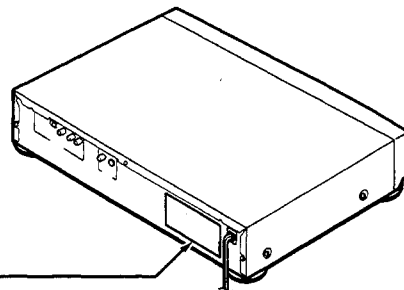

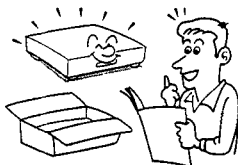

**1. Read owner's manual**

After unpacking this product, read the owner's manual carefully, and follow all the operating and other instructions.



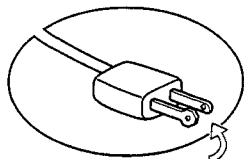
**2. Power Sources**

This product should be operated only from the type of power source indicated on the marking label. If you are not sure of the type of power supply to your home, consult your product dealer or local power company. For products intended to operate from battery power, or other sources, refer to the operating instructions.



**3. Grounding or Polarization**

This product may be equipped with a polarized alternating current line plug (a plug having one blade wider than the other). This plug will fit into the power outlet only one way. This is a safety feature. If you are unable to insert the plug fully into the outlet, try reversing the plug. If the plug should still fail to fit, contact your electrician to replace your obsolete outlet. Do not defeat the safety purpose of the polarized plug.



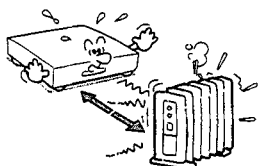
**4. Ventilation**

Slots and openings in the cabinet are provided for ventilation and to ensure reliable operation of the product and to protect it from overheating, and these openings must not be blocked or covered. The openings should never be blocked by placing the product on a bed, sofa, rug or other similar surface. This product should not be placed in a built-in installation such as a bookcase or rack unless proper ventilation is provided or the manufacturer's instructions have been adhered to.



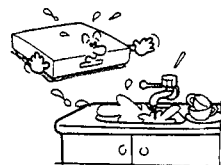
**5. Heat**

The product should be situated away from heat sources such as radiators, heat registers, stoves, or other products (including amplifiers) that produce heat.



**6. Water and Moisture**

**7. Cleaning**

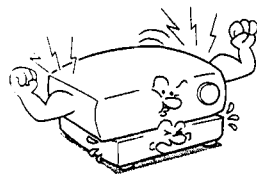

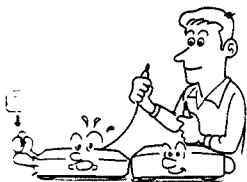

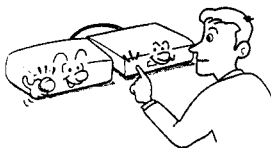

**16. Connecting**

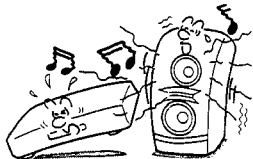

# Precautions

## Notes on Handling

- When shipping the DVD video player, the original shipping carton and packing materials come in handy. For maximum protection, repack the unit as it was originally packed at the factory.
- Do not use volatile liquids, such as insect spray, near the DVD video player. Do not leave rubber or plastic products in contact with the DVD video player for a long time. They will leave marks on the cabinet.
- The top and rear panels of the DVD video player may become warm after a long period of use. This is not a malfunction.
- When the DVD video player is not in use, be sure to remove the disc and turn off the power.
- If you do not use the DVD video player for a long time, the unit may not function properly in the future. Use the DVD video player occasionally.

## Notes on Location

- When you place this DVD video player near a TV, radio, or VCR, the playback picture may become poor and the sound may be distorted. In this case, place the DVD video player away from the TV, radio, or VCR.

## Notes on Cleaning

Use a soft, dry cloth for cleaning.

- For stubborn dirt, soak the cloth in a weak detergent solution, wring the cloth well, and wipe the unit. Use a dry cloth to wipe it dry.  
Do not use any type of solvent, such as thinner and benzene, as they may damage the surface of the DVD video player.
- If you use a chemical saturated cloth to clean the unit, follow that product's instructions.

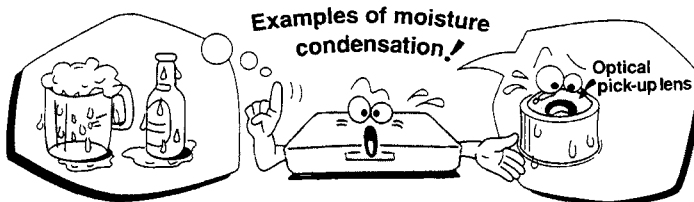
## To Obtain a Clear Picture

The DVD video player is a high technology, precision device. If the optical pick-up lens and disc drive parts are dirty or worn down, the picture quality becomes poor. To obtain a clear picture, we recommend regular inspection and maintenance (cleaning or parts replacement) every 1,000 hours of use depending on the operating environment. For details, contact your nearest dealer.

## Notes on Moisture Condensation

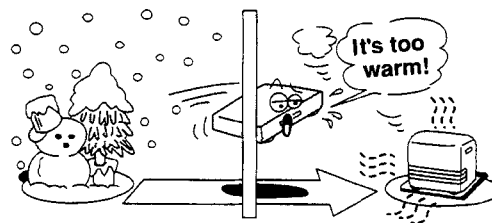
**Moisture condensation damages the DVD video player. Please read the following carefully.**

Moisture condensation occurs, for example, when you pour a cold drink into a glass on a warm day. Drops of water form on the outside of the glass. In the same way, moisture may condense on the optical pick-up lens inside this unit, one of the most crucial internal parts of the DVD video player.



