upward by pulling out the bottom of the inlet grille.
- ☐ Using the tab, pull up slightly on the filter to release it and pull it down.



Clean the filter with warm, soapy water. Rinse and let the filter dry before replacing it.

CAUTION: DO NOT operate the air conditioner without a filter because dirt and lint will clog it and reduce performance.

Preparing to install the air conditioner.

Read these instructions completely and carefully.



Before You Begin

NOTE TO INSTALLER: Leave these instructions with the air conditioner after installation is completed.

NOTE TO CONSUMER: Keep this Owner's Manual and Installation Instructions for future use.

IMPORTANT NOTES:

For personal safety, this air conditioner must be properly grounded.

It is important to have the wall outlet and circuit checked by a qualified electrician if there is any doubt as to whether a proper ground exists.

Follow National Electric Codes (NEC) and/or local codes and ordinances.



CAUTION:

Do not, under any circumstances, cut or remove the third (ground) prong from the power cord.

Do not change the plug on the power cord of this air conditioner.

Aluminum house wiring may present special problems—consult a qualified electrician.

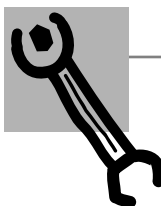


Electrical Requirements



This model requires a 115/120-volt a.c., 60 Hz grounded outlet protected with a 15-amp time delay fuse or circuit breaker.

The 3-prong grounding plug minimizes the possibility of electric shock hazard. If the wall outlet you plan to use is only a 2-prong outlet, it is your responsibility to have it replaced with a properly grounded 3-prong wall outlet.

