


2. Power Sources

This product should be operated only from the type of power source indicated on the marking label. 3. Grounding or Polarization

This product may be equipped with a polarized alternating current line plug (a plug having one blade wider than the other). This plug will fit into the power outlet only one way. This is a safety feature. If you are unable to insert the plug fully into the out-


5. Heat

Notes on Handling

- When shipping the DVD video player, the original shipping carton and packing materials come in handy. For maximum protection, repack the unit as it was originally packed at the factory.
- Do not use volatile liquids, such as insect spray, near the DVD video player. Do not leave rubber or plastic products in contact with the DVD video player for a long time. They will leave marks on the cabinet.
- The top and rear panels of the DVD video player may become warm after a long period of use. This is not a malfunction.
- When the DVD video player is not in use, be sure to remove the disc and turn off the power.
- If you do not use the DVD video player for a long time, the unit may not function properly in the future. Use the DVD video player occasionally.

Notes on Location

■ When you place this DVD video player near a TV, radio, or VCR, the playback picture may become poor and the sound may be distorted. In this case, place the DVD video player away from the TV, radio, or VCR.

Notes on Cleaning

Use a soft, dry cloth for cleaning.

- For stubborn dirt, soak the cloth in a weak detergent solution, wring the cloth well, and wipe the unit. Use a dry cloth to wipe it dry.
 - Do not use any type of solvent, such as thinner and benzine, as they may damage the surface of the DVD video player.
- If you use a chemical saturated cloth to clean the unit, follow that product's instructions.


To Obtain a Clear Picture

The DVD video player is a high technology, precision device. If the optical pick-up lens and disc drive parts are dirty or worn down, the picture quality becomes poor. To obtain a clear picture, we recommend regular inspection and maintenance (cleaning or parts replacement) every 1,000 hours of use depending on the operating environment. For details, contact your nearest dealer.

Notes on Moisture Condensation

Moisture condensation damages the DVD video player. Please read the following carefully.

Moisture condensation occurs, for example, when you pour a cold drink into a glass on a warm day. Drops of water form on the outside of the glass. In the same way, moisture may condense on the optical pick-up lens inside this unit, one of the most crucial internal parts of the DVD video player.



Moisture condensation occurs during the following cases.

- When you bring the DVD video player directly from a cold place to a warm place.
- When you use the DVD video player in a room where you just turned on the heater, or a place where the cold wind from the air conditioner directly hits the unit.
- In summer, when you use the DVD video player in a hot and humid place just after you move the unit from an air conditioned room.
- When you use the DVD video player in a humid place.



■ Do not use the DVD video player when moisture condensation may occur.

If you use the DVD video player in such a situation, it may damage discs and internal parts. Remove the disc, connect the power cord of the DVD video player to the wall outlet, turn on the DVD video player, and leave it for two or three hours. After two or three hours, the DVD video player will have warmed up and evaporated any moisture. Keep the DVD video player connected to the wall outlet and moisture condensation will seldom occur.

Notes on batteries


Basic Playback

■ Preparations

- When you want to play DVD video discs, turn on the TV and put the TV in Auxiliary (Line) input mode.
- When you want to enjoy the sound of DVD video discs or audio CDs from the audio system, turn on the audio system and set the
 amplifier to receive Auxiliary input.
- For connection details, see pages 11 14.
- Set the playback picture size according to the picture tube shape or aspect ratio of the connected TV. (See page 26.)



- Do not move the DVD video player during playback. Doing so may damage the disc.
- Use the OPEN/CLOSE button on the remote control or DVD video player to open and close the disc tray. Do not push the disc tray. Doing so may cause the DVD video player to malfunction.
- Do not push down the disc tray or put any objects other than discs in the disc tray. Doing so may cause the DVD video player to malfunction.
- Keep your fingers clear of the disc tray as it is closing. Be especially careful when children's fingers are near the closing disc tray. There is a risk of personal injury.



■ To obtain a higher quality picture

Occasionally, some picture noise may appear on the TV screen while playing a DVD video disc because the high resolution pictures on these discs include a lot of information. While the amount of noise depends on the TV, you should reduce the sharpness adjustment on your TV from the position you usually set for normal broadcasts.

■ About ^{DVD} CD

The property symbols on the heading bar show the playable discs for the function described under that heading.

DVD : You can use this function with DVD video discs.

CD: You can use this function with audio CDs.

- Twice or eight times the normal playback speeds are only approximate speeds. These speeds may vary slightly from disc to disc.

 If you use the Last Play function with these DVD video discs, turning off the DVD video player with the POWER button cancels the Last Play function.
- The Last Play function is canceled when you press the SET UP button to display the SET UP MENU on the TV screen.
- The Last Play function is canceled when you stop playback in a title that includes multiple camera angles and press the ANGLE button (page 33).
- You cannot use the Last Play function while operating the disc menu.

Playback

Locating a Specific Title, Chapter, or Track





Normally, DVD video discs are divided into titles, and the titles are sub-divided into chapters. Audio CDs are divided into tracks. You can quickly locate any specific title, chapter, or track.

Locating a Title Using the Title Menu

If a DVD video disc contains a title menu, you can locate a specific title using that title menu.







- The instructions above describe the basic procedure. The procedure varies depending on the contents of the DVD video disc. If different instructions appear on the TV screen, follow those instructions.
- If you display the title menu during playback and press the TITLE button again without selecting any title, the DVD video player resumes playback from the point where you first pressed the TITLE button.
- If a DVD video disc does not contain a title menu, the title menu does not appear on the TV screen when you press the TITLE button.

- You cannot locate a specific title on DVD video discs that do not contain title numbers.
- Pressing the CLEAR button erases the numbers next to TITLE and CHAPTER.
- You can select a preferred language for on-screen displays (see page 25).

Locating a Specific Chapter or Track

You can locate consecutive chapters or tracks.



Press SKIP I → or → repeatedly to display the chapter or track number you want.