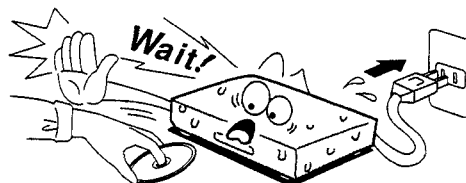
■ **Moisture condensation occurs during the following cases.**

- When you bring the DVD video player directly from a cold place to a warm place.
- When you use the DVD video player in a room where you just turned on the heater, or a place where the cold wind from the air conditioner directly hits the unit.
- In summer, when you use the DVD video player in a hot and humid place just after you move the unit from an air conditioned room.
- When you use the DVD video player in a humid place.



■ **Do not use the DVD video player when moisture condensation may occur.**

If you use the DVD video player in such a situation, it may damage discs and internal parts. Remove the disc, connect the power cord of the DVD video player to the wall outlet, turn on the DVD video player, and leave it for two or three hours. After two or three hours, the DVD video player will have warmed up and evaporated any moisture. Keep the DVD video player connected to the wall outlet and moisture condensation will seldom occur.



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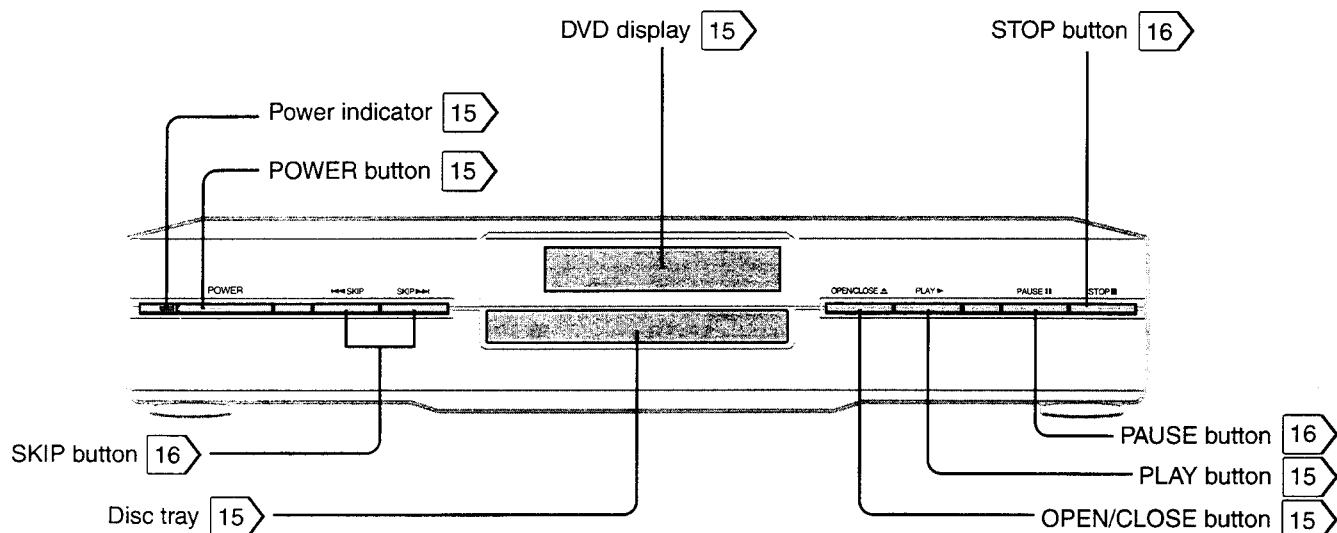

## Remote Control



### \*MENU button

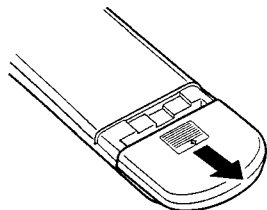

Insert the batteries into the remote control so you can use it to operate the DVD video player.

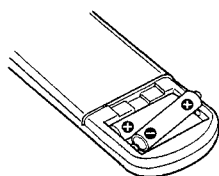

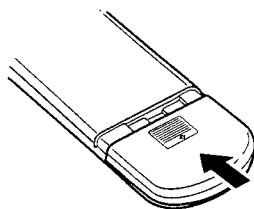

### Notes on batteries

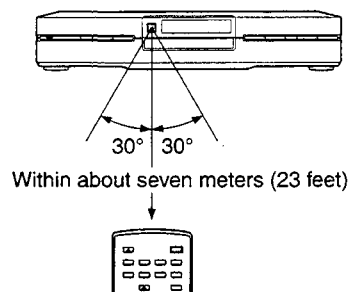
Improper use of batteries may cause battery leakage and corrosion. To operate the remote control correctly, follow the instructions below.

- Do not insert the batteries into the remote control in the wrong direction (follow the +/– signs).
- Do not charge, heat, open, or short-circuit the batteries. Do not throw the batteries into a fire.
- Do not leave dead or exhausted batteries in the remote control.
- Do not use different types of batteries together, or mix old and new batteries.
- If you do not use the remote control for a long period of time, remove the batteries to avoid possible damage from battery corrosion.
- If the remote control does not function correctly or if the operating range becomes reduced, replace all batteries with new ones.
- If battery leakage occurs, wipe the battery liquid from the battery compartment, then insert new batteries.