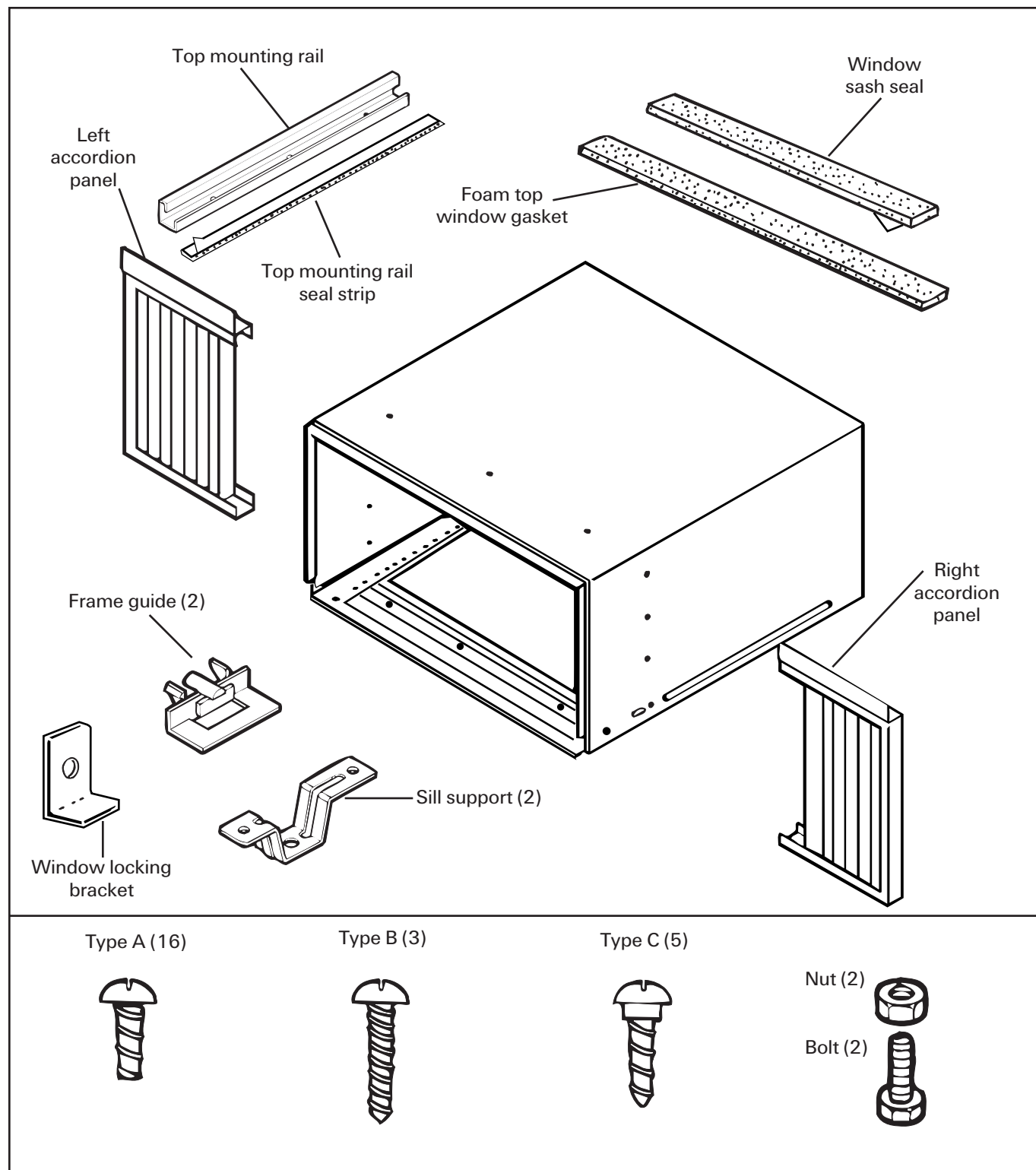

Window Installation Instructions

Parts Included

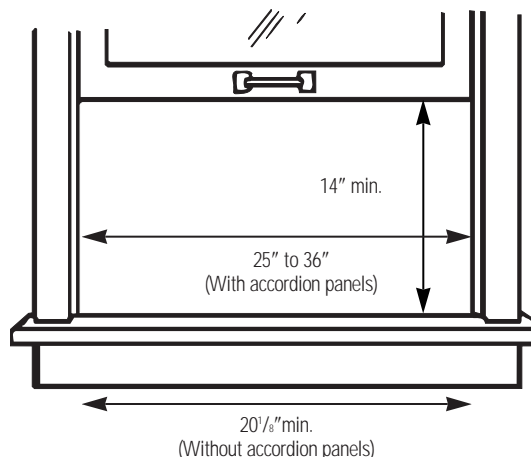


Read completely, then follow step-by-step.

Window Requirements

- These instructions are for a standard double-hung window. You will need to modify them for other types of windows.
- The air conditioner can be installed without the accordion panels if needed to fit in a narrow window. See the window opening dimensions to the right.
- All supporting parts must be secured to firm wood, masonry or metal.
- The electrical outlet must be within reach of the power cord.

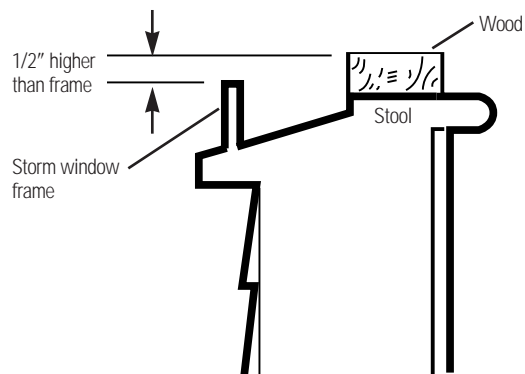


Window opening dimensions are for a standard double-hung window.

Storm Window Requirements

A storm window frame will not allow the air conditioner to tilt towards the outside and will keep it from draining properly. To adjust for this, attach a piece of wood to the stool.



WOOD PIECES—

WIDTH: 2"

LENGTH: Long enough to fit inside the window frame.

THICKNESS: To determine the thickness, place a piece of wood on the stool to make it 1/2" higher than the top of the storm window frame.

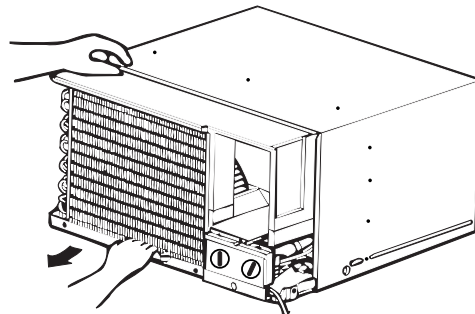
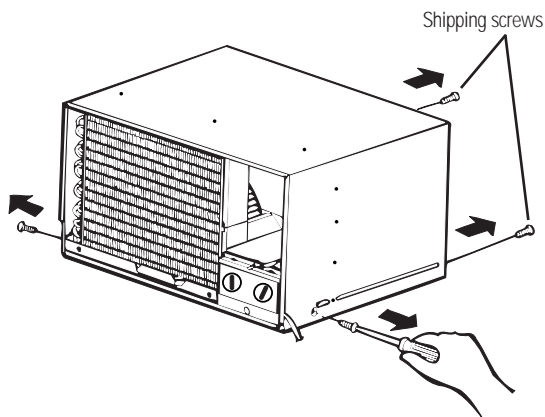
Attach securely with nails or screws provided by the installer.