## Operating with the Remote Control

This section shows you how to use the remote control.

Point the remote control at the remote sensor and press the buttons.



Distance: About seven meters from the remote sensor

Angle: About 30° in each direction of the front of the remote sensor

\* Do not expose the remote sensor of the DVD video player to a strong light source, such as direct sunlight or illumination. If you do so, you may not be able to operate the DVD video player with the remote control.

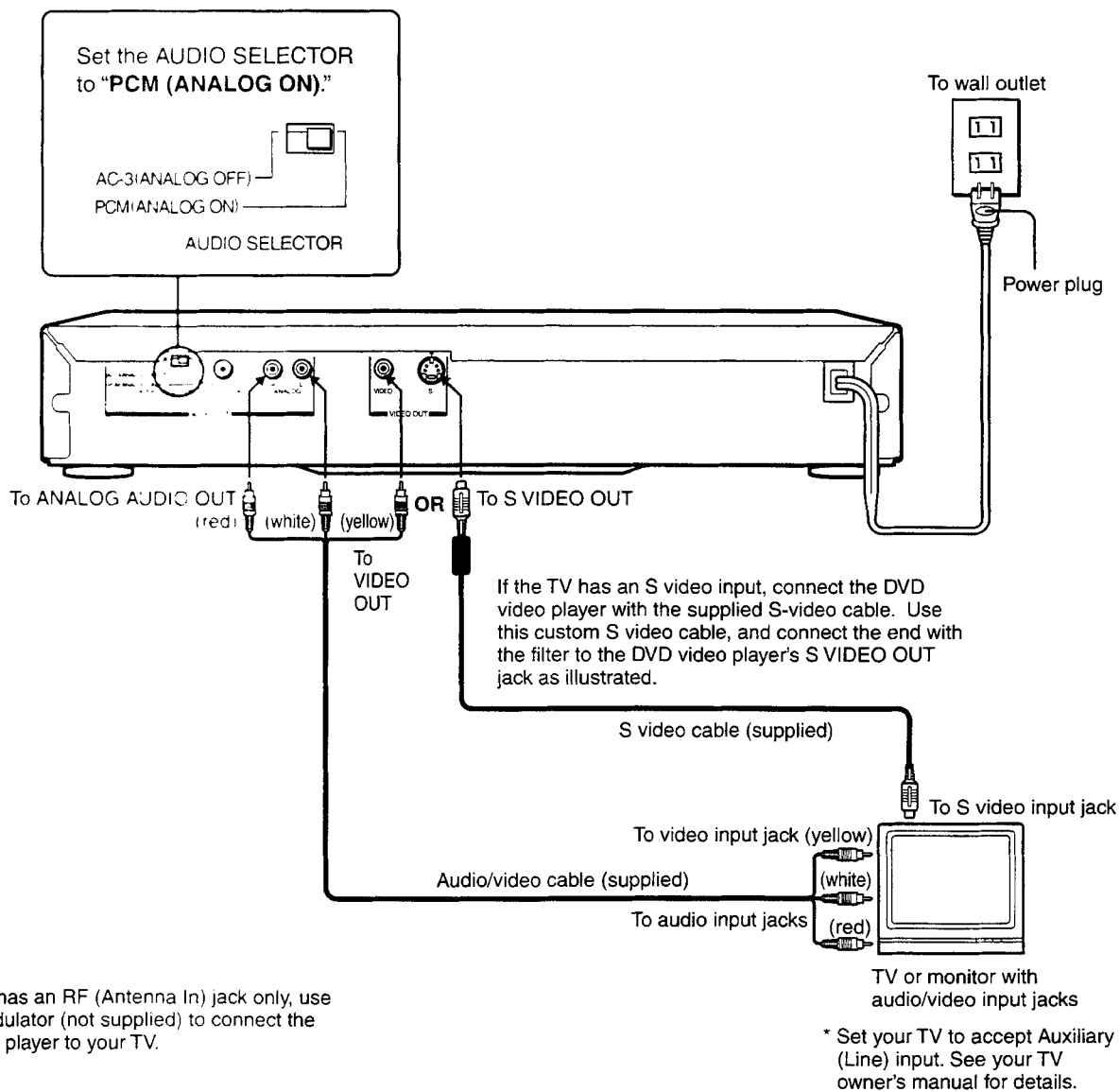
### Notes on the remote control

- Point the remote control at the remote sensor of the DVD video player.
- Do not drop the remote control.
- Do not leave the remote control near an extremely hot or humid place.
- Do not spill water into or put anything wet on the remote control.
- Do not open the remote control.

# Connecting to a TV

Connect the DVD video player to your TV.

## Connecting to a TV



If your TV has an RF (Antenna In) jack only, use an RF modulator (not supplied) to connect the DVD video player to your TV.

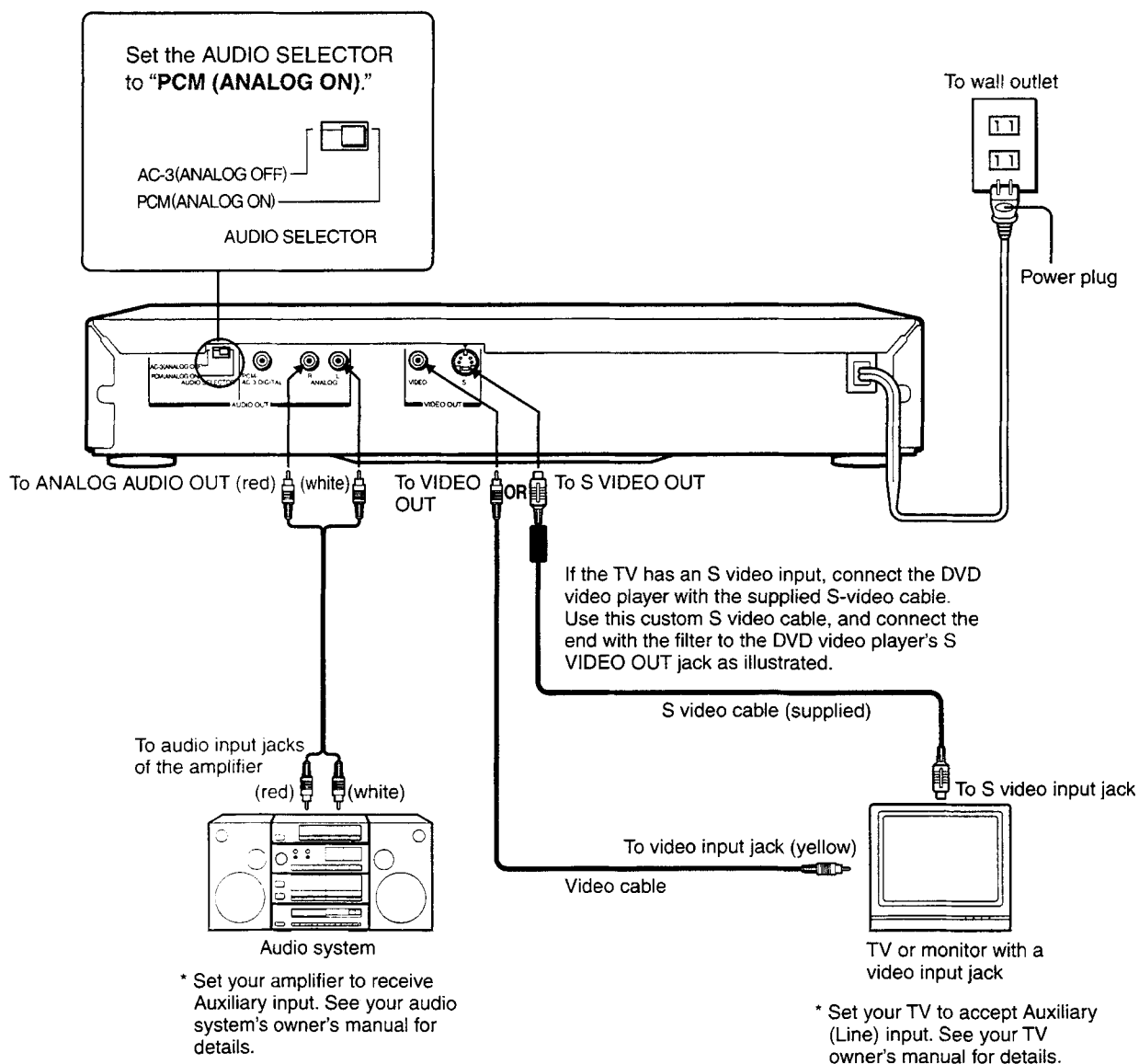
### Notes

- Be sure to refer to your TV owner's manual as well.
- When you connect the DVD video player to your TV, be sure to turn off the power and unplug both units from the wall outlet before making any connections.
- If your television has one audio input, use a Y cable adapter (not supplied) to connect to your TV.
- Connect the DVD video player directly to your TV. If you connect the DVD video player to a VCR, the playback picture will be distorted because DVD video discs are copy protected.

# Connecting to an Audio System

You can listen to the sound of audio CDs and DVD video discs in stereo.

## Connecting to an Audio System



### Notes

- Refer to the owner's manual of the connected equipment (TV, audio system) as well.
- When you connect the DVD video player to other equipment, be sure to turn off the power and unplug all of the equipment from the wall outlet before making any connections.
- If you place the DVD video player near a tuner or radio, the radio broadcast sound might be distorted. In this case, place the DVD video player away from the tuner and radio.
- The output sound of the DVD video player has a wide dynamic range. Be sure to adjust the receiver's volume to a moderate listening level. Otherwise, the speakers may be damaged by a sudden high volume sound.
- Turn off the amplifier before you connect or disconnect the DVD video player's power cord. If you leave the amplifier power on, the speakers may be damaged.