Remove the Air Conditioner From the Case

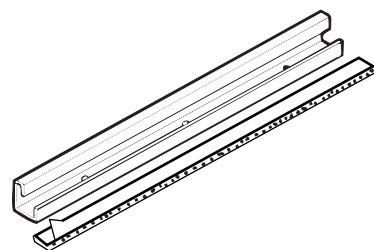
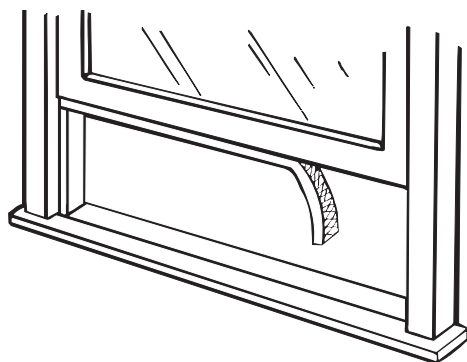
- A** Remove the 2 shipping screws from the back of the case.
- B** Remove the 2 screws on each side of the case. Keep these for later use.
- C** Slide the air conditioner from the case by gripping the base pan handle and pulling forward while bracing the case.



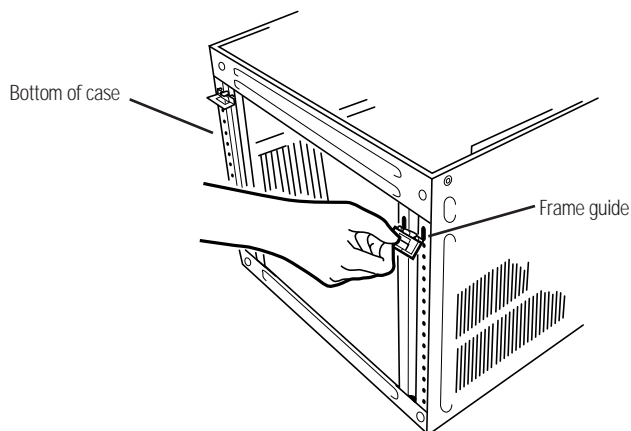

Prepare the Window and the Case

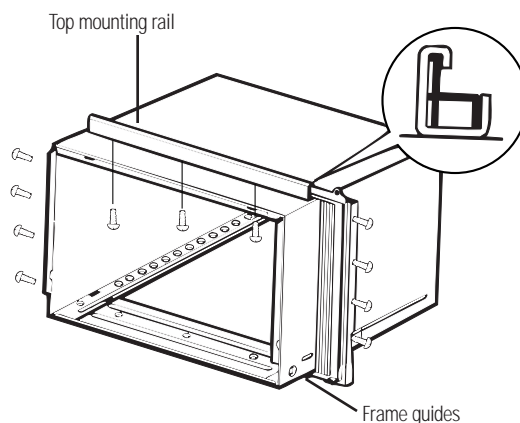
- A** Cut the window sash seal to the proper length. Peel off the backing and attach the seal to the underside of the window sash.
- C** Remove the backing from the top mounting rail seal strip and attach it to the bottom of the top mounting rail.



- B** Carefully insert the plastic frame guides into the bottom of the case on each side.



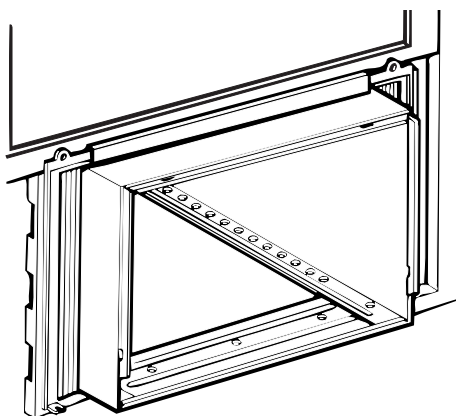
- D** Install the top mounting rail with 3 type A screws on the inside of the case. Insert the frames for the accordion panels into the top mounting rail and the frame guides. Attach the accordion panels to the side of the case using 4 type A screws.

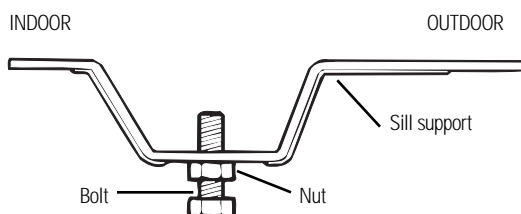
Install the Case in the Window

- A** Open the window and mark the centerline of the window stool.
- B** Carefully place the case on the window stool and align the center mark on the bottom front with the centerline of the stool.
- C** Pull the window down behind the top mounting rail.
- F** Adjust the bolt and the nut in each support so that the case is installed with a slight downward tilt (about 1/8").
- G** Secure the case to the window stool by using 3 type B screws.

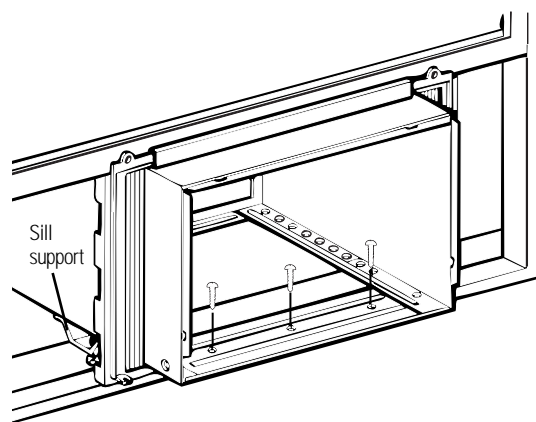
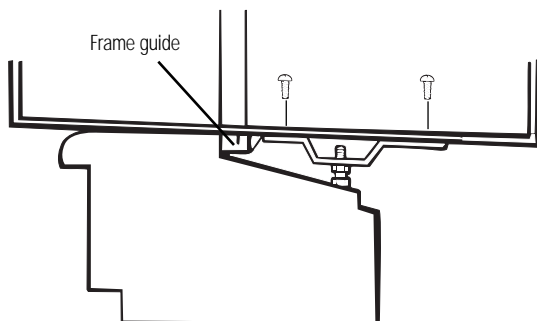


NOTE: Do not shut the window so tightly that movement of the accordion panels is restricted.

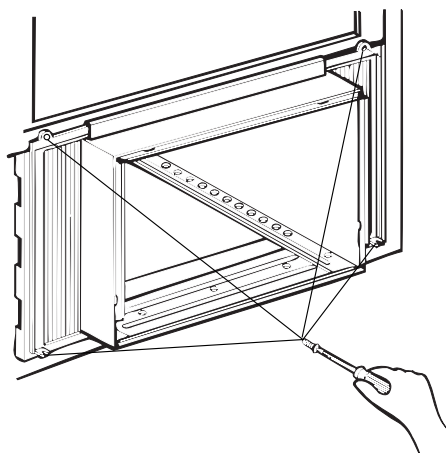
- D** Loosely assemble the sill supports.



- E** Select the position that will place the sill supports near the outermost point on the sill. Attach the sill supports to the case track hole in relation to the selected position using 2 type A screws in each support.



- H** Pull the accordion panels to each window sash track. Attach them on each side to the window sash and the window stool using 4 type C screws.

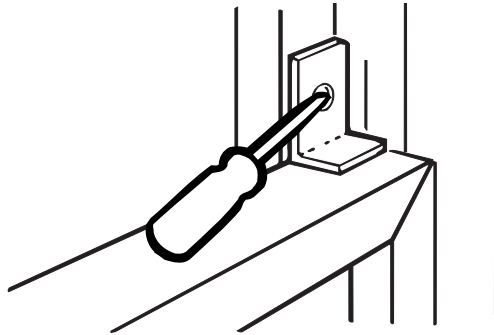

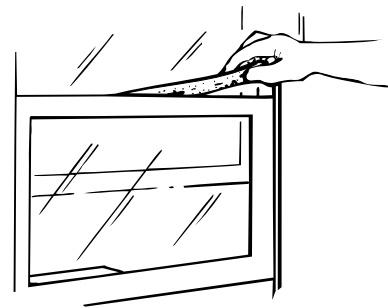
Install the Window Locking Bracket and the Foam Top Window Gasket

- A** Attach the window locking bracket with a type C screw.



- B** Cut the foam top window gasket to the window width.

- C** Stuff the foam between the glass and the window to prevent air and insects from getting into the room.

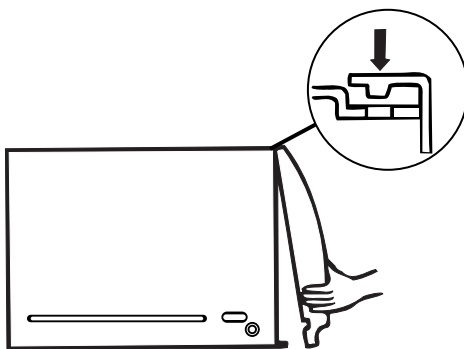

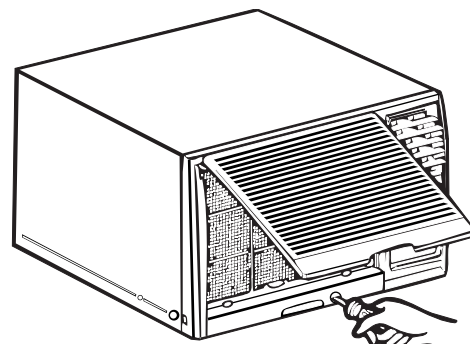
Install the Air Conditioner in the Case

- A** Slide the air conditioner into the case. Reinstall the 2 screws removed earlier on each side of the case.