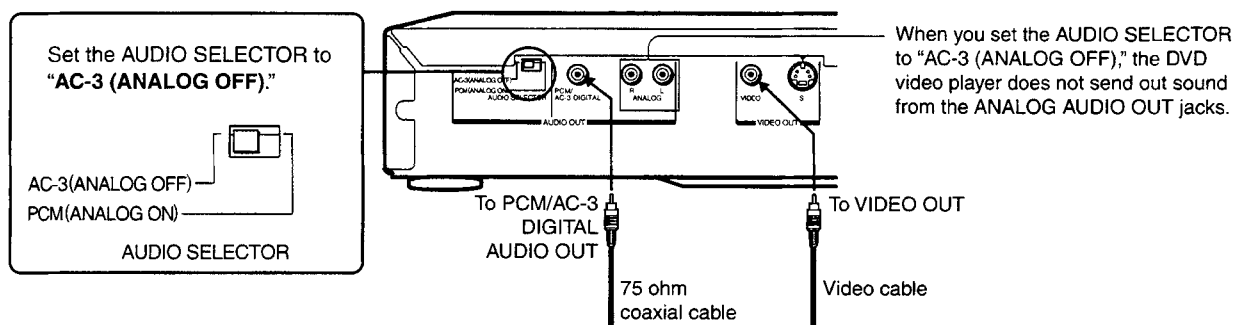

## Enjoying Dolby Digital (AC-3) Sound

### Dolby Digital (AC-3)

Dolby Digital is the surround sound technology used in movie theaters, and is now available in the home. You can enjoy motion picture and live concert DVD video discs with this realistic sound by connecting the DVD video player to a six-channel amplifier equipped with a Dolby Digital (AC-3) decoder or Dolby Digital (AC-3) processor. If you have a Dolby Pro Logic Surround decoder, you will obtain the full benefit of Pro Logic from the same DVD movies that provide full 5.1-channel Dolby Digital soundtracks, as well as from titles with the Dolby Surround mark.



### Standard equipment necessary to enjoy Dolby Digital (AC-3)

You will need:

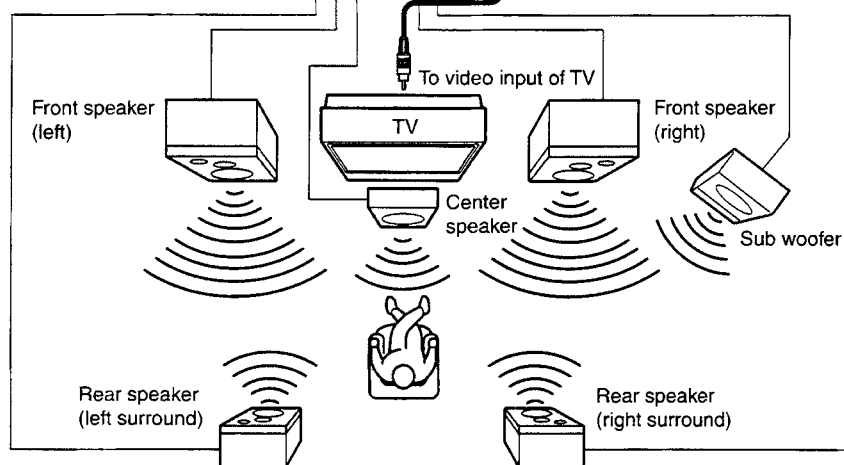
- The DVD video player (equipped with an AC-3 output jack)
- DVD video discs recorded in Dolby Digital (AC-3)
- Six-channel amplifier equipped with a Dolby Digital (AC-3) decoder, or Dolby Digital (AC-3) processor and power amplifier
- Five speakers and one sub woofer

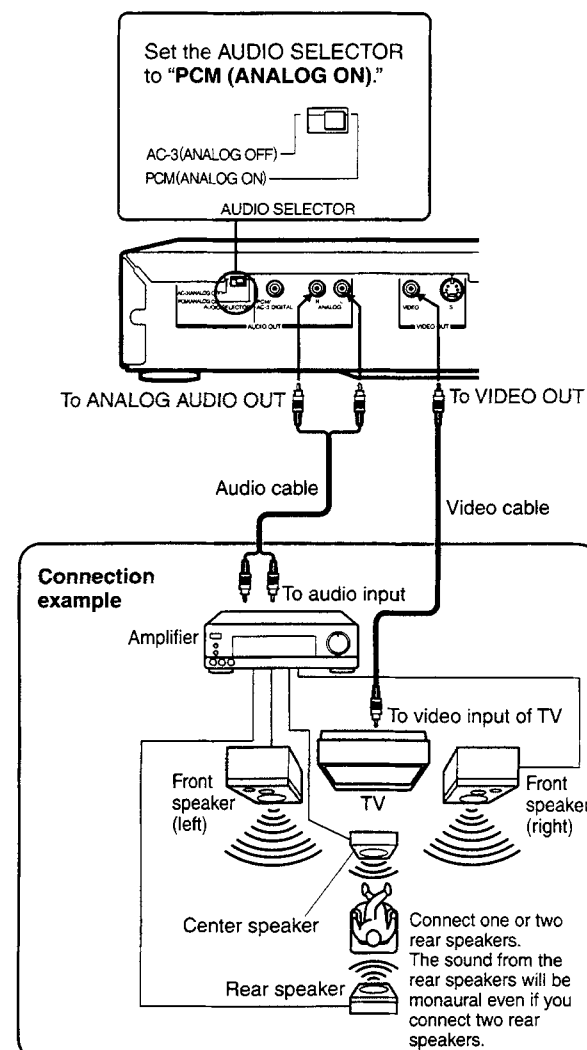
## Enjoying Dolby Pro Logic Surround Sound

You can enjoy Dolby Pro Logic Surround sound by connecting an amplifier and speaker system (right and left front speakers, a center speaker, and one or two rear speakers).

■ **With an amplifier equipped with Dolby Digital (AC-3),** connect the equipment the same way as described in "Enjoying Dolby Digital (AC-3) Sound" on the previous page. Refer to that amplifier's owner's manual and set the amplifier so you can enjoy Dolby Pro Logic Surround sound.

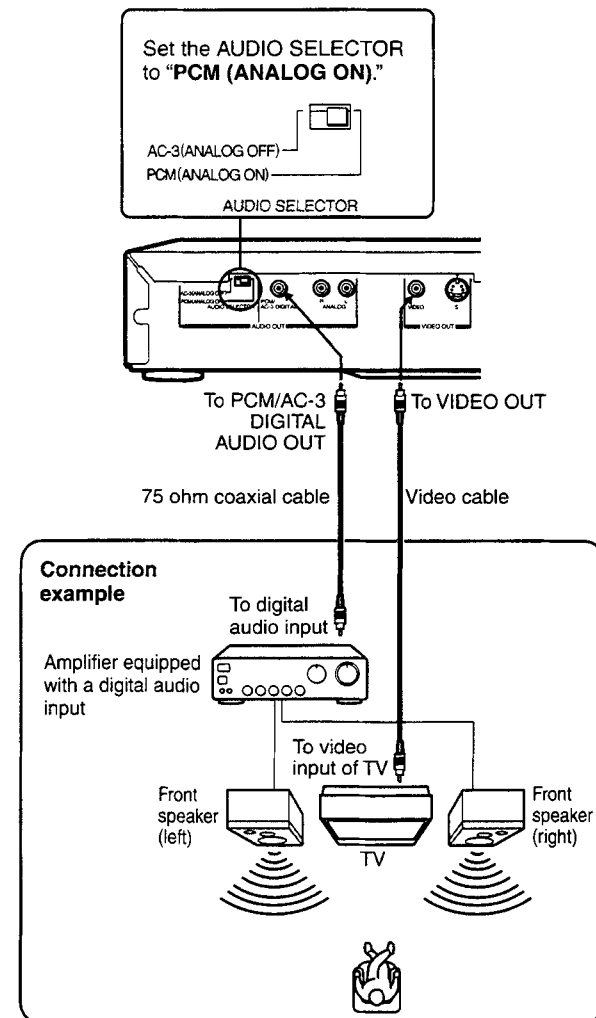




This section shows you how to play a DVD video disc or audio CD (compact disc).



## Basic Playback

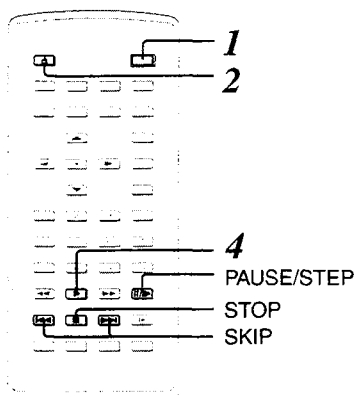
### ■ Preparations

- When you want to play DVD video discs, turn on the TV and put the TV in Auxiliary (Line) input mode.
- When you want to enjoy the sound of DVD video discs or audio CDs from the audio system, turn on the audio system and set the amplifier to receive Auxiliary input.
- For connection details, see pages 11 – 14.
- Set the playback picture size according to the picture tube shape or aspect ratio of the connected TV. (See page 26.)

1	<b>POWER</b>  <b>Press POWER.</b> The DVD video player turns on and the power indicator on the player lights.	
2	<b>OPEN/CLOSE</b>  <b>Press OPEN/CLOSE.</b> The disc tray opens.	<b>Note</b> You can open the disc tray by pressing this button even if the DVD video player is turned off.
3	<b>Place the disc in the disc tray.</b>  With the playback side down	<b>Notes</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• There are two different disc sizes. Place the disc in the correct guide in the disc tray. If the disc is out of the guide, it may damage the disc and cause the DVD video player to malfunction.</li> <li>• Do not place anything except DVD video discs or audio CDs in the disc tray.</li> </ul>
4	<b>PLAY</b>  <b>Press PLAY.</b> The disc tray closes and playback starts. 	<b>Notes</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• If you insert an audio CD, the audio CD indicator appears in the DVD display. ### Notes

- Do not move the DVD video player during playback. Doing so may damage the disc.
- Use the OPEN/CLOSE button on the remote control or DVD video player to open and close the disc tray. Do not push the disc tray. Doing so may cause the DVD video player to malfunction.
- Do not push down the disc tray or put any objects other than discs in the disc tray. Doing so may cause the DVD video player to malfunction.
- Keep your fingers clear of the disc tray as it is closing. Be especially careful when children's fingers are near the closing disc tray. There is a risk of personal injury.



#### ■ To obtain a higher quality picture

Occasionally, some picture noise may appear on the TV screen while playing a DVD video disc because the high resolution pictures on these discs include a lot of information. While the amount of noise depends on the TV, you should reduce the sharpness adjustment on your TV from the position you usually set for normal broadcasts.

#### ■ About DVD CD

The DVD CD symbols on the heading bar show the playable discs for the function described under that heading.

DVD : You can use this function with DVD video discs.

CD : You can use this function with audio CDs.

#### To go to the next chapter or track



Press SKIP ►►.

#### To stop playback



Press STOP.

The DVD video player returns to chapter 1 or track 1.

#### To go to the previous chapter or track



Press SKIP ◄◄.

The DVD video player starts playback from the beginning of the current chapter or track.

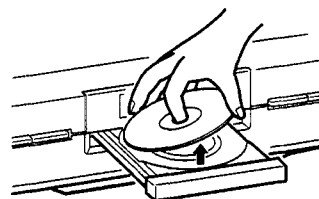
When you press the SKIP ◄◄ button twice, the DVD video player starts playback from the beginning of the previous chapter or track.