- B** Attach the front grille to the case by inserting the tabs on the grille into the tabs on the front of the case. Push the grille in until it snaps into place.



- C** Lift the inlet grille and secure it with a type A screw through the front grille.



Before you call for service...



Troubleshooting Tips
Save time and money! Review the chart below first and you may not need to call for service.

Problem	Possible Causes	What To Do
Air conditioner does not start	The air conditioner is unplugged.	• Make sure the air conditioner plug is pushed completely into the outlet.
	The fuse is blown/circuit breaker is tripped.	• Check the house fuse/circuit breaker box and replace the fuse or reset the breaker.
	Power failure.	• If power failure occurs, turn the mode control to OFF . When power is restored, wait 3 minutes to restart the air conditioner to prevent tripping of the compressor overload.
Air conditioner does not cool as it should	Airflow is restricted.	• Make sure there are no curtains, blinds or furniture blocking the front of the air conditioner.
	The temp control may not be set high enough.	• Turn the knob to a higher number. The highest setting provides maximum cooling.
	The air filter is dirty.	• Clean the filter at least every 30 days. See the <i>Operating Instructions</i> section.
	The room may have been hot.	• When the air conditioner is first turned on you need to allow time for the room to cool down.
	Cold air is escaping.	• Check for open furnace floor registers and cold air returns. • Set the air conditioner's vent to the closed position.
	Cooling coils have iced up.	• See "Air conditioner freezing up" below.
Air conditioner freezing up	Ice blocks the air flow and stops the air conditioner from cooling the room.	• Set the mode control at HIGH FAN or HIGH COOL with the temp at 1 or 2 .

Normal Operating Sounds

- You may hear a pinging noise caused by water being picked up and thrown against the condenser on rainy days or when the humidity is high. This design feature helps remove moisture and improve efficiency.
- You may hear the thermostat click when the compressor cycles on and off.
- Water will collect in the base pan during high humidity or on rainy days. The water may overflow and drip from the outdoor side of the unit.
- The fan may run even when the compressor is not.

Air Conditioner Warranty



All warranty service provided by our Factory Service Centers, or an authorized Customer Care® technician. For service, call 800-GE-CARES.

For The Period Of:	GE Will Replace, At No Charge To You:
One Year From the date of the original purchase	Any part of the air conditioner which fails due to a defect in materials or workmanship. During this full one-year warranty , GE will also provide, free of charge , all labor and in-home service to replace the defective part.
Five Years From the date of the original purchase	Any part of the sealed refrigerating system (the compressor, condenser, evaporator and all connecting tubing) which fails due to a defect in materials or workmanship. During this five-year warranty , GE will also provide, free of charge , all labor and in-home service to replace the defective part.

What GE Will Not Cover:

- Service trips to your home to teach you how to use the product.
- Improper installation. If you have an installation problem, or if the air conditioner is of improper cooling capacity for the intended use, contact your dealer or installer. You are responsible for providing adequate electrical connecting facilities.
- Failure of the product resulting from modifications to the product or due to unreasonable use including failure to provide reasonable and necessary maintenance.
- In commercial locations labor necessary to move the unit to a location where it is accessible for service by an individual technician.
- Replacement of house fuses or resetting of circuit breakers.
- Failure due to corrosion on models not corrosion-protected.
- Damage to the product caused by improper power supply voltage, accident, fire, floods or acts of God.
- Incidental or consequential damage to personal property caused by possible defects with this air conditioner.

This warranty is extended to the original purchaser and any succeeding owner for products purchased for home use within the USA. In Alaska, the warranty excludes the cost of shipping or service calls to your home.

Some states do not allow the exclusion or limitation of incidental or consequential damages. This warranty gives you specific legal rights, and you may also have other rights which vary from state to state. To know what your legal rights are, consult your local or state consumer affairs office or your state's Attorney General.

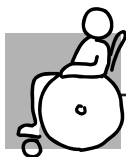

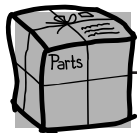