#### To remove the disc

OPEN/CLOSE



Press OPEN/CLOSE.



Remove the disc after the disc tray opens completely.

#### To pause playback (still playback)



Press PAUSE/STEP during playback.

Appears when playback is paused



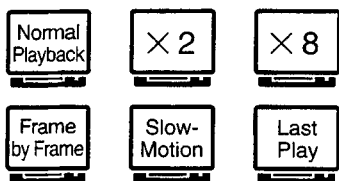
To resume normal playback, press the PLAY button.

- The sound is muted during still playback.

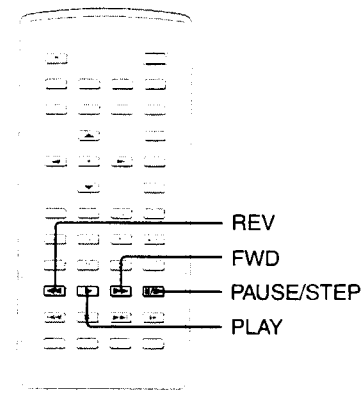
- Be sure to press the OPEN/CLOSE button to close the disc tray after you remove the disc.



# Playing a Disc (continued)



You can play discs at various speeds, and resume playback from the location where you stopped playback.



## Playing at Twice or Eight Times the Normal Speed

You can play a disc at twice or eight times the normal speed.



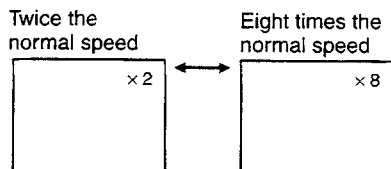
**Press REV or FWD during playback.**



The playback speed is twice the normal speed.  
Pressing the REV or FWD button again changes the playback speed to eight times the normal speed.

REV: Fast reverse playback  
FWD: Fast forward playback

Each time you press the REV or FWD button, the playback speed alternates between twice the normal speed and eight times the normal speed.



## To resume normal playback



**Press PLAY.**

## Playing Frame by Frame

You can advance a DVD video disc picture frame by frame.



**Press PAUSE/STEP during still playback.**

Each time you press the PAUSE/STEP button, the picture advances one frame.

## To resume normal playback



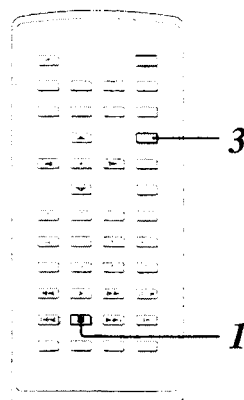
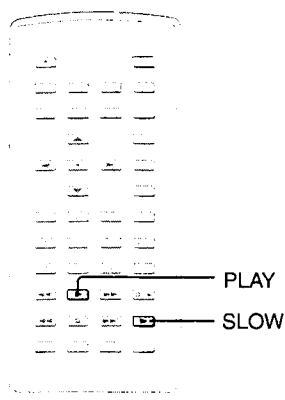
**Press PLAY.**

## Notes

- The DVD video player does not play sound and subtitles of a DVD video disc during playback that is twice or eight times the normal playback speed (forward or reverse). However, the DVD video player plays sound during fast forward or fast reverse playback of audio CDs.
- Twice or eight times the normal playback speeds are only approximate speeds. These speeds may vary slightly from disc to disc.

The sound is muted during frame by frame playback.

## Playing in Slow Motion

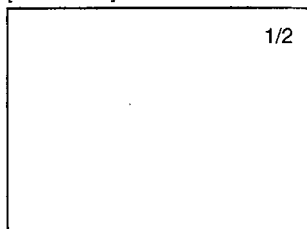
You can play a DVD video disc in slow motion.



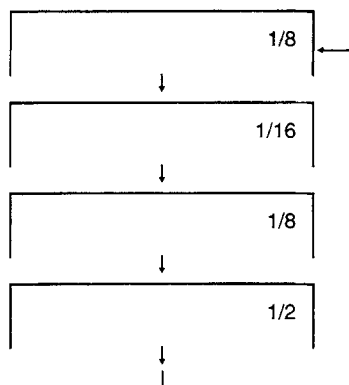
### Press SLOW during playback.

The playback speed becomes half the normal speed.

[TV screen]



Each time you press the SLOW button, the playback speed changes as follows.



### To resume normal playback



Press PLAY.

#### Note

The sound is muted during slow motion playback.

## Resuming Playback from the Same Location

You can stop playback and resume playback later from the same location on the disc.



### Press STOP during playback at the location you would like to return to later.

- The DVD video player memorizes the location where you stopped playback.
- The DVD video player stores that location in its memory, even if you turn off the player.

### Leave the disc in the DVD video player.

Opening the disc tray cancels this function.



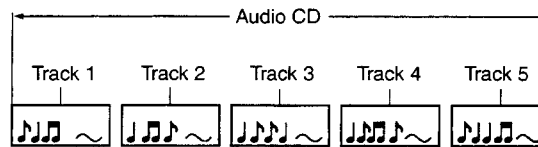
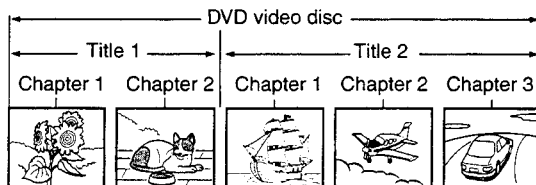
### Press LAST PLAY.

The DVD video player resumes playback slightly before the location where you stopped playback.

#### Notes

- The Last Play function is canceled if the DVD video player is disconnected from the wall outlet, or if power is interrupted.
- Some DVD video discs start playback automatically when you insert them, and you do not have to press the PLAY button to start playback. If you use the Last Play function with these DVD video discs, turning off the DVD video player with the POWER button cancels the Last Play function.
- The Last Play function is canceled when you press the SET UP button to display the SET UP MENU on the TV screen.
- The Last Play function is canceled when you stop playback in a title that includes multiple camera angles and press the ANGLE button (page 33).
- You cannot use the Last Play function while operating the disc menu.

# Locating a Specific Title, Chapter, or Track



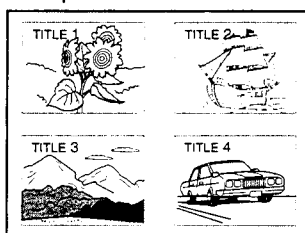
Normally, DVD video discs are divided into titles, and the titles are sub-divided into chapters. Audio CDs are divided into tracks. You can quickly locate any specific title, chapter, or track.

## Locating a Title Using the Title Menu

If a DVD video disc contains a title menu, you can locate a specific title using that title menu.

**1** **TITLE** **Press TITLE.**  
The title menu appears on the TV screen.

Example of a title menu



**2** **Press ▲ / ▼ / ◀ / ▶ to select the title you want.**  
If the titles in the title menu are assigned a number, you can directly locate a specific title by pressing its assigned number with the **number buttons**.

**3** **ENTER** **Press ENTER.**  
The DVD video player starts playback from chapter 1 of the selected title.

### Notes

- The instructions above describe the basic procedure. The procedure varies depending on the contents of the DVD video disc. If different instructions appear on the TV screen, follow those instructions.
- If you display the title menu during playback and press the TITLE button again without selecting any title, the DVD video player resumes playback from the point where you first pressed the TITLE button.
- If a DVD video disc does not contain a title menu, the title menu does not appear on the TV screen when you press the TITLE button.

## Locating a Title

You can locate a specific title by entering a title number.

**1** **Press T to highlight the space next to TITLE.**

- If you cannot wipe off the dust with a soft cloth, wipe the disc lightly with a slightly moistened soft cloth then dry the disc with a dry cloth.
- Do not use any type of solvent such as thinner, benzene, commercially available cleaners or antistatic spray for vinyl LPs. These may damage the disc.

## Storing Discs

- Do not store discs in a place subject to direct sunlight or heat.
- Do not store discs in places subject to moisture and dust, such as in a bathroom or near a humidifier.
- Store discs vertically in a case. Stacking or placing objects on discs may cause warping.

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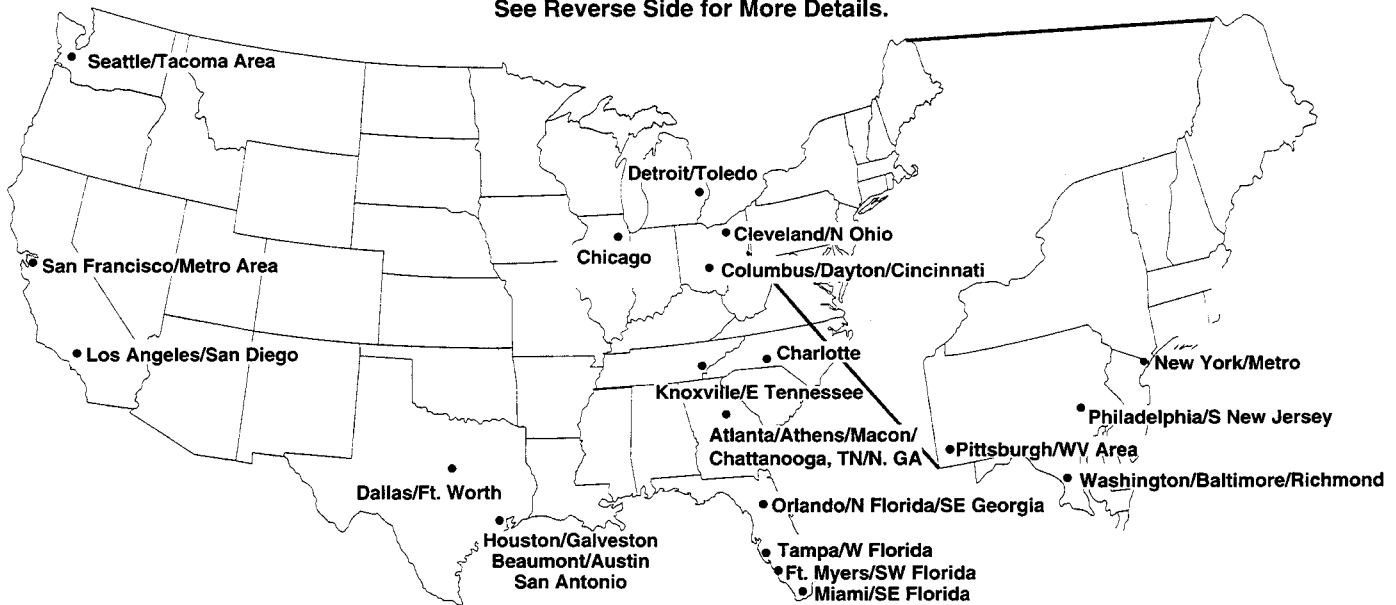
